### AN OREGON WIN WOULD...

- Mark the 644th win in program history.
- Improve Oregon to 5-2 for the first time since 2014 and improve Willie Taggart to 5-2 at UO.
- Give the Ducks consecutive wins at Stanford Stadium and the third in the last four trips there.
- Mark the third consecutive win and the fifth victory in the last seven games for the road team in the series since 2011.

### SERIES NOTES

- Oregon continues its 122nd football season when the Ducks visit No. 23 Stanford for the 81st all-time series meeting.
- Stanford won last year's meeting in Eugene, 52-27, snapping a two-game Oregon winning streak in the series.
- The Ducks are 32-47-1 all-time vs. Stanford, including a 15-29-1 record at Stanford.
- UO has won 11 of the last 15 games in the series since 2002 and five of the last seven at Stanford.

### TOP OF THE CHARTS

- Oregon leads the nation with 24 sacks.
- The Ducks are tied for 10th in the nation in scoring offense (43.0 points per game), while ranking first in rushing touchdowns (25) and total TDs (Tied-36).
- UO is tied for third nationally with 258 points.
- After ranking 115th in FBS in total defense a year ago, the Ducks are currently 29th.

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- The Oregon offensive line was one of 21 o-lines to make the mid-season honor roll for the Joe Moore Award
- SR RB Royce Freeman** is fourth in the nation in total touchdowns scored (10), while **SR RB Kani Benoit** is tied for 17th (8).
- Freeman** is third in the nation in rushing touchdowns (10) and tied for eighth in total points scored (60), while ranking 19th in scoring (10.0 ppg).
- Benoit** has eight TD runs on 45 carries (1 TD every 5.63 carries)
- Oregon leads the Pac-12 Conference in points per game (43.0), points (258), touchdowns (36), rushing touchdowns (25), passing yards per completion (13.56), team sacks (4.00), team tackles for loss (8.2) and 3rd down conversion percentage defense (0.245).

## TEAM GAME NOTES

### WASHINGTON STATE 33, OREGON 10

- Oregon fell to 4-2 with a 33-10 loss to Washington State last Saturday at Autzen Stadium.
- Oregon took a 10-7 lead in the first quarter but was held scoreless the rest of the game.
- RB Royce Freeman** rushed 12 times for 65 yards, while true freshman **QB Braxton Burmeister** was 15-for-27 with 145 yards, one TD and two INTs in his first start.
- The Ducks recorded four sacks and 6.0 tackles for loss while forcing two turnovers.

### DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

- Under new defensive coordinator **Jim Leavitt**, the Oregon defense has undergone significant improvement in the national rankings over final-season finishes a year ago.

- Oregon leads the nation with 24 sacks and has recorded four sacks in three consecutive games for the first time since 2015. The Ducks have four-plus sacks in four of six games this season.

### DEFENSIVE PROWESS

- After finishing 122nd a year ago in third down defense (48.4%), the Ducks rank fifth (24.5%) this season.
- Oregon ranks tied for ninth in tackles for loss (8.2 per game, 49 total), and 10th in rushing defense.
- The Ducks have limited opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in three of their five games this season, a feat matched in the Pac-12 this season by only Colorado and Utah.

### ROAD WARRIORS

- Saturday's game features two of the three best Power 5 road teams in conference games since 2010 in Oregon and Stanford.
- Oregon ranks fourth among Power 5 schools with 24 conference road wins this decade, with Stanford tied with Alabama for the lead during that span with 26 (Ohio State 3rd with 25).
- This includes road conference winning streaks for the Ducks of 15 games (2010-13) and eight games (2014-15).
- Oregon (24-7, .774) and Stanford (26-8, .765) rank fourth and fifth, respectively, in conference road winning percentage this decade.

- Overall, Oregon is 27-9 on the road since 2010, tied with TCU for the fifth-best winning percentage nationally during the decade.
- When allowing less than 40 points, Oregon is 22-3 in Pac-12 road games this decade.

### YOUNG GUNS

- Seven true freshmen have started for the Ducks this year (**QB Braxton Burmeister**, **WR Johnny Johnson III**, **NG Austin Faolii**, **CB Thomas Graham Jr.**, **S Nick Pickett**, **NG Jordon Scott**, **P Adam Stack**). The team has also started redshirt freshman **TE Cam McCormick** as well as eight sophomores.
- The seven true freshmen starters is tied with Boise State for fourth in FBS (Illinois 10, LSU and Baylor 8).
- A total of 13 true freshmen have made their collegiate debuts for the Ducks. In addition to the six starters, UO has also played the following six true freshmen: **RB Darrian Felix**, **S Billy Gibson**, **CB Deommodore Lenoir**, **WR Darrian McNeal**, **LB Sampson Niu**, and **WR Jaylon Redd**.

### PAC AND PLAY

- Oregon is tied for the Pac-12 Conference lead in scoring offense (43.0) and leads the league in sacks (24) and 3rd down defense (24.5%).
- The Ducks are also second in the Pac-12 in rushing defense (93.7), third in both total offense (494.0) and rushing offense (239.3), and tied for first in tackles for loss (49).
- The Ducks have finished in the top five in scoring offense nationally in six of the last seven years and in the top 10 in eight of the last nine years.

### APPLE GREEN TURNOVER

- Since 2010, Oregon leads FBS in turnover margin per game, averaging a +0.81 per game (Oklahoma State +0.66, Alabama +0.64).
- Oregon has forced at least one turnover in 86 of 99 games this decade, the fifth-highest total during that time.
- Oregon has forced two-plus turnovers in 65 games this decade, the most in the nation.
- The Ducks have forced an average of 2.18 turnovers per game in the last eight seasons, trailing only Houston in FBS (2.29).
- The Ducks lead the nation in points off turnovers per game since 2010.
- The Ducks also lead the nation since 2010 in per game differential in points off turnovers, averaging a +4.21 difference per game (Alabama +3.96, Ohio St. +3.72).

## TEAM GAME NOTES

### FIVE ALIVE

- Oregon scored five touchdowns vs. Cal, the 79th time since 2010 the Ducks have scored five or more TDs in one game, the highest total in the nation (Baylor 63, Alabama 59).
- With 99 total games played since 2010, this means that the Ducks have five-plus touchdowns in 79.8% of games this decade.

### HEAD COACH WILLIE TAGGART

- Oregon is 4-2 under **Willie Taggart**, and the Ducks' head coach owns a 22-9 record since 2015 (.710), including a 14-5 mark in conference play (.737).
- **Taggart** is in his ninth season as a head coach, and his USF teams were 18-7 the last two seasons (excluding the bowl games), including a 13-3 conference record.

### THE GRADUATES

- A total of 12 members of the Oregon football team are graduates and are pursuing advanced degrees, which ties the Ducks for the fifth-most of any FBS program in the country (Northwestern 18, Coastal Carolina 14, Cincinnati and Toledo 13; five others also have 12).
- The following Ducks have already received degrees: **Taylor Alie, Kani Benoit, Doug Brenner, Tanner Carew, Royce Freeman, Ivan Faulhaber, Elijah George, Ty Griffin, Charles Nelson, Henry Mondeaux, Tyree Robinson** and **Juwaan Williams**.

### ON THE RECORD

- Oregon visits No. 23 Stanford this weekend. The Ducks are 20-10 vs. Top 25 opponents since 2010, a .667 winning percentage that ranks third nationally, trailing only Alabama (.784) and Ohio State (.690).
- Oregon is 62-22 (.738) vs. Power 5 opponents since 2010, the seventh-best mark nationally during that time.
- UO is 37-19 (.655) vs. teams over .500 over the last seven seasons, the ninth-best mark nationally during that time.

### IN THE LEAGUE

- Oregon is 52-16 (.765) overall in Pac-12 Conference play since 2010, the seventh-best conference winning percentage among Power 5 schools.
- The Ducks lead the nation in scoring offense per game in conference games since 2010 at 42.29 points per game.
- Despite a 2-7 league mark in 2016, the Ducks were 47-7 (.870) in the Pac-12 from 2010-15, an .875 winning percentage that led the nation during that six-year span.
- Oregon has 52 conference wins this decade, tied with Clemson for fourth among Power 5 schools (Alabama/Stanford 56, Ohio State 53).

