## Pack At A Glance

### 2024 Record --

The No. 6/7th-ranked CSU Pueblo ThunderWolves are 10-1 overall and went 9-0 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference to clinch its ninth all-time RMAC title and first outright league title since 2014 following its 38-21 come-from-behind win at Chadron State on Nov. 16. The victory was the Pack's 16th consecutive in RMAC play, which is the second longest active conference win streak in Division II football.

### The Head Coach --

**Philip Vigil** (Colorado Mesa, '09) is 11 games into his second season as the head coach of the Pack football program and is in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach as he spent two seasons at Western New Mexico. Vigil is 18-4 at CSU Pueblo and 25-19 all-time as a collegiate head coach.

## Mavericks At A Glance

### 2024 Record --

The Minnesota State University Mavericks come into Saturday's second round NCAA Division II playoff game at top-seeded and No. 7 ranked CSU Pueblo sporting a 9-3 overall record and tied for second in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference with a 7-3 mark. The Mavericks, who are making their 15th all-time NCAA Division II Playoff appearance, advanced to the second round following its 20-19 first round upset win at 22nd-ranked Augustana. The Mavs scored 10 points over the final 95 seconds of the game, including capping the win with a 34-yard field goal by **Matthew Jaeger** as time expired.

### The Head Coach --

**Todd Hoffner** (Valley City State, '89) is in his 14th season as Minnesota State's head football coach as he has compiled a 140-36 (.795 winning percentage) overall record and is the program's all-time winningest coach. He has led the Mavericks to seven NSIC titles, 11 NCAA Playoff appearances and two NCAA Championship game appearances (2014 & 2019). He has been named an AFCA Region Coach of the Year three times and earned AFCA D-II National Coach of the Year in 2019.

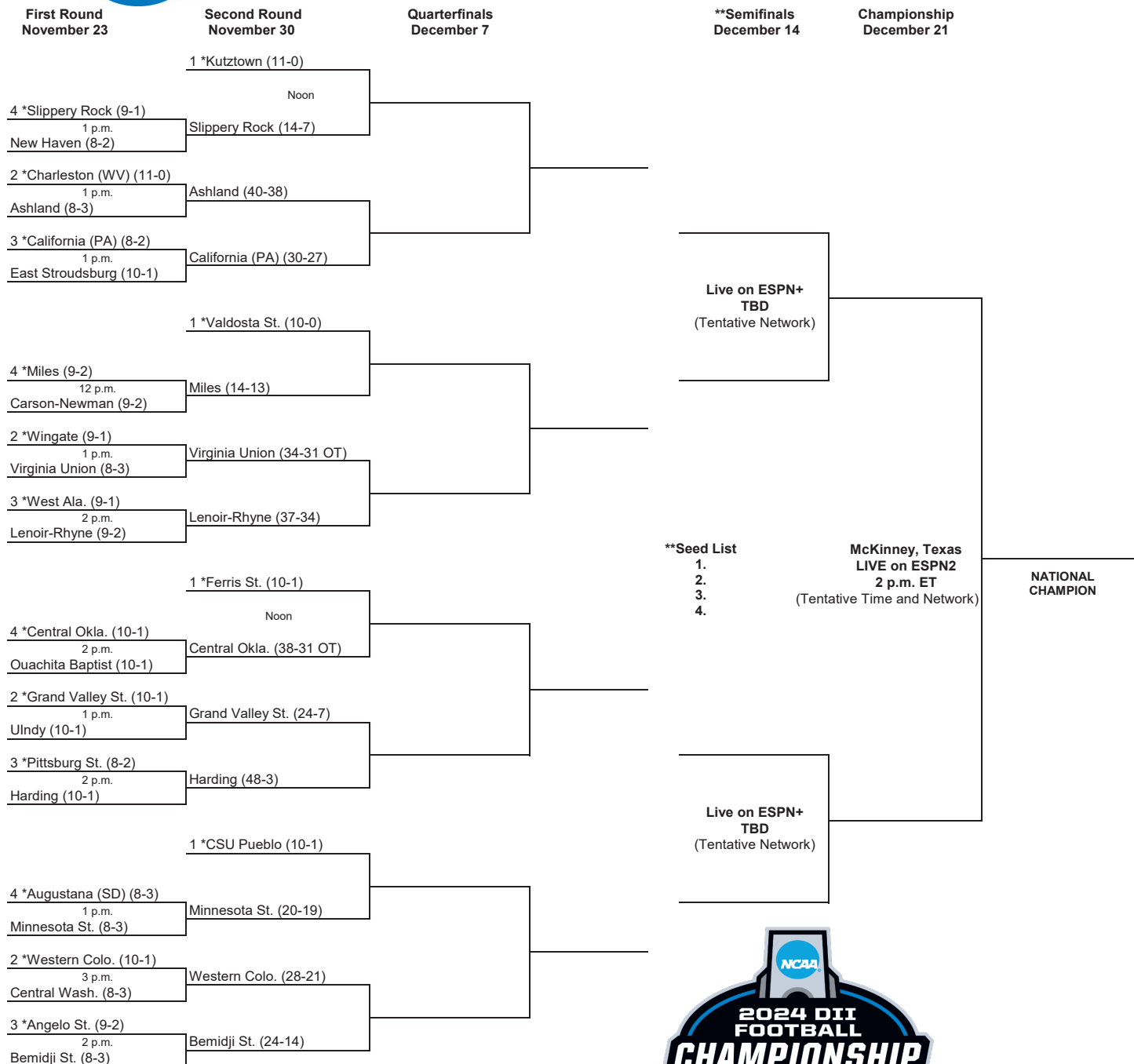

## The Series --

Saturday's game with Minnesota State will mark the fifth all-time meeting between the two schools with all meetings coming in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Minnesota State holds a 3-1 all-time edge in the series with the Pack's lone win coming in the 2014 National Championship game as the Pack defeated the Mavericks, 13-0, in Kansas City, Mo. Saturday's game will be the first time that the two teams will play in Pueblo as three of previous four meetings have come in Mankato, Minn., while the other came on a neutral field in Kansas City, Mo. The Pack is 2-4 against teams from the NSIC in the NCAA Playoffs (1-3 vs. Minnesota State, 1-0 vs. Augustana and 0-1 vs. Minnesota-Duluth).

## Pack's NCAA Playoff Record --

Saturday's game marks the 18th all-time NCAA Playoff game for the Pack as they have posted a 9-8 all-time record in the playoffs, including capturing the 2014 National Championship with a 13-0 win over Minnesota State. The Pack are the No. 1 seed for the fourth time and first time since 2013. The Pack are 1-3 all-time playing as the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Playoffs as they were 0-1 in both 2011 and 2013 and was 1-1 in 2012.

## CSU Pueblo -- Last Time Out at Chadron State (11/16/24)...

\*\* - The Pack extended its RMAC win streak to 16 consecutive games and captured its first outright RMAC title since 2014 with its 38-21 come-from-behind win at Chadron State to close the 2024 regular season on Nov. 16. The 16-game conference win streak is the second longest active streak in Division II football.

\*\* - Against the Eagles, the Pack trailed 21-7 at the half, but scored 31 unanswered points in the second half, including tallying 24 points in the third quarter to earn its second-largest come-from-behind win in school history. The win also helped the Pack finish RMAC play 9-0 for the first time since 2013.

\*\* - For the game, the Pack offense finished with 389 yards of offense as they rushed 36 times with 144 yards and passed for 245 yards. In the first half, the Pack were outgained, 198-152, but outgained the Eagles, 237-56, in the second half.

\*\* - Emanuel Fincher, who made his first start of the season, paced the Pack ground attack with 140 yards rushing on 20 carries and scored three touchdowns. All those numbers were career highs for Fincher.

\*\* - Quarterback Roman Fuller was 20-for-32 passing for 245 yards and had a touchdown pass and two interceptions in the game. The Pack lost the turnover battle, 2-1, for the game.

\*\* - On special teams, the Pack recorded two blocked kicks in the game as Shallum Peter blocked a punt in the third quarter that led to the Pack's go-ahead touchdown and Keith Mckaney blocked a 22-yard field goal attempt in the fourth quarter.

\*\* - Defensively, the Pack held Chadron State to 254 yards of offense as they passed for 179 yards and rushed the ball 35 times for 75 yards and averaged just 2.1 yards per carry. The Pack also recorded two sacks and five tackles for loss in the game.

\*\* - Gary Seidenberger paced the defense with eight tackles, while Jon Nuschy added seven tackles in the win.

## CSU PUEBLO-MINNESOTA STATE NOTES

\*\* - The Pack faces the Mavericks in the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the fifth time and first since 2019 when Minnesota State earned a 35-7 second round win in Mankato, Minn. This will be the first time the teams will meet in a playoff game in Pueblo.

\*\* - Minnesota State is making its third straight trip to the NCAA Playoffs and its first trip to the second round since 2022 when they fell 48-45 at Mines.

\*\* - The Mavericks are 16-14 all-time in the NCAA Playoffs and were Division II National Runners-up in both 2014 and 2019.

\*\* - Minnesota State advanced to the second round after earning a 20-19 win in last Saturday first round game at No. 4 seeded Augustana.

\*\* - The Mavericks enter Saturday's game averaging 391.4 yards and 30.0 points per game, and is allowing 349.8 yards and 23.5 points per game.

## PRESEASON NOTES...

**PACK PICKED THIRD IN RMAC PRESEASON POLL:** CSU Pueblo was tabbed to finish third in the 2024 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference football preseason that was released on July 31. In the poll, the Pack earned 66 points to sit 16 points in front of Colorado Mesa (50 points), who was tabbed fourth. Colorado Mines, who earned 79 points and seven first place votes, was tabbed the preseason favorite in the preseason poll, while Western Colorado was tabbed second with 74 points and three first place votes voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams.

**HEAD COACH PHILIP VIGIL ENTERS SECOND SEASON IN 2024:** Philip Vigil enters his second season as the Pack's head football coach. In his first season directing the Pack, Vigil led the program to an 8-3 overall record and a 7-2 mark in the RMAC. After opening the season by losing three of its first four games (all three losses came to teams that advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs), the Pack closed the 2023 campaign by winning its final seven games. The eight wins helped the Pack achieve its 14th consecutive winning season. Vigil, who was hired as the Pack's head coach in late December 2022 following the retirement of longtime Pack head coach **John Wristen**, is entering his fourth season as a collegiate head coach in 2024 and has compiled a 15-17 overall coaching record as he went 7-15 in two seasons (2021-22) at Western New Mexico prior to coming to CSU Pueblo. Since the Pack football program became a four-year athletic program in 1963, Vigil is just the fifth head coach in school history and just the second in the program's Division II era.

**ASSISTANT COACH CHANGES IN 2024:** One season after bringing in almost an entirely new coaching staff, Vigil has made some changes to his coaching staff for the 2024 season. The new assistant coaches are **Brian Natkin**, who will serve as the co-offensive coordinator and work with the Pack offensive line, while **Kevin Peterson** joins the coaching staff as the cornerbacks coach. While Natkin and Peterson are the two newcomers to the coaching staff, Vigil also made some additional changes to his staff for the 2024 season as **Brayle Brown** will serve as the offensive coordinator after being the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2023, while **Neema Behbahani** moves over from coaching cornerbacks in 2023 to coaching the Pack linebackers this season and **Caid Faske** will just serve as the defensive coordinator this season after being both the Defensive Coordinator and linebackers coach last season. Two former players from last season's team have joined the 2024 coaching staff as **Chance Fuller**, who was the Pack's starting quarterback in 2023, will coach the quarterbacks this season, while **Kaden Shelton**, who played on the defensive line last season, will serve as a defensive assistant coach this season. The other assistants this season are - **Mac Alexander** (Associate Head Coach/Defensive Backs/Special Teams Coordinator), **Josh Atkinson** (Receivers/Recruiting Coordinator), **Jordan Dodge** (Tight Ends), **Blake Moffett** (Running Backs), **Rashad Harris** (Director of Sports Performance) and **Herman Smith** (Defensive Line).

