Pack At A Glance

2025 Record --

The 5th-ranked CSU Pueblo ThunderWolves are 10-1 overall and went 9-0 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference for the second consecutive season to clinch its 10th all-time and second straight RMAC title after its 30-27 double-overtime Senior Day win last Saturday against 22nd-ranked Chadron State. The win extended its win streak to nine straight games and its RMAC win streak to 25 consecutive games. The 25 game win streak is the longest active conference win streak in NCAA D-II football.

The Head Coach --

Philip Vigil (Colorado Mesa, '09) is 11 games into his third season as the head coach of the Pack football program and is in his fifth season as a collegiate head coach as he spent two seasons at Western New Mexico. Vigil is 28-6 at CSU Pueblo and is 35-21 all-time as a collegiate head coach.

Falcons At A Glance

2025 Record --

The University of Texas Permian Basin Falcons come into Saturday's first round NCAA Division II playoff game at No. 3 seeded and fifth-ranked CSU Pueblo sporting a 9-2 overall record and tied for second in the Lone Star Conference with a 7-2 record. The Falcons are making its second NCAA Division II Playoff appearance in the last three seasons as they fell 10-3 in the first round at home to Bemidji State in the 2023 playoffs. UTPB ended the regular season winning its final four games by a combined margin of 38 points (52.3 to 14.3).

The Head Coach --

Kris McCullough (Henderson State, '17) is in his third season as UTPB's head coach and is in his fourth season overall as a collegiate head coach as he served as the head coach at East Central (Okla.) in 2022. In his three-plus seasons as a head coach, McCullough is 35-12 overall, including being 26-9 at UTPB. In his first season with the Falcons in 2023, he led the program to a perfect 8-0 record in LSC play for the first time in program history and along the way he was named the LSC Coach of the Year and the College Football Network D2 Coach of the Year.

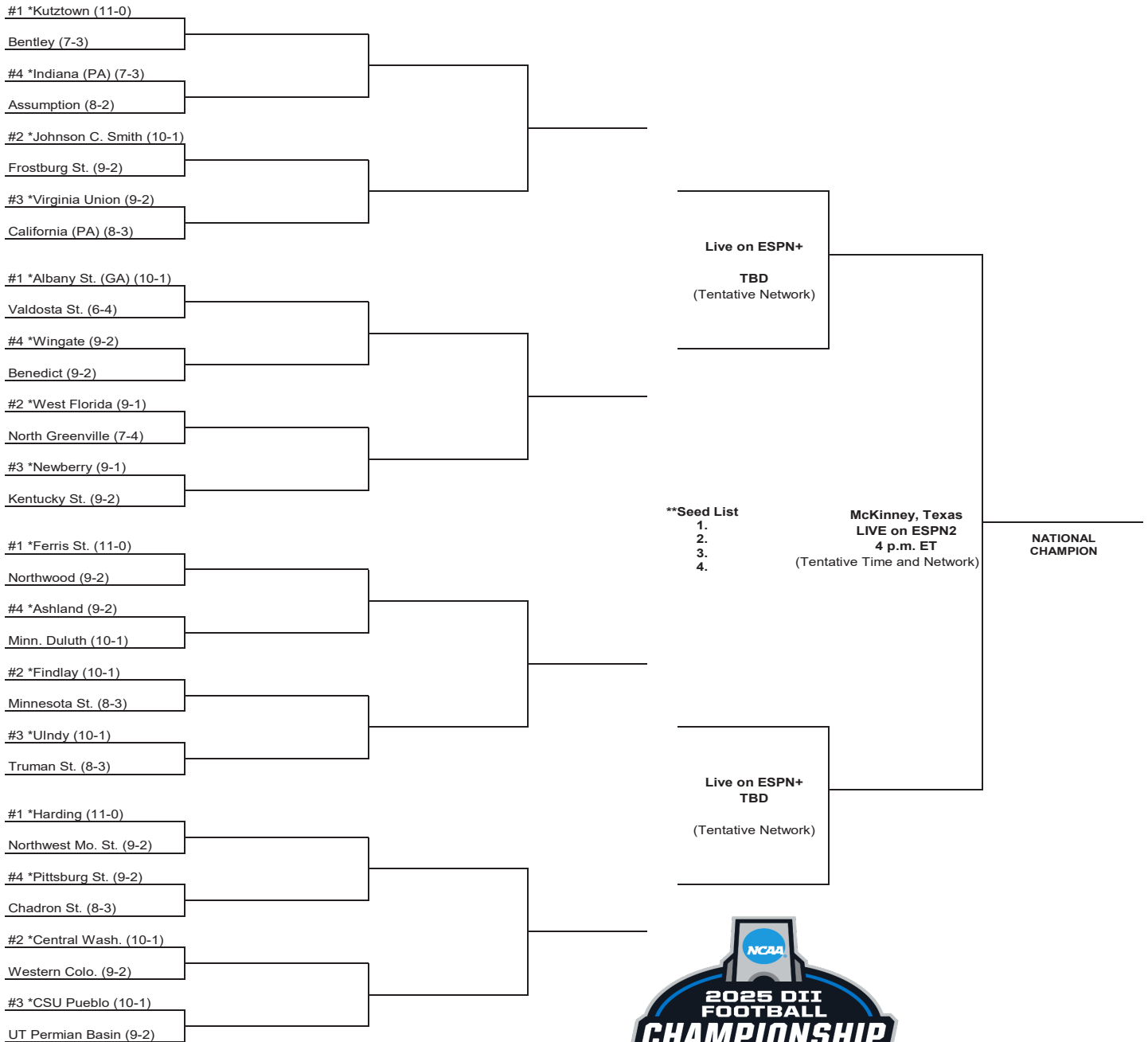

The Series --

Saturday's game with UTPB will mark the second-ever football game between the two programs as the Pack collected a 43-20 win over the Falcons to open the home portion of its 2024 schedule. While Saturday's game will be the second-ever between the two schools, the Pack are no stranger to playing Lone Star Conference schools as the Pack is 16-6 all-time against LSC schools since 2008 and have won three straight games against LSC foes since falling 12-6 at home to Texas A&M-Commerce to open the 2021 season.

Pack's NCAA Playoff Record --

Saturday's game marks the 19th all-time NCAA Playoff game for the Pack as they have posted a 9-9 all-time record in the playoffs, including capturing the 2014 National Championship with a 13-0 win over Minnesota State. The Pack is a No. 3 seed this season for the first time in their 10th all-time NCAA Playoff appearance.

CSU Pueblo -- Last Time Out vs. #22 Chadron State (11/15/25)...

** - The Pack earned its second straight RMAC title this past Saturday following a 30-27 double overtime Senior Day victory over 22nd-ranked Chadron State in the ThunderBowl. The victory extended the Pack's overall win streak to nine straight and its RMAC win streak to 25 straight games and improved their record to 10-1 overall and finished undefeated in RMAC play at 9-0 for the second consecutive season.

** - The win was capped in double overtime on a 19-yard walk-off touchdown pass from **Roman Fuller** to **Marcellus Honeycutt, Jr.**

** - That touchdown capped off a record setting performance for Fuller, who was one of the Pack's 23 seniors honored prior to the game. In the game, Fuller set new single-game school records for pass attempts (66) and completions (40) while throwing for a career-high 442 yards and three touchdown passes.

** - Two senior receivers - **Reggie Retzlaff** and **Zach Rawkowsky** - were Fuller's top targets in the passing game against the Eagles as Retzlaff caught a school record 14 passes for 166 yards and had two touchdown receptions, while Rawkowsky added 11 catches for 118 yards in the win.

** - For the third straight game, the Pack trailed at the half (14-10), but retook the lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by **Kiahn Martinez** late in the third quarter to give the Pack a 17-14 lead.

** - In the fourth quarter, CSC tied the game on a field goal by Wilson Yee and the Pack drove into scoring position in the last minute of the regulation, but Fuller threw an interception to force overtime.

** - For the game, the Pack gained a school record 38 first downs and ran a school record 109 plays on offense and gained 541 total yards as along with passing for 442 yards, the Pack gained 99 yards on the ground with 73 of those rushing yards coming from Martinez. Chadron State entered the game leading the RMAC in both total defense and passing defense.

** - The Pack lost the turnover battle for the second straight game (2-1) with the Eagles' lone turnover being the Pack-leading fifth interception of the season by Peyton Shaw.

** - The Pack defense had another strong performance as they allowed just 242 yards of offense to the Eagles (143 rushing, 99 passing) as **Gary Seidenberger** paced the defense with a team-high nine tackles.

CSU PUEBLO-UT-PERMIAN BASIN NOTES

** - The Pack will face UT Permian Basin for the second-ever time on the gridiron this Saturday and the first time they will face each other in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

** - UTPB is making its second-ever trip to the NCAA Playoffs and its first appearance since the 2023 season when they fell 10-3 to Bemidji State in a first road game in Odessa, Texas.

** - The Falcons won four straight games to close out the regular season, including posting a 74-10 win over Sul Ross State to complete the regular season.

** - UTPB and CSU Pueblo each played a common opponent this season - Adams State. The Falcons earned a 41-7 road win over the Grizzlies on Sept 6, while the Pack earned a 55-7 win in the ThunderBowl on Sept. 27.

** - UTPB opened the season winning its first five games, including upsetting Central Oklahoma, 34-14, in the season opener, before suffering back-to-back losses to Central Washington (27-14) and Western Oregon (31-28).

** - On the season, UTPB is one of the top offensive teams in Division II as they rank in the Top 10 in scoring (39.5), total offense (469.4) and passing offense (328.5). Meanwhile, on defense, they are allowing 17.7 points per game and 301.2 yards per game.

PRESEASON NOTES...

PACK TABBED CO-FAVORITES IN RMAC PRESEASON POLL: CSU Pueblo was tabbed as a co-favorite in the 2025 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Preseason Coaches' football poll that was released on July 31. In the preseason poll, the Pack were tied with Western Colorado for first place as they earned 76 points, including each team earning five first place votes, four votes for second and one vote for third. Colorado School of Mines was tabbed third with 66 points, while Colorado Mesa was tabbed fourth with 58 points. Last season, the Pack claimed the program's ninth all-time RMAC title in football as they finished the season with a 9-0 record in league play. The preseason poll was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams.

PACK LEADS WAY WITH NINE PLAYERS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-RMAC TEAM:

Along with releasing the coaches' preseason poll, the league also released its 2025 Preseason All-RMAC Team. The RMAC's preseason teams were determined by placing returning players in order of head coaches' votes from the league's 2024 All-RMAC Teams. The Pack led the way with nine players selected - 3 on offense, 4 on defense and 2 on special teams. The offensive players selected were senior receiver **Reggie Retzlaff**, junior offensive lineman **Tyler Ethridge** and senior offensive lineman **Domingo Prince II**. Meanwhile, on defense, junior linebacker **Gary Seidenberger**, junior safety **Kahden Rullo**, junior cornerback **Donovan English** and senior cornerback **Keith Mckaney** were selected, while on special teams, senior punt returner **Zack Rakowsky** and senior long snapper **Brayden Starmer** were Preseason All-RMAC selections.

HEAD COACH PHILIP VIGIL ENTERS THIRD SEASON IN 2025:

Philip Vigil enters his third season as the Pack's head football coach. In his second season directing the Pack in 2024, Vigil led the program to a 10-2 overall record and a 9-0 mark in the RMAC. The Pack claimed its ninth all-time RMAC title and first outright title in 2013 and also earned the No. 1 seed in NCAA Division II Super Region 4 and hosted a second round home playoff game in the CSU Pueblo ThunderBowl. In 2024, the Pack closed the regular season winning its final eight games and its two losses came to schools that finished the 2024 season with a 22-6 overall record. In Vigil's first season in 2023, the Pack posted an 8-3 overall record and a 7-2 mark in the RMAC. After opening the season by losing three of its first four games (all three losses came to teams that advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs), the Pack closed the 2023 campaign by winning its final seven games. Vigil, who was hired as the Pack's head coach in late December 2022 following the retirement of longtime Pack head coach John Wristen, is entering his fifth season as a collegiate head coach in 2025 and has compiled a 28-21 overall coaching record as he went 7-15 in two seasons (2021-22) at Western New Mexico and enters Saturday's game sporting a 21-6 record at CSU Pueblo. Since the Pack football program became a four-year athletic program in 1963, Vigil is just the fifth head coach in school history and just the second in the program's Division II era.

ASSISTANT COACH CHANGES IN 2025: For the third consecutive season, Vigil has made some changes to his coaching staff for the 2025 season. The new assistant coaches are **Neal Davis**, who will serve as the co-offensive coordinator and work with the Pack offensive line, former Pack All-American receiver **Paul Browning** joins the staff as the receivers coach. In addition, **Trevor Hopkins** will serve as an offensive line assistant, while **Dennis Osagiede** will coach the defensive tackles and former player **Thomas Webb, Jr.**

While there are five new coaches this season, Vigil also made some additional changes to his staff for the 2025 as **Jordan Dodge** will serve as the co-offensive coordinator, along with coaching the tight ends, while linebackers coach **Neema Behbahani** has also added the title of recruiting coordinator and defensive coordinator **Caid Faske** will also coach the defensive ends this season. The other assistants this season are - **Mac Alexander** (Associate Head Coach/Defensive Backs/Special Teams Coordinator), **Blake Moffett** (Running Backs), and **Rashad Harris** (Director of Sports Performance).

