William N. LaFORGE PRESIDENT OF DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY

Bill LaForge is President of Delta State University in Cleveland, Mississippi, in the heart of the Mississippi Delta. Appointed April 15, 2013, by the Board of Trustees of Mississippi's Institutions of Higher Learning, he is serving as Delta State's eighth president.

Before returning to his hometown of Cleveland, Mississippi, Mr. LaForge enjoyed a 36-year career, in both the public and private sectors in Washington, DC, that spanned the fields of government, law, business, higher education, and public policy.

In the private sector, he was an attorney, registered lobbyist, and principal of LaForge Government Relations, and three different law or public policy firms previously, where he specialized in federal government relations, and represented businesses and other organizations with public policy interests before the United States Congress and federal executive branch agencies. On Capitol Hill, Mr. LaForge served as senior legislative counsel to Republican and Democratic lawmakers in both houses of Congress. He was chief counsel of the U.S. Senate

Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, and culminated his government career as Chief Legislative Counsel and Chief of Staff to United States Senator Thad Cochran of Mississippi. Previously, he served as Congressional Liaison for the Peace Corps and as a legislative assistant to Mississippi Congressman David Bowen. He has also advised and organized political campaigns for major office holders in both political parties. Mr. LaForge is the author of the award-winning book, *Testifying Before Congress*, a comprehensive treatise on preparing and delivering congressional testimony, published by TheCapitol.Net in 2010.

Mr. LaForge is a member of the bars of Mississippi and the District of Columbia, and he is Past National President of the Federal Bar Association. For more than 30 years, he was an adjunct professor at George Washington University where he taught courses in the fields of commercial law, public policy, lobbying, and business-government relations. He has been a visiting professor of law at universities in Poland, Bulgaria, and Russia, where he served as a Fulbright Fellow.

Mr. LaForge grew up in Cleveland, Mississippi, where he attended public schools and graduated with honors from Delta State University with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He earned his law degree from the University of Mississippi School of Law, received an LL.M. in international law from Georgetown University, and studied international law at Cambridge University. He received fellowships to study government and public policy in the European Union and at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, and he is the recipient of an honorary doctorate of laws from the Stetson University College of Law.

While a student at Delta State, Mr. LaForge was a faculty scholar, president of the student government association, charter president of Omicron Delta Kappa leadership honorary society, and one of the first four students inducted into Delta State's Student Hall of Fame. As an alumnus, Mr. LaForge has served as national president of the Delta State University Alumni Association and a trustee of the Delta State University Foundation. He was selected Delta State's Alumnus of the Year in 1992 and a charter member of the Delta State University Alumni Hall of Fame in 2007.

A daily runner, Mr. LaForge is a veteran of 61 marathons, including 24 Boston Marathons, and he has logged more than 70,000 miles running. He was named 1999 Athlete of the Year by the University Club of Washington. He and his wife, Nancy, have two adult children—Caroline and Clayton—both attorneys.



RONNIE MAYERS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

After serving Delta State University for the past 37 years in various capacities, Ronald G. "Ronnie" Mayers was officially named Director of Athletics and Director of Aquatics on Friday, May 24, 2013 by President William N. LaForge. Mayers, who has served as interim director since October 1, 2012, replaces Jeremy McClain, who resigned to accept a position at the University of Southern Mississippi.

Mayers has been a staple at DSU since stepping foot on the Cleveland campus as a student-athlete. The Natchez, Miss., native has served the department as Head Swim Coach, Director of Aquatics, Assistant Professor of HPER, Assistant Athletic Director for Special Projects and Development, and most recently as Interim Director of Athletics.

"I am truly excited about the opportunity to lead Delta State Athletics," Mayers said. "DSU Athletics has been one of the most successful departments in Mississippi for many years and we will continue to develop champions on the field and in the classroom. I've had the chance to see the department grow over the years and the opportunity to lead this great organization was one I could not pass up."

Since his retirement as head coach of the Statesmen and Lady Statesmen Swimming and Diving teams, Mayers has served DSU as an Assistant Athletic Director for Development and Director of Aquatics. In 2006-07, Mayers served as Interim Director of Athletics for a six month period.

Known as one of the nation's top collegiate swim coaches, Mayers spent 20 years as the head coach of the men's and women's swimming and diving teams at Delta State. His teams captured five women's New South Intercollegiate Swim Conference titles in 1993, 1997, 1999, 2001 and 2002 and four men's championships in 1998, 1999, 2001, and 2002. Mayers has also garnered 14 NSISC Coach of the Year honors.

