

# STARTING LINEUP: STATESMEN SET FOR HOME OPENER AGAINST MAGICIANS

- GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE/SUNSHINE STATE CONFERENCE CLASSIC REWIND: The Delta State University men's basketball team returns to Cleveland, Miss. for its home opener after splitting the weekend at the GSC/SSC Classic in St. Petersburg, Fla. Delta State secured an 86-80 overtime win over Eckerd College in the opening game of the weekend before falling 91-56 to Florida Southern College in game two of the weekend. Airen Brooks led the Statesmen with 26 points against Eckerd, while Maalik Cartwright poured in 21 points against Florida Southern.
- BROOKS CATCHES FIRE IN SEASON OPENER AGAINST ECKERD: Senior forward Airen Brooks tallied 26 points, one off of his career-high. against Eckerd to help DSU to an overtime win. After picking up two early fouls in the first half and playing limited minutes, Brooks erupted out of the lockeroom to the tune of 26 points in the second half and overtime. Brooks added five rebounds, four assists, and three steals. He shot 8-of-17 from the field, including a 5-of-10 mark from beyond the three-point line. He also went a perfect 5-of-5 at the free throw line. Brooks was one of three Delta State Statesmen that made five three-pointers in the game.
- CARTWRIGHT CONTINUES STEADY PRODUCTION IN FLORIDA SOUTHERN LOSS: Sophomore forward Maalik Cartwright continued his steady performances for the Green and White deposite a tough setback against Florida Southern College in the second game of the year. Cartwright tallied 21 points to lead all scorers for the Statesmen, his 24th double-figure scoring effort in a Statesmen uniform.
- STARTERS CARRYING THE LOAD EARLY: Delta State's starting lineup of Kasey Walker-Gregg, Kelen Dietrich, Lee Cotton, Airen Brooks, and Maalik Cartwright has carried the majority of the soring load in the season's first two games. DSU's five starters scored all 86 of Delta State's points in the opening game of the season, and scored 40 of Delta State's 56 points against FSC.
- NIENABER CLIMBS THE COACHING CHARTS: Delta State head coach Mike Nienaber enters his 39th season of collegiate coaching, and his third season at the helm of the Statesmen basketball program. The Cincinnatti, Ohio, native boasts a career 609-536 record. Nienaber, whose was the head coach at Bethel (Tenn.) University in McKenzie. Tenn., and Christian Brothers University in Memphis. Tenn., before taking over at DSU, is the seventh winningest active coach in NCAA Division II basketball. He is also the 27th winngest active coach across all NGAA divisions. Nienaber also ranks fourth in the GSC in career conference wins with 366.

# **NEWS & NOTES:**

## RETURNING TO NON-CONFERENCE PLAY:

Delta State returns to playing non-conference games after the COVID-19 pandemic altered the number of games teams could play. The pandemic also saw divisional play return in an effort to reduce travel and featured teams playing the same opponent back-to-back games on back-to-back days.

#### CHARTER MEMBER OF THE GSC:

DSU is one of only two institutions, along with the University of West Alabama, that still remain in the Gulf South Conference as charter members of the league since its inception in the 1971-72 season.

#### **50TH SEASON OF GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE HOOPS:**

The Statesmen begin their 50th season of Gulf South Conference hoops here in 2021-2022. Delta State sported the best overall record among league teams in the 1971-1972 season at 19-8, although conference standings were not kept. Aside from Delta State and West Alabama, all six other schools (Nicholls State, Troy State (now Troy), North Alabama, Jacksonville State, UT-Martin, and Southeastern Louisiana) are now NCAA Division I institutions.

#### RETURNING STARTERS:

Maalik Cartwright and Airen Brooks are the only returning players for the Statesmen who started double-digit games last season. Guard Kelen Dietrich started the final eight games of the year and slots into the starting lineup this year, effectively giving the Statesmen three returning starters. From a roster persepective, Delta State returns 67 percent of its scoring from last season, but just 51 percent of its minutes played.

## OCARTWRIGHT LITTERED ACROSS GSC TOP 10 IN 2020-2021:

Forward Maalik Cartwright took a major step forward for Delta State during his second season. Building on a freshman campaign that saw Cartwright close the season with nine straight double-doubles en route being named GSC Freshman of the Year, the sophomore led the Statesmen in scoring (18.2 points per game), rebounding (7.4 per game), assists (4.0 per game), and blocks (1.6 per game) last season. Those stats ranked Maalik third in the league in scoring, first in field goal percentage, third in rebounding, tied for first in blocks, and eighth in assists per game.

# **CARTWRIGHT STANDS ALONE:**

Maalik Cartwright finished a phenomenal second season with the best field goal percentage mark across NCAA Divisions I, II, and III. Cartwright registered the highest field goal percentage, 73.4, of any player with more than 50 field goal attempts.

