Credentials will be available at the Media Will Call gate located on the west side of Travis E. Parker Field. Credentials should be requested at least seven days in advance of the game. No credentials will be mailed. If there is a special circumstance regarding one or more of the games, please contact the Athletic Communications Office.

#### **GAMEDAY SERVICES**

Members of the working media will be provided the following at Travis E. Parker Field: game notes package, game program, complete statistics and the opportunity to interview both coaches at the conclusion of the game. The final stat pack will be available 20 minutes after the game.

#### RADIO AND TELEVISION

Radio stations planning to originate a broadcast(s) from Travis E. Parker Field should contact the Director of Athletic Communications at least one week prior to the planned broadcast. Courtesy lines are provided for the official station of the opposing school. Any other line needed will require assistance from DSU Telecommunications.

#### PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Media members must adhere to the following guidelines regarding Statesmen player interviews: (1) All player interviews must be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office; (2) Players are available for interviews, either at the Dorgan Center or via telephone prior to practice (generally 1:30-4:00 p.m.) and following the completion of practice; (3) Please give at least 24 hours notice; (4) No interviews will be allowed prior to kickoff on gameday.



## DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY: Mississippi's regional university

As Dr. John M. Hilpert, Delta State's seventh president, said at his 2003 inauguration ceremony, "Delta State University has won our hearts."

His words conveyed the message that the warmth of the DSU community, combined with its steadfast determination to make meaningful contributions to the Mississippi Delta, make this university a special and worthwhile place to learn, to live, to work and to play.

Originally proposed by a group of leading citizens who wished to see this area progress educationally, culturally and economically, the university was established

by the state legislature as a regional teachers college in 1925.

Today, Delta State — located in Cleveland — still follows the same principles with a vision of commitment to students. Delta State University pledges that students will learn and grow in an environment that fosters discovery and creativity.

"Delta State is about the whole person," Hilpert maintains. "That is to say we think about educating students in multi-dimensional ways — classrooms, libraries, laboratories, technology centers, playing fields, offices, conference rooms, and social settings. Opportunities to learn are everywhere."

To that end, DSU pursues an agenda that works to accomplish an ambitious, yet laudable goal of becoming the best regional university in America, as it combines a heritage of academic strength with a robust commitment to serving people and communities, particularly in the Mississippi Delta.

## **JOHN HILPERT**

**Delta State University President** 

**Dr. John Hilpert's** eight-year tenure as president has resulted in significant growth and progress for Delta State University.

A strong proponent of year-long themes, Dr. Hilpert's presidency has been marked by three clearly-defined, straight-forward initiatives — "The Best Regional University in America," "The Year of Cleveland," and "The Year of Health and Wellness in the Delta."

"Results come by way of concerted efforts and focused attentions, and I believe these year-long themes force us to magnify those specific areas," Hilpert explained. "I believe we can make lasting impacts this way."

His tenure would confirm that, as during "The Year of Cleveland," Delta State celebrated its 80th academic year recognizing the rich relationship it has had with its host community, Cleveland. The community rallied together in time of need, as after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita devastated the Gulf Coast regions, community and campus citizens acted quickly to offer food, clothing, shelter, and financial help.

His most recent program, "Health and Wellness in the Delta" has allowed thousands access to free educational programs and testing, in the form of Delta Health and Wellness Day, a breast cancer awareness forum and Dr. Hilpert's own leadership of the Delta Health Alliance (DHA), a collaborative partnership comprised of Delta State, Mississippi State University, University of Mississippi Medical Center, Mississippi Valley State University and Delta Council, aimed at promoting programs of health education, health research and increasing the availability and ease of access to health care in the Delta region. He will serve as president of the DHA through June 2008.

Under Dr. Hilpert's leadership, Delta State has also experienced expansive development, most notably in the area of student enrollment, with the fall 2006 enrollment figures marking the largest in school history. Additionally, Delta State boasts a ten percent increase over a five-year enrollment period.

Other credits during his tenure include: Delta State's accreditation was reaffirmed by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December 2005; the University announced the conclusion of its highly-successful, five-year "Wings & Roots: Let our Legacy Soar" fundraising campaign, with the final tally capping at \$37,025,042, an amount that tripled the campaign's initial goal and stands as the largest collection of private support in the history of the university.

As shown in the Education Trust and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities' recent research Delta State stands atop its peer group of institutions for the percentage of entering students who graduate within six years of first enrollment. The number of doctoral

degrees conferred in 2004 doubled, while the number of undergraduate degrees conferred ranked tops among any other Carnegie master's institution in the state.

Further evidence in the University's commitment to becoming "the best regional university in America," is the advent of five additional academic majors to Delta State's already diverse curriculum, including athletic training and gaming management. Dr. Hilpert's leadership has also seen heavy emphasis put toward the incorporation of classroom technology — a consistent theme on his presidential resume.

As president of Northern State University in Aberdeen, South Dakota, from 1997 until he assumed the presidency of Delta State, integrating technology into the university's academic programs was a major goal. Northern received legislative designation as the Center for Statewide E-learning in 2001, and today Northern offers daily classes to more than one-third of South Dakota's school districts from ten studios on the campus.

For seven years prior to his arrival at Northern, Dr. Hilpert served the University of South Dakota as Vice President for University Relations, and for an interim term as Acting President. He has also held senior administrative posts at Thiel College in Pennsylvania and at Finlandia University (formerly Suomi College) in Michigan, during the 28 years of his career in higher education.

Dr. Hilpert earned his doctorate — a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration — from the Center for the Study of Higher Education at the University of Michigan. During his doctoral studies, he was honored with the prestigious Brubacher Award for scholarship by the faculty of the University of Michigan. He earned both a Master of Divinity degree from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia Senior College in Fort Wayne, Indiana. He also holds a two-year diploma from St. Paul's College in Missouri.

Throughout his career, Dr. Hilpert has served various organizations on boards, task forces, and committees. He was appointed in 2004 by Governor Haley Barbour to serve on Mississippi's Council for Education Technology.

Dr. Hilpert and his wife, Pat, have been married for 35 years. Both grew up in Missouri, he in Cape Girardeau and she in St. Louis. They have three adult sons, Joshua (daughter Julia), Zachary, and Adam (wife Megan). Pat spent 27 years as a Registered Nurse, serving in different settings as a nurse administrator and educator. She is also a published photographer who has exhibited her creative works in a variety of galleries and won several awards, including one co-sponsored by the Smithsonian Institution and the South Dakota Department of Tourism.



One of the nation's top young athletic administrators, Jeremy McClain is in his fifth year as director of athletics at Delta State University. The former NCAA All-American has steadfastly directed DSU's 13 intercollegiate athletic programs through the recent economic downturn while never sacrificing on the needs of the student-athletes.

An intense advocate for student-athletes, McClain's tenure has seen an increase in the services offered to Delta State's 350-plus student-athletes through the school's CHAMPS/Life Skills Program and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Semester in-services and learning opportunities are a staple now within the department for the student-athletes focusing on everything from finances to time management.

Improving academic performance and seeing that his student-athletes have the best chances after graduation are two additional areas importance for the Houlka, Miss., native. DSU's student-athletes routinely graduate at a higher rate than their regular student counterparts while maintaining the highest academic success rate among public institutions in the GSC. That academic success has led to a partnership with CareerAthlete, a company charged with helping today's student-athlete make a successful move into the work force.

