SETTING THE STAGE

- Navy (6-1, 4-0 in the American) will look to remain unbeaten in the American Athletic Conference as the Mids travel to Tennessee to take on the #15/#16 Memphis Tigers (8-0, 4-0 in the American) on Saturday at 7:00 PM ET / 6:00 PM CT at the Liberty Bowl (59,308).
- Saturday's contest will be Ken Niumatalolo's 100th game as the Mids' head coach. He owns a 63-36 record in eight seasons at Navy.
- The Mids received votes in the Amway Coaches Poll for the fifth consecutive week, as well as one vote in the *Associated Press* Poll.
- Navy's 6-1 record is the Mids' best start under head coach Ken Niumatalolo and its best start overall since 2004 when Navy started 7-1 en route to a 10-2 record that included victories over Air Force and Army to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and a victory over New Mexico in the Emerald Bowl.
- Dating back to last year, Navy has won 12 of its last 14 games with the only two losses coming to Notre Dame in Landover, Md. in 2014 and at Notre Dame in 2015. Memphis, meanwhile, has won an incredible 15 consecutive games and is the third-longest streak in the country behind Ohio State (21) and TCU (16).
- Navy has not defeated a ranked opponent since Nov. 7, 2009, when the Mids upset #19/#21 Notre Dame, 23-21, in South Bend. Saturday's game will take place six years to the day of when that game was played.
- The Mids have not defeated an *Associated Press* top 15 team since Nov. 17, 1984, when the Mids shocked #2 South Carolina, 38-21, and has not beaten an *Associated Press* top 15 team on the road since Sept. 21, 1974, when the Mids won at #8 Penn State, 7-6.
- Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** has scored 77 career touchdowns (all rushing), which is tied for the most in NCAA history among all players for rushing touchdowns with Montee Ball of Wisconsin.
- His 77 career touchdowns are the third most in NCAA FBS history for career total touchdowns (rushing and receiving). He is one behind second-place Travis Prentice (Miami of Ohio) and six behind record-holder Montee Ball (Wisconsin).
- His 3,939 career rushing yards are the second most in school history, trailing record-holder Napoleon McCallum by 240 yards.
- Saturday's game will be televised nationally by ESPN2 with Adam Amin, Kelly Stouffer and Olivia Harlan on the call.
- The Navy Football Tailgate Show on WNAV 1430 AM / 99.9 FM will air at 5:00 PM ET.
- The Navy Football Pregame Show with Pete Medhurst, Omar Nelson and Joe Miller will get underway at 6:00 PM ET, followed by game action beginning at 7:00 PM ET on the Navy Radio Network.
- Following the contest, Medhurst, Nelson and Miller will recap the day's events in a 60-minute postgame show.

AMERICAN RISING

- The American Athletic Conference has three teams ranked in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls.
- Memphis is ranked 15th in the *Associated Press* Poll and 16th in the coaches poll, Houston is ranked 18th in both polls, while Temple is ranked 23rd in both polls. Memphis, Temple, Houston and Navy are a combined 29-2 on the year.

VOLUNTEER NAVY

- Navy has a whopping 15 players on its roster from Tennessee, the third most of any state (26 from Texas and 21 from California).
- Four of the 15 players will start on Saturday against Memphis: Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds (Antioch)**, senior tackle **Joey Gaston (Knoxville)**, junior defensive end **Amos Mason (Nashville)** and sophomore outside linebacker **D.J. Palmore (Bartlett)**. A fifth starter, senior safety **Kwazel Bertrand (Antioch)**, is out for the year with an injury.
- Other Navy players from Tennessee on the depth chart include sophomore center **Parker Wade (Nashville)**, freshman safety **Sean Williams (Memphis)** and freshman tackle **Andrew Wood (Mt. Juliet)**.

INTERVIEW POLICY

- Head Coach Ken Niumatalolo will conduct a postpractice interview session on Tuesday and Wednesday at approximately 5:45 pm. All players and assistant coaches will also be available at that time.
- Coach Niumatalolo and all assistant coaches will be available for phone interviews Monday-Thursday from 2:00-3:00 pm. Please contact Senior Associate AD for Sports Information Scott Strasemeier with your interview request at least one day in advance.
- All player phone interviews must be arranged through Scott Strasemeier at least one day in advance. Players will conduct phone interviews during the day (Monday-Thursday) as their class schedule permits. Players will also be available after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday.

CREDENTIALS

- Navy credentials members of the media only. Navy adheres to the guidelines set forth by the NCAA that prohibits the sale of student-athlete photos for a personal profit. The Navy SID Office reserves the right to revoke credentials from those photographers who are found to have been violating these rules.
- Credentials may be issued: a) to online entities that are affiliated with a national or regional media organization; or, b) to online entities that host a website that regularly and substantially reports on Navy or the visiting team, and employs for that dedicated website at least one full-time permanent employee who writes a substantial majority of all material posted on the site, and that registers a minimum of 20,000 legitimate unique users per month in each of the past 12 months.
- An online entity that meets the requirements of either 5.a) or 5.b) and which sponsors message boards or chat rooms may be credentialed only if the entity enforces its policies regarding abusive or discriminatory material.

REYNOLDS TIES RECORD AS NAVY HOLDS OFF USF

- Navy's **Keenan Reynolds** scored twice in the fourth quarter to tie the collegiate mark for career rushing touchdowns, and Navy set a school record with three 100-yard rushers in a 29-17 victory over South Florida last Saturday.
- The Midshipmen never led until Reynolds bulled in from the 1 to make it 22-17 with 6:58 left. After South Florida fumbled the ensuing kickoff, Reynolds clinched it with another 1-yard touchdown run with 1:49 remaining.
- Reynolds' final TD came on a fourth-and-goal after a sideline chat with coach Ken Niumatalolo.
- Following his fullback, the senior quarterback scored his 77th career rushing TD, tying former Wisconsin running back Montee Ball (2009-12) for most in NCAA history.
- Reynolds finished with 117 yards rushing, **Dishan Romine** had 115 and **Chris Swain** totaled 131 for Navy.
- The victory made the Midshipmen bowl eligible for the 12th time in 13 years. Navy has ties to the Military Bowl but could go to a more prestigious venue if it wins the AAC title game.
- Rodney Adams took the opening kickoff back 97 yards for South Florida, but the Bulls scored only one other touchdown. The defeat ended their three-game winning streak.
- Navy trailed 17-16 before Reynolds launched an 80-yard drive for the winning score, accounting for 56 yards on seven carries.
- After Reynolds scored, Adams lost the handle of the following kickoff. Navy then covered 42 yards to increase its lead.
- The Midshipmen finished with 428 yards on the ground, the most since Sept. 6, 2014, against Temple.