The swimming program under Mayers' leadership produced 56 individual All-Americans and 21 Academic All-Americans. The DSU teams made 15 N.C.A.A. Division II National Championship appearances.

He began his career as an instructor in the DSU Department of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation in 1976. He also served as the head coach of the Delta Aquatic Club age-group team from 1974-1989.

Mayers is a member of the College Swimming Coaches Association, United States of America Swimming Association, Mississippi Swimming, Inc., American Swim Coaches Association, American Red Cross, National Association of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation, and Mississippi Association of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation.

Ever active in the Cleveland community, Mayers, who currently serves on the City of Cleveland Mayor's Council, is a member of the Lion's Club, United Way, Bolivar County Red Cross Disaster Team, Cleveland Country Club, DSU Alumni Association, and DSU Athletic Alumni Association.

Mayers has also held leadership and volunteer positions with Special Olympics, Relay for Life, Crosstie Arts Festival, DSU Aquatic Club, and Boy Scouts of America.

Mayers graduated from Delta State with a B.S.E. in Health, Physical Education, and Recreation in 1974. He would later earn a Master of Education in Physical Education, and Recreation in 1975.

Mayers is married to the former Karen Scott of Natchez. They have one daughter, Ann Marie.

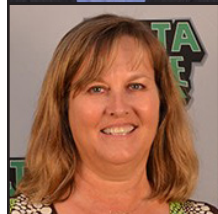

Senior Associate A.D. for External Operations

Matt Jones, Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Operations, is in his 14th year with the Delta State University Department of Athletics. For the past seven years, Jones has directed the Office of Athletic Communications while serving as the voice of the Statesmen Sports Network for the last 11. He was promoted to his current role of Assistant AD/External Affairs July 1, 2011.

In his current role, Jones will oversee the operations of Delta State Athletics' Office of Athletic Communications and Statesmen Sports Network, while handling the coordination of outside sales and marketing efforts for the Statesmen and Lady Statesmen. Since 2004, Jones has been responsible for the overall media presence of Delta State's 13 inter-collegiate sports, including media guide production, website development and maintenance, writing of press releases and coordinating multimedia needs for over 350 student-athletes each year.

Jones and the Office of Athletics Communications have enjoyed great success during his tenure as director. Postseason awards and honors have improved each year and in 2007-2008 Jones received the "Scoop Hudgins" Outstanding SID of the Year Award from the American Football Foundation.

GoStatesmen.com, the official Internet home of DSU Athletics, has undergone two complete redesigns and in July the department launched a brand new website with new navigation and features.

He has received six College Sports Information Directors of America National Publication Awards, including four "Best In Nation" citations. The 2008-2009 Delta State Swimming and Diving Media and Recruiting Guide, 2010 Delta State Baseball Guide, and 2009-2010 Delta State Swimming and Diving Media Guides were all named "Best In Nation." The 2009-2010 Delta State Men's Basketball Media Guide and 2007-2008 Delta State Swimming and Diving Media and Recruiting Guide both placed third in nation and his 2005 Delta State Swimming and Diving Media and Recruiting Guide was awarded "Best Cover in the Nation."

An active member of CoSIDA, Jones currently serves on the Fred Stabley Writing Contest and Membership committees. From 2004-2008, he served on the Radio and TV Committee. For the last 11 years, Jones has called over a 1,000 athletic events for the Statesmen Sports Network as the "Voice of the Statesmen Nation." Under his guidance, SSN expanded to five cities from 2002-2008 and currently broadcasts in Cleveland, Grenada and Jackson. Jones expanded SSN's coverage to offer over 150 broadcasts a year through Stretch Internet Radio in 2006. DSU now offers online broadcasts for softball and soccer with traditional radio offerings for football, basketball and baseball.

In 2006, Jones brokered a partnership with Penn Atlantic to web stream video of football, basketball and baseball. Now working with Armerica One, DSU continues to offer home video coverage of those four sports while exploring the opportunity to expand to soccer, softball and swimming and diving.

Jones also co-hosts "The Statesmen State Insider," a weekly half-hour magazine-style program features player and coach interviews and highlights. The program airs each Sunday at 10:30 p.m. on Greenville's WXVT-TV.

