• The 119th edition of the Big Game will be contested Saturday at Memorial Stadium.

• Stanford has faced Cal more than any other opponent, while also enjoying long-standing rivalries with USC (94), UCLA (88), Washington (87), Oregon State (83), Oregon (80), San Jose State (67) and Washington State (67).

• Stanford's 61 wins over Cal are the most against any opponent.

• The Big Game is one of the most-played FBS rivalry contests:

• Stanford ranks 14th nationally in scoring defense (19.4) and 11th in sacks (3.20), a figure that leads the Pac-12. Christian McCaffrey leads the Pac-12 with 193.22 all-purpose yards/game and 123.9 rushing yards/game, with the former ranking second nationally. For his career, McCaffrey is averaging 177.75 all-purpose yards/game, the most of any active FBS player.

• McCaffrey (3,434) is 89 yards away from passing Toby Gerhart (3,522) for third on Stanford's career rushing yards chart.

• Stanford has held each of its 10 opponents under their season scoring average.

• Under head coach David Shaw, Stanford is 5-0 against Cal, 24-9 on the road, 41-12 vs. Pac-12 opponents (regular season), 41-7 vs. unranked opponents, 18-5 in November, 46-15 coming off a win, 27-7 in day games and 9-3 on Pac-12 Networks.

• Stanford's 73 wins this decade are the most of any private school, ahead of Baylor (63), TCU (63), Notre Dame (59) and USC (59).

• Stanford has won at least 11 games four times in five seasons under head coach David Shaw. From 1891-2010, the program recorded four 10-win seasons.

• Stanford's ongoing streak of seven consecutive winning seasons is the longest in program history since an 11-season streak from 1968-78 under John Ralston, Jack Christiansen and Bill Walsh. The program's longest streak (not including the rugby years) is 13, from 1923-35 under coaches Andrew Kerr, Pop Warner and Tiny Thornhill.

• Stanford's 2016 roster includes student-athletes from 29 states, Canada and Austria.


• Stanford requires students to declare a major before their junior year. Among the team's upperclassmen, 15 majors are represented. Eight Cardinal are engineering majors. Majors among Cardinal student-athletes include: architectural design, biomechanical engineering, civil engineering, communication, computer science, earth systems, economics, human biology, Japanese, management science and engineering, philosophy, psychology, public policy, science, technology and society, and urban studies.

• Fifth-year senior SS Dallas Lloyd, senior OLB Peter Kalambayi, fifth-year senior OG Johnny Caspers, junior DE Solomon Thomas and junior RB Christian McCaffrey serve as captains, as voted by their teammates. In the modern era of Stanford's captains voting, only fourth- and fifth-year seniors had ever appeared on the ballot, making the nods for McCaffrey and Thomas a program-first.





The Stanford Axe

- The Stanford Axe is a trophy awarded to the winner of the annual Big Game. The trophy consists of an axe-head mounted on a large wooden plaque, along with the scores of past Big Games.
- The Stanford Axe was originally a standard 15-inch lumberman's axe. It made its first appearance on April 13, 1899, during a Stanford rally when yell leaders used it to decapitate a straw man dressed in blue and gold ribbons while chanting the Axe yell.
- The Axe made its second appearance two days later on April 15, 1899, at a baseball game played between Stanford and Cal in San Francisco. The Stanford yell leaders paraded the Axe and used it to chop up blue and gold ribbon after every good play by the Stanford team.
- Soon after the game, a group of Cal students seized it and ran off with the Axe. It was passed from student to student, and a chase ensued through the streets of San Francisco, first followed by Stanford students and fans and second followed by the San Francisco police. During the chase, the Axe's handle was broken off. The Axe made its way to Berkeley and was stored in a fraternity house, and later, in a bank.
- For the next 31 years, the Axe stayed in Berkeley. In 1930, 21 Stanford students plotted to take back the Axe from Cal. This successful heist made the group known in Stanford lore as the Immortal 21.
- In 1933, both sides agreed to designate the Axe as the annual trophy to be awarded to the Big Game's winner. In the event of a tie, it would be kept by the side already possessing the Axe.
- Since 1933, Cal students have stolen the Axe three times and Stanford students four times. The most recent incident occurred in 1973.
- When Stanford has the Axe, it is guarded by the Stanford Axe Committee and kept in a secret location, when not on display in the lobby of the Arrillaga Sports Center.
- During the Big Game, the Stanford Axe is displayed by the school that won the Big Game during the previous year. The Stanford Axe is transferred at the Big Game during what is known as "The Stare Down." With two minutes remaining in the Big Game, the Stanford Axe is brought to the 50-yard line, where the chairman of the UC Rally Committee and the Stanford Axe Committee wait until the end of the game to determine who will take the Axe. Once the game ends, the winner of the Big Game takes possession of the Axe until the next Big Game is played.