Delta State's successes on the field have only increased since the former Statesmen baseball player grabbed the reins of the program in the summer of 2007. Since that time, the Statesmen and Lady Statesmen have claimed seven Gulf South Conference championships and made 21 NCAA postseason appearances.

A commitment to the fan is also a priority for McClain, who successfully completed a scoreboard renovation in 2009 at Parker Field-McCool Stadium, Ferriss Field, University Field and Sillers Coliseum. Plans are in the works for renovations at Parker Field-McCool Stadium and the long anticipated Statesman Boulevard.

## **JEREMY McCLAIN**

Director of Athletics • Delta State, 1999

Although focused on making it to the next level, McClain remained realistic of his chances and completed work on his master's degree in business administration at Delta State in 2002. Also during that time, he worked as an account executive with the Jackson Senators.

From there, McClain hung up the spikes and became a marketing representative for Federated Insurance Company in Calhoun City, a firm he would stay with from Nov. 2003 — Nov. 2006. During his tenure, he operated the most profitable territory in a six-state region for two consecutive years, while also improving a two-year loss ratio from 20.4 percent to 3.3 percent.

When the opportunity to return to Delta State University presented itself, McClain did not hesitate, accepting the offer to become the director of development for Delta State's Foundation.

He is a 1999 graduate of Delta State University with a bachelor's degree in business. In 2002, McClain completed his master's degree in business administration, and his currently pursuing a doctorate degree in educational leadership from Delta State University.

McClain is married to the former Christie Cannon of Calhoun City. The couple has one son, Cannon and two daughters, Kate and Piper.

McClain has also served the NCAA and Gulf South Conference in a variety of roles, including the Football Regional Advisory Committee (2007), Baseball Regional Advisory Committee (2011) and GSC Baseball liaison, position he has held since 2009.

Prior to taking the helm of DSU Athletics, McClain served the University as director of development with the Delta State Foundation until June 30, 2007. McClain has been associated with athletics nearly his entire life. A standout two-sport athlete at Houlka High School, McClain turned heads with his prowess on the baseball diamond and earned a full scholarship to attend Delta State University.

An ace for the Statesmen pitching staff from 1996-1999, McClain still holds many of Delta State's career pitching marks, including most appearances (69), most victories (45), most strikeouts (324) and most innings pitched (363.1). His perfect 15-0 season in 1999 earned the prolific hurler All-American, All-Region and All-Conference accolades, as well as team MVP honors.

The hard-throwing right-hander was drafted by the Boston Red Sox organization in May 1999 after he earned his bachelor's of business administration. McClain pursued his dreams of playing professional baseball for the next five years, completing stints with the Red Sox (1999 - 2000), Jackson Diamondkats (2000 - 2001), Nashua Pride (2001), San Angelo Colts (2001) and Jackson Senators (2002 - 2003).

## STATESMEN FOOTBALL SEASON OUTLOOK: THREE SECONDS AND 32-YARDS TO REDEMPTION

With the game tied at 17-17 and the Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs preparing to kick a game-winning field goal, coach Ron Roberts and the Delta State University Statesmen saw their dreams of a national championship fall three seconds and 32-yards shy of hoisting the NCAA's coveted trophy. Three seconds and 32 yards has become a mantra of sorts around the program since January, as Roberts and company look to return to Braly Municipal Stadium in Florence, Ala., this season for a shot at redemption and another chance to put the Statesmen on top of the Division II college football map.

"Our goals are clear, we want to compete for a national championship every year," Roberts stated. "Last season we fell short of our goal. We left some things on the field and we're working hard every day to rectify those situations. I'm proud of what we accomplished, but we still have a ways to qo."

Led by preseason All-American quarterback Micah Davis and All-GSC linebacker Ixavier Tripplett, the Statesmen return 17 starters on both sides of the ball and feature 33 seniors on the 2011 roster. The coaching staff also signed one of the top recruiting classes in recent memory and they'll report to camp in August to give the returners a boost.

"Leadership should not be a problem this year," Roberts added. "The offense and defense both have a nice balance of starters and lettermen coming back, but we really believe we recruited some young men that will

come in and ramp up the competition."

All eyes are on the Statesmen as the season approaches. Delta State is ranked no lower than No. 5 in any of the major preseason polls, while holding down the No. 2 ranking in the Lindy's Preseason Football Magazine Top 25 Poll. While rankings mean little right now, national notoriety has only helped keep this club focused during the offseason.

"Polls are polls and fans like to read them, but we're focused on ourselves right now and what we have to improve upon," Roberts deadpanned. "We face a very challenging schedule and our focus must be centered from day one."

Offensively, the Statesmen were spectacular at times in 2010. With Micah Davis erasing the single-season passing records while throwing for over 4,000 yards, the green-and-white offense averaged 31.9 points and 452.9 yards per game.

"Obviously, bringing Micah Davis back this season is tremendously important to our offensive continuity," stated DSU offensive coordinator Greg Stevens. "He's very cerebral in his approach and his athleticism has only gotten better."

While DSU loses three-time All-American Trevar Deed and current Cleveland Brown wide receiver L.J. Castile, the Statesmen return seven offensive starters. As we begin to prep for the 2011 season, let's take a position-by-position look at the Statesmen offense.

## OFFENSIVE LINE

Any quality football team is built upon a solid front line offensively and defensively. For the Statesmen, the anchor of the offense starts up front with the return of All-GSC and Second Team All-South Region center Darrell

Leopold (6-2/305). Joining Leopold are returning starters at left tackle Harrison Lauer (6-5/295) and right tackle Kendall Hunter (6-6/340). The trio combined to start 45 games last season and combined to grade out at 93 percent for the season.

"We're blessed to have Darrell, Harrison and Kendall back this season," stated DSU offensive line coach Travis Mikel. "Those guys bring so much leadership and ability to our front five, but it doesn't stop there. Seniors Evan Shaw (6-2/275) and Chase Sherman (6-4/300) and junior transfers Lamar Young (6-5/330), John Alvarado (6-5/295) and Will Kent (6-3/270) are ready to get after it."

The Statesmen added guard/tackle Mark Vukadinovic (6-4/300) from Minnesota State-Mankato in August. "Mark is a vampire," added Mikel. "If there's blood on the field, he's involved in it. Very talented and ready to go."

Transfers and at least two incoming freshman will play a major role for the offensive line as well. University of Maryland transfer Lamar Young, a 6-foot-5, 330-pound left guard, started two seasons for the Terrapins, while junior college standouts Will Kent (Mississippi Delta CC) and John Alvarado (Fresno City College) bring experience to the line.

Freshman Dylan Unterbrink (6-1/260) is set to compete for the back-up spot at center behind Leopold. Unterbrink was a standout at Navarre High School in Navarre, Fla., before coming to DSU in August. Other players expecting to contribute include: Robbie Haar (6-0/295), Justin Henry (6-3/290), Bryan Lovelace (6-1/270), and Mike Clifton (6-6/295).

"Our talent level and depth are good right now," Mikel added. "If we can get a few of our new guys to make an impact, we should be solid up front this season."

#### **RUNNING BACK**

Depth at running back could be an issue for the Statesmen, although the unit returns All-GSC tailback Brandon Lucas (5-8/175), who scored 13 touchdowns last season. Lucas is questionable for the start of the season due to a nagging injury. The junior from Covington, Ga., rushed 116 times for 869 yards and 11 touchdowns. He also accounted for two scores through the air.