SCOUTING MEMPHIS

- Memphis enters Saturday's contest coming off a 41-13 shellacking of Tulane in a game that saw the Green Wave jump out to a 13-0 lead before the Tigers scored the final 41 points of the contest.
- The Tigers are averaging 47.9 points per game on the year, which is the third-best scoring average in the country, and 560.3 yards of total offense per game, which is sixth best nationally.
- The Tigers are led by Heisman Trophy candidate Paxton Lynch at quarterback. He has thrown for 2,709 yards and 18 touchdowns with just one interception. He is completing 70.2 percent (sixth in the country) of his passes while averaging 338.6 yards per game.
- Memphis is seventh in the country in passing offense (358.0 yds/gm), while its pass efficiency of 173.01 is the sixth best.
- Lynch has completed passes to 15 different receivers with his favorite being Mose Frazier who leads the team with 46 catches for 565 yards (12.3 yds/catch) and three touchdowns. Anthony Miller has caught 33 passes for 574 yards and three touchdowns, while four of Tevin Jones' 16 receptions have gone for touchdowns.
- Dorland Dorceus, who is not listed on their two-deep, leads the Tigers in rushing with 380 yards and seven touchdowns on 91 carries. Jarvis Cooper has rushed for 339 yards and five touchdowns on 75 carries, Jamarius Henderson has 277 yards rushing and four touchdowns on 44 carries and Sam Craft has scored five rushing touchdowns and rushed for 252 yards on 63 carries.
- The Memphis offense is ranked eighth in the nation in third down conversions (.496) and fifth in fourth down conversions (.857). It has 229 first downs, the seventh most in the country, and is fifth in red zone offense (.957). The Tigers have lost just six turnovers on the year, seventh best in the country.
- Genard Avery leads the Memphis defense with 41 tackles, 6.5 tackles for a loss and three sacks, while Wynton McManis and Reggie Ball have 36 tackles each. Ball has two interceptions and a fumble recovery, while McManis has a fumble recovery.
- The Memphis defense is fifth nationally in fourth down defense (.200) and 22nd in rushing defense (118.8).
- Kicker Jake Elliott is 14-16 on field goals and 47-47 on extra-points, while Spencer Smith is averaging 47.5 yards per punt on 25 punts with 11 punts of 50 yards or more and nine killed inside the 20. Memphis ranks 25th in the country in net punting (39.63).
- The Memphis kickoff return defense is ranked No. 1 in the country, giving up just 14.07 yards per return.

NAVY BOWL ELIGIBLE FOR THE 12TH TIME IN THE LAST 13 YEARS

- Navy is headed to a bowl game for the 12th time in the last 13 years after a 29-17 victory over South Florida last Saturday. It is the quickest Navy has become bowl eligible since 2004 (seven games).
- Navy is contractually guaranteed a spot in the Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman, which will be played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis on Monday, Dec. 28 at 2:30 PM against a team from the ACC. ESPN currently projects the ACC representative to be either NC State or Georgia Tech.
- Navy fans can purchase tickets to attend the Military Bowl or donate tickets at: navysports.com or by calling 1-800-US4-NAVY. Ticket prices are \$80 for the lower level and \$55 for the upper level. Donated tickets are \$55 and will be given to either midshipmen or enlisted personnel in the area. Fans are reminded that although the game will be played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, it is not a Navy administered contest and some traditional accommodations will not be available for this contest. All of Navy's tickets will be on the blue or press box side of the stadium.
- Navy is also eligible for the Group of Five bid to a New Year's Six Bowl, which goes to the top ranked conference champion among the Group of Five Conferences (The American, Mountain West, Conference USA, Mid-American and Sun Belt) as selected by the College Football Selection Committee. The Group of Five team selected by the committee would play in either the Chick-fil-A Bowl in Atlanta on Thursday, Dec. 31 or at the Fiesta Bowl in Glendale, Ariz. on Friday, Jan. 1.
- If Navy wins the American Athletic Conference Championship and is selected by the committee to play in either bowl game, a ticket plan will be announced that addresses previously purchased Military Bowl tickets.

NAVY VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- The Mids' 23-21 victory over No. 19 Notre Dame in 2009 marked the first time since 1984-85 that Navy has beaten a top-25 team in back-to-back seasons. The Mids defeated No. 16 Wake Forest in 2008, 24-21.
- It marked the first time an unranked Navy team defeated a ranked Notre Dame team since 1936 when the Mids beat No. 13 Notre Dame, 3-0.
- Navy has not beaten more than one ranked team in a season since 1957, when it defeated No. 5 Notre Dame (20-6), No. 10 Army (27-20) and No. 8 Rice (20-7) in the Cotton Bowl.

NIUMATALOLO SPELLS SUCCESS

- Navy football coach **Ken Niumatalolo** has been on the the Mids' sideline as either an assistant or head coach for 18 of the last 21 years (1995-98 and 2002-07 as an assistant, 2008-current as the head coach).
- Over those 18 years, Navy has compiled a 131-86 record (.604), won nine Commander-In-Chief's Trophies, gone to 12 bowl games and won six bowl games. Navy is 25-10 in Service Academy games over that stretch (.714).
- In the 117 seasons without Niumatalolo, Navy has compiled a record of 555-460-57 (.549), won five Commander-In-Chief's Trophies (in 26 years), gone to eight bowl games and won three bowl games. Navy is 54-64-7 (.460) in Service Academy games without Niumatalolo on the sideline.

NIUMATALOLO NAVY’S ALL-TIME WINS LEADER

- In his eighth season as head coach, **Ken Niumatalolo** has led the Midshipmen to a 63-36 (.636) record and is the program's all-time winningest coach.
- Niumatalolo is 7-0 all-time against Navy's biggest rival, Army, and is the first head coach in the history of the Army-Navy game to win his first seven games against the rival service academy.
- His seven wins against Army are tied for the second most in Army-Navy history. George Welsh went 7-1-1 (.833) from 1973-81, while Army's Earl Blaik is the all-time leader with eight wins, although Blaik posted just an 8-8-2 (.500) mark from 1941-58 against Navy. Both Blaik and Welsh are in the College Football Hall of Fame.
- Niumatalolo holds Navy coaching records for most wins in the first two (18), three (27), four (32), five (40) and six seasons (49) of a career.
- He is also the fastest in school history to reach 50 wins, earning his 50th victory in 2013 against Temple in what was his 81st career game. The previous record was held by Eddie Erdelatz, who won his 50th game in his 83rd contest.
- Niumatalolo is currently the 21st-longest tenured coach at the same school among active coaches.
- He is one of 11 active coaches that are the all-time winningest coach at their respective schools. Three of the 11 have been the only coach in that school's history.
- Niumatalolo is the first Samoan head football coach on the collegiate level and the second Polynesian head coach in FBS history (Larry Price, who was the head coach at Hawai'i from 1974-76, was the first).

- Since 2003, Navy is 44-14 (.759) after Oct. 31, including a 23-6 (.793) mark over the last six years.
- Navy won four-straight to end the 2014 season after winning five-consecutive games to end the 2013 season.

12 WINS IN THE LAST 14 GAMES

- The Mids enter Saturday's game against Memphis having won 12 of their last 14 games.
- The only two losses in that stretch was a 49-39 loss to Notre Dame at FEDEXFIELD in Landover, Md. in 2014 and a 41-24 loss to Notre Dame in South Bend in 2015.

NAVY AMONG NATION'S MOST SUCCESSFUL PROGRAMS IN THE COUNTRY

- The Mids own a 106-55 (.658) record from 2003-15 after posting a 3-30 (.091) mark from 2000-02.

NAVY VS. THE POWER FIVE

- Since 2003, Navy has won 21 games against schools from a Power Five (or BCS) conference. Those 21 wins have come against 10 different opponents and are the most in the country by a Group of Five school during that time period (some schools were in a BCS or Power Five conference and are now in a Group of Five conference. Wins while they were in a BCS or Power Five conference do not count).
- Navy head coach **Ken Niumatalolo** has 10 wins against teams from a Power Five conference since taking over the program at the end of the 2007 season.
- Navy's 21 wins against Power Five schools have come against Vanderbilt ('03, '04), Duke ('04, '05, '06, '07), Rutgers ('04, '08), Stanford ('06), Connecticut-then Big East/BCS('06), Pitt ('07, '13), Notre Dame ('07, '09, '10), Wake Forest ('08, '09, '10), Missouri ('09) and Indiana ('12, '13).

REYNOLDS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** is seventh in the country in rushing touchdowns (13) and eighth in scoring (11.1 pts/gm). Houston's Greg Ward Jr. is leading the nation in rushing touchdowns with 16, while Baylor's Corey Coleman is first in scoring averaging 15.4 points per game.
- Among quarterbacks, Reynolds is second in rushing touchdowns, first in rushing yards per game and second in scoring per game (Ward Jr. is averaging 12.0 pts/gm)

- Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** is 27-12 (.692) as Navy's starting quarterback (15-2 at home, 12-10 in road and neutral site games).

