THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa football is under new direction as Philip Montgomery was named the 29th head coach in school history on December 11, 2014.
- Tulsa has the smallest undergraduate enrollment of FBS schools with 3,473 students.
- Memphis comes into the game with a national ranking of #17/18 this week . . . it's the second ranked foe that Tulsa will face this year, #16 Oklahoma was the first.
- Tulsa reached three wins in its first 5 games, bettering last year's win total of two wins for the season.
- Tulsa ranks second in passing offense in the American Athletic Conference with 354.5 yards per game and also second in total offense at 550.5 yards . . . the Hurricane is 6th for total offense nationally and 9th for passing offense.
- Quarterback Dane Evans moved into 4th place on the school's career passing chart with 6,127 career yards.
- Senior safety Michael Mudoh is one of only 16 players in school history to reach 300 career tackles . . . Mudoh's career total of 343 tackles has come in 44 games for a 7.8 average per game . . . he ranks 8th on the school's all-time tackles list.
- The Hurricane has two receivers – Keyarris Garrett and Josh Atkinson – with at least three 100-yard receiving games each within Tulsa's first six contests this season . . . Atkinson has five straight 100-yard games and Garrett has had three 100+ receiving games.
- Tulsa went the first seven quarters this year without a takeaway, Tulsa then had four takeaways in the next three quarters . . . Tulsa has nine takeaways in the last 17 quarters of play, including six fumble recoveries and three interceptions.
- Tulsa has had 15 of its' 23 touchdown drives in regulation come under two minutes . . . 10 Tulsa TD drives have been under one minute.

TULSA HEAD COACH PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN FIRST SEASON . . .

- Philip Montgomery became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 Tulsa season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU . . . he has a 3-3 record as the Tulsa head coach.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the last three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.
- Under his guidance, Baylor led the nation in total offense and scoring offense in each of the last two seasons.
- Quarterbacks he tutored include 2011 Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III as well as Bryce Petty and Nick Florence at Baylor and Kevin Kolb and Case Keenum at Houston.
- Before moving to Baylor, he spent five years at Houston, also under Art Briles.
- Has coached nine Bowl games in 12 years as a collegiate coach.
- Before moving to the college ranks, he spent one year as the offensive coordinator at Denton (Texas) HS, and before that spent six years at Stephenville HS, where he was a part of back-to-back Class 4A state championships in 1998 and 1999.

THE SERIES . . .

- This is the 26th meeting between Tulsa and Memphis.
- Memphis leads the series 15-10.
- Memphis snapped a four-game losing streak against the Hurricane last year with a 40-20 victory.
- Tulsa won those previous four games by a 17.8 margin, despite two of those games going into overtime.
- Memphis leads the series in Tulsa, 8-6, but has lost the last two meetings in Tulsa.
- The last two games played in Tulsa went to overtime and both games were won by Tulsa, including 37-31 in 2005 and 33-30 in 2009.

EVANS MOVING UP ON PASSING CHARTS . . .

- Quarterback Dane Evans is in his fourth year, but just his third in a playing capacity . . . Evans red-shirted in the 2012 season, played in 2013 and then started all 12 games in 2014.
- Evans now has thrown for 6,127 career yards, moving into 4th place on the school's career passing chart.
- His 38 passing touchdowns is also the sixth most for a Tulsa quarterback . . . he trails Jerry Rhome (1963-64) for fifth place by four TD passes.
- Evans has 6,230 total offense yards to rank fifth on the school's career list, needing 28 more yards to move into fourth place.
- Evans had his third career 400+ passing game against #16 Oklahoma with 427 yards and four touchdowns . . . that was his second 400+ game this season as Evans threw for 424 yards and two TDs in the season opener against FAU.
- With five 300+ passing games this year, Evans now has eight career 300+ passing games, which is the third most in school history behind Paul Smith's 15 and G.J. Kinne's 14.
- In 2014, Evans became the 20th quarterback in school history to throw for over 2,000 yards in a single season, and it was just the sixth time that a player has thrown for over 3,000 yards in a season.
- This year, Evans has surpassed the 2,000-yard passing plateau for the second straight season.
- He is now one of just five quarterbacks in school history to surpass 2,000+ yards in at least two consecutive seasons . . . the others are: T.J. Rubley (3), James Kilian (2), Paul Smith (3) and G.J. Kinne (3).

