ONE WIN AWAY FROM TAMPA

- Making its sixth NCAA appearance in the past eight tournaments, No. 5 and second-seeded Boston University will face fourth-seeded and No. 12 Cornell in the Manchester Regional final on Saturday at SNHU Arena.
- BU is playing in a regional final for the fourth time in its past six NCAA appearances.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- BU is making its 38th NCAA tournament appearance (23 in last 33 tournaments), which ranks tied for third all-time (Minnesota and Michigan have 40).
- This is the Terriers' fourth time facing Cornell in the NCAA Tournament.
- BU is 2-1 against the Big Red in the NCAA Tournament, most recently earning a 3-1 win in the 2018 regional semifinal in Worcester.
- Cornell (1967, 4-1) and BU (1972, 4-0) have defeated one another for a national title.

TOURNAMENT RECORD

- The Terriers enter Thursday's game with an alltime record of 44-38-0 (.537) in NCAA tournament play. The 44 wins represent the fifth-highest total in tournament history.
- The only programs with more victories are Minnesota (59), Michigan (55), North Dakota (53) and Boston College (49).
- The Terriers won the title in 1971, 1972, 1978, 1995 and 2009. They finished second six times (1950, 1967, 1991, 1994, 1997 and 2015), third five times (1951, 1960, 1974, 1975 and 1977) and fourth three times (1953, 1966 and 1976).
- There was no consolation game in 1990 and 1993 to determine if BU finished third or fourth.


SEEDING STORY

SCOUTING THE BIG RED

- Cornell knocked off defending national champion and top-seeded Denver, 2-0, on Thursday after losing to Harvard, 1-0, in the ECAC semifinals.
- Jack O'Leary scored 2:49 into the contest and leading goal-getter Ben Berard notched his 11th goal of the season at the 11:28 mark of the opening frame.
- Ian Shane made 16 of his 27 saves in the third period to preserve his fifth shutout of the season; he owns a 1.70 goals-against average and a .917 save percentage.
- Gabriel Seger leads the Big Red with 29 points thanks to seven goals and a teambest 22 assists.
- Seger is one of six Cornell skaters with 20 or more points, though only Berard has reached double digits in goals.

REGIONAL PLAY

- The Terriers own a 14-13 (.519) record in their 27 previous regional contests.
- They have appeared in regionals in seven cities Worcester, Mass., Albany, N.Y., Providence, R.I., Grand Rapids, Mich., Manchester, N.H., St. Paul, Minn., and Fargo, N.D.
- BU was the host for the Northeast Regional at the DCU Center nine times (1993, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006).
- BU is a perfect 4-0 in its previous two regional appearances in Manchester, advancing to the 2009 and 2015 Frozen Fours.

QUICK BITES

- In all, the Terriers have faced 28 different teams in NCAA play.
- BU is 15-17 (.469) vs. the WCHA, 10-7 (.558) vs. the CCHA, 11-4 (.733) vs. the ECAC, 1-1 (.500) vs. the Tri-State League, 3-3 (.500) vs. the NCHC, 4-5-0 (.444) vs. Hockey East and 0-1 (.000) vs. the Big Ten.
- The Terriers are 5-6 (.455) in the championship game, 5-3 (.625) in the consolation game, 11-11 (.500) in the semifinals, 13-11 (.542) in the quarterfinals and 10-7 (.588) in the first round.
- BU is 12-11 (.522) in one-goal games and 4-5 (.500) in overtime games.
- The Terriers are 4-4-0 against this year's field as they split a weekend series at Michigan, earned home wins over Cornell and Harvard, went 1-2 against Merrimack and dropped a 3-2 decision to Michigan Tech.

RECAPPING THE JANUARY MEETING

- Freshman Lane Hutson scored with 3.8 remaining in regulation to lift BU to a 4-3 win over Cornell at Agganis on Jan. 14.
- Senior Domenick Fensore's PPG with 8:10 to play tied the game at 3-3, the third time BU had equalized that night.
- Senior Sam Stevens and freshman Jeremy Wilmer also lit the lamp for BU while seniors Matt Brown and Jay O'Brien both assisted on each of the final two goals of the game.
- Freshmen Ryan Greene and Quinn Hutson had one assist apiece while junior Drew Commesso made 28 saves.