- His 27 career wins are the most in Navy history and the fourth most in the country among active players. Connor Cook of Michigan State leads the way with 31.
- Reynolds is 6-1 (.857) in Service Academy games (one of his six service academy wins was off the bench in a relief role and is not figured into his record as a starter).
- He has a chance to be the first quarterback in the history of the Army-Navy game to be the winning starting quarterback in four straight games.
- His 77 career touchdowns are the most in NCAA history by a quarterback and the most by any player in school history.
- The 77 career rushing touchdowns are tied with Montee Ball of Wisconsin for the most in NCAA history. Ball set his record by playing in 49 games. Reynolds has played in 43 career games.
- His 77 career touchdowns are the third most in NCAA FBS history for career total touchdowns (rushing and receiving). He is one behind second-place Travis Prentice (Miami of Ohio) and six behind record-holder Montee Ball (Wisconsin).
- Reynolds has scored at least one rushing touchdown in 23 of the last 26 games.
- He has scored at least one touchdown in 32 games in his career, which is the fifth most in NCAA history. He is two behind fourth-place Ricky Williams of Texas. The record is held by Florida's Tim Tebow (2006-09), who scored in 38 games in his career.
- He has scored two or more touchdowns in a game 21 times in his career, which is tied with Kenneth Dixon of Louisiana Tech for the fourth most in NCAA history. They are both one behind Ricky Williams of Texas for the third most in NCAA history. The record is 25 set by Travis Prentice of Miami of Ohio (1996-99) and Montee Ball of Wisconsin (2009-12).
- He has scored three or more touchdowns an NCAA-record 14 times in his career (2x as a freshman, 7x as a sophomore, 3x as a junior and 2x so far as a senior).
- He scored 31 rushing touchdowns in 2013, which are the most by a quarterback in NCAA history in a single season and the most by a Navy player (any position) in school history.
- He is just the fourth player in NCAA history to rush for 30 or more touchdowns in a season and just the seventh player in NCAA history to score 30 or more touchdowns in a season.
- Despite missing two games in 2014 due to injury, his 23 rushing touchdowns were the fifth most in the country and the most by a QB. The 23 touchdowns were also the third most in school history and tied for the fourth most in NCAA history by a quarterback.
- Reynolds has led Navy to seven fourth-quarter (or overtime) game-winning drives in his career (Air Force, Indiana and Army in 2012; Pitt and San Jose State in 2013, San Diego State in 2014 and USF in 2015), which is the most in the country among active players.
- His 3,939 career rushing yards are the second most in school history. He trails record-holder Napoleon McCallum by 240 yards.
- His 3,939 career rushing yards are the sixth most in NCAA history among quarterbacks. He is 173 yards behind Colin Kaepernick (Nevada) for fifth place.
- His 1,346 rushing yards in 2013 were the 14th most by a quarterback in NCAA history and rank third at Navy for a season, trailing Napoleon McCallum and Chris McCoy.

- His 2,403 yards of total offense in 2013 (1,346 rushing, 1,057 passing) rank fourth all-time at Navy for a season.
- His 300 rushing attempts in 2013 rank as the third most in school history behind Napoleon McCallum (331 in 1983) and Ricky Dobbs (315 in 2009), while his 428 total offensive plays also stand third all-time behind Jim Kubiak in 1994 (462) and 1993 (450).
- His 863 career rushing attempts rank second all-time at Navy. He is 46 career carries behind record-holder Napoleon McCallum.
- His seven rushing touchdowns in 2013 against San Jose State set an NCAA record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback and tied an NCAA record for most touchdowns scored against an FBS opponent by a player playing any position. Reynolds also set a school record for most points scored in a game and most touchdowns scored.
- He scored three or more touchdowns in seven games in 2013 which was one game shy of the NCAA record set by Barry Sanders in 1988 and equalled by Kapri Bibbs of Colorado State in 2014.
- He scored a school-record 188 points in 2013. The record had previously been set by Bill Ingram in 1917 with 174. The 188 points were the fourth most in NCAA history by a player at any position.
- His 464 career points are the most by a quarterback in NCAA history.
- His 464 career points are the third most in NCAA history among all non-kickers. He is four points behind Travis Prentice (Miami of Ohio) for second and 36 points behind Montee Ball (Wisconsin) for first.
- Reynolds was responsible for a school-record 236 points in 2013 (31 rushing TDs, 8 passing TDs, 1 two-point conversion). The previous record was 198 set by Ricky Dobbs in 2009. He was responsible for 174 points in 2014 (23 rushing TDs, 6 passing TDs), which is tied for the fourth most in school history.
- He has been responsible for a school-record 614 points over his career (77 rushing TDs, 25 passing TDs, one two-point conversion).
- His 19 career 100-yard rushing games are the most among active quarterbacks.
- He has the first, fourth, fifth and sixth-most rushing yards by a quarterback in a game in school history, rushing for 277 yards vs. Georgia Southern in 2014, 251 yards against San Jose State in 2014, 240 yards against San Jose State in 2013 and 226 against Hawai'i in 2013.
- He and Chris McCoy are the only two players in school history to rush for more than 200 yards in a game twice in the same season in two different years.
- He is just the third player in school history to have at least four 200-yard rushing days in a career, joining McCoy (five) and McCallum (four). His four 200-yard games are tied for the most in the country among active players with James Connor of Pitt (who is out for the year with an injury).
- Reynolds rushed for 1,260 yards and threw for 1,038 yards in 2013 to become only the fourth quarterback in school history to rush AND pass for 1,000 yards in a season. The other players to accomplish this feat are Ricky Dobbs (2009), Craig Candeto (2003) and Chris McCoy (1997).
- He has thrown just seven interceptions in 398 attempts for his career for an interception percentage of .018, which is the best in program history.
- He is averaging 8.1 passing yards per attempt for his career (3,219 yards on 398 attempts), which is the fifth-best average in school history.
- He is tied for third in school history for career touchdown passes with 25. He trails second-place Bob Leszczynski by one and former Commandant of Midshipmen Bill Byrne by four for the record.
- In 2012, he became the first Navy quarterback to win his first four career starts since senior Bob Powers, who won his first six career starts in 1979. He became the first freshman to start at quarterback for Navy since Jim Kubiak started five games in 1991, when he guided the Midshipmen to a 31-13 victory over Central Michigan.
- He was just the third freshman in program history to start at quarterback, joining Kubiak and Alton Grizzard, who started seven games at quarterback in 1987.

MIDS CONSISTENTLY AMONG NATION'S TOP RUSHING TEAMS

- Over the last 14 years, Navy has consistently been one of the top rushing teams in the country, never finishing lower than sixth.
- The Mids kicked off the trend in 2002 when they finished third in the country in rushing, averaging 270.8 yds/gm.
- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for an unprecedented fourth-straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished No. 2 in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yards per game.
- Navy finished No. 2 in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yards per game. It was the best rushing average by a Navy team since 2007 when that team rushed for a school-record 348.8 yards per game.
- Through seven games this fall, Navy stands fourth in the country averaging 319.7 yards per game.
- The Mids have rushed for 300 or more yards in a game in 20 of the last 26 games.

THREE OVER 100 YARDS

- Senior fullback **Chris Swain** (23-131), senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** (26-117) and junior slot back **Dishan Romine** (6-115) became the first trio in school history to rush over over 100 yards in the same game when they turned the trick against USF last Saturday.