Prior to taking the position of Director of Athletic Communications, Jones served as the Director of the Statesmen Sports Network and coordinated the marketing efforts for DSU athletics.

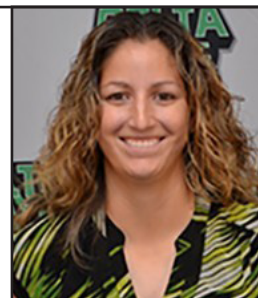

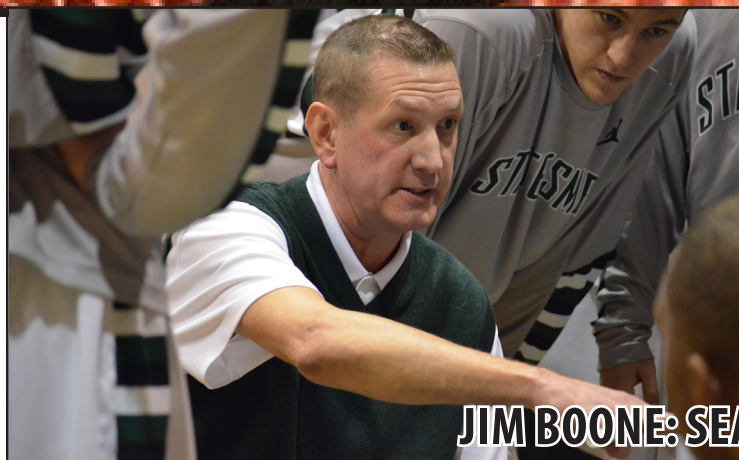

SEASON PREVIEW





JIM BOONE: SEASON THREE

Coach Jim Boone inherited a program coming off a last place regular season conference finish in 2012, and in just two short years directed the Statesmen to winning the regular season of the Gulf South Conference, accomplishing Division II's best turnaround over a two year period, a 17 game improvement. The Green and White enjoyed a "Banner Season", tallying the third most wins in the University's rich history of success, while tying a school record for conference victories, culminating in an NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance. Jim Boone has led each of the four Division II programs he has coached to the NCAA Tournament, an unprecedented accomplishment.

Returning three key players from the 2013-14 campaign, coupled with yet another outstanding recruiting class, the Statesmen are poised once again to compete on a national level and to build upon the momentum of the 2013-14 Championship season.

"We return a core group of players who have been in our program since we began two years ago, they know what we expect and what it takes to accomplish our goals," said Boone.

BACKCOURT

The Statesmen arguably have one of the best perimeter games in the nation, led by All GSC, All Region, and GSC Freshmen of the Year, 6'4" point guard Devin Schmidt.

Schmidt led the Statesmen offense to an efficient 73.8 ppg and a field goal percentage of .484, making more free throws (619) than the DSU opponents attempted (504). Individually, Schmidt averaged 15.1 ppg for the season and improved to 17.3 ppg in GSC games, shooting .541 from the field while dishing out 138 assists on the season. For his efforts, Schmidt was named to the Division II Bulletin's All Freshmen team.

Joining Schmidt in the backcourt will be junior, 6'5" shooting guard, Jack Madgen, who led the Statesmen in three point field goals attempted (135) and made (57), shooting .422 from behind the arc. Madgen also averaged 10.0 ppg during the season, and set a school record for scoring in the NCAA Tournament, notching 32 points vs. Barry University in DSU's 82-77 opening round victory.

Both Schmidt and Madgen will be looked upon for leadership and scoring in the backcourt.

Also returning will be 6'5 senior Alister Chisholm and red-shirt sophomore, 6'3' Brice Rowe along with newcomers, 6'6" LaQuavious Cotton and 6'6" Cam Denney.

Chisholm from Hagerstown Community College, led the Hawks to a national ranking with a 28-5 record in 2011-12, averaging 13.1 points per game and 5.7 rebounds. He appeared in 32 games for the Green and White as a junior, averaging 10.9 minutes per game and 4.5 ppg. Rowe a Mississippi native, played in 20 DSU games as a freshmen during the 2012-13 season, at 7.0 minutes per game averaging 1.3 ppg. Cotton, who hails from Cleveland, Mississippi played for his father Leroy Cotton at Eastside High School. He transfers to DSU as a rising senior from Mississippi College where he averaged 11.0 ppg as a junior. Denney transfers from Nova Southeastern University where he played 11.5 minutes per game and averaged 2.7 ppg as a freshmen. Denney enjoyed a prolific prep career in the basketball laden state of Indiana, and comes to the Statesmen with great expectations.

