Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Hugh Freeze at approximately 11:30 a.m. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m.

PRACTICES: Viewing is permitted for approved media for select portions of practice on Tuesdays during the season. If you do not regularly attend practices, please contact Media Relations prior to your visit for exact details on times and location. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until after the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and no formations. On available days, video is permitted for individual drills only, and media will be alerted which portions of practice (including stretch) are available for video. Credential requests must be made by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspapers; (2) network affiliate television stations; (3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; (4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. PHOTOGRAPHERS: Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter through Gate 6 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) new garage; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST MEMPHIS

Sept. 27, 2014 • Oxford, Miss. • #10 Ole Miss 24, Memphis 3: The Rebels allowed just 104 total yards, including 23 rushing yards on 31 carries. Excluding one 42-yard pass play in the first quarter, the Rebel defense allowed just 62 total yards on the other 61 plays from scrimmage. The offense generated 426 total yards, but 10 penalties for 117 yards, four turnovers and two missed field goals limited its final score. Wide receiver Laquon Treadwell had five catches for 123 yards and two touchdowns.

Sept. 6, 2009 • Memphis, Tenn. • #8 Ole Miss 45, Memphis 14: Junior QB Jevan Snead extended his streak to 10 straight games with a TD pass and finished 12-of-22 for 175 yards, two TDs and two interceptions. RB Brandon Bolden rushed for a TD for the fourth straight game and sixth time in his career. He topped the team in rushing with 71 yards on nine carries. The eighth-ranked Rebels walked away with a 45-14 win over Memphis.

Aug. 30, 2008 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 41, Memphis 24: Ole Miss QB Jevan Snead connected on 10-of-22 passes for 185 yards and

two scores in his Rebel debut. The Rebels jumped out to a 27-10 lead at halftime, and first-year head coach Houston Nutt grabbed his first win at Ole Miss, 41-24.

Sept. 1, 2007 • Memphis, Tenn. • Ole Miss 23, Memphis 21: Ole Miss DB Dustin Mouzon intercepted two Martin Hankins passes, one of which he returned 99 yards for a touchdown, as the Rebels held off Memphis with a 23-21 victory. Hankins, who completed 41-of-60 passes for 343 yards and four touchdowns, brought the Tigers within two points late in the fourth quarter. However, with 31 seconds left in the game, the Rebels stopped Memphis' 2-point conversion to preserve the win.

Sept. 3, 2006 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 28, Memphis 25: Benlarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 127 yards and two touchdowns to help Ole Miss beat Memphis 28-25 in the season opener. Freshman WR Dexter McCluster ran 31 yards for a TD on a trick play and had 268 all-purpose yards, fourth-most in school history. Brent Schaeffer connected on 7-of-16 passes for 97 yards.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE

Hugh Freeze (Southern Miss, 1992) is in his fourth season at the Ole Miss helm. He inherited a team that went 2-10 and winless in SEC games in 2011 and has led the Rebels to three straight bowl games, including a berth in one of the inaugural "New Year's Six" bowls last season. A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze owns a 29-16 mark in Oxford and a career record of 59-23. His .644 winning percentage at Ole Miss is the second-best of any Rebel coach in the last 100 years. He was named the University's 37th head football coach on Dec. 5, 2011, coming to Oxford after one year as head coach at Arkansas State where he led the Red Wolves to a 10-2 season and the 2011 Sun Belt Conference title and was tabbed Sun Belt Coach of the Year. It is his second stint at Ole Miss, as he was a member of the Rebel coaching staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator with two of the top classes in school history.

MEMPHIS HEAD COACH JUSTIN FUENTE

Justin Fuente (Murray State, 1999) is in his fourth year as Memphis' head coach. In his first stop as a head coach, Fuente has led the Tigers to a 22-20 mark, including a 10-3 record and an American Athletic Conference Championship last season. He has directed Memphis to a 5-0 start and top-25 national ranking so far this year. Fuente was co-offensive coordinator at TCU from 2009-11 prior to taking the Memphis job. He was offensive coordinator at Illinois State before going to TCU.

MEMPHIS SCOUTING REPORT

Memphis is 5-0 (2-0 American Athletic Conference) and ranked No. 22 in the Amway coaches poll entering this week's Mid-South showdown with Ole Miss. Among the five wins are three road victories over Kansas (55-23), Bowling Green (44-41) and USF (24-17), as well as a thrilling 53-46 barnburner over Cincinnati. Justin Fuente's Tigers rank fourth nationally in scoring with 47.8 points per outing and eighth in total offense with 541.2 yards per game. Paxton Lynch has been sensational at quarterback, completing 70.6 percent of his passes (103-for-146) for 1,535 yards, 10 touchdowns and no interceptions. Three rushers have each scored four touchdowns - Jarvis Cooper (244 yards), Sam Craft (199 yards) and Doroland Dorceus (175 yards). Anthony Miller (15 catches, 304 yards, 1 TD) and Mose Frazier (21 catches, 279 yards, 2 TDs) have been Lynch's top targets to date. As a team, Memphis has turned the ball over just four times this season, while collecting seven total takeaways on defense.