Big Game History

- Beginning with the first game played between the two schools on March 10, 1892, the rivalry between Stanford and California has grown into one of the most colorful in all of college football. Cal is Stanford's oldest rival.
- Saturday marks the 119th meeting between Stanford and Cal, which ranks tied for the eighth-longest rivalry among FBS programs. The Cardinal leads the series, 61-46-11, and has won six in a row and seven of the last nine games.
- An overflow crowd of over 20,000 filled the Haight Street Grounds in San Francisco to witness the first Big Game in 1892. Stanford's team manager, Herbert Hoover, who later became the 31st President of the United States, printed 10,000 tickets for the 15,000-seat stadium on the corner of Haight and Stryan Streets. As the crowd continued to fill the stadium, Hoover ran out of tickets and was forced to collect coins at the gate, dispensing the money in empty wash tubs and boxes.
- With the team captains from both teams on the field for pregame instructions, referee Jack Sherrard politely asked for the ball to commence the game. However, there was one slight problem -- no one had remembered to bring the ball. A fan set off on horseback to retrieve a ball from a nearby sporting goods store and the first Big Game was born. Stanford upset Cal, 14-10, and Hoover and the Cal team manager counted \$30,000 receipts from the game -- enough to finance the team for next season.
- The Big Game has been a series where "anything can happen and usually does." The 1982 game will forever be remembered for one of the most memorable and dramatic endings in college football history, known simply as "The Play."
- Stanford had taken a 20-19 lead on a 34-yard field goal by Mark Harmon with just four seconds left in the game. On the ensuing kickoff, Cal scored the game-winning touchdown on a five-lateral, 57-yard kickoff return, culminating in Cal's Kevin Moen bowling over Gary Tyrell, a trombonist in the Stanford band.
- Stanford's answer to "The Play" occurred in 1990 when the Cardinal scored nine points in the final 12 seconds to pull out an improbable 27-25 victory. Stanford quarterback Jason Palumbis connected with wide receiver Ed McCaffrey on a 19-yard touchdown pass with 12 seconds left, drawing the Cardinal to within one point at 25-24. After Stanford's two-point conversion failed, the Bears celebrated certain victory. However, the Cardinal recovered the onside kick and after Cal was penalized 15-yards on the first play of the drive, Stanford found itself at the Cal 22-yard line. John Hopkins calmly kicked a 37-yard field goal as time expired, giving the Cardinal a 27-25 victory in Berkeley.
- Stanford owns the longest winning streak, claiming seven consecutive games from 1995-2001. However, Cal rebounded to capture five straight from 2002-2006. The Bears also won five in a row from 1919-1923 and own the longest unbeaten streak of eight games from 1947-54 (two ties). The Cardinal also posted a six-game winning streak from 1961-1966.
- Stanford has produced nine shutouts in the series, with Cal recording 13, including a three-year stretch from 1936-1938. There was also a 0-0 tie at Cal in 1932.
- The highest winning point total is 63, set by Stanford in 2013. In 1975, Cal won at Stanford, 48-15, scoring the most points by the Bears in the Big Game.

• Christian McCaffrey ran for 192 yards and gained a school-record 389 all-purpose yards in another highlight-reel performance that gave the Cardinal its sixth straight win over the Golden Bears.

• Remound Wright ran for two short touchdowns and Bryce Love added a 48-yard scoring run for Stanford, which clinched the Pac-12 North with the win. Jared Goff threw for 386 yards and two touchdowns but the Bears settled for field goals three times in the red zone and fell short once again against their fiercest rival.

• Cal moved the ball well for much of the game but three times settled for field goals by Matt Anderson after getting inside the 20.

• McCaffrey broke Glyn Milburn's Stanford all-purpose record of 379 yards set in the 1990 Big Game. McCaffrey posted a school-record nine straight 100-yard rushing game while topping 300 all-purpose yards for the fourth time on the season as Stanford retained the coveted Axe for another year.

• The game was especially meaningful to graduate transfer defensive lineman Brennan Scarlett, who spent his first four years at Cal before finishing his career with the Cardinal.

It Happened Against Cal

1892 - Before an overflow crowd of 20,000 at the Haight Street Grounds in San Francisco on March 10, Stanford defeated Cal, 14-10, in the inaugural Big Game. Stanford's manager was Herbert Hoover, who later became the 31st President of the United States.

