DELTA STATE WELCOMES MCKENDREE FOR PIG PICKIN

- STATESMEN HOST MCKENDREE FOR 35th PIG PICKIN: Delta State University (1-0, 0-0 GSC play host to Great Lakes Valley Conference member McKendree University (0-1, 0-0 GLVC) on Saturday, Sept. 11, 2021. The game is part of the 35th annual Pig Pickin festivities with kickoff set for 6 p.m. at Parker Field-McCool Stadium.
- INSIDE THE SERIES: Delta State and McKendree meet for the first time on the griding.

8TH

- STATESMEN IN SEPTEMBER: DSU boasts a 151-88-6 record in September, including a 20-10 record under coach Cooley.
- QUICK START FOR THE BIG GREEN: Aided by a 20-point first quarter, the Statesmen scored 34 points in the first half against Bethel University. The 34 first-half points were the sixth most points in a first-half under eighth-year head coach **Todd Cooley** and the most points in a first half since 2017. Delta State scored 56 first-half points against visiting Concordia (11.9.15) and 41 against Concordia (11.8.14). The Statesmen have scored 31 points in the opening half three times, most recently in the 2017 NCAA playoffs against Bowie State (11.18.17). The green-and-white put 42 points on the board against Central State (Ohio) (9.28.14) and 35 against Fort Valley State (9.16.14). The 20 points were the most first-quarter points since 2017 vs. Ft. Valley State.
- SHEGOG EFFICIENT: Redshirt junior Patrick Shegog completed 16-of-19 passes for 196 yards and tied a career-high with three touchdown passes. Shegog's tossed three touchdowns in a game for the second time in his career, dating back to three scoring tosses against West Florida (9.29.18). His 196 yards passing are the second-most in his career after throwing for 219 against Shorter (10.25.18).
- STATESMEN DEBUTS: The #DSUFamily saw 22 players see their first action in the green-and-white uniform against Bethel University.
- THE TURNOVER BATTLE: The Statesmen were plus-one against Bethel University, intercepting four passes and recovering two fumbles. Sherrod Paige became the first Statesmen to pick off two passes in a debut since All-American Junior Falk posted two in his Statesmen debut against Tusculum University (9.5.19). **Tv Woods** had an interception and a fumble recovery while Faulk recorded his 10th career interception. John Valesco had DSU's second fumble recovery.
- CLIMBING THE INT CHART: Junior Faulk's interception was the 10th of his career, tying him for fourth in career interceptions with Kim Stewart (1969-70) and Don Fennell (1964-66). Faulk needs two interceptions to move into third, three to move into second and four to tie Dominique Davenport (2008-2011) atop the list. (See Career INT list on page five). Faulk set the Delta State single season record with nine interceptions in 2019 to break the old mark of eight held by Garrett Williams (2010).

SERIES NOTEBOOK: MCKENDREE UNIVERSITY

- ▶ **Delta State** and **McKendree University** collide on the gridiron for the first time. Northern Michigan's Drake Davis tossed a nine-yard touchdown pass with 6:20 left for a 27-20 win over the homestanding Bearcats.
- ▶ Mike Babock is in his ninth year at the helm of the Bearkats with a 44-34 record following McKendrees 27-20 loss to Northern Michigan.
- ► McKenderee played their 2020 season in the spring posting a 1-1 record. The Bearcats defated Quincy University 30-8 and fell to the University.. The Bearcats posted a 5-6 record and a 3-4 GLVC record in 2019.
- ▶ **Statesmen vs. GLVC:** McKendree marks the third staight season that Delta State vaces a school from the Great Lakes Valley Conference for the third straight season. The Statesmen are 1-4 all-time against the GLVC all-time after a 28-24 loss to Grand Valley State in 2019. Delta State is 0-3 against GVSU, 0-1 vs. Indianapolis and 1-0 vs, Southwest Baptist.
- ► **GLVC Preseason Poll:** McKendree is picked fifth in the GLVC Preseason Coaches Poll annoucned on July 30, 2021. The University of Indianapolis was voted atop the 2021 preseason poll, Ulndy received five of the possible eight first-place votes, while Lindenwood University collected 44 points and three first-place votes to finish second. Truman State University, Missouri S&T, and McKendree University round out the top five, while Southwest Baptist University, William Jewell College, and Quincy University close the poll.

- ▶ Offensive Notes: McKendree had 205 yards of total offense, 103 on the ground and 102 though the air. Turner Pullen complete 11-of-23 passes for 102 yards and a touchdown that tied the game 13-13 in the second half. Narkel Leflore rushed 12 times for 65 yards to lead the rushing attack. Steven towns had seven receptions for 89 yards and a tochdown.
- ▶ **Defensive Notes:** The Bearcats yielded 419 yards to Northern Mlchigan, 179 in the air and 240 on the ground. Michael Tucker, Sidney Houston and KeShon Spraggins recorded seven tackles to lead the defense. Houston had three tackles for a loss, including the defenses lone sack of the day.
- Special Teams Notes: Ryan Castle connected on field goals from 39 and 43 in the fourth quarter for the Bearcats. Andrew Anckle punted eight times for 48.4 yards per boot with a long of 54 and two insdie the opponent 20 yard line.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES: Parker Burleson, Kory Gainwell, and John Boyd shined on special teams for the Statesmen. Burleson punted three times for a 51.3 vard average with two pinned inside the 20 and a long of 59 yards. The freshman also had four of his seven kickoffs go for touchbacks. Gainewell returned two kickoffs for 86yards with a long return of 48 yards. The University of Memphis transfer rushed eight times for 37 yards and caught one pass seven yards in his debut. Boyd blocked a Bethel punt in the fourth quarter while posting two tackles.