REBELS SOAR TO OFFENSIVE RECORDS

- In six games Ole Miss has scored 281 points, which surpasses the *season* totals from these recent seasons: 2011 (193), 2007 (241), 2006 (188), 2005 (148), 2004 (215).
- Ole Miss has scored 50+ points in three games for the first time in school history.
- For the first time in school history, Ole Miss has eclipsed 600 total yards three times in a season ... The Rebels had never done it more than once in any of the 120 prior seasons.
- The Rebels' 665 yards vs. New Mexico State are second-most in a game in school history, while the 662 vs. UT Martin rank third and 607 vs. Fresno State rank eighth all-time.
- The Rebels scored 43+ points in three straight games for the first time in school history.
- The team's 192 points in the first three games tied the 1995 Florida State team for third-most points through the first three games in FBS history.
- The Rebels set school records with 149 points in a two-game span and 192 points in a three-game span.
- Ole Miss is the first team in SEC history to score 73+ points in back-to-back games and the first from any conference since Houston in 1968.
- Ole Miss scored 50+ points in back-to-back games for the first time in school history.
- First SEC team to score 70+ in consecutive games since Florida in 1994.

GET READY, SCOREBOARD

Saturday's matchup features the No. 4 and No. 5 scoring offenses in the country. Memphis is fourth at 47.8 points per outing, while Ole Miss is fifth at 46.8. The Tigers' season high for points is 63, while the Rebels have put up 76 and 73. The last time either team scored 50 points in this series was in a 61-7 Ole Miss win in 1980.

LANDSHARKS LOVE TURNOVERS

- The Rebels' Landshark defense is tied for second among SEC teams and tied for 20th nationally with 12 takeaways.
- The Rebels forced five turnovers in the 43-37 win at No. 2 Alabama.
- Ole Miss leads the SEC and is tied for 12th nationally with nine interceptions.
- The Rebels' three defensive touchdowns are tied for most in the nation.
- Last year, Ole Miss led the SEC and ranked eighth nationally with 34 turnovers forced, including a league-best 22 interceptions.

SPORTS ILLUSTRATED COVER

For the second straight year, Ole Miss was featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated after a win over Alabama. The Sept. 23 issue shows a jubilant **Trae Elston** after the senior safety's interception of Alabama quarterback Cooper Bateman in the Rebels' 43-37 win, their first in Tuscaloosa since 1988. It's the sixth time Ole Miss has been featured on the national cover of the iconic magazine. The others:

- Sept. 24, 1962: College football preview showcased the Rebelettes.



- Junior QB Chad Kelly, a transfer from East Mississippi Community College after starting his career at Clemson, has
 helped Ole Miss to a 5-1 start and impressive offensive numbers by completing 121 of 188 passes for 1,862 yards
 with 14 TDs and five interceptions.
- Kelly leads the SEC in passing (310.3 ypg, 12th in nation), total offense (331.8 ypg, 11th in nation), passing touchdowns (14, 11th in nation), points responsible for (108, 7th in nation), yards per completion (15.39, 7th in nation) and yards per attempt (9.9, 4th in nation).
- He ranks second in the SEC and 12th nationally with a pass efficiency rating of 166.8.
- His four 300-yard passing games are tied for most in a season in school history with Bo Wallace (2013, 2014) and Eli Manning (2002, 2003) ... Kelly's total is third on the Ole Miss career chart behind Wallace (11) and Manning (10).
- First SEC QB since Johnny Manziel in 2012 to account for five touchdowns in a half (4 pass, 1 rush vs. Fresno State).
- First QB to lead his team to victory in Tuscaloosa since Texas A&M's Manziel in 2012.
- Kelly's 416 yards of total offense vs. NM State (384 passing, 32 rushing) are fourth-most in a game in school history.

SPREADING THE BALL

- Through six games, 15 different Rebels have scored touchdowns (13 on offense, two on defense).
- Seven different Rebels have rushed for at least one touchdown: Chad Kelly (4), Jaylen Walton (3), Eugene Brazley (3), Robert Nkemdiche (2), Jordan Wilkins (2), Akeem Judd (2) and D.K. Buford (1).
- Seven different Rebels have caught a touchdown pass: Quincy Adeboyejo (5), Laquon Treadwell (3), Cody Core (3), Markell Pack (3), Damore'ea Stringfellow (1), Robert Nkemdiche (1) and Damarkus Lodge (1).
- Notably, preseason All-America TE Evan Engram has yet to score this season.
- Eighteen different Rebels have caught a pass, while 14 different Rebels have logged a rushing attempt.

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM EXPANSION AND RENOVATIONS

A number of renovations, expansions and improvements are underway for Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field as part of the Forward Together capital campaign (that has also helped create the new Pavilion at Ole Miss for basketball).

PHASE 1: Completed for this season are renovations to the south end zone that have added 770 club seats, 30 new luxury suites and a new ribbon board. The west suites and press box also received a fresh refinishing.