RETZLAFF NAMED TO SHRINE BOWL 1000 WATCH LIST: After being named the RMAC Offensive Player of the Year, a Harlon Hill Trophy finalist and a First-Team All-American, **Reggie Retzlaff** was named to the 2025 Shrine Bowl 1000 Watch List that was released on July 28. The 101st annual East-West Shrine Bowl is a best-in-class all-star event that will take place at the Ford Center at The Star in Frisco, Texas, on January 27, 2026. NFL coaches will coach players in an NFL facility and will have access to NFL-level resources, facilities, player-friendly schedules, and opportunities at the highest level. Every year, approximately 1,000 all-star game-eligible players are drafted, signed after the draft, or attend a rookie mini-camp. Our aim is for this Shrine Bowl 1000 to serve as a glimpse into our scouting process, as well as a preview of college players who are currently all-star game eligible for the 2026 East-West Shrine Bowl and the 2026 NFL Draft class. Retzlaff is one of 10 NCAA Division II players and one of three players from the RMAC who have been named to the 2025 Shrine Bowl 1000 Watch List.

its Preseason Elite 100 Watch List and the Pack had four players named to the list that was chosen by the D2Football.com staff with input from Division II coaches and professional scout Josh Buchanan. The four Pack players named to the D2Football.com Elite 100 Watch List were redshirt senior receiver **Reggie Retzlaff**, junior defensive back **Donovan English**, who named to the First-Team Offense and First Defense respectively, while junior offensive lineman **Tyler Ethridge** and junior linebacker **Gary Seidenberger** were named to the Squad Team on offense and defense respectively.

PACK RANKED NO. 5 IN LINDY'S SPORTS PRESEASON DIVISION II TOP 10 POLL:

The Pack is ranked No. 5 in the Lindy's Sports Preseason Division II Top 10 poll that was released in its annual college football yearbook that hit newsstands in late June. The Pack was one of two RMAC schools ranked in the Lindy's Sports Preseason Top 10 Division II poll as Western Colorado opens the 2025 season ranked No. 7 after advancing to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second consecutive season in 2024. In the Lindy's Sports Division II poll, the magazine says about CSU Pueblo in 2025, "Wide receiver Reggie Retzlaff and quarterback Roman Fuller are enough to win a ton of ballgames." Since 2011, the Pack has posted a 131-30-0 overall record and a 108-13 RMAC record. The Pack has won seven league titles and made 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, including capturing the Division II National Championship in 2014.

RMAC GAME TO OPEN 2025 CAMPAIGN FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON:

For the second consecutive season, the Pack will open the 2025 season by playing an RMAC home game against South Dakota Mines on Thursday, Aug. 28 in the CSU Pueblo ThunderBowl. It is the second straight season that the NCAA is allowing Division II football team to play a Week Zero game (Aug. 28-30) on its schedule. The Pack will once again have a bye week before its final stretch of three games against Western Colorado, Mines and Chadron State to close the 2025 regular season.

FIVE HOME GAMES IN 2025:

After playing six home games the past three seasons, the Pack will play just five home games this season in the ThunderBowl, including opening the season with back-to-back Thursday night games against South Dakota Mines (Aug. 28) and Fort Hays State (Sept. 4). In addition to those two home games, the Pack will host Adams State on Sept. 27, welcome Fort Lewis for Homecoming 2025 on Oct. 11 and close out the regular season on Nov. 15 against Chadron State. The five home games this season are the fewest since 2021 when the Pack also played five home games.

NEW SUPER REGIONAL ALIGNMENT IN 2025:

The NCAA realigned its four super regions for Division II in 2025. The RMAC and the LSC remained in Super Region 4, but the NCAA moved the MIAA and the Great American Conference (GAC) into Super Region 4. The Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formerly part of Super Region 4 and now moves to Super Region 3 with the GLIAC, GLVC, and GMAC.

NCAA PLAYOFFS EXPAND TO 32 TEAMS:

In April, the NCAA approved expanding the NCAA Division II football playoff field to 32 teams. Each of the four super regional fields will now have eight teams, which eliminates the No. 1 seed in each super region receiving a bye. A team will have to win five straight games to claim the national title.

year starter (2009-12) for the Pack at offensive tackle and earned All-RMAC honors three times, including first-team honors in 2011 and 2012. Jensen was a two-time All-American and a finalist for the 2012 Gene Upshaw Division II Lineman of the Year Award. Following his Pack career, Jensen was drafted in the sixth round of the 2013 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens and played eight seasons in the NFL with both Baltimore and Tampa Bay. He was the starting center for Tampa Bay's Super Bowl LIV team that had Tom Brady as quarterback. He retired from the NFL after the 2023 season after playing in 100 regular season games, including 90 starts at center. Meanwhile, the 2014 Pack team, which was coached by **John Wristen**, posted a 14-1 overall record and captured its fourth straight RMAC title and won the national title with a 13-0 win over Minnesota State-Mankato in the championship game, which was played in Kansas City, Mo. The Pack is the only RMAC school in Colorado and one of just three in the

state of Colorado to have won a national title in football.

"T" Signal on Kicks: Any waving signal by any player of a return team is considered an invalid signal. The "T" signal given by a returner during any kick will now also be considered an invalid signal and there will be no return.

Team Pre-Snap Movement: Any defensive team player within one yard of the line of scrimmage (stationary or not) may not make quick and abrupt or exaggerated actions that simulate action at the snap and are not part of normal defensive player movement in an obvious attempt to make the offense foul.

Disconcerting Signals: No player shall use words or signals that disconcert opponents when they are preparing to put the ball in play. New for 2025, the terms "move" and "stem" are reserved for defensive cadence and may not be used by the offense. The offense may use a "clap" as a starting signal and this signal may not be used by the defense.

Substitution Fouls by the Defense after the Two-Minute Timeout: The defense may not have more than 11 players on the field when the ball is snapped. The infraction, a substitution foul, is treated as a live-ball foul and is a 5-yard penalty. If this action occurs after the two-minute timeout in either half, and 12 or more defenders are on the field and participate in the down, officials will penalize the defense for the foul and the offense

will have the option to reset the game clock back to the time displayed at the snap. The game clock will then restart on the next snap.

Scrimmage Kick Formation: The definition of a scrimmage kick formation has been modernized to ensure teams cannot take advantage of player safety rules to gain advantages on fakes from the formation. By rule, to qualify as a scrimmage kick formation, there must be a potential kicker 10 or more yards behind the neutral zone (or a potential holder and potential kicker seven or more yards behind the neutral zone in position for a place kick) and it must be obvious that a kick will be attempted. Added for 2025, to qualify as a scrimmage kick formation, no player other than the potential kicker (or holder) may be aligned within the frame of the body of the snapper and no other player may be aligned in the clear path from the snapper to the potential kicker (or holder).

Scrimmage Kick Plays: Currently, if the offense is in a scrimmage kick formation at the snap, any defender within one yard of the line of scrimmage must be aligned completely outside the frame of the body of the snapper and a defensive player may not initiate contact with the snapper until one second has elapsed after the snap. Added for 2025, if

the snapper is on the end of the line and is an eligible receiver, he loses the protections outlined above on a scrimmage kick play.

Optional Equipment – Eye Shields: Eye shields must be clear, not tinted, and made from molded or rigid material. New for 2025, both Oakley and Nike have submitted a nearly clear eye shield that has been approved.

Defenseless Players: A player attempting to recover a loose ball is added to the

list of defenseless players.

Automatic Unsportsmanlike Conduct Fouls: All forms of gun violence are not permitted in college football and simulating the firing of a weapon is an automatic unsportsmanlike foul. Added to the rule in 2025, if a player brandishes a weapon, it is considered an unsportsmanlike act.

PACK TRACKS...

BACK IN THE PLAYOFFS: CSU Pueblo will be making its second consecutive and 11th all-time appearance in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. The Pack is 9-9 all-time in the NCAA Playoffs, but has earned the No. 3 seed for the first time. Last season, the Pack, who was the No. 1 seed in Super Region Four, fell 26-23 in the second round at home to Minnesota State. The Pack's 11 appearances in the NCAA Playoffs are 10th most among this year's field and third-most amongst the Super Region Four field as only Northwest Missouri State (27) and Pittsburg State (22) have more appearances.

SUPER REGION FOUR FIELD: CSU Pueblo (10-1) earned the No. 3 seed from Super Region Four in this year's Division II Playoffs. The No. 1 seeded team from Super Region Four is 2023 National Champion Harding (11-0), while the No. 2 seeded team is Central

WIN STREAK REACHES NINE

GAMES: Thanks to its 30-27 double overtime win last Saturday at home against 22nd-ranked Chadron State, the Pack extended its win streak to nine straight games since suffering its lone loss of the season at home to Fort Hays State (36-35) on Sept. 4. The nine-game winning streak is tied for the fourth-longest active win streak in Division II football and is the longest active win streak among RMAC schools. During its current nine-game winning streak, the Pack offense is averaging 39.8 points and 456.6 yards of offense (2,717 passing, 1,392 rushing) per game. Meanwhile, defensively, the Pack is allowing 19.7 points and 314.0 yards of offense (1,660 passing, 1,166 rushing) per game. The Pack have also recorded 21 sacks and have forced 21 turnovers, including picking off 15 passes and have committed 15 turnovers and allowed 14 sacks over its last nine games. The Pack has scored 40 or more points in five the nine games, including two games of scoring 50 or more points.

RMAC WIN STREAK REACHES 25 STRAIGHT

GAMES: Thanks to its 30-27 double overtime win last time out against Chadron State, the ThunderWolves extended its RMAC win streak to 25 consecutive games dating to the 2023 season. The 25-game conference

win streak is currently the longest active conference win streak in Division II football as Kutztown (Pa.) has won 22 straight conference games. The 25-game conference win streak for the Pack is the second longest in school history as the only longer conference win streak was 33 straight RMAC wins from 2010-14. The Pack's RMAC win streak started with an 85-7 win at Fort Lewis on Sept. 30, 2003.

The Pack's last loss in RMAC play came at home on Sept. 23, 2023, against Mines (55-14). Since that loss, the Pack closed 2023 by winning its final seven conference games and then the Pack has gone 9-0 in league play the past two seasons. league titles from 2011-2014. The 9-0 record marked the second straight season that the Pack went perfect in league play. The Pack also went 9-0 in RMAC play in 2011, 2012, and 2013. The Pack have now won 10 all-time RMAC titles with nine of those titles coming since 2011, which is a span of 14 seasons. The nine RMAC titles since 2008 as the most among the league's 10 schools over that span. Mines is second with seven titles since 2008. In fact since the beginning of the 2008 season, the Pack and Mines have won a combined 16 league championships.

BAKER EARNS RMAC SUMMIT AWARD FOR FOOTBALL: Junior punter **Regan Baker** became the seventh Pack football player to earn the RMAC Summit Award, which is awarded to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative GPA competing at the finals site of their respective sport's championship or whose team won the RMAC regular season title, when the league announced the award on Nov. 20. Baker carries a 4.0 cumulative GPA in Exercise Science at CSU Pueblo. The previous Summit Award winners for the Pack football program were **Joe Rosenbrock** (2013), **Justin LaBorde** (2014), **Corbin Feenstra** (2015), **Corbin Feenstra** (2016), **Preston Guerra** (2018) and **Evan Lyons** (2024).

SENIOR SENDOFFS: The Pack has now posted a 15-2 on Senior Day games in the ThunderBowl since the program was rebooted in 2008. The Pack has won 15 of its last 16 Senior Day games in the ThunderBowl with the lone loss being a 28-12 setback in 2021 to Colorado School of Mines. The Pack has won four straight Senior Day games since that loss to Mines as they won 45-20 in 2022 against South Dakota Mines, 42-37 in 2023 against Black Hills State, 28-13 in 2024 against Mines and 30-27 in double overtime this season. CSU Pueblo's other Senior Day loss came in 2008 as the Pack fell 19-10 to Adams State.

PACK VS. NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS: Saturday's game with UT-Permian Basin will mark the second straight and third game overall this season for the Pack against a nationally-ranked foe. The Pack is 2-0 this season against nationally-ranked teams after picking up wins this season against then sixth-ranked Western Colorado (24-21) and 22nd-ranked Chadron State (30-27 in double overtime). In addition, the Pack has now compiled a 26-22 all-time record against ranked teams following last week's win over Chadron State since the football program rebooted in 2008, including an 18-12 mark in regular season games against nationally-ranked foes. Since picking up a 59-27 win in the 2022 season opener at 24th-ranked Midwestern State, the Pack has lost seven of its last 13 games to nationally-ranked opponents and is 6-12 against ranked opponents since the start of the 2021 season and 11-16 against ranked teams since 2018. In 2023, the Pack were 0-3 against nationally-ranked teams and was 3-1 in 2024 against nationally-ranked teams.

OFFENSE HAS RECORD SETTING DAY IN DOUBLE OVERTIME OVER CHADRON STATE: In last Saturday's 30-27 double overtime win over Chadron State, the Pack offense set several new single game school records and quarterback **Roman Fuller** also set several single-game player records against the Eagles. In the game against Chadron State, the Pack set new single game team records for first downs (38), total plays run (109), third-down conversions (12), passing attempts (66) and passing completions (40). For the game, the Pack offense finished with 541 yards of offense as they averaged 5.0 yards per game. In the game, they rushed 43 times for 99 yards and passed for a season-high 442 yards, which is the second-most passing yards in a game in program history. Fuller's 66 pass attempts and 40 pass completions were also new single game player records. The last time the Pack offense ran over 100 plays in a game was in 1978 when they ran 101 plays against Fort Lewis.

PACK RALLIES FROM HALFTIME DEFICIT FOR THIRD STRAIGHT GAME: For the third straight game this past Saturday, the Pack trailed at halftime, before ultimately rallying to win the game. In the double overtime win last weekend against Chadron State, the Pack trailed 14-10 at the half, before rallying to post a 30-27 win in double overtime. That halftime rally against Chadron State came a week after the Pack posted its largest comeback win in school history with a 41-34 overtime victory at Colorado School of Mines. Against the Orediggers, the Pack trailed 28-6 with 4:07 left in the second quarter before rallying to score 28 of the next 34 points (the Pack held Mines to just six points after halftime) to force overtime on a 32-yard touchdown pass from **Roman Fuller** to **Marcellus Honeycutt, Jr.**, with 54 seconds left in regulation. The Pack's run of comeback wins began with its 24-21 win at Western Colorado to open the month of November. Against the Mountaineers, the Pack trailed the Pack trailed 21-0 just seven minutes into the second quarter, before scoring 24 unanswered points, including holding the Mountaineers scoreless in the second half, to post the 24-21 comeback win which was sealed on a 32-yard walk-off game winning field goal by **Jackson Smith** as time expired. The 21-point comeback is now the second largest comeback win in program history.