GARRETT IS TOP TARGET . . .

- Senior Keyarris Garrett has a team-leading 698 receiving yards on 45 receptions.
- He ranks ninth in the nation for receiving yards per game (116.3) and 12th for receiving yards (698) this year.
- Garrett has had three 100+ receiving games this year . . . he caught five passes for 163 yards in the season opener vs. FAU.
- Garrett went over 100 yards in Tulsa's next two games as well, with 102 yards on seven catches vs. New Mexico and 189 yards and one TD on 14 receptions against #16 Oklahoma.
- In 38 career games, Garrett has 2,319 yards, 16 TDs and a 13.8-yard average on 168 career receptions . . . his yardage is the 12th-most in school history.

ATKINSON RACKING UP THE YARDS . . .

- Junior receiver Josh Atkinson has enjoyed a productive season for the Hurricane, and now with the absence of Keevan Lucas has taken a more significant role in the offense.
- He ranks second on the team with 576 yards on 36 catches for 96.0 yards per game and 16.0 yards per catch.
- Atkinson is on a streak of five straight 100+ receiving games, the longest consecutive streak since Chris Penn's six in 1993.
- He did not have a catch in Tulsa's season opener, but since then has averaged 115.2 yards in the last five games.
- Atkinson had his first career 100-yard receiving game with 119 yards on three receptions against New Mexico, including a 69-yard TD, which was his first catch of the season.
- He followed that up with his second 100+ game when he caught 10 passes for 104 yards and one touchdown against Oklahoma.
- Atkinson had his third 100+ receiving game of the season and his career with 107 yards on six receptions against Houston.
- Last week, Atkinson had a career-best 136 yards on eight catches at East Carolina . . . a week before, he had a team-leading nine receptions for 110 yards vs. ULM.
- Atkinson has totals of 1,101 yards and three touchdowns in 27 career games.

STEPPING UP . . .

- With the absence of receiver Keevan Lucas, lost for the season after suffering an injury in the fourth game against Houston, red-shirt freshman receiver Justin Hobbs stepped up in more extensive action against ULM.
- Hobbs came into the game with two receptions for 25 yards on the year.
- Against ULM, Hobbs caught five passes for 82 yards, including a 36-yard TD . . . a week later, Hobbs had three receptions for 57 yards at East Carolina.
- He now has 10 receptions for 164 yards and one TD in six games this year.

DIFFERENT DEFENSE . . .

- At the midway point of the season, the Tulsa defense has shown steady improvement.
- Tulsa's last two opponents, ULM and East Carolina, averaged 393.0 yards.
- Before that, Tulsa allowed an average of 703.5 yards against two of the nation's top offenses – Oklahoma ranks 18th and Houston ranks 5th – in the third and fourth games of the season.
- Through six games last year Tulsa opponents had 28 plays of 30+ yards for an average of 51.3 yards per play and 11 TDs . . . this year, Tulsa has given up 10 less plays of 30+ yards, averaging 39 yards per play, and six less touchdowns.
- Tulsa had a team-high 14 TFLs for -35 yards against East Carolina, including three sacks for -17 yards.



MUDOH IN TOP-10 FOR CAREER TACKLES . . .

- Senior safety Michael Mudoh now has 343 career tackles ties for eighth place on the school's all-time tackles chart . . . he needs nine more stops to tie for seventh place.
- Mudoh's 72 tackles this year for a 12.0 average through six games ranks second in the nation.
- Mudoh had a career-high 20 tackles in the opener vs. FAU, which ties for the second-best game in the NCAA this year for tackles.
- It's the third straight season opener that he had double-figure tackles . . . his previous career-best was 17 stops coming in the 2013 opener vs. Bowling Green, and last year had 10 tackles against Tulane.
- Mudoh totaled more team-highs with 16 stops at Oklahoma, 11 tackles against ULM and 12 stops at East Carolina
- Mudoh has 18 double-figure tackle games in 30 career starts . . . he has four double-digit tackle games this year.

TULSA'S MEMPHIS TIES . . .

