Credentials will be available at the Media Will Call gate located on the west side of Travis E. Parker Field. Credentials should be requested at least seven days in advance of the game. No credentials will be mailed. If there is a special circumstance regarding one or more of the games, please contact the Athletic Communications Office.

Members of the working media will be provided the following at Travis E. Parker Field: game notes package, game program, complete statistics and the opportunity to interview both coaches at the conclusion of the game. The final stat pack will be available 20 minutes after the game.

Courtesy lines are provided for the official station of the opposing school. Any other line needed will require assistance from DSU Telecommunications.

## PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Media members must adhere to the following guidelines regarding Statesmen player interviews: (1) All player interviews must be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office; (2) Players are available for interviews, either at the Dorgan Center or via telephone prior to practice (generally 1:30-4:00 p.m.) and following the completion of practice; (3) Please give at least 24 hours notice; (4) No interviews will be allowed prior to kickoff on gameday.

As Dr. John M. Hilpert, Delta State's seventh president, said at his 2003 inauguration ceremony, "Delta State University has won our hearts."

His words conveyed the message that the warmth of the DSU community, combined with its steadfast determination to make meaningful contributions to the Mississippi Delta, make this university a special and worthwhile place to learn, to live, to work and to play.

Originally proposed by a group of leading citizens who wished to see this area progress educationally, culturally and economically, the university was established

by the state legislature as a regional teachers college in 1925.

Today, Delta State – located in Cleveland – still follows the same principles with a vision of commitment to students. Delta State University pledges that students will learn and grow in an environment that fosters discovery and creativity.

"Delta State is about the whole person," Hilpert maintains. "That is to say we think about educating students in multi-dimensional ways – classrooms, libraries, laboratories, technology centers, playing fields, offices, conference rooms, and social settings. Opportunities to learn are everywhere."

To that end, DSU pursues an agenda that works to accomplish an ambitious, yet laudable goal of becoming the best regional university in America, as it combines a heritage of academic strength with a robust commitment to serving people and communities, particularly in the Mississippi Delta.

The County also boasts several public and private golf courses, and Delta State University's state-of-the-art athletic complex provides world-class facilities for swimming, racquetball, indoor tennis, basketball, and baseball.

## JOHN HILPERT

Delta State University President

**Dr. John Hilpert's** seven-year tenure as president has resulted in significant growth and progress for Delta State University.

A strong proponent of year-long themes, Dr. Hilpert's presidency has been marked by three clearly-defined, straight-forward initiatives – "The Best Regional University in America," "The Year of Cleveland," and "The Year of Health and Wellness in the Delta."

"Results come by way of concerted efforts and focused attentions, and I believe these year-long themes force us to magnify those specific areas," Hilpert explained. "I believe we can make lasting impacts this way."

His tenure would confirm that, as during "The Year of Cleveland," Delta State celebrated its 80th academic year recognizing the rich relationship it has had with its host community, Cleveland. The community rallied together in time of need, as after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita devastated the Gulf Coast regions, community and campus citizens acted quickly to offer food, clothing, shelter, and financial help.

His most recent program, "Health and Wellness in the Delta" has allowed thousands access to free educational programs and testing, in the form of Delta Health and Wellness Day, a breast cancer awareness forum and Dr. Hilpert's own leadership of the Delta Health Alliance (DHA), a collaborative partnership comprised of Delta State, Mississippi State University, University of Mississippi Medical Center, Mississippi Valley State University and Delta Council, aimed at promoting programs of health education, health research and increasing the availability and ease of access to health care in the Delta region. He will serve as president of the DHA through June 2008.

Under Dr. Hilpert's leadership, Delta State has also experienced expansive development, most notably in the area of student enrollment, with the fall 2006 enrollment figures marking the largest in school history. Additionally, Delta State boasts a ten percent increase over a five-year enrollment period.

Other credits during his tenure include: Delta State's accreditation was reaffirmed by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December 2005; the University announced the conclusion of its highly-successful, five-year "Wings & Roots: Let our Legacy Soar" fundraising campaign, with the final tally capping at \$37,025,042, an amount that tripled the campaign's initial goal and stands as the largest collection of private support in the history of the university.

As shown in the Education Trust and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities' recent research Delta State stands atop its peer group of institutions for the percentage of entering students who graduate within six years of first enrollment. The number of doctoral

degrees conferred in 2004 doubled, while the number of undergraduate degrees conferred ranked tops among any other Carnegie master's institution in the state.

Further evidence in the University's commitment to becoming "the best regional university in America," is the advent of five additional academic majors to Delta State's already diverse curriculum, including athletic training and gaming management. Dr. Hilpert's leadership has also seen heavy emphasis put toward the incorporation of classroom technology – a consistent theme on his presidential resume.

As president of Northern State University in Aberdeen, South Dakota, from 1997 until he assumed the presidency of Delta State, integrating technology into the university's academic programs was a major goal. Northern received legislative designation as the Center for Statewide E-learning in 2001, and today Northern offers daily classes to more than one-third of South Dakota's school districts from ten studios on the campus.

For seven years prior to his arrival at Northern, Dr. Hilpert served the University of South Dakota as Vice President for University Relations, and for an interim term as Acting President. He has also held senior administrative posts at Thiel College in Pennsylvania and at Finlandia University (formerly Suomi College) in Michigan, during the 28 years of his career in higher education.

Dr. Hilpert earned his doctorate – a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration – from the Center for the Study of Higher Education at the University of Michigan. During his doctoral studies, he was honored with the prestigious Brubacher Award for scholarship by the faculty of the University of Michigan. He earned both a Master of Divinity degree from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia Senior College in Fort Wayne, Indiana. He also holds a two-year diploma from St. Paul's College in Missouri.

Throughout his career, Dr. Hilpert has served various organizations on boards, task forces, and committees. He was appointed in 2004 by Governor Haley Barbour to serve on Mississippi's Council for Education Technology.

Dr. Hilpert and his wife, Pat, have been married for 35 years. Both grew up in Missouri, he in Cape Girardeau and she in St. Louis. They have three adult sons, Joshua (daughter Julia), Zachary, and Adam (wife Megan). Pat spent 27 years as a Registered Nurse, serving in different settings as a nurse administrator and educator. She is also a published photographer who has exhibited her creative works in a variety of galleries and won several awards, including one co-sponsored by the Smithsonian Institution and the South Dakota Department of Tourism.

## THE ROBERTS ERA: YEAR FOUR

**Jeremy McClain** begins his fourth year as director of athletics at Delta State University after one of the most successful years in the program's history. In his first year as Director, McClain continued to build upon the championship success of Delta State's 13 intercollegiate athletic programs, while improving student services and community involvement.

McClain continued putting his stamp on the program last season by focusing on services to DSU's student-athletes. McClain and the athletic administration worked to enhance the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, while adding Career Athlete™ to the department's offerings.

In 2008-2009, McClain has coordinated a major expansion of Delta State University's scoreboards with the addition of a videoboard at Parker Field-McCool Stadium, and new scoreboards at Ferriss Field, Sillers Coliseum and University Field.

He has also seen the completion of the locker room renovation at Walter Sillers Coliseum, and the dugout and locker room addition at University Field.

This spring, McClain has focused on facility upgrades and student support services as two areas DSU Athletics will target.

In his first year at the helm, the Statesmen Football and Baseball programs claimed Gulf South Conference titles, while Lady Statesmen Basketball returned to national prominence with a GSC and NCAA South Region title, and a trip to the Final Four. In all, eight teams competed in NCAA postseason play and the future looks even better for the Statesmen and Lady Statesmen under McClain's leadership.

Last year, DSU launched a comprehensive student-services program including the NCAA's Champs Life Skills Program. DSU Athletics now offers several seminars to student-athletes on several topics including financial planning, and time management.

McClain officially took the reigns of Delta State's Department of Athletics on July 1, 2007 and the former Delta State All-American from Houlika hasn't looked back since.

Prior to taking the helm of DSU Athletics, McClain served the University as director of development with the Delta State Foundation until June 30, 2007. McClain has been associated with athletics nearly his entire life. A standout two-sport athlete at Houlika High School, McClain turned heads with his prowess on the baseball diamond and earned a full scholarship to attend Delta State University.

An ace for the Statesmen pitching staff from 1996-1999, McClain still holds many of Delta State's career pitching marks, including most appearances (69), most victories (45), most strikeouts (324) and most innings pitched (363.1). His perfect 15-0 season in 1999 earned the prolific hurler All-American, All-Region and All-Conference accolades, as well as team MVP honors.

The hard-throwing right-hander was drafted by the Boston Red Sox organization in May 1999 after he earned his bachelor's of business administration. McClain pursued his dreams of playing professional baseball for the next five years, completing stints with the Red Sox (1999 – 2000), Jackson Diamondkats (2000 – 2001), Nashua Pride (2001), San Angelo Colts (2001) and Jackson Senators (2002 – 2003).

Although focused on making it to the next level, McClain remained realistic of his chances and completed work on his master's degree in business administration at Delta State in 2002. Also during that time, he worked as an account executive with the Jackson Senators.

