NOTABLE

WEEKLY HONORS

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Paxton Lynch • Jr. • QB • Memphis • Deltona, Fla.

Lynch completed 39 of 53 passes for 384 yards and three touchdowns to lead Memphis to a 37-24 win against No. 13/12 Mississippi, giving the Tigers their first win against a nationally ranked opponent since 1996 and keeping Memphis unbeaten on the season. Lynch set career highs for attempts and completions and turned in his fifth straight game with at least 300 passing yards. All three of Lynch's touchdown passes came during Memphis' run of 31 straight points, which effectively put the game away.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Josh Hawkins • Sr. • CB • East Carolina • Winston-Salem, N.C.

Hawkins keyed East Carolina's defensive effort which held Tulsa to a season-low 17 points in the Pirates' 30-17 win. Hawkins had six tackles and gave the Pirates a lead they would not relinquish with a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown in the first quarter. Hawkins has two interceptions and has made 31 tackles this season.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Demarcus Ayers • Jr. • WR • Houston • Lancaster, Texas

Ayers set an American Athletic Conference record with 175 yards on punt returns, including a 73-yard return for a touchdown, in the Cougars' 42-7 win against Tulane. Ayers averaged 21.9 yards on eight punt returns and finished the game with 283 all-purpose yards. Aside from his special teams play, Ayers was the game's leading receiver with six catches for 93 yards, while he also added a 15-yard rushing touchdown.

AMERICAN NOTEBOOK

Streaking

Memphis extended its winning streak to a school-record 13 games with its win against Mississippi. The only teams with longer active winning streaks are Ohio State, which has won 20 straight, and TCU, which has won 15 in a row. Houston and Temple have both won seven straight.

Perfection

The American has three unbeaten teams (Houston, Memphis and Temple are 6-0). The only other conferences with three undefeated teams are the Big Ten and the Big 12.

Conference Calls

The American is a combined 10-1 against opponents from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt conferences this season. The American is 7-11 against teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC.

Look West

The top three teams in the American Athletic Conference's West Division — Houston, Memphis and Navy — are a combined 16-1 this season.

Depth Perception

Eight of The American's 12 teams have at least a .500 winning percentage this season. The only other conferences with at least eight .500 or better teams are the ACC (eight), the Big Ten (11), the Pac-12 (10) and the SEC (11).

That's Offensive

The American has four of the top 10 teams nationally in terms of total offense. Houston is fifth nationally at 554.7 yards per game, followed by Tulsa (sixth, 550.5 ypg), Cincinnati (seventh, 546.2 ypg) and Memphis (10th, 532.8 ypg).

Soaring

Temple's 6-0 start matches those from the Owls' 1935, 1945 and 1974 squads as the best in program history.

Seven of the 12 teams in the American Athletic Conference were ranked in the top 25 of the Bowl Championship Series standings or the College Football Playoff committee rankings between 2008 and 2014.

Play On

Seven of the 12 American Athletic Conference teams in 2015 were bowl-eligible in 2014 (UCF, Cincinnati, East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, Navy, Temple). Houston, Memphis and Navy earned bowl victories last season.

What A Rush

Navy QB Keenan Reynolds entered the 2015 season as the NCAA career leader in rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. Reynolds moved into second place among all players on the NCAA's career rushing touchdowns chart and needs four TDs to tie the mark set by former Wisconsin RB Montee Ball.

Eyeballs

Temple and Cincinnati have played in front of record home crowds. The Owls drew 69,176 at Lincoln Financial Field for their win against Penn State, while the Bearcats had an on-campus record 39,095 on hand at the newly renovated Nippert Stadium for their win against Alabama A&M before surpassing that number with 40,101 in attendance against Miami (Fla.). Memphis and East Carolina have both played in front of home crowds of at least 45,000.

Veteran Presence

Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo, who is in his eighth year as the Midshipmen's head coach, has more head coaching experience than the other five West Division coaches combined (six years).

To The End Zone

Houston QB Greg Ward Jr. is tied with LSU RB Leonard Fournette for the national lead with 14 rushing touchdowns this season.

Dual Threats

American Athletic Conference quarterbacks occupy the top three places among QBs on the FBS rushing touchdowns chart. Greg Ward Jr. of Houston leads all players with 14 rushing TDs, while Navy's Keenan Reynolds is 15th with nine TDs, and SMU's Matt Davis is 27th with seven.

To Be The Best

American Athletic Conference teams play 11 games against teams ranked in the preseason top 25 polls. The American's nonconference slate includes games against preseason No. 2 TCU, No. 4 Baylor, No. 10 Florida State, No. 11 Notre Dame, No. 16 Georgia Tech, No. 17 Mississippi, No. 19 Oklahoma, No. 21 Stanford and No. 24 Missouri.



The first American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 5, 2015, at noon ET and will be televised nationally on either ABC or ESPN.