- Tulsa has two players on the roster from Memphis.
- Sophomore linebacker Petera Wilson Jr. played as a true freshman last year after coming to Tulsa from Memphis' White Hall High School.
- Wilson has 11 tackles and one sack for -5 yards this year.
- Red-shirt freshman running back Ramadi Warren played his prep football at Memphis Whitehaven High School . . . he has played in two games this year and has gained 80 yards for a 6.2 average on 13 carries.

FAMILIAR FACES RETURN TO TULSA . . .

- The Memphis coaching staff has some familiar faces who spent time on the Tulsa coaching staff.
- Safeties coach Brent Guy spent the previous four years as the Golden Hurricane defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.
- Defensive coordinator Galen Scott coached at Tulsa for two seasons (2008-09) under Todd Graham, coaching linebackers and the secondary.
- Memphis receivers coach Holmon Wiggins coached Tulsa running backs in 2011 under Bill Blankenship.
- Director of athletic performance Rohrk Cutchlow served as Tulsa's strength & conditioning coordinator in 2011.
- Former Tulsa head coach, Golden Hurricane alumnus and former TU quarterback Bill Blankenship is an offensive consultant at Memphis.
- Blankenship, who was the head coach at Tulsa from 2011-14, coached Memphis head coach Justin Fuente at Tulsa's Union High School.

500+ . . .

- In four of Tulsa's six games this year, the Hurricane offense has surpassed the 500-yard plateau . . . Tulsa averages the sixth-most yards nationally with 550.5 per game.
- Tulsa gained 600+ yards in each of its first three games with 618 yards vs. FAU, 600 yards at New Mexico and 603 yards at Oklahoma.
- This was the first time in school history that Tulsa had three consecutive games with 600 yards of total offense.
- The last time Tulsa had back-to-back 600+ total offense games was in 2008 when it happened twice – 606 vs. New Mexico (Sept. 20) and 641 vs. Central Arkansas (Sept. 27), and 602 vs. SMU (Oct. 11) and 791 vs. UTEP (Oct. 18).
- Tulsa had its fourth 500+ game with 563 yards of total offense against ULM.

HERE'S SOME NUMBERS AFTER SIX GAMES . . .

- Tulsa has averaged 33.3 points this year, while scoring over 30 points four of six games.
- Tulsa has an NCAA-high 91.2 offensive plays after six games.
- The Hurricane set a school record with 107 offensive plays against ULM, breaking the mark of 103 plays that was set against SMU in 2012.
- In the first two games Tulsa went over 40 points in each game, marking Tulsa's first back-to-back 40-point scoring games since 2012 when Tulsa had 49 points at UAB and 45 at Marshall.
- Tulsa has had a 100-yard receiver in each game this year, while two receivers each went over 100 yards in two of the first three games – New Mexico and Oklahoma.
- Tulsa had two 100-yard rushers vs. New Mexico with Zack Langer gaining 139 yards and D'Angelo Brewer had his first career 100+ rushing game with 133 yards.
- QB Dane Evans went over 2,000 passing yards in six games this year . . . he has 2,127 yards and 11 TDs with a passing efficiency of 145.03 and completion percentage of 59.5.
- Before throwing an interception against Houston in the third period, Evans had gone 125 passes between interceptions.
- Tulsa has had 12 plays, including 11 by pass and one rush, and six touchdowns offensively that have covered 40+ yards.
- The Tulsa defense has 49 tackles for -146 yards, an average of 8.2 TFLs per game this season . . . the 49 TFLs is only 28 shy of surpassing last year's season total of 77 TFLs.

LANGER PUTTING UP YARDS . . .

- Senior Zack Langer has a team-high 596 yards and 11 TDs after six games . . . only 10 Tulsa players have now had at least 10 rushing touchdowns in a single season.
- He has had two 100+ rushing games this season to give him six career 100+ rushing games, with the other four coming last year.
- He has rushed for 11 TDs this season, including three in two games, coming against FAU and Houston.
- Langer's 11 rushing TDs ranks sixth nationally . . . he is tied with four past Tulsa players for the seventh-most rushing TDs for a single season in school history.
- Langer carried the ball 33 times for 139 yards and one TD in the New Mexico win.
- In the second half of the UNM game, Langer rushed 24 times for 116 yards and his 5-yard touchdown run with 4:07 left in the game sealed the victory for the Hurricane.
- A week later, Langer had 161 yards and one TD against #16 Oklahoma as 114 of those yards came in the first half.
- Langer has now rushed for 1,636 yards and 17 TDs in 42 career games.