Joining Lucas in the backfield are seniors Rafael Mitchell (5-8/170) and Clint Farrar (5-9/185) and a host of newcomers. Mitchell, a part-time starter at running back and receiver over the last three seasons, accounted for three touchdowns last season while rushing for 120 yards on 21 carries. Farrar, a special teams contributor the past three seasons, was impressive at times in spring camp.

As for the newcomers, transfers Brant Botill (5-10/215/College of Sequoias), Richard Freelon (6-0/205/Jacksonville State), Avery Horn (5-10/195/Michigan/Reedly College), and Bryce McBride (5-8/200/Mt. San Antonio College) are all expected to make a major impact on the Statesmen run game.

"If we've improved depth and talent in a single area more, it would have to be at running back," stated Ryan Tallent, DSU running backs coach. "We have a good group of speedsters and power backs who can certainly get the job done."

## **FULLBACK**

Senior Jamarcus Jackson (5-10/225) returns to anchor his starting fullback position after a breakout junior campaign. The former Holmes

Community College star rushed for just 44 yards, but grabbed eight passes for 85 yards and a touchdown. Better known for his ability to protect the quarterback and open gaping holes in the defensive line, Jackson graded at 94 percent last season as a blocker.

Redshirt freshman Michael Johnson (5-7/190) enters the fall as Jackson's backup. The former Madison Central standout is slightly smaller than Jackson, but packs a punch out of the backfield.

#### TIGHT END

Intensity is the name of the game for the Statesmen tight ends. Returning part-time starters Dex Hopkins (6-2/225), Jacob Sesma (6-3/225) and Reed Falkner (6-2/225) bring a wealth of talent back to field for the ever-emerging position in coach Stevens' attack. Hopkins caught six passes for 47 yards and a touchdown last year while Sesma corralled four passes for 32 yards. Falkner grabbed two passes for 21 yards as well. Redshirt junior Dewayne Hopson (6-3/238) also returns from last season's squad.

## WIDE RECEIVER

One of the deepest positions on the 2011 roster, the Statesmen wide receiving corps returns three starters off of last year's club and seven highly-touted newcomers join the group in August. Preseason All-GSC pick Chance Dennis (6-3/200), a senior from Houston, Texas, will anchor the spot this season after catching 52 passes for 807 yards and four scores in 2010. Dennis averaged 57.6 yards receiving per game and 16.5 yards per catch.

"Chance has the ability and opportunity to do exactly what L.J. Castile did for us last year," stated wide receivers coach Chet Pobolish. "The added bonus of having Bill, Carlton and Tim back also gives us tremendous leadership and continuity in the receiving corps."

Seniors Bill Franks (5-8/175), Carlton Ollie (5-11/178) and Tim Smith (6-0/197) also spent time in the starting rotation last year. Franks, a transfer from East Mississippi CC, caught 36 passes for 388 yards and two touchdowns to finish fifth on the team in receptions. Smith, a speedy possession receiver, added 16 receptions for 302 yards and a score. Smith's 18.9 yards per catch average was tops amongst receivers last year. Ollie closed last year with 19 grabs for 226 yards and a pair of scores.

Newcomers will also play a major role in the 2011 campaign with the addition of Lavon Downs (6-1/185/Fullerton College), Erick Clayton (6-1/207/Butte CC), Jamel Gandy (5-9/160/Mississippi State), Kevin Jackson (6-3/185/College of the Sequoias), DeJarrius Adams (6-2/205/Univ. of Memphis) and D.J. Holley (6-3/190/Auburn HS).

"We were lucky enough to add some major talent to our group during the recruiting period this spring," Pobolish added. "Everyone of the guys listed at the position could contribute mightily this season and I'm expecting another outstanding year with our aerial offense."

For the first time since the 2008 season, the Statesmen return both the starting and backup quarterbacks this year. Senior preseason All-American Micah Davis (6-2/205) will once again man the helm for one of the nation's most prolific offenses, while redshirt junior Kevin Vye (6-3/200) is ready and able to run the show should he be called upon.

Davis spent the 2010 season rewriting the Statesmen quarterbacking record book, becoming the first DSU signal-caller to eclipse the 4,000-yard mark. In 15 games, Davis completed 336 of 517 passes for 4,097 yards with 33 touchdowns and 19 interceptions. Along the journey, Davis topped school records for completions, attempts, yards, completion percentage, total offense yards and yards passing in a debut.

"His accuracy and decision-making are second to none," stated Stevens.

"Micah is one of those once-in-a-generation type players that just understands the game of football. Being a coach's son doesn't hurt, but he's just special in the pocket."

Davis is not alone, as Kevin Vye returns to fold after redshirting last season. A junior college All-American, Vye possesses the arm strength and quickness to guide the Statesmen offense in any situation.

The Statesmen also welcomed in four high school quarterbacks when fall camp started on August 6. Former All-State and Natchez High star Javon Washington (5-10/189), Brandon Bailey (6-1/195/Thaxton HS), Keenan Daniels (6-3/189/Florence HS) and Zach Hutcheson (6-3/205/Newnan HS).

"I'm excited about the talent level we have in the position," Stevens quipped. "With senior leadership and talented younger players, it will be a fun year to be a quarterbacks coach."

#### **DEFENSIVE OVERVIEW**

The 2010 version of then rookie defensive coordinator Pete Golding's defense got off to a slow start, allowing over 500 yards in two out of five games to open the season. Golding's charges allowed 412.8 yards by the end of the regular season.

DSU saved its best defense for the NCAA playoffs, allowing only 307 yards per game during the four game stretch. That momentum could easily be carried over from the end of 2010, as 11 key contributors from the NCAA runners up on defense dot the preseason depth chart.

"When I look out there right now, it feels really good to see all of these familiar faces, said DSU defensive coordinator Pete Golding. These guys should know what it takes to play championship football."

## **DEFENSIVE LINE**

Seniors Anthony Daniels, Robbie Mayers, Joe Marshall and Mark Hoskins each return to anchor the front three. Marshall was selected to the 2011 Preseason All Gulf South Conference team, following a tremendous 2010

season in which he racked up 55 tackles, 13 tackles for loss and six quarterback sacks, both of the latter were team highs. Junior college transfers Mario Owens and Derrick Joslin will also factor into the race to earn the nose quard spot.

Freshman Isiah Corbett will also look for playing time at the left end spot, along with returner Chance Starkweather. Jacksonville State transfer Armani Williams will also factor into the mix at right end.

## **LINEBACKERS**

The linebacking corps returns three regulars, including 2010 GSC Defensive Freshman of the Year Ixavier Triplett, and veteran Robert Hogan. Triplett finished a stellar freshman season, in which he compiled 100 tackles, including 12 for loss. Hogan completed his junior campaign with 66 total stops, with 8.5 for loss.

Ken and Melvin Griffin (not related) also look for playing time at the outside linebacker positions. Ken finished the 2010 season with 16 tackles, while the latter totaled 47 tackles, 4.5 for loss and two sacks. Freshman duo Rory Island and Caleb Smith are also in strong position to see playing time for the season opener. Island was named Division 8-4A player of the year at linebacker at Bay High School (Bay St. Louis), while Smith was a Second Team All-State performer at Clinton H.S.

"We feel good about the linebackers right now," said head coach/ linebackers coach Ron Roberts. "We have about eight or nine guys that we really feel like we can put out there and get the job done."

## **SECONDARY**

The biggest loss on defense from the 2010 season was Garrett Williams. The All-American lead the team with 130 total tackles, including 11 tackles for loss 2.5 sacks and eight interceptions.