From there, McClain hung up the spikes and became a marketing repre-

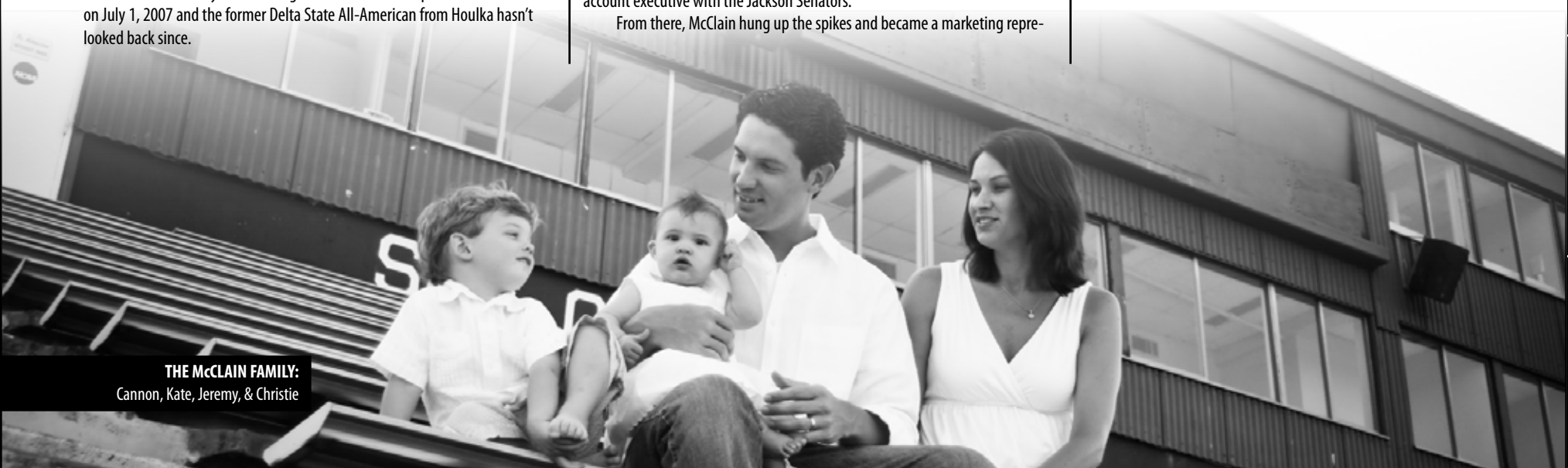
sentative for Federated Insurance Company in Calhoun City, a firm he would stay with from Nov. 2003 – Nov. 2006. During his tenure, he operated the most profitable territory in a six-state region for two consecutive years, while also improving a two-year loss ratio from 20.4 percent to 3.3 percent.

When the opportunity to return to Delta State University presented itself, McClain did not hesitate, accepting the offer to become the director of development for Delta State's Foundation. In just under six months, McClain raised a total of \$165,000 in cash gifts and over \$250,000 in pledges.

"A great foundation has been laid here at Delta State University, and it is my desire to continue to build upon that foundation. It is my goal to continually enhance student-athlete services, while enriching their livews through community service. Our charge to help mold our student-athletes into the best people, not just competitors, they can be and we will not stop looking at ways to accomplish this goal," stated McClain.

He is a 1999 graduate of Delta State University with a bachelor's degree in business. In 2002, McClain completed his master's degree in business administration, and his currently pursuing a doctorate degree in educational leadership from Delta State University.

McClain is married to the former Christie Cannon of Calhoun City. The couple has one son, Cannon and one daughter, Kate.

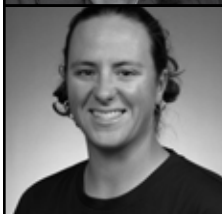

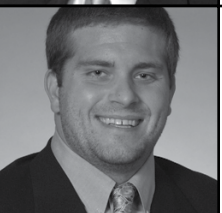

## STATESMEN REVAMPED AND RELOADED FOR 2010

Five and five, it's a record that has not been synonymous with Statesmen football in the past decade. All of that recent success seemed to hit a pitfall last season when the Statesmen missed out on the playoffs for the first time in four years. Making it even more disappointing is the fact that many people around the team felt that the talent underachieved and could have done a lot better, after their preseason No. 3 national ranking.

Fourth year Head Coach Ron Roberts is left to pick up the pieces and figure out what went wrong.

"Sometimes when you are winning you get complacent and that was the first thing that we have to evaluate," Roberts said. "We let the talent slip in some spots and sometimes you think the team will run by itself and it

just doesn't."

Roberts' Green and White squad gets a facelift this season in hopes of getting back to the Statesmen's winning ways. Starting with new coaches in former Statesmen safety Pete Golding as the new Defensive Coordinator, Greg Stevens in as Offensive Coordinator, E.K. Franks is the new Strength and Conditioning and Defensive Line coach and Travis Mikel's promotion to Offensive Line coach. The new coaches bring in a fresh look and are dedicated to winning.

Not only are the new coaches going to grace the sidelines during the 2010 season, but they have been hard at work along with the remaining coaches, recruiting to help make the Statesmen one of the deepest and most talented teams in years.

"Our recruiting for this year has us as talented as we were in the 2006, 2007 and 2008 seasons," Roberts said. "Our coaches did a great job of coming in here and getting great players."

42 lettermen return to the Statesmen in 2010, including 19 on offense. The defense gets back 20 lettermen and the special teams stays pretty much in tact with three returnees. On offense the Statesmen will have back six starters and on defense, seven starters will bring their talents back into the lineup. Six players were named All-GSC selections in 2009, with only Trevar Deed returning after his first team nod.

The Statesmen will face an 11 game season this year, including five home games and six road games, with four televised games, the first in week two against Arkansas Tech on national television on CBS College Sports TV in Cleveland. The others coming against West Alabama at home (9/30), Arkansas Monticello on the road (10/7) and North Alabama at home (10/28). The 25th annual Pig Pickin' Festival is set for September 25th at 6:00 p.m. against Henderson State and Homecoming is scheduled for October 16th at 4:00 p.m. against the Bisons of Harding. Delta State's season starts on September 4th at 4:00 p.m. in Jackson when the Statesmen do battle with Jackson State.

### OFFENSE:

Senior All-American running back and Phoenix, Ariz., native Trevar Deed returns after another incredibly productive season. Deed carried the ball 160 times for 931 yards and 10 touchdowns. That number had Deed second in the GSC in rushing yards behind Ouachita Baptist's KJ Johnson. He also solidified himself as a dual threat back by also leading the team with 67 catches, 805 yards and five receiving touchdowns. Deed was second in

the Gulf South Conference with 1,947 all-purpose yards, which was behind only Arkansas Tech's Frantz Simeon.

Coach Roberts knows that in his senior year, Trevar Deed is going to be one of the most dynamic players in the GSC and needs to build off the big season he had last year.

"At times he may have been our only offensive threat last year," Roberts said. "He was a guy that showed up every week ready to play and he will be a huge part of what we do in 2010."

Senior Quarterback Micah Davis is the incumbent although he has not taken a snap for the Green and White. Davis redshirted last year and watched as Garrett DeWitt piloted the team. Now ready to take the realm, Coach Roberts is excited about the progress of Davis.

"Last year gave him another year to sit, watch, learn and mature," Roberts said. "He is a very intelligent football player that comes from a coaching family so he is not a stranger to the game of football. He had a great spring and with Micah we know what we are going to get week in and out."

Junior Zak Mikel is also back and will bring in his dual-threat style

to help the Statesmen offense on the ground and through the air. The three-year letterman was third on the team in rushing with 151 yards on 34 attempts with two touchdowns. Newcomer Kevin Vye will also push for a depth chart spot. The 2009 JuCo leader in passing efficiency and second in TD passes during his time at DeAnza College in California will look to bring his accurate passing to the Green and White.

The wide receiver corp is deep with a capital D. Even though only two receivers return from last year, recruiting has really paid off for the Statesmen. Seniors Ray Chisolm and Todd Bradford are back for another go. The speedy Chisolm was fifth on the team in grabs with 14 catches for 225 yards and a long 52-yard touchdown against West Georgia, the first of his Statesmen career. The Elder Statesman, Todd Bradford will make the switch to inside slot in Delta State's new offense. Last season was first for Bradford after a three-year hiatus. The 27 year-old had 12 catches for 93 yards and one touchdown in 09.

Coach Roberts is most excited about the wideout talent that is coming into the program. Carlton Ollie is one of the unsung standouts coming out of spring practice. The Copiah-Lincoln Community College transfer

along with East Mississippi Community College transfer Bill Franks have worked extremely hard during the preseason workouts to help the Statesmen in 2010.

The Statesmen won't be short of Division I transfers as well. The WRs will be bolstered with the addition of University of Wisconsin transfer Maurice Moore, Colorado State University transfer Blake Swain and six foot three inch tall University of Houston transfer L.J. Castile.

The guys in charge of making the whole thing work are the offensive linemen. Senior Phillip Yandall and Junior Kendal Hunter return to the starting lineup after a successful offensive year in 2009. Hunter is back after an injury in week two against UAM, which ended his 09 season.