COACHING THEIR ALMA MATERS

- All four head coaches at the Manchester regional are leading their alma maters.
- In total, six tournament teams are led by a former player.

HISTORY WITH THE BIG RED

- Saturday will be the 51st meeting between BU and Cornell, with the Big Red ahead in the all-time series, 26-21-3.
- The teams first met on Jan. 10, 1925, on Beebe Lake in Ithaca, with the Terriers posting a 7-2 win.
- They played again at the same location a little over a year later (a 1-0 BU win) and did not play again until an 8-1 Cornell win on March 11, 1966, in the ECAC Tournament.
- They have faced off in the NCAA tournament on three occasions with the first two being the 1967 and 1972 national title games, won by the Big Red (4-1) and Terriers (4-0), respectively.
- As members of the ECAC, the teams met at least once a year for the next 19 years until BU joined Hockey East for the 1984-85 season.
- The Terriers are 9-7-2 in the 18 meetings that have taken place since they moved to Hockey East.
- The teams have played to a 3-3-2 record at Red Hot Hockey since the event debuted in 2007.

HOW DID WE GET HERE?

- Five different Terriers found the back of the net as BU earned a 5-1 win over No. 9/11 Western Michigan on Thursday.
- Senior Ethan Phillips assisted on two goals and scored an empty-netter to finish with a career-best three points.
- Freshman Lane Hutson opened the scoring in the first period before his brother Quinn doubled the Terriers' lead 8:52 into the second stanza.
- Senior Matt Brown made it 3-0 at the 10:20 mark before Skoog answered a Bronco goal with one of his own to push the lead to 4-1 entering the third period.
- Seniors Jay O'Brien and Domenick Fensore each had an assist, as did junior Luke Tuch and freshman Jeremy Wilmer.
- Junior Drew Commesso made 24 saves.

LANE HUTSON THINGS

- Freshman Lane Hutson's goal that opened the scoring in the NCAA Tournament was his 48th point of the season which pushed him past Brian Leetch as the highest-scoring freshman in Hockey East history.
- Hutson will enter Saturday's regional final with 15 goals and 33 assists for 48 points, one better than Leetch's 47 points (9g, 38a) in 1986-87
- He ranks fifth all-time in points by a freshman defensemen.
- The awards keep piling up for the Hockey East Tournament MVP, who is the only defenseman nominated for the 2023 Hobey Baker Award.
- He was just the third blue liner in league history to be named Hockey East Rookie of the Year.
- This marks the 17th time and the third time in the last four years that a Terrier has been a Hobey finalist; David Farrance was top-10 finalist in 2020 and 2021.
- In addition, Hutson is only the second BU freshman to be selected in the Hobey Top 10, joining 2015 winner Jack Eichel.
- Hutson was also runner-up for Hockey East Player of the Year in addition to being a unanimous Hockey East First Team All-Star and Hockey East All-Rookie selection.
- He was the first defenseman to ever lead Hockey East in scoring in the league's 39-year history, posting 34 points on nine goals and a league-high 25 assists in 24 Hockey East tilts.
- Hutson is tied for fifth in the NCAA in assists, seventh in the country in points, sixth in the nation in points per game, and is first among NCAA defensemen in points per game.
- In addition, Hutson leads all freshman defensemen in plus-minus as a plus-23.
- Hutson was a two-time Hockey East Defender of the Month, the league's Player of the Month for January and the National Rookie of the Month for January.
- Additionally, Hutson was a six-time Rookie of the Week honoree and a two-time Player of the Week.
- He has totaled 16 multi-point games, including three three-point efforts and a four-assist performance at Maine on Feb. 3.

HUTSON HEROES

- When you need a game-winning goal, the Hutson brothers are at your service.
- Freshman Quinn Hutson scored his teamleading seventh game-winning goal on Thursday against Western Michigan, his second winner in the last three games.
- He also had the winner in the Terriers' 2-1 overtime victory over Providence in the Hockey East semifinals.
- Brother Lane then provided the OT winner last Saturday in the title game.
- Quinn began BU's current eight-game win streak with a GWG at Vermont on Feb. 24 and has totaled six goals during this stretch.
- Three of Lane's five game-winners have been in overtime, including a 2-1 home win over UMass Lowell on Oct. 29 and a 4-3 road victory at Northeastern on Nov. 19.
- All five of Lane's winners have been against ranked opponents, including Cornell in January.
- Quinn has been excellent this season, scoring 15 goals and adding 13 assists for 28 points.
- Either Quinn or Lane have scored or assisted on seven of the Terriers' eight GWGs during this win streak.