FULLER NAMED RMAC OFFENSIVE AND NFF COLORADO CHAPTER PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Following his school record performance last Saturday at home against Chadron State, **Roman Fuller** took home the final RMAC Offensive Player of the Week of the 2025 season on Monday and then followed that up with being named this week's NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week. The RMAC Player of the Week honor is the second of Fuller's career as he was honored after last year's game at Western Colorado and his third NFFCC Player of the Week accolade as he was honored earlier this season after the Fort Hays State game and then was honored after the

Western Colorado game last season. Fuller sweeps this week's Player of the Week accolades after setting CSU Pueblo single-game records and Division II season bests for pass completions and attempts, and threw touchdown passes in both overtime periods as the ThunderWolves outlasted Chadron State, 30-27, in double overtime to earn its second straight RMAC football title. Fuller finished the game completing 40-of-66 passes for 442 yards and three touchdowns. The 66 pass attempts and the 40 pass completions are the most in a game this season by a Division II player, while his 442 yards passing are the eighth most yards in a game by a Division II player this season. The Pack's previous school record for pass attempts was 52 by **Isaac Williams** at New Mexico Highlands in 2021, while the previous school record for pass completions was 34 by **Roman Fuller** at Western Colorado in 2024. In addition, Fuller's 442 yards passing is the second most in a game in school history. Fuller now has two of the top passing yardage games in program history - 442 vs. Chadron State in 2025 and 435 yards at Western Colorado in 2024.

PACK RALLIES FROM 20-PLUS POINT DEFICIT FOR SECOND STRAIGHT GAME TO WIN AT MINES: For the second straight week, the Pack rallied from a 20-plus point deficit in the second quarter en route to earning a 41-34 overtime win two weeks ago at Mines. In the win against Mines, the Pack trailed 28-6 with 4:07 left in the second quarter, before rallying to score 28 of the next 34 points (the Pack held Mines to just six points after halftime) to

force overtime on a 32-yard touchdown pass from Fuller to Honeycutt, Jr., with 54 seconds left in regulation. In the overtime period, **Reggie Retzlaff** caught a 12-yard pass from Fuller to give the Pack a 41-34 lead and on the ensuing possession by Mines, **Peyton Shaw** picked off a pass from Mines quarterback Joseph Capra to seal the 22-point come-from-behind victory. The 22-point win was the largest come-from-behind victory in school history as it bettered the 21-point comeback win the previous week at Western Colorado. In the game, the Pack trailed 21-0 just seven minutes into the second quarter following a 23-yard blocked punt return by WCU's Jevon Young. The Pack would go on to score 24 unanswered points, including holding the Mountaineers scoreless in the second half, to post the 24-21 comeback win which was sealed on a 32-yard field goal by **Jackson Smith** as time expired.

RETZLAFF EARNS RMAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AND NFFCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: The Pack's 41-34 come-from-behind win at Mines was sealed on a 12-yard touchdown in overtime to **Reggie Retzlaff** and that touchdown catch, which was his third of the game, helped the 2024 All-American earn both RMAC Offensive Player and NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week honors. Against Mines, Retzlaff caught eight passes for 82 yards and had three touchdown catches. His three touchdown catches pushed his season total to 13, which helped him set a new single-season school record for touchdown catches, bettering the old record of 12 which he had tied the past two seasons. Against the Orediggers, Retzlaff averaged 10.3 yards per catch and had touchdown catches of 18 yards in the second quarter

to help pull the Pack within 28-13 and then he added a 14-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter to pull the Pack within 34-27 with 9:23 left in the game, before sealing the win with his overtime touchdown reception. The RMAC Offensive Player of Week honor is his first this season and third of his career, while the NFFCC Player of the Week accolade his is first this season and second of his Pack career.

PACK DEFENSE HOLDS MINES TO SIX POINTS, 96 YARDS AFTER HALFTIME:

After allowing 28 points and 266 yards of offense, including 178 rushing yards, the Pack defense regrouped as the half and limited the Mines offense to a total of six points (two field goals) and 96 yards of offense in the second half and overtime. For the game, Mines gained 362 yards of offense as they rushed for 242 yards on 51 carries and averaged 4.7 yards per carry and passed for just 120 yards. In the second half and overtime, Mines rushed for 64 yards and passed for 32 yards. Through 10 games this season, the Pack is second in the RMAC in scoring defense (18.6 ppg), pass defense (196.7 ypg), and rushing defense (12.0 ypg) and is third in total defense as they are allowing 316.9 yards per game. The Pack has allowed just 20 or more points just five times this season and has allowed 350 or more yards in a game four times, including holding four teams to less than 230 yards of offense.

MARTINEZ RUNS FOR SEASON-HIGH 112 YARDS AGAINST MINES, PUSHES HIS CAREER TOTAL TO 1,602 YARDS:

One of the keys to the Pack's comeback win last weekend at Mines as the rushing from senior running back **Kiahn Martinez**. In the win over Mines, Martinez carried the ball 18 times for a season-high 112 yards and averaged 6.2 yards per carry in the win. It marked just the second 100-yard rushing performance of the season as redshirt freshman **Russell Patton** had a career-high 108 yards on the ground against Adams State. Along with it being his first 100-yard rushing games this season, it was also Martinez's second career 100-yard rushing performance as he gained a career-high 125 yards in 2023 at Fort Lewis. In the win over Mines, the Pack rushing attack finished with 161 yards rushing on 32 carries and averaged 5.0 yards per carry and got a rushing touchdown from Patton in the third quarter. With his 112 yard rushing against Mines, Martinez moved up to 15th on the school's all-time rushing chart with 1,602 yards and enters Saturday's NCAA Playoff game with UTPB having gained 1,675 rushing yards. He is now one of 15 running backs in school history to gain 1,600 or more yards and one of 22 players that have rushed for 1,000 or more yards in a career with the ThunderWolves. This season, Martinez has carried the ball a team-high 127 times for a team-leading 539 yards and has scored six touchdowns and is averaging 4.2 yards per carry and

67.4 rushing yards per game. Over his last five games, he has rushed for 349 yards and has scored five touchdowns and is averaging 69.8 yards per game and 4.3 yards per carry. His 17 career rushing touchdowns are tied for 11th on the school's all-time charts.

HONEYCUTT, JR. CONTINUES HIS HOT PLAY AGAINST MINES:

One week after catching three passes for a career-high 144 yards, including hauling in an 88-yard touchdown pass and tallied 164 all-purpose yards in the Pack's 24-21 win at Western Colorado, junior receiver **Marcellus Honeycutt, Jr.**, had another strong performance in the 41-34 overtime win at Mines. In that game against the Orediggers, Honeycutt, Jr., accounted for 148 all-purpose yards as he caught three passes for 73 yards and had a 32-yard touchdown pass that helped the Pack tie the game at 34 to force overtime and he returned two kickoffs for 75 yards, including a Pack season-high 46-yard kickoff return.

The 88-yard touchdown reception against Western Colorado was the longest offensive play of the season for the Pack and the second-longest pass reception this season in the RMAC. He averaged 48.0 yards per reception against the Mountaineers, which also set a new single-game school record. The 88-yard catch is also tied for the 19th longest pass play in the state of Colorado history

and was the longest pass play for the Pack since **Andrew Cook** caught a 90-yard pass from **Steven Croell** against Western Colorado in 2021. On the season, Honeycutt, Jr., comes into this weekend's NCAA Playoff game with UTPB having caught 28 passes for 552 yards and has had six touchdown catches, which is tied for ninth in the RMAC. He is averaging a team-best 19.7 yards per reception and 50.2 receiving yards per game.

SMITH'S WALK-OFF FIELD GOAL SEALS COMEBACK WIN AT WESTERN COLORADO, EARNS THIRD RMAC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR:

The Pack's comeback win three weeks ago at then sixth-ranked Western Colorado was sealed on a walk-off 32-yard field goal by junior kicker **Jackson Smith** as time expired. The Pack, who trailed 21-0 just seven minutes into the second quarter, would eventually tie the game at 21-all on a 1-yard touchdown run by **Kiahn Martinez** with 1:22 left in the third quarter. The drive that led to Smith's game-winning field goal began after Jusiah Sampleton blocked a 47-yard field goal attempt by WCU's Zach Grable with 4:02 left in the game. The Pack took over the ball on its own 27-yard line and drove 58 yards in 10 plays and capped the drive with Smith's walk-off field goal. The big play on the drive was a 20-yard pass completion

from Roman Fuller to Dedrek Taylor-Akins on a 3-and-16 from the WCU 35-yard line. The catch put the ball at the WCU 15-yard line with 1:08 left in the go in the game. Along with kicking the game-winning field goal, Jackson also made all three of his extra points as he earned the RMAC Special Teams Player of the Week accolade for the third time this season and second time in the last three weeks.

TORRIE SCORES THIRD DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWN ON SEASON:

In the Pack's win at Black Hills State, junior linebacker **Byson Torrie** returned an interception 49 yards for a touchdown to give the Pack a 17-0 lead with 35 seconds left in the opening quarter. The interception return for a score was Torrie's third this season as he returned a fumble and an interception for a touchdown earlier this season at home against Adams State. He is the first player to score three defensive touchdowns in a season since **Darius Williams** returned three interceptions for scores during the 2017 season. In addition, he is the only NCAA player this season to have scored three defensive touchdowns. The Pack enters this week's action tied with Central Washington and Benedict for the Division II lead in defensive touchdowns with four. Along with the interception return 49 yards for a score, Torrie also added four tackles, including three solo stops against the Yellow Jackets. Thanks to his performance against BHSU, Torrie was named the RMAC Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 20 for the second time this season.

JACKSON SMITH KICKS HIMSELF INTO RECORD BOOKS AT BLACK HILLS STATE:

The Pack's 40-14 win at Black Hills State was keyed by the strong kicking of junior **Jackson Smith**. In the win over the Yellow Jackets, Smith, who was named the RMAC Special Teams Player of the Week for the second time this season on Oct. 20, tied a single-game school record with four made field goals (31, 37, 38, 43) and he also added four extra points to set a new school record for kick scoring with 16 points. Prior to the Black Hills State, only two kickers in school history - **Greg O'Donnell** against Midwestern State in 2015 and **Nathan Taylor** against Colorado Mesa in 2016 - had made four field goals in a single game. In addition, the 16 points bettered the old school record of 13 set by **Jacob Willig** against Midwestern State in 2023. His four field goals are tied for the third-most this season by a Division II player and the most in an RMAC game since BHSU's Coleman Chapman also made four field goals in a game during the 2023 season.

PACK VS. COLORADO SCHOOLS: CSU Pueblo has now posted a 120-60-3 (.664) record against schools from the state of Colorado since becoming a four-year school in 1963. The Pack is 64-24-3 at home and 56-36 on the road against Colorado schools over that same

span. Since rebooting football in 2008, the Pack are 66-19 all-time against Colorado schools, including being 36-8 in home games after its win over Fort Lewis on Oct. 11 and is 30-11 on the road against Colorado schools after its win last weekend at Mines. The Pack went undefeated against Colorado schools in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2024 and 2025 and lost just once to Colorado schools in season in 2010 (4-1), 2014 (4-1), 2017 (4-1), 2018 (5-1) and 2019 (4-1). In 2003, the Pack was 3-2 against Colorado schools and in 2022, the Pack was 3-3 against Colorado schools. The Pack as gone a perfect 5-0 the past two seasons against Colorado schools and has now won 14 straight football games against Colorado schools dating to a 55-15 home loss to Mines during the 2023 season.

ROAD WIN STREAK REACHES 15 STRAIGHT GAMES: The Pack's 41-34 come-from-behind overtime win last Saturday at Mines extended its road win streak to 15 straight games since suffering a 57-49 double overtime loss in 2023 at Grand Valley State. Since that setback to the Lakers, the Pack, who began its current road win streak last season with an 85-7 win at Fort Lewis, closed the 2023 season by winning its last four road games, was 5-0 during the 2024 season on the road with wins at South Dakota Mines, Adams State, Fort Lewis, Western Colorado and Chadron State and went 6-0 on the road in the regular season this year as they posted wins over Central Missouri, Colorado Mesa, New Mexico Highlands, Black Hills State, Western Colorado and Mines. The current 15 game road winning streak is the longest active road streak in Division II football and the longest for the Pack since winning 22 straight road games from 2010 to 2014. Since rebooting the football program in 2008, the Pack has posted a 77-22 record on the road, including a 66-13 record in RMAC road games.

PACK REMAINS IN TOP SIX IN LATEST AFCA, D2FOOTBALL.COM TOP 25 POLLS: Entering the 2025 postseason, the Pack has continued to climb up both the AFCA Division II Coaches' poll presented by HUDL and the D2Football.com Media polls as the Pack enters the NCAA Division II Playoffs ranked No. 4 in the AFCA Division II Coaches and No. 6 in the D2Football.com Media polls that were released earlier this week. In the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll presented by HUDL, the Pack earned 669 points to jump one spot to No. 4, while the Pack advanced one spot to No. 6 in the D2Football.com poll. In fact, the Pack have been ranked in 24 straight AFCA Coaches polls, while they have been ranked in 23 of the last 25 D2Football.com polls. PACK ALL-TIME WINNINGEST FOOTBALL PROGRAM IN COLORADO: CSU Pueblo enters Saturday's game with UTPB as the all-time winningest college football program in the state of Colorado in terms of winning percentage as the Pack has won 65.8 percent of its football games since beginning its four-year school tenure in 1963. The Pack have played 421 games since 1963 and has won 275 games and has lost just 142 and has recorded four ties. Division I University of Colorado is second in all-time winning percentage with a 56.8 percent as they are 736-555-36 all-time, while the University of Denver is third with a 56.3 winning percentage as they went 273-262-40 before dropping football in 1960.

PACK BOASTS 68-41-1 ALL-TIME RECORD IN NOVEMBER: Saturday's game with UTPB will mark the 11th game in the month of November for Pack football since 1963. The Pack has posted a 68-41-1 all-time record in November, including a 40-11 record in November since 2008. In addition, the Pack is 20-4 at home in November and 20-7 on the road in November since 2008. The Pack has won nine straight regular season games in the month of November since suffering a 14-7 loss at Western Colorado in the final game of the 2021 season and is 3-0 in the month of November this season.