**BONE EARNS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN HONORS:** In *Lindy's College Football Preview Magazine*, senior defensive back **Daniel Bone III** was named a First-Team All-American in the magazine's Division II preview section. Additionally, Bone was also named a First-Team D2Football.com Elite 100 Preseason Watch List selection, while senior receiver **Reggie Retzlaff** was named to the Offensive Squad on the D2Football.com Elite 100 Preseason Watch List.

**RMAC GAME TO OPEN 2024 SEASON:** For the first time since the 2017 season, the Pack will open the 2024 season by playing a RMAC game against South Dakota Mines in Rapid City, S.D., on Thursday, Aug. 29. The early conference game came about after the NCAA allowed Division II football teams to play a Week Zero game (Aug. 29-31) on its schedule. The South Dakota Mines game was originally scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 28, but by moving the game to the first game of the season, the Pack will now have a bye week before its final stretch of three games against Western Colorado, Mines and Chadron State to close the regular season.

**PACK WILL PLAY SIX HOME GAMES IN 2024:** For the second consecutive season, the Pack will play six home games in the CSU ThunderBowl, including opening its home schedule by playing three straight games against UT-Permain Basin (Sept. 7), Grand Valley State (Sept. 14) and Colorado Mesa (Sept. 21). In addition to those three home games, the Pack will host New Mexico Highlands for Homecoming 2024 on Oct. 5 and host Black Hills State on Oct. 19 and closing its regular season home schedule on Nov. 12 against Colorado School of Mines, who is the two-time defending NCAA Division II National Runners-up.

**GRAND VALLEY STATE GAME MARKS ANNIVERSARY OF SCHOOL'S FIRST-EVER FOOTBALL GAME AS A FOUR-YEAR SCHOOL:** The Pack's home game on Sept. 14 against Grand Valley State will mark the 38th anniversary of Pack football's first-ever football game as a four year school. On Sept. 14, 1963, CSU Pueblo (then Southern Colorado State University) played host to Emporia State at Dutch Clark Stadium in Pueblo in the school's first-ever football game as a four-year school. Prior to 1963, the school was called Pueblo Junior College and played two-year football. In that 1963 game, SCSU fell 21-20 to Emporia State and would finish that inaugural first four-year season playing football with a 3-5 overall

The 2014 Pack team, which was coached by John Wristen, posted a 14-1 overall record and captured its fourth straight RMAC title and won the national title with a 13-0 win over Minnesota State-Mankato in the championship game, which was played in Kansas City, Mo.

**NCAA TO ALLOW TABLETS ON FIELD THIS SEASON:** One of the big rule changes this season from the NCAA is to allow the use of sideline and press box tablets through the league's replay system provided by SkyCoach. The NCAA Football Rules Committee recently approved using tablets on the sideline and in the press box for the coaches and players for the 2024 season and the Pack, along with the other nine RMAC schools, will be allowed to have five tablets available this season for the coaches to use per RMAC rules.

**WIN STREAK REACHES EIGHT-GAMES:** Thanks to its 38-21 win in its regular season finale on Nov. 16 at Chadron State, the Pack extended its win streak to eight straight games since suffering its lone loss of the season at home to then No. 3 ranked Grand Valley State (24-21) on Sept. 14. The eight game win streak is the fifth longest active streak in Division II football and the 11th longest win streak in school history. During its current eight game win streak, the Pack offense is averaging 45.4 points and 474.6 yards of offense (2,285 passing, 1,512 rushing) per game. Meanwhile, defensively, the Pack are allowing 20.6 points and 331.3 yards of offense (1,621 passing, 1,029 rushing) per game. The Pack have also recorded

27 sacks and have forced 16 turnovers on defense and have committed eight turnovers and allowed six sacks over its last eight games.

**RMAC WIN STREAK REACHES 16 STRAIGHT:** The Pack's regular season finale at Chadron State helped the ThunderWolves extend its win streak in RMAC play to 16 consecutive victories dating to the 2023 season. The 16-game conference win streak is the second longest active streak in Division II football and the longest streak among RMAC schools. The 16 game conference win streak for the Pack is the second longest since winning a school and RMAC-record 33 straight league games from 2010-14. The current 16 game RMAC win streak began with a 43-10 win at home in 2023 against Adams State on Homecoming 2023. The Pack closed the 2023 season by winning seven straight RMAC games and they completed RMAC play this season with an unblemished 9-0 record. During the

ThunderBowl with the lone loss being a 28-12 setback in 2021 to Mines. The Pack have won three straight Senior Day games since that loss to Mines as they won 45-20 in 2022 against South Dakota Mines, 42-37 last season against Black Hills State and 28-13 this season against Mines. CSU Pueblo's other Senior Day loss came in 2008 as the Pack fell 19-10 to Adams State.

**PACK VS. NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS:** The Pack's regular season home finale on Nov. 9 against Mines marked the fourth of four games in the 2024 regular season for the Pack against nationally-ranked teams. The Pack hosted then No. 21 ranked UT Permian Basin in its 2024 home opener on Sept. 7, then faced then No. 3 ranked Grand Valley State on Sept. 14 to close out non-conference play, played two weeks ago at then No. 8 Western Colorado and then played last weekend at home against then No. 14 Mines. CSU Pueblo has compiled an all-time record of 24-21 against ranked teams since the program rebooted in 2008, including a 16-12 mark in regular season games against ranked foes. Since picking up a 59-27 win in the 2022 season opener at 24th-ranked Midwestern State, the Pack have lost seven of its last 10 games to nationally-ranked opponents and is just 4-11 against ranked opponents since the start of the 2021 season and 9-15 against ranked teams since 2018. Last season, the Pack were 0-3 against nationally-ranked teams and is 3-1 this season against teams currently ranked nationally heading into the playoffs.

**PACK MOUNTS SECOND-LARGEST COMEBACK FOR WIN IN SCHOOL HISTORY AT CHADRON STATE:** In the Pack's last game at Chadron State to conclude the regular season, the Pack trailed 21-7 at half against the Eagles, but would outscore Chadron State 31-0 in the second half, including scoring 24 points in the third quarter to post the 38-21 victory. The 14-point comeback is the second largest comeback for a win in school history as the only larger comeback win came in 2012 as the Pack trailed 21-3 just six-plus minutes into the second quarter against Chadron State, before rallying for a 45-38 win in overtime against the Eagles.

**FINCHER HAS CAREER GAME AGAINST CHADRON STATE:** The win at Chadron State in the regular season finale was a coming out party for back-up junior running back **Emanuel Fincher**. In the win over the Eagles, Fincher, who earned his first career start in place of an injured **Howard Russell V**, ran the ball a career-high 21 times for a career-high 140 yards and scored a career-high three touchdowns, including a 10-yard run for a score to help the Pack tie the game at 21 just six-plus minutes into the third quarter. Fincher's 140 yards rushing was the fourth most rushing yards in a game this season for the Pack. Fincher's performance helped him earn the NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week honor on Nov. 19. Fincher is the fourth Pack player to earn NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week honors.

ninth and final Pack player to earn RMAC Player of the Week honors for the 2024 season when he was named the final Special Teams Player of the Week on Nov. 18. Peter, who was one of three Pack players to earn Special Team Player of the Week honors this season, earned the honor after blocking his third punt of the season to help the Pack earn its 38-21 come-from-behind victory at Chadron State. In the win at Chadron State, Peter's blocked punt with 1:40 left in the third quarter at the Pack 6-yard line helped the Pack score the go-ahead touchdown two plays later to give CSU Pueblo a 28-21 lead with 1:11 left in the quarter. After forcing the Eagles to punt inside the 10-yard line, Peter broke through the line and blocked a punt attempt by Brodie Eisenbraun. Eisenbraun would recover the blocked punt, but was tackled on the Pack 2-yard line by Peter to set up the go-ahead scoring drive by the Pack. The blocked punt was the third this season for Peter and was one of two blocked kicks in the game for the Pack as junior defensive back **Keith Mckaney** blocked a 60-yard field goal attempt in the fourth quarter by Chadron State. Peter's three blocked punts are tied for the most in the RMAC and is tied for fourth nationally in Division II.

**RETZLAFF EARNS SECOND RMAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADE FOLLOWING PERFORMANCE AGAINST MINES:** Reggie Retzlaff earned his second RMAC Offensive Player of the Week accolade of the 2024 season on Nov. 11 following his play in the Pack's 28-13 win over Mines. Against the Orediggers, Retzlaff caught seven passes for 139 yards and had two touchdown catches, both of which came in the second half. The two touchdown catches pushed his season total to 12 and his career total to 24. The 24 career touchdown receptions are tied for first on the school's all-time list, while is 12 touchdown passes this season are tied for the most in single season in program history. school's all-time chart with **Paul Browning**, who caught 24 touchdown passes from 2011-14. The two touchdown receptions also pushed his single season tally to 12, which is tied for the most in single season in school history. Along with being tied for the school's career touchdown reception mark, Retzlaff enters Saturday's second round NCAA Playoff game with Minnesota State sitting third in career receiving yards (1,974) and tied for fifth in career receptions (112). He has caught three or more touchdown passes in a game four times in his career and has had at least two touchdown catches in seven of 21 career games as a member of the Pack. This season, Retzlaff is fifth in Division II in receiving yards (1,169), leads the RMAC and is third nationally in receiving yards per game (116.9), 12th nationally in receptions per game (6.4) and leads the RMAC and is tied for ninth nationally in touchdown passes (12). He is averaging 18.3 yards per reception and has caught at least seven passes in six of the Pack's 11 games this season and has had five 100+ plus receiving yards and currently stands tied for eighth among active Division II players in career receiving touchdowns with 24.

### RETZLAFF CLIMBING SINGLE SEASON RECEIVING CHARTS:

Coming into Saturday's NCAA Playoff game with Minnesota State, Retzlaff holds the school's single-season record for pass receptions (64), pass receiving yards (1,169) and tied for the single season mark for touchdown receptions (12). He is the second receiver (**Paul Browning** is the other) in school history to record 1,000 or more receiving yards in a single season. In addition to Retzlaff, **Taylor Tosches** is tied for sixth on the single-season reception chart (53) and is tied for eighth on the single-season receiving yards chart (769) and is eighth on the school's single season chart with eight touchdown receptions.

### RETZLAFF CATCHES THREE TOUCHDOWN PASS AGAINST WESTERN COLORADO:

In the Pack's road win Western Colorado two week ago, Retzlaff caught seven passes for 138 yards and had three touchdown receptions, including a 76-yard touchdown catch from Fuller to give the Pack a 17-7 lead just four-plus minutes into the second quarter. The 76-yard reception was the longest play of the season for

the Pack. With his three touchdown receptions, Retzlaff pushed his career total to 22, which is second on the school's all-time charts.