The 2015 season will be The American's first in its new 12-team, two-division format, in which each team will play eight conference games. Each team will face the other five teams in its own division as well as three teams from the other division.

The American's East Division includes UCF, Cincinnati, UConn, East Carolina, USF and Temple. The West Division lineup is Houston, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Tulane and Tulsa. The two divisional champions will meet in The American Championship at the home site of one of the participants.

The winner of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest-ranked team among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

Divisional Champions

The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games — both divisional and non-divisional.

In the event of a two-team tie within a division, the head-to-head result between the tied teams will determine the divisional champion.

Championship Site

The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion with the best record in conference games.

If the two divisional champions have the same conference record, then the regular-season head-to-head winner between the divisional champions would host the championship. If the divisional champions have the same conference record and did not play in the regular season, then the team with the better overall regular-season record would host the championship.

Temple is ranked in the top 25 for the first time since 1979 as the Owls are No. 22 in the Associated Press poll and No. 24 in the USA Today poll ... Temple is off to its best start in program history ... The Owls have been led offensively by RB Jahad Thomas, who is fifth in the nation in all-purpose yards (176.2 ypg) and leads The American in rushing with 756 yards and 10 touchdowns on 145 carries ... QB P.J. Walker has completed 93 of 153 passes (60.8 percent) for 1,063 yards and eight touchdowns ... WR Robby Anderson has a team-high 23 catches for 262 yards and four touchdowns ... East Carolina has gone 3-0 at Dowdy-Ficklin Stadium this year, with wins against Towson, Virginia Tech and Tulsa ... The Pirates have used two quarterbacks extensively ... QB Blake Kemp has thrown for 1,556 yards and 10 touchdowns with six interceptions and has completed 71.3 percent of his passes (154 of 216) ... COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, comparative outcomes of common opponents and other factors.

Two Days

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day belong to college football, with two semifinal games and four other top bowl games continuing a wonderful tradition. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Jeff Long (chair), Barry Alvarez, Mike Gould, Pat Haden, Kirby Hocutt, Tom Jernstedt, Bobby Johnson, Tom Osborne, Dan Radakovich, Condoleezza Rice, Mike Tranchese, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings..

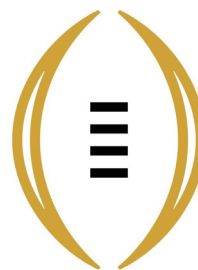

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The Miami Beach Bowl was played for the first time in 2014 at state-of-the-art Marlins Park in Miami, which sits on the site of the historic Orange Bowl stadium. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year, beginning with last year's matchup against Brigham Young. Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference and the Sun Belt Conference are scheduled for future years, though institutions from other conferences also will have the opportunity to participate.

The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The Birmingham Bowl takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The St. Petersburg Bowl is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The Hawaii Bowl is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West Conference.

The Marmot Boca Raton Bowl is a new game that will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2015.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl will debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The Popeye's Bahamas Bowl is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference in 2016 and Conference USA in 2018.

The R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tennessee, the Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, and the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.

THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The 2015 football season will be the second under the American Athletic Conference's comprehensive television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports.

The new arrangements began with the 2013-14 basketball season and will be in place through the 2019-20 academic year. The contracts provide for unprecedented exposure on two of the industry leaders in sports television.

In football, the contract calls for all conference-controlled games — which encompasses all conference games and home nonconference games — to be televised. Nearly 90 percent of those games will be carried on either national broadcast or national cable platforms.

In addition to contracted games on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3, American Athletic Conference teams will regularly appear on CBS Sports Network through a sublicensing agreement with ESPN.

Additional nonconference games will be available on ESPN3 — ESPN's live multi-screen sports network, giving fans an online destination that delivers thousands of global sports events annually. It is accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 and Xbox One. The network is currently available to more than 99 million homes at no additional cost to fans who receive their high-speed Internet connection or video subscription from an affiliated service provider. The network is also available at no cost to approximately 21 million U.S. college students and U.S.-based military personnel via computers, smartphones and tablets connected to on-campus educational and on-base military broadband and Wi-Fi networks.

ESPN, Inc., is the world's leading multinational, multimedia sports entertainment company featuring a portfolio of more than 50 multimedia sports assets. The company is comprised of eight U.S. 24-hour television networks and five HD simulcast services. Based in Bristol, Connecticut, ESPN is 80-percent owned by ABC, Inc., which is an indirect subsidiary of The Walt Disney Company. The Hearst Corporation holds a 20 percent interest in ESPN.

CBS Sports Network is available to 100 million homes and may be seen on a digital basic cable package in all American Athletic Conference markets. Talent for The American's weekly game on CBS Sports Network includes Dave Ryan on play-by-play, Corey Chavous as the analyst and Lauren Gardner as the reporter.