HOTTEST TEAM IN THE COUNTRY

- BU owns the longest active win streak in the nation, which also doubles as the longest active unbeaten streak in the NCAA.
- The Terriers have won eight straight games dating back to a Feb. 24 win at UVM.

A HISTORIC START FOR THE TERRIERS

- BU reached 20 wins in its first 26 games, which is the fastest a Terrier squad has hit 20 wins since the 2008-09 team started 20-5-1 en route to a national title.
- The Terriers matched Quinnipiac as the fastest team to 20 wins (in terms of games played) in men's Division I this season.
- BU's 28 wins has surpassed the 2016-17 squad's 24 victories and matched the 2014-15 NCAA finalists.

GOALS FROM EVERYWHERE

- Through 37 games this season, 19 different Terriers have scored a goal and 20 different Terriers have recorded at least one point.
- All 19 of those Terriers goal scorers have notched at least two points.
- Eleven Terriers have recorded at least 20 points this season, which is the most among the 16 tournament teams.
- In addition, 17 Terriers have recorded at least 10 points, which is the most among the final 16 squads.
- Nine different BU skaters have lit the lamp during the postseason.

BROWN KEEPS ROLLING

- Senior Matt Brown enters Saturday ranked second in Hockey East with 45 points thanks to 16 goals and 29 assists, all of which are career highs.
- He lit the lamp on Thursday and also had the primary helper on Lane Hutson's overtime winner in the HE title tilt.
- Brown is also 12th in the NCAA with an average of 1.22 points per game.
- Three of Brown's 11 multi-point efforts this season were four-point performances at BC on Dec. 9 (1g, 3a), at UConn on Oct. 22 (2g, 2a) and against Maine on Jan. 21 (1q, 3a).
- He closed the regular season by recording a point in 12 of his final 15 games as the Terriers clinched the regular-season title.
- For his career, Brown has notched 37 goals and 62 assists for 99 points.
- He was the first Terrier since David Farrance (43 points) in 2019-20 to reach the 40-point milestone; Clayton Keller (45 points) was the most recent Terrier forward to achieve that feat, doing so in 2016-17.
- The senior tallied seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points all of last season.
- Twenty-seven of Brown's 45 points have come against ranked foes.

TERRIERS WIN 10TH LEAGUE TOURNAMENT

- BU won its 10th Hockey East Tournament title with a thrilling 3-2 overtime win over fellow NCAA Tournament participant Merrimack on Saturday at TD Garden.
- The Terriers erased deficits of 1-0 and 2-1 to send the contest into overtime before freshman Lane Hutson's seeing-eye wrister from the center point found the back of the net to stretch BU's win streak to seven.
- It was the second overtime win of the weekend for BU as Lane's older brother, Quinn, provided the heroics in Friday's semifinal against Providence.
- Lane Hutson was named the Bill Flynn Tournament MVP and was joined on the Steve Nazro All-Tournament Team by classmate Devin Kaplan and juniors Drew Commesso and Dylan Peterson.
- Kaplan's goal with 10:58 left in regulation sent the game to overtime while Commesso made 23 saves on Saturday after recording 37 stops in the semifinal victory.
- Kaplan also assisted on Hutson's first goal to join his classmate with two points.
- Seniors Jamie Armstrong, Matt Brown, Domenick Fensore and Sam Stevens each had an assist, as did rookie Ryan Greene.

BU ALSO WON A SEMIFINAL THRILLER

- Freshman Quinn Hutson scored with 9:08 left in overtime to lift the Terriers to a 2-1 victory over seventh-seeded Providence in a Hockey East semifinal contest.
- The game was scoreless until the late stages of regulation as the Friars got on the board first with 7:35 left in the third.
- BU got an equalizer from junior Dylan Peterson just over five minutes later to send the game to OT, where Hutson buried a perfect pass by junior Luke Tuch.
- Junior Drew Commesso made 37 saves including an impressive stop on a PC shorthanded breakaway with the Friars up 1-0 to allow for the comeback.
- Freshman Ryan Greene assisted on both goals for BU while Quinn's classmate and brother Lane Hutson also had a helper.