Coach Roberts considers senior Jake Zbydniewski to be a returning starter to the line after being out for two seasons. Zbydniewski was a big part of the run to the semifinals in the 2006 season and Roberts looks to his experience to make him a leader from the first snap. Finishing out the prospective line for 2010 are newcomers in Orange Coast College transfer Junior Harrison Lauer at tackle and Jones County Junior College Junior transfer Darrell Leopold at center.

### DEFENSE:

Losing your all-time leading tackler and All-American Lardester Hicks-Green to graduation may seem like a big hill to climb, but not only is the man they call "Dex" back as a football graduate assistant, the Statesmen are primed on defense to make a splash in the GSC.

The defensive line upfront in Roberts' 3-3-5 is very important to the success of the Statesmen. All-GSC selection Justin Halas is the biggest loss but returning are Cleveland's own senior Matt Melton and senior Eljae Faoagali. Melton was fourth on the team with four and a half tackles for loss and led the team with two fumble recoveries. Faoagali had a shortened season because of an arm injury but still led the team with two forced fumbles and will look to make a big impact in 2010 from his defensive end position.

Mark Hoskins, who didn't play in 2009 because of injury, also returns to provide experience upfront. Newly signed Robbie Mayers from Jones County Junior College, Joe Marshall a transfer from Youngstown State University, Holmes Community College transfer Paul Middleton and Iowa State University transfer Cameron Murray will also be big additions to the Statesmen defense in the trenches.

Two starting linebackers return with Hollan Fiu back for his senior season and Robert Hogan back as a junior. Fiu is the leading returning tackler from 2009. He made 40 stops, five and a half tackles for a loss of 17 yards and one sack for a loss of nine yards. Hogan is the second leading returning tackler from 2009. With 33 tackles, he was seventh on the squad while also registering three tackles for a loss of three yards. Hogan also had

one interception against Valdosta State to help seal the win against the Blazers.

Xavier Tripplett, who redshirted last year, will get his chance on the field during the 2010 season. Newcomers Melvin Griffin from Holmes Community College, Bill Hawkins from Hinds Community College, and Tyler Seau, the youngest son of USC and NFL great Junior Seau, will also suit up in the Green and White this year. The Palomar College transfer will look to live up to his names' greatness for the Statesmen this year.

The secondary has the most turnover from last season. Four of the five starters are gone with just Dominique Davenport, the 2008 GSC Freshman of the Year, returning for his junior season. "D-squared" missed four games because of injury but still registered 20 tackles and one interception against Harding in 09. He also had four pass breakups and five pass defenses. Joining him in the secondary. Four-year player Garrett Williams is also back after moving from linebacker back into the secondary. Williams will be looked to for leadership after his 30 tackle and three tackles for loss season in 2009.

"The secondary was one of the spots that we had to overhaul and our coaches did a great job of recruiting there," Roberts said.

Several newcomers will play key roles for the Statesmen secondary, including junior college transfers Dwight Tillman, Brett Butler, Preston Felder and Jerry Barnes.

### SPECIAL TEAMS:

Matt Dean is back as the place kicker for the Statesmen. In 2009 he connected on 34-of-35 extra point attempts and nailed 7-of-14 field goal attempts. Those 34 extra points ranked seventh on the GSC single-season records list. He also hit a career long 43-yard field goal versus Valdosta State.

Tyler Caldwell, the Laurel native, is back to punt for Delta State. Caldwell punted 42 times for 1,675 yards, which is an average of 39.9 yards per kick. He also did a great job of pinning opponents inside their 20 yard line, doing that 12 times. Coach Roberts wants his average in the 41-43 yard range because he showed the power with seven punts over 50 yards in 2009.

Head Coach • Fourth Year • Visalia, Calif. • University of Tennessee at Martin, 1988

### The Roberts File

- Led the Statesmen to 25-9 record and back-to-back Gulf South Conference Championships in first two years as head coach
- Team competed in second round of NCAA Playoffs in 2007 & NCAA Quarterfinals in 2008
- His 10 wins in 2007 were the most of any first year head football coach in DSU history
- 22 NCAA All-Americans and 53 All-Conference performers have played under his tutelage
- Coached NFL standout and Pittsburgh Steeler corner Ricardo Colclough at Tusculum College
- Coach Michael Eubanks (2006-2007) and Lardester Hicks-Green (2008) to GSC Defensive Player of the Year Award
- Eight Statesmen have competed in the Cactus Bowl, the NCAA DII Football All-Star Game, since Roberts became head coach

After being named the 17th head football coach at Delta State University in January of 2007, Ron Roberts has continued the task of building one of the most dominant programs in DSU history over the past three seasons. The Statesmen defense, already an imposing force unto itself, continued to mature while the new look spread offense highlighted the athletic talents of many newcomers along with some familiar faces.

Overall, Roberts has guided DSU to a 25-9 record and the school's first ever back-to-back outright Gulf South Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008. The Statesmen advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division II Football Championships in 2007 and the Quarterfinals in 2008.

In the last four seasons, two as defensive coordinator, Roberts has completed the turnaround of the Statesmen defense, as evidenced by DSU's dominance in the GSC statistical rankings. In 2006 and 2007, the Statesmen led the GSC in scoring and total defense, and in 2008 DSU ranked ninth nationally in rush defense.

Roberts coached back-to-back GSC Defensive Players of the Year in Michael Eubanks (2006/2007) and Lardester Hicks-Green (2008), while a total of 19 Statesmen have received All-Gulf South Conference accolades on defense. Eubanks, Hicks-Green, Monterio James and Jamarcus Wiggins all received All-American honors as well.

In 2007, Michael Eubanks became just the second defensive player in NCAA Division II history to be named one of three finalists for the Harlon Hill Trophy, awarded annually to NCAA Division II's top collegiate football player.

Along with the Robert's era came a more wide open look on the offensive side of the ball as well, giving DSU the "Wow factor" that fans deserve. The new look not only gave the fans something to cheer about, but enabled the rushing game to improve from 10th in the conference in 2006 to within just tenths of a point from leading the league at 217.8 yards a game.

The Statesmen concluded 2007 ranked second in the NCAA in total defense, third in rush defense, second in scoring defense and first in defensive pass efficiency. Michael Eubanks, an outside linebacker from Cleveland, was selected as the National Defensive Player of the Year while being invited to the Harlon Hill Ceremony as one of the final three candidates for the award. All told,

a total of five players were named to All-American Teams.

The successes of 2007 spilled over into 2008, where the Statesmen finished the season ranked second in the GSC (471.9 ypg) and sixth nationally. Led by All-GSC candidate Garrett DeWitt, the Statesmen passing attack ranked fourth nationally with 328.3 yards passing per game. The Statesmen also rolled up 1,713 rushing yards and ranked second in the GSC and 16th nationally with 36.2 points per game.

Wide receiver Chad Schroeder (WR/PR) was named to the prestigious American Football Coaches Association All-American Team, while Trevar Deed was named a First Team All-American after amassing 15 total touchdowns and over 1479 yards of total offense. Mark Ellis (OL), Pete Veseau (C), Chad Schroeder (WR) were also honored as All-GSC performers.

Prior to joining the DSU staff, Roberts served one season as head coach at Mount Whitney HS in Visalia, Calif., and the 2003 season as defensive coordinator at Texas State University in San Marcos, Texas.

While at TSU, Roberts took over a defense ranked near the bottom in the Southland Conference. Within a year the seasoned coordinator improved TSU's defense in virtually every statistical category and Texas State placed two defenders on the All-Southland Conference Defensive Team.

Before his journey to Texas State, Roberts spent five seasons as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Tusculum College. During his tenure at the Greeneville, Tenn. school, the Pioneers posted one of the most memorable runs in TC football history.

In 2002, Roberts guided a defense that led the South Atlantic Conference in yards (273) allowed per game and in points per game (15). In 2002, the Pioneers posted a school record 31 turnovers for a +7 margin.

At Tusculum College, Roberts coached 11 All-South Atlantic Conference defensive selections and Ricardo Colclough, a second round National Football League draft pick in 2004.

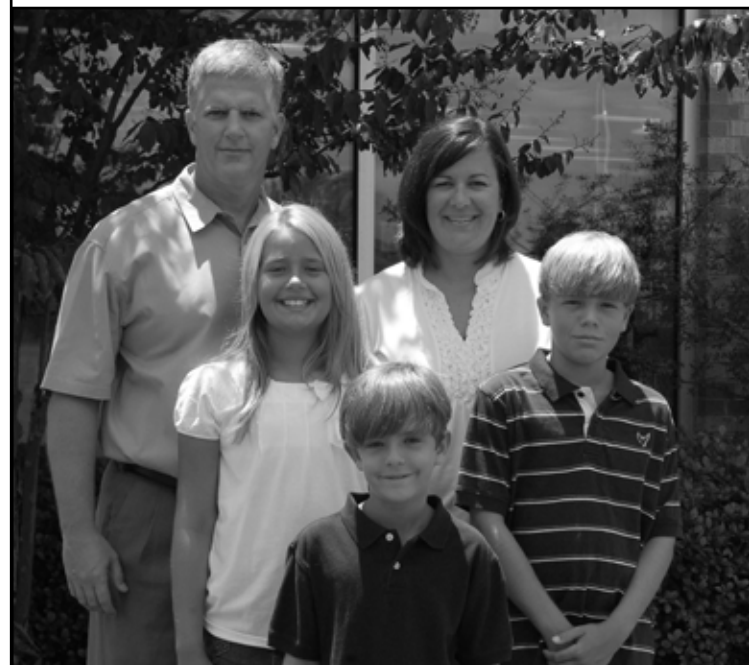
Prior to joining the Tusculum staff, Roberts served as an assistant coach at Greensboro College in 1998 and was head coach at Burroughs High School (1994-96) in California. While at Burroughs, Roberts guided BHS to its first playoff appearance in 15 years and followed that up with another post-season



trip the following year. He began his coaching career at Houston High School in Germantown, Tenn., as a defensive coordinator.

