THE AMERICAN TODAY

After the American Athletic Conference placed three teams in the top 25 of both major national polls last week, the league's ranked teams all faced what figured to be challenging tests on the road before all three remained unbeaten. All three teams moved up in the rankings this week.

Temple, which is ranked No. 21/22 this week, got things started Thursday as the Owls clamped down in the second half to take a 24-14 win at East Carolina. The Owls had the only points in the final 30 minutes, as WR Robby Anderson's 23-yard touchdown reception gave Temple the lead before a 14-yard TD run by RB Jahad Thomas iced it.

For Temple, the performance was the latest in a line of impressive second-half efforts. The Owls have outscored their seven opponents 137-29 in the second half this season, while Temple has closed its last four games with impressive scoring runs. Temple scored the game's final 14 points against East Carolina, the last 16 against UCF, the last 42 against Tulane, and the last 27 against Charlotte.

Memphis, ranked No. 16/16 last week, never trailed in its shootout with Tulsa as the Tigers scored a 66-42 win on the road. QB Paxton Lynch continued his remarkable season as he completed 32 of 44 passes for 447 yards and four touchdowns. He also added a rushing touchdown to lead a Memphis offense that gained 704 yards and 35 first downs.

Tulsa's potent offense kept the Golden Hurricane within a touchdown of the Tigers into the third quarter, thanks in large part to WR Keyarris Garrett, who had 14 receptions for an American Athletic Conference-record 268 yards and three touchdowns.

Houston, ranked No. 18/19 last week, faced an early deficit against a UCF squad that has gradually been getting key players back from injuries. But the Cougars' ground game proved to be too much as Houston rushed for 366 yards and had five touchdowns on the ground in a 59-10 win in Orlando. RB Kenneth Farrow led the way with 167 yards and three touchdowns on 13 carries, while the Cougars were able to turn four UCF turnovers into 24 points.

Navy kept pace in The American West Division as the Midshipmen remained unbeaten in conference play with a 31-14 win against Tulane at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. Navy found its patented ground game stymied by a stout Green Wave defensive line, but the Midshipmen were able to put the game away by capitalizing on three Tulane turnovers in the second half. QB Keenan Reynolds had two rushing touchdowns for Navy, leaving him two shy of the NCAA's career record of 76.

USF is one of the hottest teams in The American as the Bulls moved into second place in the East Division with a 38-14 win against SMU at Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls, who have won three straight for the first time since 2011, were led by QB Quinton Flowers, who rushed for three touchdowns and 201 yards — the most by an FBS player this season and an American Athletic Conference record for a quarterback.

Cincinnati picked up its first conference win as the Bearcats reeled off 612 yards of offense in a 37-13 win against UConn at Nippert Stadium. QB Gunner Kiel made his return to the starting lineup, after he had missed the last two games due to injury, and threw for 327 yards and two touchdowns, while RB Hosey Williams (140 yards) and RB Mike Boone (117 yards) both rushed for more than 100 yards.

AMERICAN NOTEBOOK

Streaking

Memphis extended its winning streak to a school-record 14 games with its win against Tulsa. The only teams with longer active winning streaks are Ohio State, which has won 21 straight, and TCU, which has won 15 in a row. Houston and Temple have both won eight in a row.

Perfection

The American has three unbeaten teams (Memphis, Houston and Temple are 7-0). The only other conferences with three undefeated teams are the Big Ten and the Big 12.

Conference Calls

The American is a combined 10-1 against opponents from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt conferences this season. The American is 7-11 against teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC.

Look West

The top three teams in the American Athletic Conference's West Division — Houston, Memphis and Navy — are a combined 19-1 this season.

Depth Perception

Seven of The American's 12 teams have at least a .500 winning percentage this season.

That's Offensive

The American has four of the top eight teams nationally in terms of total offense. Houston is fifth nationally at 561.1 yards per game, followed by Memphis (sixth, 557.3 ypg), Cincinnati (seventh 555.6 ypg) and Tulsa (eighth, 548.1 ypg).

Soaring

Temple's is 7-0 for the first time in program history.

Half And Half

Temple has outscored its seven opponents by a 137-29 margin in the second half.

Rank And File

Seven of the 12 teams in the American Athletic Conference were ranked in the top 25 of the Bowl Championship Series standings or the College Football Playoff committee rankings between 2008 and 2014.

Play On

Navy QB Keenan Reynolds entered the 2015 season as the NCAA career leader in rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. Reynolds moved into second place among all players on the NCAA's career rushing touchdowns chart and needs two TDs to tie the mark set by former Wisconsin RB Montee Ball.

Eyeballs

Temple and Cincinnati have played in front of record home crowds. The Owls drew 69,176 at Lincoln Financial Field for their win against Penn State, while the Bearcats had an on-campus record 39,095 on hand at the newly renovated Nippert Stadium for their win against Alabama A&M before surpassing that number with 40,101 in attendance against Miami (Fla.). Memphis and East Carolina have both played in front of home crowds of at least 45,000.