### DECADE OF THE DUCK

- The decade of the 2010s has been Oregon's most prolific, as the Ducks are 77-22 (.778) during the 2010s, the eighth-best winning percentage in FBS during the decade.
- The Ducks are 43-9 (.827) at Autzen Stadium since 2010, the 11th-best home mark nationally during the decade.
- Oregon allowed only 24 points against Cal, and the Ducks are 44-2 during the decade when allowing 24 or fewer points.

### DOUBLE DIGITS DURING THE DECADE

- Oregon has won at least 12 games during the 2010s four times, one of the only three programs to do so (Alabama, Ohio State 5).
- The Ducks are also one of only six programs to win at least 11 games in five seasons during the decade and one of 12 with at least five 10-win seasons during the decade.

### POLL POSITION/SCHEDULE SITUATION

- The Ducks were ranked 24th in both the Coaches and AP Polls but dropped out after the loss at Arizona State and remain unranked.
- Oregon has now been ranked in at least one poll at some point during the season for 20 consecutive years (since 1998).
- The Ducks face seven teams this season who appeared in 2016 bowl games: Nebraska, Wyoming, Utah, Washington State, Stanford, Utah, and Washington.
- The Ducks ended a five-game losing streak to Nebraska on Sept. 9 and extended their winning streak over Wyoming to two games. Oregon's 10-game winning streak over Arizona State ended on Sept. 23, and Oregon defeated Cal to snap a 1-year skid. The Ducks also lost their third in a row to Washington State.
- Oregon will look to increase series winning streaks over UCLA (5), Utah (1), and Arizona (1) while attempting to end series losing streaks vs. Stanford (1), Washington (1) and Oregon State (1).

### PROJECT ELEVATE

- The uniform worn by the Ducks vs. Nebraska was perhaps the most inspiring and important in team history.
- Three childhood cancer survivors, Ethan Frank, Joe MacDonald, and Sophia Malinoski, teamed with Nike designers and three Duck football players (**Tyrell Crosby, Justin Hollins** and **Khalil Oliver**) on this project, which was known as "Project Elevate."
- Ethan, Joe, and Sophia were all in attendance at the game, and all received game balls from the team in the locker room following the game.

Started at running back in 10 games while adding a 10th score with a 1-yard catch at Utah ... Named honorable mention all-conference ... Eclipsed the 100-yard plateau five times, including his last three games of the year vs. Stanford, Utah and Oregon State, with his 22nd career effort over the century mark placing him second in Oregon history ... Rushed for a season-high 207 yards, including a season-long 85-yard TD run, against Virginia on a season-high 21 carries ... ## ROYCE FREEMAN

### FREEMAN ACTIVE NCAA LEADER

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** rushed for 62 yards in Oregon's loss to Washington State to remain the NCAA's leading active rusher. Freeman heads into Saturday's game at Stanford with 4,800 yards. The Duck running back is 332 yards ahead of Northwestern's **Justin Jackson**.
- **Freeman** has rushed for 1,566 more yards than anyone else playing in the Pac-12 Conference. Washington's **Myles Gaskin** is second with 3,243 yards.
- **Freeman** also leads all active players in rushing touchdowns with 54. He has scored seven more TDs than Western Michigan's **Jarvion Franklin**. Only 15 active players have as many as 30 rushing touchdowns, while three (Freeman, Franklin and Troy's **Jordan Chunn**) have 40-or-more rushing TDs.

### FREEMAN CLOSING IN ON 5,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** joined **LaMichael James** (2009-11) as the only two Ducks in history to rush for more than 4,000 yards during their careers. Freeman reached the milestone in Oregon's win at No. 12 Utah last season. In addition to being one of two 4,000-yard rushers, Freeman is one of only four Oregon running backs to rush for more than 3,000 yards (James, Freeman, **Kenjon Barner** - 2009-12, **Derek Loville** - 1986-89) and one of just 16 Oregon Ducks to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau. He achieved that milestone in just his 21st career game.
- **Freeman** needs 200 yards to join **James** in the 5,000-yard rushing club and 283 yards to pass him for the all-time rushing lead at Oregon.

### FREEMAN THIRD AT OREGON IN CAREER ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** passed **Derek Loville** (1986-89) and **De'Anthony Thomas** (2011-13) for third all-time on Oregon's career all-purpose yards list in the Wyoming game.
- He added 100 yards at Arizona State, 51 yards against Cal and 70 vs. Washington State to move his career total to 5,586 yards.
- **Freeman** became just the fifth Oregon player in school history to surpass the 5,000 career all-purpose yard mark in the Nebraska game.
- **Freeman** needs 284 yards to break **LaMichael James'** (2009-11) record of 5,869 yards. Freeman will pass **Kenjon Barner** (2009-12) for second with 263 more yards.

### FREEMAN LOOKING TO BE JUST 2ND DUCK RB TO REACH 5,000 CAREER YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** enters the Stanford game with 4,826 career yards of total offense.
- He has 4,800 rushing yards and 26 passing yards during his career.
- **Freeman** needs 174 yards to join **LaMichael James** (2009-11) as the only two Duck running backs with 5,000 career yards of total offense.

### NEXT FREEMAN 100-YARD GAME TIES OREGON CAREER RECORD

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** rushed for 157 yards on

a career-high 30 carries at Wyoming to notch his 25th career (third this season) 100-yard rushing game.

- **Freeman**, who also has two 200-yard rushing games, had five 100-yard games in 2016 after rushing for more than 100 yards 11 times as a sophomore and six times as a true freshman.
- **Freeman** rushed for 153 yards on 29 carries against Nebraska.
- **Freeman** rushed for 150 yards on 23 carries against Southern Utah in the Ducks' opener.
- **Freeman's** 25 100-yard games are the second most in school history. **LaMichael James** (2009-11) holds the school record with 26.
- **Freeman's** 81 yards rushing at Arizona State snapped a streak of six straight 100-yard games dating back to last season.

### FREEMAN LOOKING TO BE OREGON'S UNDISPUTED TD CHAMP

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** enters the Stanford game tied for the all-time lead with **LaMichael James** (2009-11) in career touchdowns with 58, while leading James by one in rushing TDs.
- **Freeman** passed James for the rushing TD title with his 10th of the season at Arizona State.
- In addition to the TD at ASU, **Freeman** rushed for four TDs against Southern Utah in the opener, for three TDs at Wyoming and added two more against Nebraska.

### FREEMAN TIES JAMES FOR MOST CAREER POINTS AT OREGON

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** tied **LaMichael James** (2009-11) for the most points in school history when he scored his 10th touchdown of the season at Arizona State.
- **Freeman** and **James** both have 348 career points.

### FREEMAN CLIMBING PAC-12 ALL-TIME LISTS

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** is not only moving up in the Oregon record books, but he's also climbing both the Pac-12 Conference's career rushing and career rushing touchdowns top-10 lists.
- **Freeman** enters Saturday's game at Stanford fifth in career rushing yards in the Pac-12. Freeman needs 11 yards against the Cardinal to pass USC's **Marcus Allen** for fourth.
- **Freeman** moved into solo possession of second place, ahead of former Duck **LaMichael James**, with his 54th rushing TD in the Arizona State game.
- **Freeman** needs six more rushing TDs in his career to set a new Pac-12 Conference record.

### FREEMAN TOP 40 RUSHER IN CFB HISTORY

- **SR RB Royce Freeman** has steadily moved his way up the list of all-time rushers in college football history. Entering the Stanford game, according to SRCFB, Freeman is the 34th leading rusher in NCAA history with 4,800 yards.
- With 100 yards against the Cardinal, **Freeman** will move into 29th on the all-time list ahead of **Thurman Thomas**.
- With 200 yards he will become just the 22nd college player to rush for 5,000 career yards.

- Awards criteria exemplified were effort and consistency.
- The honor cited the Ducks leading the nation in rushing TDs (25), being tied for first in total TDs (36) and rushing for 239.3 yards per game.