FRONT COURT

DSU returns two key players from last season's NCAA Tournament run in the Frontcourt.

Zelvin Smith of New Orleans, quickly established himself as the Green and White's 6th Man. Smith scored a career high 16 points in DSU's home win over Valdosta. For the season, Smith played in 25 games, averaging 4.3 ppg and shooting .521 from the field. Harrick is expected to provide the

Statesmen with defense and rebounding coming off the bench.

Newcomers to the Statesmen frontcourt will have high expectations for immediate production. They include Jamal Hester, a 6'9/285 transfer from Southwest Mississippi CC, Ethan Gillis, a 6'8 transfer from Snead State Community College, and local prep star, 6'5 PJ Davis.

Hester played his high school basketball at Ridgeland HS in Jackson, Mississippi where he was selected to the All-State game and averaged 24 points and 11 rebounds as a senior. Gillis, a highly touted prep star coming out of Rabun Gap Academy in Georgia, is a very skilled forward with three point shooting range and inside scoring abilities. He led Snead State in three point shooting, knocking down 44% of his attempts beyond the arc. And, Davis led Eastside High School to the Mississippi State Championship game, averaging 18 points, 10 rebounds and 5 blocked shots per game.

"The Gulf South is one of Division II's premiere conferences and will be very talented and deep again this year. But, we are confident in both our returning team and our incoming players and their collective talents. We have had two years to develop our system of play and I could not be more pleased with the tremendous progress we have made as evidenced by last year's success. We are very prepared and ready to compete at the top of our league and on a national level once again. This will be an exciting year for Statesmen Basketball, we are eager to begin."

JIM BOONE

Head Coach • Third Year • Winfield, W.V. • West Virginia State College, 1981

Jim Boone is in his third season (37-23) as head coach of the Delta State University Statesmen Basketball program. Boone (467-351), a native of Winfield, W.V., brings 29 years of collegiate coaching experience to Delta State, including stops at the NCAA Division I and II levels. His career record speaks to his success on the hardwood, but his real niche has been at the NCAA DII level where he has posted a blistering 375-189 mark as a head coach.

The Winfield, W.V., native led the Statesmen to one of the best seasons in program history in 2013-2014, as Delta State went 26-7 overall, captured the Gulf South Conference regular season title and made a run to the NCAA Sweet 16. For his efforts, Boone's peers named him GSC Coach of the Year; the seventh time in his career he has captured such an honor.

In all, the Statesmen completed a two-year turnaround of a program that had won just six games the year before Boone took over in 2012-13. After the success of 2013-14, expectations will continue to grow for the Statesmen in year three.

Prior to taking over as head coach of the Statesmen, Boone spent the 2011-12 season as head coach at West Virginia Wesleyan College, guiding the Bobcats to a school record 22 wins at the DII level and the program's first ever NCAA Division II Regional Tournament Championship appearance.

Under Boone's leadership, the Bobcats (22-9) defeated perennial DII power Winston Salem State in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament this season before falling to West Liberty State.

Boone began his career as a standout player at West Virginia State College where he was a four-year letterman. He earned his bachelor's degree in Accounting (1981) and followed that with a master's in Business Administration from the University of Kentucky (1982) with a concentration in Marketing.

His coaching career brought him back to his alma mater, spending three seasons as the head assistant coach from 1982-85. Boone made the jump to NCAA DI basketball in 1986, as an assistant at Charleston Southern University, where the Buccaneers won the Big South Conference Championship.

The championship experience led Boone to California University of Pennsylvania as head coach. Over the next 10 years, Boone led California (Pa.) to unprecedented success, including a 228-71 record. During his time with the Vulcans, Boone's squads claimed 31 wins and being the number one team in the country in 1992, two NCAA DII Final Four appearances, six regular season conference titles, and nine trips to the NCAA Tournament.

"Basketball, as it is taught by Coach Boone, is a formula for success. Jim Boone does not just teach basketball, he teaches life lessons. He has developed a philosophy that exceeds the boundaries of offense and defense. Jim's programs have been yearly one of the nation's most successful on any level, and the primary reason, is because he brings an overriding purpose to everything he does. 'Commitment to Excellence,' is the credo that Jim has used to oversee the values and principles that govern his teams."