1932 - Steve Anderson boomed a 75-yard punt, tied for the second-longest punt in school history.

1956 - Lou Valli ran for 209 yards on 23 carries in a 20-18 loss in Berkeley. The rushing total still ranks as the fourth-best single-game mark in school history.

1959 - Dick Norman completed 34 of 39 passes for 401 yards and one touchdown in a 20-17 loss at Stanford Stadium.

1974 - Mike Langford booted a 50-yard field goal as time expired to lift Stanford to a 22-20 win over Cal in Berkeley. The two teams combined for 29 points in a wild fourth quarter.

1977 - Darrin Nelson rushed for 94 yards to become the sixth freshman in NCAA history to reach the 1,000-yard rushing mark in a single season.

1982 - In one of the wildest endings in college football history, Cal defeated Stanford, 25-20, after using five laterals to return a kickoff 57 yards for a game-winning touchdown. Stanford had taken a 20-19 lead on a 35-yard field goal by Mark Harmon with 0:04 left.

1984 - Paced by Brad Muster's 204 yards, Stanford rushed for 322 yards and defeated Cal, 27-10, in Berkeley.

1988 - Tuan Van Le blocked a potential game-winning 20-yard field goal by Robbie Keen with 0:04 left, as Cal and Stanford played to a 19-19 tie.

1989 - With a 3:30 p.m. start, the Big Game finished under the lights for the first time, as Stanford defeated Cal, 24-14, at Stanford Stadium.

1990 - Jon Hopkins kicked a game-winning, 39-yard field goal with no time left on the clock to give Stanford a 27-25 win in Berkeley. Jason Palumbis connected with Ed McCaffrey on a 19-yard touchdown with 0:12 left to cut Cal's lead to 25-24. Stanford recovered the onside kick on the Cal 37-yard line with 0:09 left in the game. A roughing the passer penalty moved the ball down to the 15-yard line, setting up Hopkins' game-winning field goal. Glyn Milburn finished the game with 196 yards on the ground, which ranked as the ninth-best rushing performance in school history.

1991 - Tommy Vardell rushed for 182 yards on a (then) school-record 39 carries to lead Stanford to a 38-21 win over Cal before a crowd of 85,500 at Stanford Stadium.

1992 - Stanford defeated Cal, 41-21, to gain a share of the Pac-10 championship.

1999 - Casey Moore broke loose for a 94-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter of Stanford's 31-13 victory at Stanford Stadium, marking the second-longest touchdown run in school history.

2000 - In the first-ever overtime game between the two schools, Randy Fasani connected with Casey Moore on a 25-yard touchdown pass to lift Stanford to a 36-30 victory in Berkeley.

2010 - Stanford scored on each of its first eight possessions en route to a 48-14 victory in Berkeley.

2011 - Andrew Luck threw for 257 yards and two touchdowns as Stanford beat California, 31-28, in a rain-soaked Big Game with a rare late start under the lights at Stanford Stadium.

2012 - Cal entered the game averaging 5.0 yards/rush but was held to three yards on 28 carries (3.9 inches/rush) as Stanford cruised to a 21-3 win in Berkeley. Stepfan Taylor ran for a career-high 189 yards and one touchdown in what was only the second Big Game ever not played in November or December. The only other Big Game not played in November nor December was the rivalry's inaugural in March of 1892.

2013 - Ty Montgomery exploded for five touchdowns, one on the ground and four through the air, as Stanford routed Cal, 63-13, for its fourth consecutive win in the Big Game. The 63-point output by the Cardinal was the most ever scored in a Big Game and led Stanford to its largest win over Cal in the 116-game history of the series. With the win, Stanford clinched a return to the Pac-12 championship game.

2014 - Remound Wright ran for four touchdowns, and Stanford used a smothering defensive effort to rout rival Cal, 38-17. Blake Martinez intercepted two passes and forced a fumble as the Cardinal created five turnovers.

2015 - Christian McCaffrey ran around and through the Cal defense on a 49-yard touchdown catch and also scored on a 98-yard kickoff return to help Stanford clinch a spot in the Pac-12 Championship Game by winning the Big Game, 35-22. McCaffrey ran for 192 yards and gained 389 all-purpose yards in a highlight-reel performance that gave the Cardinal its sixth straight win over the Golden Bears. Remound Wright ran for two short touchdowns and Bryce Love added a 48-yard scoring run for Stanford, which clinched the Pac-12 North with the win. The game was especially meaningful to graduate transfer defensive lineman Brennan Scarlett, who spent his first four years at Cal before finishing his career with the Cardinal.

