

Head Coach Jeff Mercer

2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year



In July, 2016, Jeff Mercer became the fourth head coach in the history of Wright State baseball and he hit the ground running.

Mercer was tabbed by WSU Director of Athletics Bob Grant to guide the successful program that had back-to-back NCAA Regional Finals appearances and 124 wins over the three previous years. He is the first former Raider player to lead the program.

2018 was full of records and history for the Raiders as Mercer received his first Coach of the Year Award and became the first person to win a league title as a player, assistant coach and head coach at WSU. Senior Gabe Snyder was selected as the Player of the Year and to the First Team along with Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdick and Ryan Weiss. Sophomore Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson were chosen to the Second Team while Harris and Quincy Hamilton were named to the Freshman Team. Mercer was voted the Coach of the Year.

In his first season in 2017, the Raiders reached new heights as Wright State received its first-ever top 25 ranking. WSU finished the year at 38-21, 21-9 as freshman pitcher Ryan Weiss was selected as the Freshman of the Year and was chosen to the First Team along with junior second baseman Matt Morrow. Junior pitcher Danny Sexton was named to the Second Team along with junior pitcher Derek Hendrixson and freshman third baseman Seth Gray. Both Weiss and Gray were selected to the All-Freshman Team while Weiss was later named a Freshman All American and the Second Team All Midwest. Sexton signed a free agent contract with the San Diego Padres.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree for Wright State in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in September 2013 and helped make an immediate impact on the program. WSU set a school record for wins with 43 in 2015 just to break it a year later with 46 wins.

Mercer assisted Lovelady in not only setting records, but also coached six total players drafted by Major League Baseball, including five this past spring. During his three years back at Wright State, the Raiders have had 30 Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular-season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

Working with all aspects of the program, Mercer was the recruiting coordinator responsible for bringing in the majority of the talent during this most successful period in the history of Wright State baseball. One of Mercer's primary responsibilities was his role as the hitting coach. In the 2016 season, WSU's 47 home runs were the most in a season since 2009, Coach Mercer's senior year playing for the Raiders. He also worked with the infield and outfield, and coached third base.

Mercer came back to WSU after serving two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University. While there, he primarily worked with pitchers and outfielders, but was also instrumental in the development and organization of baseball camps and handled other day-to-day operations.

Prior to Western Kentucky, Mercer was a volunteer assistant during the 2011 season at the University of Michigan. During his time there, he worked with the catchers and outfielders. Prior to arriving in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

A native of Bargersville, Indiana, Mercer played two seasons at Dayton before transferring to Wright State, where he was a



two-time First Team All-Horizon League honoree as a first baseman. He was named to the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper All-American Third Team in 2009 after hitting .357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. He was also named the Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009 and was named to the league's All-Tournament team after he tied the WSU single-season records for RBI, doubles, games played and games started. In 2009, the Raiders played in the Fort Worth, Texas NCAA Regional.

Mercer earned a degree in organizational leadership from Wright State in 2009. He and his wife, Stephanie, live in Beavercreek.

11 Raiders Honored by League

11 members of the Wright State baseball team were recognized as the Horizon League announced its postseason honors.

Senior Gabe Snyder was selected as the Player of the Year and to the First Team along with Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdick and Ryan Weiss. Sophomore Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson were chosen to the Second Team while Harris and Quincy Hamilton were named to the Freshman Team. WSU head coach Jeff Mercer was voted the Coach of the Year.

Snyder (Millersburg, OH/West Holmes) is hitting .360 in 51 starts at first base. He has collected a team and league best 70 RBI along with 15 home runs, 17 doubles and 14 stolen bases. Earlier in the season, he set career marks for home runs and RBI, needing just one home run and four RBI to reach the WSU single-season records.

He was named the Batter of the Week twice this season. Snyder leads the league in slugging percentage (.685), hits (73), RBI (70), home runs (15) and total bases (139). He was the HL Freshman of the Year in 2015 and named to the All-Tournament Team last year. WSU has had eight previous Player of the Year Awards with the last one coming in 2012 by Tristan Moore.

Morrow (Richmond, IN/Richmond), a first team recipient as a freshman and a junior as well, is hitting .287 with 56 hits and 58 runs scored in 49 games. A senior, he leads the League in runs (58), fifth in doubles (13) and second in walks (39).