### PACK BLOCKS SCHOOL RECORD THREE KICKS IN WIN OVER BLACK HILLS STATE:

In its 24-21 home win over Black Hills State on Oct. 19, the Pack blocked a single-game school record three kicks in the win over the Yellow Jackets. Against the Yellow Jackets, senior defensive lineman **Cody Ramming** blocked two field goals, both of which were returned 75 (**Ben Wilson**) and 58 yards (**Eli Pittman**) respectively for touchdowns, while Peter blocked a punt. The 75 yard return by junior defensive back **Ben Wilson** is the longest blocked field goal return in school history. The Pack is one of 13 Division II schools this season to block at least three kicks in a game, while the Pack's six blocked kicks this season is currently third in the RMAC and tied for 12th nationally in Division II.

### PACK VS. COLORADO SCHOOLS:

CSU Pueblo has posted a 115-60-3 (.654) record against schools from the state of Colorado since becoming a four-year school in 1963. The Pack is 62-24-3 at home and 53-36 on the road against Colorado schools over that same span. Since rebooting football in 2008, the Pack are 61-19 all-time against Colorado schools, including being 34-8 in home games and 27-11 on the road against Colorado schools. The Pack went undefeated against Colorado schools in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2024 and lost just once to Colorado schools in season in 2010 (4-1), 2014 (4-1), 2017 (4-1), 2018 (5-1) and 2019 (4-1). Last season, the Pack was 3-2 against Colorado schools and in 2022, the Pack was 3-3 against Colorado schools. This season the Pack went a perfect 5-0 against Colorado schools and they have now won eight straight football games against

In the Pack's win at Western Colorado, the Pack offense scored on seven of its 12 possessions, including five of its seven first half possessions as they tallied 44 points and gained 593 yards of offense in the victory. Against the Mountaineers, the Pack rushed 26 times for 158 yards and passed for 435 yards, which is the second-highest passing yardage for the Pack in a game in school history. The 158 yards rushing came against a WCU defense that was second nationally in Division II in rushing defense as they entered the game allowing just 60.5 yards per game. In the passing game, **Roman Fuller** earned his second straight start and was 34-for-46 passing for 435 yards and tossed five touchdown passes. The 34 pass completions were a single game school record by a Pack quarterback, while the five touchdowns was won shy of the single game school record for a quarterback.

## FULLER NAMED BOTH RMAC OFFENSIVE AND NFF COLORADO CHAPTER PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

For the seventh time this season on Monday, Nov. 4, the Pack had a player recognized as an RMAC Player of the Week. This week's Offensive Player of the Week accolade went to **Roman Fuller** thanks to his career game at Western Colorado. Fuller is the fourth Pack player this season to earn RMAC Offensive Player of the Week as he joins **Howard Russell V** (Sept. 21), **Reggie Retzlaff** (Sept. 7) and **Devin Larsen** (Aug. 29). In addition to the four offensive honorees, the Pack has had one Defensive Player of the Week - **Makeah Scippio** (Sept. 7) and two Special Teams Players of the Week - **Reece Robinson** (Oct. 7) and **Cody Ramming** (Oct. 19). Along with winning the RMAC Offensive Player of the Week honors, Fuller was also named the NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week to become the third Pack player to earn the honor this season as Retzlaff was honored on Sept. 10 and Larsen was honored on Sept. 4.

**FULLER HAS STEPPED UP SINCE BECOMING PACK'S STARTING QUARTERBACK:** Since becoming the Pack's starting quarterback against Black Hills State, Fuller has completed 68.5 percent of his passes as he is 83-for-121 passing for 980 yards and has had

two interceptions and nine touchdown passes. He has thrown for over 200 yards in three of those four games, including 435 yards in a win at Western Colorado. The 435 yards passing are second-most in a game in school history. Entering the postseason, Fuller is second nationally in completion percentage (69.8

percent), third nationally in passing efficiency (182.0) and eighth nationally in yards per pass attempt (9.7 yards per attempt). On the season, he is completing 70 percent of his passes as he is 113-for-162 with 1,569 yards passing and has had three interceptions and 17 touchdown passes, including tossing three or more touchdown passes in a game four times.

## RETZLAFF, TOSCHES COMBINE FOR 17 CATCHES, FOUR TOUCHDOWNS AGAINST WESTERN COLORADO:

While the Pack passed for 435 yards in the win at Western Colorado, senior receivers **Reggie Retzlaff** and **Taylor Tosches** combined to catch 17 of Fuller's 34 pass completions for a combined 275 yards as Retzlaff caught seven passes for 138 yards and hauled in three touchdown passes, while Tosches caught 10 passes for 137 yards and had one touchdown reception. It marked the second time this season that Retzlaff and Tosches had each recorded 100-plus receiving yards in the same game and those two also accomplished the feat in the season opener at South Dakota Mines when each player caught 11 passes each for 241 and 151 yards respectively.

## RUNNING GAME HAS BEEN STRONG DURING EIGHT GAME WIN STREAK:

Since the 38-14 home win against Colorado Mesa on Sept. 21, the Pack running game has been strong as since the win over the Mavericks, the Pack have rushed for a total of 1,512 yards and have scored 20 rushing touchdowns, including four touchdowns each against Colorado Mesa, New Mexico Highlands and Chadron State. Over its last eight games to conclude the regular season, the Pack carried the ball a total of 246 times and is averaging 6.1 yards per carry and 189 yards per game. Against Colorado Mesa, the Pack carried the ball 41 times for 211 yards and averaged 5.1 yards per carry, before gaining a season-high 301 yards on 38 carries and averaging 7.9 yards per game at Adams State, then tallied 197 yards

rushing on 25 carries (7.9 yards per carry) against New Mexico Highlands and had 291 yards on 35 carries, averaged 8.3 yards per carry at Fort Lewis, tallied 148 yards on 20 carries (7.4 yards per carry) against Black Hills State, had 158 yards on 26 carries (6.1 yards per carry) at Western Colorado, rushed 62 times for 25 yards (2.5 yards per carry) against Mines and tallied 144 yards on 365 carries (4.0 yards per carry) at Chadron State. Senior running back **Howard Russell V** led the way for the Pack on the ground as he carried the ball 18 times for 142 yards and scored three touchdowns and averaged 7.9 yards per carry in the win against Colorado Mesa. He then followed up that performance with 168 yards rushing on 13 carries and added two touchdowns and averaged 12.9 yards per carry against Adams State, he then tallied seven carries for 107 yards (15.3 yards per carry) and two scores against New Mexico Highlands, had 14 carries for 135 yards (9.6 yards per carry) and a touchdown against Fort Lewis, rushed 15 times for 102 yards (6.8 yards per carry) against Black Hills State, rushed 19 times for 159 yards (8.4 yards per carry) at Western Colorado and then rushed 21 times for 70 yards (3.3 yards per carry) against Mines. The 159 yards rushing against Western Colorado were the most in a game by a Pack running back this season. The Pack have now rushed for 200 or more yards in a game 10 times since 2022 and is 9-1 in those nine games when rushing for 200 or more yards with the only setback coming last season against Mines when the Pack rushed for 217 yards.

## RUSSELL CLIMBING UP PACK'S CAREER RUSHING CHART:

Entering the NCAA Playoff game with Minnesota State, Russell continues to climb the school's all-time rushing chart as he is now the program's No. 13 all-time rusher as he has gained 1,700 yards in his one-plus seasons with the Pack. He is one of 22 players in school history to gain 1,000 career yards and is now the 13th player in school history to gain 1,700 career rushing yards. The school's all-time rushing mark of 5,966 yards is held by CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2024 inductee **Cameron McDondle**, who played for the Pack from 2012-15.

## RUSSELL IS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN BOTH RUSHING YARDS AND TOUCHDOWNS:

Entering play this weekend, Russell is among the leaders in Division II football in rushing yards (1,115), rushing yards per game (111.5), rushing yards per carry (7.3), rushing touchdowns (11), total touchdowns (13) and points scored (78). He leads the RMAC and is 15th nationally in rushing yards, leads the RMAC and tied for 26th nationally in rushing touchdowns and leads the RMAC and is tied for 25th nationally in total touchdowns and leads the RMAC and is 24th nationally in all-purpose yards per game as he is averaging 127.0 yards per game. On the season, Russell has had seven 100-plus yard rushing games, including rushing for 100 or more yards in six of his last seven games to conclude the regular season.

**TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Thanks to his two blocked field goals that led to touchdowns in the Pack's 24-21 win over Black Hills State on Oct. 19, Ramming was named the Special Teams Player of the Week by both the RMAC on Oct. 21 and by D2Football.com on Oct. 22. Ramming became the sixth Pack player this season to earn RMAC Player of the Week honors and the second straight Pack player to earn Special Teams honors as redshirt junior receiver **Reece Robinson** was honored following the New Mexico Highlands game on Oct. 7, while Ramming is the first Pack player to earn Player of the Week honors from D2Football.com since **Trey Botts** was honored on Oct. 19, 2022.

## PACK BOASTS 65-40-1 ALL-TIME RECORD IN NOVEMBER:

Saturday's game with Minnesota State will mark the 107th game in the month of November for Pack football since 1963. The Pack has posted a 65-40-1 all-time record in November, including a 37-10 record in November since 2008. In addition, the Pack is 19-3 at home in November and 18-7 on the road in November since 2008. The Pack has won five straight games in the month of November since suffering a 45-24 loss at Mines in the first round of the 2022 NCAA Division II Playoffs, including being 3-0 this season in November heading into the postseason.

## PACK RECORDS THIRD GAME WITH 600-PLUS YARDS

**OF OFFENSE THIS SEASON AGAINST FORT LEWIS:** In the Pack's 58-24 win at Fort Lewis on Oct. 12, the Pack ran 76 plays on offense and gained 614 yards as they averaged 8.1 yards per game against the Skyhawks. In the game, the Pack rushed 35 times for 291 yards and averaged 8.3 yards per carry and passed for 323 yards as they were 23-for-41 passing with one interception and four touchdown passes. The 614 yards of offense marked the third time this season that the Pack gained 600 or more yards in a game and also marked the ninth most total offensive yards in a game in school history. The Pack scored seven touchdowns in game, including tallying 45 points in the second half as they outscored the Skyhawks, 45-10, to post the victory. In fact, since the beginning of the 2023 season, the Pack has now recorded four of the Top 10 total offensive yardage outputs in school history. **PACK TALLIES SEASON-HIGH TYING FIVE SACKS, FOUR INTERCEPTIONS AND FIVE TURNOVERS AT FORT LEWIS:** In the Pack's win at Fort Lewis on Oct. 12, the Pack defense played a big role in the victory as they recorded a season-high five sacks and also picked off a season-high four passes and forced a season-high five turnovers. Against the Skyhawks, the Pack's five sacks were recorded by **Daniel Bone III, Lorenzo Diggs, A.J. Jordan, Jon Nuschy, and Makeah Scippio**, while the four interceptions were collected by **Donovan Guyton, Dre'Monti Jackson, Gary Seidenberger, and Oliver Welch**. In addition, Jordan was credited with both a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. On the season, the Pack have recorded 36 sacks, which is second in the RMAC and have picked off 14 passes, which is second in the RMAC and 17th nationally. The Pack are averaging 3.3 sacks and 1.3 interceptions per game. Scippio leads the team in sacks with nine, while **Dominick Fini** has recorded five sacks and Ramming has had 3.5 sacks. On the interception front, **Donovan English** and **Kahden Rullo** lead the team with three interceptions each.