Roberts was a two-time All-Conference selection at linebacker at the College of Sequoias in his native Visalia, Calif. He transferred to the University of Tennessee at Martin, where he helped guide them to the 1988 Gulf South Conference Championship. He graduated from UT-Martin with a degree in Sociology and later earned his master's degree in Education from the University of Memphis in 1992.

Roberts is married to the former Didi Walker of Germantown, Tenn. The couple are the parents of three children; Reed, Reilly, and Ryan.

**Chet Pobilish** is in his fourth season as an assistant on Ron Roberts' staff at Delta State. Pobilish coaches wide receivers and serve as the Coordinator of Special Teams.

The Statesmen continued to move the ball effectively in 2009 under coach Pobilish's guidance. For a second-straight year, Trevar Deed was named All-GSC and All-American, as one of the top receivers/all-purpose backs in the Gulf South Conference.

In 2008, Pobilish helped the Statesmen offense finish the season ranked second in the GSC (471.9 ypg) and sixth nationally. Pobilish came to Delta State University from William Penn University in Oskaloosa, Iowa, where he served as an offensive assistant.

The Rayland, Ohio, native spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at Emporia State before moving to William Penn. At ESU, Pobilish coached wide receivers for five years before serving the last three as quarterbacks coach. His 2,595 yards receiving also rank fourth on the all-time ESU list. Known as a deceptive and elusive receiver, Pobilish concluded his career with 4,655 all-purpose yards.

He is a 1999 graduate of Emporia State with a degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation. In December, Pobilish married the former Holly Mitchell. The couple resides in Cleveland with their daughter, Lauran Elizabeth.

## HARLON HILL TROPHY FINALISTS

Many former Delta State University greats have been honored as finalists for the prestigious Harlon Hill Trophy. First awarded in 1986, the Harlon Hill Trophy is awarded annually to the nation's best NCAA Division II football player. Nominating and voting on these players is conducted through the sports information departments at the 156 NCAA Division II football playing institutions.

Named after the late Harlon Hill, a talented wide receiver for then Florence State Teacher's College (now the University of North Alabama) and the NFL's Chicago Bears, the trophy was designed and built by Herff Jones, Inc. which is also responsible for the design of the Heisman Trophy and the Congressional Medal of Honor.

After the regional and national voting process has concluded, the final three vote-getters are invited to Florence, Ala. during the week of the Division II National Championship game for a presentation banquet that honors the newest recipient.

In 2007, Delta State University All-American linebacker Michael Eubanks became just the second defensive player in the trophy's 21-year history to be named one of the top three finalists for the coveted award. UNA's Ronald McKinnon, a Harlon Hill Trophy winner, is the only other defensive player to earn the honor.

Eubanks, a Cleveland native and 2007 graduate, concluded the 2007 season with 90 tackles, 27 tackles-for-loss, and 12 sacks. His sacks and TFLs led the GSC and ranked among the nation's top five. He set the new NCAA Division II career sack record November 17, 2007 versus Shaw University in the first round of the NCAA playoffs. The speedy outside linebacker recorded a school and conference record five sacks that day to eclipse the old mark.

Eubanks, is pictured above with Matt Jones and Travis Chamblee. The two members of the

Delta State Athletic Communications staff engineered his campaign in 2007.

In 2005 and 2006, Delta State's Scott Eyster, the all-time leading passer in school and GSC history, was named one of the top eight finalists, but fell just short of a top three invite. In 1996, Tregnel Thomas was a national finalist, but he too fell just short.

In 2004, All-American wide receiver Ellis Debrow and in 2000 quarterback Josh Bright drew national attention, but they were not a finalist.

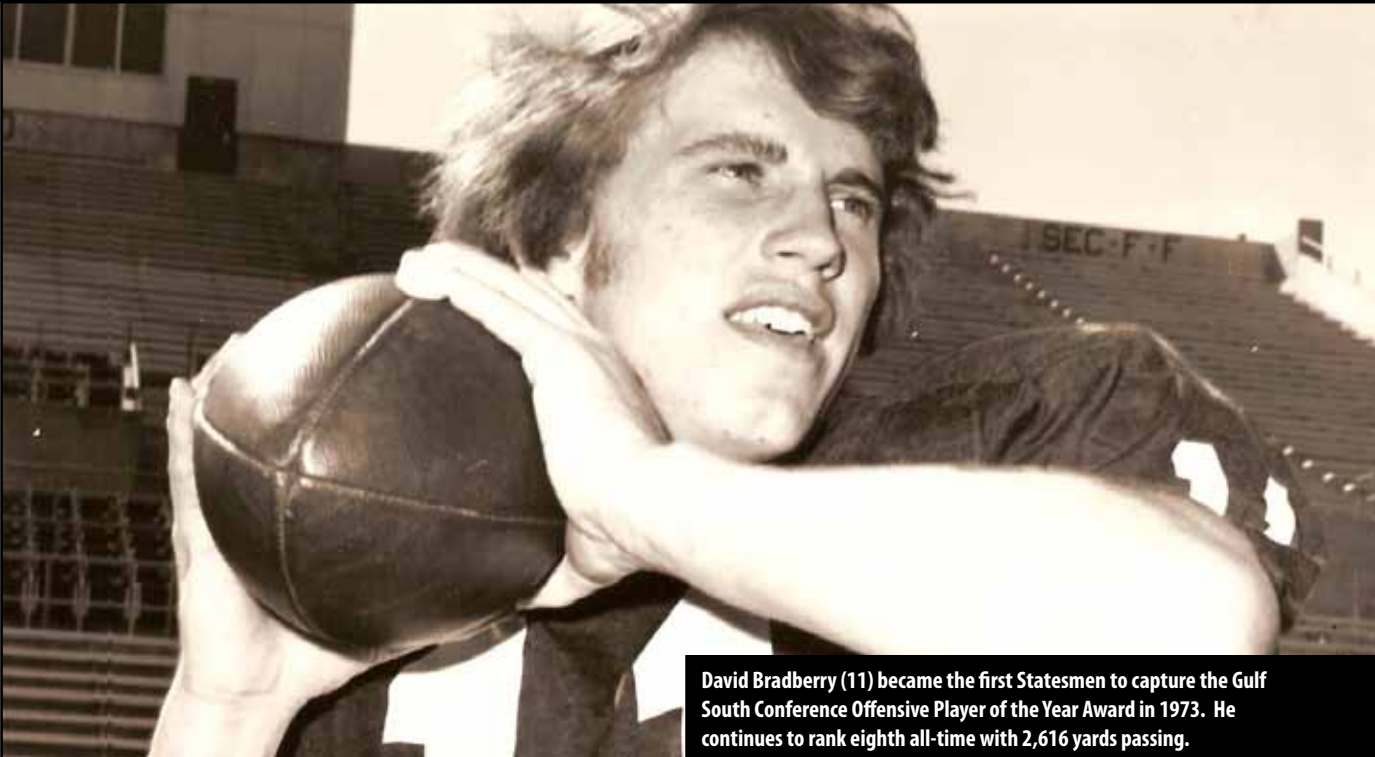

## • CELLULARSOUTH CHARLES CONERLY TROPHY •

Founded and organized exclusively by the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame and Museum since 1996, the CellularSouth Conerly Trophy is awarded annually to Mississippi's top college football player as determined by a panel of 60 media voters representing radio, television and print outlets in small, medium and large sized markets across the state.

The award, named after the late Charlie Conerly, is an original bronze sculpture sculpted by the late Bruce Brady, a nationally acclaimed artist from Brookhaven, MS. The original Conerly Trophy is on permanent display at the Museum. The Conerly Trophy recipient is presented an exact replica that is a lost wax casting thrown at a foundry in Texas.

The Conerly Trophy is presented at a banquet usually held the Thursday following the final regular season game. Past banquet sites are Jackson, Clarksdale and Tunica. The three finalists are present at the dinner with the winner announced at that time.