LINSCOTT COMES A LONG WAY . . .

- Matt Linscott came to Tulsa in 2012 as a walk-on from nearby prep powerhouse Jenks High School.
- In 2013, he played in 11 games on special teams and in 2014 was a back-up safety and special teams performer.
- Before the 2014 season, Linscott was put on scholarship . . . during the season, he had 13 tackles, forced one fumble and had one fumble recovery in 12 games.
- In the spring of 2015 and the arrival of the new coaching staff, Linscott made the move to linebacker and earned a starting position.
- Through six games, Linscott has totaled 55 tackles to rank 27th nationally for tackles . . . he had double-digit tackles in the first three games with 10 against FAU, 11 against New Mexico and 13 at Oklahoma.
- Linscott leads the Hurricane and is 20th nationally for tackles for lost yardage with 10.5 TFLs for -41 yards . . . he also has 3.5 sacks, two pass break-ups, one interception and one forced fumble.

- Δ Tulsa has had 39 players earn 1st, 2nd or 3rd-team All-America honors
- Δ The Golden Hurricane has produced three NFL Hall of Famers, the most among Oklahoma schools (Jim Finks, Bob St. Clair, Steve Largent)
- Δ TU has the most former football players (4) to serve as head coaches in the NFL among Oklahoma colleges
- Δ Tulsa has two Heisman Trophy runners-up – Jerry Rhome (1964) and Howard Twilley (1965)
- Δ Tulsa won a school record 11 games in 2008 and 2012
- Δ Paul Smith won the 2007 Wuerffel Trophy, while Wilson Hollo-way won the FedEx Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award in 2008

BREWER TURNS IN KEY PERFORMANCES . . .

- Sophomore running back D'Angelo Brewer rushed for 91 yards and a 5.7 average per carry vs. ULM, and he scored the go-ahead touchdown (27-24) on a reception with 8:41 left in the final quarter Brewer caught a 15-yard pass for a touchdown.
- In five games, Brewer now has rushed for 362 yards for a 5.7 average per carry on 63 attempts . . . he missed the East Carolina game.
- In the second game of the year, Brewer had his first career 100+ rushing game with 133 yards and one TD on 20 carries, for a 6.7-yard average per carry.
- As a true freshman in 2014, Brewer carried the ball just 39 times for 128 yards.
- Brewer played quarterback as a junior and senior at Tulsa's Central High School.

LONG PLAYS . . .

- Of Tulsa's 38 offensive plays covering more than 20 yards, 33 of them have come through the air . . . nine of these 33 passing plays over 20 yards have gone for TDs.
- Only five rushing plays have gone for over 20 yards with a season-long run by Zack Langer against Oklahoma.
- Tulsa has eight kickoff returns and one punt return that have gone for over 20 yards as well, giving the Hurricane 47 plays on offense or special teams to go over 20 yards.
- Keyarris Garrett has been on the receiving end of 12 of those 20+ passing plays with a long of 50 yards against FAU . . . Josh Atkinson has nine 20+ pass receptions, including a season-long 69-yard TD reception against New Mexico.
- The injured Keevan Lucas had seven 20+ plays with five going for touchdowns and his longest was for a 43-yard TD against FAU.

TULSA PUTS UP NUMBERS AGAINST #16 SOONERS . . .

- Tulsa had its third 600+ total offense game with 603 yards vs. #16 Oklahoma . . . in Oklahoma's previous two games the opposing offenses (Akron and Tennessee) combined for only 480 total yards between them vs. the Sooners.
- Dane Evans threw for 427 yards and four TDs vs. Oklahoma.
- Keyarris Garrett had a career-best 14 receptions for a career-high 189 yards and one TD against Oklahoma . . . fellow receiver Josh Atkinson had 10 catches for 104 yards and one TD.
- Zack Langer had his second straight 100+ rushing game with 161 yards and one TD on 31 carries vs. Oklahoma.
- Three Tulsa tacklers had double-digit stops, including Michael Mudoh (16), Matt Linscott (13) and Kerwin Thomas (12).
- * Despite two more takeaways by the Tulsa defense, the Oklahoma offense broke a Tulsa school record for opponent total offense with 773 yards.