PACK STRONG IN NOVEMBER REGULAR SEASON GAMES SINCE 2008: Last Saturday's game with Chadron State marked the 38th regular season game in the month of November for the Pack

as the Pack has posted a 34-4 record in regular season November games since the Pack restarted its football program in 2008, including going 3-0 this season in November regular season games.

RETZLAFF BECOMES SCHOOL'S ALL-TIME LEADER IN RECEPTIONS, RECEIVING YARDS AND TOUCHDOWNS: Redshirt senior receiver **Reggie Retzlaff**, who was named a unanimous All-American, a Harlon Hill Trophy finalist (finished seventh in the voting) and the RMAC Offensive Player of the Year last season, became CSU Pueblo's all-time leader in career receptions, career receiving yards and career touchdown catches following his six reception, 84-yard day at Black Hills State on Oct. 18. Entering this week's action with UT-Permian Basin, Retzlaff has caught a team-leading 68 passes for 922 yards this season and is averaging 13.6 yards per reception and 92.2 receiving yards per game after catching a single-game school record 14 passes for 166 yards and two touchdown passes against Chadron State. Retzlaff closed the regular season leading the league in receptions per game (6.8) and is second in the league in receiving touchdowns (15), receiving yards (922) and receiving yards per game (92.2) and third in scoring (9.0) and fourth in total points scored (90). He is now the school's all-time leader in career receptions (183), career receiving yards (2,955) and receiving touchdowns (39). All three of those marks were held by current Pack receivers coach **Paul Browning** as Browning caught 152 passes for 2,507 yards and had 24 career touchdown receptions with the Pack from 2011-14. Additionally, Retzlaff has also scored 234 career points, which is second on the school's all-time scoring

(non-kicking) charts. During the 2024 season, Retzlaff set new single season school records for pass receptions (67), receiving yards (1,228) and touchdowns (12). During the 2024 season, he caught 67 passes for 1,228 yards and tied his own school record for 12 touchdown receptions. He caught at least seven passes in seven games, tallied 100 or more receiving yards in a game seven times, including a single-game school record 241 yards in the Pack's 35-6 season-opening win at South Dakota Mines and hauled in two or more touchdown catches in a game five times. Entering the postseason, Retzlaff is third among active Division II receivers in career receiving yards (2,955), is the D-II active leader in receiving yards per game (92.3) and career touchdown receptions with 39.

RETZLAFF AMONG ACTIVE DIVISION II LEADERS IN TOUCHDOWN RECEPTION AND CAREER RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME: Thanks to catching two touchdown passes in last Saturday's 30-27 double overtime win at home against Chadron State, Retzlaff has now hauled in 39 career touchdown receptions, including a team-leading 15 touchdown catches this season, which is second the RMAC and second in Division II behind Black Hills State's T.J. Chukwurah's 16 touchdown catches. His 39 career touchdown receptions are fourth most in state of Colorado history. Along with being the active Division II leader with 39 career touchdown catches, he is also the active Division II leader in career receiving yards per game as he is averaging 92.3 receiving yards per game. In his time with the Pack, Retzlaff has caught three or more touchdown passes in a game six times and has had at least two touchdown catches in 13 of his 32 career games. Entering Saturday's game with UTPB, Retzlaff is tied for fourth among all active NCAA football players (all levels) with 39 touchdown catches.

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO STEP UP FOR PACK: Heading into this weekend's NCAA Playoffs, the Pack offense continues to be one of the top units in the RMAC as they enter Saturday's game with UTPB leading the league and is eighth nationally in scoring (39.6 ppg) and leads the league in both passing offense (302.2 ypg) and total offense (453.5 ypg). In addition, the Pack also leads the league and is tied for third nationally in offensive first downs (286) and leads the RMAC and is 16th in Division II red zone offense (52-for-58). This season, the Pack gained 397 yards (141 rushing, 256 passing) in the season opener against South Dakota Mines, before gaining a season-high 483 yards (132 rushing, 351 passing) against Fort Hays State, tallied 373 yards (123 rushing, 250 passing) at Central Missouri, posted 396 yards (147 rushing, 249 passing) at Colorado Mesa, gained 442 yards (245 rushing, 197 passing) against Adams State, tallied 451 yards (223 rushing, 228 passing) at New Mexico Highlands and recorded a season-high 556 yards (194 rushing, 362 passing) against Fort Lewis and tallied 498 yards (93 rushing, a season-high 405 passing) at Black Hills State, amassed 422 yards (105 rushing, 317 passing) out Western Colorado, tallied 429 yards (161 rushing, 268 passing) at Mines and amassed 541 yards of offense (99 rushing, 442 passing) last time out against Chadron State. The 541 yards of offense against Chadron State last weekend marked the 15th consecutive game for the Pack to record 300 or more

yards of offense. In addition, since the beginning of the 2023 season, the Pack is 28-4 when gaining 300 or more yards of offense. The Pack have failed to gain 300 or more yards in just two games since 2023 as they gained 209 yards of offense in a 24-21 home win last season over Black Hills State and 218 yards in a 30-14 home loss in 2023 to Western Colorado.

SMITH AMONG DIVISION II LEADERS IN FIELD GOALS PER GAME, FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE AND SCORING: Jackson Smith enters play on Saturday against UTEP sitting second in Division II in field goals made per game (1.67), 15th nationally in field goal percentage (78.9 percent) and is ninth nationally in scoring per game (9.8 ppg). On the season, Smith is 15-for-19 on field goals and is a perfect 43-for-43 on extra points. He is second on the team in scoring with 88 points and those 88 points are fifth-most in the RMAC and 24th nationally in Division II. In last week's Chadron State game, Smith had his streak of 11 consecutive field goals made snapped after missing 32-yard field goal attempt in the first quarter. The 11 consecutive field goals made streak began after Smith missed a 54-yard field goal in the second quarter at Colorado Mesa. During his streak of 11 consecutive made field goals, Jackson made a school-record 60 yard field goal at New Mexico Highlands and is 3-for-4 this season on field goals of 50 or more yards.

FULLER BECOMES THIRD QB IN SCHOOL HISTORY WITH 4,000 CAREER PASSING YARDS AND 40 CAREER TOUCHDOWN PASSES: Entering Saturday's game with UTPB, senior quarterback Roman Fuller continues to climb Pack's career passing charts after going 40-for-66 passing for a career-high 442 yards with three touchdown passes and an interception in last week's home game against Chadron State. He enters this week's action sitting third in career pass completions (394), third in career passing attempts (614), third in career passing

yards (5,063), and third in career passing touchdowns (48). In addition, he has amassed 4,993 yards of total offense, which is fourth on the school's all-time chart and has had his hand in 50 career touchdowns, which is fourth on the school's all-time list. In his career, he is completing 64.2 percent of his passes and has a 156.0 career passing efficiency rating, which is tops in school history. Fuller is one of three quarterbacks in CSU Pueblo history to record 4,000 career passing yards and toss 40 career touchdown passes. The other Pack quarterbacks to achieve that feat are **Chris Bonner** (6,704 yards, 63 TD) and **Ross Dausin** (6,686 yards, 53 TD). Fuller has thrown for 200 or more yards in a game 15 times, including in 10 of the Pack's 11 games this season and has thrown for 200 or more yards in 13 of his last 15 games since being held to career-low 30 yards passing last season at home against Black Hills State. He enters this week's action, leading the RMAC in passing yards (3,221), passing yards per game (292.8), passing touchdowns (30), and completions per game (23.36) and is second in total offense (289.1), and points responsible for (192), and is third in passing yards per completion (12.53) and is fourth in the RMAC in completion percentage (61.3 percent) and sixth in passing efficiency (146.7).

DEFENSE HAS STEPPED UP LAST SEVEN GAMES: The Pack defense has played a significant role in its last seven victories to close

out the regular season as they have allowed a total of 129 points and 1,881 yards of offense combined to Adams State, New Mexico Highlands, Fort Lewis, Black Hills State, Western Colorado, Mines and Chadron State. In last Saturday's double overtime home win over Chadron State, the Pack held the Eagles to a total of 242 yards (143 rushing, 99 passing) of offense and collected its RMAC-leading 17th interception of the season, while two weeks ago at Mines, the Pack held the Orediggers to a total of 362 yards (242 rushing, 120 passing) of offense, including limiting them to just 96 yards and just six points after halftime and added two sacks and forced two turnovers in the 41-34 comeback overtime win and then three weeks at Western Colorado, the Pack held the high-powered Mountaineers offense to a total of 317 yards of offense (112 rushing, 205 passing) and recorded two sacks and five tackles for a loss in the 24-21 win. The Mountaineers, who had 193 yards of offense in the first half, were held to just 123 yards of offense and no points in the second half. Against Black

Hills State on Oct. 18, the Pack held the Yellow Jackets to a total of 199 yards of offense (79 rushing, 120 passing) and recorded two sacks, eight tackle for a loss and picked off a pass that was returned 49 yards by **Bryson Torrie** for a touchdown in the 40-14 win. That performance came a week after the Pack held Fort Lewis to 228 yards of offense (105 rushing, 123 passing) and recorded five sacks, forced two turnovers and had 10 tackles for a loss

in the 49-13 homecoming win, and before that, the Pack defense held the then No. 1 offense in Division II to a total of 309 yards, which was 188 yards off its season average of 497 yards per game and they also held the Cowboys rushing attack to 147 yards, which was nearly 203 yards off its season average of 349.5 yards per game in the 59-13 win at New Mexico Highlands and the Pack started the strong play on defense against Adams State as they held the Grizzlies to just 224 yards of offense as they rushed for 80 yards on 43 carries and passed for 144 yards. In addition, the Pack defense has also recorded 17 sacks and forced 11 turnovers in its last five games, including forcing five turnovers (4 interceptions, 1 fumble) against Adams State, three turnovers (1 interception, 2 fumbles) against New Mexico Highlands, two turnovers (1 interception, 1 fumble) against Fort Lewis, one turnover, which was an interception at Black Hills State and did not force a turnover last time out against Western Colorado. Entering this weekend's NCAA Playoff game

at home with UTPB, the Pack defense ranks third in the RMAC in total defense (310.0 yards per game), and is second in scoring defense (19.4 points per game), passing defense (187.8 yards per game) and rushing defense (122.2 yards per game). Additionally, the Pack is 16th in Division II in turnover margin (+9), and is fifth in Division II in turnovers gained (26) and is fourth in interceptions with 17.

for 161 yards and averaged 5.0 yards per carry and got a rushing touchdown from **Russell Patton**. In the comeback win three weeks ago at Western Colorado, the Pack rushed the ball 29 times for 105 yards and got two rushing touchdowns from Martinez and then in the win at Black Hills State on Oct. 18, the Pack rushed the ball 31 times for 93 yards and before that game, the Pack rushed the ball 37 times for 194 yards and averaged 5.2 yards per carry and tied a season high with four rushing touchdowns in the homecoming win over Fort Lewis, including two rushing scores from Martinez. Prior to the rushing performance against Fort Lewis, the Pack rushed the ball 31 times for 223 yards and averaged 7.2 yards per carry and scored a season-high four touchdowns, including two rushing scores from senior running back **Devin Cross** in the 59-13 win at New Mexico Highlands and prior to the New Mexico Highlands game, the Pack rushing attack carried the ball 32 times for a season-high 245 yards and averaged 7.7 yards per carry and scored two touchdowns on runs of 50 or more yards. The 245 yards rushing were the most for the Pack in a game since rushing for 291 yards last season at Fort Lewis. On the season, the Pack rushing offense is sixth in the RMAC as they are averaging 151.4 yards per game and have scored 20 touchdowns, which tied for fourth-most in the league. The Pack has rushed for 100 or more yards in nine of its 11 games this season and had a streak of nine consecutive games of rushing for 100 or more yards since being held to 62 yards in last year's 28-13 home win over Mines snapped at Black Hills State on Oct. 18. Redshirt senior running back **Kiahn Martinez** (539 yards), redshirt freshman running back **Russell Patton** (484 yards) are eighth and 12th in the league in total rushing yards, while Patton is 10th in the league in rushing yards per game (48.4). Patton and Martinez are tied for the team lead in touchdowns with six, while senior running back **Devin Cross** has had three rushing scores. Since the beginning of the 2023 season, the Pack has had seven games of 200 or more rushing yards and is 6-1 in those games when they rush for 200 or more yards.

This year's Homecoming game against Fort Lewis marked another class of CSU Pueblo Hall of Fame inductees. HAPPY HOMECOMINGS: The Pack's home contest with Fort Lewis on Oct. 11 marked the 39th Homecoming football game for the Pack since becoming a four-year school in 1963. The Pack hold a 33-6 all-time record in Homecoming games, including a 17-0 record on Homecoming since rebooting the football program in 2008. CSU Pueblo is now 8-0 on homecoming all-time against Fort Lewis after last Saturday's 49-13 win.

PACK IS NOW 15-2 AFTER HOMECOMING GAMES SINCE 2008:

Since rebooting the football program in 2008, the Pack has posted a 15-2 record following its homecoming games and have won its last seven games following homecoming since falling 35-24 at Fort Lewis in 2017. The Pack's other loss following its homecoming game came in 2010 as the Pack fell 19-16 at Mines. Last season, the Pack earned 58-24 win at Fort Lewis following its 67-28 homecoming win over New Mexico Highlands.

PACK RECORDS THEN SCHOOL RECORD 36 FIRST DOWNS, GAINS SEASON-HIGH 556 YARDS AGAINST FORT LEWIS:

In last Saturday's 49-13 Homecoming win over Fort Lewis, the Pack offense recorded a then single-game school record 36 first downs (9 rushing, 23 passing, 4 penalty) and gained a season-high 556 yards on 78 plays. The Pack averaged 7.1 yards per game in the win over the Skyhawks. Against the Skyhawks, the Pack rushed for 194 yards on 37 carries (5.2 yards per carry) and tied a season-high with four rushing touchdowns and was 28-for-41 passing for 362 yards and had three touchdowns passes and an interception. The 36 first downs bettered the old school record of 33 set at Black Hills State in 2018.