Dominique Davenport and Dwight Tillman return at the cornerback spots for Golding and the Statesmen defense. Davenport is a returning All-Conference player, who after a disappointing sophomore season, finished with 53 tackles and five interceptions. The senior also had a team high 15 passes defended. Tillman returns following a 51 tackle performance in 2010. The Baltimore, Md., native also finished with one interception and 12 passes defended.

Newcomers Eric Williams and Montavius Hill will also compete for time at the cornerback positions. Williams recently completed a two-year stint at Hinds C.C., while Hill transferred from Louisiana Monroe by way of Mississippi Delta C.C.

"As with all of our defensive positions, I am excited about our defensive backs, said Golding. They know what we expect of them. We are looking for a strong season from them."

The remaining defensive backfield positions are also expected to be

filled by returnees, as Kenny Barnes, Brett Butler and Jerry Barnes each return from the 2010 season. Kelvin Boston, Fred Marshall and Trenton Warren should all see significant playing time in Golding's 3-3-5 system. Jerry Barnes leads returnees from the secondary following a 59 tackle performance in 2010 with two interceptions. Butler will continue to combine his hard hitting and speed, after finishing with 55 tackles in his opening season at DSU.

"This defense finished strong last season, Golding continued. I expect them to play at that same level to start this year."

#### SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Special teams coordinator Chet Pobolish looks to improve a shaky kicking game that caused the Statesmen plenty of missed points in 2010.

Returning place kickers Matt Dean and Matt Snyder combined to have 13 extra points either blocked or missed last season. Each finished the season 6-of-10, and both hit clutch kicks last season. Dean nailed a 48 yarder that proved to be the game winner against Arkansas Tech, while Snyder hit a 27 yarder with 2:22 left in the National Championship contest.

"Both kickers are very capable of having the starting job," Pobolish stated. "They both made some important kicks for us last year, and they have gotten better in the off-season."

Backup quarterback Kevin Vye fills the important role of field goal holder, while Skylar Parker returns as the long snapper.

Senior Andrew Jones has had the majority of the opportunities at punter during fall practice. Jones has been a member of the squad as the backup punter for two seasons.

"Andrew has been around the program, and he has learned from some good ones here," Pobolish said. "We expect a lot out of them."

Avery Horn and Bryce McBride each look to excite the Statesmen crowds with their speed, as they are the most likely kick returners.

Horn was primarily used as a running back at his previous stop, but was used as a kick returner for the University of Michigan in 2008, where he had five kick returns for 104 yards. Brown tallied over 1,000 yards at Mt. San Antonio in 2010.

"These guys are going to be very exciting to watch. We had a record breaker last year with Maurice Moore, I believe any of the guys we put back there could be just as good."

As head coach of the Statesmen, Ron Roberts has engineered one of the most successful runs in Delta State University football history and 2011 looks to be no different for the green-and-white.

The Visalia, Calif., native became the 17th head football coach at Delta State University in January of 2007 and Roberts has continued the task of building the Statesmen into one of the nation's elite NCAA Division II programs. In his four years at the helm, the Statesmen are 36-13 with three Gulf South Conference championships.

In his four years, the Statesmen have appeared in the NCAA Division II playoffs three times and in 2010 played for the national title, falling on a last-second field goal to Minnesota-Duluth 20-17.

His tenure has been defined by a tenacious defense paired with one of the nation's most prolific offenses. In 2010, the Statesmen averaged 31.9 points and 452.9 yards of total offense per game. That combination propelled the Statesmen to an 11-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in GSC play; giving the Statesmen a share of the GSC title for the third time in four years.

The Statesmen then began a march through the playoffs dispatching North Alabama 47-24, Albany State 28-7 and Shepherd 29-17 before dropping the heartbreaker to Minnesota-Duluth 20-17 at Braly Municipal Stadium in Florence, Ala., in the title clash.

Roberts has made several major changes to the program over the past two years, including the hiring of defensive coordinator Pete Golding, a former Statesmen All-GSC safety, and offensive coordinator Greg Stevens. Two moves that paid huge dividends last season.

In fact, the coaching staff during Roberts' time has remained stable with Chet Pobolish (Special Teams Coordinator/WRs) in his fifth season and Travis Mikel (OL) beginning his fourth. That continuity has helped Roberts direct the Statesmen through this exciting period.

Individual player success has also been a hallmark of Roberts' tenure with 21 Statesmen named to All-America teams, including two-time GSC Defensive

Player of the Year and 2007 Harlon Hill Trophy national finalist Michael Eubanks (LB), the NCAA's career sacks leader.

The GSC has also named 45 Statesmen to the All-GSC first or second teams under Roberts with eight DSU student-athletes receiving the honor in 2010. Alongside Eubanks, the Statesmen have seen Lardester Hicks-Green (LB) named GSC Defensive Player of the Year while Monterio James (CB/2005), Dominique Davenport (CB/2008) and Ixavier Triplett (LB/2010) were all named GSC Freshman of the Year.

Last season, Garrett Williams (SS) and Trevar Deed (RB) received All-American accolades while L.J. Castile (WR) and Phillip Yandall (OL) received honorable mention honors. The Statesmen also placed eight players on the All-GSC first or second teams as well.

The past four seasons have delivered the "wow factor" that fans deserve and Roberts promised when he took over the program from Rick Rhoades after serving two seasons as defensive coordinator. The new look has not only given the fans something to cheer about, but also enabled the Statesmen to return to the national stage.


Prior to last season, the Statesmen entered every year ranked no lower than No. 15 in the national rankings. The 2009 campaign failed to get off the tarmac, finishing the season 5-5 and out of the NCAA playoffs for the first time since Roberts became head coach.

The Statesmen claimed back-to-back Gulf South Conference titles in Roberts' first two seasons as head coach. All-American linebacker Michael Eubanks and the nation's No. 1 ranked defense led the green-and-white to its first league crown since the 2000 national title season in 2007. DSU finished the season 10-2 overall and 8-0 in GSC play. DSU defeated Shaw 45-7 in the first round of the NCAA playoffs before falling 20-17 at North Alabama in the second round at Braly Municipal Stadium.

The Statesmen concluded 2007 ranked second in the NCAA in total defense, third in rush defense, second in scoring defense and first in defensive pass efficiency. Michael Eubanks, an outside linebacker from Cleveland, was

selected as the National Defensive Player of the Year while being invited to the Harlon Hill ceremony as one of the final three candidates for the award. All told, a total of five players were named to All-American Teams.

The successes of 2007 spilled over into 2008, where the Statesmen finished the season ranked second in the GSC (471.9 ypg) and sixth nationally. Led by All-GSC candidate Garrett DeWitt, the Statesmen passing attacked ranked fourth nationally with 328.3 yards passing per game. The Statesmen also rolled up 1,713 rushing yards and ranked second in the GSC and 16th nationally with 36.2 points per game.

Wide receiver Chad Schroeder (WR/PR) was named to the prestigious American Football Coaches Association All-American Team, while Trevar Deed was named a First Team All-American after amassing 15 total touchdowns and over 1479 yards of total offense. Mark Ellis (OL), Pete Veseau (C), Chad Schroeder (WR) were also honored as All-GSC performers.

Off the field, Roberts is constantly involved in civic and social events within the Cleveland community. His civic-mindedness spills over into the program as well. The team annually participates in Habitat for Humanity home construction, offers free football clinics on campus and around the state, and works with mentoring organizations to help promote education and health across the Mississippi Delta.