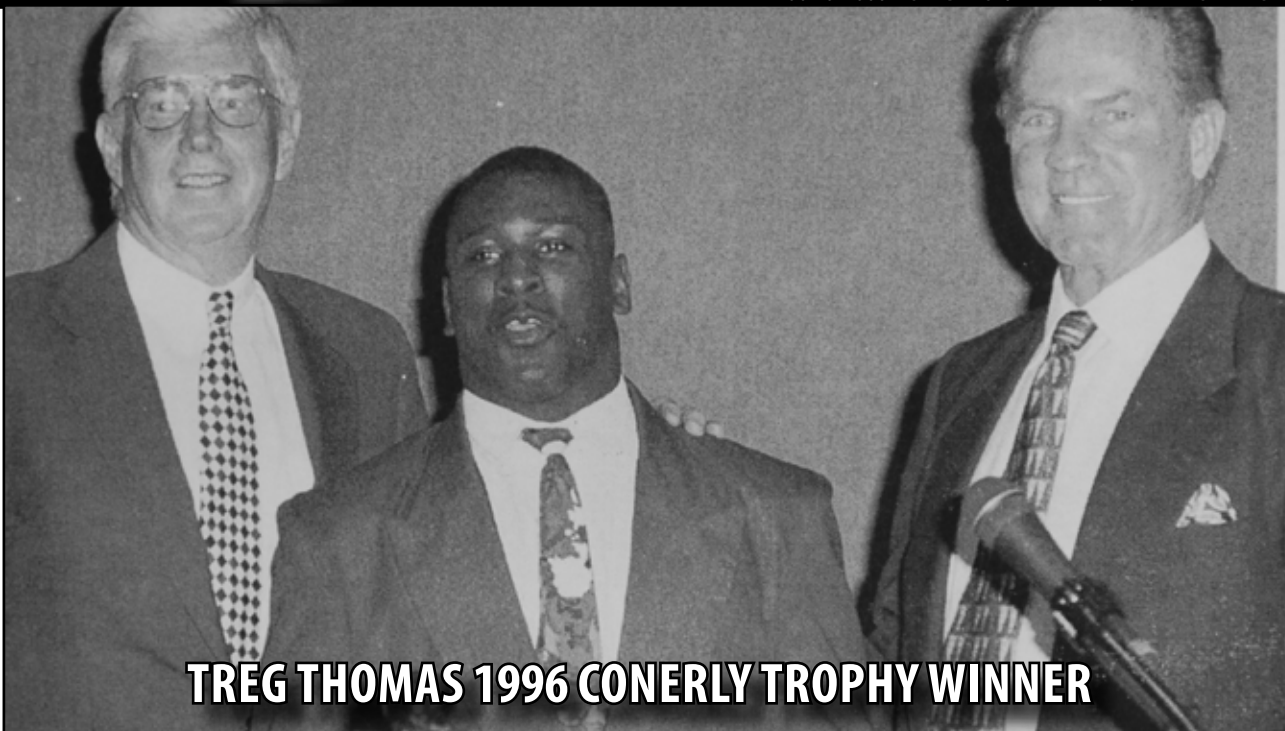
Former Delta State great Tregnel Thomas, a 5-foot-7 running back from Pascagoula, became the first Conerly Trophy winner in the award's history in 1996. Thomas blistered Gulf South Conference and NCAA opponents for 1,604 yards rushing and 11 touchdowns.

Josh Bright repeated the feat in 2000 after leading the Statesmen to the NCAA Division II national championship. Bright, a 6-foot-5 quarterback from Batesville, rushed for 1,495 yards and passed for 1,292 yards. He also rushed for a school-record 21 touchdowns.

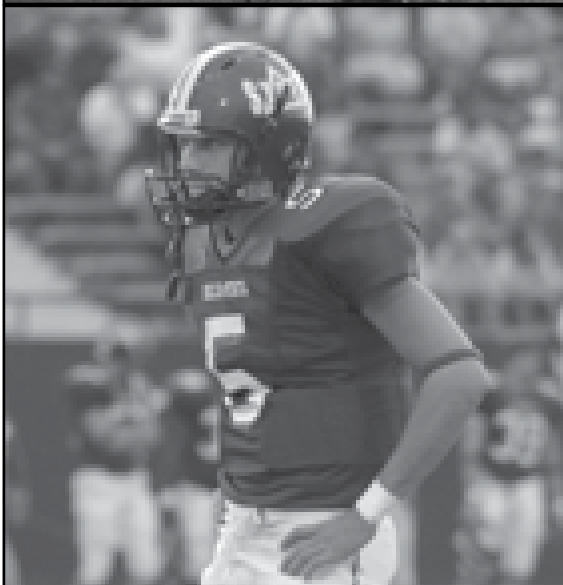
Scott Eyster, a 6-foot-3 quarterback from Hammond, La., became the first four-time finalist in Conerly Trophy history in 2006. The record-setting quarterback finished his career as the all-time leading passer in Delta State and Gulf South Conference history, while establishing a new record for career total offense. He ranks second all-time in NCAA history in career passing yards and career total offense. Eyster was a finalist in 2003, 2004, 2005, and 2006. No other player in Mississippi history has even been named a finalist three times. He concluded his career at DSU with 13,889 yards passing and 116 touchdown passes. He holds every major career and season passing mark in Delta State history.

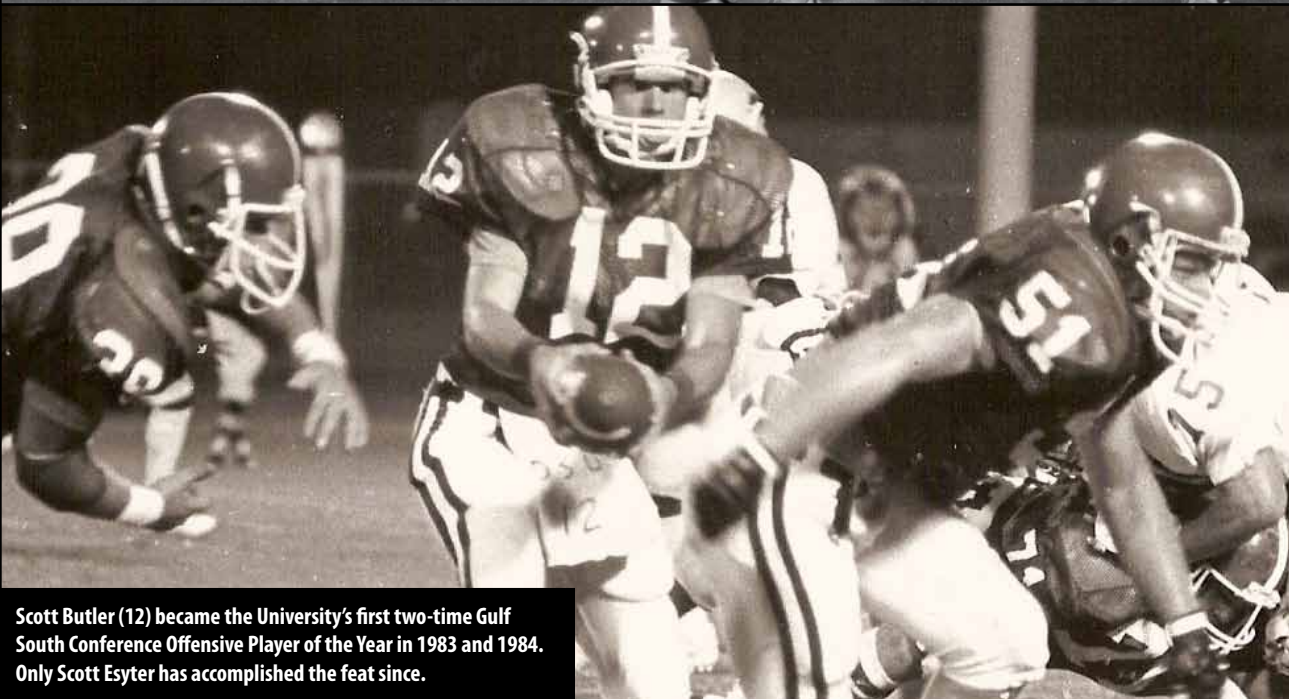

## QUARTERBACKS RULE THE ROOST



Scott Butler (12) became the University's first two-time Gulf South Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1983 and 1984. Only Scott Eyster has accomplished the feat since.

### GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE • OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR •

Delta State University has boasted some of the top offensive players in the history of the Gulf South Conference. In fact, four quarterbacks have helped define the position in one of the toughest league's in the nation. For their efforts, Delta State players have claimed six GSC Offensive Player of the Year Awards over the years.

In a league dominated by offense throughout the 1980s, 90s, and today, Delta State has always been in the thick of the hunt in the GSC. From 1973 when David Bradberry claimed the first honor for the Statesmen to Scott Eyster rewriting the conference record book, Delta State players have always put up some astounding numbers.

David Bradberry, a senior from Jackson, became the first Statesmen to earn the honor. In 1973, the lanky Bradberry helped direct the Statesmen to a 7-3 record while passing for 1,427 yards and 12 TDs. He also rushed for 536 yards and eight scores.

From 1983 to 1984 no other quarterback in the country enjoyed the level of success Scott Butler did for Delta State. The Oxford native amassed 5,299 yards of total offense and passed for 5,076 yards during that span. He ranked third and fourth respectively in the country in total offense his junior and senior seasons. When he finished his career he had broken or tied 20 DSU and 14 GSC records.