### CROSBY GETTING ALL-AMERICAN ATTENTION

- Pro Football Focus (@PFF\_College) released its All-American team after the fourth week of the season, and **SR OT Tyrell Crosby** was one of 12 players named to the team. Crosby scored a 90.3 rating which was the highest of any offensive tackle in the country and the second highest rating for any offensive lineman. Arkansas center **Frank Ragnow** had a 92.9 rating.

### CROSBY IN LATEST PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS RATINGS

- No. 3 rated offensive tackle in the nation and No. 2 in the Pac-12 Conference.
- No. 2 rated left tackle in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference.

- Crosby's** 84.1 overall grade ranked No. 2 among Pac-12 offensive tackles for the week of the Washington State game.
- Crosby** allowed no pressures in 36 pass block snaps against the Cougars.

- Herbert** reached 3,000 passing yards faster than any Duck quarterback in school history.
- Herbert** bested **Marcus Mariota's** school record of 15 games.
- Herbert's** path to 3,000 yards passing also outpaced **Dan Fouts** (16 games), **Joey Harrington** (17 games), **Bill Musgrave** (18 games), **Danny O'Neil** (18 games), **Akili Smith** (18 games) and **Kellen Clemens** (20 games).

## OFFENSIVE GAME NOTES

- The sophomore signal caller started the last seven games of his freshman year and was impressive despite a lack of experience. **Herbert** finished the season completing 162-of-255 passes for 1,936 yards and 19 touchdowns with just four interceptions.
- Herbert** cracked the top 10 in a pair of single-season all-time lists for the Ducks last year. He completed 63.5 percent of his passes to tie **Marcus Mariota** (2013) for fourth on the single-season list. His 148.75 passing efficiency ranked ninth all-time at Oregon.
- Oregon's single-game records haven't been safe with **Herbert** behind center. The freshman set or tied three different single game records during his first season.
- In just his second career start at California, Herbert threw six touchdown passes to tie an Oregon single-game best. His six TDs matched **Vernon Adams Jr.** (vs. USC in 2015), **Marcus Mariota** (at California in 2012), **Darron Thomas** (vs. Nevada in 2011), **Joey Harrington** twice (vs. Arizona State in 2001 and at Arizona State in 2000) and **Danny O'Neil** (vs. Stanford in 1994).
- In **Herbert's** third career start he completed 31-of-42 passes for 489 yards and four touchdowns. against ASU. The 489 passing yards tied a school record set by **Bill Musgrave** in 1989 against BYU. Herbert also totaled 512 total yards against ASU to set a new Oregon record.
- Herbert's** 12 TD passes in his first three starts (UW, Cal, ASU) matched the most ever by a Duck quarterback in a three-game stretch. Herbert connected on two TDs against Washington in his first-ever start, before matching the single-game school record with six touchdown passes at Cal and then throwing four in the win over Arizona State. Herbert tied both **Marcus Mariota** (2012-14) who threw 12 TDs in three games in 2012, and **Joey Harrington** (1998-01) who tossed 12 TDs in three games in 2000. Herbert also ranks in a tie for fourth on the list with his 11 touchdowns in games against Cal, Arizona State and USC.

### HERBERT BECOMES FIRST TRUE FRESHMAN TO START AT QUARTERBACK IN 33 YEARS

- In last year's Washington game, **Justin Herbert** became the first true freshman to start a game at quarterback at Oregon since Chris Miller in 1983. The Ducks' signal caller completed 21-of-34 passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns. The 21 completions and 34 attempts were the most by a freshman (true or redshirt) since Miller got the start against Stanford on Nov. 12, 1983 and completed 9-of-15 passes for 98 yards and a TD. Oregon has started a handful of freshman over the years, but most of those had used a redshirt their first season on campus.

### BURMEISTER THIRD TRUE FRESHMAN TO START AT QB IN 34 YEARS

- FR QB Braxton Burmeister** started at quarterback vs. Washington State marking just the third time in 34 years a true freshman started at QB for the Ducks.

- Burmeister completed 15-of-27 passes for 145 yards and his first career touchdown (a 30-yard strike to **SO TE Jacob Breeland**).

### NELSON'S CAREER GAME IS HIS SECOND 100-YARD RECEIVING GAME

- SR WR Charles Nelson** set a new career high for receiving yards in Oregon's win over Nebraska finishing with 117 on eight receptions. His eight catches matched a career high.
- The 117 yards accounted for **Nelson's** second career 100-yard game. He had 104 yards receiving on seven catches in Oregon's win over Arizona in the Pac-12 championship game during the 2014 season.
- Ironically, **Nelson's** career-best eight receptions against Nebraska matched the eight passes he caught at Nebraska last season.
- In two games against Nebraska, **Nelson** has 16 catches for 197 yards and a touchdown.

### NELSON PASSES CENTURY MARK IN RECEPTIONS

- SR WR Charles Nelson** caught a team-high eight passes in Oregon's win over Nebraska, and in the process became the 29th member of the 100-reception club at Oregon.
- Nelson** is 23rd on the list with 107 catches.
- He needs four catches to move into the top 20.
- Nelson** leads Oregon in receiving yards (243) and is second in catches (15).
- Nelson** led Oregon in both receptions and yards in Oregon's first two games. Against Southern Utah, he had six catches for 99 yards. In the win over Nebraska he finished with eight catches for 117 yards.
- Nelson** left the Wyoming game with a first-half injury after catching two passes for 27 yards.
- Nelson** did not play at Arizona State or against California and Washington State.

### NELSON SETS CAREER KICK RETURN YARDS RECORD AT OREGON

- WR/KR Charles Nelson** set a new Oregon career kickoff return record as a junior. The Ducks' all-purpose weapon passed **De'Anthony Thomas** (2011-13) in the Washington game. Nelson now has 2,173 yards.

### NELSON OWNS TWO OF TOP FOUR KICKOFF RETURN SEASONS IN OREGON HISTORY

- SR KR/WR Charles Nelson** has put together back-to-back top five seasons in kickoff return yards.
- Nelson's** 879 yards during his junior season is the third most in Oregon history, edging the 876 return yards he put up as a sophomore.

### DUCKS' YOUNG RECEIVING CORPS STEPPING UP

- Heading into the 2017 season, minus **Charles Nelson's** 92 career catches, the rest of Oregon's receiving corps (wide receivers and tight ends) had combined to make nine catches.
- **SO TE Jacob Breeland** had six receptions for 123 yards, while **SO WR Dillon Mitchell** had two catches for nine yards and **SO WR Alex Ofodile** had one catch for eight yards.
- In 2017, in addition to Nelson's 15 catches for 243 yards and one touchdown, Oregon has had 10 wide receivers or tight ends combine for 77 catches and 987 yards through six games. **Mitchell, Breeland** and **Ofodile** have combined for 32 receptions for 443 yards and four TDs while **FR WR Johnny Johnson III, SO WR Brenden Schooler, SOTE Ryan Bay, SO WR Malik Lovette, FR TE Cam McCormack, JR WR Taj Griffin** and **FR WR Darrian McNeal** have 45 catches for 544 yards and four touchdowns.
- **Griffin** had 17 catches for 251 yards coming into the season, but those were as a running back.

### FREEMAN THIRDS, BENOIT 12TH IN NATION IN RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS

- **SR RB Kani Benoit** joins **SR RB Royce Freeman** in the top 12 in the country in scoring rushing touchdowns in 2017.
- **Freeman** is third in the country with 10 touchdowns, two behind Auburn's **Kerryon Johnson** who is the national leader with 12.
- **Benoit** is tied for 12th with six other players with eight TDs.
- **Freeman** leads the Pac-12 Conference, while **Benoit** is tied for third.
- **Benoit** is averaging a TD every 5.63 carries. He has scored his eight TDs on just 45 total carries. **Freeman** is scoring a TD every 11.50 carries.

### BENOIT RUNS FOR CAREER-HIGH 138 YARDS VS. CALIFORNIA

- **SR RB Kani Benoit** rushed for a career-high 138 yards on 18 carries (7.7 ypc) in Oregon's 45-25 win over California on Sept. 30.
- **Benoit** gained 113 yards on 12 carries in the second half to help the Ducks seal the victory.
- **Benoit** averaged 9.41 yards per carry after the half, while scoring two TDs.