JACKSON SMITH MAKES HISTORY WITH 60-YARD FIELD GOAL AGAINST NEW MEXICO HIGHLANDS:

In the Pack's win at New Mexico Highlands, junior kicker **Jackson Smith** made history as he drilled a career-long 60-yard field goal to give the Pack its first points of the game in its 59-13 road win over the Cowboys. The 60-yard field goal bettered the old CSU Pueblo school record of 55 yards set by **Mitch Johnson** against Adams State on Sept. 20, 1975, and was the longest field goal in the state of Colorado since Western Colorado's Lloyd Tucker hit a 61-yard field goal against

Adams State on Nov. 12, 2011. The 60-yard field is tied for the fifth-longest in the state of Colorado history and is just one of 17 field goals of 60 or more yards in NCAA football since 2008, and the longest by an RMAC player since Chadron State's Wilson Yee hit a 61-yarder in 2023. Entering this week's action, Jackson leads the RMAC in field goal percentage as he is 15-for-19 (78.9 percent) on the season and is fifth in the league in scoring with 88 points, while his 9.8 points per game average is tops among kickers in the RMAC. SMITH NAMED RMAC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Thanks to his school record 60-yard field goal at New Mexico Highlands, Smith was named the RMAC Special Teams Player of the Week on Monday, Oct. 6. He was the second consecutive Pack player to earn RMAC Special Teams Player of the Week as he joins **Reece Robinson**, who was honored on Monday, Sept. 29 following his performance against Adams State. It is the fourth time this season the Pack has had an RMAC Football Player of the Week as along with the two selections on special teams, **Bryson Torrie** and **Kahden Rullo** were named the Defensive Players of the Week on Sept. 29 and Sept. 1 respectively.

SPECIAL TEAMS SCORES ANOTHER TOUCHDOWN AGAINST NEW MEXICO HIGHLANDS: The Pack's special teams added its second touchdown of the season at New Mexico Highlands as sophomore safety **Tre Jordan** scored on a 10-yard blocked punt return for a touchdown to give the Pack a 17-0 lead just 81 seconds into the second quarter. Jordan's blocked punt return score came after sophomore linebacker **Shallum Peter** was credited with a blocked punt. The blocked kick was the fourth of Peter's career and first this season. The four blocked kicks are now an all-time school record for Peter. Since the beginning of last season, the Pack has blocked a total of nine kicks as they tied a single-season school record with seven blocks in 2024 and have blocked two kicks through seven games this season.

PACK SCORES TOUCHDOWNS IN ALL THREE PHASES

OF GAME AGAINST ADAMS STATE: For the first time this season and second time since the beginning of the 2023 season, the Pack scored in all three phases (offense, defense, special teams) of the game in its home win over Adams State three weeks ago. In the game against the Grizzlies, the Pack scored two touchdowns on defense, both of which came from **Bryson Torrie** on a fumble return and an interception return, while the special teams score came on a punt return by **Reece Robinson** and the Pack offense scored four touchdowns in the game. Prior to the Adams State game, the last time the Pack scored in all phases of the game came at Grand Valley State during the 2023 season as the Pack scored on an interception return by **Gary Seidenberger** and a blocked field goal return by **Eli Pittman**.

TORRIE MAKES HISTORY AGAINST ADAMS STATE, SCORES TWO DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:

In the Pack's 55-7 home win against Adams State, junior linebacker **Bryson Torrie** made history as he scored two defensive touchdowns in the win over the Grizzlies as he scored 12 of the Pack's 55 points in the game. His first defensive touch-

down was a 42-yard fumble return for a score with 5:08 left in the first quarter to give the Pack a 17-0 lead, while his touchdown came on a 5-yard interception return with 11:07 left in the second quarter to give the Pack a 38-0 lead. It is believed to be the first time in school history a player scored two defensive touchdowns in the same and was the most defensive touchdowns in a game since returning three interceptions for touchdowns against Adams State during the 2019 season. According to research, Torrie is just the fourth player in Division II history to score two defensive touchdowns in a game and the first since Pace's Nick Nasti returned two fumbles for a touchdown in a game against Stonehill on Oct. 10, 2015. In addition, Henderson State's Matt McFadden returned two interceptions against Arkansas-Monticello on Oct. 26, 2013 and Mississippi College's Sam Washington returned two interceptions for a touchdown against Troy State in 1974.

ROBINSON RECORDS SECOND CAREER PUNT RETURN TOUCHDOWN AGAINST

ADAMS STATE: In the second quarter of last Saturday's game against Adams State, senior **Reece Robinson** took a punt from ASU's Braden Biller and returned it 65 yards for a touchdown to give the Pack a 31-0 lead with 12:34 left in the second quarter. The punt return touchdown was the second of Robinson's career, which is tied for second-most on the school's all-time charts and tied for first among active Division II players and tied for ninth among all active NCAA football players.

TORRIE, ROBINSON TAKE HOME RMAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS:

Thanks to their performances against Adams State, Torrie and Robinson took home RMAC Defensive and Special Teams Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 29. Torrie earned his first career Player of the Week accolade, while Robinson earned his second career Special Teams Player of the Week honor and first this season. Robinson was recognized as the Special Teams Player of the Week last season on Oct. 7, 2024, following the New Mexico Highlands game.

TORRIE TAKES HOME NFF COLORADO CHAPTER PLAYER OF THE WEEK

HONOR: Thanks to his performance against Adams State, **Bryson Torrie** was named the NFF Colorado Chapter Player of the Week on Sept. 30. It was Torrie's first career honor from the NFFCC and he is the second Pack player to earn the Player of the Week honor from the NFF Colorado Chapter as quarterback **Roman Fuller** earned the honor on Sept. 9 after his performance against Fort Hays State. football playing schools in Colorado as only Colorado (50), Mines (39) and Air Force (36) have had more winners than CSU Pueblo.

TAYLOR-AKINS STEPS UP AGAINST CENTRAL MISSOURI: In the Pack's 29-24 win at Central Missouri, junior receiver **Dedrek Taylor-Akins** had a career night catching the football as he was targeted 15 times in the passing game and hauled in seven receptions for a Pack season-high 170 yards and had one touchdown reception, which was a 65-yard pass from senior quarterback **Roman Fuller** for the Pack's first touchdown of the game. In the game, Taylor-Akins averaged 24.3 yards per catch and had four catches of 20 or more yards. On the season, Taylor-Akins has now caught 29 passes for 416 yards and is averaging 14.3 yards per reception and has had six touchdown catches, which is tied second-most on the team and tied for ninth-most in the RMAC this season.

PACK AMONG D-II NATIONAL LEADERS IN RED ZONE OFFENSE AND OFFENSIVE FIRST DOWNS:

Through 11 games this season, the Pack is 16th in Division II in red zone offense and is tied for third nationally in offensive first downs with 286 after recording a school record 38 first downs last time out against Chadron State. Heading into this week's action with UTPB, the Pack is 16th in Division II in red zone offense as the Pack is 52-for-58 (89.7 percent) in the red zone this season. They had its perfect streak in the red zone snapped against Fort Lewis as the Pack was 7-for-8 in the red zone in the homecoming win over the Skyhawks. The Pack has scored 41 touchdowns and made 11 field goals in the red zone this season. In addition to being 16th in Division II in red zone offense, the Pack has thrown 439 passes and has had just seven interceptions, which is ranked third in the RMAC and 39th nationally and is tied for nationally with Saturday's foe, UTPB, in offensive first downs with 286 as the Pack has gained 89 rushing first downs, 167 passing first downs and 30 first downs by penalty. The Pack's 286 first downs this season are just 14 shy of the school record of 300 first downs that was achieved during the national championship season in 2014. The Pack opened the season with 23 first downs against South Dakota Mines, before tallying 32 first downs against Fort Hays State, recorded 22 first downs at Central Missouri, had 25 first downs at Colorado Mesa, 19 against Adams State, 24 at New Mexico Highlands, had a school record 36 first downs against Fort Lewis, tallied 25 at Black Hills State, had 16 at Western Colorado, has 26 at Mines and recorded a school record 38 last times out against Chadron State. The 38 first downs against Chadron State are the third-most in a Division II game this season behind Central Missouri's 41 first downs against Missouri Southern and Colorado School of Mines' 40 first downs against Adams State. 54 (85.2 percent) red zone scoring chances, which was fourth-best in the RMAC and 30th nationally in Division II. The Pack scored 34 touchdowns and made 12 field goals in the red zone during the 2024 season. Since the beginning of the 2022 season, the Pack are now 162-for-181 (89.5 percent) in the red zone as they finished the 2022 season 39-for-43 (90.7 percent) in the red zone, was 36-for-41 (87.8 percent) in 2023, 46-for-54 (85.2 percent) in 2024 and is 42-for-44 (95.5 percent) in the red zone through nine games this season.

CROSS STANDS EIGHTH IN CAREER RUSHING YARDS AMONG ACTIVE DIVISION II PLAYERS:

Senior running back **Devin Cross** has continued his climb up the active Division II rushing charts this season as he currently is third on the Pack in rushing this season with 400 yards on 68 carries and is averaging 5.9 yards per carry and 36.4 rushing yards per game. Entering Saturday's game with UTPB, Cross is currently 13th among active Division II players in career rushing yards with 2,553 yards. Prior to this season, Cross spent the past three seasons as Midwestern State where he gained 2,166 yards rushing on 365 carries and averaged 5.9 yards per carry and 74.7 yards per game. He also scored 12 career rushing touchdowns and 15 total touchdowns in his time with the Mustangs. In addition, Pack senior running back **Kiahn Martinez** is 47th among active Division II players in career rushing yards with 1,675 yards.

SEASON OPENERS: CSU Pueblo has now posted a 15-2 (.882) record in season opening games since the program's reboot in 2008 and are 29-10 (.744) all-time in season openers since becoming a four-year school in 1963. This season's opener at home with South Dakota Mines was the earliest season opener for the Pack since the 2024 opener on August 29 at South Dakota Mines, a game the Pack won 35-6. This season's opener at home with South Dakota Mines marked the 10th time the Pack opened the season at home since 2008 and the first time since 2023 when the Pack opened the season with a 37-8 win over Midwestern State. The Pack is 9-1 (.900) since the program reboot in 2008 in season openers at home with the lone loss being a 12-6 home loss in 2021 against Texas A&M-Commerce. CONFERENCE OPENERS: Since the Pack returned to the gridiron in 2008, the Pack's RMAC game at home with South Dakota Mines to open this season was the 17th season that CSU Pueblo has played an RMAC opener. The Pack is now 14-3 in conference openers since 2008 following its 43-0 home win last Thursday. The Pack's lone conference opening losses came in 2023 at home against Western Colorado (30-14), in 2022 at home against Western Colorado (17-1) and in 2016 at Mines (57-21). Along with being 14-3 in RMAC openers since 2008, the Pack are 6-1 in RMAC openers on the road with the lone setback coming in 2016 at Mines (57-21). PACK IN HOME SEASON OPENERS: This year's season opener at home against South Dakota Mines marked the 39th home opener since 1963, including the 17th home opener since the program reboot in 2008. Since 1963, the Pack is 18-6 at home in season openers and have won 10 of its last 11 home openers with the lone loss coming in its 2021 season opener at home against Texas A&M-Commerce (12-6).

ROAD OPENERS FOR PACK: The Pack's game at Central Missouri on Sept. 11 marked the 39th road opener in the program's history since 1963. The Pack is now 10-7 in road openers since the program's reboot in 2008. The Pack have won four of its last six road openers with the lone losses being a 34-14 setback at Grand Valley State in the first road game of the 2021 season and a 57-49 double overtime loss in its first road game of the 2023 season. The Pack are 23-16 all-time in road openers since 1963.

PACK IN HOME OPENERS: The Pack's home opener this season with South Dakota Mines marked the 39th home opener since 1963, including the 17th home opener since the program reboot in 2008. Since 1963, the Pack is 27-10-2 in home openers, including being 13-4 in home openers since 2008. The Pack have won five of its last eight home openers and has now won three straight home openers.

PACK STRONG IN REGULAR SEASON NON-CONFERENCE GAMES SINCE 2008: The game at Central Missouri marked the 31st regular season non-conference football game since the 2008 season. The Pack are now 20-11 all-time in regular season non-conference games and has posted a perfect non-conference record seven times in the last 16 seasons. on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs in terms of winning percentage heading into Saturday's home game with UTPB. CSU Pueblo has recorded a 275-142-4 all-time record entering Saturday's game and the Pack have won nearly 66 percent (65.8 winning percentage) of its 421 all-time games. In addition from 2010-19, the Pack were second in winning percentage (.862) and fourth in victories (106) as they compiled a 106-17 record in NCAA Division II football.

90-1 RECORD SINCE 2008 WHEN SCORING 36 OR MORE POINTS:

The Pack has posted a 91-1 record when scoring 36 or more points in a game since the program rebooted in 2008. In addition, the Pack is 134-2 all-time in school history when scoring 36 or more points since becoming a four-year school in 1963. The Pack's lone losses when scoring 36 or more points came on Sept. 9, 2023 at Grand Valley State as the Pack lost 57-49 in double overtime and on Oct. 28, 1978 at Western Colorado, a game the Pack lost 51-43. Last season, the Pack was 7-0 when scoring 36 or more points and they have won 18 straight games when scoring 36 or more points since that loss at Grand Valley State in 2023 and is 6-0 this season after scoring 43 points in the season opener against South Dakota Mines, tallying 55 points at home against Adams State, scoring a season-high 59 points at New Mexico Highlands, tallying 49 points against Fort Lewis, recording 40 points at Black Hills State and 41 points last time out at Mines.

NINE-GAME REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK SNAPPED WITH FORT HAYS STATE SETBACK:

The Pack's 36-35 home setback to Fort Hays State on Sept. 4 snapped the Pack's nine game regular season winning streak that has spanned since the Pack suffered a 24-21 home loss to then No. 3 ranked Grand Valley State on Sept. 14, 2024. The nine game win streak was the fifth longest active streak in Division II football and the 11th longest win streak in school history.