Josh Bright claimed the honor in 2000 after leading the Statesmen to a 14-1 record and the NCAA Division II national championship. Bright, a 6-foot-5 quarterback from Batesville, rushed for 1,495 yards and passed for 1,292 yards. He also rushed for a school-record 21 touchdowns.

Scott Eyster, a 6-foot-3 quarterback from Hammond, La., became the second two-time winner in 2005 and 2006. The record-setting quarterback finished his career as the all-time leading passer in Delta State and Gulf South Conference history, while establishing a new record for career total offense. He ranks second all-time in NCAA history in career passing yards and career total offense. In 2006, Eyster passed for 3,926 yards and 36 TDs while leading DSU to the NCAA semifinals. In 2005, the rocket-armed signal-caller passed for 3,107 yards and 29 TDs. He finished his career with 13,889 yards passing and 14,432 yards of total offense. In four years he also threw a whopping 116 touchdowns, while rushing for 12 more.

## THE ROBERTS ERA: YEAR FOUR

### GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE • DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR •

Defensive success is a relatively new thing at Delta State University. For years Statesmen football has been synonymous with offensive success. Since head coach and defensive coordinator Ron Roberts came to town, a few things have changed. With the rebirth of Delta State's "Green Shirt" defense, postseason accolades have flown DSU's way. Prior to Roberts coming to Delta State and in the previous 79 years of Statesmen football, only one man had been named Gulf South Conference Defensive Player of the Year. That was Anthony Maddox in 2003. Since Roberts arrival, DSU has claimed back-to-back awards with Michael Eubanks in 2006 and 2007, and Lardester Hicks-Green made it three straight in 2008.

In 2003, Anthony Maddox, a 6-foot-3, 305-pound defensive tackle, was named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Year becoming the first in school history. A game changing performer, Maddox helped guide the Statesmen to a 9-2 record. From his down lineman position, the Funston, Ga. native recorded 80 tackles with 61 solo stops. He also tallied 16 tackles-for-loss and 5.0 sacks. A menace to quarterbacks, the speedy lineman totaled four quarterback hurries and forced two fumbles. After finishing his career in 2003, Maddox was selected in the fourth round of the National Football League Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars. After three seasons in Jacksonville, he is now a member of the Houston Texans defensive front.

2006 and 2007 could best be described as the Michael Eubanks Era in the GSC. Over three seasons, the Cleveland native dominated play from his outside linebacker position. As a sophomore, Eubanks burst onto the scene with a school-record 13.5 sacks and 15.5 tackles for loss. One year later, Eubanks claimed the award for the first time after tallying 10.5 sacks and 24.0 tackles-for-loss with 75 total tackles.

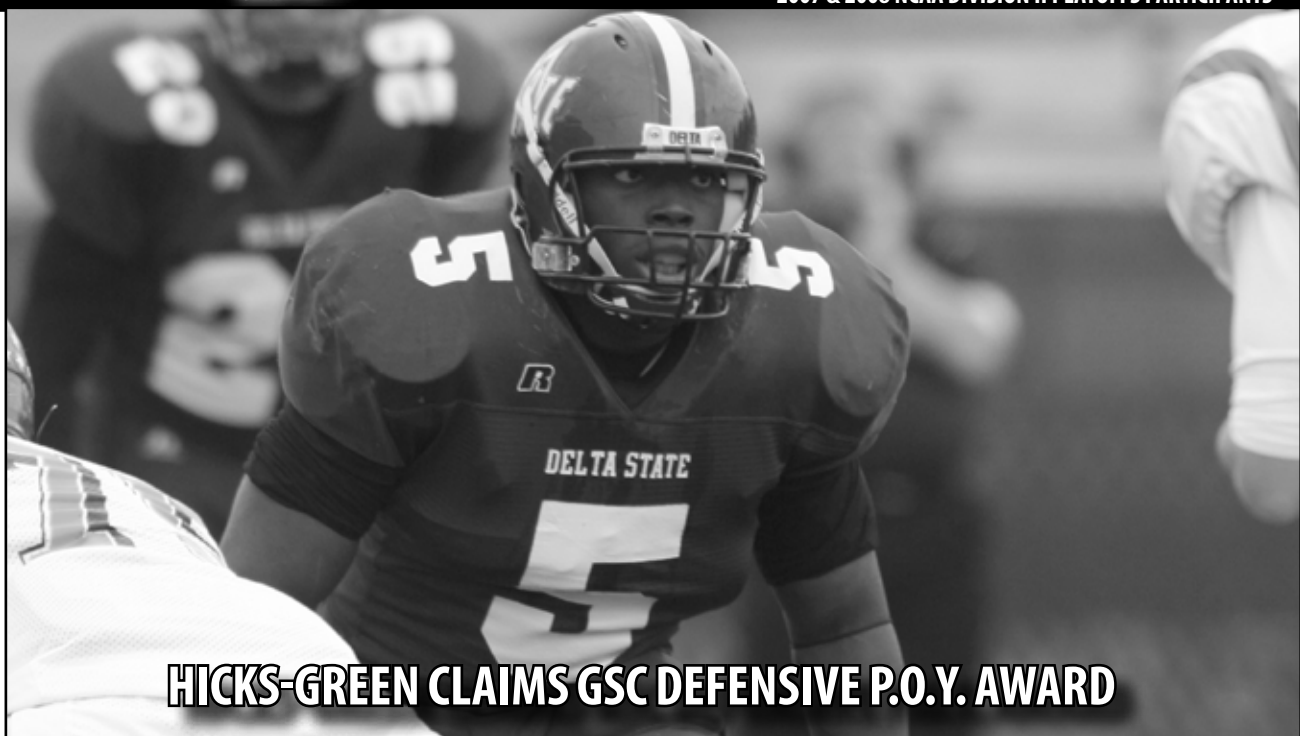
In 2007, Eubanks capped his career with one of the most memorable seasons in GSC history en route to the award. After guiding DSU to the semifinals as a junior, Eubanks got the Statesmen back to the playoffs with an amazing 90 tackles, 27.0 tackles-for-loss, and 12 sacks. He also recorded 14 quarterback hurries and forced four fumbles.

He finished his career by breaking the NCAA Division II career record for sacks with 39.0. He also established a new GSC record for career tackles-for-loss with 70.5.

In 2008, Lardester Hicks-Green, a 6-foot-1, 235 pound outside linebacker, turned in one of the best seasons in school history for a backer with 100 tackles, 15.5 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks, and one interception.

## STATESMEN COACHES AMONG THE BEST

### AFCA/GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE • COACH OF THE YEAR •

During the past decade, the Delta State football program has enjoyed tremendous success both on the field and in the classroom. Since 1998, the Statesmen have averaged just over eight victories per season. Not surprisingly, much of the success can be attributed to the coaches that put the players in the right spot at the right time. Fortunately for DSU, the last four head coaches have garnered either conference, regional or national coach of the year honors.

During Todd Knight's tenure as head coach, he guided the Statesmen to their first Gulf South Conference championship in 1998 with an 8-3 record. Not surprisingly, Knight became the first DSU football coach to earn GSC Coach of the Year honors.

In 2000, after winning the NCAA Division II National Championship with a 14-1 record, second year coach Steve Campbell earned Delta State's first ever National Coach of the Year Award.