PHASE 2: When the 2016 season begins, the north end zone will be enclosed, bringing stadium capacity to 64,038. New video boards and sound system will be installed. A new plaza and bell tower on the north side of the stadium will give Ole Miss Football an exciting new "front door." A green space will extend the Walk of Champions from The Grove to the new plaza. The south end zone will have a new field-level club area.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss ranks sixth in the SEC and 31st nationally in scoring defense (19.7 ppg) after leading the country in that category last season.
- Ole Miss ranks seventh in the SEC and 36th in the nation in total defense (337.5 ypg).
- The Rebels' pass efficiency defense (113.4) is fourth in the SEC and 38th nationally.
- The Rebels average 8.0 tackles for loss per outing, which is fifth-best among SEC teams and tied for 15th nationally.
- Senior DB **Trae Elston** is one of seven players in the nation with a pair of interception returns for TD this year ... His 93-yard return against UT Martin was the Rebels' longest since Charles Sawyer's 96-yarder vs. BYU in 2011.
- Elston leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with four interceptions ... He's vying to become the third straight Rebel to lead the SEC in picks (Cody Prewitt in 2013, Senguez Golson in 2014).
- Senior DB Mike Hilton is tied for second among SEC players and 26th nationally with seven passes defended, while sophomore CB Kendarius Webster is tied for fifth in the league with six.
- Sophomore DB A.J. Moore is tied atop the SEC with two fumble recoveries and is tied for fourth in the league with
 two forced fumbles.
- Senior LB Denzel Nkemdiche leads the Rebels with 38 tackles, while his younger brother DT Robert Nkemdiche
 tops the team with 5.5 TFLs.
- Twenty-three different Rebels have recorded a tackle for loss, and seven different players have registered a sack.
- Senior DB Chief Brown returned an INT 22 yards for his first career touchdown vs. Fresno State.

FIRST 100 YEARS OF VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM

Ole Miss is celebrating the first 100 years of Vaught-Hemingway Stadium this season. The longtime home of Ole Miss Football began its life in 1915 when students helped build the first grandstands. The stadium's permanent foundation was a three-year, federally funded project from 1939-41. Stadium capacity was originally listed at 24,000. It will top 64,000 next season after the enclosure of the north end zone. The Rebels boast an all-time record of 262-93-8 (.733 winning percentage) at Vaught-Hemingway.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

In the spring, senior DB **Mike Hilton** became the 25th different Rebel to be awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a standout defensive player each year. The award honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Hilton wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

LANDSHARK

At Ole Miss, "Landshark" is a term adopted by the Rebel football team's defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players will celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of "fins up" also contributes to the players' persona.

With the popularity of both the players and the "Landshark" celebration, Ole Miss student-athletes from other sports have even performed the hand gesture as a tribute to their fellow Rebels on the football team.

Roots of the "Landshark" at Ole Miss date back to 2008. After four straight losing seasons, the Rebel football team returned to national prominence with a 9-4 record and a victory over 7th-ranked Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl. Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense and included All-Americans Peria Jerry and Greg Hardy and eventual All-SEC standout Jerrell Powe.

The term "Landshark" originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the "Landshark."

GENERAL: This was the first meeting all-time between Ole Miss and UT Martin ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was 60,186 ... Ole Miss improved to 90-26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of the last 20 ... The Rebels' 76 points are their most since scoring 92 against West Tennessee Teachers College (now known as University of Memphis) in 1935 ... The Rebels' 27 first-quarter points were their most in the opening frame in modern history (since at least 1962) ... It was the most points in any quarter since scoring 28 in the four th against Boise State in last season's opener ... Ole Miss had its highest first-half scoring output (41) since scoring 42 against Arkansas State in 1990 ... Ole Miss scored 11 touchdowns by 10 different players.

OFFENSE: Senior RB Jaylen Walton only rushed three times, but he piled up 65 yards and a pair of scores, taking rushes from 60 yards and 4 yards to the house ... Touchdowns runs were 60 yards by Walton, 4 yards by Walton, 20 yards by Kelly (first career), 70 yards by Eugene Brazley (first career) and 20 by D.K. Buford (first career) ... Touchdown catches were 56 yards by Markell Pack (first career), 15 yards by Quincy Adeboyejo, 31 yards by Robert Nkemdiche (first career - lined up as an H-back), 57 yards by Cody Core and 12 yards by **DaMarkus Lodge** (first career).

DEFENSE: Senior DB **Trae Elston** returned an interception 93 yards for his first career TD ... It was the longest return since Charles Sawyer's 96-yarder vs. BYU in 2011.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior DB/PR **Carlos Davis** made his debut as the punt returner and had six returns for 80 yards (13.0 average) ... Junior **Robert Nkemdiche** blocked a field goal for the first time in his career and the Rebels' first since Allen Walker did so against Fresno State in 2010.

FRESNO STATE NOTES

GENERAL: This was the third all-time between Ole Miss and Fresno State ... Ole Miss now leads the series 3-0 ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was 60,302 ... The Rebels' 149 points over the last two games are the most in a two-game span in school history ... The previous record was 131 from Oct. 22-29, 1904 ... Ole Miss is the first SEC team ever to score 73+ points in back-to-back games and the first SEC team to score 70+ points in back-to-back games since Florida in 1994 ... Ole Miss has scored 49 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time ever in the same season ... The Rebels' 28 first-quarter points were their most in the opening frame in modern history (since at least 1962), surpassing last week's total of 27 vs. UT Martin.

OFFENSE: Ole Miss gained 607 yards of total offense, the second straight game with more than 600 and the seventh-most in a game in program history ... This was the first time Ole Miss returned two interceptions for touchdowns in a game since 1993 vs. Northern Illinois ... It was the Rebels' first game with multiple defensive touchdowns since Texas A&M last year ... Senior LB **C.J. Johnson** picked off a pass for the second time in his career and returned it 70 yards to set up a Rebel score ... The Ole Miss defense racked up three interceptions, two forced fumbles, 10 tackles for loss and a sack.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore K **Gary Wunderlich** converted all nine PATs and connected on his first FG attempt of the year, a 37-yarder in the fourth quarter.