NAVY'S THREE-HEADED MONSTER

- Navy is running 753 pounds of fullback at the opposition as seniors **Chris Swain** (6-1, 245) and **Quentin Ezell** (6-1, 253) and junior **Shawn White** (6-1, 255) combine to give the Mids a three-headed monster at fullback.
- The fullbacks have combined to rush for 848 yards and 11 touchdowns on 166 carries (5.1 yds/carry) this season.
- The Swain Train leads the way with 582 yards and five touchdowns on 118 carries (4.9 yds/carry), while Ezell has rushed for 234 yards and five touchdowns on 39 carries (6.0 yds / carry) and White has rumbled for 32 yards on nine carries (3.6 yds/carry).

REYNOLDS NAMED AAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ... TWICE

- Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** has quickly earned respect within the American Athletic Conference, garnering AAC Offensive Player of the Week honors in consecutive weeks.
- Reynolds earned the award on Sept. 21 after setting an AAC single-game record with five rushing touchdowns to lead Navy to a 45-21 win against East Carolina in the Mids' first conference game in program history.
- On Sept. 26, he played a role in all four of the Mids' touchdowns to lead Navy to a 28-18 win at UConn. Facing a defense that was ranked 15th nationally in scoring and 18th in yards allowed, Reynolds rushed for a game-high 142 yards with three touchdowns on 28 carries, while he completed 3 of 4 passes for 40 yards and one TD. Reynolds turned in his NCAA-record 14th career game with at least three rushing TDs and moved into second place on the NCAA's career rushing touchdowns chart (73).

EFFICIENT OFFENSE

- The Navy offense is averaging 2.75 points per possession according to Sport Source Analytics, which is the sixth-best average in the country.
- Baylor is No. 1 in the country, averaging 3.61 points per possession. It is the only team in the country averaging more than 3.0 points per possession.
- The rest of the top 10 includes #2 Bowling Green, #3 TCU, #4 Western Kentucky, #5 Oklahoma, #7 LSU, #8 Texas Tech, #9 Memphis and #10 Stanford.

TOUGH IN THE RED ZONE

- Navy is No. 1 in the country in red zone offense (32-33, 23 TD's and nine field goals)
- The Navy defense is seventh in the country in red zone defense (14-20, 11 TD's allowed, 3 field goals and six stops without allowing a point).

30 POINTS IS THE KEY

- Under Ken Niumatalolo, the Mids are 41-10 (.804) when scoring 30 or more points in a game.
- Under Niumatalolo, Navy is 56-12 (.824) when holding the opposition to under 30 points.

TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

- The Mids have allowed just seven rushing touchdown in the first seven games (1 to Air Force, 4 to Notre Dame, 1 to Tulane, 1 to USF).
- Navy was the second-to-last team in the country to allow a rushing touchdown, going 15 quarters without giving one up. Iowa was the last team to give up a rushing touchdown.
- The Mids are 31st in the country in rushing defense, allowing 135.9 yards per game.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK

- The Navy defense recorded five sacks against UConn. It was the most sacks by a Navy defense since recording six in a 42-6 victory over Temple in 2006.
- The defense has recorded 11 sacks in its seven games this fall after posting just eight all of last year. It also equals the total that the 2013 team had in 13 games.
- Sophomore outside linebacker **Kevin McCoy** leads the way with 2.5 sacks.

MCCOY BECOMING A FORCE FOR THE MIDS

- Sophomore outside linebacker **Kevin McCoy** has become a force for the Mids as a pass rusher off the edge.
- McCoy has recorded 3.5 tackles for a loss, 2.5 sacks, a fumble recovery that he returned 54 yards for a touch-down and three caused fumbles, which ranks fourth in the country for forced fumbles per game (0.4).
- McCoy's three forced fumbles are the most by a Navy player since 2011 when Jabaree Tuani and Matt Brewer forced four each.

- David Gordeuk** is second in special teams tackles with seven tackles (all on kickoffs).

SIR BLOCK-A-LOT

- Nose guard **Bernard Sarra** blocked three kicks (all field goals) last year, which tied for the most in the country. Sarra blocked a field goal against VMI and two against Notre Dame.
- Sarra and Tylor Harris of Wake Forest were the only players in the country that blocked two kicks in one game last year. They were the 21st and 22nd players in NCAA history to achieve the feat.
- The three blocked field goals tied for the seventh most in NCAA history in a single season. The record is six by Lonnell Dewalt of Kentucky in 2004.

GREBE ALMOST PERFECT

- Since taking over all the kicking duties on Oct. 11, 2014 against VMI, senior kicker **Austin Grebe** has been almost perfect.
- Prior to replacing a struggling **Nick Sloan** after the loss last year to Air Force, Grebe was only responsible for kickoffs.
- Since getting the job, Grebe has gone 15-16 (.938) on field goals and 61-62 (.984) on extra-points.
- Grebe is 9-10 on field goals this year and his .900 percentage is ninth best in the country.

- Commissioner Mike Aresco has announced the schedule format for the 2015-18 American Athletic Conference football seasons.
- The 2015 season will be The American's first in its new 12-team, two-division format, in which each team will play eight conference games. Each team will face the other five teams in its own division as well as three teams from the other division. The format ensures each school will play every conference opponent at home and on the road at least once in the four-year cycle.
- The American's East Division includes UCF, Cincinnati, UConn, East Carolina, USF and Temple. The West Division lineup is Houston, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Tulane and Tulsa. The two divisional champions will meet in The American Championship at the home site of one of the participants.
- The East and West division winners, determined by final conference record, will meet in the first American Athletic Conference Football Championship Game, which will be played at the home site of one of the division winners.
- The American Athletic Conference has enjoyed widespread success since its inaugural season in 2013. The conference produced two 12-win teams in 2013, including UCF, which won the Fiesta Bowl, and saw UCF, Cincinnati and Memphis tie for the conference title in 2014. Five American Athletic Conference teams – UCF, Cincinnati, East Carolina, Houston and Memphis – played in bowls in 2014 postseason, as did Navy who joins The American this fall.

AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE ANNOUNCES DETAILS OF FIRST CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

- Commissioner Mike Aresco has announced that the first American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 5, at noon ET and will be televised nationally on either ABC or ESPN.
- The American's East Division includes UCF, Cincinnati, UConn, East Carolina, USF and Temple. The West Division lineup is Houston, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Tulane and Tulsa. The two divisional champions will meet in The American Championship at the home site of one of the participants.
- The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games -- both divisional and non-divisional.
- In the event of a tie within a division, the head-to-head result between the tied teams will determine the divisional champion.
- The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion with the best record in conference games.
- If the two divisional champions have the same conference record, then the regular-season head-to-head winner between the divisional champions would host the championship. If the divisional champions have the same conference record and did not play in the regular season, then the team with the better overall regular-season record would host the championship.
- The winner of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest-ranked team among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

KRAH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior outside linebacker **Myer Krah** is one of 11 players from the Football Bowl Subdivision who has been named to the 2015 Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team. The student-athletes selected for this honor have made a positive impact on others and their communities.
- In its 24th year, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team is comprised of athletes who have used their limited free time to perform inspirational acts of service. This summer, the program received a record 197 nominations from colleges and universities across the country for just 22 spots on the team (11 FBS, 11 Non-FBS).

- Navy is one of just three schools to have the same offensive staff back for a fifth straight year, joining Minnesota and Northwestern.