PACK STRONG IN SECOND HALF THIS SEASON:

Entering Saturday's contest with UTPB, the Pack has outscored its first 11 opponents 200-88 in the second half, including outscoring their foes 72-30 in the third quarter and 128-58 in the fourth quarter and overtime. On the season, the Pack has scored 436 points overall as they are averaging 39.6 points per game, which is tops in the RMAC and eighth nationally in Division II. The Pack is one of 16 teams in Division II to have scored at 400 points on the season as top-ranked Ferris State leads the way with 578 points. The Pack have scored 45.9 percent of its points in the second half as the Pack is averaging 18.2 points per game in the second half and overtime, including outscoring Chadron State, 20-13, last time out. Along with outscoring their foes, 72-30 in the third quarter, the Pack is outscoring its foes, 128-58 in the fourth quarter and overtime, the Pack is outscoring their opponents, 211-100

15 CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS:

Thanks to its win on Homecoming against Fort Lewis, CSU Pueblo has assured themselves of its 15th consecutive all-time winning season. CSU Pueblo entered the 2025 season as one of only two football programs in the state of Colorado (Colorado School Mines is the other) at any level to boast 15 consecutive winning seasons. The streak began in 2009, and including that year, the Pack has posted a 152-36 overall record, including three undefeated regular seasons, 14 seasons with at least seven wins, 10 seasons with at least nine wins and eight seasons with at least 10 wins, highlighted by the school-record 14-win NCAA Division II National Championship team in 2014. During this streak, the Pack has earned eight Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championships and have advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs 10 times, including winning the national title in 2014. Also a highlight of the past 13 years was a 33-game RMAC win streak that stretched from Oct. 23, 2010 to Oct. 11, 2014. The Pack is currently in the midst of a 23-game RMAC winning streak that dates back to the 2023 season.

PACK BOASTS 116-49 RECORD IN OCTOBER:

The game at Black Hills State on Oct. 18 marked 165th game in the month of October in the four-year history of Pack football. The Pack has posted a 116-49 all-time record in October, including a 62-10 record in October since 2008. In addition, the Pack is 32-3 at home in October since 2008 and 30-7 on road in October since 2008. The Pack has won 17 straight games in the month of October since suffering a 28-21 loss at New Mexico Highlands on Oct. 16, 2021.

PACK BOASTS 87-44 RECORD IN SEPTEMBER:

The Pack's game with Adams State on Sept. 27 marked the 131st game in the month of September in the four-year school era for Pack football. The Pack has now posted an 87-44 all-time record in the month of September, including a 50-19 record in September since 2008. In addition, the Pack is 46-22 at home in September, 39-22 on the road and 2-0 on neutral fields in the month. Since 2008, the

Pack are also 14-12 in the month of September against non-conference foes with seven of those 13 losses against either Grand Valley State (0-4) or West Texas A&M (3-3) and ended the month winning three straight games in the month and was 3-1 in the month this season.

PACK IMPROVES TO 6-0 IN AUGUST ALL-TIME WITH SOUTH DAKOTA MINES WIN IN SEASON OPENER:

Thanks to its 43-0 win in last Thursday's season opener against South Dakota Mines, the Pack improved to 6-0 all-time in the month of August since restarting the program in 2008. The Pack is 4-0 at home in August and 2-0 on the road in August. Here are the Pack games in the month in August.

STRONG SCHEDULE FOR PACK IN 2025:

Once again, the Pack will play one of the toughest schedules in Division II football this season as their 11 opponents combined for a 63-61 record during the 2024 season, including its two non-conference opponents - Fort Hays State and Central Missouri - from the MIAA posting a 17-6 overall record and seven teams that posted winning records. The Pack will also play one NCAA Division II Playoff opponent from last season - Western Colorado. Last season, the Pack's two losses (Grand Valley State and Minnesota State) came against NCAA Playoff teams that posted a 22-6 overall record as Grand Valley went 11-2 and Minnesota State finished 11-4.

PACK DEFENSE STRONG AT FORCING TURNOVERS THIS SEASON:

Entering the 12th week of the 2025 season, the Pack is tied for fifth in Division II in turnovers forced with 26 and is tied for 16th nationally in turnover margin at 0.82 per game. The Pack's overall turnover margin is +9 on the season as they have forced 26 turnovers (17 interceptions, nine fumbles) and had have a total of 17 turnovers (10 fumbles, seven interceptions) on offense. Over the past two-plus seasons, the Pack defense has forced 70 turnovers and has committed a total of 44 turnovers.

DEFENSE IS AMONG D-II LEADERS IN INTERCEPTIONS:

Heading into Saturday's 12th game of the 2025 season, the Pack defense is tied for fourth in Division II with 17 interceptions. PEYTON SHAW, DRE'MONTI JACKSON AND TORRIE ARE RANKED IN TOP SIX IN RMAC IN INTERCEPTIONS: While the Pack is tied for fourth in Division II football in interceptions with 17, senior safety **Peyton Shaw** leads the way

league and 75th nationally in interceptions per game (0.27). Shaw's five interceptions have come against South Dakota Mines, Central Missouri (2 pickoffs), Mines and Chadron State, while Jackson's three interceptions have come against Colorado Mesa (2 pickoffs) and he had another pick against Adams State, while Torrie had interceptions against Adams State, Fort Lewis and Black Hills State. The two interceptions in a game by Shaw and Jackson are tied for the fourth-most in a game this season by a Division II player. So far this season, 74 Division II players have recorded at least two interceptions in a single game, including three players with three interceptions in a game.

PACK DEFENSE RECORDS SHUTOUT IN SEASON OPENER AGAINST SOUTH DAKOTA MINES: In the Pack's season opener against South Dakota Mines, the Pack defense recorded its first shutout since the 2022 season and the 29th shutout in the program's history. Prior to the shutout against South Dakota Mines, the Pack's previous shutout came at Black Hills State on Nov. 12, 2022, a game the Pack won 38-0. Along with recording 29 shutouts in school history, the Pack is now 120-8-2 all-time in school history when allowing 10 or less points in a game and has recorded 16 shutouts since the program restarted in 2008.

in career receiving touchdowns (21), while Martinez, who was a Second-Team All-RMAC selection in 2023, is one of 22 running backs in school history to record 1,000 career rushing yards.

RAKOWSKY CONTINUES MOVE UP CAREER RECEIVING CHARTS: Senior receiver **Zack Rakowsky** has also slowly been climbing the school's all-time receiving charts this season as the Loveland, Colo., native enters the UTPB game sitting third on the school's career receptions chart (158) and fourth on the career receiving yards chart (2,122) and is tied for eighth in career touchdown receptions (13). This season, Rakowsky is second on the team with 48 receptions for 548 yards and is averaging 11.9 yards per catch and 60.9 yards per game. He has caught at least four passes in seven games this season, including a season-high 11 receptions for 118 yards last time out against Chadron State. In his time with the Pack, Rakowsky has had 17 games with four or more receptions, including three games with 10 receptions and has had five 100-plus yard receiving games, including a career-high

152 yards receiving against Colorado Mesa in 2023. He is now the fourth receiver in school history with 2,000 career receiving yards and passed **Paul Browning** for second on career receptions chart with his 11 receptions last weekend against Chadron State.

OFFENSIVE LINE BOASTS 130 CAREER STARTS WITH THE PACK:

One of the biggest strengths of this year's Pack team is their offensive line as four of the five starters from last season returned and those four have started a total of 119 games over the past three-plus seasons with the Pack. The lone loss on the offensive line from last season was starting center **Senon Chapple**, who was a two-time All-RMAC selection and the RMAC Offensive Freshman of the Year in 2023, who hit the transfer portal at the end of the 2024 season and currently starts at NCAA FCS member Central Arkansas. Two of the veterans on the offensive line are senior left guard **Arthur Braach** and senior right guard **Domingo Prince II**, who have each started 34 consecutive games over the past two-plus seasons, while junior left tackle **Tyler Ethridge** has started 28 career games, including 18 straight games and senior right tackle **Jaiden Jones** has started 22 of 23 games as a member of the Pack. The lone newcomer to the line this season is sophomore center **Preston Jarvis**, who transferred to the Pack from Murray State at the end of the 2024 season, has started the all 11 games at center this season. Combined, the five starters on the offensive line have played a total of 133 career games with the Pack.

LYONS BECOMING THE TOUCHBACK KING:

One of the strengths of the Pack's special teams the past few seasons as been the ability of junior kicker **Evan Lyons** to record touchbacks on his kickoffs. This season, Lyons has recorded 41 of the Pack's 44 touchbacks, which is third-most in the league. In his two-plus seasons with the Pack, Lyons has recorded 137 touchbacks and is averaging 61.7 yards per kickoff. He enters Saturday's game with UTPB with the second most touchbacks since the football program was restarted in 2008. **Greg O'Donnell**, who kicked for the Pack from 2012-15, leads the way in career touchbacks with 147, while behind Lyons in third place is **Mitchell Carter** with 69. In 2023, Lyons recorded 34 touchbacks, before tallying 62 touchbacks in 2024 and has recorded 41 this season.

PACK OFFENSE OPENS SEASON WITH STRONG PERFORMANCE:

For the fifth consecutive game and the 22nd time in 24 games since the beginning of the 2023 season, the Pack gained over 300 yards of offense in its 2025 season opener against South Dakota Mines. In the 43-0 win over the Hardrockers, the Pack gained 397 yards of offense as they rushed for 141 yards on 39 carries and was 26-for-38 passing for 256 yards. **Roman Fuller** was once again efficient under center as he completed 66 percent of his passes (23-for-35) for 231 yards and had two touchdown passes. Nine different receivers caught

at least one pass in the season opener as **Retzlaff** and senior **Zach Rakowsky** combined for 12 catches for 150 yards in the win.

17 STARTERS RETURN FOR PACK:

Third-year Pack head coach **Philip Vigil** welcomes back a total of 17 returning starters from last season's 10-2 squad that captured its ninth all-time RMAC title after going 9-0 in league play. The Pack returns eight starters on offense, five starters on defense and four starters on special teams. The starters lost on offense were offensive lineman **Senon Chapple**, running back **Howard Russell V** and receiver **Taylor Tosches**, while on defense, the starters lost were defensive back **Daniel Bone III**, defensive lineman **Dominick Fini**, linebacker **Jon Nuschy**, defensive back **Eli Pittman**, defensive lineman **Cody Ramming**, defensive lineman **Makeah Scippio**, and defensive lineman **James Turrentine**. The lone starter not back on special teams is kicker **Jacob Willig**.

BACK IN THE PLAYOFFS IN 2024:

CSU Pueblo made its 10th overall appearance in the NCAA Division II Playoffs and its first appearance since 2022 last season. The Pack, who earned the No. 1 seed from Super Region 4 and earned a first round bye, hosted a second round home playoff game against Minnesota State. The Mavericks won the game, 26-23. The Pack is now 9-9 all-time in the NCAA Playoffs and earned the No. 1 seed for the fourth time and first time since 2013 in 2024. The last time the Pack was in the playoffs in 2022, the Pack fell in the first round at Colorado School of Mines, 45-24.

PACK CLINCHES OUTRIGHT RMAC TITLE, FINISHES 9-0 IN LEAGUE PLAY IN 2024:

With its 38-21 come-from-behind win on Nov. 16, 2024, at Chadron State, the Pack clinched the outright RMAC title and finished league play with a perfect 9-0 record. The outright RMAC title is the fifth in the program's history and the 9-0 record in RMAC play is the fifth for the Pack and first since going 9-0 in 2015. The Pack also went 9-0 in RMAC play in 2011, 2012 and 2013. The Pack have now claimed nine all-time RMAC titles with eight of those titles coming since 2011, which is a span of 13 seasons. The eight RMAC titles since 2008 are the most among the league's 10 member schools over that span. Mines is second with seven titles since 2008.

RETZLAFF NAMED 2024 RMAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

Reggie Retzlaff was named the RMAC Offensive Player of the Year in 2024 after leading the RMAC in both receiving touchdowns (12) and receiving yards per game (116.9) and was second in the league in receiving yards (1,169), receptions per game (8.4) and all-purpose yards per game (117.2). He was named an RMAC Offensive Player of the Week two times and caught a single-season school record 64 passes for a single-season school record 1,169 yards and tied for the single-season school record with 12 touchdown passes. He is the fourth

55 INTERCEPTION RETURN FOR TOUCHDOWNS SINCE 2008:

Since 2008, the Pack have totaled 55 interception returns for a touchdown, including **Bryson Torrie** returning an interception 49 yards for a touchdown three weeks ago at Black Hills State. The most interceptions for a touchdown in a season is eight, which occurred in 2019. The ThunderWolves have had five interceptions returned for a score in a season in 2010, 2014 and 2017. The Pack have recorded 19 interception returns for a touchdown since the beginning of the 2019 season.

59 STRAIGHT WINS WHEN HOLDING OPPONENTS TO 10 POINTS OR LESS:

Since the restart of the Pack football program in 2008, the Pack have posted a 59-0 record when allowing 10 points or less to an opponent. Additionally, the Pack are 121-9-3 all-time when allowing

10 or less points since becoming a four year school in 1963. Over the past two seasons, the Pack has gone 10-0 when holding an opponent to 10 or fewer points, including being 2-0 this season.

SCORING STREAK REACHES 202 STRAIGHT GAMES:

Coming into Saturday's game with UTPB, the Pack have scored in 202 straight games since being shut out (32-0) in its third game of 2008 season against Chadron State. The shutout was just the 11th in the program's history and the only time being shutout since restarting the football program in 2008. In addition, the Pack have scored at least one point in 102 straight home games since that home shutout by Chadron State in 2008.