**PACK SCORES SEASON HIGH 67 POINTS, INCLUDING 39 POINTS IN THIRD QUARTER AGAINST NEW MEXICO HIGHLANDS:** One week after scoring a then season-high 66 points in its win at Adams State, the Pack bettered that scoring total by one point as they scored 67 points in its Homecoming win over New Mexico Highlands on Oct. 5. The 67 points scored were the fourth most points scored in a game in school history and just the sixth time the Pack has scored 65 or more points in a game. Along with scoring a season-high 67 points, the Pack also scored 39 points in the second quarter, which are the most points scored by the Pack in a quarter since scoring 40 points in the second quarter against Fort Lewis in 2021. The 95 combined points against New Mexico Highlands were the most ever in a homecoming game for the Pack and the 67 points scored were the second-most ever scored by the Pack in a homecoming game as they tallied 75 points in a 75-3 win over Fort Lewis on Homecoming 2022.

**ROBINSON TAKES HOME RMAC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR:** Redshirt junior **Reece Robinson** became the fifth Pack football player this season to earn an RMAC Player of the Week honor on Monday, Oct. 7 and the first to earn Special Teams Player of the Week accolades. Robinson earns this week's RMAC Special Teams Player of the Week honor after returning his first career punt return 73 yards for a touchdown in the 67-28 Homecoming win this past Saturday over New Mexico Highlands. The 73-yard punt return for a touchdown was the longest offensive play of the season for the Pack, the longest punt return in the RMAC this season and the first for the Pack since **Andrew Cook** returned a punt 70 yards for a score last season against Western Colorado. Robinson's punt return gave the Pack a 36-0 lead with 7:30 left in the second quarter. In addition to his lone punt return touchdown, Robinson, who is the first Pack player to earn an RMAC Special Team Player of the Week accolade since sophomore running back **Moosah Alsaif** was honored twice during the 2023 season, also caught two passes for 34 yards and had 107 all-purpose yards in the win.

**PACK GAINS SEASON-HIGH 718 YARDS OF OFFENSE AT ADAMS STATE:** In the Pack's 66-10 win at Adams State, the Pack gained a season-high 718 yards of offense as they averaged 10.4 yards per play as they run 69 plays in the victory. Against the Grizzlies, the Pack rushed for a season-high 301 yards on 38 carries and averaged 7.9 yards per carry and passed for 417 yards, which is the second-highest passing yardage mark in school history behind the school-record 548 yards passing in the season opener

at South Dakota Mines. Since the program reboot in 2008, the Pack have now recorded 10 games of 600 or more yards of total offense with four of those 10 games occurring since the beginning of the 2023 season.

**PACK SCORES SEASON HIGH 66 POINTS AT ADAMS STATE, 56 POINT MARGIN IS TIED FOR SEVENTH BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY:** Against Adams State on Sept. 28, the Pack scored 66 points, which is tied for the fifth most points scored in a game by the Pack in school history. It was just the seventh time in school history that the Pack has scored 60 or more points in a game. Meanwhile, the 56 point margin of victory is tied for the seventh largest in school history and the highest for the Pack in a game since last year's school record 78 point win (85-7) at Fort Lewis.

**DEFENSE HOLDS GRIZZLIES UNDER 200 YARDS:** While the Pack offense scored a season-high 66 points and gained a season-high 718 yards of offense against Adams State, the Pack defense also stepped up as they held the Grizzlies to 141 yards on 72 plays. The Grizzlies averaged 2.0 yards per play as they finished with 59 yards rushing on 41 carries and averaged 1.4 yards per rush and passed for 82 yards and averaged just 6.8 yards per completion.

**CONFERENCE HOME OPENERS:** Since the Pack returned to the gridiron in 2008, Saturday's RMAC home game with Colorado Mesa two weeks ago marked 16th season that the CSU Pueblo opened its RMAC home schedule. The Pack is now 12-4 in their RMAC home openers, but snapped a two-game losing skid in RMAC home openers with its win last Saturday over Colorado Mesa. It will mark the first time since rebooting the football program that Pack opened its home RMAC schedule against Colorado Mesa. The Pack have played Western Colorado the past two seasons in its first RMAC home game.

**PACK IN HOME OPENERS:** The Pack's home opener on Sept. 7 with then 21st-ranked UT Permian Basin marked the 38th home opener since 1963, including the 16th home opener since the program reboot in 2008. Since 1963, the Pack is 26-10-2 in home openers, including being 12-4 in home openers since 2008. The Pack have won just four of its last seven home openers and has now won two straight home openers.

**THUNDERWOLVES STRONG IN THUNDERBOWL:** One of the biggest successes of the Pack program since restarting the program in 2008 is their ability to win home games in the CSU Pueblo ThunderBowl. Since 2008, the Pack have posted a 79-19 overall record in the ThunderBowl and have won at least five home games in a season 10 times, including posting undefeated marks at home in 2014 (8-0), 2017 (5-0) and 2018 (5-0). Along with being 79-19 at the home, the Pack are 15-8 at home against non-conference foes, including being 10-4 in regular season non-conference home games after its 24-21 loss to then No. 3 ranked Grand Valley State this season. Four of those eight losses at home have come against Grand Valley State as they fell in the NCAA Playoffs to the Lakers in both 2013 (34-30) and 2015 (31-7) and in regular season contests in 2022 (35-10) and 2024 (24-21). ## PACK STRONG IN REGULAR SEASON NON-CONFERENCE GAMES SINCE 2008:

The Pack's game with Grand Valley State two weeks ago marked the 29th regular season non-conference football game since the 2008 season. The Pack are now 19-10 all-time in regular season non-conference games and has posted a perfect regular season non-conference record seven times in the last 16 seasons. Last season, the Pack went 1-1 in regular season non-conference games as they won at home over Midwestern State (37-8) and fell in double overtime at Grand Valley State (57-49). When factoring in postseason games, the Pack are a combined 30-18 in non-conference games. The Pack are 1-1 this season against non-conference foes.

**SEASON OPENERS:** CSU Pueblo has now posted a 14-2 (.875) record in season opening games since the program's reboot in 2008 and are 28-10 (.737) all-time in season openers since becoming a four-year school in 1963. Thursday's game at South Dakota Mines to open the season was the earliest season opener for the Pack since opening the 2017 season with a home RMAC game against Mines, a game the Pack won 38-7. The road game with South Dakota Mines marks the seventh time the Pack will open the season on the road since 2008 and first time since 2022 when the Pack opened on the road at Midwestern State. The Pack are 6-1 (.857) since the program reboot in 2008 in season openers on the road with the lone loss being a 57-21 setback in 2016 in Golden, Colo., against Mines. Since 1963, the Pack is 11-4 on the road in season openers and has won three straight and six of its last seven road openers with the lone loss coming in its 2016 season opener on the road against Colorado School of Mines.

## NINE GAME WIN STREAK SNAPPED WITH GRAND VALLEY STATE LOSS:

The 24-21 loss last Saturday against Grand Valley State snapped the Pack's nine game win streak, which was the longest win streak for the Pack since also winning nine straight games during the 2019 season and also the second-longest active streak in Division II football. During the nine game win streak, the Pack outscored its opponents by 31.3 points per game as they averaged 47.0 points per game on offense and allowed 15.7 points per game on defense.

**CONFERENCE OPENERS:** Since the Pack returned to the gridiron in 2008, the Pack's RMAC road game with South Dakota Mines on Aug. 29 marked the 16th season that CSU Pueblo has played an RMAC opener. The Pack is 13-3 all-time in conference openers

## PACK ALL-TIME WINNINGEST FOOTBALL PROGRAM IN COLORADO:

CSU Pueblo comes into Saturday's NCAA playoff game with Minnesota State as the all-time winningest college football program in the state of Colorado in terms of winning percentage as the Pack has won 65.3 percent of its football games since beginning its four-year school tenure in 1963. The Pack have played 409 games since 1963 and has won 265 games and has lost just 140 and has recorded four ties. Division I University of Colorado is second in all-time winning percentage with 57 percent as they are 732-547-36 all-time, while the University of Denver is third with a 56.3 winning percentage as they went 273-262-40 before dropping football in 1960.

## 14 CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS:

With its win at Fort Lewis on Dec. 12, the Pack assured themselves of its 14th consecutive winning season. The streak began in 2009 and including that year, the Pack has posted a 139-34 overall record, including three undefeated regular seasons, 14 seasons with at least seven wins, nine seasons with at least nine wins and seven seasons with at least 10 wins, highlighted by the school-record 14-win NCAA Division II National Championship team in 2014. During this streak, the Pack has

earned eight Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championships and have advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs 10 times, including winning the national title in 2014. Also a highlight of the past 13 years was a 33-game RMAC win streak that stretched from Oct. 23, 2010 to Oct. 11, 2014. CSU Pueblo came into the 2024 season as one of only two football programs in the state of Colorado (Colorado School Mines is the other) at any level to boast 13 consecutive winning seasons.

beginning playing football as a four-year school in 1963, CSU Pueblo currently sits 10th on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs in terms of winning percentage. CSU Pueblo has recorded a 265-140-4 all-time record entering Saturday's game Minnesota State game and the Pack have won 65 percent (65.3 winning percentage) of its 409 all-time games. In addition from 2010-19, the Pack were second in winning percentage (.862) and fourth in victories (106) as they compiled a 106-17 record in NCAA Division II football.

## RUSSELL TAKES HOME RMAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADE, FOURTH PACK PLAYER TO BE HONORED THIS SEASON:

On Monday, Sept. 23, Russell was named the RMAC Offensive Player of the Week after scoring three of the Pack's four offensive touchdowns in the 22nd-ranked Pack's 38-14 home win last Saturday against Colorado Mesa. He began the game with a 57-yard run on the first offensive play and finished the game with a season-high 142 yards rushing on 18 carries and averaged 7.98 yards per carry. He scored his three touchdowns on runs of 1-yard, 18-yards and 11-yards against the Mavericks. The three touchdown game was the first for a Pack running back since **Marche Dennard** also scored three touchdowns in a game against New Mexico Highlands in 2018. Along with his 142 rushing yards, Russell also caught two passes for 10 yards and tallied 152 all-purpose yards for the game.

## PACK HELD WITHOUT TOUCHDOWN PASS FOR FIRST TIME IN 10 GAMES AGAINST COLORADO MESA:

In the win over Colorado Mesa, the Pack snapped a streak of 10 consecutive games with a touchdown pass for the Pack that dated to last season's game at Fort Lewis. Over that span, the Pack had thrown 41 touchdown passes and had scored 16 rushing touchdowns.

## RETZLAFF, SCIPIO EARN WEEK ONE RMAC OFFENSIVE AND DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

Thanks to their outstanding performances in the Pack's 40-23 home opening win against UT Permian Basin, senior receiver **Reggie Retzlaff** was named this week's RMAC Offensive Player of the Week, while senior defensive lineman **Makeah Scippo** was named the RMAC Defensive Player of the Week. In the win over UTPB, Retzlaff caught seven passes for 165 yards and had touchdown receptions of 70 and 35 yards and averaged 23.6 yards per catch against the Falcons, while Scippo recorded four sacks and added 4.5 tackles for loss to go along with six tackles, including three solo stops. It marked the second week that at least one Pack player was honored by the RMAC as a Player of the Week as senior quarterback **Devin Larsen** was named the league's inaugural RMAC Offensive Player of the Week.