Boone (228-71) finished his time with a school-record 228 wins and a .763 win percentage. Boone was inducted into the California (Pa.) Hall of Fame in 2005.

From California (Pa.), Boone on the challenge of rebuilding NCAA Division I Robert Morris University, eventually leading the Colonials to the NEC Championship game in 2000. In 1999 and 2000, he led RMU to a record of 25-13 in the NEC and produced two of the best seasons in Colonials history.

Boone left RMU after 2000 to take on the task of turning Eastern Michigan University into a competitive DI program. In five seasons at EMU, Boone quadrupled the program's wins total and set several EMU attendance records.

Boone left EMU after the 2005 season to take his talents to Tusculum College, a member of NCAA DII and the South Atlantic Conference. In 2009, the Pioneers won a school-record 20 games and made its second-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament. He still holds the school record for conference wins over a four-year period. Boone recruited and coached two-time SAC Player of the Year and All-American Kyle Moore.

During his career, his teams have recorded 17 or more wins on 16 occasions, including six conference championships, four tournament titles and seven postseason appearances. From 1990-96, his California teams recorded over 20 victories for six consecutive years tallying an impressive 150-33 mark during that span. His 94-24 league record in the PSAC is still the best of any coach in that conference's history. He was named PSAC Coach of the Year on three occasions (1988, 1992, 1996) and NCAA Region Coach Year twice (1992, 1996).

He is married to the former Stephanie VanVranken and they are the parents of two sons, Jimmy and Joey.



Jay Bowen

Assistant Coach • First Year • Memphis, Tenn. • Christian Brothers, 1984

Assistant Coach Jay Bowen begins his first season under Head Coach Jim Boone on the Delta State Men's Basketball staff.

Bowen, who brings more than 30 years of coaching experience at the collegiate, junior college and high school levels, comes to the Delta from Cambridge Christian School in Tampa, Florida, where served as head coach and athletic director since 2011. During his tenure, the boy's basketball squad achieved a top 10 ranking every year.

Prior to Cambridge Christian, Bowen was an assistant coach at the University of Tennessee Chattanooga in 2010-11, helping UTC to a Southern Conference North Division title.

Bowen served as an assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin for two seasons before moving to UTC. The Skyhawks won the first and only Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 2009 while coaching three future professional athletes, including one NBA draft pick. Bowen also inked the OVC Newcomer of the Year and directed the schools fourth all-time leading scorer.

"Jay brings a wealth of collegiate experience along with very strong recruiting ties to Mississippi and our core geographic recruiting areas," added Boone. "His coaching career began at Christian Brothers University, where he was the assistant men's basketball coach and head junior varsity coach from 1984-87.

Bowen left CBU and became the assistant men's coach and head cross-country coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University of the Peach Belt Conference from 1987-88. Following Armstrong Atlantic, Bowen was a graduate assistant men's basketball assistant coach for Ole Miss from 1998-89 before serving as East Central Community College Head Men's Basketball Coach from 1989-91.

Bowen earned Mississippi Junior College Coach of the Year honors during his ECCC tenure. Bowen would return to the school in 1998 for second tour of duty as head men's basketball and men's and women's tennis coach, signing eight future NCAA Division I student-athletes up until his departure in 2001.

In 1991, he moved on to Georgia State University in Atlanta, Georgia, as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for five seasons. Bowen was promoted to the top assistant position for his final two seasons handling the defense and implementation of the motion offense. He recruited five professional players and four athletes that became future coaches during his time at GSU.

Following his GSU days, Bowen was the head coach at Jackson Academy in Jackson, Mississippi, from 1996-98. He led JA to a 36-2 record and a Mississippi State title and was voted the Mississippi Coach of the Year at the Jackson school.

Bowen coached under Austin Peay State legend Dave Loos from 2001-2002, winning back-to-back OVC titles before returning to Oxford, Mississippi from 2002-2005. He was the director of men's basketball operations for Ole Miss from 2002-04 and from 2004-05 was the head coach at Lafayette High School.

Bowen would move on to be the Associate Head Women's Basketball Coach at the University of Memphis in Memphis, Tennessee, from 2005-07 and East Texas Baptist University from 2007-08. He is credited with recruiting the Conference-USA Newcomer of the Year at UM and mentored two all-conference performers at ETBU.