- His 18 carries were a career high, six more than he had vs. Colorado during the 2016 season.
- **Benoit** has double-digit carries just three times during his career. In addition to his 18 vs. Cal, he had 13 vs. Colorado in 2016 and 11 vs. Eastern Washington in 2015.
- **Benoit's** 68-yard TD was the longest run of his career and Oregon's longest scoring play from scrimmage this season.
- His previous longest run was a 62-yard scamper against Arizona State in 2015.

### BENOIT HAS THREE CAREER 100-YARD GAMES

- **SR RB Kani Benoit's** picked up his third career 100-yard game against California when he rushed for 138 yards on 18 carries.
- **Benoit** had his second career 100-yard rushing game in Oregon's season opener when he gained 107 yards on just seven carries (15.3 yards per carry).
- In **Benoit's** three career 100-yard games he has a combined 31 carries for 345 yards (11.13 ypc).
- **Benoit's** first career 100-yard game came at Nebraska last season when he rushed for 100-yards on just six carries (16.7 yards per carry).
- **Benoit** also scored a career-high three TDs in the win over Southern Utah.

### DUCKS STREAK OF GAMES WITH 20+ POINTS SNAPPED AT 47

- Oregon was held to 10 points by Washington State last Saturday and in the process saw its streak of scoring 20-or-more points end at 47 games.
- Oklahoma State now owns the longest streak at 34 games.
- In addition to Oregon, California (31) and Texas A&M (11) saw double-digit streaks end.

### OFFENSIVE RECORDS FALL IN 77-21 WIN

- Oregon's 77 points scored against Southern Utah was the most in the modern era (post WW2) by a Ducks' team. The last time UO scored more than 77 was a 97-0 win over Willamette in 1916.
- The Ducks also set a number of Autzen Stadium records in the win. The 77 points bested the previous record of 72 against New Mexico (2010) and Nevada (1999).
- Oregon's 11 touchdowns were one more than UO scored against Colorado (2012) and Nevada (1999), and Washington scored vs. Oregon last season.
- The nine rushing TDs were two more than UO scored against Nicholls (2013), Colorado (2012) and Utah State (1999), and UCLA scored against the Ducks (1975).

### POINTS IN A HURRY

- Of Oregon's 35 drives for touchdowns in 2017, 22 (62.9 percent) lasted two minutes or less. Four more took three minutes or less, while the longest drive lasted 4 minutes and 18 seconds, covered 75 yards on 14 plays, and was capped by a **Justin Herbert** nine-yard TD run at Wyoming.

### GROUND AND POUND

- Oregon's reputation as a high-scoring offense owes a lot to the team's ability to score touchdowns, not only through the air, but on the ground. The Ducks have racked up 594 touchdowns since the beginning of 2010 with 304, the second most in the nation, of them coming on running plays.
- Oregon leads the nation this season in rushing touchdowns with 25. Army (24) is second, Notre Dame (23) is third, Tulsa (22) is fourth and Florida Atlantic and Clemson (21) are tied for fifth.

### DUCKS HAVE FOURTH-MOST TD PASSES SINCE 2010 SEASON

- When it comes to finding the end zone through the air, almost nobody has been better than Oregon since 2010. The Ducks have tossed 251 TD passes during that time, which is the fourth most in the nation.
- UO's offense has thrown at least 28 TDs in each of the last seven seasons with a high of 44 touchdown passes in 2014. Last season, Oregon had 28 TD passes. The Ducks have 10 this year.

### DUCKS SCORE IN ALL FACETS OF GAME

- If the Ducks aren't scoring on offense, they're probably finding the end zone on defense or special teams. Oregon is sixth in the country in non-offensive TDs since 2010 with 38. **JR KR Tony Brooks-James** gave Oregon an early addition to the list scoring on the season's opening kickoff against Southern Utah.

### DUCKS LEAD NATION IN NUMBER OF OFFENSIVE CATEGORIES

- Oregon's offense has been hard to stop through six games with the Ducks ranking among the nation's best in a number of categories.
- Oregon is first in touchdowns (36) and rushing touchdowns (25).
- Oregon is tied for third in points (258), is fifth in total yards (2,964), eighth in first downs (148) and 10th in points per game (43.0).
- The Ducks lead the Pac-12 Conference in touchdowns, rushing touchdowns, total yards, points per game and are tied for first in points.

#### Touchdown Breakdown

- Oregon has more than 550 yards of offense in three games this year (705 vs. Southern Utah, 566 vs. Nebraska, 558 at Wyoming).
- Oregon has posted at least 550 yards of total offense in at least six games in five seasons during the decade, including in eight games during both the 2013 and 2014 seasons (six in each year from 2010-12).

### LIGHTNING STRIKES

- Oregon leads the nation since 2010 in scoring offense (44.36) and ranks second in total offense per game this decade (528.3 ypg).
- Since 2010, Oregon leads the nation in percentage of possessions scoring points (46.54%), percentage of possessions scoring touchdowns (39.54%), and points per possession (2.68) while ranking third in fewest three-and-out possessions (15.91%).

- Oregon is one of just three teams in the nation with double-digit games with both 300+ passing yards and 200+ rushing yards since 2014. The Ducks have totaled 13 during that stretch, including two games this season.

### DYE ACTIVE LEADER ON D

- **SO ILB Troy Dye** has played in just 17 games in his young career, but has quickly become a leader both on the field and on the stats sheet.
- The true sophomore from Norco, Calif., is Oregon's active leader in tackles for loss (20.0) and sacks (9.5), and ranks second among current players in career tackles (143).

### DYE OFF TO ANOTHER FAST START

- After starting the 2016 season with an 11-tackle performance against UC Davis worthy of Pac-12 player of the week honors, **SO LB Troy Dye** opened the 2017 season with a similar monster effort that included 10 tackles (5 solo), 2.0 tackles for loss, one sack, an interception and a pass breakup against Southern Utah.
- Dye, who moved from outside linebacker in 2016 to the "Jack" inside linebacker position in new defensive coordinator **Jim Leavitt's** scheme this season, added a team-high 11 stops in Week 2 vs. Nebraska, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- In Week 3, he paced a UO defense that held Wyoming to just 183 yards of total offense, making four stops, a tackle for loss and adding a pass breakup.
- **Dye** added seven tackles in the Pac-12 opener at Arizona State in Week 4, helping the Ducks limit the Sun Devils to 2.7 yards per rushing attempt - the fewest yards per carry for ASU in the last ten meetings with Oregon.
- **Dye** led the team with nine tackles Week 5 against Cal, adding a sack and 2.5 tackles for loss along the way. His game-high seven solo stops played a part in limiting the Golden Bears to 263 yards of total offense and eight yards rushing.
- Week 6 saw **Dye** again lead the defense with a game-high 11 tackles and the first forced fumble of his career.
- **Dye** has eight double-digit tackle games in 17 career appearances. He has only appeared on defense in 16 games as he was limited to special teams duty at Nebraska last season.

### HOLLINS IMPRESSIVE STREAK ENDS AT 10

- **JR DL Justin Hollins'** streak of consecutive games recording a tackle for loss ended at 10, when he came up empty last week vs. Washington State. His TFL run tied **Nick Reed** (parts of 2006 and '07 seasons) for the most consecutive games with a tackle for loss by an Oregon player since at least 2005.
- **Hollins'** streak started Oct. 29, 2016 during a home win over Arizona State.
- The redshirt junior from Arlington, Texas totaled 13.5 TFLs during the streak.
- **Hollins** had 4.0 TFLs over the first 21

games of his career, and has more than tripled that output in his last 11 contests.

### SACK TOWN USA

- The Ducks followed up a season-high seven sacks during their Week 5 win over Cal with four more in Week 6 vs. Washington State and now rank first nationally with 24 (4.00 per game).
- The seven sacks vs. the Golden Bears were the most by a Pac-12 team this season and most by UO since hitting the same number Oct. 10, 2015 vs. Washington State.
- Nine Ducks have recorded at least one sack this season, led by **JR DE Jalen Jelks** (4.5) and **SR OLB Jonah Moi** (4.5).