ALABAMA NOTES

GENERAL: This was the 63rd meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Alabama ... The Crimson Tide now hold a 47-11-2 series lead ... Ole Miss has defeated Alabama in back-to-back years for the first time in history and won in Tuscaloosa for the first time since 1988 ... Attendance at Bryant-Denny Stadium was a capacity crowd of 101,821 ... Ole Miss now has an all-time record of 33-46-3 (.421) in SEC openers ... Ole Miss starts the season 3-0 for the third straight year ... The Rebels' 43 points were their most ever scored in a game in Tuscaloosa and tied for the second-most points ever against Alabama ... This is the first time in school history Ole Miss has scored 43 or more points in three straight games ... Ole Miss handed Alabama its first loss in Tuscaloosa since Texas A&M in 2012 ... The Rebels forced five Alabama turnovers (scoring 24 points off of them) and did not commit a single turnover ... Ole Miss improved to 6-10 against ranked teams under Freeze ... The Rebels are now 4-8 against top-10 teams and 3-3 against top-five foes in the Freeze era.

OFFENSE: Ole Miss was a perfect 4-for-4 in red zone tries (2 TD, 2 FG) and is a perfect 15-for-15 this season (12 TD, 3 FG) ... Junior QB Chad Kelly completed 18 of 33 passes for 341 yards, three TDs and no INTs, while rushing eight times for 21 yards and another score ... Sophomore RB Jordan Wilkins punched in a 1-yard touchdown in the second quarter for his second career TD (first of the season) ... He's the seventh different Rebel to rush for a TD this season ... Junior WR Quincy Adeboyejo caught his fifth touchdown of the season with a crazy 66-yard reception on a desperation heave by Kelly that was tipped up ... SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore K Gary Wunderlich made a career-high three field goals on three attempts, converting from 32, 34 and 45 yards ... Sophomore DB A.J. Moore recovered an Alabama fumble (his first career recovery) on the opening kickoff that set up a Rebel field goal for the game's first score ... He then forced a fumble on a second-quarter Alabama kick return (recovered by Carlos Davis) that set up a Chad Kelly touchdown run.

GENERAL: This was the 90th meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt ... The Rebels now lead the series 50-38-2, including 50-20-2 in SEC games ... Ole Miss defeats Vanderbilt for the third straight year ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was a sell-out crowd of 60,654 ... Ole Miss starts the season 4-0 for the second straight year ... With Vanderbilt's first-quarter field goal, Ole Miss trailed for the first time all year and gave up its first points in the first quarter this season.

OFFENSE: Ole Miss piled up 472 total yards of offense and has eclipsed 400 yards in every game this year ... The Rebels capitalized on five of six red-zone chances and have converted 20 of 21 chances inside the 20 this year ... Junior QB Chad Kelly completed 24 of 42 passes for 321 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions ... It was his third-straight 300-yard game ... Junior WR Laquon Treadwell caught eight passes for a careerhigh 135 yards ... He's now tied for fifth in school history with four career 100-yard receiving games ... With eight catches, Treadwell moves into a tie for fifth in school history with his position coach Grant Heard with 142 career receptions ... Sophomore WR Damore'ea Stringfellow caught four passes for 71 yards, including his first touchdown catch as a Rebel ... Junior DT Robert Nkemdiche punched in a 1-yard run for his third touchdown of the season ... He has scored an offensive TD in three of four games ... Senior RB Jaylen Walton rushed 21 times for 133 yards and a touchdown ... It was his third career 100-yard game ... Walton moves up to 15th place in school history with 1,496 career rushing yards and tied for ninth in school history with 21 career touchdowns ... Walton amassed a career-high 215 all-purpose yards in the game and leapfrogged Brandon Bolden and Jeff Scott into third place in the Ole Miss record book with 3,828 career all-purpose yards ... Sophomore WR Markell Pack caught a career-high six balls for 52 yards.

DEFENSE: Ole Miss held Vandy to one touchdown and 16 points ... Although the Rebels did not sack Vanderbilt, they racked up seven TFLs and eight QB hurries ... Senior LB **Denzel Nkemdiche** led the team with a career-high 14 tackles (career-high 12 solo), his second straight double-digit effort.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore K Gary Wunderlich converted two of three field goals, making from 19 and 39 yards ... Sophomore P Will Gleeson punted four times for a 50.8-yard average and made a first down on a fake punt when he tucked the ball and ran for a 3-yard gain ... It was the first time Ole Miss gained a first down on a fake punt since Robert Nkemdiche did so against Vanderbilt in 2013 ... Playing in his third career game, sophomore Cale Luke blocked a Vanderbilt punt to set up a go-ahead third-quarter touchdown ... Ole Miss' 10 points was its lowest output since last year's 42-3 loss to TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl ... Ole Miss drops to 1-1 this season against ranked teams, 6-11 under **Hugh Freeze** and 64-148-2 all-time ... The Rebels fall to 4-4 against SEC East foes under Freeze and 33-35 overall since the league started divisional play in 1992.