## RETZLAFF BECOMES SECOND STRAIGHT PACK PLAYER TO EARN NFF COLORADO CHAPTER PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS:

On Tuesday, Sept. 10, Retzlaff was named this week's NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week honor following performance in the Pack's home opener against UT Permian Basin. Retzlaff is the second straight Pack player to earn Player of the Week honors from

the NFF Colorado Chapter as Larsen was honored following the season opener against South Dakota Mines. Retzlaff becomes the 22nd overall Pack player and second receiver to earn Player of the Week honors from the NFF Colorado Chapter.

## LARSEN TAKES HOME INAUGURAL RMAC, NFF COLORADO CHAPTER PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS:

Thanks to his record setting passing performance in the Pack's season opener at South Dakota Mines, **Devin Larsen** was named both the inaugural 2024 RMAC Offensive Player and NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week as Larsen was tabbed the RMAC Offensive Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 2 and earned the NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week accolade on Tuesday, Sept. 3.

## LARSEN HAS IMPRESSIVE DEBUT AS PACK STARTING QB:

Larsen had an impressive record-setting debut as the Pack's starting quarterback in this year's season opening win at South Dakota Mines. Against the Hardrockers, Larsen, who is a transfer from Western New Mexico, was 30-for-45 passing for a single-game school record 508 yards and tossed five touchdowns and had no interceptions. He completed 66.7 percent of his passes in the 35-6 win. The 30 pass completions bettered the old single-game school record of 29 completions, while the 508 passing yards bettered the old single-game school mark of 396 set by **Steven Croell** against Midwestern State in the 2022 season opener. The 508-yard passing game was the first 400-plus yard passing performance in the program's 38 year history. ### RETZLAFF, TOSCHES COMBINE FOR 22 CATCHES AND NEARLY 400 RECEIVING YARDS IN SEASON OPENER:

In the Pack's season opener at South Dakota Mines, the Pack's senior receiving duo of **Reggie Retzlaff** and **Taylor Tosches** combined to catch 22 passes for 392 yards in the 35-6 win. Against the Hardrockers, Retzlaff caught 11 passes for a single-game record 241 yards and hauled in three touchdown receptions, while Tosches also caught 11 passes for 151 yards and added a touchdown reception. The 11 receptions from Retzlaff and Tosches were one shy of the school's single-game record of 12 receptions set by **John Trahan** against Colorado Mesa in 1982. It marked the first time in school history that two receivers combined to catch 20 or more passes in a single game. The 241 receiving yards bettered the old school record of 219 yards set by **Max Fine** against Colorado School of Mines in 2022. The 241 receiving yards are 15th-best all-time performance in Colorado collegiate football history.

### SCORING STRONG FOR PACK IN MIDDLE TWO

**QUARTERS THIS SEASON:** Coming into action this weekend, the Pack has scored a league-leading 459 points and is averaging 41.7 points per game. The Pack has scored at least 85 points in all four quarters this season, including tallying 124 points in the second quarter, 137 points in the third quarter and 111 points in the fourth quarter. They have also scored 87 points in the first quarter. On the season, the Pack has scored 261 of its 459 (56.9 percent) points in the second and third quarters combined. The Pack is outscoring its foes in the those two quarters - 261 to 117 on the season. In addition, the Pack have scored at least 20 points in each quarter this season, including scoring a season high 39 points in the second quarter against New Mexico Highlands and 28 points in the fourth quarter at Fort Lewis.

**RUSH DEFENSE STRONG THIS SEASON:** Through 11 regular season games this season, the Pack

defense has been strong against the run as they have allowed a total of 1,429 yards on the season as the Pack's opponents are averaging 3.3 yards per carry and 129.9 yards per game, which is sixth-best in the RMAC. Five of the Pack's 11 opponents have gained 75 or fewer yards in a game as South Dakota Mines carried the ball 28 times for 50 yards as the Hardrockers averaged 1.8 yards per carry, while Colorado Mesa carried the ball 30 times for 49 yards as the Mavericks averaged 1.6 yards per carry, Adams State carried the ball 41 times for 59 yards and averaged 1.4 yards per carry, Western Colorado carried the ball 27 times for 40 yards and averaged 1.5 yards per carry and Chadron State gained 75 yards on 35 carries and averaged 2.1 yards per carry. In fact, only five opponents this season have rushed for more than 100 yards against the Pack defense, including New Mexico Highlands rushing for 295 yards on 52 carries.

### PACK DEFENSE STEPPING UP THIS SEASON:

Through 11 games this season, the Pack defense has stepped up as they have allowed just a total of 218 points and have allowed a total of 3,592 yards for an average of 4.4 yards per play and 326.5 yards per game. The Pack defense has also forced 20 turnovers, recorded 36 sacks and 83 tackles for loss through 11 games. In the opener against South Dakota Mines, the Pack defense held the Hardrockers to 214 yards on 75 plays, while against UTPB, the Pack allowed 331 yards on 90 plays and then allowed 401 yards on 67 plays against Grand Valley State, held Colorado Mesa to a total of 281 yards on 65 plays, held Adams State to a total of 141 yards on 72 plays, limited New Mexico Highlands to a total of 356 yards on 65 plays, against Fort Lewis, the Pack allowed 280 yards on 76 plays, then allowed Black Hills State to gain 509 yards on 97 plays, allowed 445 yards on 78 plays at Western Colorado, allowed 390 yards on 77 plays against Mines and allowed 254 yards on 61 plays at Chadron State. The Pack are fourth in the RMAC in scoring defense (19.8), sixth in rushing defense (130.6), and third in passing defense (196.6).

**HARD TO PASS AGAINST THE PACK THIS YEAR:** With a defensive secondary that is among the best in the league, the Pack have made it difficult for teams to pass the ball this season as they enter Saturday's game NCAA playoff game with Minnesota State sitting third in the league in pass defense as they are allowing just 196.6 passing yards per game and are second in the RMAC and 22nd in Division II in passing efficiency defense as their opponents have an passing efficiency of just 107.12 on the year. The Pack's opponents are completing just 53.6 percent (207-for-386) of its passes on year and has allowed just two foes - Black Hills State and Western Colorado - to pass for more than 250 yards in a game on the season and the Yellow Jackets passed for 297 yards and allowed 405 passing yards to Western Colorado. The Pack is also second in the RMAC in interceptions with 14 as they have collected at least one

interception in eight of its 11 games this season, including picking off four passes at Fort Lewis. **Donovan English** and **Kahden Rullo** lead the way with three interceptions each. Since the beginning of last season, the Pack have picked off a total of 22 passes.

## PACK DEFENSE WREAKING HAVOC IN OPPONENTS BACKFIELD THIS SEASON:

The Pack has made it a habit this season on wreaking havoc in their opponents backfields as the Pack have recorded 36 sacks and 83 tackles for a loss this season. The 36 sacks second-best in the RMAC and tied for ninth nationally in Division II as they average 3.27 sacks per game, while the 83 tackles for loss are tied for third in the RMAC and 23rd nationally in Division II as they average 7.5 tackles for loss per game. The Pack have had at least three sacks in seven of their 11 games this season, including a season-high six sacks against Mines and have tallied at least six tackles for a loss in nine of its 11 games, including a season-high 10 against UTPB, Adams State and Fort Lewis. The Pack are averaging 3.27 sacks per game and 7.5 tackles for loss per game. **Makeah Scippio** leads the way in sacks with nine, while **Dominick Fini** is second with five sacks and **Cody Ramming** is third with 3.5 sacks. In addition, Scippio leads the way with 12 tackles for 70 yards in losses, Fini is second with eight tackles for a loss of 27 yards. **James Turrentine** and Ramming are tied for third in tackles for a loss with 6.5. The Pack has had 22 players credited with at least one tackle for a loss and 14 players have been credited with at least one sack this season. The 36 sacks this season are tied for fifth-most in a single season in school history.

## NUSCHY RECORDS CAREER-HIGH 17 TACKLES AGAINST GRAND VALLEY STATE:

Senior linebacker **Jon Nuschy** had a career night against Grand Valley State as the La Junta, Colo., native tallied a career-high 17 tackles and added a sack and a tackle for a loss. The 17 tackles is tied for the second-most by an RMAC player this season and tied for the 19th most by a Division II player this season. On the season, Nuschy is third on the team in tackles with 70, including 34 solo stops and has had 5.5 tackles for a loss, 2.5 sacks, two pass break-ups and two quarterback hurries.

## SCIPPIO HAS BIG NIGHT AGAINST UTPB:

In the Pack's home opener against UTPB, senior defensive lineman **Makeah Scippio** overwhelmed the Falcons offensive backfield as he recorded a career-high four sacks and had 4.5 tackles for a loss in the 40-23 victory. The four sacks were 0.5 sacks shy of the school's single game record of 4.5 set by **Chase Vaughn** against Oklahoma Panhandle State in 2008, while the 4.5 tackles for loss were 1.5 tackles for loss shy of the single game school record of six set by **Trey Botts** against New Mexico Highlands in 2022. Scippio's 4.0 sacks are tied for the most in a single game this season, while his 4.5 tackles for a loss are tied for the 11th-most in Division II this season.

## PITTMAN HAS TALLIED 21 CAREER PASS BREAKUPS:

Against Mines on Nov. 9, senior defensive back **Eli Pittman** recorded a pass breakup to push his career total to 21, which is ninth on the school's all-time chart. He is one of 12 players in school history to record 20 or more career pass breakups. The school's all-time record for pass break-ups is 42 set by **Darius Williams** from 2015-18.

## NUSCHY, BONE CONTINUE TO CLIMB CAREER TACKLE CHARTS:

Coming into Saturday's game NCAA playoff game with Minnesota State, Nuschy and senior defensive back **Daniel Bone III** have continued their

climb up the school's career tackles chart as those two players have recorded 232 and 230 career tackles respectively. Those two players are now the 18th and 19th players in school history to record 200 career tackles. On the season, Bone is tied for the team lead in tackles with 73, while Nuschy is third with 70 tackles. Bone is averaging 7.3 tackles per game, which is tied for fourth-best in the RMAC, while Nuschy is averaging 6.4 tackles per game, which is 10th-best in the league.

## SEIDENBERGER TIED FOR TEAM LEAD IN TACKLES:

Coming into action this weekend against Minnesota State, sophomore linebacker **Gary Seidenberger** is currently tied for the team lead in tackles with 73, including recording 31 solo stops. Along with the 73 total tackles, Seidenberger has recorded 6.5 tackles for a loss, two sacks, two pass breakups, one interception and one fumble recovery. He ended the regular season by recording double-digit tackles in three of his last four games as he tallied 13 tackles against both Black Hills State and Western Colorado and then had 11 tackles, along with 2.5 tackles for a loss and two sacks against Mines and posted eight tackles and a tackle for a loss at Chadron State. In 10 games this season, Seidenberger is averaging 7.3 tackles per game is currently tied for fourth-best in the RMAC.

## PACK DEFENSE HAS STRONG GAME IN SEASON OPENER:

While the Pack offense gained 604 yards of offense and scored 35 points in the season opener at South Dakota Mines, the Pack defense also turned in a strong game as they held the Hardrockers to just two field goals and limited them to just 214 yards on 75 offensive plays. In the game, the Pack held South Dakota Mines to 50 rushing yards on 28 carries and allowed just 164 yards passing. The Hardrockers averaged just 2.9 yards per game against the Pack defense. The Pack defense has now held five of its last eight opponents to 10 or fewer points. The six points was also the fewest points allowed by the Pack in a season opener since allowing West Texas A&M to score just six points in the 2014 opener.