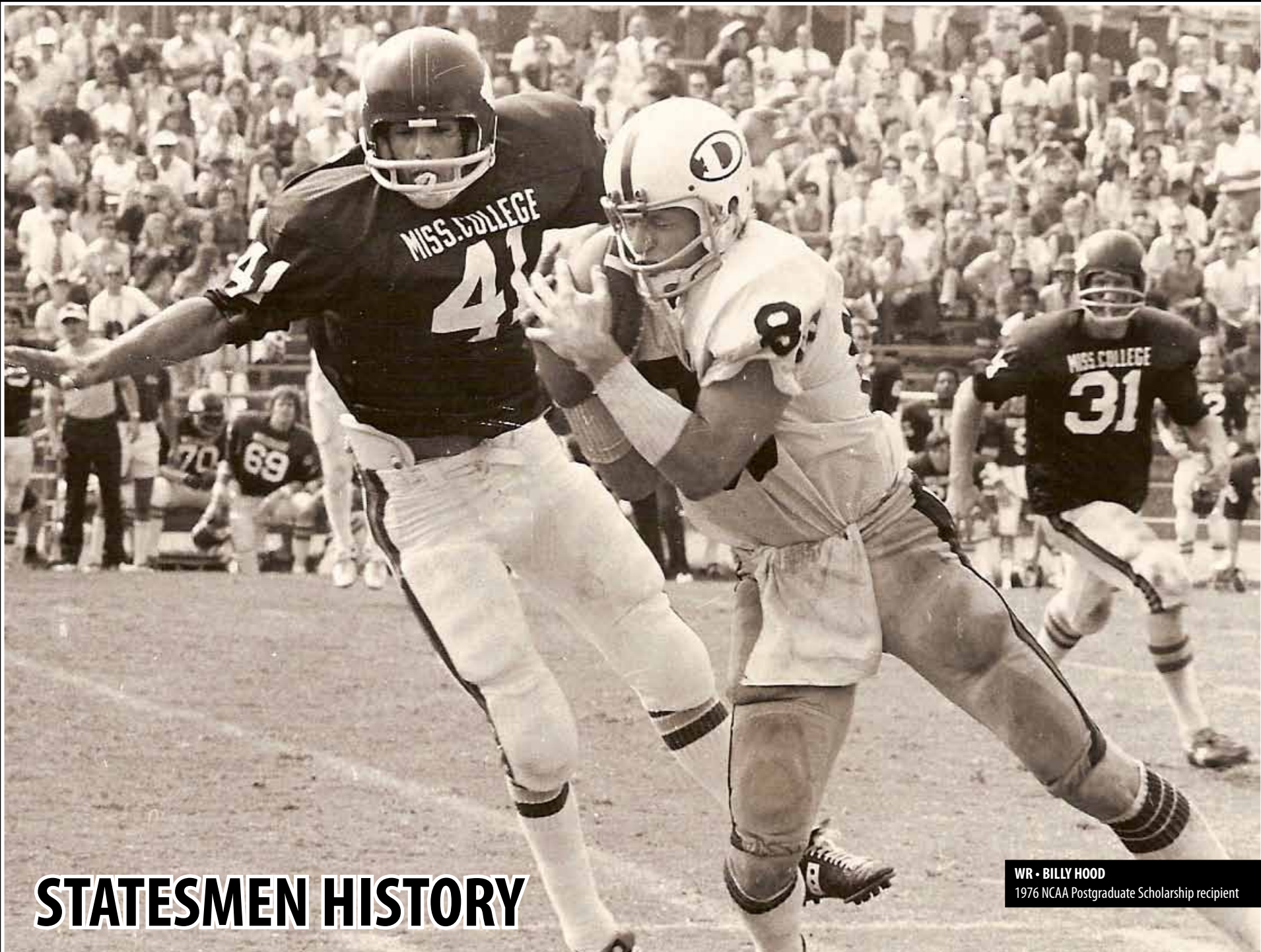
Six years later, after guiding the Statesmen back to the playoffs for the first time since the National Championship season, coach Rick Rhoades was awarded the Regional Coach of the Year award after leading the Green and White to a 14-1 record and an appearance in the Regional Championship game.

For current DSU head coach Ron Roberts the journey to Coach of the Year honors was a short one. In his first year as Statesmen head coach in 2007, Roberts guided the Statesmen to the GSC Championship and the second round of the playoffs for the second consecutive season while posting a 10-2 record. This marks the first time in Delta State football history that the Statesmen have had two consecutive seasons with at least 10 victories. Robert's also becomes the first head football coach in DSU history to win 10 games in his first season at the helm.

In 2008, the Visalia, Calif., native repeated the feat, sending the Statesmen to a 10-2 record and a second-straight Gulf South Conference championship. DSU finished the season in the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals and capped the season with a No. 7 national ranking.

## THE ROBERTS ERA: YEAR FOUR

### SIMPLY PERFECT... 1954 STATESMEN GO UNDEFEATED

Coach E.B. Chadwick knew he had a special group of players coming in for the 1954 season. Little did he know they would be perfect! Coach Chadwick would say, "Those boys always gave their all and left it all on the field." Leaving it on the field is an understatement. The 1954 edition of the Green and White remains the only undefeated team in Delta State University football history. The 2004 season was the 50th anniversary of the miraculous season and many of the members of that squad returned for a reunion at Parker Field.

In 1954, the Statesmen began their march to perfection with a 35-6 thumping of Millsaps College. Coach Chad's boys would continue the streak with a 35-12 drilling of Louisiana Monroe the following week. The third game of the year brought the first road game of the year at Troy State. The Statesmen dispatched the Trojans 26-12 in Troy, Ala.

Over the next five weeks the Statesmen would allow only six points over that span to finish 8-0. Game four pit the Statesmen versus the UAM Boll Weevils and the Weevils felt the spray of a 32-0 defeat. The Statesmen shut-out Mississippi College the next week 25-0 and followed that up with a 40-0 thrashing of West Alabama. Against Southern Arkansas, the Statesmen wowed a capacity Homecoming crown to a 53-0 win over the Muleriders.

DSU would wrap up the only perfect season in school history with a 20-6 win over Southeast Missouri State.

Aubrey Rozzell and Jimmy Sanders would earn Honorable Mention All-American status that year and forever write their names into the Delta State football record book.



### 1959 CHRISTMAS BOWL CHAMPS

Perhaps no other football team in Delta State school history charmed and excited fans the way the 1959 Statesmen did.

Under the direction of legendary head coach E.B. Chadwick -- who had led the school to its only undefeated season just five years before -- the 1959 club went 9-1 during the regular season and received a bid to play in the Christmas Festival Bowl at Demon Stadium in Natchitoches, La., against East Central Oklahoma State, a team that was 8-3.

To say DSU had speed and depth that year would be an understatement. The Deltans averaged a school record 330.0 rushing yards per game -- best in the nation among NAIA schools -- and 388.9 yards of total offense, which ranked them fifth in the nation. The team had 11 regular running backs and three capable quarterbacks.

With that it was no major crisis, when starting quarterback Don Ward went down with a dislocated shoulder and had to miss the game, leaving Frank Greenlee to anchor the attack in the first half of the contest, and Bob Brumfield to lead the team to victory in the second half.

After one half, the two teams were scoreless, with DSU and East Central Oklahoma both serious scoring threats before coming up empty.

James Hubbert changed things on the opening kickoff of the second half, as he scampered 95 yards for the game's first score at the 14:38 mark of the third quarter. Despite Willie Stokes' wide PAT attempt that followed, DSU scored again moments later after a bobbled Tiger punt attempt gave the Statesmen possession at the East Central Oklahoma 20-yard line.

Billy Pat Thomas went in from seven yards out three plays later, but Brumfield's kick was blocked, to make the score 12-0 Statesmen.

Ironically, most of the Delta State faithful who made the trip never saw DSU score the two quick touchdowns to start the second half, as a steady rain sent most in attendance under the grandstand for cover.

Later in the third period, Brumfield, scored on a three-yard bootleg, followed by a Stokes kick, to give DSU not only a 19-0 win, but also its only 10-win season and bowl victory ever.

## STATESMEN CLAIM FIRST NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WITH 63-34 WIN OVER BLOOMSBURG

**FLORENCE, ALA.** — Eighteen of the 27 teams that scored first have won the NCAA Division II National Championship, but Delta State did what it has been doing all long as the Statesmen overcame the odds to win their first National Championship, 63-34.

Delta State not only overcame Bloomsburg scoring first, the Statesmen also overcame their first post-season deficit. All told, Delta State would establish four new NCAA records in the process, as the Statesmen scored the most points in the game since Northwest Missouri scored 58 last season. The Statesmen would also set a new -game rushing record with 524 yards rushing, while accumulating 649 yards total offense, also a new NCAA record. Delta State's 36 first downs in the game also set a new NCAA mark.

After a Bloomsburg score in the opening minutes of first quarter, the Statesmen took to the field with a seven-point answer of their own. Junior quarterback Josh Bright rushed 35 yards for the Delta State touchdown with 9:55 left in the half. Bright would the day with 175 yards rushing with three touchdowns and 80 yards passing on a 6-of-11 day. Billy Dorgan would miss the extra point attempt on the five-play, 62-yard scoring drive to leave the score, 7-6.

On the preceding kick-off, Delta State surprised the Bloomsburg with an on-side kick, which was successfully recovered by Archie McDonald at the Delta State 46. With the favorable field possession, Delta State took to the ground, as Rico McDonald carried twice for a combined 22-yards on the drive, while teammate DeForest Hart ran for 5 yards to set up Bright's second rushing touchdown of the afternoon.

From 7-yards out, Bright muscled in for the score. Electing for the 2-point try, Bright connected with James Grubbs to give the Statesmen a 14-7 advantage with 5:04 left to play in the first quarter. Huskies quarterback Eric Miller aired out a 44-yard pass to Tierell Johnson and a 22-yard bullet to Mike Lielko to set up the short 2-yard touchdown connection with Lielko. Chris Thompson would convert the point after attempt to complete the seven-play, 74-yard scoring drive to tie the contest at 14-14 with 2:16 left in the first quarter.

The Statesmen would again try to keep the Bloomsburg defense guessing, as Delta State showed its patented quarterback swap. With his first snap in play-off action, Jeff Smith came through with back-to-back completions to Jody Jennings for 15-yards and Jason Franklin for 21-yards. With 12:26 left in the half and Delta State facing 4th and goal, Tanny Flowers dove in for the Statesmen score. Dorgan split the uprights for the point after to finish the 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive to put Delta State on top, 21-14.

Delta State would engineer a nine-play, 50-yard scoring drive on its next possession to build a 28-14 lead. The Statesmen scoring effort was highlighted with 15-yard Bright-to-McDonald connection on a screen pass and capped off with a 1-yard McDonald touchdown run with 7:26 left in the half. The Statesmen defense squashed Bloomsburg's scoring hopes on the play as Andre Brown recovered a Jerrod Beckett forced fumble.