• Situated in the heart of Silicon Valley, Stanford's student-athletes are afforded the opportunity to experience the latest in cutting-edge technology, as the origins of some of the greatest hi-tech breakthroughs and most dynamic companies can trace their roots back to The Farm:

• STRIVR Labs co-founder and former Cardinal kicker Derek Belch has created a truly immersive, fully customizable virtual reality experience specifically for football teams. The platform has already changed the way Stanford's student-athletes prepare, and high school, college, and NFL teams are close behind.

• With the help of the Cardinal football team, a group of Stanford doctors and neuroscientists have been working to quantify the head trauma that players sustain during a game. The researchers developed custom mouth guards equipped with accelerometers and gyrometers that measure linear and rotational acceleration -- essentially, how violently the head gets whipped around during a game. The data from the sensors, which the scientists pull from the mouth guards after games and practices throughout the season, provides critical baseline data of how many jarring hits players typically experience.

• Temperature-regulation research of Stanford biologists H. Craig Heller and Dennis Grahn led to a device that rapidly cools body temperature and greatly improves exercise recovery.

This is the sort of claim you see in spam email subject lines, not in discussions of mammalian thermoregulation. By taking advantage of specialized heat-transfer veins in the palms of hands, "the glove" can rapidly cool athletes' core temperatures -- and dramatically improve exercise recovery and performance.

• The program partnered with APTUS Sports to maximize athletic and academic development. Prior to the season, each player completed 10 game-like exercises in 30 minutes on a special tablet that assessed how quickly and accurately they learn, react and adjust. APTUS analyzed individual, group and team data, and reported the findings to the coaching staff.

• In 2012, Stanford became the first college program to use iPad playbooks, saving countless trees, dollars and man-hours.

• Stanford is the nation's only team to play 11 Power 5 programs (and Notre Dame), six road games and no FCS programs. Along with Stanford, the nation's only three teams to face 11 Power 5 programs (and Notre Dame) are USC, Texas and Oregon. Stanford and Oregon are the only two teams to play six road games.

• Stanford has completed five seasons with 11 wins over FBS programs, the most this decade by any team. Alabama, Boise State, Ohio State and Oregon each have four.

- Stanford is one of 10 teams in the nation with at least eight wins in each of the past six seasons (2010-15), joining Alabama, Boise State, Florida State, LSU, Northern Illinois, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Oregon and Wisconsin.
- Stanford joins Clemson, Duke, Northwestern and Wisconsin as the only FBS football teams to earn APR Public Recognition Awards from the NCAA in each of the past four years.
- The Cardinal has made a school-record seven straight bowl appearances, the Pac-12's second-longest active streak.
- No Pac-12 Conference team has had more draftees over the past five years than Stanford (24).
- Following the 2015 season, Stanford became the only school ever ranked in the top-4 by U.S. News and World Report (4th) and the Associated Press (3rd). The only three games without at least 100 yards rushing during that stretch were 2014 losses at No. 9 Notre Dame (47) and No. 17 Arizona State (76), 2015 loss at Northwestern (85), and 2016 losses at Washington (29), vs. Washington State (61) and Colorado (93). Stanford has not recorded fewer than 100 yards rushing in a victory since the second game of 2012 (92 yards vs. Duke).

• The Cardinal has rushed for at least 300 yards twice in 2016 (302 vs. USC, 365 vs. Oregon State). Stanford is 7-0 under head coach David Shaw when rushing for 300 yards or more.

• The Cardinal has won the time-of-possession battle in 24 of its past 30 games. In 13 of its past 25 games, Stanford has held the ball for nine or more minutes than opponents.

• Stanford led the nation in time of possession in 2015 (34:48), the seventh-best clip in the past 20 years. The Cardinal is the only team with two top-10 single-season time of possession rankings over the past 20 years. The Cardinal is second nationally since 2010 in time of possession (32:58).

• The Cardinal has held the ball over 40 minutes in a game five times this decade.

• The #WildCaff is back. Christian McCaffrey, the 2015 AP Player of the Year, looks to build on a record-breaking sophomore season. The do-it-all communication major is Stanford's top returning rusher, receiver, kick returner, punt returner and touchdown passer. Here's a snapshot of his historic 2015 campaign:

- NCAA single-season all-purpose yards record holder (3,864)
- Only FBS player to lead team in rushing and receiving yardage
- Top four FBS individual all-purpose single-game performances
- Owned three of five 100-yard rushing and receiving games by an FBS player

• McCaffrey's 17 100-yard rushing games since the start of the 2015 season are tied with San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey for most in FBS over that span.