## PACK STRONG ON THIRD DOWN DEFENSE THIS SEASON:

One of the biggest reasons for the Pack's success on defense through the first 11 games this season has been their performance on third down. On the season, the Pack defense has limited their 11 opponents to a 59-for-184

effort (32.1 percent) on third down as the Pack held South Dakota Mines held to a 4-for-21 effort (19 percent) on third down, limited UTPB to a 5-for-18 (27.8 percent) effort on third down, GVSU was 7-for-16 (43.8 percent) on third down, Colorado Mesa was 3-for-14 (21.4 percent) on third down, Adams State was 4-for-20 (20 percent) on third down, New Mexico Highlands was 4-for-12 (48 percent) on third down, Fort Lewis was 7-for-17 (41.1 percent) on third down, Black Hills State was 14-for-23 (60.9 percent) on third down and Western Colorado was 6-for-16 (37.5 percent) on third down, Mines was a paltry 4-for-16 (25 percent) on third down and Chadron State went 1-for-12 (8.3 percent) on third down. The 32.1 percent third-down defense percentage is fifth-best in the RMAC and 32nd nationally in Division II. Since the beginning of last season, the Pack's opponents are converting just 32.6 percent of its third downs (111-for-340) as they finished last season 52-for-156 (33.3 percent) on third down and is 59-for-184 (32.1 percent) this season.

**FOURTH DOWN HAS BEEN KIND TO PACK THIS SEASON:** The Pack come into Saturday's game with Minnesota State as one of the top teams in the RMAC at converting on fourth down as the Pack are 7-for-13 (53.8 percent) on fourth down conversions this season, which is third-best in the RMAC. In the win over Colorado Mesa, the Pack was 4-for-4 on fourth down and were 2-for-2 on fourth down in the season opener against South Dakota Mines and 1-for-2 on fourth down against Mines. The Pack was 0-for-1 on fourth down against UT-Permian Basin, Grand Valley State, Adams State, New Mexico Highlands and Western Colorado and did not have a fourth down conversion attempts against Fort Lewis, Black Hills State and Chadron State.

**PACK AMONG NCAA DIVISION II LEADERS IN PASSING, SCORING, FIRST DOWNS AND TOTAL OFFENSE:** Entering Saturday's NCAA playoff game with Minnesota State, the Pack offense is among the national leaders in passing offense, first downs, total offense, and scoring offense. Through 11 games this season, the high-octane Pack offense is fifth nationally in passing offense as they are averaging 311.7 passing yards per game, seventh in total offense as they are averaging 472 yards per game and are eighth in scoring offense as they are averaging 41.7 points per game and are 21st in offensive first downs as they have recorded 242 on the season. The Pack has scored 21 or more points in each of its 11 games on the season, including scoring 35 or more points in seven of its 11 games and has gained over 400 yards of offense in six of its 11 games, including three games with 600 or more yards of total offense.

**SPECIAL TEAMS HAS BIG GAME AGAINST COLORADO MESA:** In the Pack's home win over Colorado Mesa on Sept. 21, the Pack special teams played a big role in the 38-14 victory as the Pack scored a touchdown on a blocked punt and also gained a first down on a fake punt play that set up the Pack's third touchdown of the first quarter. The Pack's second touchdown of the game against the Mavs came on a 23-yard punt block return by redshirt freshman defensive back **Matteus Bugg**. The punt that Bugg returned for a score was blocked by redshirt freshman linebacker **Shallum Peter**. The blocked punt for a touchdown was the first for the Pack since **Kyle Rosenbrock** returned a blocked punt for a score against Adams State in 2017. In addition to the blocked punt return for a touchdown, senior linebacker **Noa Purcell** picked up 16 yards on a fake punt attempt on a fourth-and-8 play to give the Pack a first down at the Mesa 36-yard line. Four plays later, Russell scored the Pack's third touchdown of the game to take a 21-0 lead with

**REGAN BAKER DRILLS 74 YARD PUNT AGAINST UTPB:** Junior punter **Regan Baker**, who is a transfer from Idaho State, recorded a 74-yard punt in the Pack's home opener against UTPB and that 74-yard punt is tied for the 17th longest punt in Division II football this season. Baker, who is a native of Australia and a transfer from Idaho State, is one of 43 Division II punters this season with a punt of 70 or more yards. On the season, Baker has punted 44 times for 1,742 yards and is averaging 39.6

yards per punt and has had four 50-plus yard punts and has placed 14 punts inside the 20-yard line. He enters this weekend's action eighth in the RMAC in punting.

**STRONG PUNT RETURN DEFENSE FOR PACK THIS SEASON:** While Baker is averaging 39.6 yards per punt and has put 14 of his 44 punts inside the 20-yard line, the Pack has allowed only 11 punt returns for 24 yards on the season and their opponents are averaging just 2.2 yards per punt return, which is tops in the RMAC and sixth nationally in Division II (**see chart to the right**). The Pack is one of 13 Division II teams that is allowing less than three yards per punt return on the season.

**57 STRAIGHT WINS WHEN HOLDING OPPONENTS TO 10 POINTS OR LESS:** Since the restart of the Pack football program in 2008, the Pack have posted a 57-0 record when allowing 10 points or less to an opponent. Additionally, the Pack are 119-9-3 all-time when allowing 10 or less points since becoming a four year school in 1963. Last season, the Pack went 6-0 when holding an opponent to 10 points or less and is 2-0 this season when holding an opponent to 10 or fewer points.

**SCORING STREAK REACHES 190 STRAIGHT GAMES:** Coming into Saturday's NCAA playoff game with Minnesota State, the Pack have scored in 190 straight games since being shut out (32-0) in its third game of 2008 season against Chadron State. The shutout was just the 11th in the program's history and the only time being shutout since restarting the football program in 2008. In addition, the Pack have scored at least one point in 96 straight home games, including tallying 210 points in its six home games last season, since that home shutout by Chadron State in 2008. This season, the Pack have

scored a total of 218 points at home and are averaging 36.3 points per home game and is averaging a league-leading 41.7 points per game.

**SINGLE DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED BY PLAYERS VOTE AGAIN THIS SEASON:** For the second straight season, the Pack players voted to award single digit numbers to the most deserving players and leaders in the program. **NINE PACK PLAYERS PLAYING 2024 SEASON AS COLLEGE GRADUATES:** Nine Pack football players are playing this season as college graduates, including five of those players earning their degrees from CSU Pueblo and four players who joined the Pack program as graduate transfers. The nine Pack players that have already earned their degree this season are **Andrew Cook, Steven Croell, Dominick Fini, Roman Fuller, Isaiah Hereford, Gaige Hill, Devin Larsen, Eli Pittman** and **Thomas Webb, Jr.**

**53 INTERCEPTION RETURN FOR TOUCHDOWNS SINCE 2008:** Since 2008, the Pack have totaled 53 interception returns for a touchdown, including junior defensive back Keith Mckaney returning an interception 48 yards for a touchdown in this season's home opener against UT Permian Basin. The most interceptions for a touchdown in a season is eight, which occurred in 2019. The ThunderWolves have had five interceptions returned for a score in a season in 2010, 2014 and 2017. The Pack have recorded 17 interception returns for a touchdown since the beginning of the 2019 season.

**19 ALL-RMAC PERFORMERS RETURN FOR 2024:** The Pack had 24 selections to one of the three All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams last season and 19 of those honorees are returning for the 2024 season, including a returning two-time All-American selection. The returning All-America honor is senior defensive back **Daniel Bone III**, who was tied for the team lead in tackles with 84 and added 8.0 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, two interceptions and three fumble recoveries. Bone is also one of two returning First-Team All-RMAC selections from last season as sophomore running back/return specialist **Moosah Alsaffar** also returns after returning two of his three kickoffs for touchdowns and averaged 76.0 yards per kickoff return, while the Pack also welcomes back both the RMAC Offensive (offensive lineman **Senon Chapple**) and Defensive Freshmen of the Year (linebacker **Gary Seidenberger**) last last season. The other returning All-RMAC players are senior offensive lineman **Arthur Braach**, senior receiver/return specialist **Andrew Cook**, redshirt junior tight end **Tyler Dvorak**, fifth-year senior defensive lineman **Dominick Fini**, senior running back **Kiahn Martinez**, redshirt junior defensive back **Keith Mckaney**, redshirt senior linebacker **Jon Nuschy**, senior defensive back **Eli Pittman**, redshirt junior offensive lineman **Domingo Prince II**, redshirt junior receiver **Zack Rakowsky**, redshirt senior defensive lineman **Cody Ramming**, senior receiver **Reggie Retzlaff**, senior running back **Howard Russell IV**, senior defensive lineman **Makeah Scippio** and senior defensive lineman **James Turrentine**.

**21 STARTERS RETURN FOR PACK:** Second-year Pack head coach **Philip Vigil** welcomes back a total of 21 returning starters from last season's 8-3 squad that finished

the year winning its final seven games. The Pack returns eight starters on offense, nine starters on defense and four on special teams. The starters lost on offense were quarterback **Chance Fuller** and offensive linemen **Cade Chapman** and **Tristan Rael**, while on defense the starters lost were defensive backs **Donyai Dixon** and **Cory McLellan**. The lone starter not back on special teams is punter **Sullivan Moon**.

**STRONG SCHEDULE FOR PACK IN 2024:** Once again, the Pack will play one of the toughest schedules in Division II football this season as their 11 opponents combined for a record of 72-57 during the 2023 season, including both of the Pack's non-conference foes UT-Permian Basin (10-2) and Grand Valley State (11-2) each advancing to the NCAA Playoffs in 2023 and posting a 21-4 overall record. Overall, the Pack will play for NCAA Playoff teams from last season as RMAC foes Colorado School of Mines and Western Colorado also advanced to the playoffs. Last season, the Pack's three losses (Grand Valley State, Western Colorado and Colorado School of Mines) came against NCAA Playoff teams that finished with a 35-5 overall record.

**THREE STRAIGHT 11-0 REGULAR SEASON SEASONS IN 2011, 2012 AND 2013:** From 2011-13, the Pack posted three consecutive 11-0 undefeated regular season records and is one of just two teams in NCAA Division II history to accomplish the feat. In fact, the Pack won a total of 58 games and went 58-5 from 2011-15, including winning a school record 14 games in 2014 en route to claiming the 2014 Division II National Championship. During that stretch, the Pack won 42 straight regular season games from 2011 through the first five games of the 2014 season, which was the second-longest streak in Division II history behind only Grand Valley State, who posted 48 straight wins from 2004-09. That 42 game winning streak ended with a 23-22 road loss to Fort Lewis on Oct. 11, 2014.

**10 NCAA PLAYOFF APPEARANCES SINCE 2011:** Since 2011, Pack Football has made 10 trips to the NCAA Division II Playoffs, including advancing to the playoffs for the second time in the last three seasons. The Pack has posted a 9-8 all-time in the playoffs, including capturing the 2014 Division II National Championship. The Pack have qualified for the playoffs in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 (which were later vacated due to an NCAA violation), 2017, 2018, 2019, 2022 and 2023. The only seasons that the Pack haven't made the playoffs since restarting football in 2008 were 2008, 2009, 2010, 2016 and 2021.