THUNDERWOLVES STRONG IN THUNDERBOWL:

One of the biggest successes of the Pack program since restarting the program in 2008 is their ability to win home games in the ThunderBowl. Since 2008, the Pack have posted an 83-20 overall record in the ThunderBowl and have won at least five home games in a season 10 times, including posting undefeated marks at home in 2014 (8-0), 2017 (5-0) and 2018 (5-0). Along with being 83-20 at the home, the Pack are 15-9 at home against non-conference foes, including being 11-5 in regular season non-conference home games after its 36-35 home loss this season to Fort Hays State. Four of those eight losses at home have come against Grand Valley State as they fell in the NCAA Playoffs to the Lakers in both 2013 (34-30) and 2015 (31-7) and in regular season contests in 2022 (35-10) and 2024 (24-21). The Pack have won 13 of its last 18 games at home as they went 5-2 at home last season and is 4-1 this season at home heading into the playoffs. THREE STRAIGHT 11-0 REGULAR SEASON SEASONS IN 2011, 2012 AND 2013:

From 2011-13, the Pack posted three consecutive 11-0 undefeated regular season records and is one of just two teams in NCAA Division II history to accomplish the feat. In fact, the Pack won a total of 58 games and went 58-5 from 2011-15, including winning a school record 14 games in 2014 en route to claiming the 2014 Division II National Championship. During that stretch, the Pack won 42 straight regular season games from 2011 through the first five games of the 2014 season, which was the second-longest streak in Division II history behind only Grand Valley State, who posted 48 straight wins from 2004-09. That 42 game winning streak ended with a 23-22 road loss to Fort Lewis on Oct. 11, 2014.

62ND SEASON OF INTERCOLLEGIATE FOOTBALL

IN 2025: CSU Pueblo is celebrating its 62nd season of intercollegiate football in 2025 as the school began football as a junior college program in 1938 with **Dale Rea** as the coach. The first Pueblo Junior College team went 1-3-2 and would on to post an 81-92-11 overall record as a two-year program. The first four year season in football came in 1963 as Southern Colorado State, who was coached by **Joe C. Prater**, went 3-5-0. From 1963 to 1984, the program posted a 114-99-4 overall record and a 50-49-1 record in conference play.

PACK HAD STRONG OFFENSE IN 2024: The Pack offense was strong during the 2024 season as the Pack set new single season records for pass completions (278), passing yards (3,702), passing yards per game (308.5) and points per game (40.2). The Pack also ranked in the Top 15 in NCAA Division II in passing offense (6th, 308.5), scoring offense (7th, 40.2), completion percentage (10th, .656), and passing efficiency (11th, 163.15). In addition, the Pack led the RMAC in passing offense, passing yards per completion (13.32), scoring offense, passing efficiency and was second in the league in completion percentage, and first downs offense (259).

PACK RECORDS THREE GAMES WITH 600-PLUS YARDS OF OFFENSE LAST SEASON: The Pack offense recorded three games last season with 600 or more yards of total offense as they had 718 yards of offense at Adams State, 614 yards at Fort Lewis and 604 yards in the 2024 season opener at South Dakota Mines. The 614 yards of offense was the ninth most total offensive yards in a game in school history. In fact, since the beginning of the 2023 season, the Pack has now recorded four of the Top 10 total offensive yardage outputs in school history. PACK TIES SCHOOL RECORD FOR BLOCKED KICKS

IN 2024: One of the biggest strengths for the Pack last season was their ability to block kicks as they tied a single-season school record for blocks with seven, which was eighth-best in Division II and second in the RMAC. The Pack blocked three punts and four field goals. The three blocked punts were fifth-best in Division II and second in the RMAC. In addition, the Pack also set a single-game school record with three blocked kicks at home against Black Hills State, which was tied for the second-most in a game during the 2024 season. Sophomore linebacker **Shallum Peter** led the way with three, which is tied with **Corey Orth** for most in a single season by a Pack player. Peter's three blocked kicks were tops in the RMAC and fourth-best in Division II.

STRONG ON PUNT RETURN DEFENSE IN 2024: Along with its ability to block kicks during the 2024 season, the Pack was among the Division II national leaders in punt return defense as the Pack allowed their 12 opponents to average just 2.0 yards per punt return, which was tops in the RMAC and fourth in Division II. The Pack's opponents returned 12 punts for 24 yards on the season.

PACK AMONG DIVISION II LEADERS IN SACKS IN

2024: The Pack closed out the 2024 season leading the RMAC and sixth in Division II in sacks per game as they averaged 3.3 sacks per game. On the season, the Pack finished with a total of 40 sacks, which is fifth on the school's single-season list. The Pack defense had five players record three or more sacks on the season, including **Makeah Scippio** leading the way with 10, which is tied for eighth-most on the school's single-season chart. Over the past two-plus seasons, the Pack defense has recorded 105 sacks over a total of 32 games as along with 40 sacks last season, the Pack tallied 37 sacks during the 2023 season and has had 28 sacks this season and is averaging 3.11 sacks per game, which is 15th nationally in Division II.

PACK MOUNTS THIRD-LARGEST COMEBACK FOR WIN IN SCHOOL HISTORY AT CHADRON STATE:

In the Pack's win in last season's regular season finale at Chadron State, the Pack trailed 21-7 at half against the Eagles, but would outscore Chadron State 31-0 in the second half, including scoring 24 points in the third quarter to post the 38-21 victory. The 14-point comeback was at the time the second largest comeback (now it is the third largest) for a win in school history as the only larger comeback win before this year's comeback win at Western Colorado came in 2012 as the Pack trailed 21-3 just six-plus minutes into the second quarter against Chadron State, before rallying for a 45-38 win in overtime against the Eagles.

FULLER SETS NEW SINGLE SEASON RECORDS FOR COMPLETION PERCENTAGE AND PASS EFFICIENCY IN 2024: Senior quarterback **Roman Fuller** set new single

season passing records in his first season with the Pack in 2024. On the season, Fuller was 137-for-195 passing for 1,842 yards and had 18 touchdown passes and four interceptions. He set new single-season school records for both completion percentage (70.3 percent) and passing efficiency (176.0). The 70.3 completion percentage was also tops in both the RMAC and Division II. Fuller had three or more touchdown passes in a game four times and passed for over 200 yards in five games, including a season-high 435 yards on a 34-for-46 effort through the air at Western Colorado.

PACK DEFENSE STEPPED UP LAST SEASON: The Pack defense stepped up last season as they have allowed just a total of 244 points and have allowed a total of 3,987 yards for an average of 4.4 yards per play and 332.3 yards per game. The Pack defense has also forced 21 turnovers, recorded 40 sacks and 87 tackles for loss on the season. The Pack finished fifth in the RMAC in scoring defense (20.3), seventh in rushing defense (134.3), and third in passing defense (197.9).

HARD TO PASS AGAINST THE PACK LAST YEAR:

With a defensive secondary that was among the best in the league, the Pack made it difficult for teams to pass the ball during the 2024 season as they were third in the league in pass defense as they are allowing just 197.9 passing yards per game and were second in the RMAC and 20th in Division II in passing efficiency defense as their opponents posted a passing efficiency of just 106.05 on the year. The Pack's opponents completed 52.7 percent (223-for-423) of its passes on year and allowed just two foes - Black Hills State and Western Colorado - to pass for more than 250 yards in a game on the season as the Yellow Jackets passed for 297 yards and they allowed 405 passing yards to Western Colorado. The Pack was also second in the RMAC in interceptions with 15 as they collected at least one interception in nine of its 12 games, including picking off four passes at Fort Lewis. **Donovan English** and **Kahden Rullo** led the way with three interceptions each.

SEIDENBERGER FOLLOWS UP IMPRESSIVE FRESHMAN SEASON WITH STRONG SOPHOMORE CAMPAIGN IN 2024:

After recording 50 tackles and being named the RMAC Defensive Freshman of the Year in 2023, junior linebacker **Gary Seidenberger** had an impressive sophomore season in 2024 as he led the Pack with a team-high 87 total tackles, along with 7.5 tackles for a loss, three sacks and two pass break-ups. He recorded double-digit tackles in four of his last five games to close out the 2024 season as he tallied 13 tackles against both Black Hills State and Western Colorado and then had 11 tackles, along with 2.5 tackles for a loss and two sacks against Mines. He then had eight tackles and a tackle for a loss at Chadron State and closed the season with a career-high 14 tackles in the NCAA Playoff loss to Minnesota State. On the season, Seidenberger averaged 7.9 tackles per game, which was fourth-best in the RMAC. Entering Saturday's game with UTPB, Seidenberger has tallied 200 career tackles, 12.5 tackles for a loss and 4.5 career sacks. This season, he is second on the team in tackles with 63 and has had 3.5 tackles for a loss, a sack, a two pass break-up and three quarterback hurries.

PACK STRONG ON THIRD DOWN DEFENSE LAST SEASON:

One of the biggest reasons for the Pack's success on defense last season was their performance on third down. On the season, the Pack defense limited their 12 opponents to a 66-for-203 effort (33 percent) on third down and the 33 percent third-down defense percentage was seventh-best in the RMAC and 34th nationally in Division II. Since the beginning of last season, the Pack's opponents are converting just 32.6 percent of its third downs (111-for-340) as they finished last season 52-for-156 (33.3 percent) on third down and was 66-for-203 (33.3 percent) last season.

SINGLE DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED BY PLAYERS VOTE AGAIN THIS SEASON:

For the third straight

season, the Pack players voted to award single digit numbers to the most deserving players and leaders in the program. The nine players (a 10th player earned a single digit number, Domingo Prince II, but he can't wear a single digit number since he is an offensive lineman) listed below were selected by their teammates to be worthy of having a single digit number this season.

football's premier scholar-athlete award. The nominee must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of playing eligibility and have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, having outstanding football playing ability and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The 12-16 finalists for the 2025 award will be announced on Oct. 22 by the National Football Foundation.

DEFENSE CONTINUES TO BE STRENGTH FOR PACK:

Since restarting the football program in 2008, Pack has made playing defense a staple of its program. Since 2011, the Pack have had one of the most stingiest and unforgiving defense in all of Division II as they have finished in the Top 20 nationally in scoring defense almost every season. The Pack led the country in 2011 and 2014. Additionally, the Pack has also ranked in the Top 25 in turnover ratio (or turnovers gained) in all but two seasons, as they ranked 23rd in 2023 as they gained 24 turnovers and in 2024 as they gained 21 turnovers. The Pack led the country in that category in both 2014 and 2018.

275 WINS AND COUNTING: CSU Pueblo enters Saturday's game with UTPB having won 275 football games since becoming a four-year school in 1963 as they are sporting a 275-142-4 overall record. The Pack played its first-ever game as a four-year school against Emporia State on Sept. 14, 1963 and did not field a team from 1985-2007. In addition, Saturday's game with UTPB will also mark the 205th game since the football program rebooted in 2008. Since reinstating football in 2008, the Pack has posted a 161-43 overall record, including a 132-24 record in RMAC play.

ADAMS STATE GAME IN 2023 WAS PROGRAM'S 250TH ALL-TIME FOOTBALL WIN: The Pack's Homecoming game in 2023 with Adams State marked the 250th

all-time victory as a four-year school in football for CSU Pueblo. In that game against Adams State, the Pack defeated the Grizzlies, 43-10, to secure the program's 250th all-time victory in football since 1963. The program's first-ever win as a four year school came on Sept. 29, 1963 as the Pack collected a 26-7 win at St. Mary's of the Plains. The Pack have now won 275 all-time games heading into this week's game with UTPB.

422 GAMES AND COUNTING: Saturday's game with UTPB will be the 422nd all-time game for CSU Pueblo since becoming a four year school in 1963. In addition, the Pack has played 204 games since restarting football in 2008 and have posted a 161-43 (.789 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2008 season.

21 POINTS IS MAGIC NUMBER: CSU Pueblo sports a 161-16 record (.910 winning percentage) when scoring at least 21 points in a game since the beginning of the 2008 season, including going 10-2 last season when scoring 21 or more points with the lone setbacks coming at home to Grand Valley State (24-21) in the regular season and Minnesota State (26-23) in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Entering Saturday's UTPB game, the Pack have scored 21 or more points in 41 of its last 46 games, including tallying 21 or more points in 30 consecutive games since being held to 14 points against Mines during the 2023 season. The Pack is 10-1 this season when scoring 21 or more points with the only loss coming at home to Fort Hays State in its second game of the 2025 season.

SEVEN OR MORE WINS 15 TIMES IN LAST 17 SEASONS: Thanks to its win at Black Hills State on Oct. 18, CSU Pueblo has now won at least seven games in

a season for the 15th time in the last 17 seasons. The Pack had a streak of five straight double-digit win seasons from 2011-15 before winning eight games during the 2016 season. The Pack has now won 10 games in a season for the second straight year (2024 and 2025) and ninth time since the football program was rebooted in 2008.

GAME OPERATIONS MOVES TO EAST SIDE PRESS BOX AT THUNDERBOWL:

During the offseason, the CSU Pueblo Foundation began construction of several new suites on the west side of the ThunderBowl. With the addition of the suites on the west side for the 2025 season, all game operations (ThunderTron, SID Staff, Coaches, Radio, Media) have now moved over

a renovated east side press box for the 2025 season. The new east side press box has also been renamed the Robert Hoag Rawlings Press Box thanks to a naming rights donation from the Robert Hoag Rawlings Foundation.

PACK ATHLETICS RECORDS PROGRAM-HIGH 12TH PLACE FINISH IN 2024-25 LEARFIELD DIVISION II DIRECTORS' CUP:

During the 2024-25 school year, CSU Pueblo Athletics recorded its highest ever finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings as the ThunderWolves' finished 12th overall in the ranking of athletic department performances at the NCAA Division II level. CSU Pueblo recorded a program-best 592.50 total points to finish in the Top 25 in the final standings for the third consecutive year and just the second time finishing inside the Top 20 in program history. The previous best finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings came in 2022-23 when the Pack finished 16th with a then program-best 550.25 points. During the 2024-25 school year, the Pack recorded a third-place finish in women's cross country, was tied for third in men's soccer, placed sixth at the NCAA Division II Women's Indoor Track and Field National Championships and the football team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs. In addition, the Pack had Top 15 finishes in women's outdoor track and field, men's indoor and outdoor track and field championships.