• Along with Louisiana-Lafayette's Elijah McGuire, McCaffrey is one of only two active FBS players with 2,000 career yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving. McCaffrey is only one of six Pac-12 players since 1996 to reach that milestone, and the third such player in Stanford history (Darrin Nelson and Brad Muster).

• The last Pac-12 player to lead the nation in all-purpose yards was USC's Reggie Bush (McCaffrey wears jersey No. 5 as a reminder of Bush, who was one of his favorite players to watch while growing up). Other Pac-12 all-purpose champions include Heisman Trophy winners O.J. Simpson, Charles White and Marcus Allen.

• McCaffrey and Bush are the only two Power 5 players in the past 20 years to average over 130 rushing and 35 receiving yards/game.

• Since 1996, only three players have amassed over 700 all-purpose yards against the same opponent in a two-game span:

• McCaffrey carried 98 times (in five games) as a sophomore before scoring his first rushing touchdown. He ran for his first score as a junior on his 12th carry of the season. Christian McCaffrey ran for two touchdowns of 35+ yards in the season opener against Kansas State. He rushed for one touchdown of 35+ yards in all of his historic 2015 season.

• McCaffrey exploded for 225 all-purpose yards at Arizona, which included 169 yards rushing. McCaffrey accounted for two rushing touchdowns and one receiving score.

• McCaffrey has been good for at least 200 all-purpose yards 17 times since the start of 2015.

McCaffrey Electrifies

STANFORD, Calif. - As Stanford's offense sputtered in the second half, Christian McCaffrey kept urging his teammates on that the offense could be better. Then he finally took matters into his own hands and iced away another win.

McCaffrey scored his second touchdown on a late 41-yard run that helped lead No. 8 Stanford to a 26-13 victory over Kansas State in the season opener for both teams.

Stanford had just 30 yards in the second half before McCaffrey's long touchdown run following a failed onside kick by Kansas State put the game away.

After a fast start led by quarterback Ryan Burns in his first career start, the Cardinal was far from a machine in the second half. With a new quarterback and three new offensive linemen, Stanford struggled to get anything going with a fumble and four punts to start the second half.

But a defense that had eight sacks, one safety and two turnovers made sure it wasn't an issue.

Burns started fast by completing his first 10 passes, including a 40-yard touchdown strike to Michael Rector on the opening play of the second quarter.

McCaffrey then got into the act with an electrifying 35-yard touchdown run. He froze safety Kendall Adams with a juke and raced to the end zone for the score.

He finished 126 yards on 22 carries and 210 all-purpose yards in the opener this year.

The biggest highlight might have been a play that didn't even count. McCaffrey fielded a punt at his own, and made his way through almost the entire Kansas State coverage unit for a 97-yard score. The only problem was an illegal block by Curtis Robinson that wiped it all out and forced Stanford to start a drive on its own 2.

Stanford Methodically Defeats USC

STANFORD, Calif. - This was typical Stanford.

A heavy dose of methodical mashing, a bit of everything from Christian McCaffrey and a couple little wrinkles that caught USC totally off guard.

McCaffrey slipped out of the backfield for a 56-yard touchdown reception and dived over the pile for a 1-yard score as the seventh-ranked Cardinal beat USC, 27-10.

The win for the Cardinal was the seventh in the most recent nine games against the Trojans, the best nine-game stretch for the Cardinal in the history of a rivalry that covers 96 games and 111 years. Stanford has also beaten USC three times within the last calendar year.

McCaffrey had a routine 260 all-purpose yards. Stanford ran it 48 times for 302 yards, threw 14 passes and held the ball for 34:14.

The Cardinal drew most of the USC defense into the box with a steady dose of inside runs before receiver Michael Rector went 56 yards for a touchdown on a reverse with 3:26 left in the third quarter to make it 27-10.

At that point, the Cardinal played the keep-away game they love so much.

USC fell to 1-2 for the first time since 2001, when the Trojans started 1-4 in Pete Carroll's debut season as coach.

McCaffrey was the workhorse between the tackles, carrying 30 times for 165 yards. McCaffrey went over 200 all-purpose yards for the eighth straight game.

Stanford Rallies Past UCLA

PASADENA, Calif. - UCLA contained Christian McCaffrey, kept Stanford's offense out of the end zone and generated just enough points to lead the Pac-12 champions until the Cardinal's final drive.

And then everything reverted to usual form in this one-sided California rivalry.

J.J. Arcega-Whiteside caught an 8-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Burns with 24 seconds to play, and No. 7 Stanford rallied for its ninth consecutive victory over the Bruins, 22-13.