- (AP) Senior fullback **Chris Swain** rumbled for a career-high 126 yards, including a 52-yard touchdown, all in the first half as Navy cruised to a 48-10 victory over Colgate in the opener for both teams.
- Navy's ground attack finished with 371 yards on 47 carries against the Raiders, whose biggest strength was supposed to be their front seven.
- Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** entered the game needing 14 rushing touchdowns and 20 total TDs to break the FBS career marks established by former Wisconsin tailback Montee Ball. He chipped away at those records by running for a second-quarter score.
- Colgate's Jake Melville, who is also a dual-threat, completed 14 of 26 passes for 127 yards and a touchdown. He ran for another 29 yards on 11 carries.
- After the teams traded field goals early in the first quarter, Navy overwhelmed its FCS opponent on both sides of the ball.
- Swain made up for an earlier fumble with a 52-yard touchdown run with 2:30 left in the opening quarter. Another 46-yard scamper by senior slot back **DeBrandon Sanders** set up Navy's second touchdown — a 1-yard sneak by Reynolds for a 17-3 lead with 11:53 remaining in the half.
- The Midshipmen offense didn't have any problems as fullbacks **Shawn White** and **Quentin Ezell** barreled for scores of 6 and 18 yards, respectively, increasing the margin to 31-3 at the break. Navy's three fullbacks ran for 153 yards on 14 carries in the opening half.
- The Raiders managed to get into Navy territory midway through the third quarter. However, Navy's **Kevin McCoy** forced a fumble that was recovered by nose guard **Patrick Forrestal**. Ezell made Colgate pay with another 12-yard touchdown.
- Colgate finally got on the board with a 24-yard touchdown from Melville to John Quazza with 10:22 left in the game. McCoy then returned a fumble 54 yards for a 45-10 lead. It was Navy's first fumble recovery for a touchdown since 2010.
- Navy's **Nick Sloan** added a 38-yard field goal to round out the scoring.

- (AP) Navy's record-setting quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** ran for five touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut with a 45-21 victory.
- Reynolds already owns the NCAA record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with 70 and is now fourth overall for the most by any player.
- Reynolds has scored three touchdowns or more in 13 games, the most in NCAA history. His five rushing touchdowns also set an American Athletic Conference record.
- East Carolina (1-2, 0-1 AAC) had held seven of its past 15 opponents to less than 100 rushing yards. Navy (2-0, 1-0 AAC) had 415 on the ground. Fullback **Chris Swain** went over 100 yards for the second straight game, finishing with 123 on a career-high 29 carries and a touchdown.
- Pirates quarterback Blake Kemp completed 36 of 49 passes for 325 yards and three touchdowns, while Isaiah Jones caught 10 passes for 130 yards.
- In the first half, Navy scored on all four of its possessions on drives of 68, 56, 70 and 85 yards for a 28-14 lead.
- The Pirates tried to keep Navy off-balance with a no-huddle offense. However, it was the Midshipmen who took the lead on their first possession, helped by runs of 23 and 11 yards by slotback **Dishan Romine**. Reynolds capped the drive with a sneak from the one.
- East Carolina responded with a 2-yard pass from Kemp to Jimmy Williams with 2:45 left in the first quarter.
- The Midshipmen relied on their bruising fullbacks, led by Swain and **Quentin Ezell**, to control the ground attack. This helped set up Reynolds' second touchdown on a 2-yard dive to open the second quarter.
- After East Carolina's Davis Plowman missed a 48-yard field goal attempt, Navy responded with two more touchdowns on 2-yard sneak by Reynolds and another 4-yard run by Swain.
- Navy linebacker **Daniel Gonzales** was ejected late in the second quarter for targeting, setting up a 17-yard touchdown pass from Kemp to Bryce Williams.
- Navy's defense came up with a big play in the third quarter as the offense sputtered. **Will Anthony** stuffed Kemp on a 4th-and-1 and then he recovered a fumble on the Pirates' 17-yard line on a sack by **Amos Mason**. Reynolds took advantage with a 2-yard run boosted the lead to 35-14 to open the fourth quarter.
- The Pirates cut the lead on the next possession when Kemp found Bryce Williams on an 8-yard score. Navy responded with an 11-play, 75-yard score with Reynolds running in from the 17 to make it 42-14. **Tyler Goble's** first career interception set up **Austin Grebe's** 25-yard field goal to round out the scoring.

- (AP) Navy quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** carried the ball 28 times for 142 yards and three touchdowns and threw for another score as Navy beat UConn, 28-18.
- The win was the seventh in a row for Navy, which is now 3-0 for the first time since 2006.
- Reynolds had touchdown runs of 10, 4 and 10 yards to give him 73 rushing TDs for his career, tied for second in NCAA history behind former Wisconsin star Montee Ball, who ran for 77.
- The senior threw the ball just four times, but completed three of those, including a 19-yard touchdown to **Jamir Tillman**, the team's first passing touchdown this season.
- Navy had 343 yards of offense, 303 of them on the ground. Fullback **Chris Swain** ran 10 times for 58 yards. The team converted eight of its 12 third-down attempts, including its first seven.
- Bryant Shirreffs threw for 219 yards and two scores for UConn. Freshman receiver Tyraiq Beals caught six passes for 63 yards and a score for the Huskies.
- Shirreffs hit tight end Tommy Myers with a 6-yard touchdown pass that made it a 10-point game after a 2-point conversion with just over seven minutes left. The Huskies recovered the onside kick, but turned the ball over on downs, ending the comeback threat.
- Reynolds has rushed for 3,491 yards and is now second on Navy's all-time rushing list behind former running back Napoleon McCallum, who ran for 4,179 yards from 1981-85.
- The senior had 93 yards rushing by halftime after leading Navy to touchdowns on each of its three first-half possessions.
- His 10-yard touchdown run capped their opening 62-yard drive. They went 85 yards on their second, and led 14-3 when Tillman out-jumped UConn's Jamar Summers in the end zone to pull down a 19-yard touchdown pass.
- Reynolds also scored on a 4-yard run with 2 seconds remaining in the half, capping a 14-play drive.
- His 10-yard touchdown run in the third quarter made it 28-10 and moved him past Texas running back Ricky Williams on the all-time list for rushing TDs.
- UConn also moved the ball, putting up 325 yards of offense, including 186 in the first half.
- But, the Huskies had to settle for a 38-yard field goal on their opening drive. They decided to pass up a 31-yard attempt on their second possession and were left with no points after Shirreffs missed a wide-open Max DeLorenzo on fourth down.
- Beals later got behind the Navy defense and caught a 39-yard touchdown pass from Shirreffs for UConn's first touchdown.
- UConn's defense came into the game ranked 18th in the nation and had been giving up 126 yards a game on the ground. Navy had 190 yards rushing by halftime.
- Navy didn't punt until midway through the third quarter, and that one pinned the Huskies inside the 1-yard line.

- (AP) Senior quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** rushed for a game-high 183 yards, including 117 in the first half, to lead the Midshipmen to a 33-11 victory over service academy rival Air Force in Annapolis.
- It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.
- Reynolds completed 4 of his 10 passes for 117 yards with a touchdown on a wet, windy day, while **Chris Swain**, a 6-foot-1, 245-pound fullback, had a pair of short-yardage scores for the Midshipmen.
- Air Force committed a season-high four turnovers, all in Navy territory. Karson Roberts, who was 5 for 12 for 73 yards with an interception, ran for his team's lone touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Reynolds ran for 54 yards on Navy's first play from scrimmage to set up the first score, a two-yard run by Swain. The Midshipmen defense came up big on Air Force's ensuing possession, stuffing fullback Shayne Davern on fourth-and-goal from the 1.
- After Navy's **Kwazel Bertrand** recovered a fumble by Roberts, the Midshipmen went 64 yards to pull ahead 14-0 with 14:47 left in the second quarter. This time, Reynolds threw a 27-yard pass to **Thomas Wilson**, who fought off two defenders just inside the end zone.
- The Falcons got into Navy territory again midway through the second quarter, but **Brendon Clements** intercepted a high pass by Roberts.
- Reynolds continued to be the difference-maker and another 67-yard run gave the Mids the ball at the 1 late in the second quarter. Three plays later, **Demond Brown** scored on a sweep and Navy led 21-0 at the break.
- Navy carried that momentum into the second half. On the opening drive, the Mids went 75 yards on 12 plays and boosted the lead to 27-0 on 1-yard run by Swain. From there, though, Navy's offense stalled, which gave Air Force a chance to get back into the game.
- The Falcons finally got on the board with a 39-yard field goal by Drew Oehrle with 4:14 left in the third quarter. Air Force pulled to within 27-11 on a 1-yard run and 2-point conversion by Roberts with 13:46 remaining in the game. It was the first rushing touchdown allowed by Navy this season.
- Navy rebounded with a pair of field goals by **Austin Grebe** from 37 and 24 yards to put the game away.
- The win gave the Mids an advantage in what was the first leg in the battle for the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy. Now in its 44th year, the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy is presented annually to the winner of the football games among the three major service academies - Army, Navy and Air Force. The Falcons won the trophy last season after beating Navy 30-21 and Army 23-6.