### HURRY, HURRY, HURRY ... STEP RIGHT UP!

- Oregon's defense has put pressure on opposing quarterbacks to the tune of 24 sacks on the season, but even when the Ducks are not tackling QBs behind the line of scrimmage they are making their lives uncomfortable.
- **JR Jalen Jelks** leads all 3-4 defensive ends nationally with 15 QB hurries, followed by teammate **SR Henry Mondeaux** with 14.
- Additionally, **Jelks** is grading out as the No. 5 defensive end in the country according to Pro Football Focus.

### HAVE A DAY, JALEN JELKS

- **JR DL Jalen Jelks** put on a career performance Week 4 at Arizona State, setting personal bests with team-highs of nine tackles, 3.0 sacks and 5.0 tackles for loss.
- **Jelks'** sacks resulted in 13 yards lost by the Sun Devils and his TFLs totaled 20 yards lost.
- The three sacks by the Phoenix native were the most by an Oregon player since **Nick Reed** (2005-08) had 3.0 at Oregon State on Nov. 29, 2008.
- **Jelks'** five tackles for loss were the most by a Duck since **Reed** had 5.0 on Nov. 3, 2007, also against the Sun Devils.

### MOI WREAKING HAVOC

- **SR OLB Jonah Moi** has made the most of his increased playing time and new starting role in **DC Jim Leavitt's** defense, accounting for at least a portion of a sack in five of the six games this season.
- The former junior college transfer from Redlands, Calif., ranks tied for 21st nationally and first in the Pac-12 with teammate **Jalen Jelks** at 0.75 sacks per game.

### PARTY IN THE BACKFIELD

- One of the major themes of the Ducks' defensive play through the first third of the season has been getting pressure in the opposing backfield, led by senior outside

linebackers **Justin Hollins** and **Jonah Moi** off the edge, junior interior lineman **Jalen Jelks**, and sophomore inside 'backer **Troy Dye**.

- **Hollins** and **Moi** have at least one tackle for loss in all but one game thus far, while **Dye** and **Jelks** have a TFL in four of the six contests to date.
- Combined, the quartet has 26.5 of the team's total of 49.
- By comparison, Oregon had 38 TFLs through six games last season.
- **Jelks** leads the way with 8.0 TFLs, while he and **Moi** share the lead in sacks at 4.5. **Hollins** has 7.0 TFLs, 2.5 sacks and three forced fumbles.

### SPRINGS MOVING UP TOP 10

- **SR CB Arrion Springs** has moved into the Ducks' all-time top 10 list for pass breakups with an FBS-leading (tie) 10 through the first six games of the season, giving him 34 for his career.
- He had a pair in both the season opener vs. Southern Utah and Pac-12 opener at Arizona State, and tied his career-high with three in Week 2 vs. Nebraska.
- The fourth-year cornerback from San Antonio is currently two behind former NFL all-pro safety **Jairus Byrd (2006-08)** for sixth in school history.
- **Springs** is currently the No. 1 rated cornerback in the Pac-12 according to Pro Football Focus.

### DUCKS STUFF THE RUN

- The Oregon defense is coming off an irregular year that saw the Ducks surrender more than 200 rushing yards per game for the first time in 30 years. But if the first six games of the season are any indication, that regression may be an outlier.
- In Week 1 vs. Southern Utah, Oregon held the Thunderbirds to 99 yards on 38 attempts for an average of 2.6 yards per carry.
- It marked the first time the Ducks have limited an opponent to less than 100 yards rushing since holding UC Davis to 89 yards Sept. 3, 2016.
- Oregon bettered that mark in Week 5, holding Cal to just eight rushing yards on 29 attempts for an average of 0.3 ypc. That was the stingiest effort by UO's rushing defense since limiting Washington State to two yards on Oct. 19, 2013.
- The Ducks' run defense has not allowed more than 142 yards in a game this season, and that came on 53 attempts by Arizona State in Week 4 (2.7 ypc).
- For the season, opponents are averaging 2.7 yards per carry, compared to 5.7 in 2016.

### D-BOYS REPRISE?

- The collective effort of the 2017 Ducks' defensive backfield through the first six games of the season has brought back memories of the days when the eventual NFL quartet of **Jairus Byrd**, **Patrick Chung**, **Walter Thurmond III** and **T.J. Ward** patrolled Pac-12 stadiums in the mid 2000s.
- Oregon ranks tied for 23rd nationally in interceptions (7), with DBs responsible for five of them.
- **FR CB Thomas Graham Jr.** has a pair, as does **JR CB Ugochukwu Amadi**, and **SR S Tyree Robinson** nabbed the other.
- As for passes defended, the Ducks are second in the country with 45, including an FBS-leading 38 breakups.
- **SR CB Arrion Springs** has a team-high 10 breakups - good for first (tie) in the FBS - while **Amadi** and **Graham** have five apiece.

### TRUE TEST

- Of Oregon's 13 true freshmen to play this season, seven have seen action on the defensive side of the ball, including nose guards **Austin Faoliu** (2 starts) and **Jordon Scott** (4 starts).
- **FR CB Thomas Graham Jr. (5 starts)** leads all newcomers and ranks second on the team with 32 tackles, followed by **Scott** (4 starts) and **FR S Nick Pickett (3 starts) with 11**.
- **FR S Billy Gibson** has six tackles and **FR CB Deommodore Lenoir** has contributed seven tackles and two pass breakups.
- **Graham** and **Pickett** gave the Ducks three true freshman starters on D in wins against Nebraska and Wyoming, and the loss at Arizona State.
- **ILB Sampson Niu** became the latest true freshman to play in 2017, seeing action on defense and special teams in Week 6 vs. Washington State.

### GRAHAM EARNS FIRST NATIONAL HONORS

- **FR CB Thomas Graham Jr.** is quickly proving why he was one of the most sought after prep players in the country before coming to Eugene. The former four-star recruit from Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., earned his first national honors as a collegian when he was named the Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week and 247Sports True Freshman of the Week for his performance vs. Nebraska.
- **Graham** had two interceptions, seven tackles (six solo), 1.0 tackles for loss and registered a pair of pass breakups in the win over the Cornhuskers.

### PASS AT YOUR OWN RISK

- Oregon's defensive effort at Wyoming in Week three was one of its best in recent memory, limiting the Cowboys to 183 yards of total offense, including a paltry 66 passing yards.
- The Ducks clearly flustered Wyoming quarterback and NFL prospect **Josh Allen**, who completed only 9-of-24 attempts for 64 yards with no touchdown passes and one interception.
- The last time UO held an opponent to less than 183 yards of total offense was Sept. 15, 2012 vs. Tennessee Tech (177).
- The last time the Ducks held an FBS foe to less than 183 was Sept. 4, 2010 vs. New Mexico (107).

### DYE ONE OF THREE TRUE FRESHMEN IN NATION TO LEAD TEAM IN TACKLES

- **SO LB Troy Dye** was in rare company when it came to true freshmen leading their teams in tackles in 2016. The Norco, Calif., native was one of just three first-year players in the country to lead their team in tackles.
- **Dye** was joined by **Josiah Taauefa** (UTSA) and **Jordyn Brooks** (Texas Tech).

Named the 33rd head coach in Oregon football history on Dec. 7, 2016, Willie Taggart arrived in Eugene after building a reputation as one of college coaching's brightest offensive minds and a proven winner.

Taggart is 4-2 at Oregon, and his first game featured a 77-21 win over Southern Utah in which UO scored its most points since 1916 and set a school record with nine rushing TDs (both Autzen Stadium records). Oregon scored 42 points in the first half in his first three games as head coach, marking the first time in school history the Ducks have as many as 42 points in a single half three consecutive games.

After his first five games, Taggart's squad has been impressive on both sides of the ball. The Ducks lead the nation with 24 sacks and 25 rushing touchdowns, while ranking tied for the national lead with 36 total touchdowns.

Despite having less than two months before National Letter of Intent day after coming to Oregon, Taggart impressed immediately with a strong first recruiting class with the Ducks. In the midst of hiring his coaching staff, Taggart put together a consensus top 25 2017 recruiting class, highlighted by a No. 16 ranking by Scout.com.