McCaffrey rushed for 138 yards for the Cardinal, but they struggled on offense for three and a half quarters. Stanford got the ball back with 2:05 left and coolly put together a 70-yard drive capped by Burns' fade to Arcega-Whiteside, who got one foot inbounds on an acrobatic play.

Solomon Thomas then returned Josh Rosen's fumble 42 yards for a touchdown on the game's final play, punctuating the heartbreak for a lively Rose Bowl crowd. Even with that touchdown, Stanford had its lowest-scoring performance since the 2015 season opener.

Another stirring Stanford victory was another soul-crushing loss for the Bruins, who haven't beaten their upstate rivals since 2008. They had never even led the Cardinal for more than six minutes in any of those eight straight losses, but UCLA nursed an advantage in this one for nearly three quarters -- until Stanford snatched it away again.

Washington Rolls Past Stanford

SEATTLE - No. 10 Washington handed Stanford a 44-6 defeat in front of a packed Husky Stadium, the Cardinal's worst loss since a 41-3 setback against Arizona State in 2007.

Jake Browning threw for 210 yards and three touchdowns, Myles Gaskin added 100 yards rushing and two scores, and Washington claimed its most lopsided victory over an AP top 10 team since beating No. 5 USC, 31-0, in 1990. That game 26 years ago announced Washington as a national contender and it went on to share the national title a year later with Miami.

It was Washington's biggest win over a top 10 team, bettering a 36-point victory over Wisconsin in 1959.

Browning was the leader of an efficient offense that scored on seven of nine drives. He threw touchdown passes of 3 yards to Dante Pettis, 19 yards to John Ross and 3 yards to Aaron Fuller with 5:30 remaining. Browning was 15 of 21 and did not commit a turnover.

Equally important was Washington's ability to establish a running game. The Huskies rushed for 214 yards and averaged 5.2 yards per carry.

Christian McCaffrey was held to 49 yards rushing on 12 carries and five catches for 30 yards.

It was McCaffrey's fewest yards rushing since 2014 at California when he had 19 yards on three carries.

Stanford's only touchdown came late in the third quarter on a 19-yard pass from Ryan Burns to J.J. Arcega-Whiteside.

Burns was 15 of 22 for 151 yards, but Washington controlled the line of scrimmage on both sides. Stanford quarterbacks were sacked eight times, six in the first half. Stanford had allowed only four total sacks in the first three games combined.

Washington State Tops Stanford

STANFORD, Calif. - Washington State's Luke Falk threw for 357 yards and four touchdowns and the Cougars' defensive line shut down Christian McCaffrey and the Cardinal offense in a 42-16 victory.

The Cougars held the Cardinal to 296 yards of offense and did not allow an offensive score until the final play of the game.

Falk connected with Tavares Martin Jr. twice in the first half and added two second-half touchdown passes.

Stanford had an eight-game winning streak against Washington State snapped, and lost for the first time in all-black uniforms, which have been worn for at least one game annually since 2010.

The 15th-ranked Cardinal fell behind late in the first quarter and trailed throughout. A 26-yard third-quarter pick-six by Frank Buncom gave Stanford some hope, cutting the deficit to 21-10. But Washington State followed with three touchdowns to build a 42-10 lead.

McCaffrey finished with 35 yards rushing on eight carries, and had 83 all-purpose yards -- breaking a national-leading streak of 19 consecutive games with at least 100 all-purpose yards.

Quarterback Ryan Burns got the start and most of the action, but Keller Chryst received more playing time than he had before, mostly late in the game. But after throwing an interception that led to Washington State's final touchdown, Burns re-entered the game and led the Cardinal on its longest drive of the night -- 67 yards, the last of which came on a touchdown pass to JJ Arcega-Whiteside on the game's final play.

Burns completed 19 of 25 passes for a career-high 222 yards, and threw an interception and a touchdown pass. Chryst was 2-of-9 passing for 13 yards.

Stanford reached the Washington State red zone twice -- at the end of each half. On the final play of the second quarter, Michael Rector was tackled at the Washington State 7-yard line with a 44-yard gain on a pass from Burns as time expired. The other resulted in the final touchdown.

In an odd twist, Conrad Ukropina had two long field-goal tries bounce off the left upright -- both in the first half with the score fairly close. He accounted for Stanford's only points of the first half, on a 43-yard field goal at the outset of the first quarter. Meanwhile, a pair of Falk-to-Martin touchdown passes pushed the Cougars ahead 14-3 at halftime, the first being a 5-yarder in the back of the end zone with 2:12 left in the opening quarter.