Prior to joining the DSU staff, Roberts served one season as head coach at Mount Whitney HS in Visalia, Calif., and the 2003 season as defensive coordinator at Texas State University in San Marcos, Texas.

While at TSU, Roberts took over a defense ranked near the bottom in the Southland Conference. Within a year the seasoned coordinator improved TSU's defense in virtually every statistical category and Texas State placed two defenders on the All-Southland Conference Defensive Team.

Before his journey to Texas State, Roberts spent five seasons as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Tusculum College. During his tenure at the Greeneville, Tenn. school, the Pioneers posted one of the most memorable runs in TC football history.

In 2002, Roberts guided a defense that led the South Atlantic Conference in yards (273) allowed per game and in points per game (15). In 2002, the Pioneers posted a school record 31 turnovers for a +7 margin.

At Tusculum College, Roberts coached 11 All-South Atlantic Conference defensive selections and Ricardo Colclough, a second round National Football League draft pick in 2004.

Prior to joining the Tusculum staff, Roberts served as an assistant coach at Greensboro College in 1998 and was head coach at Burroughs High School (1994-96) in California. While at Burroughs, Roberts guided BHS to its first playoff appearance in 15 years and followed that up with another post-season trip the following year. He began his coaching career at Houston High School in Germantown, Tenn., as a defensive coordinator.

Roberts was a two-time All-Conference selection at linebacker at the College of Sequoias in his native Visalia, Calif. He transferred to the University of Tennessee at Martin, where he helped guide them to the 1988 Gulf South Conference Championship. He graduated from UT-Martin with a degree in Sociology and later earned his master's degree in Education from the University of Memphis in 1992.

Greg Stevens enters his second season as Offensive Coordinator/ Quarterbacks coach on Ron Roberts' staff at Delta State University. Stevens came to Delta State after serving four years as an assistant at Utah State. Known as one of the top offensive coordinators in NCAA Division II, Stevens has coached six All-Americans and 13 players to All-Conference/All-Region honors during his career.

In his first season as offensive coordinator at DSU, Stevens helped guide the Statesmen to the NCAA DII National Championship game and their third Gulf South Conference title in four years with an 11-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the GSC. DSU fell short of their goal of winning the title on a last-second game-winning field goal by Minnesota-Duluth 20-17.

The Statesmen offense proved to be one of the most prolific in the NCAA; finishing 12th in Division II with 452.9 yards of total offense per game while ranking 21st in passing at 277.5 yards per game. DSU also ranked in the top 50 in scoring, placing 39th with 31.9 points per game.

DSU ended the regular season leading the GSC in total offense and finished the season second. The Statesmen ranked third in the league in scoring, rushing and passing as well.

It was the Statesman passing attack that proved to be one of the best units in the GSC, as Micah Davis connected with 16 different receivers for a school record 4,097 yards passing. DSU finished with 4,166 yards passing also a school record.

It was a record breaking year for Micah Davis, a finalist for the CellularSouth Charles Conerly Trophy, completed 336 of 517 passes for 4,097 yards - all three school records. He also threw 33 touchdowns passes. His 65.0 completion percentage also snapped Garrett DeWitt's 63.7 school record. Davis is the first Statesmen guarterback to break the 4,000 yard mark in a season.

The receiving corps was led by All-GSC and honorable mention All-American L.J. Castile who caught 67 passes for 900 yards and 13 touchdowns. Junior transfer Chance Dennis also grabbed 52 passes for 807 yards and four touchdowns while Maurice Moore hauled in 54 passes for 594 vards and three scores.

On the ground, the Statesmen also produced solid numbers, as Trevar Deed rushed for 1,108 yards and 11 touchdowns in Stevens' spread offense. Brandon Lucas was a great one-two punch for DSU, as the sophomore speedster rushed for 843 yards and 11 scores on

Stevens also saw three-time All-American Trevar Deed's career come to a close at Delta State. Coach Stevens helped Deed engineer one of the top individual careers in school history with the second most receptions in DSU history with 187 while also breaking the school's scoring record (264 points/44 touchdowns) and all-purpose yardage records (5,144). He closed his career as the only 2,000 yard rusher and 2,000 yard receiver in Gulf South Conference history.

DSU's offensive line was also outstanding in 2010. The unit allowed the fewest sacks in the GSC last season and provided Davis and company the time to engineer one of the greatest seasons in school

From 2005-2008, Stevens worked as the wide receivers coach at Utah State, working with the Aggies' career receptions leader in All-American Kevin Robinson.

The wide receiver/returner left the Aggies with his name scattered throughout the school record book, including atop the career receptions list, as well as the NCAA record book, finishing as the NCAA career yards per play record holder.

Stevens served as the interim offensive coordinator in 2006.

Prior to serving at USU, Stevens spent three years as the offensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin. While at SFA, Stevens directed the Lumberjacks offense to the No. 1 ranking in passing in the Southland Conference in 2002 and 2003 and ranked 36th in NCAA-FCS in 2004.

Stevens also has ties to the Gulf South Conference, serving as offensive coordinator at the University of Arkansas-Monticello for three years. During his stint at UAM, the Boll Weevils set over 30 offensive school records and was ranked among the nation's top five units.

The Ephraim, Utah native has also coached at Mesa (Colo.) State (1992-94), Eastern Arizona (1995-97) and Snow (Utah) Junior College

Pete Golding, a former four-year starter and All-conference safety at Delta State University, enters his second season as the defensive coordinator for the Statesmen under head coach Ron Roberts. If year two is as exciting as year one, the Statesman Nation is in for one heck of a ride in 2011.

One of the fastest rising assistants in college football, Golding has coached All-Americans Michael Eubanks (LB/2006), Monterio James (CB/2006) and Garrett Williams (SS/2010). He's also been able to coach nine Statesmen to All-Gulf South Conference and All-South Region honors, while seeing six former players at Tusculum receive All-South Atlantic Conference accolades.

In Golding's first year back at Delta State, the Statesmen advanced to the NCAA DII National Championship game and their third Gulf South Conference title in four years with an 11-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the GSC. DSU fell short of their goal of winning the title on a last-second game-winning field goal by Minnesota-Duluth

Delta State's "Green Shirts" defense played a past-paced and frenetic style that led the Statesmen to 19 interceptions and 27 forced fumbles. Led by Garrett Williams, who recorded 130 tackles and tied the school record interceptions in a season with eight, DSU allowed 372.7 yards per game, but bristled during the postseason surrendering less than 250 yards per game in postseason.

Under Golding's guidance, Garrett Williams closed his senior season as a unanimous All-American selection after finishing with the third highest single season tackles total in DSU history.

Williams was one of three defensive standouts to receive postseason honors in 2010. Ixavier Triplett was named second team All-GSC while becoming the first linebacker in GSC history to be named Defensive Freshman of the Year. Triplett finished the season with 100 tackles and 12 tackles for loss. He's the first freshman in DSU history to record 100 tackles in a season.

Cornerback Dominique Davenport also received second team All-GSC honors and will enter his senior season with a chance to break the school record for career interceptions. Davenport picked off five passes last season and has nine for his career.

Prior to joining Roberts' staff, Golding served the past two vears as defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach under

Frankie DeBusk at Tusculum College, a member of the South Atlantic Conference. Prior to being named defensive coordinator in 2008. Golding served as defensive backs coach in 2007.