AN OPENING GAME HIGHLIGHT FOR LANGER . . .

- Senior Zack Langer came into this year's season opener having never carried the ball once in an opening game for the Hurricane.
- Langer played in both the 2012 and 2013 season openers but did not carry the ball, and in 2014 was injured for the first game.
- This year, it wasn't until Tulsa's last possession of the first half that Langer touched the ball for the first time in a season opener . . . he went for one yard on his first touch and a game-high 18 yards on his second carry.
- Langer ended the game as one of the heroes, finishing the game with 89 rushing yards and three TDs, as well as one reception for 34 yards.
- Langer's third TD, covering three yards, was the game-winner in overtime against FAU.

TAKEAWAYS COMING TULSA'S WAY . . .

- It took the Tulsa defense eight quarters this year to get its first takeaway, but when it did, the second one came on the very next possession.
- With a 30-21 lead heading into the fourth quarter against New Mexico, the Tulsa defense became opportunistic in the final period.
- Senior end Derrick Alexander recovered a fumble on UNM's first drive of the fourth quarter, giving the offense the ball on the New Mexico side of the field.
- On New Mexico's next possession, sophomore cornerback Kerwin Thomas intercepted a pass and returned it 14 yards.
- The two takeaways amounted to 10 points for the Hurricane.
- On New Mexico's next drive, Tulsa's Trent Martin forced a fumble and a loss of two yards on a 4th-and-1 play, thus giving the Hurricane offense the ball.
- In the next game, Tulsa's defense forced two fumbles against Oklahoma, both in the second quarter and both leading to 14 Tulsa points.
- Tulsa had one fumble recovery against Houston and had three takeaways against ULM.
- The Hurricane defense has totaled nine takeaways, all coming in the last 17 quarters.
- Tulsa's offense has scored 38 points off of opponent turnovers this season.

BRUBAKER IS BACK . . .

- Sophomore defensive tackle Jesse Brubaker had a huge sack in OT in the season opener.
- With FAU 2nd-and-Goal at the 6-yard line, Brubaker sacked FAU QB Jaquez Johnson for a five-yard loss putting the Owls back at the 11-yard line . . . the Owls had to settle for a field goal.
- Brubaker ended the game with three tackles and 1.5 stops for -7 yards, including that six-yard sack.
- He had a career-best 7 tackles against Houston this season.
- Brubaker returned to the starting lineup in the opener after missing all but one game in 2014 due to an orbital bone fracture to his left eye . . . he played in just Tulsa's third game last year.
- In 2013, Brubaker started 10 games as a true freshman, collecting 20 tackles.

LOOKING BACK AT THE OPENER . . .

- With the win over FAU, Tulsa improved to 67-48-1 overall in season openers and 61-24 in home openers at Skelly Field @ H.A. Chapman Stadium.
- It was the third straight season that Tulsa's home opener ended in dramatic fashion . . . in 2013 Carl Salazar knocked through 34-yard field goal with no time remaining to give Tulsa a 30-27 win over Colorado State . . . last year, Tulsa and Tulane went into two overtimes when a Demarco Nelson interception on Tulane's second possession preserved Tulsa's 38-31 lead.
- After trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, Tulsa scored the next 21 points for a 21-7 lead at the 12:49 mark of the second quarter . . . FAU rattled off the next 24 points to take a 31-21 lead at the 11:14 mark of the third period . . . Tulsa could get only as close to three points twice, before knotting the score at 41-41 with 0:03 left in regulation . . . Tulsa held FAU to a field goal in OT, before Zack Langer ran in from 3 yards out for a 47-44 win.
- Keevan Lucas and Keyarris Garrett combined for 356 receiving yards and 2 TDs.
- It was the second straight season opener that Dane Evans had thrown for over 400 yards, the first two 400+ yard passing games of his career.

GETTING THAT ROAD WIN . . .