**61ST SEASON OF INTERCOLLEGIATE FOOTBALL IN 2024:** CSU Pueblo is celebrating its 61st season of intercollegiate football in 2024 as the school began football as a junior college program in 1938 with **Dale Rea** as the coach. The first Pueblo Junior College team went 1-3-2 and would on to post an 81-92-11 overall record as a two-year program. The first four year season in football came in 1963 as Southern Colorado State, who was coached by **Joe C. Prater**, went 3-5-0. From 1963 to 1984, the program posted a 114-99-4 overall record and a 50-49-1 record in conference play.

**RETZLAFF HAS SEASON FOR RECORD BOOKS IN 2023:** **Reggie Retzlaff** has a season for the record books in 2023 as the senior receiver caught a school record-tying 12 touchdown receptions. The 12 touchdown receptions tied the mark set in 2022 by redshirt senior receiver **Andrew Cook**. The prior record before Cook set the new mark in 2022 was 11, which was held by three players (Paul Browning, John Trahan and Casey Tolle). On the season, Retzlaff caught 48 passes for a team-high 805 yards and averaged a team-best 16.8 yards per reception and 73.2 receiving yards per game. He had three games with 100 or more receiving yards and caught at least two touchdown passes in four games, including three touchdown receptions on three catches at Fort Lewis. The 12 touchdown passes were tied most in the RMAC and eighth nationally in Division II.

**STRONG OFFENSE IN 2023:** The Pack offense was strong during the 2023 season as the Pack ranked in the Top 25 in NCAA Division II in scoring - (9th, 42.0 points per game), passing offense (7th, 289.7 passing yards per game), total offense (16th, 446.3 yards per game), red zone offense (15th, 87.8 percent) and completion percentage (17th,

64.4 percent). In addition, the Pack was also in the Top 5 in the RMAC in scoring offense, passing offense, total offense and was third in first downs (22.1 per game) and third down conversions (43.9 percent).

**DEFENSE STRONG AS WELL IN 2023:** While the Pack offense was strong in 2023, so too, was the Pack defense under first-year defensive coordinator **Caid Faske**. The Pack defense ranked in the Top 5 in the RMAC in passing defense (3rd, 189.1 yards per game), scoring defense (4th, 23.8 points per game), total defense (4th, 330.7 yards per game), rushing defense (5th, 141.6 yards per game) and led the league in sacks (3.27 sacks per game), was second in turnover margin (+12) and was third in both total interceptions (13) and red zone defense (77.8 percent).

**PACK WINS 2023 DIVISION II STATISTICAL TITLE FOR KICKOFF RETURN YARDAGE:** The Pack took home an NCAA Division II national statistical championship during the 2023 season as they led Division II football in kickoff return yardage per game. During the 2023 season, the Pack returned 20 kickoffs for 599 yards and averaged a Division II-best 30.0 yards per return. The Pack also returned three kickoffs for touchdowns, which was tied for tops in Division II with Northwood (Mich.). The three kickoff return touchdowns was also a single-season record.

**ALSAFFAR TIED FOR D-II LEAD IN KICKOFF RETURN TOUCHDOWNS:** Despite only returning three kickoffs during the 2023 season, redshirt freshman **Moosah Alsaffar** made quite an impression as he returned two of those three kickoffs for a touchdown, which tied for the most in Division II and tying a single-season school record. On the season, Alsaffar returned three kickoffs for 228 yards and averaged 76.0 yards per return as he returned a 96 yard kickoff for a touchdown against Colorado Mesa and added a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Black Hills State. The 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown was one of 10 recorded during the 2023 season.

**BONE HAS NOSE FOR FOOTBALL:** Two-time All-American defensive back **Daniel Bone III** continues to have a nose for the football as he is now seven games into his senior campaign having collected eight interceptions in his Pack career and is just two interceptions shy of becoming the 12th player in school history to record 10 career interceptions. Last season, Bone recorded two interceptions and also tied for the team lead in tackles with 84. As a team, the Pack recorded 13 interceptions, which was third-best in the RMAC.

**CROELL HAS RECORD SETTING PERFORMANCE IN 2022 SEASON OPENER AT MIDWESTERN STATE:** Senior **Steven Croell** had his best game of his collegiate career in the 2022 season opener at Midwestern State. Against the Mustangs, Croell was 24-for-38 passing for a then single-game school record 396 yards and he had a career-high five touchdowns and one interception. The five touchdown passes were the most in a game since **Rex Dausin** tossed a school record six touchdown passes at Black Hills State in 2016. Along with passing for 396 yards, Croell also gained 29 yards rushing for a single-game school record 425 yards of total offense. Croell played in seven games and made six starts at quarterback during the 2022 season. On the season, Croell was 75-for-124 passing for 849 yards and had seven touchdowns and three interceptions. He recorded an efficiency of 131.8 on the year and completed nearly 61 percent of his passes. Croell enters this season as one of three quarterbacks that competed for the starting quarterback job. The other competitors in preseason camp for the No. 1 quarterback were Western New Mexico transfer **Devin Larsen** and University of Tulsa transfer **Roman Fuller**, who is the cousin of last year's starting quarterback and current Pack quarterbacks coach **Chance Fuller**.

**PACK STRONG AT TAKING CARE OF FOOTBALL IN 2023:** Another strength for the Pack in 2023 was their ability to take care of the football as they were second led the RMAC and were 16th in Division II in turnovers lost with 12. On the season, the Pack had eight interceptions and lost four fumbles. In addition, the Pack was second in league and

13th nationally in turnover margin (+12) as they collected 13 interceptions and forced 11 fumbles. The Pack won the turnover battle in seven of its 11 games last season, including a +5 margin in the season opener against Midwestern State. In that game, the Pack threw had one turnover (an interception) and the defense forced six turnovers (two interceptions and four fumbles).

**DEFENSE CONTINUES TO BE STRENGTH FOR PACK:** Since restarting the football program in 2008, Pack has made playing defense a staple of its program. Since 2011, the Pack have had one of the most stingiest and unforgiving defense in all of Division II as they have finished in the Top 20 nationally in scoring defense almost every season. The Pack led the country in 2011 and 2014. Additionally, the Pack has also ranked in the Top 25 in turnover ratio (or turnovers gained) in all but one season, including ranking 23rd in 2023 as they gained 24 turnovers. The Pack led the country in that category in both 2014 and 2018. In 2023, the Pack allowed 23.8 points per game, which was fourth-best in the RMAC and were fourth in the RMAC in total defense as they allowed 330.7 yards per game.

**PACK STRONG IN RED ZONE IN 2023:** The Pack offense was once again strong in the red zone last season as they converted on 36 of its 41 (87.8 percent) red zone scoring chances, which was third-best in the RMAC and 15th nationally in Division II. The Pack scored 32 touchdowns and made four field goals in the red zone last season. Since the beginning of the 2022 season, the Pack are 78-for-87 (89.6 percent) in the red zone as they finished the 2022 season 42-for-46 (91.3 percent) in the red zone and were 36-for-41 (87.8 percent) last season.

**21 STARTERS, 65 LETTERMEN RETURNING:** The Pack welcomes back 21 starters (8 on offense, 9 on defense and 4 on special teams) and 65 lettermen from last season's squad that posted an 8-3 overall record and was third in the RMAC with a 7-2 record.

**265 WINS AND COUNTING:** CSU Pueblo enters Saturday's playoff game with Minnesota State having won 265 football games since becoming a four-year school in 1963 as they are sporting a 265-140-4 overall record. The Pack played its first-ever game as a four-year school against Emporia State on Sept. 14, 1963 and did not field a team from 1985-2007. Since reinstating football in 2008, the Pack has posted a 151-41 overall record, including a 123-24 record in RMAC play.

**ADAMS STATE GAME IN 2023 WAS PROGRAM'S 250TH ALL-TIME FOOTBALL WIN:** The Pack's Homecoming game last season on Oct. 7 with Adams State marked the 250th all-time victory as a four-year school in football for CSU Pueblo. In that game against Adams State, the Pack defeated the Grizzlies, 43-10, to secure the program's 250th all-time victory in football since 1963. The program's first-ever win as a four year school came on Sept. 29, 1963 as the Pack collected a 26-7 win at St. Mary's of the Plains. The Pack have now won 265 all-time games following its 38-21 win in its regular season finale two weeks ago at Chadron State.

**409 GAMES AND COUNTING:** Saturday's game with Minnesota State will be the 410th all-time game for CSU Pueblo since becoming a four year school in 1963. In addition, the Pack has played 192 games since restarting football in 2008 and have posted a 151-41 (.786 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2008 season.

**21 POINTS IS MAGIC NUMBER:** CSU Pueblo sports a 152-14 record (.916 winning percentage) when scoring at least 21 points in a game since the beginning of the 2008 season, including going 8-1 last season when scoring 21 or more points with the lone setback coming in the second game of the season at Grand Valley State as the Pack fell 57-49 in double overtime to the Lakers. The Pack have scored 21 or more points in 29 of its last 34 games, including tallying 21 or more points in each of its 11 games thus far this season. The Pack are 10-1 this season when scoring 21 or more points in a game.

## SEVEN OR MORE WINS 14 TIMES IN LAST 16 SEASONS:

CSU Pueblo comes into Saturday's 12th game of the 2024 season having already won 10 games this season. The Pack has now won at least seven games in a season 14 times in the last 16 seasons. The Pack had a streak of five straight double-digit win seasons from 2011-15 before winning eight games during the 2016 season. The Pack have won 10 games in a season for the eighth time since the football program was rebooted in 2008 and the first time since winning 11 games in 2019.

## CAMERON MCDONDLE BECOMES 18TH FOOTBALL PLAYER TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME:

On Friday, Oct. 4, former Pack football running back **Cameron McDondle** became the 18th Pack football player to be inducted into the CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Fame as he joined the Class of 2024. McDondle, who played for the Pack from 2012-15, was a four-year letterman for Coach **John Wristen**. At the end of his collegiate career, McDondle compiled 5,951 rushing yards to become the school's all-time rushing leader. The 5,951 career rushing yards is second-most in RMAC history and 15th all-time in NCAA Division II. In his career, he averaged 126.6 rushing yards per game and scored a school record 56 rushing touchdowns and averaged 6.6 yards per carry as he totaled 897 career carries for the ThunderWolves and rushed for more than 100 yards in 31 career games, which included 10 straight 100-plus rushing games as a senior in 2015 and gained 100 or more rushing yards in 23 of his last 25 career games. Finished third in the Harlon Hill Trophy voting as a senior. Earned First-Team AP Little All-America honors and was also an All-American selection by D2Football.com, D2CCA and *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* and was a two-time First-Team All-RMAC selection as a junior and senior and was the 2015 RMAC Offensive Player of the Year.