OFFENSE: Ole Miss recorded season lows with 328 total yards, 69 rushing yards and 259 passing yards ... Junior QB **Chad Kelly** completed a pass to 10 different receivers ... Kelly completed 26 of 40 passes for 259 yards, one TD and one INT, adding a career-high and team-high 40 rushing yards on 15 carries ... Sophomore WR **Markell Pack** had two catches for 18 yards and a touchdown, his second score of the year ... Junior RB **Akeem Judd** caught five passes for 21 yards, his first catches as a Rebel ... Junior TE **Hunter Thurley's** 12-yard reception was his first catch as a Rebel.

DEFENSE: Senior FS **Trae Elston** led the Rebels with 10 tackles and tied a career high with nine solo stops ... Sophomore DE **Marquis Haynes** recorded his first full sack of the year ... He led the team with 7.5 sacks last season ... Junior DT **D.J. Jones** posted 2.0 tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble ... It was his first sack and first forced fumble as a Rebel.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore K **Gary Wunderlich** made 1 of 2 field goals, converting from 22 and missing from 29 ... Sophomore P **Will Gleeson** punted five times for a 43.8-yard average with two punts of 50 yards.

NEW MEXICO STATE NOTES

GENERAL: This was the first meeting between Ole Miss and New Mexico State ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was a sellout crowd of 60,154 ... Ole Miss improved to 30-1-2 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference ... This was the 88th Homecoming game at Ole Miss since 1924 ... The Rebels improved to 71-15-2 all-time and have won 17 of the last 19 ... Ole Miss has scored 50+ points in three games for the first time in program history.

OFFENSE: The Rebels' 665 yards of total offense were the second-most in school history behind the 751 vs. Troy in 2013 ... Ole Miss eclipsed 600 yards of total offense for the third time this season, the most such games in a season in school history ... Junior QB Chad Kelly completed 24 of 33 passes for 384 yards with three touchdowns and one interception, while also rushing three times for 32 yards and another score ... His 384 yards were the most by an Ole Miss QB since Bo Wallace threw for 387 in last year's season opener vs. Boise State ... Kelly posted his fourth 300-yard passing game of the season, which ties him for the single-season school record with Wallace (2013, 2014) and Eli Manning (2002, 2003) ... Kelly is in sole possession of third place in career 300-yard games behind Wallace (11) and Manning (10) ... Hugh Freeze refers to his tenure at Ole Miss as a "journey." Suffice it to say the journey has moved at a quicker pace than even Freeze could have imagined.

A Mississippi native, inspirational leader and one of the nation's top rising coaches, Freeze was the first choice to return championships to Ole Miss Football and was introduced as the Rebels' 37th head coach on December 5, 2011.

In the time since Freeze inherited a team coming off a twowin season and 14 straight Southeastern Conference losses, the Rebels have made three straight bowl appearances and won more games in each season.

He is the first coach in school history to guide the Rebels to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons.

Among the accomplishments in Freeze's first three years: 24-15 record; two bowl wins; 22 weeks ranked in the nation's top 25; at least one win over every other SEC West team; three straight top-15 ranked recruiting classes; three straight Vaught-Hemingway Stadium season ticket sellouts and season attendance records; 77 graduated players.



The foundation that was laid in 2012 and 2013 led the way for a memorable campaign last year. Ole Miss played in the very first of the inaugural New Year's Six bowl games - the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl vs. TCU. The Rebels got there on the strength of the nation's No. 1 scoring defense (16.0 ppg allowed) and wins over four 10-win teams (Alabama, Boise State, Memphis, Mississippi State) and three conference champions (Alabama, Boise State, Memphis). Freeze led Ole Miss to its most regular-season wins over ranked teams since 1969 and its highest national ranking (No. 3) since 1964.

A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze seems to get the most out of his players every game by emphasizing the importance of playing for the love of teammates instead of self. His leadership has also seen a rise in the team's grade point average and involvement in service opportunities both locally and abroad, such as spring break mission trips to Panama and Haiti.

The Rebels' 8-5 record after defeating Georgia Tech 25-17 in the 2013 Music City Bowl gave Ole Miss consecutive winning campaigns for the first time since the 2008-09 seasons. For his efforts, Freeze was named the 2013 FCA Grant Teaff Coach of the Year.

A month after the Rebels capped off a 7-6 season in 2012 with a 38-17 win over Pittsburgh in the BBVA Compass Bowl, Ole Miss was the talk of National Signing Day when Freeze and Co. landed a consensus top-10 class that was ranked as high as No. 2 by 247Sports and No. 5 by ESPN - the highest recorded signing class rankings in school history.

Freeze, a noted speaker and recruiter throughout his career, has enjoyed success at nearly every coaching level over the past 20 years, from high school to NAIA to FBS, and each stop has featured a high-scoring offense and the ability to motivate young people. Before returning to Oxford, the former Ole Miss assistant experienced a record-setting run at Arkansas State.

With Freeze as head coach in 2011, the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference championship and became just the third school in Sun Belt history to finish undefeated in league play with a perfect 8-0 mark. In the best debut season ever by an A-State head coach, Freeze became just the 14th FBS first-year head coach to win 10 regular season games. The Sun Belt Coach of the Year also returned ASU to a bowl game for the first time since 2005. Prior to his arrival at Arkansas State, Freeze compiled a 20-5 record over the 2008 and 2009 seasons at the helm of the Lambuth University football program.