In eight seasons as a head coach, Taggart has rebuilt two different programs in Western Kentucky (2010-12) and South Florida (2013-16). The native of the Tampa Bay, Fla., area brings a proven track record of creating a positive student-athlete experience while also placing a winning product on the field.

Taggart owns a 22-9 record (.710) since 2015, and in eight seasons as a head coach, he is 44-47 (.484) with four bowl appearances. He ranks fourth among all FBS head coaches who have coached each of the last three seasons with a scoring offense average of 40.13.

Taggart took over a three-win South Florida team in 2013 and used his energy and stellar recruiting style to put the program back on a winning track, while also rallying USF fans with his "Do Something" mantra. Taggart turned the program into an offensive juggernaut in only four years, leading the Bulls to a program-record 10-2 mark in 2016 with seven conference victories after going 2-10 in his first season. The Bulls closed the 2016 regular season in the AP poll (No. 25) for just the second time in program history and reached back-to-back bowl games after earning a bid to the 2016 Birmingham Bowl.

A quarterback in his playing days at Western Kentucky, Taggart molded the South Florida offense into one of the nation's best over his four seasons with the "Gulf Coast Offense." The Bulls ranked seventh in the country in points per game (43.6) during the 2016 regular season and fifth in rushing offense (291.75 ypg).

The team's primary play caller, Taggart led an offense that set 33 program records, including scoring, total touchdowns, total yards, rushing yards, yards per play, yards per carry and points per game. Taggart also molded a number of standout players at USF with a program-record 10 landing on all-conference teams, highlighted by quarterback Quinton Flowers, who was named the AAC Offensive Player of the Year after becoming the first USF player ever to post 2,000 yards passing and 1,000 yards rushing in the same season. Before revamping the offense at South Florida, Taggart laid the foundation by signing some of the most highly-regarded recruiting classes in program history, landing the league's top recruiting classes in both 2015 and 2016.

Taggart's players have found success in the classroom in addition to on the field, with the USF football program experiencing a rise in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) over each of Taggart's four seasons. The Bulls also saw record numbers of academic all-conference honorees in each of Taggart's first three seasons, including 38 in 2015.

Before he was hired at USF in 2013, Taggart spent three seasons remaking a Western Kentucky program that was enduring a 20-game losing streak upon his arrival. After just one year of transition, Taggart guided his alma mater to two straight winning seasons (7-5 in 2011, 7-6 in 2012) and the program's first bowl appearance - the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl - since moving from FCS to FBS. WKU won 12 of 14 games under Taggart from Oct. 2011 to Oct. 2012, with the only losses coming to No. 1-ranked teams in LSU and Alabama. Taggart proved his ability as a recruiter as well at Western Kentucky, securing the top classes in the Sun Belt Conference in both 2010 and 2011.

Before becoming the head coach of the Hilltoppers, Taggart worked as the running backs coach at Stanford under head coach Jim Harbaugh from 2007-09. He joined the program following a 1-11 season in 2006 and was instrumental in the development of the Cardinal offense, which in 2009 led Pac-10 in total offense (441.4 ypg) and ranked second in the conference rushing offense (224.3 ypg) while breaking the school's single-season rushing record that had stood since 1949 with 2,481 yards. Taggart also helped to groom the 2009 Doak Walker Award winner in Toby Gerhart, who averaged 144.7 rushing yards per game while also maintaining a 3.25 GPA.

Taggart started his coaching career at Western Kentucky in 1999, returning to the institution he attended and would later bring to prominence as its head coach. Taggart worked at WKU in multiple capacities from 1999 to 2006, starting as the receivers coach for a year before spending a year as quarterbacks coach (2000), two as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach (2001-02) and four as assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach (2003-06). Taggart helped coach an offensive unit that set school records for points (432), total yards (5,479) and first downs (263), en route to the 2002 NCAA Division I-AA national championship. The Hilltoppers ranked second in the nation in pass efficiency and sixth in rushing, and averaged 38.8 points per contest in four playoff victories.

Taggart's coaching career began just a year after he wrapped up a stellar playing career at WKU, where he was the starting quarterback from 1995-98. Taggart set 11 WKU school records while directing the offense and had his jersey retired on Oct. 23, 2016. He finished his career as WKU's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns (47), ranked second in scoring (286 points), pass efficiency rating (127.71) and rushing yards (3,997), tied for third in most 100-yard rushing games (17) and tied for fourth in touchdown passes (30). His rushing yards were the most in NCAA Division I history at the time for a quarterback.

Recruited to WKU by Harbaugh to play for his father, Jack, Taggart graduated in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in social sciences. Prior to college, Taggart was a prep standout at Bradenton Manatee High School, where he was a first-team all-state and all-conference selection as a senior after guiding the Hurricanes to the state 5A championship game.

Taggart and his wife, Taneshia, have two sons, Willie Jr. and Jackson, and one daughter, Morgan.



**EUGENE** — The Wille Taggart era of Oregon football began in rousing fashion Saturday, with Tony Brooks-James returning the opening kickoff for a touchdown and the Ducks' offense in vintage form throughout a

77-21 victory over Southern Utah before 52,204 fans in Autzen Stadium.

The Ducks (1-0) won their seventh straight season opener, and their 10th straight season opener played at home. They won their 16th straight game over non-Power 5 conference opponents.

**How It Happened:** Brooks-James returned the opening kick 100 yards to get the Ducks on the board first. Oregon's defense, making its debut under coordinator Jim Leavitt, got off to an inauspicious start, allowing Southern Utah to drive 70 yards to a game-tying touchdown.

But the defense buckled down from there, and the Ducks scored the game's next 35 points. Justin Herbert sparked that stretch with a TD pass to Jacob Breeland, and the Ducks also got a pair of touchdowns each from Royce Freeman and Kani Benoit.

The Thunderbirds scored twice just before halftime, recovering a muffed kick return by Brooks-James in between. But the UO defense rallied with a three-and-out to open the second half, Freeman scored in third touchdown of the night early in the third quarter, and the rout was on.

**Who Stood Out:** Freeman kicked off his senior season and quest for the UO career rushing record with 150 yards and four touchdowns on 23 carries. His 48 career rushing touchdowns tie for fifth-most in conference history, and are five behind LaMichael James for the UO record. Freeman is also within four yards of catching Stepfan Taylor (Stanford, 2009-12) for sixth in Pac-12 history with 4,300 rushing yards. Benoit also surpassed the century mark, rushing for 107 yards and three touchdowns on seven carries.

Herbert was an efficient 17-of-21 for 281 yard with the single passing touchdown, and Charles Nelson led UO receivers with five catches for 99 yards. Defensively, returning team MVP Troy Dye made an apparently seamless transition to inside linebacker, leading the Ducks with 10 tackles and adding a first-half interception that helped Oregon take firm grasp of momentum.

**What It Means:** The Ducks used a familiar formula to beat the Thunderbirds, with explosive offense, timely turnovers and stops on defense, and game-changing special teams play. There's still much work to be done in the weeks ahead, but the win was the first step in proving the 2016 season an aberration in recent UO football history.

**Notable:** Brooks-James' kickoff return was the first by a Duck to open a new season since Saladin McCullough in 1997 against Arizona in Autzen Stadium. ... The Ducks used seven true freshmen in the first half: Johnny Johnson III started at receiver, Adam Stack was the primary punter, Austin Faoliu started at nose guard and the defense used Jordon Scott, Nick Pickett, Billy Gibson and Thomas Graham Jr. off the bench. Cornerback Deommodore Lenoir and receiver Darrian McNeal played in the second half. ... Safety Tyree Robinson, safety Brady Breeze, defensive lineman Scott Pagano and defensive lineman Malik Young were notable among the Ducks who did not suit up Saturday. ... Blake Maimone, who battled all preseason camp for the punting job with Stack, handled the job in the second half.

**EUGENE** — Oregon improved to 2-0 in dramatic fashion, jumping out to a 28-point lead in the first half and then surviving a scoreless second half to hold Nebraska, 42-35, before 58,389 fans in Autzen Stadium.

Justin Herbert threw for 365 yards and three touchdowns, Royce Freeman rushed for 153 yards and two touchdowns and the UO defense intercepted four passes, the last by Ugochukwu Amadi to clinch the victory.