The Pioneers became an explosive and record-setting defensive unit under Golding's direction. In 2007, Tusculum set a new school record for interceptions with 14 and in 2008 TC lead the SAC in sacks and turnovers forced en route to an appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Pioneers eventually lost to Delta State in the second round 27-19 at Parker Field-McCool Stadium.

The Hammond, La., native began his coaching career as a graduate assistant on former DSU head coach Rick Rhoades' staff in 2006. The Statesmen went 12-3 that season and advanced all the way to the NCAA Division II Semifinals before falling to eventual national champion Grand Valley State.

Golding was a four-year starter for the Statesmen from 2002-2005 at safety, racking up 285 career tackles to rank fourth in school history. In 2004, the former 5-foot-9 free safety garnered All-Gulf South Conference honors after leading the team with 85 tackles with two interceptions and eight pass break-ups. As a senior in 2005, he tallied 81 tackles with five tackles-for-loss, two interceptions and two forced fumbles.

Golding graduated in 2005 from Delta State with a degree in health, physical education and recreation.



In Mikel's first season as offensive line coach, the Statesmen allowed the fewest sacks in the Gulf South Conference while producing one of the top offenses in NCAA Division II. DSU averaged 31.9 points and 452.9 yards of total offense per game.

Mikel's linemen allowed Micah Davis to become the first 4,000 yard passer in school history while Trevar Deed shattered the school all-purpose yardage (5,144) and scoring (264 points/44 touchdowns) records.

Phillip Yandall (LT) and Darrell Leopold (C) earned postseason honors for DSU under Mikel's direction. Yandall was named a Daktronics Honorable Mention All-American while both Yandall and Leopold were named All-GSC and All-South Region.

In 2009, the Statesmen offense averaged 410.4 yards per game, while scoring 27.1 points per game. Mikel is currently pursuing a master's degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation.





The record-setting quarterback finished his career as the all-time leading passer in Delta State and Gulf South Conference history, while establishing and new record for career total offense. He ranks second all-time in NCAA history in career passing yards and career total offense. In 2006, Eyster passed for 3,926 yards and 36 TDs while leading DSU to the NCAA semifinals. In 2005, the rocket-armed signal-caller passed for 3,107 yards and 29 TDs. He finished his career with 13,889 yards passing and 14,432 yards of total offense, both GSC records. In four years he also threw a whopping 116 touchdowns, while rushing for 12 more.

Many former Delta State University greats have been honored as finalists for the prestigious Harlon Hill Trophy. First awarded in 1986, the Harlon Hill Trophy is awarded annually to the nation's best NCAA Division II football player. Nominating and voting on these players is conducted through the sports information departments at the 156 NCAA Division II football playing institutions.

Named after the late Harlon Hill, a talented wide receiver for then Florence State Teacher's College (now the University of North Alabama) and the NFL's Chicago Bears, the trophy was designed and built by Herff Jones, Inc. which is also responsible for the design of the Heisman Trophy and the Congressional Medal of Honor.

After the regional and national voting process has concluded, the final three vote-getters are invited to Florence, Ala. during the week of the Division II National Championship game for a presentation banquet that honors the newest recipient.

In 2007, Delta State University All-American linebacker Michael Eubanks became just the second defensive player in the trophy's 21-year history to be named one of the top three finalists for the coveted award. UNA's Ronald McKinnon, a Harlon Hill Trophy winner, is the only other defensive player to earn the honor.

Eubanks, a Cleveland native and 2007 graduate, concluded the 2007 season with 90 tackles, 27 tackles-for-loss, and 12 sacks. His sacks and TFLs led the GSC and ranked among the nation's top five. He set the new NCAA Division II career sack record November 17, 2007 versus Shaw University in the first round of the NCAA playoffs. The speedy outside linebacker recorded a school and conference record five sacks that day to eclipse the old mark.

Eubanks, is pictured above with Matt Jones and Travis Chamblee. The two members of the

Delta State Athletic Communications staff engineered his campaign in 2007.

In 2005 and 2006, Delta State's Scott Eyster, the all-time leading passer in school and GSC history, was named one of the top eight finalists, but fell just short of a top three invite. In 1996, Tregnel Thomas was a national finalist, but he too fell just short.

In 2004, All-American wide receiver Ellis Debrow and in 2000 quarterback Josh Bright drew national attention, but they were not finalists.



#### CELLULARSOUTH CHARLES CONERLY TROPHY

Founded and organized exclusively by the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame and Museum since 1996, the CellularSouth Conerly Trophy is awarded annually to Mississippi's top college football player as determined by a panel of 60 media voters representing radio, television and print outlets in small, medium and large sized markets across the state.

The award, named after the late Charlie Conerly, is an original bronze sculpture sculpted by the late Bruce Brady, a nationally acclaimed artist from Brookhaven, MS. The original Conerly Trophy is on permanent display at the Museum. The Conerly Trophy recipient is presented an exact replica that is a lost wax casting thrown at a foundry in Texas.

The Conerly Trophy is presented at a banquet usually held the Thursday following the final regular season game. Past banquet sites are Jackson, Clarksdale and Tunica. The three finalists are present at the dinner with the winner announced at that time.

Former Delta State great Tregnel Thomas, a 5-foot-7 running back from Pascagoula, became the first Conerly Trophy winner in the award's history in 1996. Thomas blistered Gulf South Conference and NCAA opponents for 1,604 yards rushing and 11 touchdowns.

Josh Bright repeated the feat in 2000 after leading the Statesmen to the NCAA Division II national championship. Bright, a 6-foot-5 quarterback from Batesville, rushed for 1,495 yards and passed for 1,292 yards. He also rushed for a schoolrecord 21 touchdowns.

Scott Eyster, a 6-foot-3 quarterback from Hammond, La., became the first four-time finalist in Conerly Trophy history in 2006. The record-setting quarterback finished his career as the all-time leading passer in Delta State and Gulf South Conference history, while establishing and new record for career total offense. He ranks second all-time in NCAA history in career passing yards and career total offense. Eyster was a finalist in 2003, 2004, 2005, and 2006. No other player in Mississippi history has even been named a finalist three times. He concluded his career at DSU with 13,889 yards passing and 116 touchdown passes. He holds every major career and season passing mark in Delta State history.



### GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR •

Delta State University has boasted some of the top offensive players in the history of the Gulf South Conference. In fact, four quarterbacks have helped define the position in one of the toughest league's in the nation. For their efforts, Delta State players have claimed six GSC Offensive Player of the Year Awards over the years.

In a league dominated by offense throughout the 1980s, 90s, and today, Delta State has always been in the thick of the hunt in the GSC. From 1973 when David Bradberry claimed the first honor for the Statesmen to Scott Eyster rewriting the conference record book, Delta State players have always put up some astounding numbers.

David Bradberry, a senior from Jackson, became the first Statesmen to earn the honor. In 1973, the lanky Bradberry helped direct the Statesmen to a 7-3 record while passing for 1,427 yards and 12 TDs. He also rushed for 536 yards and eight scores.

From 1983 to 1984 no other quarterback in the country enjoyed the level of success Scott Butler did for Delta State. The Oxford native amassed 5,299 yards of total offense and passed for 5,076 yards during that span. He ranked third and fourth respectively in the country in total offense his junior and senior seasons. When he finished his career he had broken or tied 20 DSU and 14 GSC records.

Josh Bright claimed the honor in 2000 after leading the Statesmen to a 14-1 record and the NCAA Division II national championship. Bright, a 6-foot-5 quarterback from Batesville, rushed for 1,495 yards and passed for 1,292 yards. He also rushed for a school-record 21 touchdowns.