- (AP) Navy fell to No. 15 Notre Dame 41-24 at a sold out Notre Dame Stadium, ending an eight-game winning streak by the Mids.
- The Midshipmen kept it close early as they rallied to tie the score at 21 late in the second quarter on TD runs of 45 and 22 yards by fullback **Quentin Ezell** after quarterback **Keenan Reynolds** went down with a leg injury. But a 52-yard field goal by Justin Yoon to close the first half and a pair of touchdowns early in the second half by C.J. Prosise gave the Irish a 17-point lead they wouldn't relinquish.
- Navy entered the game tied for best in the nation with one turnover. **Chris Swain** fumbled at the Navy 7-yard line in the second quarter and linebacker Jaylon Smith recovered. On the opening second-half kickoff, **Dishan Romine** fumbled at the 26 and Devin Butler recovered.
- Reynolds sat out part of the second quarter and the end of the game after falling awkwardly on his left leg while being tackled.
- Reynolds finished with 110 yards rushing on 15 carries, but the Irish held him without a rushing touchdown for a second straight season. His replacement, **Tago Smith** threw an interception in the fourth quarter.
- The Midshipmen came into the game averaging 340 yards rushing a game and finished with 318, but couldn't overcome the turnovers.
- Smith led the Midshipmen to touchdown drives with Reynolds out and replaced Reynolds again with nine minutes left in the fourth quarter. He drove Navy to the 30-yard line with six minutes left in the game, but his pass was intercepted by Notre Dame safety Elijah Shumate at the Irish 6-yard line.
- Navy's **Austin Grebe** missed a 44-yard field goal, the first miss of his career, but made a 40-yard attempt later in the third quarter to cut the lead to 38-24.
- Navy jumped to a 7-0 lead early on a 13-yard run by **Toneo Gulley** after holding Notre Dame to a three-and-out on its first possession. The Irish had scored on their first two possessions against Navy in every game since 2011. It took the Mids just three plays to drive 70 yards, highlighted by a 51-yard run by Reynolds on the game's first play.

- Reynolds, who was sacked three times in the first half, converted on fourth-and-2 from midfield and threw a 41-yard pass to **Jamir Tillman** on the next play. However, the Mids had to settle for a 25-yard field goal by **Austin Grebe**.
- Tulane's Trevor Simms missed a 49-yard field goal attempt as time expired and Navy led 10-7 at the half.

- His 27 career wins are the most in Navy history and the fourth most in the country among active players. Connor Cook of Michigan State leads the way with 31.
- Reynolds owns wins over Central Michigan, Indiana (2x), East Carolina (2x), Florida Atlantic, Texas State, Delaware, Army (3x), Air Force (2x), Pitt, Hawai'i, South Alabama (2x), San Jose State (2x), Middle Tennessee, Temple, Georgia Southern, Colgate, Connecticut, Tulane and USF.
- His losses have come at the hands of Troy, Arizona State, Western Kentucky (2x), Duke, Toledo, Notre Dame (3X), Ohio State, Rutgers and Air Force.
- Reynolds is 6-1 (.857) in Service Academy games (one of his five service academy wins was off the bench in a relief role and is not figured into his record as a starter).
- He has a chance to be the first quarterback in the history of the Army-Navy game to be the winning starting quarterback in four straight games.
- His 77 career touchdowns are the most in NCAA history by a quarterback and the most by any player in school history.
- The 77 career rushing touchdowns are tied as the most in NCAA FBS history among all players alongside Montee Ball (Wisconsin). Ball originally set the record by playing in 49 games, while Reynolds tied the record in his 43rd game played.
- His 77 career total touchdowns are the third most in NCAA FBS history for career total touchdowns (rushing and receiving) . He trails second-place Travis Prentice (Miami of Ohio) by just one and record-holder Montee Ball (Wisconsin) by six.
- He has scored at least one rushing touchdown in 23 of the last 26 games.
- He has scored at least one touchdown in 32 games in his career, which is the fifth most in NCAA history. He is two behind fourth-place Kenneth Dixon of Louisiana Tech, who is also an active player, and Ricky Williams of Texas (1995-98). The record is held by Florida's Tim Tebow (2006-09), who scored in 38 games in his career.
- He has scored two or more touchdowns in a game 21 times in his career, which is tied with Kenneth Dixon of Louisiana Tech for the the fourth most in NCAA history. They are both two behind Ricky Williams of Texas for the third most in NCAA history. The record is 25 set by Travis Prentice of Miami of Ohio (1996-99) and Montee Ball of Wisconsin (2009-12).
- He has scored three or more touchdowns an NCAA-record 14 times in his career (2x as a freshman, 7x as a sophomore, 3x as a junior and 2x as a senior).
- He has scored four or more touchdowns four times (2x as a sophomore, 1x as a junior and 1x as a senior).
- He has scored five or more touchdowns three times (1x as a sophomore, 1x as a junior and 1x as a senior).
- He is just the fourth player in NCAA history to rush for 30 or more touchdowns in a season (did it in 2013) and just the seventh player in NCAA history to score 30 or more touchdowns in a season.
- He scored at least one rushing touchdown in a school-record 14 consecutive games before the streak was snapped by Notre Dame last year (11/1/14). He had scored a rushing TD in seven straight contests following that contest before being kept out of the end zone against Air Force on 10/3/15. He has scored at least one rushing touchdown in 22 of the last 25 games after being kept out of the end zone at Notre Dame (10/10/15). It is the first time since Reynolds has become the starting quarterback that he did not score a touchdown in consecutive games.
- He has led Navy to seven fourth-quarter (or overtime) game-winning drives in his career (Air Force, Indiana and Army in 2012; Pitt and San Jose State in 2013; San Diego State in 2014; USF in 2015), which is the most in the country among active players.
- His 3,939 career rushing yards are the second most in school history. He trails record-holder Napoleon McCallum by 240 yards.
- His 3,939 career rushing yards are the sixth most in NCAA history among quarterbacks. He is 173 yards behind fifth-place Colin Kaepernick (Nevada, 2007-10).