**How It Happened:** Oregon (2-0) exploded out of the gates, with Herbert throwing touchdown passes to Brenden Schooler and Charles Nelson in the opening few minutes, and Freeman rushing for a touchdown on the final play of the first quarter to give the Ducks a 21-7 lead. The home team scored another 21 in the second quarter, and rushing touchdowns by Freeman and Kani Benoit, and a Dillon Mitchell reception from Herbert.

The latter put the Ducks up 42-14 at the break. But the UO offense couldn't find any traction after halftime, and Nebraska's Tanner Lee threw a pair of TD passes to Stanley Morgan in the third quarter. In the fourth, Mikale Wilbon rushed for a touchdown after a Freeman fumble, and the Huskers forced a punt with 2:17 left. But Amadi intercepted a pass on the next play, and the Ducks held on.

**Who Stood Out:** Herbert completed 25-of-33 passes for 365 yards and three touchdowns. Freeman had 29 carries to get his 153 yards and two scores, and Nelson caught eight passes for 117 yards. True freshman Thomas Graham Jr. started for the first time and had two interceptions, and Troy Dye led the Ducks with 11 tackles.

**What It Means:** The Ducks demonstrated some resiliency in holding on, but also showed that they still have room to improve in their first season under Willie Taggart.

**Notable:** Graham and safety Nick Pickett each made his first career start, joining classmates Austin Faoliu, Johnny Johnson III and Adam Stack in the starting lineup ... Senior Tyree Robinson started at safety after not playing in the opener, but didn't see action in the second half due to injury ... The Ducks wore their "Project Elevate" uniforms to benefit OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital. Three young cancer patients who helped design the uniforms — Ethan Frank, Joe MacDonald and Sophia Malinoski — announced Oregon's starting lineup prior to kickoff ... Oregon entered Saturday with a 1-6 record all-time against the Huskers. The Ducks' last win in the series was 20-12 in Lincoln, Neb., in 1953. Saturday's game wrapped up a home-and-home series that Nebraska opened with a 35-32 win in Lincoln last season.

**LARAMIE, Wyo.** — In a game that drew nearly two dozen NFL scouts hoping to get a look at an elite quarterback, it was Oregon's Justin Herbert who outplayed his counterpart from Wyoming, Josh Allen,

leading the Ducks to a 49-13 victory before 29,139 fans in War Memorial Stadium.

**How It Happened:** The Ducks (3-0) hit 42 points in the first half for the third time in three games this season, taking a 42-10 lead into the break. All 10 Wyoming points followed turnovers, as the Oregon defense otherwise was stout and forced five three-and-outs plus a fumble against Allen.

The Ducks drove to touchdowns on their first two possessions, both rushing touchdowns by Royce Freeman. A muffed punt by Charles Nelson and a fumble by Herbert helped Wyoming put 10 points on the board. But the Oregon defense allowed little else in the first half, while the Ducks added rushing touchdowns by Freeman, Herbert and Kani Benoit, and a passing TD from Herbert to Taj Griffin.

Oregon's second-half sluggishness reared its head again, and Wyoming scored three more points off a UO turnover in the second half. Herbert threw a pass that went off a receiver's hand and was intercepted; the Cowboy's field goal was the only scoring play of the third quarter. But the Ducks laughed last, with Benoit rushing for his second touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter.

**Who Stood Out:** Freeman carried 30 times for 157 yards and three touchdowns. He tied LaMichael James with 53 career touchdowns, and become the all-time UO leader in carries with 785. Herbert completed 18-of-29 passes for 251 yards with a touchdown and an interception. The UO defense hounded Allen into a 9-of-24 night for 64 yards; Kaulana Apelu led the Ducks with seven tackles.

**What It Means:** The Ducks are off to a 3-0 start for the first time since the 2014 season. They enter the start of Pac-12 play next week at Arizona State.

**Notable:** Jordon Scott made his first career start at nose tackle, with previous starter Austin Faoliu not on the trip. Graduate transfer Scott Pagano made his UO debut as a reserve on the defensive line. The Ducks opened offensively in a four-receiver set, with Brenden Schooler making his first career start on offense. ... Charles Nelson was injured in the first half and returned to the UO sideline before halftime on crutches, with a boot on his right leg. Junior Taj Griffin replaced him on offense, making his 2017 debut. Dillon Mitchell took over returning punts.

**TEMPE, Ariz.** — Oregon's unbeaten run to the start of the Willie Taggart era ended, when the No. 24 Ducks fell 37-35 to Arizona State in Sun Devil Stadium.

**How It Happened:** In a back-and-forth game two years after the Ducks and Devils went three overtimes in Tempe, the Ducks (3-1, 0-1 Pac-12) rallied into the lead on a rushing touchdown by Justin Herbert with 6:41 to play. But Arizona State (2-2, 1-0) drove to a go-ahead field goal with 2:33 to play, and Oregon couldn't answer despite taking possession two more times.

Herbert's rushing touchdown provided the only lead of the night for Oregon. Manny Wilkins had touchdowns rushing and passing for ASU in the first quarter, and the first of three field goals on the night by Brandon Ruiz gave Arizona State a 17-7 lead late in the period. The Ducks caught a break when the Sun Devils muffed a punt just before halftime; Oregon quickly converted it into Royce Freeman's school-record 54th career rushing touchdown, to trail 17-14 at halftime.

But Arizona State used explosion plays to extend the lead in the third quarter. Wilkins had a completion of 63 yards to set up his second rushing touchdown of the night, and a 47-yard pass play led to a Demario Richard touchdown that put ASU up 31-14. Their backs against the wall, Oregon pulled within 31-28 on TD passes by Herbert to Johnny Johnson III and Tony Brooks-James. Although they followed Ruiz's second field goal with the rushing TD by Herbert for a 35-34 lead, that was the Ducks' last gasp.

**Who Stood Out:** Herbert completed 19-of-35 passes for 281 yards and three scores, without an interception. Six receivers had multiple receptions, led by Dillon Mitchell with five catches for 61 yards, including Oregon's first-quarter touchdown. Freeman ran 15 times for 81 yards and a score. Defensively, Jalen Jelks had a monster night with three sacks among his five tackles for loss and eight total tackles. Thomas Graham Jr. added eight tackles; Deommodore Lenoir added five, reflecting how often ASU tested the Ducks' true freshmen when they were in the game.

**What It Means:** A month ago, a 3-1 start to the season sounded pretty good for a team coming off a 4-8 season. But Oregon had re-set the bar in nonconference play, making Saturday's result a frustrating one.

**Notable:** Charles Nelson did not play due to a bum ankle suffered against Wyoming. ... Owing in part to his absence, true freshman Jaylon Redd made his UO debut. He was the lead blocker on the sweep play that resulted in Freeman's record-setting touchdown. ... The Ducks were whistled for 14 penalties, for 99 yards, continuing a theme from the first two games after appearing to address the issue with just four flags drawn at Wyoming. ... The Ducks were a top-10 team nationally in converting third downs — and ASU entered the night last in the FBS in third-down defense — but Oregon went just 1-of-11.

**EUGENE, Ore.** — The Oregon football team won a war of attrition by dominating the battle in the trenches, overcoming the loss of quarterback Justin Herbert and running back Royce Freeman to beat California, 45-24, before 55,707 fans in Autzen Stadium.

**How It Happened:** The Ducks (4-1, 1-1 Pac-12) bounced back from their loss to Arizona State a week earlier, and survived the gut punch of playing without Herbert and Freeman in the second half. Already playing Saturday without receiver Charles Nelson, tight end Jacob Breland, linebacker A.J. Hotchkins and safety Nick Pickett, Oregon lost Herbert, Freeman, receiver Dillon Mitchell and linebacker Kaluana Apelu to injuries and also safety Tyree Robinson due to an ejection for targeting in the first half.

Herbert was injured on his rushing touchdown that made it 17-0 late in the first quarter, having already thrown a touchdown pass to Brenden Schooler as well. The offense struggled to find traction behind backup Taylor Alie initially, and Cal scored just before halftime to make it 17-7.

