

- TIPOFF: The Delta State University women's basketball team returns home for the first time in 2021 to take on Christian Brothers University. It will be only the third and fourth games of the season for DSU. Game one will be at 6:30 on Friday night and 2:30 on Saturday afternoon. It will be the second set of games for the Lady Statesmen at home on the season.
- ▶ INSIDE THE SERIES: Delta State leads the series lead all-time against Christian Brothers 49-5. The Lady Statesmen are 27-0 all-time in Walter-Sillers Coliseum. The first time these two teams met was January 1, 1995, with DSU getting the win 71-48. Last season, DSU won both games last season. In the first game, Nia Johnson scored 26 points to lead the Delta State over CBU 89-85 in overtime. Quantesha Patterson scored 19 points and had career-high 22 rebounds to register her 11th double-double of the season. Shaniyah Buford added 15 points, and Zyaire Ewing followed with 12 points and 10 rebounds. In the second game, Quantesha Patterson scored a career-high 28 points and collected 15 rebounds to help the Delta State rally for a 78-70 win over Christian Brothers at Canale Arena in Memphis, Tenn.
- LAST WEEKEND: Delta State lost the only game with the University of Alabama-Huntsville 53-63. The Lady Statesmen trailed by as many as 18 points in the third quarter before attempting a comeback. They cut down the lead to three points at 47-50 but couldn't get any closer.

 Zyaire Ewing added her sixth straight double-double with 20 points and 16 rebounds and T'Kyra Hicks had a season high 15 points.
- ◆ GBU: The Lady Bucs are 0-2 on the season. The only series they have played was at Union University on December 11-12. They los the first game 45-65 and lost the second 70-82. They are led by All-GSC preseason pick Brynne Lylte who averaged 20 points per game. Freshman Emily Jones averaged 16 points in the two games as well as ten and half rebounds. As a team, the Lady Bucs are averaging 57.5 points while giving up 73.5 points. In the first two games. CBU shot 29% from the floor and was 19 of 62 for 30.6% from the three point line.
- THE TEAM: Delta State is led by Zyare Ewing who is averaging 18.3 points and 13.1 rebounds per game on 43.5% shotting. Shaniyah Buford is right behind with 15.9 points per game. T'Kyra Hicks is adding 8.0 points per game. Camryn Davis has had two different seven rebound games and is averaging 4.6 rebounds a game. Ewing is the third best in the conference in points per game while Buford is seventh. Ewing is also the best rebounder in the GSC. Buford has made the second most three pointers so far this season in the GSC with 15.

Delta State University boasts one of the richest basketball traditions in the GSC and NCAA Division II. The Lady Statesmen are 1183-333-3 on the hardwood since the program began in 1925. The Lady Statesmen became the first NCAA DII program to reach 1,000 wins with an 87-40 victory at Southern Arkansas (2.3, 2011).

435

A founding member of the GSC, the Lady Statesmen boasts the most **victories** in league history with **435** since 1985-86. Valdosta State is second with 317 followed by North Alabama (253), West Georgia (278) & West Alabama (242).

28

Delta State has made appearances in 27 NCAA tournaments, the most is the Gulf South. The last time DSU made the tournament was in 2020.

Delta State owns 16 **GSC championships** the league's first-ever team title in 1986 and followed suit in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2016.

Delta State owns six **national championships**. Three were earned under **Margaret Wade** in 1975, 76, 77 while Lloyd Clark won the other three in 1989, 1990, and 1992.

Four Lady Statesmen have scored over **2000** points in their careers. Lusia Harris-Stewart (1974-77) leads the way with 2,981. Deborah Temple (1982-84) has 2225, Veronica Walker (2008-12) has 2188, and Latanya Patty (1990-1993) has

No single individual had a larger impact on the sport of women's basketball than **Lily Margaret Wade**. Wade retired following the 1978-79 season with a career record of 465-85 (.789). The "Mother of Modern Women's College Basketball" guided the Lady Statesmen to A.I.A.W. National Championships in 1975, 1976, and 1977.

DSU LEGEND LUSIA HARRIS SECOND WOMAN DRAFTED: In the seventh round of the 1977 NBA draft, the New Orleans Jazz selected Harris with the 137th pick overall. She became the second woman ever drafted by an NBA team after Denise Long, who was selected by the San Francisco Warriors in the 1969 draft.

LADY STATESMEN OLYMPIC BASKETBALL FACT: Member of the 1976 Silver medel winning USA womens basketball team. Harris is credited with scoring the first ever basket in Olympic Women's Basketball compitiion in 1976. She also arned a gold medal with the 1975 U.S. Pan American team, and led the United States in both scoring and rebounding as they earned a silver medal in the 1976