OXFORD, Miss - On a night where the Ole Miss offense couldn't avoid the dreaded turnovers, the Rebel defense bowed up to shut down the visiting Memphis Tigers for a 24-3 victory on a beautiful Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

"Our kids showed great resolve and I'm extremely proud of our defense," said Ole Miss head coach Hugh Freeze, whose birthday was Saturday. "We haven't had a better effort than that in our two and a half years here. They were phenomenal, and Memphis is a team that has been putting up really good numbers."

Ole Miss (4-0) recognized the M-Club Class of 2014 at halftime, and celebrated the career and life of former player Chucky Mullins, after renaming Coliseum Drive in his honor on Friday. It was fitting then that the defense was led by linebacker Deterrian Shackelford, the only two-time recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award. Shackelford, who wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor, led the Rebels with eight total tackles, including four solo tackles and one tackle for loss.

The Rebels allowed just 104 total yards the entire evening, including 23 rushing yards on 31 carries. Excluding one 42-yard pass play by Memphis (2-2) in the first quarter, the Rebel defense allowed just 62 total yards on the other 61 plays from scrimmage.

Sophomore Tony Conner and junior Denzel Nkemdiche each had two tackles for loss, while junior C.J. Johnson, freshman Marquis Haynes, senior Bryon Bennett and senior Lavon Hooks each had a sack. Haynes also forced a fumble, which junior Issac Gross recovered, and junior Trae Elston recorded an interception.

The Ole Miss offense generated 426 total yards, but 10 penalties for 117 yards, four turnovers and two missed field goals limited its final score. Sophomore wide receiver Laquon Treadwell had five catches for 123 yards and two touchdowns, while junior running back Jaylen Walton had 10 carries for 78 yards and a touchdown. Senior quarterback Bo Wallace finished 22-37 for 248 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions.

Ole Miss opened the game's scoring on a 63-yard strike from Wallace to Treadwell with 12:01 remaining in the first quarter. The first quarter ended with the Rebels leading just 7-3 though, as Memphis hit a 40-yard field goal with 2:51 remaining.

The Rebels didn't get on the board again until the fourth quarter, but they scored 17 points in the final frame to stretch their lead out to 21 points. Following a 19-yard field goal from senior Andrew Fletcher, Walton ran 23 yards to pay dirt, and Treadwell caught a 17-yard pass in the back of the end zone with 1:18 remaining.

OXFORD, Miss. - Junior signal caller Chad Kelly completed 24-of-33 passes for a career-high 384 yards and touchdown passes of 20, 37 and 66 yards, as the Rebels routed the Aggies 52-3. Kelly also rushed 32 yards and added another score on the ground, as Ole Miss amassed 665 yards of total offense, the most since the Rebels posted 751 yards against Troy in 2013.

After both teams traded field goals to start the game, Ole Miss took over, reeling off 49-straight points, including a 31-3 lead into the half.

After allowing the Aggie offense to gain 67 yards and convert three third downs on the first drive, the Ole Miss defense stiffened and shut out New Mexico State the rest of the way. The Rebels allowed just 167 yards of total offense after the opening drive and forced two turnovers with four sacks.

Following the Aggies 39-yard field goal to tie the game, Kelly marched the Rebels 65 yards down the field in five plays, and sophomore running back Jordan Wilkins capped the drive with an 11-yard TD run up the middle that put Ole Miss up 10-3 with 3:03 left in the first quarter. Junior Akeem Judd added a 3-yard scoring run as the quarter ended to give the Rebels a 17-3 lead after one.

Ole Miss continued scoring in the second quarter with a 66-yard scoring strike from Kelly to sophomore wide out Markell Pack. Kelly added a 4-yard rushing score later in the quarter that put the Rebels up 31-3 heading into the half.

Kelly added to the Ole Miss total in the third quarter with a pair of touchdown passes to junior wide receiver Laquon Treadwell of 20 and 37 yards, respectively. Treadwell finished the game with eight catches for a career-high 136 yards and two scores. It also marked Treadwell's fifth career 100-yard receiving game.

Scoring continued in the fourth quarter for the Rebels after sophomore Eugene Brazley went straight up the middle for 78 yards to the end zone to give Ole Miss a 52-3 lead with 11:47 left.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss scored early and often Saturday against UT Martin.

The Rebel offense amassed 662 yards and scored 10 touchdowns, while the defense limited the Skyhawks to just 290 yards and scored a TD of its own, as Ole Miss rolled to a 76-3 season-opening win in front of 60,186 fans at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

It marked the most points in a game for Ole Miss and the largest margin of victory since a 92-0 win against West Tennessee Teachers College, now known as Union University, in 1935.

On the first play of the Rebels' second series of the day, senior Jaylen Walton broke free on a draw play up the middle for a 60-yard touchdown run to get Ole Miss on the scoreboard. After the Rebel defense forced a Skyhawk punt, junior Carlos Davis returned it 58 yards to the UT Martin 26, and five plays later Walton danced into the end zone from four yards out for his second TD of the day to put Ole Miss up 13-0.

Walton finished the game with just three carries but gained 65 yards and tied a career-high two TDs.