But the Ducks controlled the line of scrimmage after halftime, rushing 34 times for 217 yards and four touchdowns. Kani Benoit ran for two scores, Tony Brooks-James added one and true freshman Darrian Felix capped the evening with an 11-yard score for the game's final points.

The UO defense, meanwhile, limited California (3-2, 0-2) to eight yards rushing on the night, and sacked quarterback Ross Bowers seven times. A 75-yard touchdown pass by Bowers to Kanawai Noa in the third quarter got the Golden Bears within 24-14, and Matt Anderson kicked a field goal to make it a one-score game at 24-17 early in the fourth. But the Ducks answered the field goal in less than a minute, with Benoit slicing through the defense like a blade for a 68-yard touchdown between blocks by Jake Pisarcik and Calvin Throckmorton, regaining momentum for Oregon.

**Who Stood Out:** Benoit rushed 18 times for 138 yards and fellow runner Brooks-James had 16 carries for 76 yards, picking up the slack in Freeman's absence. Herbert was 7-of-8 passing for 86 yards and a touchdown before his injury, and Alie went 9-of-13 for 41 yards in relief. Henry Mondeaux had two sacks and recovered a fumble, and Troy Dye led the defense with nine tackles. Pressed into first-string roles by the injuries to Pickett and Apelu, safety Mattrell McGraw and linebacker Blake Rugraff made six tackles each.

**What It Means:** The long-term influence of the injuries isn't yet known, making it difficult to extrapolate their full impact; UO coach Willie Taggart said immediately afterward he hadn't spoken with team doctors for official diagnosis on Herbert, Freeman and the rest. But the Ducks were able to compartment their concern and demonstrated resiliency and toughness, traits Taggart and his staff worked hard to instill since taking over the team.

**Notable:** Alie left the field after taking a hit in the second half and was replaced for the remainder of the game by true freshman Braxton Burmeister, who made his UO debut. ... Felix also made his collegiate debut, becoming the 12th true freshman to play this season. ... The Ducks committed another 10 penalties for 110 yards, including the targeting called that resulted in Robinson's ejection. ... Though Breland was not in uniform, the Ducks began the game with two tight ends, Ryan Bay and Cam McCormick, the first career start for each. ... Cal right guard Valentino Daltoso practiced with Oregon as a walk-on last season before transferring.

**EUGENE, Ore.** — Oregon's first game since quarterback Justin Herbert was sidelined by a fractured collar bone ended in a 33-10 loss to No. 11 Washington State in Autzen Stadium.

**How It Happened:** Oregon (4-2, 1-2 Pac-12) used stout defense and some good fortune to take an early lead. The Ducks had two possessions in the first quarter that began in WSU territory after defensive stops and subpar punts by the Cougars, both resulting in scores. Aidan Schneider's 20-yard field goal got Oregon within 7-3, and Jacob Breeland hauled in a beautiful 30-yard pass from true freshman Braxton Burmeister for a 10-7 lead with 3:37 left in the opening quarter.

But other than that, offense was hard to come by for Oregon. Washington State loaded up to stop the run, and the Ducks couldn't get enough strikes in the passing game to loosen up the defense. The vaunted UO running game averaged just 2.9 yards per carry, and the Cougars scored the final 26 points of the game to remain unbeaten.

**Who Stood Out:** Troy Dye set the tone defensively with 11 tackles, and the Ducks got a sack each from Jalen Jelks, Henry Mondeaux, Jonah Moi and Jordan Scott. Burmeister, making his first college start a week after taking off his redshirt, went 15-of-27 for 145 yards and a touchdown. Royce Freeman started after being injured a week early, and had 62 yards on 12 carries.

**What It Means:** The Ducks knew they'd need to reinvent themselves offensively without Herbert, and that adjustment period began Saturday. With tough games against Stanford, UCLA, Utah and Washington over the next four weeks, they'll look to flesh things out quickly this week in practice.

**Quotable:**

*Willie Taggart, UO head coach*

"Braxton did some good things, he did some bad things. He did some things most freshmen do sometimes. I think, this game, he can learn a lot from. He's gotten that first game out of the way. I think he'll be better as we move forward. But he needs a lot more help around him."

"We didn't play our best ballgame up front. Washington State did a great job, their defensive line, with the movement, and our guys didn't handle that well. And that cost us big-time in the run game."

"It thought our defense played well. I didn't think we did enough offensively to show how well they played."

**Notable:** Senior quarterback Taylor Alie, the backup earlier this season to Herbert, was ruled out for Saturday's game a day earlier, Taggart said. Receiver Dillon Mitchell (concussion) also didn't play after being injured a week earlier. ... The Ducks committed 10 penalties for 95 yards and were 2-of-17 on third down. ... Oregon's defense held WSU to 282 passing yards, well off their season average. ... Senior receiver Charles Nelson suited up pregame and participated in warmups but was in street clothes when the Ducks returned to the field for the opening kickoff. ... Linebacker Sampson Niu made his collegiate debut, becoming the 13th true freshman to see action for Oregon this fall.

## OREGON ATHLETICS EXCELLENCE

### DUCKS FINISH RECORD NINTH IN DIRECTOR'S CUP

- The UO athletic department in 2016-17 posted its highest-ever finish for the third year in a row, taking ninth in the annual ranking of NCAA athletic departments.

- Schools can count their best 20 team finishes (up to 10 women's sports and 10 men's sports) in an academic year, and Oregon took ninth despite fielding just 19 NCAA programs - more than a dozen fewer than top-two finishers Stanford and Ohio State.

- The Ducks took ninth just a year after entering the top-10 for the first time in 2015-16, when the UO athletic department was 10th in the Directors' Cup standings. A year earlier, Oregon was 13th, at that point its best finish ever.

- The department earned 1,027 points toward the Directors' Cup in 2016-2017, led by 300 from the women's track and field program — 100 for each national title by the program in its historic "Triple Crown" year, the first by an NCAA women's program. Oregon's three national titles in 2016-17 were one fewer than Stanford and Oklahoma, and gave the Ducks multiple national championships for the fifth straight year, the longest active streak in the country.

- The 100 points for the women's NCAA Outdoor title contributed to Oregon's 467 points during the spring, nearly half the department's total for the year. The Ducks also got 90 points for the men's golf team's NCAA runner-up finish, 83 points for making the semifinals of the Women's College World Series and 69 points for the ninth-place men's NCAA Outdoor finish. The women's golf team and both tennis programs also contributed points by reaching their respective postseasons.

- This was the fifth year in a row UO finished in the top 15 of the standings, and the sixth in the last eight years.

### WOMEN'S TRACK TRIPLE CROWN

After winning national titles in women's cross country, women's indoor track and field and women's outdoor track and field last years, the Ducks became the first

women's program in the history of the NCAA to sweep all three championships in a single academic year.

### POSTSEASON APPEARANCES IN 2016-17

- During the 2016-17 academic year, the Ducks sent 15 teams to the postseason, the most in school history.

- In addition to the women's track and field team sweeping all three national titles (cross country, indoor, outdoor), the Oregon men's basketball program advanced to the Final Four, softball went to the Women's College World Series and men's golf, a year after winning a national title, finished as runner-up to Oklahoma.

- Women's basketball had a remarkable run to the Elite Eight in 2016-17 while men's track and field finished third in the nation in indoor and ninth outdoors.

- Volleyball, men's cross country, women's golf, men's tennis and women's tennis all qualified for their respective NCAA Tournaments.

- Acrobatics and Tumbling finished second at the NCATA national tournament.

### NATIONAL TITLES

- Oregon owns 37 overall national championships. - 24 of those titles have come in the last 10 years (2007+).

- The Ducks have won an incredible 31 NCAA titles in cross country or indoor and outdoor track and field.

- Oregon won the first ever NCAA men's basketball tournament in 1939.

- The Ducks won their first men's golf NCAA title in thrilling fashion at Eugene Country Club in 2016. Eugene native Sulman Raza won in a third playoff hole of his match play round to beat Texas.

- Oregon's 37 national titles include four NCATA national titles in acrobatics and tumbling, which is not yet considered an NCAA sport.

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Ducks have 101 all-time academic All-Americans.

- Oregon averages 100 academic all-conference selections annually.