CAMERON McDONDLE BECOMES 19TH FOOTBALL PLAYER TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME:

On Friday, Oct. 4, 2024, former Pack football running back **Cameron McDondle** became the 18th Pack football player to be inducted into the CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Fame as he joined the Class of 2024. McDondle, who played for the Pack from 2012-15, was a

four-year letterman for Coach **John Wristen**. At the end of his collegiate career, McDondle compiled 5,951 rushing yards to become the school's all-time rushing leader. The 5,951 career rushing yards is second-most in RMAC history and 15th all-time in NCAA Division II. In his career, he averaged 126.6 rushing yards per game and scored a school record 56 rushing touchdowns and averaged 6.6 yards per carry as he totaled 897 career carries for the ThunderWolves and rushed for more than 100 yards in 31 career games, which included 10 straight 100-plus rushing games as a senior in 2015 and gained 100 or more rushing yards in 23 of his last 25 career games. Finished third in the Harlon Hill Trophy voting as a senior. Earned First-Team AP Little All-America honors and was also an All-American selection by D2Football.com, D2CCA and *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* and was a two-time First-Team All-RMAC selection as a junior and senior and was the 2015 RMAC Offensive Player of the Year.

1982 NAIA PLAYOFF TEAM BECOMES SECOND FOOTBALL TEAM TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME:

While McDondle was the 18th Pack football player to be inducted into the CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Fame, the 1982 football team became the second football team to be inducted into the Hall of Fame as they joined the 2014 NCAA Division II National Championship team on Friday, Oct. 4. The 1982 football team was coached by Class of 2023 Hall of Fame inductee **Mike Friedman** and posted a 9-1 regular season record and made the program's first-ever postseason appearance with a trip to the NAIA Playoffs, where the Pack lost to eventual national champion Central State of Oklahoma. The nine wins matched a program high at the time. The team was ranked as high as fifth nationally during the season as the only other setback in 1982 was a 14-13 loss at Colorado Mesa. The team, who was led by longtime former CSU Pueblo football coach **John Wristen** at quarterback, led the RMAC in total offense and passing as Wristen completed 68-of-121 passes for 1,358 yards and had 13 touchdowns and just two interceptions. **John Trahan** was the league's top receiver with 41 catches for 917 yards and 10 touchdowns, while **Herman Heard** and **Jeff Patterson** combined to rush of 1,472 yards and scored 19 touchdowns and linebacker and CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Famer **Dan DeRose** was the top tackler with 12.5 stops per game. Trahan was named a Second-Team NAIA All-American and was joined on the All-RMAC First Team by Wristen, offensive lineman **Jeff England**, defensive lineman **Craig Ward** and linebacker **Mark DeRose**.

PACK NFL PROS: Entering the 2025 season, CSU Pueblo has one former player listed on active NFL rosters. **Mike Pennel**, who played at CSU Pueblo in 2013, was signed by Cincinnati Bengals to its practice squad prior to the start of the 2025 season and was put on the Bengals active roster before the start of the season. Pennel played in eight games

20 regular season and five playoff games with the Chiefs since 2023. During the 2024 off season, Pennel resigned with the Chiefs on a one-year contract for the 2025 season. Pennel, who was released by the Chiefs in the final cuts of the 2025 preseason, has now played 13 seasons in the NFL with six different franchises. He was also a member of Kansas City's 2019 and 2023 Super Bowl Championship teams. In addition to Pennel, **Morgan Fox**, who played for the Pack from 2012-15, was also released by the Atlanta Falcons in the preseason after signing a two-year, \$8.5 million dollar free agent contract in the off season and was recently signed by the Buffalo Bills to their practice squad. Fox played the past three seasons with the Los Angeles Chargers. Fox began his NFL career as an undrafted free agent in 2016 with Los Angeles Rams and played for them from 2016-20, before playing the 2021 season with the Carolina Panthers. In his career, he has collected 183 tackles, 51 quarterback hits, 27.5 sacks, 33 tackles for a loss, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries, three passes defended and a safety over his eight-year career with three NFL teams. Four other former Pack players have recently spent time in NFL camps as **Trey Botts**, who played for the Pack from 2017-22, lasted until final cuts with the Baltimore Ravens after being signed by the team as an undrafted free agent in 2023. Botts was also selected in the eighth round by Philadelphia in the 2023 USFL Draft and signed to play in the CFL with the Toronto Argonauts, while **Nick Williams**, who played with the Pack from 2018-21 and completed his collegiate career in 2022 at UNLV, was signed as an undrafted free agent with the Denver Broncos and was in 2023 preseason camp with the Broncos until being released at end of training camp. In addition, two members of the 2024 Pack team - defensive end **Makeah Scippio** and receiver **Taylor Tosches** - received invitations to participate in the Denver Broncos 2025 Rookie Minicamp on May 9-11, 2025.

JENSEN RETIRES FROM NFL AFTER 2023 SEASON, PLAYED NINE TOTAL SEASONS WITH BALTIMORE AND TAMPA BAY: Former CSU Pueblo and RMAC Hall of Famer and longtime NFL veteran center **Ryan Jensen** announced his retirement from football on Friday, Feb. 2. Jensen, who was inducted into the CSU Pueblo Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2023 and the RMAC Hall of Fame in July of 2025, retired after having played nine years in the NFL, including the final six seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Jensen began his NFL career with the Baltimore Ravens, who selected him the sixth round of the 2013 NFL Draft. Jensen played for the Ravens from 2013-17. Jensen, who sat out the entire 2023 season due to injury, sustained a significant injury on the second day of training camp in 2022, including complete tears of his MCL and PCL ligaments, along with a partial ACL tear. He missed the entire 2022 regular season before playing the Bucs' first round playoff game loss to the Dallas Cowboys, which would be the final NFL game of Jensen's career. In his 11-year NFL career, Jensen played in 100

career regular season games, with 90 starts at center. Since becoming a full-time starter in 2017, Jensen played 5,307 offensive snaps, which is 27th most in the league over that span. He was the anchor of the Bucs' offensive line and became one of the best at his position in the NFL. In addition, he was the starting center on the Tampa Bay Bucs 2020 Super Bowl winning team that defeated the Kansas City Chiefs in Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla., and was named to the NFL Pro Bowl in 2021. During his playing career with the Pack that was from 2009-12, Jensen was a four-year starter and earned All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors over this final three seasons at CSU Pueblo, including earning First-Team All-RMAC honors in both 2011 and 2012. As a senior in 2012, Jensen was a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award and also earned First-Team Daktronics All-America honors and Second-Team AP Little All-America accolades. During the 2012 season, Jensen did not allow a sack in 13 games and averaged over 13 knockdown blocks per game. He also earned All-America honors as a junior in 2011.

PACK HAD TWO PLAYERS PLAYING IN THE CANADIAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE DURING 2024 SEASON:

Along with currently having two active NFL players, the Pack also had two former players listed on active rosters in the Canadian Football League during the 2024 season. Among the former Pack players listed on CFL rosters in 2024 were **Darius Williams**, who has played three seasons as a linebacker for the Calgary Stampeders and **Dean Faithfull** played the 2023 and 2024 seasons as a kicker with the Edmonton Elks. Faithfull, who played at CSU Pueblo in 2021, was a first round draft pick (2nd overall) in the 2023 CFL Global Draft, while Williams, who played defensive back with the Pack from 2015-18, was signed as a free agent with Calgary in 2021. Neither of those players played in the CFL during the 2025 season.

Colorado State University Pueblo Head Football Coach Philip Vigil



Philip Vigil is 11 games into his third season as the head coach of the Colorado State University Pueblo football program in 2025. Vigil was named just the fifth football coach and the second since the program was restarted in 2008 in the history of the ThunderWolves' program in December 2022.

Vigil's appointment as the Pack's new football coach came following the retirement of long-time CSU Pueblo head coach **John Wristen**, who was hired by his alma mater to resurrect the ThunderWolves football program in 2007. Wristen spent 15 seasons (2008-22) as the head coach.

"I'd like to express my gratitude to President (Dr. Timothy) Mottet and Dr. (Paul) Plinske. My family and I are incredibly excited to return to Colorado," Vigil said about returning to his home state as CSU Pueblo's head coach. "I'm thankful for the time we had in Silver City and for the support of our friends and colleagues at Western New Mexico University. Melanie and I are looking forward to joining the Pack and becoming active members of the Pueblo community. Coach Wristen established a great program at CSU Pueblo. I'm honored to be named as the second coach in ThunderWolves' history and I'm eager to get to work."

Vigil's second Pack team in 2024 posted a 10-2 overall record and went undefeated in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference play with a 9-0 record. The Pack earned the program's ninth all-time RMAC title and first outright league title since 2013. The team earned the No. 1 seed in Super Region IV and hosted a second round NCAA Playoff game against Minnesota State. The Pack finished the season ranked No. 8 and No. 11 in the final AFCA Division II Coaches and D2Football.com polls.

The Pack offense finished the 2024 season ranked in the Top 10 in Division II

in passing (6th, a school record 308.5 yards per game), scoring offense (7th, a school record 40.2 points per game), total offense (9th, a school record 462.3 yards per game) and passing completion percentage (10th, a school record .656 percent). In addition, the Pack was 11th in Division II in team passing efficiency at 163.5.

Meanwhile, on the defense, the Pack was sixth in sacks as they averaged 3.33 per game and 16th in interceptions as they picked off 15 passes and was eighth in Division II in blocked kicks with seven, including a school-record tying three blocked kicks.

In his first season in 2023, Vigil led the program to an 8-3 overall record and a 7-2 mark in the RMAC. His first Pack team ended the season by winning seven straight games. Vigil's team led NCAA Division II in kickoff return average as they averaged 29.95 yards per return.

Meanwhile, the Pack offense ranked in the Top 10 in NCAA Division II in passing offense (7th, 289.7 yards per game) and scoring offense (9th, 42.0 points per game) and fewest sacks allowed (10th, 0.91 per game), while the Pack defense was ranked 10th nationally in quarterback sacks as they averaged 3.27 per game.

Vigil, who is no stranger to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference as he played at Colorado Mesa from 2005-08 and also coached with the Mavericks from 2012-14 and spent one season coaching at Colorado School of Mines, arrived at CSU Pueblo after spending two seasons (2021-22) as the head football coach at Western New Mexico University, which is a member of the Lone Star Conference and is located in Silver City, New Mexico.

Under Vigil's leadership, the Mustangs recorded the program's first winning season in the LSC since 1993 during the 2022 campaign. During Vigil's tenure, the Mustangs' football program earned 22 All-Conference awards from the LSC, including a program-best 17 selections in 2022. Those 17 selections were the most for the program in its LSC history.

Following a 30-year championship drought, Vigil led the Mustangs to the Chile Bowl Championship in 2022 as Western New Mexico defeated its rival, Eastern New Mexico, 38-24. The win over Eastern New Mexico culminated a 6-5 season in 2022. The six wins were the most for the program since the 2005 Mustangs team posted a 5-5 overall record.

Prior to Vigil's arrival, the Mustangs football program had won a total five football games over a span of four seasons.

Prior to getting his first head football coach position at Western New Mexico, Vigil spent 12 seasons as an assistant football coach at the collegiate level.

Vigil came to Western New Mexico in 2021 after serving as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator for Head Coach Colby Carthel at NCAA Division I Stephen F. Austin in 2019 and 2020.

During his time with the Lumberjacks, Vigil played a pivotal role in Stephen F. Austin in recruiting back-to-back Top 5 recruiting classes and back-to-back No. 1 recruiting class in the Southland Conference.

On the coaching front at Stephen F. Austin, Vigil coached freshman running back Ja'quarion Turner to First-Team All-Conference honors in 2020. The 2020 SFA team captured its first winning season in over a decade by posting a 6-4 record. The only four losses that season came against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) programs.

Prior to coaching at Stephen F. Austin, Vigil coached four years at (2015-18) as Fort Hays State University in Hays, Kan., as the program's Pass Game Coordinator and Re-

cruting Coordinator.

During his time at Fort Hays State, the Tigers posted a 36-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason all four years and won back-to-back Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) in 2017 and 2018.

In both 2015 and 2018, under Vigil's leadership, two different Tiger quarterbacks (Treveon Albert in 2015 and Jacob Mezera in 2018) would break school records for both total yards and total touchdowns. Those two quarterbacks would also go on to earn both All-Conference and All-American honors.

Before arriving at Fort Hays State in 2014, Vigil was the Associate Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach for three seasons (2012-14) as his alma mater, Colorado Mesa University. During his time coaching at Colorado Mesa, the Mavericks won a total 15 games over three seasons and also won 13 conference games during that same time period.

From 2010-11, Vigil spent two seasons coaching running backs at NCAA Division II powerhouse Northwest Missouri State University. During his tenure with the Bearcats, two of his running backs earned All-Conference and All-American honors.

As a team, the Bearcats posted a 22-5 record over Vigil's two seasons in Maryville, Mo., and he was part of the coaching staff when the Bearcats won 46 consecutive games in MIAA play. In 2010, Northwest Missouri State finished ranked No. 3 in the final AFCA Division II Top 25

poll and advanced to the National Semifinals, while a season later, he helped the Bearcat offense lead Division II in scoring as they averaged 48.6 points per game.

Vigil started his collegiate coaching career in 2009 as a defensive backs coach at Colorado School of Mines.

A former quarterback at Colorado Mesa from 2005-08, Vigil was a two-year starter under center for the Mavericks. In 2007, he led Mesa to a 10-2 record and an NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. The 2007 Colorado Mesa team ended the season ranked 19th in the final AFCA Top 25 Poll.

He finished his playing career at Colorado

Mesa as a two-time All-RMAC selection and was ranked all-time in school history in career passing yards (4,583) and second and third in single season passing yards (2,032 and 1,960). In the classroom, he was named an RMAC All-Academic honoree four times.

Vigil, who is a native of Arvada, Colo., and graduated from Faith Christian High School, earned his bachelor's degree in Sports Management from Colorado Mesa in 2008 and his Master's degree in Education from Northwest Missouri State in 2011.

He and his wife, Melanie, live in Pueblo West have three children - son, Peyton and daughters, Ava and Olivia.