The Delta State offense took over on the 36-yard line to watch Flowers scramble 25 combined yards to set up a Bright-to-Franklin 9-yard touchdown score. The Statesmen

would use ten-plays, 65-yards and 3:42 to take the 35-14 advantage in the locker room at the half.

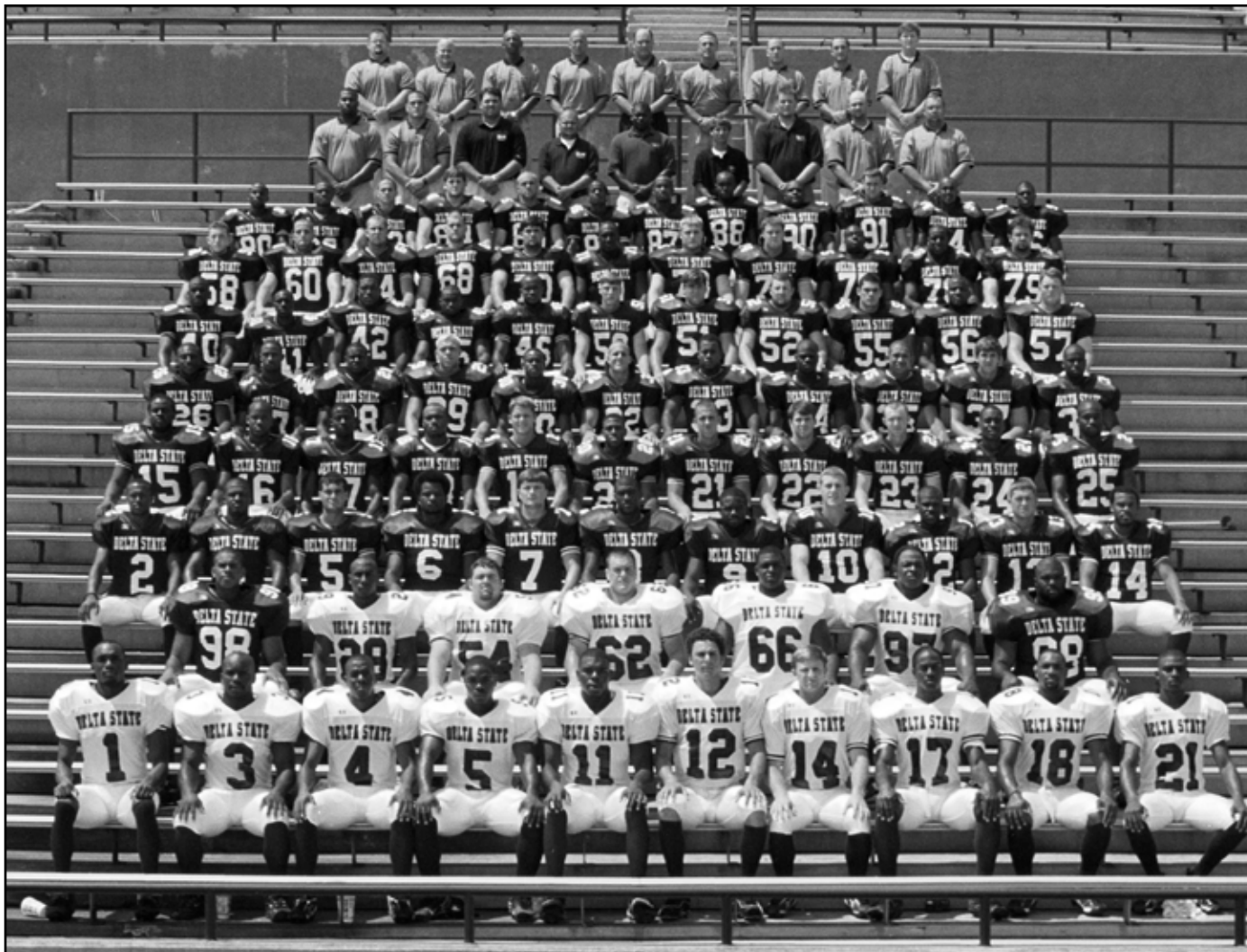
The Statesmen ended the first half tied for the most points in a half and a new record for the most points combined in the first half. Turn about became fair play in the opening ticks of the second half, as Bloomsburg successfully operated its own on-side kick. Facing a 4<sup>th</sup> and 15, Miller dropped back to find Johnson open in the flat for an 18-yard pick-up, which would set up a 1-yard Miller touchdown run. Thompson would successfully attempt the extra point to pull the Huskies with a touchdown at 35-21.

Delta State would respond with 8:28 left in the third as Hart muscled in from 2-yards out to complete the seven-play, 65-yard scoring drive. As quickly as the Statesmen posted the 42-21 lead, Bloomsburg tagged seven more to the board, as Miller, on a

4th and 10, connected with Darryl Williams for the 16 yard touchdown strike with 5:49 in the third.

On the Statesmen's next possession, Bright would rumble 25-yards for his third and final rushing touchdown of the game, putting Delta State , 49-28.

Entering the fourth quarter with a commanding 49-28, Hart powered in from 7-yards out with 12:03 left in the game to complete the 13-play, 74-yard scoring drive. Dorgan would complete the PAT for the insurance padding 56-28 lead. With 5:26 left in the quarter, Gary Smith got into the scoring act for the Statesmen as he rushed 18-yards for Delta State's final touchdown of the afternoon. Bloomsburg would add a last-stitch effort on Arrastene Henry's 5-yard TD with 3:32 left in the game, but it would not be enough as Delta State clinched its first NCAA Division II National Championship, 63-34.

## GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

The GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE (GSC) enters its 36th year of excellence, continuing a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite NCAA Division II conferences. With 15 universities in six southeastern states, the GSC is the largest playing Conference in Division II.

GSC members feature comprehensive athletic programs that compete for 13 official conference championships: football, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's golf. In 2003, the GSC conducted a provisional championship in women's golf, which will continue in 2004.

We take pride in our 37 National Team Championships in 10 sports and the emphasis on academic success by our coaches and student-athletes. Christian Brothers University joined the list of GSC National Champions in 2002, capturing the Women's Soccer Championship, the league's first in soccer. This last year, West Florida won their first men's tennis championship while Delta State captured their first baseball championship.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed by six universities in the summer of 1970: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin and Troy State. Due to scheduling problems during the 1970-71 academic year, the only league sport was football. Jacksonville State won the league's first championship.

In 1971, the league changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE, added Southeastern Louisiana (SELA) and Nicholls State (increasing the membership to eight), and opened an office in Hammond, LA. The following year, Mississippi College and Northwestern Louisiana (NWLA, now Northwestern State) were admitted. NELA withdrew to go Division I two years later, followed by SELA and Nicholls State in 1979.

The conference continued with seven teams until 1981, when the presidents admitted Valdosta State. West Georgia joined in 1983. Eight years of stability ended in 1991 when Tennessee-Martin and Troy State went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, before the beginning of an expansion resulting in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial (1992-93); Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State, Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); West Florida (1994-95); and Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, Montevallo and Southern Arkansas (1995-96). Jacksonville State went Division I at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers to keep the Conference at 16 schools. In July 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University, making it the largest NCAA conference at any level with 18 schools. The Conference membership decreased to 17 when MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2002-03 season.

Former Commissioner Jim McCullough moved the GSC office to its present Birmingham location. The current Commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October 1992. He is assisted by Sports Information Director Michael Anderson, Assistant Sports Information Directors Eric SanInocencio, Assistant Sports Information Director Michael Banks and Office Manager Andrea Nguyen. The Supervisors of Officials are Billy Johnson (Football), John Caldwell (Basketball-West) and Mike Murphy (Basketball-East).

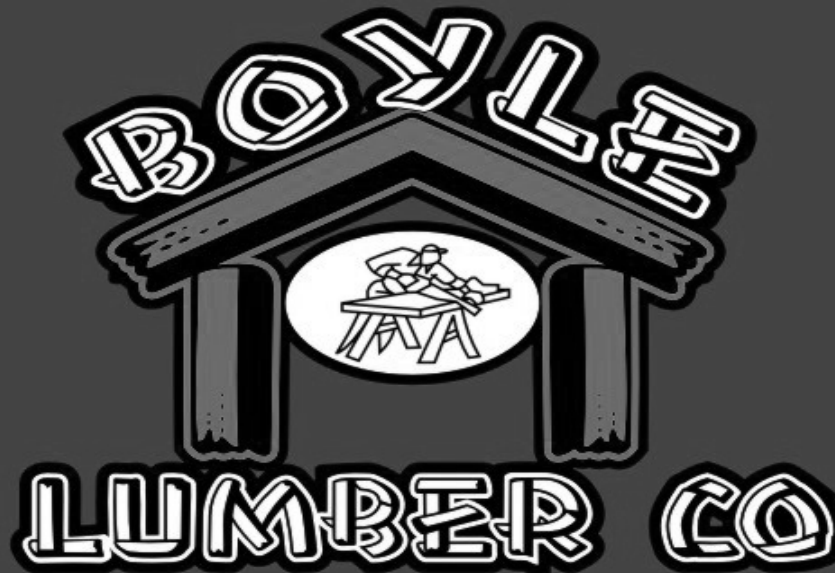