- With a road win over New Mexico in the second week of the season, Tulsa snapped a six-game road losing streak.
- Tulsa was 0-6 last year on the road, as the last road victory came in the final road game of the 2013 season when Tulsa defeated Louisiana Tech, 24-14, on Nov. 23 in Ruston, La.
- The victory also put Tulsa at 2-0 on the season for the first time since the 2009 season when Tulsa won its first two games, both on the road at Tulane (37-13) and New Mexico (44-10).

LUCAS NAMED AAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER WEEK ONE . . .

- In the season opener, Keevan Lucas caught 10 passes for 193 yards and two touchdowns, while also carrying the ball twice for 21 yards vs. FAU, thus earning the first American Athletic Conference's Offensive Player of the Week award this season.
- His 193 yards was the second-highest receiving total for the first weekend of the college football season.
- Lucas' touchdown receptions covered 39 yards to tie the game 7-7, and one for 43 yards to give Tulsa a 21-7 lead in the second quarter.
- On Tulsa's game-tying drive in the final minute, Lucas caught four passes covering 58 yards on the 12-play, 53-yard drive, with three catches going for first downs.
- In the overtime series, Lucas took the first play 11 yards to the 14-yard line leading to the winning touchdown.
- The weekly award is the second straight year that Lucas has begun the year as the American Athletic Conference's Offensive Player of the Week. Last year, he won the award on the first week after a 233-yard, 3-touchdown performance against Tulane.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT OPENERS . . .

- Dane Evans has started two season openers for the Golden Hurricane, including 2014 and this year, and has put up huge numbers.
- In overtime wins against Tulane in 2014 and FAU this season, Evans has thrown for 862 yards and six TDs.
- The junior has averaged 431 yards and three TDs in Tulsa's last two season openers.
- One of his favorite targets in the last two openers has been fellow junior Keevan Lucas . . . Lucas has totaled 426 yards and five TDs for an average of 213 yards and 2.5 touchdowns in the last two season opening games.

THE OPENER WAS THE FIRST TIME PLAYING . . .

- Red-shirt freshman offensive center Chandler Miller received his first career start in his first-ever collegiate game in the season opener.
- Including Miller, Tulsa had a total of 11 players who saw their first collegiate action against FAU in the season opener.
- Six offensive players and five defensive players saw their first-ever playing time in the season opener.
- The offensive players included WR Justin Hobbs, TE Chris Minter, OT Willie Wright, OG Tyler Bowling, C Chandler Miller and OG Alex Pagonis.
- The defensive players earning their first collegiate playing time were DB Sam Gottsch, DB McKinley Whitfield, DB J.R. Reed, LB Tim Quickel and DE Myles Mouton.
- Minter and Whitfield are true freshmen, Reed is a freshman gray-shirt, Pagonis is a JUCO transfer, while Hobbs, Wright, Bowling, Miller, Gottsch, Quickel and Mouton are all red-shirt freshmen.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and currently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).



FIRST STARTS . . .

- A total of six players earned their first career starts in the season opener, including three on offense and three on defense.
- The first-time offensive starters were red-shirt freshmen OC Chandler Miller (Bixby, Okla.) and WR Justin Hobbs (Overland Park, Kan.) and sophomore OT Evan Plagg (Guthrie, Okla.).
- The three players on defense receiving their first career starts were sophomore SAF Jordan Mitchell (Owasso, Okla.), junior LB Matt Linscott (Jenks, Okla.) and sophomore DE Jeremy Smith (Sperry, Okla.).
- In the second game, three more Tulsa players saw their first career starting assignment with sophomore DE Frankie Davis (Broken Arrow, Okla.), junior SAF Jeremy Brady (North Little Rock, Ark.) and red-shirt freshman OT Willie Wright (Houston, Texas).

THE DEFENSE . . .

- Tulsa's defense returned 27 lettermen, including six returning starters and another seven players who started at least one game in their careers entering this year.
- The defensive front returned three starters from the 2015 season, including end Derrick Alexander and tackles Derrick Luetjen and Jerry Uwaezuoke
- The line also welcomed back the return of 2013 starting tackle Jesse Brubaker, who missed all but one game last year with an injury.
- The linebacker corps returned starters Trent Martin on the inside and Football Writer's Association (FWAA) Freshman All-American Craig Suits on the outside.
- On the back-end, although still rather young, Tulsa returned eight lettermen with just two seniors.