Slone (Murfreesboro, TN/Siegel) is a first-time honoree after hitting .287 in 50 games at shortstop. The junior drove in 40 runs with a .383 slugging percentage and 29 runs scored. He also leads the league in assists with 153.

Burdick (Batavia, OH/Glen Este) was named to the Second Team and Freshman Team a year ago. This year he ranks third in runs scored (55), and batting average (.358) as well as second in RBI (60), hits (72), total bases (118). The sophomore leads the league in sacrifice bunts (10), sacrifices flies (10) and plate appearances (253).

Weiss (South Elgin, IL/South Elgin) makes his second appearance on the First Team list as he received the distinction in 2017 as well as Freshman Team and Freshman of the Year honors. With a record of 9-2 and an ERA of 3.49, he leads the league in wins and games started (14). In 10 league games, the sophomore holds a 7-2 record and a 2.98 ERA. Weiss was honored as the Pitcher of the Week March 19.

Gray (Springfield, OH/Shawnee) was also named to the Second Team and Freshman Team in 2017. The sophomore was named the Batter of the Week on May 21. Gray is hitting .276 in 51 starts at short with 16 steals and 15 doubles, which ranks fourth best in the League.

Orr (Mount Vernon, OH/Mount Vernon) was also named to the Horizon League Freshman Team in 2015. This year, the junior ranks second in runs scored (55), third in walks (39), fifth in on-base percentage (.459) and first in stolen bases (32), just four shy of the school season record. He was named the Batter of the Week on March 12.

Harris (Mansfield, OH/Madison) ranks fifth in batting average (.357) with 36 RBI on 35 hits, five doubles, three home runs and 20 runs scored. He holds a .351 against League foes.

Hendrixson (Centerville, OH/Centerville) makes his second appearance on the Second Team as he was selected a year ago as well for the honor. This season he is tied for the Horizon League lead in saves with eight after posting nine saves a year ago. The senior has mostly been used in relief but did win both starts this year over Youngstown State and Northern Kentucky. He has holds a 2.30 ERA in 31.1 innings over 22 games.

Hamilton (Centerville, OH/Centerville) is hitting .241 in 29 games with 12 starts in the outfield.

Prior to 2018, three coaches have won League Coach of the Year honors two times each: Ron Nischwitz (1992, 2004), Rob Cooper (2010, 2011) and Greg Lovelady (2014, 2016). The second-year head coach, Mercer has led the Raiders to a 36-15 overall record and 22-6 mark in the Horizon League, winning each of the conference series this season and the 2018 regular-season title.

The Wright State bats led the way and the pitching was strong as the Raiders defeated Youngstown State 11-1 in their first game of the 2018 Horizon League Championship Thursday afternoon at WSU's Nischwitz Stadium.

Scoring runs in each of the first five innings, the Raiders scored two RBI by a Bentley Jones single in the second and a bases-clearing double from Chase Slone in the third highlighted the offense. JD Orr had three hits on the day with a double and two of the Raiders' six stolen bases as lead-off hitter Matt Morrow collected two hits and an RBI.

Starting pitcher Ryan Weiss threw 58 pitches over four innings, allowing just one earned run with six strikeouts as Mitch Gremling picked up his second win of the season, shutting out the Penguins over five innings with four strikeouts.

#1 Wright State 10
#2 UIC 2

The Wright State baseball team rolled into the finals with a 10-1 win over UIC Friday afternoon at WSU's Nischwitz Stadium. UIC defeated Milwaukee 10-2 in an elimination game later Friday afternoon. The Raiders will square off with the Flames for the championship at 11 am eastern Saturday. If the Flames win that game, the teams will play a "winner take all" game at 3 pm. Please note the new start times due to weather.

Starting pitcher Caleb Sampen, 5-0 now, was most of the story against the Flames Friday as he held them



hitless through 6 2/3, holding them to just the one hit while striking out five on 82 pitches. Bear Bellomy came on to finish the game, allowing two hits and one run with two strikeouts.