Scott Eyster, a 6-foot-3 quarterback from Hammond, La., became the second two-time winner in 2005 and 2006. The record-setting quarterback finished his career as the all-time leading passer in Delta State and Gulf South Conference history, while establishing a new record for career total offense. He ranks second all-time in NCAA history in career passing yards and career total offense. In 2006, Eyster passed for 3,926 yards and 36 TDs while leading DSU to the NCAA semifinals. In 2005, the rocket-armed signal-caller passed for 3,107 yards and 29 TDs. He finished his career with 13,889 yards passing and 14,432 yards of total offense. In four years he also threw a whopping 116 touchdowns, while rushing for 12 more.

## GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE • DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR •

Defensive success is a relatively new thing at Delta State University. For years Statesmen football has been synonymous with offensive success. Since head coach Ron Roberts came to town, a few things have changed. With the rebirth of Delta State's "Green Shirt" defense, postseason accolades have flown DSU's way. Prior to Roberts coming to Delta State and in the previous 79 years of Statesmen football, only one man had been named Gulf South Conference Defensive Player of the Year. That was Anthony Maddox in 2003. Since Roberts arrival, DSU has claimed back-to-back awards with Michael Eubanks in 2006 and 2007, and Lardester Hicks-Green made it three straight in 2008.

In 2003, Anthony Maddox, a 6-foot-3, 305-pound defensive tackle, was named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Year becoming the first in school history. A game changing performer, Maddox helped guide the Statesmen to a 9-2 record. From his down lineman position, the Funston, Ga. native recorded 80 tackles with 61 solo stops. He also tallied 16 tackles-for-loss and 5.0 sacks. A menace to quarterbacks, the speedy lineman totaled four quarterback hurries and forced two fumbles. After finishing his career in 2003, Maddox was selected in the fourth round of the National Football League Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars. After three seasons in Jacksonville, he is now a member of the Houston Texans defensive front.

2006 and 2007 could best be described as the "Michael Eubanks Era" in the GSC. Over three seasons, the Cleveland native dominated play from his outside linebacker position. As a sophomore, Eubanks burst onto the scene with a school-record 13.5 sacks and 15.5 tackles for loss. One year later, Eubanks claimed the award for the first time after tallying 10.5 sacks and 24.0 tackles-for-loss with 75 total tackles.

In 2007, Eubanks capped his career with one of the most memorable seasons in GSC history en route to the award. After guiding DSU to the semifinals as a junior, Eubanks got the Statesmen back to the playoffs with an amazing 90 tackles, 27.0 tackles-for-loss, and 12 sacks. He also recorded 14 quarterback hurries and forced four fumbles.

He finished his career by breaking the NCAA Division II career record for sacks with 39.0. He also established a new GSC record for career tackles-for-loss with 70.5.

In 2008, Lardester Hicks-Green, a 6-foot-1, 235 pound outside linebacker, turned in one of the best seasons in school history for a backer with 100 tackles, 15.5 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks, and one interception.

#### **AFCA/GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE** COACH OF THE YEAR •

During the past decade, the Delta State football program has enjoyed tremendous success both on the field and in the classroom. Since 1998, the Statesmen have averaged just over eight victories per season. Not surprisingly, much of the success can be attributed to the coaches that put the players in the right spot at the right time. Fortunately for DSU, the last four head coaches have garnered either conference, regional or national coach of the year honors.

DELTA STATE

During Todd Knight's tenure as head coach, he guided the Statesmen to their first Gulf South Conference championship in 1998 with an 8-3 record. Not surprisingly, Knight became the first DSU football coach to earn GSC Coach of the Year honors.

In 2000, after winning the NCAA Division II National Championship with a 14-1 record, second year coach Steve Campbell earned Delta State's first ever National Coach of the Year Award.


Six years later, after guiding the Statesmen back to the playoffs for the first time since the National Championship season, coach Rick Rhoades was awarded the Regional Coach of the Year award after leading the Green and White to a 14-1 record and an appearance in the Regional Championship game.

For current DSU head coach Ron Roberts the journey to Coach of the Year honors was a short one. In his first year as Statesmen head coach in 2007, Roberts guided the Statesmen to the GSC Championship and the second round of the playoffs for the second consecutive season while posting a 10-2 record. This marks the first time in Delta State football history that the Statesmen have had two consecutive seasons with at least 10 victories. Robert's also becomes the first head football coach in DSU history to win 10 games in his first season at the helm.

In 2008, the Visalia, Calif., native repeated the feat, sending the Statesmen to a 10-2 record and a second-straight Gulf South Conference championship. DSU finished the season in the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals and capped the season with a No. 7 national ranking.

Ron Roberts became the 17th head coach in DSU football history in April of 2007 after serving as defensive coordinator in 2006. In his first season at the helm, DSU claimed its third GSC championship and its first out-right. DSU advanced to the second round of the NCAA playoffs as well. In 2008, the Statesmen repeated the feat, claiming the GSC title and advancing to the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals. In 2010, Roberts guided the Statesmen to their third GSC title in four seasons and finished national runner-up after falling 20-17 in the NCAA DII Championship to UM-Duluth. In four seasons, Roberts has compiled a 36-13 record.

#### SIMPLY PERFECT...1954 STATESMEN GO UNDEFEATED



The 1954 edition of the Green and White remains the only undefeated team in Delta State University football history. In 1954, the Statesmen began their march to perfection with a 35-6 thumping of Millsaps College. Coach Chad's boys would continue the streak with a 35-12 drilling of Louisiana Monroe the following week. The third game of the year brought the first road game of the year at Troy State. The Statesmen dispatched the Troians 26-12 in Troy. Ala.

Over the next five weeks the Statesmen would allow only six points over that span to finish 8-0. Game four pit the Statesmen versus the UAM Boll Weevils and the Weevils felt the spray of a 32-0 defeat. The Statesmen shut-out Mississippi College the next week 25-0 and followed that up with a 40-0 thrashing of West Alabama. Against Southern Arkansas, the Statesmen wowed a capacity Homecoming crown to a 53-0 win over the Muleriders.

DSU would wrap up the only perfect season in school history with a 20-6 win over Southeast Missouri State.

Aubrey Rozzell and Jimmy Sanders would earn Honorable Mention All-American status that year and forever write their names into the Delta State football record book.



Under the direction of legendary head coach E.B. Chadwick -- who had led the school to its only undefeated season just five years before -- the 1959 club went 9-1 during the regular season and received a bid to play in the Christmas Festival Bowl at Demon Stadium in Natchitoches, La., against East Central Oklahoma State, a team that was 8-3.

To say DSU had speed and depth that year would be an understatement. The Deltans averaged a school record 330.0 rushing yards per game -- best in the nation among NAIA schools -- and 388.9 yards of total offense, which ranked them fifth in the nation. The team had 11 regular running backs and three capable quarterbacks.

With that it was no major crisis, when starting quarterback Don Ward went down with a dislocated shoulder and had to miss the game, leaving Frank Greenlee to anchor the attack in the first half of the contest, and Bob Brumfield to lead the team to victory in the second half.

After one half, the two teams were scoreless, with DSU and East Central Oklahoma both serious scoring threats before coming up empty.

James Hubbert changed things on the opening kickoff of the second half, as he scampered 95 yards for the game's first score at the 14:38 mark of the third quarter. Despite Willie Stokes' wide PAT attempt that followed, DSU scored again moments later after a bobbled Tiger punt attempt gave the Statesmen possession at the East Central Oklahoma 20-yard line.