KIRK SOLID OUTING: Cole Kirk made his Statesmen debut in the second half against **Bethel University.** completing 11-of-15 passes for 122 yards and his first career touchdown. Kirk played a majority of the third quarter tossing a 30-yard scoring strike to Deion Dampier with 4:38 left in the fourth quarter for a 41-7 lead.

SPINNING THE PIGSKIN Cole Kirk and Patrick Shegog combined to complete 27-of-34 passes for 318 vards and four touchdowns. The last time the Statesmen threw for 300 yards dates to a 322-yard and three touchdown outing against Shorter (10.25.18). Shegog completed 22-of-29 passes for a career-high 319 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Statesmen to a 46-20 win. The last time the Statesmen combined for four touchdown passes in a game came against West Alabama (10.8.16) while also throwing for 427 yards.

SPREADING THE PIGSKIN Cole Kirk and Patrick Shegog completed a pass to 11 different receivers in the win over Bethel University. Dohnte Meyers caught five passes for 85 yards and a touchdown in his Statesmen debut and running back **Deion Damp**ier had five grabs for 63 vards and two touchdowns. Returnees Corintheus Edmonds followed with four catches while Todd Lee Battle had three Robbie Evans had two and Oakey Coleman had one. Additionally, Jaylen Green and Adam Duncan led five newcomers with two receptions. Tyler Kennedy. Kory Gainwell. and Calvin Lockett had one catch apiece.

D2FOOTBALL.COM PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: Junior Faulk and **Innis Claud V** were named to the D2football.com Preseason All-American teams. Faulk was named to the first-team while Claud was listed on the secondn team.

DELTA STATE PICKED 3rd IN GSC COACHES POLL: The Statesmen are picked to finish third in the annual Gulf South Conference **Preseason Coaches Poll**. Defending National Champion West Florida was named the 2021 GSC Football Preseason Favorite for the first time in school history, collecting 47 points behind five first-place votes. Nipping at the Argonauts' heels is defending GSC Champion Valdosta State which posted 45 points and nabbed the final three first-place votes. Delta State ranked third in the Coaches' Poll voting with 33 points followed by West Alabama (30) and West Georgia (26) to round out the Top Five. Mississippi College (22), North Greenville (14), and Shorter (seven) complete the GSC Pre-Season Poll.

SIX STATESMEN NAME PRESEASON ALL-GSC: Six Statesmen (three offensive and three defensive players) were named to the Pre-Season All-GSC Team. Three-time All-GSC center Innis Claud V and junior **Nicolas Melsop** anchor an offensive line that will open holes for one of the league's top returning backs in senior Rico **Owens**. The defensive side starts with All-American defensive back Junior Faulk is joined by seniors Dante Williams (LB) and Zane Samuel (DE).





PARKER FIELD @ McCOOL STADIUM

- ▶ One of the Gulf South Conference's oldest and most historic venues, Travis E. Parker Field at Horace L. McCool Stadium has served as the home of the Statesmen since it opened in 1970. Delta State has enjoyed tremendous success at Parker-McCool under its last four coaches, posting an impressive 84-31 record.
- ► Formerly known as Delta Field and Travis E. Parker Field, the 8,500 seat stadium was completed in time for the 1970 season. In 1984, the field was renamed to honor former Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning Board of Trustees member, Travis E. Parker, a tireless supporter of Delta State University and Delta area communities.
- ▶ In 2007, DSU honored long-time coach and administrator Horace McCool by naming the stadium in his honor. McCool was 76-48-3 in 14 seasons as head coach of the Statesmen and was instrumental in running the Department of Athletics as Director of Athletics. During his time as AD, McCool helped revive Lady Statesmen basketball, which blossomed into a national power under the legendary Margaret Wade.
- ▶ The current facility replaced the "old" Delta Field, which is located between Sillers Coliseum and the Hugh Ellis Walker Alumni-Foundation House on the Delta State campus. The Statesmen have enjoyed a 252-126-15 mark at home.
- ▶ The two-level press facility includes booths for radio, film, coaches, and working press, as well as to a snack kitchen and restroom. The press box is completely enclosed, with the exception of the second-level film deck, and is climate controlled for year-round comfort and convenience.
- ► Parker-McCool has gone through several recent renovations, including the installation of artificial turf in the summer of 2014, a press box revitalization project in May of 2013, and the addition of a new scoreboard/video board in the fall of 2008. Past additions have included the chairback seats in 1993 and the creation of a picnic area in the southwest corner of Parker Field in 2001.
- ▶ In the summer of 2014, Delta State began construction on a new visitor's concession stand and bathroom on the southeast corner of Parker-McCool.
- ▶ In his first season as head coach of the Statesmen, coach Todd Cooley led Delta State to a perfect 4-0 record at Parker-McCool. The Nashville, Arkansas native is the first head coach since Ron Roberts to go undefeated at home in his first season at DSU.
- ▶ Delta State has an 8-2 (.800) record in NCAA Division II postseason play.
- ▶ The Statesmen went 2-0 at Parker-McCool in the 2000 NCAA playoffs en route to the national championship. DSU defeated Valdosta State (49-12) and North Dakota State (34-16) at home with road wins over Catawba (20-14) and Bloomsburg (63-34) in the NCAA title game.
- ▶ Trevar Deed set a DSU postseason record with 16 receptions for 203 yards and four touchdowns in a 55-34 loss to North Alabama in the second round of the 2008 NCAA Division II playoffs at Parker-McCool.
- ▶ In DSU's 45-7 victory over Shaw University in the first round of the 2007 NCAA playoffs, senior linebacker and Harlon Hill finalist Michael Eubanks set a new NCAA DII single-game sack record with five versus the Hawks.