ON THE DOUBLE

- BU completed its seventh Hockey East "double" by claiming both the regular-season and tournament titles this season, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95, 1996-97, 2005-06, 2008-09 and 2014-15 squads.
- Jay Pandolfo, who won the "double" as a player in 1993-94 and 1994-95, became the first first-year head coach to lead a team to the Hockey East Championship.
- In addition to Pandolfo, the other two Terrier alumni on the coaching staff, associate head coach Joe Pereira and director of operations Doug Friedman, also completed the Hockey East "double" as players.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR

- Four Terriers were named Hockey East All-Stars on March 10, bringing the Terriers' all-time total to 90 Hockey East All-Stars.
- BU landed a league-high three players on the first team - unanimous selection Lane Hutson as well as seniors Matt Brown and Domenick Fensore - all of whom are also nominated for the Hobey Baker Award.
- Senior Wilmer Skoog was honored as a Third Team All-Star.
- Hutson, a freshman, and Brown each received this recognition for the first time; Fensore and Skoog were Second Team All-Stars last season.

PANDOLFO NAMED COACH OF THE YEAR

- First-year head coach Jay Pandolfo was named Hockey East Coach of the Year.
- Pandolfo guided the Terriers to the program's 11th Hockey East regular-season title and their first since 2016-17, with BU posting an 18-6-0 league record.
- He then followed that with the program's 10th league tournament championship and first since 2018.
- Pandolfo is the third BU coach to win his NCAA Tournament debut, joining Harry Cleverly and David Quinn.
- The Terriers are 28-10-0 under Pandolfo's guidance, including an 13-6-0 against ranked teams and a 6-1-0 mark against top-10 foes.
- BU boasts the third-best offense in the nation, averaging 3.95 goals per game.
- Five freshmen have all recorded at least 20 points, including three 30-point producers, while 10 returners have improved upon their point total from last year.
- Pandolfo coached four Hockey East All-Stars, including three first-team selections, as well as two All-Rookie Team honorees.
- He became the first head coach in program history to win 20 games in his first season in charge of the Terriers.
- Pandolfo had matched Jack Parker's 19-6-0 record in 1973-74 as the best start by a BU head coach in program history.
- Parker began the next season 2-0-0 to go 21-6-0 (.778) before his next loss, finishing his first two seasons at 45-11-1 (.798).

GREENE EARNS ALL-ROOKIE NOD

- Rookie Ryan Greene joined Lane Hutson on the Hockey East All-Rookie Team after a fantastic freshman campaign.
- Greene, who won the league's first Rookie of the Week award in October and added a Player of the Week selection to his resumé in November, totaled 27 points on nine goals and 18 assists, including 20 points (6g, 14a) in 22 league contests.
- He has notched at least one point in 14 of his last 21 games, including a four-game point streak in February that helped BU secure its spot atop the league standings.
- He reached 31 points this past weekend thanks to three assists, including two in the Terriers' semifinal win over Providence.

CAPTAIN FANTASTIC

- A 2023 Hobey Baker Award nominee, senior captain Domenick Fensore has scored a career-high nine goals, including three game-winners, and added 20 assists for 29 points this season.
- His nine regular-season goals was second among league blue liners while his 27 regular-season points ranked third among Hockey East defenders.
- Fensore finished is a career-best plus-13 and has blocked 39 shots this year.

MORE ON SKOOG'S STELLAR SEASON

- Senior Wilmer Skoog was named a Hockey East All-Star for the second straight season.
- Skoog secured his second straight season of at least 10 goals, as he lit the lamp 12 times and added a career-high 15 assists for 27 points.
- He then added two more goals in the Terriers' quarterfinal win on March 11.
- Twenty-three of the superb Swede's 27 points came against league opponents.
- Skoog scored three game-winning goals, recorded seven multi-point performances and finished the regular season with 100 shots on goal, second only to senior Domenick Fensore on the Terriers.
- He finished the regular season as a career-best plus-10 and enters Thursday having totaled 38 goals and 36 assists for 74 points for his career.