## 1982 NAIA PLAYOFF TEAM BECOMES SECOND FOOTBALL TEAM TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME:

While McDondle was the 18th Pack football player to be inducted into the CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Fame, the 1982 football team became the second football team to be inducted into the Hall of Fame as they joined the 2014 NCAA Division II National Championship team on Friday, Oct. 4. The 1982 football team was coached by Class of 2023 Hall of Fame inductee **Mike Friedman** and posted a 9-1 regular season record and made the program's first-ever postseason appearance with a trip to the NAIA Playoffs, where the Pack lost to eventual national champion Central State of Oklahoma. The nine wins matched a program high at the time. The team was ranked as high as fifth nationally during the season as the only other setback in 1982 was a 14-13 loss at Colorado Mesa. The team, who was led by longtime former CSU Pueblo football coach **John Wristen** at quarterback, led the RMAC in total offense and passing as Wristen completed 68-of-121 passes for 1,358 yards and had 13 touchdowns and just two interceptions. **John Trahan** was the league's top receiver with 41 catches for 917 yards and 10 touchdowns, while **Herman Heard** and **Jeff Patterson** combined to rush for 1,472 yards and scored 19 touchdowns and linebacker and CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Famer **Dan DeRose** was the top tackler with 12.5 stops per game. Trahan was named a Second-Team NAIA All-American and was joined on the All-RMAC First Team by Wristen, offensive lineman **Jeff England**, defensive lineman **Craig Ward** and linebacker **Mark DeRose**.

## NUSCHY NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY:

**Jon Nuschy** has been named as one of 18 semifinalists from NCAA Division II for the 2024 William V Campbell Trophy, which is college football's premier scholar-athlete award. The nominee must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of playing eligi-

lity and have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, having outstanding football playing ability and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The 12-14 finalists for the 2024 award will be announced on Oct. 23 by the National Football Foundation.

**PACK NFL PROS:** Entering the 2024 season, CSU Pueblo has two former players listed on active NFL rosters. **Morgan Fox**, who played for the Pack from 2012-15, is entering his third season with the Los Angeles Chargers and had a career-high recording a career-high 38 tackles and 6.5 sacks during the 2022 season. Fox was began his NFL career as an undrafted free agent in 2016 with Los Angeles Rams and played for them from 2016-20, before playing the 2021 season with the Carolina Panthers. A second Pack player, **Mike Pennel**, who played at CSU Pueblo in 2013, is a member of the Kansas City Chiefs after being signed as practice player in late October 2023 and played three regular season games and all four postseason games in 2023 for the Super Bowl Champions. In 2023, Pennel recorded 23 tackles (10 solo stops) and added a tackle for a loss, two quarterback hits and a pass defended. Pennel has played 10 seasons in the NFL with six different franchises. He was also a member of

Kansas City's 2020 Super Bowl Championship team and has two Super Bowl rings in his career. Two other former Pack players have recently spent time in NFL camps as **Trey Botts**, who played for the Pack from 2017-22, lasted until final cuts with the Baltimore Ravens after being signed by the team as an undrafted free agent in 2023. Botts was also selected in the eighth round by Philadelphia in the 2023 USFL Draft and signed to played in the CFL with the Toronto Argonauts, while **Nick Williams**, who played with the Pack from 2018-21 and completed his collegiate career in 2022 at UNLV, was signed as an undrafted free agent with the Denver Broncos and was in 2023 preseason camp with the Broncos until being released at end of training camp.

**PACK ALSO HAS SEVERAL FORMER PLAYERS PLAYING IN CANADA:** Along with currently having two active NFL players, the Pack also have two former players listed on active rosters in the Canadian Football League. Among the former Pack players listed on CFL rosters are **Darius Williams**, who is in his third season playing linebacker for the Calgary Stampeders and **Dean Faithfull**, who is in his second season as a kicker with the Edmonton Elks. Faithfull, who played at CSU Pueblo in 2021, was a first round draft pick (2nd overall) in the 2023 CFL Global Draft, while Williams, who played defensive back with the Pack from 2015-18, was signed as a free agent with Calgary in 2021.

## Colorado State University Pueblo Head Football Coach Philip Vigil



**Philip Vigil** is 11 games into his second season as the head coach of the Colorado State University Pueblo football program in 2024. Vigil was named just the fifth football

coach and the second since the program was restarted in 2008 in the history of the ThunderWolves' program in December 2022.

Vigil's appointment as the Pack's new football coach came following the retirement of longtime CSU Pueblo head coach **John Wristen**, who was hired by his alma mater to resurrect the ThunderWolves football program in 2007. Wristen spent 15 seasons (2008-22) as the head coach.

"I'd like to express my gratitude to President (Dr. Timothy) Mottet and Dr. (Paul) Plinske. My family and I are incredibly excited to return to Colorado," Vigil said about returning to his home state as CSU Pueblo's head coach. "I'm thankful for the time we had in Silver City and for the support of our friends and colleagues at Western New Mexico University. Melanie and I are looking forward to joining the Pack and becoming active members of the Pueblo community. Coach Wristen established a great program at CSU Pueblo. I'm honored to be named as the second coach in ThunderWolves' history and I'm eager to get to work."

In his first season with the Pack in 2023, Vigil led the program to an 8-3 overall record and a 7-2 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. His first Pack team ended the season by winning seven straight games. Vigil's team led NCAA Division II in kickoff return average as they averaged 29.95 yards per return.

Meanwhile, the Pack offense

ranked in the Top 10 in NCAA Division II in passing offense (7th, 289.7 yards per game) and scoring offense (9th, 42.0 points per game) and fewest sacks allowed (10th, 0.91 per game), while the Pack defense was ranked 10th nationally in quarterback sacks as they averaged 3.27 per game.

Vigil, who is no stranger to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference as he played at Colorado Mesa from 2005-08 and also coached with the Mavericks from 2012-14 and spent one season coaching at Colorado School of Mines, arrived at CSU Pueblo after spending the last two seasons (2021-22) as the head football coach at Western New Mexico University, which is an NCAA Division II school in the Lone Star Conference that is located in Silver City, New Mexico.

Under Vigil's leadership, the Mustangs recorded the program's first winning season in the LSC since 1993 during the 2022 campaign. During Vigil's tenure, the Mustangs' football program earned 22 All-Conference awards from the LSC, including a program-best 17 selections in 2022. Those 17 selections were the most for the program in its LSC history.

Following a 30-year championship drought, Vigil led the Mustangs to the Chile Bowl Championship in 2022 as Western New Mexico defeated its rival, Eastern New Mexico, 38-24. The win over Eastern New Mexico culminated a 6-5 season in 2022. The six wins were the most for the program since the 2005

Mustangs team posted a 5-5 overall record.

Prior to Vigil's arrival, the Mustangs football program had won a total five football games over a span of four seasons.

Prior to getting his first head football coach position at Western New Mexico, Vigil spent 12 seasons as an assistant football coach at the collegiate level.

Vigil came to Western New Mexico in 2021 after serving as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator for Head Coach Colby Carthel at NCAA Division I Stephen F. Austin in 2019 and 2020.

During his time with the Lumberjacks, Vigil played a pivotal role in Stephen F. Austin in recruiting back-to-back Top 5 recruiting classes and back-to-back No. 1 recruiting class in the Southland Conference.

On the coaching front at Stephen F. Austin, Vigil coached freshman running back Ja'quan Turner to First-Team All-Conference honors in 2020. The 2020 SFA team captured its first winning season in over a decade by posting a 6-4 record. The only four losses that season came against Football Bowl Sub-division (FBS) programs.

Prior to coaching at Stephen F. Austin, Vigil coached four years at (2015-18) as Fort Hays State University in Hays, Kan., as the program's Pass Game Coordinator and Recruiting Coordinator.

During his time at Fort Hays State, the Tigers posted a 36-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason all four years and won back-to-back Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) in 2017 and 2018.

In both 2015 and 2018, under Vigil's leadership, two different Tiger quarterbacks (Treveon Albert in 2015 and Jacob Mezera in 2018) would break school records

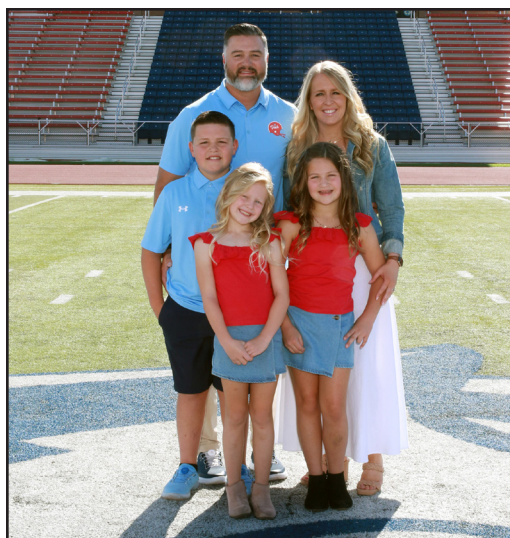
for both total yards and total touchdowns. Those two quarterbacks would also go on to earn both All-Conference and All-American honors.

Before arriving at Fort Hays State in 2014, Vigil was the Associate Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach for three seasons (2012-14) as his alma mater, Colorado Mesa University. During his time coaching at Colorado Mesa, the Mavericks won a total 15 games over three seasons and also won 13 conference games during that same time period.

From 2010-11, Vigil spent two seasons coaching running backs at NCAA Division II powerhouse Northwest Missouri State University. During his tenure with the Bearcats, two of his running backs earned All-Conference and All-American honors.

As a team, the Bearcats posted a 22-5 record over Vigil's two seasons in Maryville, Mo., and he was part of the coaching staff when the Bearcats won 46 consecutive games in MIAA play. In 2010, Northwest Missouri State finished ranked No. 3 in the final AFCA Division II Top 25 poll and advanced to the National Semifinals, while a season later, he helped the Bearcat offense lead Division II in scoring as they averaged 48.6 points per game.

#### DEVIN LARSEN, COLORADO STATE PUEBLO

In his Pack debut as the starting quarterback, Larsen had a record setting night in the Pack's 35-6 season opening win at South Dakota Mines. He completed 66.7 percent of his passes as he was 30-for-45 passing for a single-game school record 508 yards and tossed five touchdown passes and did not throw an interception. The 30 pass completions were also a single game school record. The 508 yard passing game marked the first-ever 400-plus yard passing game in school history and is the eighth-highest total in the state of Colorado history. The 508 yards is also the top passing performance so far in all of NCAA football (FBS, FCS and Division II). His five touchdown passes was one shy of the single game record of six. In addition, he also finished the game with a school record total offensive yardage mark of 495 yards, which bettered the previous mark of 425.

In CSU Pueblo's home opener against No. 21 Texas-Permian Basin, Reggie Retzlaff continued his hot play to open the 2024 season as he caught seven passes for 164 yards and hauled in two touchdown receptions to push his season total to five through two games. Against the Falcons, he averaged 23.4 yards per reception and had touchdown catches of 70 yards on the Pack's fourth offensive play of the game and a 32-yard pass to give the Pack a 13-9 lead with 8:11 left in the first quarter. The 70-yard touchdown reception is the longest offensive play of the season for the Pack and second longest on the team. Retzlaff helped the Pack to a 40-23 win over the Falcons to move to 2-0 on the season and extend its winning streak to nine straight games, which is the second longest active streak in Division II football. On the season, Retzlaff has caught 18 passes for 405 yards and is averaging 22.5 yards per reception and 202.5 receiving yards per game. He also leads the league and is tied for the Division II lead in receiving TDs with five, while his 405 receiving yards are tops in Division II.

In the 10th-ranked Pack's impressive 44-34 win Saturday at No. 8 Western Colorado, Fuller had a career day in his second career start for the Pack. In the win over the Mountaineers, which improved the Pack to 7-0 in the RMAC and extended its RMAC win streak to 14 straight games, Fuller was 34-for-46 passing for 435 yards and had five touchdown passes and tallied 432 yards of total offense. His 34 pass completions were a single-game school record, while his 435 passing yards are the second most in a game in school history and is tied for the 18th most in Division II this season.