The Raider offense, which has scored in double figures in the last five games, got all the runs needs in two innings with four in the fourth and six in the sixth. Zach Weatherford led the bats with two hits and three RBI as Alex Alders and JD Orr each picked up two RBI on a hit each. Peyton Burdick, Chase Slone and Bentley Jones each posted an RBI each as well. Seth Gray added a hit to round out the totals.

Wright State is now 38-15 overall. This will be the fourth meeting of the teams for the Horizon League Championship with UIC winning two of the first three times. WSU won in 2006 while the Flames won in 2009 and 2017. UIC won last year's batter 4-2 in Chicago. This year, the Raiders have won five of seven meetings.

The Wright State baseball team took a rough road to the Horizon League Championship Saturday afternoon, taking a lead early and losing it before storming back for an 11-9 victory over UIC in front a loud home crowd. It was the Raiders' third title in the last four years.

The Raiders put together a double, two singles and a sacrifice fly to plate five runs in the bottom of the first to take an early lead, but the Flames seized upon opportunities to score one in the third and seven in the fourth for an 8-5 lead to chase WSU starter Derek Hendrixson. Wright State chipped away with one in the sixth, three more in the seventh and a security run in the eighth to seal the comeback 11-9. It marked a WSU record six straight games scoring in double digits.

"We showed this type of resiliency all year, and we have been able to overcome adversity and injuries," WSU head coach Jeff Mercer said.

2018 Horizon League Weekly Honors

May 21: Seth Gray, Batter of the Week

Gray hit .643 in four wins with nine hits in 14 at bats with three doubles, seven runs and four RBI. He posted an .857 slugging percentage and .737 on-base percentage as well as four walk and two stolen bases.

April 16: Gabe Snyder, Batter of the Week

Snyder batted .529 with 10 RBI and three home runs last week to help Wright State to a 4-1 record, including a three-game sweep over conference foe Youngstown State. In the Raiders' 18-4 rout of YSU on Friday, the Millersburg, Ohio, native used a two-run home run in the bottom of the first to become Wright State's all-time career RBI leader (184), breaking Alfredo Batista's record that had stood since 1986. The long ball also pulled him to within one homer of tying the Raiders' all-time home run record set by Bryan Vickers (2002-05). Snyder recorded a hit in each of Wright State's five games last week, including three multi-hit outings, as the Raiders totaled 46 runs in five games. He finished the week with six runs scored, three walks, and three stolen bases.

April 2: Alex Alders, Batter of the Week

Alders batted .526 on the week, including 10-of-15 in league play, as the Raiders took two of three games from Northern Kentucky after falling to Xavier on Tuesday. The redshirt sophomore notched 10 hits in 19 at bats, scoring five runs and driving in four runs while recording a double, a triple, and two stolen bases. Alders went 8-for-10 at the plate in the final two games versus Northern Kentucky — both victories — while driving in two runs and scoring two runs in each contest.

March 19: Ryan Weiss, Pitcher of the Week

Weiss tossed eight innings of shutout baseball in a 3-0 win over Oakland on Saturday, March 13. The redshirt sophomore threw 93 pitches in the outing, allowing four hits and striking out nine batters with no walks. He shared the shutout with Derek Hendrixson who pitched the final frame to earn a save.

March 12: JD Orr, Batter of the Week

In three Wright State wins, Orr went 6 for 11 for a .545 batting average with five runs, three RBI, three walks, and two steals. The Raiders defeated Hartford, 11-2, on Saturday and, 13-4, on Sunday, with Orr batting a combined 4-for-7, including a 3-for-4 outing on Sunday morning. On Sunday afternoon, Orr notched another multi-hit game with a 2-for-4 performance in the Raiders' 7-3 win over intrastate opponent Dayton. Wright State has won four consecutive games and six of its last seven contests.

February 26: Gabe Snyder, Batter of the Week

Snyder hit .417 in three games at 20th-ranked Louisiana, helping Wright State to a 2-1 record. In 12 at bats, the Millersburg, Ohio, native had five hits, four runs, two doubles, a triple, a walk, and three RBI.

Wright State baseball already has the regular season Horizon League title in hand. The return of outfielder Peyton Burdick has paid dividends in the team's renewed success.

Last season Burdick was sidelined with a torn MCL in his right elbow, which led to him undergoing Tommy John surgery. Resilience in the weight room helped bring him back to form.