POLL POSITION

- BU is fifth in both the USCHO.com poll and the USA Today/USA Hockey poll.
- This is the Terriers' 15th straight week in the top 10.
- BU is 13-6-0 against ranked teams, including a 6-1-0 mark against top-10 foes.
- The Terriers have faced seven schools that are currently in the top 20 of at least one national poll, including two top-10 teams (Harvard, Michigan) who the Terriers went 2-1-0 against this season.

WEBBER IS A SPONGE

- Junior Cade Webber ranks third in the nation with 88 blocked shots this season.
- He led BU with five blocks in the Terriers' win over Western Michigan on Thursday.
- That was his seventh game with five or more blocked shots this season.
- Webber has also recorded career highs in goals (1), assists (5) and points this season.

FAB FRESHMEN

- Five of the 10 Terriers with at least 20 points this season are freshmen, with Devin Kaplan joining four of his classmates in that club after his goal on Feb. 24 at Vermont.
- Lane Hutson leads BU with 48 points (15g, 33a), followed by Ryan Greene (9g, 22a), Jeremy Wilmer (9g, 22a), Quinn Hutson (15g, 13a) and Kaplan (10g, 13a).
- BU's freshman class has combined for 161 points this season, which is second among NCAA Tournament teams.
- There have only been four games this season in which a Terrier freshman has not recorded at least one point.
- All five got on the score sheet in the playoff win against UVM.
- Both Hutsons and Wilmer tallied a point in Thursday's win over Western Michigan.

SCORING IN BUNCHES

- The Terriers own the third-best offense in the NCAA, averaging 3.94 goals per game.
- They will face the second-best defense in the nation on Saturday, as Cornell has allowed just 1.94 goals per game.
- BU scored five goals on Thursday against Western Michigan while Cornell shut out Denver, 2-0, in its semifinal win.
- The Terriers notched seven goals in last weekend's quarterfinal win over Vermont, which was the fourth time this season that they lit the lamp at least seven times.
- BU was an offensive juggernaut in January, averaging an NCAA-best 5.0 goals per game while going 7-1-0.
- The Terriers averaged 4.1 goals per game over the final two months of the year en route to an 8-2-0 record in November and December.
- BU has scored at least two goals in all but four games this season and has notched five or more goals on 15 different occasions.
- The Terriers have actually hit every number from 0-9 in terms of goals scored in a game this season, with their 9-6 win over Maine on Jan. 21 completing that statistical achievement.
- BU scored a goal in 11 straight periods going back to the Cornell win on Jan. 14 before being shut out by BC in the first period of the Jan. 28 win.
- The Terriers then notched a goal in 10 straight periods, a streak that ended after a scoreless second period at Providence on March 4.

THE PANDOLFO FILE

- The Terriers' season-opening win over Bentley on Oct. 1 was Jay Pandolfo's first game as the Terriers' head coach.
- Pandolfo was hired in May as the program's 13th head coach after spending this past season as the team's associate head coach.
- Prior to returning to BU, Pandolfo spent five years as an assistant coach with the Boston Bruins and helped them reach the second round of the Stanley Cup playoffs in four straight seasons.
- A two-time Stanley Cup champion with New Jersey (2000, 2003), Pandolfo played 899 NHL games with the Devils, the New York Islanders and Boston, totaling 226 points (100g, 126a).
- A member of the 1995 NCAA champions, Pandolfo is the first Division I men's hockey coach to have won an NCAA championship and two Stanley Cups as a player.
- At BU, he totaled 169 points (79g, 90a) and was runner-up for the 1996 Hobey Baker Award as a senior after recording 67 points (38g, 29a).
- He helped lead BU to four straight Frozen Fours, two Beanpot titles and two Hockey East championships as a player.
- A 1996 First-Team All-American, Pandolfo was a first-ballot inductee into the BU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

NHL HOPEFULS

- Twelve of the Terriers on this year's roster have been chosen by a professional team in the National Hockey League Entry Draft.
- That number is tied for third among all NCAA teams.