"Jay will be involved with all aspects of our program, but his primary responsibilities will be with recruiting and on the floor coaching, as he is a terrific teacher and will serve as a positive mentor to our players," Boone said.





Robert Szorc

Graduate Assistant • First Year • West Chicago, Ill. • St. John's University (2007)

Robert Szorc begins his first season with the Delta State University Men's Basketball program as a graduate assistant. He comes to the Statesmen after serving as a high school math teacher and basketball coach for the past seven years, five of those as a head coach. For the past three years, Szorc served as the head basketball coach at Wheaton Warrenville South in Wheaton, IL.

Szorc will be involved in all aspects of the Statesmen program and more specifically with strength and conditioning, on the court coaching and perimeter development, basketball operations, and the scouting of opponents.

"I am excited for this opportunity to join the Delta State University family and to work with Coach Boone," Szorc said. "I am honored to assist in the continued success of Statesmen Basketball and its outstanding tradition."

While at Wheaton Warrenville South, Szorc directed all aspects of the basketball program, including fundraising, fall and spring skill development for youth, summer camps, and the development of the program's feeder schools.

"We are very pleased to have Bob join our Delta State basketball family," said Boone. "He brings a tremendous amount of energy and enthusiasm to our program. His work ethic and skill set are a perfect fit for us."

Prior to Wheaton Warrenville South, Robert was the head coach at Alleman Catholic High School in Rock Island, Ill. At Alleman Catholic, Szorc directed the program to back to back regionals and advanced to the sweet 16 in only his second year as a head coach. He inherited a program that was coming off a five-win season and led the Pioneers to a 10 game improvement and 15 wins in year two.

Both at Wheaton Warrenville South and Alleman Catholic, he also assisted the baseball programs. He began his teaching career at Marmion Academy in Aurora, IL assisting Rashon Burno who is now an assistant at the University of Florida.

The consummate teacher and coach, Szorc has worked the summer tour at some of the nation's most noteworthy basketball camps. Including one of the nation's best teaching camps, the Snow Valley Basketball School in Waverly Iowa, Future Stars in Lake Forest IL, and the prestigious Five Star Basketball Camps.

Robert is a graduate of St. John's University in Collegeville, Minn., and Benet Academy in Lisle, Ill.



Jimmy Boone

Volunteer Assistant • Second Year

Jimmy Boone enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Statesmen of Delta State University. Boone, who is the eldest son of head coach Jim Boone, will assist with basketball operations, on-court coaching and video exchange.

Boone spent the 2010-2011 season as an assistant on the coaching staff for the Tusculum College men's basketball program, serving as a student assistant, and the 2011-2012 season as a graduate assistant at West Virginia Wesleyan University.

Boone completed a solid four-year playing career at Tusculum, where he played in 114 games and logged over 3,100 minutes. He finished his TC career with 831 points, including 162 three-pointers, the sixth most in school history. In his junior campaign, he helped the Pioneers to a 20-11 record as TC advanced to the SAC Tournament championship game and later earned an at-large berth for the NCAA Division II Tournament. During that junior season, he earned SAC Player of the Week honors.

Boone's prep career consisted of three seasons at Pioneer High School in Ann Arbor, Mich. and his senior campaign locally at Greeneville High School. While at GHS, the Greene Devils won the District, Region and Sub-State titles and finished with a 28-8 record. He averaged 15 points and five assists per game as GHS advanced to the State quarterfinal. At Pioneer HS, he averaged 14 points per game, while earning All-conference and All-Area First Team honors. The two-time All-Conference and All-County selection was named team MVP and led PHS to a conference title and advanced to the sectional final in 2005.

He is the son of Jim and Stephanie Boone and has one brother, Joey. He majored in english education.

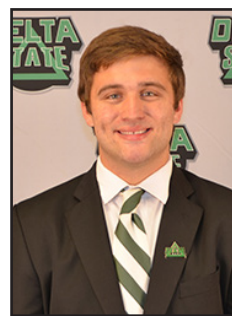

BOONE AND COMPANY LOOK TO BUILD ON 2013-14 SUCCESS

The 2013-14 season proved that head coach Jim Boone means business. In just his second season in command of the Statesmen, DSU topped the Gulf South Conference regular season with a record of 26-7 overall and a league record of 16-4. The previous season saw the same program win less than half that many games.

Delta State took a quick loss early in the season to Florida Southern who finished the season ranked No. 10 in the country. After that an eight game win streak and a ten game win streak were established before closing out the regular season. The Statesmen only suffered five regular season losses, with the other two coming in the postseason.