Stanford finished with 61 yards rushing, for an average of 2.3 yards per carry.

Stanford Rallies to Beat Notre Dame

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - Nothing seemed to be going right for Stanford until cornerback Quenton Meeks changed the momentum when he intercepted a pass by Notre Dame's DeShone Kizer and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown.

Bryce Love dove into the end zone from seven yards out to start the fourth quarter and cap the comeback in a 17-10 victory as Stanford rallied back from a 10-point deficit.

Stanford, playing without injured Christian McCaffrey, added a 2-point conversion on a pitch to Love, who ran in untouched.

Stanford, which started the season ranked No. 8, averted losing three straight for the first time since 2007. The Irish ranked No. 10 in the preseason, lost a third straight home game for the first time since 2007.

Notre Dame had a chance to tie it in the closing seconds. But DeShone Kizer couldn't get a pass off on fourth-and-10 from the 14. He was about to be sacked and he appeared to try to pitch the ball to left guard Quenton Nelson, but the officials ruled it a fumble and blew the ball dead. It was the fourth time this season where the Irish had a chance to tie or win the game on the final possession and couldn't do it.

Meeks, who missed the previous two games with an injury, picked off Kizer on the first possession of the second half to cut the score to 10-7.

Malik Zaire replaced Kizer for three possessions but couldn't get anything going and the Irish gave up a safety when a snap from center Sam Mustipher, who had three bad snaps in the hurricane last week against North Carolina State, snapped the ball through the end zone.

Kelly said Kizer wasn't injured, he was just looking for a spark.

The Cardinal, who had one offensive touchdown in each of their last three games, continued to struggle offensively but came up with the big play when it needed it. Stanford drove 47 yards on 12 plays on its opening possession, but Conrad Ukropina's 45-yard field goal attempt bounced off the upright.

STANFORD, Calif. - Stanford committed four turnovers and sustained a disappointing 10-5 defeat to Colorado on Reunion Homecoming at Stanford Stadium.

The Buffaloes intercepted three passes and recovered a fourth-quarter fumble deep in their territory to beat the Cardinal for the first time in six meetings.

Colorado dominated much of the game but allowed the Cardinal to stay close by missing three field goals, two inside the 30.

Running back Christian McCaffrey returned to the starting lineup but couldn't ignite the struggling offense. He finished with 92 yards on 21 carries, but his longest run was 11 yards.

Ryan Burns had a difficult day, completing 16 of 29 attempts for 170 yards and was picked off three times. A costly fumble on first and goal at the Colorado 4 with 10:34 remaining in the fourth quarter came when Burns mishandled the exchange from center Jesse Burkett.

That spoiled a gallant effort by the Stanford defense, which yielded a game-high 131 rushing yards to Phillip Lindsay. Led by Solomon Thomas and Joey Alfieri, the unit produced five sacks.

Although Colorado out-rushed Stanford, 224-93, its 10 points were the fewest by the Buffs in a winning cause since a 6-0 victory at Missouri in 1992.

Through three quarters, Colorado out-rushed Stanford, 187-69. Still, thanks to the missed field goals, the Cardinal trailed only 7-3.

A 60-yard punt by Jake Bailey pinned Colorado at its own 6, and the defense forced a quick punt.

Starting from his 34, Burns hit Trenton Irwin on third-and-8 for 16 yards. A personal foul tacked on 15 yards to the Colorado 15, where two McCaffrey runs gave Stanford first-and-goal at the 4. But the snap was fumbled and Bay Area product Kenneth Olugbode recovered.

The Cardinal defense gave the offense another opportunity but again it resulted in a turnover. On third-and-15 from his own 30, Burns was intercepted by strong safety Tedric Thompson, who returned it 30 yards to the Stanford 20.

This time, Colorado capitalized. Although the defense dug in, Chris Graham converted a 23-yard field goal to give the Buffs a 10-3 lead with 2:30 left.

The Cardinal caught a break on the ensuing kickoff when the ball sailed out of bounds. But Burns was intercepted again.

Colorado took an intentional safety with four seconds to play, and Stanford ran one play before time expired.

McCaffrey Scores Three Touchdowns at Arizona

TUCSON, Ariz. - Christian McCaffrey took the handoff up the middle, made a little juke and, with a burst of speed, raced past Arizona's flailing defenders.

This was the player Stanford had been missing the past few weeks.

McCaffrey returned to his tackle-eluding form, accounting for 225 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns to lead the Cardinal to a 34-10 victory over Arizona.