Veteran Presence

Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo, who is in his eighth year as the Midshipmen's head coach, has more head coaching experience than the other five West Division coaches combined (six years).

To The End Zone

Houston QB Greg Ward Jr. is tied with LSU RB Leonard Fournette for the national lead with 15 rushing touchdowns this season.

Dual Threats

American Athletic Conference quarterbacks occupy the top two places among QBs on the FBS rushing touchdowns chart. Greg Ward Jr. of Houston leads all players with 15 rushing TDs, while Navy's Keenan Reynolds is 12th with 11 TDs.

To Be The Best

American Athletic Conference teams play 11 games against teams ranked in the preseason top 25 polls. The American's nonconference slate includes games against preseason No. 2 TCU, No. 4 Baylor, No. 10 Florida State, No. 11 Notre Dame, No. 16 Georgia Tech, No. 17 Mississippi, No. 19 Oklahoma, No. 21 Stanford and No. 24 Missouri.



The first American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 5, 2015, at noon ET and will be televised nationally on either ABC or ESPN.

The 2015 season will be The American's first in its new 12-team, two-division format, in which each team will play eight conference games. Each team will face the other five teams in its own division as well as three teams from the other division.

The American's East Division includes UCF, Cincinnati, UConn, East Carolina, USF and Temple. The West Division lineup is Houston, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Tulane and Tulsa. The two divisional champions will meet in The American Championship at the home site of one of the participants.

The winner of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest-ranked team among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

Divisional Champions

The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games — both divisional and non-divisional.

In the event of a two-team tie within a division, the head-to-head result between the tied teams will determine the divisional champion.

Championship Site

The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion with the best record in conference games.

If the two divisional champions have the same conference record, then the regular-season head-to-head winner between the divisional champions would host the championship. If the divisional champions have the same conference record and did not play in the regular season, then the team with the better overall regular-season record would host the championship.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, comparative outcomes of common opponents and other factors.

Two Days

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day belong to college football, with two semifinal games and four other top bowl games continuing a wonderful tradition. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Jeff Long (chair), Barry Alvarez, Mike Gould, Pat Haden, Kirby Hocutt, Tom Ierlan, Bobby Johnson, Tom Osborne, Dan Radakovich, Condoleezza Rice, Mike Tranchese, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings..

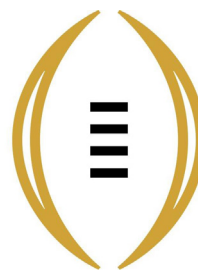

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The Miami Beach Bowl was played for the first time in 2014 at state-of-the-art Marlins Park in Miami, which sits on the site of the historic Orange Bowl stadium. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year, beginning with last year's matchup against Brigham Young. Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference and the Sun Belt Conference are scheduled for future years, though institutions from other conferences also will have the opportunity to participate.

The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The Birmingham Bowl takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The St. Petersburg Bowl is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The Hawaii Bowl is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West Conference.

The Marmot Boca Raton Bowl is a new game that will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2015.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl will debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The Popeye's Bahamas Bowl is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference in 2016 and Conference USA in 2018.

The R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tennessee, the Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, and the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.

THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The 2015 football season will be the second under the American Athletic Conference's comprehensive television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports.

The new arrangements began with the 2013-14 basketball season and will be in place through the 2019-20 academic year. The contracts provide for unprecedented exposure on two of the industry leaders in sports television.

In football, the contract calls for all conference-controlled games — which encompasses all conference games and home nonconference games — to be televised. Nearly 90 percent of those games will be carried on either national broadcast or national cable platforms.

In addition to contracted games on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3, American Athletic Conference teams will regularly appear on CBS Sports Network through a sublicensing agreement with ESPN.

Additional nonconference games will be available on ESPN3 — ESPN's live multi-screen sports network, giving fans an online destination that delivers thousands of global sports events annually. It is accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 and Xbox One. The network is currently available to more than 99 million homes at no additional cost to fans who receive their high-speed Internet connection or video subscription from an affiliated service provider. The network is also available at no cost to approximately 21 million U.S. college students and U.S.-based military personnel via computers, smartphones and tablets connected to on-campus educational and on-base military broadband and Wi-Fi networks.

ESPN, Inc., is the world's leading multinational, multimedia sports entertainment company featuring a portfolio of more than 50 multimedia sports assets. The company is comprised of eight U.S. 24-hour television networks and five HD simulcast services. Based in Bristol, Connecticut, ESPN is 80-percent owned by ABC, Inc., which is an indirect subsidiary of The Walt Disney Company. The Hearst Corporation holds a 20 percent interest in ESPN.

CBS Sports Network is available to 100 million homes and may be seen on a digital basic cable package in all American Athletic Conference markets. Talent for The American's weekly game on CBS Sports Network includes Dave Ryan on play-by-play, Corey Chavous as the analyst and Lauren Gardner as the reporter.