# PERFECTION FROM THE FIELD:

Forward Maalik Cartwright achieved perfection from the floor on Jan. 22, 2021 when he went 13-for-13 from the floor in a 78-65 win over Christian Brothers at Canale Arena in Memphis, Tenn. Cartwright played 38 minutes and registered 28 points, four boards, three assists, two blocks and one steal. That mark moved him into a tie for most field goals made in GSC history without a miss.

▶ PRESEASON HONORS: Coming off last year's breakout season, Maalik Cartwright opens this season as a GSC Preseason All-GSC selection. Cartwright joined Lee (Tenn.) University guard Quay Kennedy, Valdosta State guard Cam Hamilton, West Georgia guard Michael Zabetakis, and Valdosta State guard Jacolbey Owens on the Preseason All-GSC team. A pair of Statesmen newcomers, point guard Kasey Walker-Gregg and forward Bryson Hall, were also recognized by the league on the Top Newcomers List. In the preseason poll, the Statesmen were picked to finish ninth in the GSC by the league's coaches.

## RECORD BREAKERS:

Various Statesmen rewrote the DSU and GSC record books with new marks last season. While his playing career is still young, Cartwright owns the best field goal percentage mark of any Statesmen player at 68.7 percent (222-for-323 from the field). He is also tied for first in GSC history in single-game field goal percentage (100 percent, 13-for-13), and sits second in the GSC record book in single-season field goal percentage (73.4 percent) behind Maurice Stafford of the University of North Alabama, who shot 75 percent from the field in the 1983-1984 season. Dietrich torched the nets in a 106-102 double overtime loss at the University of Alabama-Huntsville last season, pouring in 11 three pointers on 16 attempts. Dietrich's 11 made three-point field goals ranks as the third-best single-season mark of all-time in the GSC. Dietrich's performance also rewrote the DSU record book, as he unseated Larry Walker's 10 three-point field goal effort from a 1997 game against Auburn-University at Montgomery.

#### DOUBLE-DIGIT DUO:

Delta State's duo of Airen Brooks and Maalik Cartwright have been double-digit scoring machines in their Green and White careers. In 41 career games, Brooks has scored double-digit points 34 times, including eight 20-plus point games. His career-high is 27 points versus LeMoyne Owen College (11.16.2019). Cartwright has put up 24 double-digit scoring games for the Green and White in 38 career games and has tallied ten 20-plus point scoring games. Cartwright has twice scored his career-high of 29 points, once on Feb. 1, 2020 against Auburn Montgomery, and again versus Christian Brothers on Feb. 5, 2021.

### **EFFICIENT FROM THE FIELD:**

Delta State led the Gulf South Conference in field goal percentage at 50.9 percent in 14 games. The Statesmen feature three players that shot 50 percent or better from the field last season: Cartwright (73.4 percent, 113-for-154), Z'Mari Minter (52.2 percent, 12-for-23), and Kelen Dietrich (50.8 percent, 31-for-61). DSU's field goal percentage ranked the eighth nationally in Division II. DSU had five games where the team shot 55 percent of better from the field, and posted two occasions in which the squad shot 60 percent of better from the field. The team also shot 42 percent or better from beyond the three-point line six times last year.

#### DIETRICH STRETCHES THE FLOOR:

Delta State guard Kelen Dietrich was a welcome addition to Coach Mike Nienaber's team last season, particularly with his ability to shoot from long-distance. After getting minimal playing time in the first half of the season, Dietrich started the team's final eight games and went 27-for-47 from beyond the three-point arc. His 57.4 percent mark from deep led the Statesmen and paced the GSC. Dietrich also posted a 50.8 percent shooting mark from the field in his debut collegiate hoops season in 27.6 minutes per contest.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLE TROUBLE:

Maalik Cartwright has accumulated 10 career double-digit rebound games for DSU and has nine career double-doubles. He collected a career-high 15 rebounds against West Florida on Feb. 13, 2020, and posted a career-best five consecutive double-double from Jan. 30, 2020 to Feb. 13, 2020. Forward Airen Brooks has 12 career double-doubles for the Statesmen and has racked up 10 or more rebounds in 18 games in his Green and White career. His 19 rebounds on Jan. 23, 2020 against Alabama-Huntsville set a new career-high. He also has five career games with 15 or more boards.

The Statesmen have made 16 appearances in the **NCAA Division II Tournament**, the most of any GSC member institution. Delta State has advanced to six "Sweet 16s", two "Elite Eights", and one Final Four.

Delta State owns seven **Gulf South Conference titles** during its storied history. The Statesmen claimed the league's first-ever team title in 1972 and followed suit in 1986. 1993, 1997, 1998, 2006 and 2019.

Delta State has four Statesmen playing professional basketball, including Devin Schmidt (Spain), Laquavious Cotton (France), and Willie Readus (Argentina)