Following another UT Martin punt, junior quarterback Chad Kelly — making his Ole Miss debut — connected with sophomore Markell Pack for a 56-yard TD pass on the Rebels' first play of the drive. Sophomore Ryan Buchanan entered the game on Ole Miss' next offensive series and capped a 38-yard drive with a with a 15-yard TD strike to junior wideout Quincy Adeboyejo that put the Rebels up 27-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Ole Miss continued to add to its lead in the second quarter after Buchanan found junior Robert Nkemdiche, who was lined up at tight end, in the flat and Nkemdiche rumbled 31 yards to the end zone to put the Rebels up 34-0. It was Nkemdiche's first career reception and touchdown, and the 6-4, 296-pounder added a blocked field goal later in the quarter. Buchanan finished the game with a pair of TDs and 58 yards on 4-of-6 passing.

The Rebels would score six more touchdowns for a total of 11 on the day.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss scored 76 points last week against UT Martin and quarterback Chad Kelly set out to prove that wasn't a fluke.

The junior signal caller directed the Rebels on seven-straight touchdown drives to start the game, as Ole Miss cruised to a 73-21 victory over Fresno State.

Kelly completed 20-of-25 attempts for 346 yards and four touchdowns of 14, 16, 44 and 50 yards, and added 26 yards and a rushing score on the ground.

Through the first two games of the year the Rebels have scored 149 points - the most in a two-game stretch in school history - and have averaged 634.5 yards of offense.

Ole Miss took the opening kickoff and went 85 yards in 10 plays capped by a 14-yard touch-down pass from Kelly to senior wide out Cody Core. Following a Fresno State three-and-out, the Rebels took over on their own 41 and took just five plays to go 59 yards for another score - a four-yard scoring rush up the middle by Kelly - that put Ole Miss up 14-0 with 8:26 left in the opening quarter.

The Rebels tacked on two more scores in the quarter on a pair of passing TDs from Kelly to Quincy Adeboyejo from 16 and 50 yards to go up 28-0. The 28 points were the most in an opening quarter in Ole Miss modern history (since 1962) surpassing last week's mark of 27 points.

After Fresno State picked off sophomore Ryan Buchanan and returned it 56 yards for a score, Kelly re-entered the game and found Adeboyejo for the third time in the first half on a 44-yard TD strike. Adeboyejo finished the game with five catches for a career-high 120 yards and three scores

The Ole Miss defense limited Fresno State to just 316 yards and forced four Bulldog turnovers, including a pair of interception returns for TDs.

Junior defensive star Robert Nkemdiche scored a TD in his second-straight game, this time a one-yard plunge up the middle on the Rebels' opening drive of the second half.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — For the second straight year, Ole Miss and Alabama delivered an instant classic on the gridiron. For the second straight year, Ole Miss took down Alabama. Behind five turnovers forced by the Landshark defense, the No. 11 Rebels won 43-37, defeating the No. 2 Crimson Tide in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history.

Playing a night game on the road in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium, Ole Miss led the entire game and left Tuscaloosa victorious for the first time since 1988.

Ole Miss scored at least 43 points for the third consecutive game, marking the first time that feat has ever been accomplished in program history. The 43 points was also the most the Rebels have ever scored in a game played in Tuscaloosa.

Junior quarterback Chad Kelly was calm, cool and collected as he played away from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium for the first time in his Rebel career. He finished the evening completing 18-of-33 passes for 341 yards and three touchdowns through the air, while also rushing for a score. Kelly and the Ole Miss offense did not turn the ball over once and recorded 24 points off of the five Alabama turnovers.

A.J. Moore was in on two of the turnovers, recovering the fumble on the opening kick and forcing a fumble on another kick return later in the first half. Trae Elston picked off a pass for the third straight game, while teammate C.J. Johnson has made an interception in back-to-back games. Tony Bridges' interception with 2:36 left in the game was the fifth and final turnover forced by the Landshark defense.

Cody Core caught four passes for a career-high 123 yards, including a 73-yard TD. Laquon Treadwell hauled in a team-high five passes for 80 yards, his last catch a 24-yarder in the end zone that ended up being the game-winning score.

Alabama recorded 503 yards of total offense led by running back Derrick Henry and quarter-back Jake Coker. Henry rushed 23 times for 127 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. — The Rebels entered the game with the nation's highest-scoring offense averaging 64.0 points per game, and scored just 20 points through the first three quarters, but Ole Miss outlasted the Commodores 27-16 in front of a sellout crowd of 60,654 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to improve to 4-0 (2-0 SEC) on the season.

Vanderbilt battled the Rebels all night and took an early 3-0 lead with 3:25 left in the first frame after Commodore kicker Tommy Openshaw connected from 28 yards out. It marked the first time all season Ole Miss had trailed in a game, a span of more than 191 minutes of game action.

Kelly and the Rebel offense responded right back with a five play, 72-yard drive capped by a 20-yard TD pass to sophomore wide out Damore'ea Stringfellow that gave Ole Miss a 7-3 lead with 2:13 left in the first quarter. Kelly finished the game with 321 yards on 24-of-42 passing and one score.

The 'Dores put together a seven play, 50-yard drive to open the second half capped by a 41-yard field goal from Openshaw that cut the Rebel lead to 13-6. Ole Miss took the ball on the ensuing kickoff and went 64 yards in nine plays, but Vanderbilt blocked Wunderlich's 29-yard field goal attempt to keep it a one-score game.