TEN STARTERS BACK ON OFFENSE . . .

- A total of 10 starters returned to the Tulsa offense in 2015.
- Six more players, who have started at least one game in their careers, also returned to the Hurricane offensive unit.
- The Hurricane returned 100-percent of its rushing and passing totals and 94 percent of the teams' receiving total.
- Tulsa's offense put up 412.5 total yards in 2014 to rank fourth in the American Athletic Conference for total offense.

STAFFORD NAMED TO TWO WATCH LISTS . . .

- Senior offensive guard Garrett Stafford, a 6'5", 300-pound senior from Tulsa's Memorial High School, has been named to preseason watch lists for the 2015 Rotary Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy.
- After 6 games this year, Stafford has now played in 38 career games and has started 32 consecutive contests.
- Stafford had started 24 straight games at left tackle before he started the season opener this year at left guard.
- Stafford moved to left guard during spring drills . . . all his previous starts had been at tackle (24 at left tackle, 2 at right tackle).
- In 2014, Stafford graded over 80-percent in all 12 games and finished the year with grades over 90-percent in the final six contests.
- Eligibility for the Rotary Lombardi Award is limited to down linemen, end-to-end, either on offense or defense, who set up no farther than 10 yards to the left or right of the ball, or linebackers who set up no farther than five yards deep from the line of scrimmage
- The Outland Trophy is given to the nation's best interior lineman on either offense or defense.

WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

RECEIVERS LUCAS & GARRETT NAMED TO BILETNIKOFF AWARD WATCH LIST . . .

- Junior receiver Keevan Lucas was named to the 2015 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List, as announced by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club (TQC) Foundation, Inc.
- Lucas played in the first four games, but is sidelined the remainder of the season after suffering an injury vs. Houston.
- The Biletnikoff Award annually recognizes the outstanding receiver in college football.
- The 5'10" junior from Abilene, Texas, Lucas led the Hurricane with 101 receptions for 1,219 yards and 11 TDs to finish the season ranked sixth on the school's all-time receiving chart.
- He now has 2,078 career receiving yards and 17 TDs.
- A second-team all-American Athletic Conference selection in 2014, Lucas had five 100-yard receiving games with a career-best 233 yards and three TDs on 13 receptions against Tulane.
- He ranked among the nation's leaders in 2014 for receptions per game (5th), receiving yards per game (11th), receiving yards (12th) and receiving TDs (12th).
- Keyarris Garrett was added to the 2015 Biletnikoff Award Watch List in September.
- The 6'4" senior was added to the list on Sept. 29 following a game in which he caught 14 passes for 189 yards and one TD against #16 Oklahoma on Sept. 19.

DERRICK ALEXANDER ADDED TO LOMBARDI LIST . . .

- Tulsa defensive end Derrick Alexander was added to the 2015 Watch List for the Rotary Lombardi Award on August 25, as the Rotary Lombardi Award Committee announced an updated watch list.
- Alexander joins teammate Garrett Stafford, a senior offensive guard, who was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award.

- Junior punter Dalton Parks was named to the preseason watch list for the 2015 Ray Guy Award, the Augusta Sports Council announced . . . the Ray Guy Award is presented to the nation's top collegiate punter.

- Tulsa opened its' tenure in the American Athletic Conference with a 38-31 double overtime victory against Tulane in the 2014 season opener.
- The American is the sixth conference affiliation for the Tulsa football program, while the previous five include: Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28), Big Four Conference (1929-32), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004) and Conference USA (2005-13).
- Tulsa was an independent for 12 years, coming between the Missouri Valley and its entrance into the WAC in 1996.
- In nine years as a C-USA member, Tulsa compiled a 49-23 regular season league record and a 2-2 mark in C-USA Championship Games – Tulsa was 2-1 against UCF in C-USA title games and 0-1 against East Carolina, both now members of the American Athletic Conference.

SINCE 2003 . . .

- The first three years of 2000's were lean for the Tulsa football, posting just a 7-28 combined record in 2000, 2001 and 2002.
- Since 2003, Tulsa has a 92-69 (.571) overall record. Nineteen of those losses came in the 2013 and 2014 seasons.