Billy Pat Thomas went in from seven yards out three plays later, but Brumfield's kick was blocked, to make the score 12-0 Statesmen.

Ironically, most of the Delta State faithful who made the trip never saw DSU score the two quick touchdowns to start the second half, as a steady rain sent most in attendance under the grandstand for cover.

Later in the third period, Brumfield, scored on a three-yard bootleg, followed by a Stokes kick, to give DSU not only a 19-0 win, but also its only 10-win season and bowl victory ever.

#### STATESMEN CLAIM FIRST NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WITH 63-34 WIN OVER BLOOMSBURG

**FLORENCE, ALA.** — Eighteen of the 27 teams that scored first have won the NCAA Division II National Championship, but Delta State did what it has been doing all long as the Statesmen overcame the odds to win their first National Championship, 63-34.

Delta State not only overcame Bloomsburg scoring first, the Statesmen also overcame their first post-season deficit. All told, Delta State would establish four new NCAA records in the process, as the Statesmen scored the most points in the game since Northwest Missouri scored 58 last season. The Statesmen would also set a new-game rushing record with 524 yards rushing, while accumulating 649 yards total offense, also a new NCAA record. Delta State's 36 first downs in the game also set a new NCAA mark.

After a Bloomsburg score in the opening minutes of first quarter, the Statesmen took to the field with a seven-point answer of their own. Junior quarterback Josh Bright rushed 35 yards for the Delta State touchdown with 9:55 left in the half. Bright would the day with 175 yards rushing with three touchdowns and 80 yards passing on a 6-of-11 day. Billy Dorgan would miss the extra point attempt on the five-play, 62-yard scoring drive to leave the score, 7-6.

On the preceding kick-off, Delta State surprised the Bloomsburg with an on-side kick, which was successfully recovered by Archie McDonald at the Delta State 46. With the favorable field possession, Delta State took to the ground, as Rico McDonald carried twice for a combined 22-yards on the drive, while teammate DeForest Hart ran for 5 yards to set up Bright's second rushing touchdown of the afternoon.

From 7-yards out, Bright muscled in for the score. Electing for the 2-point try, Bright connected with James Grubbs to give the Statesmen a 14-7 advantage with 5:04 left to play in the first quarter. Huskies quarterback Eric Miller aired out a 44-yard pass to Tierell Johnson and a 22-yard bullet to Mike Lielko to set up the short 2-yard touchdown connection with Lielko. Chris Thompson would convert the point after attempt to complete the seven-play, 74-yard scoring drive to tie the contest at 14-14 with 2:16 left in the first quarter.

The Statesmen would again try to keep the Bloomsburg defense guessing, as Delta State showed its patented quarterback swap. With his first snap in play-off action, Jeff Smith came through with back-to-back completions to Jody Jennings for 15-yards and Jason Franklin for 21-yards. With 12:26 left in the half and Delta State facing 4th and goal, Tanny Flowers dove in for the Statesmen score. Dorgan split the uprights for the point after to finish the 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive to put Delta State on top, 21-14.

Delta State would engineer a nine-play, 50-yard scoring drive on its next possession to build a 28-14 lead. The Statesmen scoring effort was highlighted with 15-yard Bright-to-McDonald connection on a screen pass and capped off with a 1-yard McDonald touchdown run with 7:26 left in the half. The Statesmen defense squashed Bloomsburg's scoring hopes on the play as Andre Brown recovered a Jerrod Beckett forced fumble.

The Delta State offense took over on the 36-yard line to watch Flowers scramble 25 combined yards to set up a Bright-to-Franklin 9-yard touchdown score. The Statesmen would use ten-plays, 65-yards and 3:42 to take the 35-14 advantage in the locker room at the half.

The Statesmen ended the first half tied for the most points in a half and a new


record for the most points combined in the first half. Turn about became fair play in the opening ticks of the second half, as Bloomsburg successfully operated its own on-side kick. Facing a 4<sup>th</sup> and 15, Miller dropped back to find Johnson open in the flat for an 18-yard pick-up, which would set up a 1-yard Miller touchdown run. Thompson would successfully attempt the extra point to pull the Huskies with a touchdown at 35-21.

Delta State would respond with 8:28 left in the third as Hart muscled in from 2-yards out to complete the seven-play, 65-yard scoring drive. As quickly as the Statesmen posted the 42-21 lead, Bloomsburg tagged seven more to the board, as Miller, on a 4th and 10, connected with Darryl Williams for the 16 yard touchdown strike with 5:49 in the third.

On the Statesmen's next possession, Bright would rumble 25-yards for his third and

final rushing touchdown of the game, putting Delta State, 49-28.

Entering the fourth quarter with a commanding 49-28, Hart powered in from 7-yards out with 12:03 left in the game to complete the 13-play, 74-yard scoring drive. Dorgan would complete the PAT for the insurance padding 56-28 lead. With 5:26 left in the quarter, Gary Smith got into the scoring act for the Statesmen as he rushed 18-yards for Delta State's final touchdown of the afternoon. Bloomsburg would add a last-stitch effort on Arrastene Henry's 5-yard TD with 3:32 left in the game, but it would not be enough as Delta State clinched its first NCAA Division II National Championship, 63-34.



#### **GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE**

The GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE (GSC) enters its 37th year of excellence, continuing a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite NCAA Division II conferences. With eight universities in five southeastern states, the GSC is one of the most successful conferences in Division II.

GSC members feature comprehensive athletic programs that compete for 13 official conference championships: football, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's golf. In 2003, the GSC conducted a provisional championship in women's golf, which will continue in 2004.

We take pride in our 37 National Team Championships in 10 sports and the emphasis on academic success by our coaches and student-athletes. Christian Brothers University joined the list of GSC National Champions in 2002, capturing the Women's Soccer Championship, the league's first in soccer. This last year, West Florida won their first men's tennis championship while Delta State captured their first baseball championship.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed by six universities in the summer of 1970: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin and Troy State. Due to scheduling problems during the 1970-71 academic year, the only league sport was football. Jacksonville State won the league's first championship.

In 1971, the league changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE, added Southeastern Louisiana (SELA) and Nicholls State (increasing the membership to eight), and opened an office in Hammond, LA. The following year, Mississippi College and Northwestern Louisiana (NWLA, now Northwestern State) were admitted. NELA withdrew to go Division I two years later, followed by SELA and Nicholls State in 1979.

The conference continued with seven teams until 1981, when the presidents admitted Valdosta State. West Georgia joined in 1983. Eight years of stability ended in 1991 when Tennessee-Martin and Troy State went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, before the beginning of an expansion resulting in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial (1992-93); Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State, Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); West Florida (1994-95); and Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, Montevallo and Southern Arkansas (1995-96). Jacksonville State went Division I at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers to keep the Conference at 16 schools. In July 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University, making it the largest NCAA conference at any level with 18 schools. The Conference membership decreased to 17 when MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2002-03 season.

Former Commissioner Jim McCullough moved the GSC office to its present Birmingham location. The current Commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October 1992. He is assisted by Sports Information Director Michael Anderson, Assistant Sports Information Directors Eric SanInocencio, Assistant Sports Information Director Michael Banks and Office Manager Andrea Nguyen. The Supervisors of Officials are Billy Johnson (Football), John Caldwell (Basketball-West) and Mike Murphy (Basketball-East).