- Reynolds scored 31 rushing touchdowns in 2013, which are the most by a quarterback in NCAA history for a season and the most by a Navy player (any position) in school history.
- He is just the fourth player in NCAA history to rush for 30 or more touchdowns in a season and just the seventh player in NCAA history to score 30 or more touchdowns in a season.
- He finished the 2013 campaign ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring per game (14.7), tied for first in rushing touchdowns (31) and tied for 11th in points responsible for per game (18.2).
- His 1,346 rushing yards in 2013 were the 14th most by a quarterback in NCAA history and rank third at Navy for a season, trailing Napoleon McCallum and Chris McCoy.
- His 2,403 yards of total offense in 2013 (1,346 rushing, 1,057 passing) rank fourth all-time at Navy for a season.
- His 300 rushing attempts in 2013 rank as the third most in school history behind Napoleon McCallum (331 in 1983) and Ricky Dobbs (315 in 2009), while his 428 total offensive plays also stand third all-time behind Jim Kubiak in 1994 (462) and 1993 (450).
- His seven rushing touchdowns in 2013 against San Jose State set an NCAA record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback and tied an NCAA record for most touchdowns scored against an FBS opponent by any position. Reynolds also set a school record for most points scored in a game and most touchdowns scored.
- He scored three or more touchdowns in seven games in 2013 which was one game shy of the NCAA record set by Barry Sanders in 1988 and equalled by Kapri Bibbs of Colorado State last year.
- He scored a school-record 188 points in 2013. The record had previously been set by Bill Ingram in 1917 with 174. The 188 points were the fourth most in NCAA history by a player at any position.
- Reynolds was responsible for a school-record 236 points in 2013 (31 rushing TDs, 8 passing TDs, 1 two-point conversion). The previous record was 198 set by Ricky Dobbs in 2009.
- Reynolds rushed for 1,260 yards and threw for 1,038 yards in 2013 to become only the fourth quarterback in school history to rush AND pass for 1,000 yards in a season. The other players to accomplish this feat are Ricky Dobbs (2009), Craig Candeto (2003) and Chris McCoy (1997).
- He was named the 2014 winner of the Naval Academy Athletic Association's Thompson Cup, which is presented to that midshipman, male or female, who has done the most during the year to promote athletics at the Naval Academy. Reynolds is just the third sophomore to win the Thompson Cup in the 127-year history of the award and the first sophomore since Roger Staubach, who won the award in 1963. Following the 2013 season, Reynolds was named the Washington DC Touchdown Club Metro Area Player of the Year and the Columbus (Ohio) Touchdown Club Male Athlete of the Year.

2012

- In 2012, he became the first Navy quarterback to win his first four career starts since senior Bob Powers, who won his first six career starts in 1979. He became the first freshman to start at quarterback for Navy since Jim Kubiak started five games in 1991, when he guided the Midshipmen to a 31-13 victory over Central Michigan.
- He was just the third freshman in program history to start at quarterback, joining Kubiak and Alton Grizzard, who started seven games at quarterback in 1987.
- Against Army as a freshman, he led Navy on a fourth quarter seven-play, 80-yard drive that he capped himself with an eight-yard touchdown run to give Navy a 17-13 victory. Reynolds was held to 43 yards rushing, but scored the game-winning touchdown and completed 10 of 17 passes for 130 yards. He became the first player in series history to be named the game's MVP as a freshman.

Anchored an offense that rushed for 415 yards and passed for another 41 in the win over the Pirates ... directed Navy's offense to 438 yards of total offense, including 371 yards on the ground in the Mids' season-opening win over Colgate ... carried the ball 11 times for 21 yards and a one-yard TD run ... completed three of his six passes for 67 yards, including a 44-yard completion to Jamir Tillman.

- **2014:** Garnered First-Team FBS All-Independent honors, was an All-Independent selection by Phil Steele and received All East recognition ... named the FBS Independent Offensive Player of the Year ... was ranked by NFL.com as the second-toughest player in the country and the fourth-smartest player in the country last fall ... anchored an offense that has rushed for over 300 yards in 15 of their last 19 games which included a school-record nine in a row (Notre Dame 2013 - Texas State 2014) ... part of an offensive unit that ended the year ranked No. 1 nationally in fewest penalties per game (2.54), fewest penalty yards per game (24.77), No. 2 in rushing offense (338.1), No. 2 in passing yards per completion (17.06), No. 6 in fewest passes intercepted (5), No. 11 in third down conversion (.481), No. 36 in red zone offense (.873) and No. 39 in fourth down conversion (.565) ... led the team in rushing with 1191 yards on 250 carries (4.8 yds / carry) and scored 23 touchdowns ... the 23 touchdowns ties as the fourth most by a quarterback in NCAA history ... the 23 touchdowns were the fifth most scored in the NCAA FBS this season at any position and the most by a quarterback ... it's the third-most touchdowns scored in a season at Navy ... completed 52 of his 111 passes (.468) for 843 yards and six touchdowns, while throwing just three interceptions ... Navy's leading scorer with 138 points ... named the Poinsettia Bowl Offensive Most Valuable Player after scoring both of Navy's touchdowns in the win over San Diego State ... paced the Mids with his 14th career 100-yard rushing game with 100 yards on 26 carries to lead Navy to its 13th straight win over Army ... the 14 career 100-yard rushing days is tied as the most among active FBS quarterbacks, alongside Ohio State's Braxton Miller ... his 9-yard TD pass to Jamir Tillman was his 23rd career passing touchdown ... he is now tied for fourth on the Mids' career touchdown passes list alongside Jim Kubiak (1991-94) ... with 3 touchdowns at South Alabama, he became the NCAA record holder for most rushing touchdowns in a career by a quarterback ... additionally, he became the NCAA record holder for most 3-touchdown days with 12 ... he led the Mids' rushing attack at South Alabama with 119 yards on 10 carries, reaching 100 yards for the 13th time in his career and the fifth time this season ... with his 119 yards, he topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the season and 3,000-yard rushing milestone for his career ... he (119) and fullback Noah Copeland (112) both rushed for over 100 yards, marking the second time this season (Western Kentucky) the pair has teamed up to do so ... his 67-yard touchdown run against the Jags was the longest touchdown run of the season by the Mids and matched the longest run of the season (Ryan Williams-Jenkins vs. Ohio State) ... named ESPN.com's Impact Performer of the Week, the National Quarterback of the Week by The College Football Performance Awards, one of eight Stars of the Week by the Manning Award and the FBS Independent Offensive Player of the Week following his performance against Georgia Southern ... carried the ball 30 times for 277 yards and six touchdowns, while completing five of his eight passes for 71 yards and a touchdown ... he broke the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record for rushing TDs, previously held by Ricky Dobbs with five ... it ties as the second-most rushing TDs in a game, as well as the second-most TDs overall in program history ... it was the third time in his career he has scored four or more rushing touchdowns in a game ... the 277 yards are tied as the fourth most in a game by a Navy player and the most since Shun White set the school record with 348 against Towson in 2008 ... meanwhile, it's the most single-game rushing yards by a Navy quarterback in a school history, bettering Chris McCoy's record of 273 against SMU in 1995 ... rushed for 47 yards on 18 carries and threw for 118 yards and two touchdowns on 6 of 15 passing against Notre Dame ... also connected with Geoffrey Whiteside for a two-point conversion, Navy's first since the 2013 Army-Navy game when Brendan Dudeck completed his pass to Reynolds ... his nation's-best 14-game consecutive games streak with a rushing touchdown was snapped by the Irish ... the 39 points by Navy against Notre Dame were the most points scored in a regulation game against the Irish and the second most all-time ... the Mids' 454 yards of total offense (336 rush, 118 pass) are the most by Navy in the series since 1972 (459 yds) ... the 336 yards rushing by Navy were the most yards on the ground allowed by Notre Dame this season, as were the 60 rushing plays ... part of an offense that rushed for 423 yards against San Jose State, Navy's third 400-yard rushing game of the season and the 27th-best rushing performance in program history ... named the FBS Independent Offensive Player of the Week, ECAC Offensive Player of the Week and named one of the "Stars of the Week" by the Manning Award for his performance against San Jose State ... accounted for 251 of the 423 rushing yards ... also ran for three touchdowns to break the Navy record for career touchdowns ... on Navy's 98-yard drive that resulted in a 2-yd TD run by Reynolds, he accounted for 93 of the 98 yards ... carried the ball 21 times for just 27 yards and a touchdown, while completing six of his 14 passes for 126 yards, a touchdown and an interception at Air Force ... carried the ball 39 times which are the most by a Navy player since Ricky Dobbs came off the bench to carry the ball 42 times in a driving rainstorm against SMU on 10-25-08 ... sat out the VMI game ... Navy topped the 400-yard rushing mark for the second time with 412 yards against Western Kentucky and featured two 100-yard rushers (Reynolds 121, Copeland 104) for the first time since the 2013 season opener against Indiana ... carried the ball

24 times for 121 yards and a pair of touchdowns against Western Kentucky ... struggled with the passing game against the Hilltoppers where he connected on just three of his 14 passes for 55 yards and an interception returned for a touchdown ... rushed for 25 yards on 19 carries and two touchdowns, while completing 12 of his 22 passes for 231 yards and a TD against Rutgers ... it was just the second time in his career that he has passed for better than 200 yards (Delaware '13) ... had made 23 consecutive starts at quarterback before sitting out the Texas State contest with a strained knee ... rushed for 173 yards on 21 carries and two touchdowns at Temple, while also completed four of his eight passes for 30 yards ... it was his ninth career 100-yard rushing afternoon and fourth 150-plus yard day ... left the game late in the fourth quarter with an injury ... carried the ball 23 times for 42 yards and a 1-yard touchdown, while also connecting on two of his four passes for 20 yards in the Mids' opener against No. 5 Ohio State ... topped the 2,000-yard rushing mark for his career in the opener.