Quarterback Johnny McCrary then marched the Commodores 88 yards in eight plays and found Ralph Webb over the middle for a seven-yard TD catch to tie the game at 13 with 7:39 left in the third. McCrary passed for 194 yards and one TD in the game.

Needing a spark, the Rebels found one on special teams after sophomore wide receiver Cale Luke blocked Vanderbilt's punt from deep inside Commodore territory and Ole Miss recovered the ball on the VU 20-yard line. Seven plays later, all-everything Robert Nkemdiche found the end zone from a yard out to put the Rebels back on top 20-13 at the end of the third quarter.

Vanderbilt marched itself into the red zone again to start the fourth quarter, but the Ole Miss defense stiffened and limited the 'Dores to another Openshaw field goal — this one from 34 yards out — that cut the Rebel lead to 20-16 with 12:12 left in regulation.

The Commodore defense picked off Kelly on the next Ole Miss possession and returned it inside the Rebel 20. However, the Rebel 'D' held Vanderbilt at bay once again and Openshaw missed a 32 yarder with 9:28 left that would have pulled the 'Dores within a point.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. — In front of a packed crowd of 90,585 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, No. 3 Ole Miss could not overcome a big deficit early in the game. No. 23 Florida scored the first 25 points of the game to hand the Rebels (4-1, 2-1 SEC) their first loss of the season, 38-10.

Chad Kelly completed 26-of-40 passes for 259 yards. The junior quarterback found 10 different receivers throughout the night. His favorite targets were Laquon Treadwell and Akeem Judd as both Rebels caught five passes. Treadwell finished with a team-high 42 receiving yards, while Evan Engram made three receptions for 41 yards.

On the ground, the Rebels were also led by Kelly with 40 yards on 15 carries. The Florida defense forced four fumbles, and Ole Miss lost three of them. Four turnovers throughout the night hurt the Rebels as they led to 19 Florida points.

The Gators (5-0, 3-0 SEC) were led by quarterback Will Grier, who went 24-of-29 for 271 yards and four touchdowns. Demarcus Robinson had eight catches for 98 yards and a touchdown, while Kelvin Taylor posted a game-high 83 yards rushing.

Florida tallied 355 yards of total offense, while Ole Miss gained 328 yards. The Rebels had 23 first downs compared to 18 for the Gators. However, a 50 percent (8-of-16) conversion rate on third down helped Florida keep drive alive and wear down the Landshark defense.

Both teams saw their offenses go three-and-out to start the game before Florida put together the first scoring drive. The Gators went 61 yards in five plays with a pair of hookups between Grier and Robinson. A 36-yard touchdown by that duo put UF on the board. After an Ole Miss fumble on the ensuing drive, the Gators took advantage of the turnover and good field position, scoring a touchdown on another five-play drive for a 13-0 lead with 6:48 left in the first quarter.

The Gators completed a 77-yard touchdown pass to claim a 19-0 lead midway through the second quarter. Just before the halftime break, Florida found the end zone to take a 25-0 lead into the locker room.

Getting the ball to start the second half, the Rebels orchestrated a 70-yard scoring drive that resulted in a 22-yard field goal by Gary Wunderlich.

With just over four minutes left in the game, Kelly found Markell Pack for a 7-yard touchdown pass-and-catch to give Ole Miss its first and only touchdown of the night.

OXFORD, Miss. - Junior signal caller Chad Kelly completed 24-of-33 passes for a career-high 384 yards and touchdown passes of 20, 37 and 66 yards, as the Rebels routed the Aggies 52-3. Kelly also rushed 32 yards and added another score on the ground, as Ole Miss amassed 665 yards of total offense, the most since the Rebels posted 751 yards against Troy in 2013.

After both teams traded field goals to start the game, Ole Miss took over, reeling off 49-straight points, including a 31-3 lead into the half.

After allowing the Aggie offense to gain 67 yards and convert three third downs on the first drive, the Ole Miss defense stiffened and shut out New Mexico State the rest of the way. The Rebels allowed just 167 yards of total offense after the opening drive and forced two turnovers with four sacks.

Following the Aggies 39-yard field goal to tie the game, Kelly marched the Rebels 65 yards down the field in five plays, and sophomore running back Jordan Wilkins capped the drive with an 11-yard TD run up the middle that put Ole Miss up 10-3 with 3:03 left in the first quarter. Junior Akeem Judd added a 3-yard scoring run as the quarter ended to give the Rebels a 17-3 lead after one.

Ole Miss continued scoring in the second quarter with a 66-yard scoring strike from Kelly to sophomore wide out Markell Pack. Kelly added a 4-yard rushing score later in the quarter that put the Rebels up 31-3 heading into the half.

Kelly added to the Ole Miss total in the third quarter with a pair of touchdown passes to junior wide receiver Laquon Treadwell of 20 and 37 yards, respectively. Treadwell finished the game with eight catches for a career-high 136 yards and two scores. It also marked Treadwell's fifth career 100-yard receiving game.

Scoring continued in the fourth quarter for the Rebels after sophomore Eugene Brazley went straight up the middle for 78 yards to the end zone to give Ole Miss a 52-3 lead with 11:47 left.