With the regular season title in their possession, the Statesmen went looking for the Gulf South Conference title. DSU opened the tournament with a 67-53 victory over West Florida, putting them in the semifinals to face Christian Brothers. The GSC tournament ended with Delta State barely missing the championship game, falling to the Bucs 64-67.

The season was far from over for the Green-and-White as they earned the No. 3 seed in the NCAA South Region Tournament in Lakeland, Fla. Delta State took two straight wins from Barry and Saint Leo, landing in the South Region title game against Tuskegee. DSU came up short against the Tigers, 59-80, narrowly missing the program's third appearance in the Elite Eight.

Some records were shattered en route to the conclusion of the season. Willie Readus holds the season record for free throws made with 198. As a team, the 2013-14 Statesmen now hold the record for free-throw percentage in a game when DSU shot 92.3 percent from behind the line against Union on Feb. 22.

On the year, three Statesmen averaged double figures offensively. Readus led the way with 19.5 points per game, Devin Schmidt contributed 15.1, and Jack Madgen added 10.0. Readus held the No. 11 rank in all of DII and No. 1 rank in the GSC for re-



bounds per game with 10.8. Readus also ranked 6th in double doubles in the country with 19, while ranking 3rd in the league in scoring (19.5 ppg) and field goal percentage (51.1%). Schmidt, Madgen, and Readus ranked 5th, 6th, and 7th, respectively in the conference in minutes played. Schmidt also ranked 3rd in the conference in assists per game with 4.2.

Nationally, Delta State held top 10 rankings in defensive rebounds per game coming in at No. 8 with 29.2 and No. 10 in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a 39.7 field goal percentage. At No. 11, DSU hold the rank for total rebounds in a season with 1,296 and No. 14 for scoring defense, keeping its counterparts to 65.8 points per game.

Postseason honors were showered on several Statesmen, including Coach Boone. DSU swept the GSC honors with Devin Schmidt claiming Freshman of the Year, Readus taking Player of the Year, and Coach Jim Boone earning Coach of the Year. Readus also earned All-South Region and Daktronics First Team All-South Region honors. The senior center was also named to the highly coveted NABC All-America list as well as the D2 Bulletin All-America Fourth Team. Schmidt, a 6-4 guard, had a stellar freshman season and joined Readus on the All-South Region team and was named to the D2 Bulletin All-Freshman team. Three Statesmen were named to the GSC Academic Honor Roll. Jake Maestranzi, Jack Madgen, and Declan Harrick earned for their hard work in the classroom. Madgen was also named to the GSC All-Academic team. For the first time in men's basketball history at Delta State, not one but two Statesmen were named to the NABC Honor Court. This accolade recognizes men's collegiate basketball student-athletes who excelled in academics.

THE HISTORY



AN ERA OF SUCCESS: STEVE RIVES



From 1986 to 2006, Steve Rives stalked the sideline at Delta State University as head men's basketball coach. Coach, teacher, confidant, and friend are all adjectives former players have used to describe the man that led the Statesmen to 386 victories and four Gulf South Conference championships during his tenure in the Mississippi Delta.

The Jackson native came to DSU from Louisiana College in the summer of 1986. Known as one of the top prep coaches in the country before launching his collegiate coaching career, Rives was a talented and young coach bent on making the Statesmen program his own and leading the green-and-white into uncharted territory.

Rives philosophy was simple. In fact, it's a formula that led to over 700 career wins on the high school and collegiate levels. The formula that has worked so well for the ole ball coach is hard work + solid defense + offensive execution = success. That formula took Rives to the top of the Delta State University career coaching victories list with 386 and forever etched his name as one of the top coaches in the country.

Rives' first season, 1986-87, at Delta State proved to be a memorable experience. He took over a program that in 1985-86 had gone 23-8, claimed the GSC championship, and finished in the NCAA Regionals in Cape Girardeau, Missouri.

Obviously, expectations were riding high, but the 1986-87 season exceeded the expectations of most Statesmen faithful. DSU marched towards the NCAA Final Four with a 24-9 record and a second place finish in the GSC. Led by future NBA star Gerald Glass, the Statesmen downed Abilene-Christian (88-71), Southeast Missouri (90-84), and St. Cloud State (78-73, OT) before losing to Kentucky Wesleyan (75-98) in the semifinals.