• **2013:** Named a *Sports Illustrated* Honorable Mention All-American ... named SB Nation's Independent Offensive Player of the Year ... a First-Team FBS All-Independent selection, he was also named the FBS All-Independent Offensive Player of the Year ... garnered All-East honors and was a First-Team All-Independent selection by Phil Steele ... Navy's starting quarterback in all 13 contests, he led the team with 1346 yards on 300 carries (4.5 ypc) and a program-record 31 touchdowns, while completing 68 of his 128 passes for 1057 yards and eight touchdowns ... tossed two interceptions and lost four fumbles on the year ... member of Navy's offensive unit that finished the year ranked No. 1 nationally in turnovers lost (10), No. 1 in passes had intercepted (4), No. 2 in rushing offense (325.4), No. 3 in tackles for loss allowed (3.62), No. 6 in passing yards per completion (15.09), No. 6 in third down conversion (51.1), 11th in fourth down conversions (67.9) and 12th in turnover margin (+0.9) ... named the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl Most Valuable Player for Navy following a two-touchdown performance against Middle Tennessee ... paced the Mids with 86 yards on 20 carries and completed three of his seven passes for 19 yards ... with his three-yard touchdown run in the opening quarter against the Blue Raiders, he became just the fourth player and ONLY quarterback in FBS history to score 30 or more rushing touchdowns in a season, joining Barry Sanders (Oklahoma State, 37 in 1988), Montee Ball (Wisconsin, 33 in 2011) and Kapri Bibbs (Colorado State, 31 in 2013) ... with his one-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter (10:48), Reynolds scored his 31st rushing touchdown of the 2013 season, tying Bibbs for the most in the country ... Navy also rushed for 351 yards, marking the first time since 2010 that it has topped the 300-yard rushing mark in three straight games (331 vs. Notre Dame, 383 vs. Hawai'i) ... carried the ball 17 times for 59 yards and a touchdown, while completing 10 of his 17 passes for 168 yards and a touchdown in leading the Mids to a win over South Alabama ... connected with Matt Aiken on a two-point conversion, Navy's first since last year's Air Force game when Noah Copeland ran it in ... named named a Manning Award Star of the Week, FBS Independent Offensive Player of the Week and ECAC Offensive Player of the Week on Nov. 11 after leading Navy with a then career-high 226 yards rushing on 28 carries against Hawai'i ... his 226 yards rushing are the third most by a Navy quarterback in school history and the most since Chris McCoy rushed for 268 yards on 27 carries against Kent State on Nov. 22, 1997 ... he is one of only 7 different quarterbacks in school history to reach 200 yards rushing in a game ... the last QB to reach the 200-yard milestone was Kriss Proctor with 201 yards on 20 carries against Central Michigan on Nov. 13, 2010 ... offense since 2007 (Ball State 540, Duke 540) ... the 589 yards of total offense against Indiana are the most by the Mids since Nov. 6, 2010, when they produced 596 yards (521R, 75P) in a 76-35 win over East Carolina ... Navy's 237 yards passing are the most since throwing for 248 yards against Stanford on Sept. 10, 2005 ... earned ECAC Offensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 16 after he rushed for 109 yards and threw for a career-high 233 yards and two TDs against Delaware ... it's his third career 100 rushing-100 passing game ... he is the first Navy player to pass for 200 yards and rush for 100 yards since Craig Candeto threw for 212 yards and rushed for 138 yards against Northwestern on Sept. 21, 2002 ... his 233 yards passing are the most by a Navy quarterback since Brian Broadwater threw for 302 against Tulane on Nov. 11, 2000 ... Broadwater combined with Ed Malinowski (33) and Billy Hubbard (27) for 362 yards through the air ... his 342 yards of total offense marked the best output by a Navy player since Shun White recorded 348 yards of total offense against Towson on Aug. 30, 2008 ... put together his second straight 100-yard rushing game and fourth of his career ... carried the ball a career-high 32 times for 127 yards and three touchdowns in the Mids' season-opening win over Indiana ... it was his third-career 100-yard rushing day and it was his third three-rushing TD performance of his career ... also completed two of his four passes for 71 yards ... combined with Darius Staten (106) to become just the 43rd tandem to rush for 100 yards apiece in a game.

Navy also produced 32 first downs in the win at ECU, topping 30 first downs for the first time since the Air Force contest in 2011 ... carried the ball 10 times for a career-high 81 yards and three touchdowns, while completing three of his five passes for 51 yards and two TDs against East Carolina ... responsible for five of the Mids' eight touchdowns on the day, becoming the first QB since Ricky Dobbs to be responsible for five TDs in a game ... Dobbs rushed for 5 TDs against Delaware on Nov. 14, 2009 ... with three rushing TDs (1, 2 and 1 yd), he is the second Navy player this season to score three rushing TDs in a single game, joining Trey Miller who scored three in the win over VMI on Sept. 22 ... picked off by ECU's Chip Thompson in the second quarter, marking Reynolds' first collegiate interception thrown ... once again, he orchestrated a furious rally in the fourth quarter for the Mids, fighting back from a 30-21 deficit to lead Navy to a 31-30 victory over Indiana on Homecoming ... earned ECAC Div. I Offensive Player of the Week honors for a second straight week after carrying the ball 17 times for 66 yards and a touchdown, while completing eight of his 13 passes for 96 yards and the game-winning touchdown pass to Matt Aiken ... named the FBS Independent Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 15, as well as the ECAC Div. I Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Mids to a 31-13 road win over Central Michigan ... with his start against the Chippewas, he became the first Navy freshman to start at quarterback since 1991 when Jim Kubiak started five games for the Mids ... completed six of his 11 passes for a career-best 134 yards and three touchdowns, while also carrying the ball 24 times for 59 yards ... the 24 carries are the most by a Navy player this season ... with touchdown strikes of 23 (11:43, 1Qtr), 19 (3:49, 1Qtr) and 41 yards (2:53, 3Qtr), he became the first Navy QB to throw three touchdown passes in a game since Chris McCoy threw three against Colgate on Nov. 15, 1997 ... capped the Mids' opening drive (11:43, 1Qtr) with a 23-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Turner, marking his first collegiate passing touchdown ... came into the game at the 9:03 mark in the fourth quarter (Miller injured ankle) to rally Navy to victory over Air Force ... carried the ball three times for 22 yards and completed all three of his passes for 55 yards, including a 35-yard completion to Gee Gee Greene ... scored his first collegiate touchdown on a 15-yard run with 6:35 to go in the fourth, setting up a game-tying two-point conversion by fullback Noah Copeland ... relieved Trey Miller in the fourth quarter of the San Jose State contest where he completed three of his four passes for 33 yards ... carried the ball eight times for a career-high 34 yards at Penn State, which featured a career-long run of 30 yards ... completed four of his five passes for 44 yards, including a 21-yard