"It feels good to be back," Burdick said. "Sitting out last year, I learned a lot by paying attention to the game and talking to people."

One of those people has been WSU assistant coach Matt Talarico, who has supplied the team with film of opposing pitchers throughout the season.

"It gives you an advantage going into a battle and knowing what you're going to face," Burdick said.

The breakthrough season has been gratifying for WSU coach Jeff Mercer, especially considering that Burdick was lightly recruited out of high school and faced adversity with his injury.

"It is one of the more incredible stories that we've had. He dedicated himself in the weight room, invested in his work and has grown tremendously," Mercer said. "He plays the game at a level that is far beyond most college players. Nothing has been handed to him."

In his second full campaign for WSU, Burdick has been on a tear from the plate with a .363 batting average, 69 hits and 17 doubles, all of which lead the team. The speed of he and his teammates in the outfield has also been giving the opposition fits, as the Raiders rank fifth in the NCAA in overall fielding percentage (.982).

"I like to just think about playing wiffle ball when I'm up there," Burdick said.

"When you have a guy that's physical and add pitch recognition and the ability to hit all quadrants of the zone, you have a really special hitter," Mercer said.

The Raiders came up just short of a league crown last season after being defeated by UIC in the championship round. Missing the threat of Burdick at the plate made a clear impact on that result Mercer says.

"His importance can't be overstated," Mercer said. "You can see when we didn't have him last year and how much better we are this year just by having him in the lineup."

With the drastic turnaround, WSU will host the conference tournament next weekend, and Burdick recognizes the significance of that like he does a pitch.

"Having the fans behind you is an advantage when it comes to the tournament, and you get to sleep in your own bed," Burdick said. "You can't complain about that."

Weatherford Having Time of His Life by Alan Hieber

The Wright State baseball team cheered as it was announced they would play Stanford in the NCAA tournament.

The trip to California will be a first for Raider outfielder Zach Weatherford, but he is already pretty used to covering a lot of ground in the confines of his home field, Nischwitz Stadium.

Tracking down fly balls in the depths of a deep field like the Nisch can be an arduous task. The Raiders have mastered this skill as the fifth ranked team in the nation in team fielding percentage (.982).

With his ability in the outfield, Weatherford is no exception. He credits this to being dedicated in the weight room, coaching and practice routines such as running down fly balls shot by the pitching machine.

“It starts to become muscle memory once you do it a lot. I’ve been working on it everyday at practice with coach Mercer,” Weatherford said. “He tells me to get in the weight room, helps me with my nutrition and first step reads and as a group teaches us the right way to play outfield.”

“We try to think of baseball like an equation and find the guys that have the ability to play the best defense. Zach is a world-class runner,” Mercer said. “The thing that makes him special defensively is that he has great instincts and can read the ball off the bat well. Every rep he takes in practice is with great intent and anticipation.”

Under the tutelage of assistant coach Matt Talarico, WSU is also an above average threat on the base paths. Weatherford has the second most stolen bases on the team (18). His offensive prowess is also evident at the plate.

“He has great bat speed and an ability to hit the ball to all fields. The way he gets out of the box and can run puts a lot of pressure on defenses,” Mercer said.

Weatherford put his batting talents on display in the 11-9 Horizon League tournament clinching game against UIC on Saturday. This included a seventh inning home run that pulled the Raiders within a run, which was soon followed by the go-ahead two-run homer WSU outfielder Peyton Burdick hit.

“That was probably the craziest game I’ve ever been a part of. It was honestly the best moment of my life,” Weatherford said.

“What he (Weatherford) did in the conference tournament is a sign of what’s to come from him offensively. In a lot of ways he carried us to that championship,” Mercer said. “He is a better offensive player than he even realizes. When he realizes how special he is, he is going to do some incredible things for us.”

Being lightly recruited by other schools has given Weatherford added motivation to prosper on the field. These are the types of players Mercer often looks for during the recruiting process.

“A lot of our guys come in with an edge and something to prove. Zach was no different,” Mercer said. “I like tough and hard-nosed kids. Those are the guys that know how to work.”

Much like he is fearless when running down the ball in the outfield, Weatherford is not afraid of playing a team like Stanford.

“I’m ready to shock the world. A mid-major team can compete with anybody,” Weatherford said.