Good early in the season, McCaffrey missed most of the second half against Washington State on Oct. 8 and did not play the following week against Notre Dame. McCaffrey returned against Colorado last week, finishing with 92 yards rushing on 21 carries.

The shifty junior had a jump in his step against the Wildcats, scoring on runs of 45 and 6 yards to finish with 169 yards on 23 carries. McCaffrey added four catches for 27 yards, including an 18-yard catch-and-run touchdown.

Bryce Love chipped in 78 yards on 12 carries while giving McCaffrey a break and helped the Cardinal break out of scoring funk.

In his first career start, junior quarterback Keller Chryst made some good decisions at the line of scrimmage, picking up alignments and blitzes, and threw a pair of touchdown passes. He also missed a few passes that could have gone for big plays, finishing with 104 yards and an interception on 14-of-30 passing.

Arizona had its top two quarterbacks back for the first time since the season opener, yet continued to sputter offensively in its fifth straight loss.

Brandon Dawkins started and threw for 116 yards, including a 38-yard touchdown pass to Trey Griffey. Dawkins also had 65 yards on 17 yards rushing on 17 carries. Anu Solomon replaced him in the third quarter and lasted just two series, finishing 0-for-3 passing.

Part of it was a lack of running game. With Nick Wilson out for an extended period, Arizona was forced to use Grant, a converted receiver, as starting running back.

Grant finished with 64 yards, but Arizona had just 170 yards on 44 carries and finished 286 total yards, 147 below its season average.

Stanford showed off what it can do offensively when McCaffrey is healthy. The Cardinal defense also held up against Arizona's quick-hitting attack, putting them within a game of becoming bowl eligible.

McCaffrey's Big Day Leads Stanford over Oregon State

STANFORD, Calif. - With a young quarterback making his second career start, Stanford head coach David Shaw was fully comfortable having his team run the ball on its final 29 plays from scrimmage.

With a backfield tandem of 2015 AP Player of the Year Christian McCaffrey and promising sophomore Bryce Love, Shaw's decision was really a no-brainer.

McCaffrey rushed for 199 yards and a touchdown, Love scored on a 56-yard touchdown run and Stanford beat Oregon State, 26-15.

Conrad Ukropina kicked a career-high four field goals, including a personal best-tying 52-yarder in the first half.

The Cardinal did it behind another strong outing by its defense, which intercepted Beavers quarterback Marcus McMaryion twice in the second half.

More importantly, Stanford piled up 365 yards rushing and controlled the ball for more than 39 minutes.

McCaffrey, whose 51-yard run in the first half helped set up Ukropina's second field goal, scored on a one-yard run in the third quarter.

It was the 16th 100-yard game for McCaffrey since the start of the 2015 season.

Love, a sophomore who filled in when McCaffrey was injured earlier this season, finished with 89 yards on nine carries.

Stanford's ground game was key on a day Chryst was more effective running the ball than throwing it in his second career start. Chryst completed 10 of 17 passes for 60 yards but rushed for 83 including a 44-yard keeper that set up McCaffrey's touchdown.

McCaffrey Runs for Three Scores, Stanford Beats Oregon

EUGENE, Ore. - Stanford quarterback Keller Chryst finally found a groove for his third start.

The junior quarterback threw for 258 yards and three touchdowns in Stanford's 52-27 victory over Oregon.

Stanford improved to 3-0 with Chryst at quarterback. His breakout -- along with Christian McCaffrey's big day -- provided some offensive equilibrium for the Cardinal. McCaffrey ran for 135 yards and three touchdowns.

McCaffrey ran for a 61-yard touchdown to put Stanford up early. After Oregon lost the ball on a fumble, McCaffrey scored again on a 5-yard touchdown run. He needed just 20 yards rushing going into the game to reach the 1,000-yard mark for the second straight season.

McCaffrey, who also scored on a 14-yard run in the first half, looked to regain his form from one week prior with 199 yards rushing in a 26-15 victory over Oregon State.

McCaffrey also caught five passes for 52 yards against Oregon.

Oregon freshman quarterback Justin Herbert, who started his fifth game after taking over for graduate transfer Dakota Prukop, threw for 272 yards and two touchdowns. But he also threw two interceptions.

Royce Freeman ran for 111 yards and a touchdown for Oregon. The Ducks' main problems were on defense, allowing Stanford 540 yards of total offense. It was the first time this season the Cardinal had 250 or more yards both via pass and on the ground this season.

Kani Benoit's 7-yard touchdown run for Oregon in the final quarter made it 52-20 and allowed the Ducks to preserve their streak of games with 20 or more points to 40, the longest active streak in the nation.