Rives carried that momentum into the next decade and guided the Delta State University men's basketball program into the national elite. The Statesmen claimed Gulf South Conference Championships in 1992-93, 1996-97, and 1997-98.

As the century turned, Rives once again led the Statesmen to the top of the GSC standings in the West Division and competed for for several league titles. In 2000-2001 and 2004-2005, the Statesmen knocked on the door of the GSC title, only to lose in the conference finals.

In 2005-2006, that all changed. Returning a bevy of talented players, including All-GSC and future Orlando Magic guard Jeremy Richardson, Rives added Southern Miss transfer Jasper Johnson to the mix. Johnson and Richardson flourished together, leading the Statesmen to 26-1 regular season finish and the nation's No. 1 ranking.

Heading into the postseason, DSU downed Valdosta State (74-70), Alabama-Huntsville (74-72) and Montevallo (71-67) en route to the program's fourth GSC championship under Rives. While the story doesn't end the way the Statesmen Nation would have wanted, DSU fell in the Region semifinals, the Statesmen concluded the season 30-2, Rives was named National Coach of the Year, and Jasper Johnson was named the National Player of the Year and was the program's first recipient of the CellularSouth Bailey Howell Award.

The legendary coach retired at the end of the season with a record of 386-188. His 386 wins rank as the most all-time in school history by more than 170. He finished his career with 11 20-win seasons and four other times his teams claimed 18 or 19 wins in a season. Delta State made eight trips to the NCAA Tournament under Rives, including a Final Four appearance during the 1986-1987.

Possibly the greatest legacy Steve Rives has brought to the game of basketball is coaches. At last count, Rives had 63 former players or graduate assistants coaching in the high school or collegiate ranks, including current Statesmen head coach Jason Conner and graduate assistant Colby Harris.

Today, Rives and his wife, Sue, reside in the Jackson area. He remains very active in Mississippi in the basketball community and serves as one of the analysts for the Gulf South Conference's annual coverage of the GSC Tournament in Southaven.

The man known for his tenacious matchup zone defense and power offensive game has made an indelible mark on the Delta State University men's basketball program. His legacy is one all former Statesmen coaches will look to for inspiration and motivation for years to come.

GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

The Gulf South Conference (GSC) enters its 40th year of excellence, continuing a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite NCAA Division II conferences. With eight universities in six southeastern states, the GSC is the largest playing Conference in Division II.

GSC members feature comprehensive athletic programs that compete for 13 official conference championships: football, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's golf. In 2003, the GSC conducted a provisional championship in women's golf, which will continue in 2004.

We take pride in our 37 National Team Championships in 10 sports and the emphasis on academic success by our coaches and student-athletes. Christian Brothers University joined the list of GSC National Champions in 2002, capturing the Women's Soccer Championship, the league's first in soccer. This last year, West Florida won their first men's tennis championship while Delta State captured their first baseball championship.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed by six universities in the summer of 1970: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin and Troy State. Due to scheduling problems during the 1970-71 academic year, the only league sport was football. Jacksonville State won the league's first championship.

In 1971, the league changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE, added Southeastern Louisiana (SELA) and Nicholls State (increasing the membership to eight), and opened an office in Hammond, LA. The following year, Mississippi College and Northwestern Louisiana (NWL, now Northwestern State) were admitted. NELA withdrew to go Division I two years later, followed by SELA and Nicholls State in 1979.

The conference continued with seven teams until 1981, when the presidents admitted Valdosta State. West Georgia joined in 1983. Eight years of stability ended in 1991 when Tennessee-Martin and Troy State went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, before the beginning of an expansion resulting in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial (1992-93); Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State, Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); West Florida (1994-95); and Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, Montevallo and Southern Arkansas (1995-96). Jacksonville State went Division I at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers to keep the Conference at 16 schools. In July 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University, making it the largest NCAA conference at any level with 18 schools. The Conference membership decreased to 17 when MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2002-03 season.

Former Commissioner Jim McCullough moved the GSC office to its present Birmingham location. The current Commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October 1992. He is assisted by Sports Information Director Michael Anderson, Assistant Sports Information Directors Eric SanInocencio, Assistant Sports Information Director Michael Banks and Office Manager Andrea Nguyen. The Supervisors of Officials are Billy Johnson (Football), John Caldwell (Basketball-West) and Mike Murphy (Basketball-East).
