SETTING THE SCENE

- The Mustangs will close out the season at Memphis on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT on ESPNews.
- SMU enters the game at 2-9, but the record can be deceiving, as SMU's losses have come to teams who entered this week with a combined **72-25** mark, seven of whom were ranked in the top 25 or have received votes this season.
- SMU registered **season-highs** in rushing yards (323) and rushing TDs (6) in its win over Tulane, and three of the Mustangs' scoring drives were over 90 yards - 91, 95 and 99.
- Xavier Jones' three-TD rushing touchdown performance vs. Tulane last week helped Jones set an **SMU freshman record** with 10 TDs on the ground this season and also earned him inclusion on the weekly **American Athletic Conference Honor Roll**.

THE SERIES

- The Mustangs and Tigers will meet for the **eighth time**, with Memphis holding a slight 4-3 edge overall. SMU has won three of the four previous meetings, averaging 40 points per game in those wins.

THE COACHES

- Chad Morris** is in his first season at the SMU helm. Prior to arriving on the Hilltop, Morris spent five seasons as a collegiate offensive coordinator at Tulsa (2010) & Clemson (2011-14). Prior to his stint in the college ranks, Morris was a high school coach for 16 seasons, posting a 169-38 record. In his final prep stop, Morris led Lake Travis High School to back-to-back 16-0, state-championship seasons in 2008 and 2009.
- Justin Fuente** is in his fifth season at the Memphis helm. Fuente has posted a 25-23 record in his time as head coach and led the Tigers to the 2014 AAC Championship.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

- Memphis currently stands at 8-3 and is coming off a 31-12 loss at Temple last week. All three losses have come against conference foes that were ranked or receiving votes.

LAST TIME VS. MEMPHIS

Paxton Lynch threw for 307 yards and a touchdown as Memphis beat SMU, 48-10, on Oct. 25, 2014.

Memphis scored 41 of the game's first 48 points, including 21 straight to open the game followed by a 20-0 stretch after Prescott Line put SMU on the scoreboard with a 1-yard TD run.

The Mustangs were limited to just 251 yards of total offense. Matt Davis finished with 46 yards rushing and Line added 38. Garrett Krstich had 59 yards passing with two interceptions.

#PONYUPTEMPO

Head Coach Chad Morris integrated a #PonyUPTempo mindset into the SMU program. **SMU scored 133 points all of last season, but had 134 in just four games in 2015.** On the year, the Mustangs have now tallied **333 through 11 games.**

SMU has also scored on its first possession in five of 11 games (Baylor, TCU, ECU, UH & Tulsa).

SEEING RED (ZONE)

SMU has made good use of its redzone appearances this year, having posted a perfect redzone performance in six of its 11 games. The Mustangs went 5-5 against Tulane, 4-4 at Houston, 2-2 vs. ECU, 4-4 against James Madison and 7-7 at TCU. SMU has scored on 37 of its last 43 redzone trips, and on 86% of trips overall in 2015.

MAN ON THE RUN

Twice this season SMU junior quarterback **Matt Davis** has earned American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll recognition - once after registering a career-high 334 yards passing and 62 yards on the ground versus No. 3 TCU and again after guiding the Mustangs to a 31-13 win over North Texas.

Davis has led his team in rushing in six of 11 games this season, and has been the leading rusher for SMU in 13 of the last 18 games, dating back to last season.

In 2014, the Houston native led SMU with 1,468 yards of total offense. His 855 passing yards tied for best on the team and he led the squad with 613 rushing yards. In the last five games of 2014 (all starts), he had 1,270 total yards (735 passing & 535 rushing).

In his first career start at Tulsa (Nov. 8), he had 212 yards passing and 181 yards rushing while totaling three TDs (1 pass, 2 rush). The 181 rushing yards were the most by a QB in SMU history, beating the previous mark set by Ramon Flanigan in 1993 by 33 yards (148 versus Navy). He broke that mark with 191 yards (+145 passing) in the 27-20 win at Connecticut on Dec. 6.

Since 2009, the SMU coaching staff has chosen a deserving student-athlete to wear the number 23 to honor **Jerry LeVias**.

LeVias was the first African-American to receive an athletic scholarship in the Southwest Conference. While at SMU, LeVias made athletic and academic All-America teams and, in 1966, contributed to the Mustangs' first SWC title in 18 years. He was an All-American in 1968 and was chosen All-SWC in 1966, 1967 and 1968.

Senior wide receiver **Darius Joseph** has already left his mark in the SMU record book, ranking in the top 10 in career receptions, season receptions and games with at least 10 catches.

Joseph holds the eighth spot on SMU's career receptions list. His career high is 13 receptions (100 yards & 2 TDs) at East Carolina on Oct. 4, 2014. That led to his first AAC Weekly Honor Roll recognition. The 13 receptions were a career-high for Joseph and tied for the most-ever by an SMU junior, with Joseph joining Emanuel Tolbert, who caught 13 passes as a junior at Baylor in 1978.

HONORARY CAPTAINS

Head Coach Chad Morris has brought several new traditions to the SMU football program. One involves naming an Honorary Captain at each home game.

In the seven home games **Harvey Armstrong** (9/4), **Reggie Dupard** (9/12), **Chuck Hixson** (9/26), **Ramon Flanigan** (10/3), **Gary Hammond** (10/31), **Lance McIlhenny** (11/6) and **Louie Kelcher**.

Armstrong (1978-81) earned All-America honors (1981) and was co-captain of the 1981 National Championship squad. He played eight years in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles and Indianapolis Colts.

Dupard (1982-85) was selected All-America (1985) and a first-round draft choice of the New England Patriots in 1986.

Hixson threw for 7,179 yards and 40 touchdowns from 1968-70. He led the nation in passing as a sophomore, earning the Sammy Baugh Trophy, and guided the Mustangs to the 1968 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl. He left the Hilltop as the Mustangs' career leader in passing yards and completions.

Flanigan is SMU's all-time total offense leader with 7,437 yards. He ranks among the school's career leaders in TD passes (30) and rushing yards (1,797). At the time of his graduation, he had accounted for more touchdowns (57) than any other SMU player, running for 27 and throwing for 30.

Hammond played receiver, running back and quarterback over three successive seasons on the Hilltop (1969-71). Hammond was an All-SWC choice all three years and the SWC Offensive Player of the Year in '71. Hammond led SMU in a different statistical category each year: receiving in '69 (722 yards), rushing in '70 (891 yards) and passing in '71 (787 yards).

Quarterback for the Pony Express, McIlhenny was a three-time All-Southwest Conference selection from 1981-83 and led SMU to back-to-back national championships in 1981 & 1982, going 34-5-1 as a starter.

Kelcher earned All-America honors and was named the SWC Defensive Player of the Year in 1974. The two-time All-SWC performer, he played 10 years in the NFL with the San Diego Chargers and San Francisco 49ers.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Youth was served early in 2015 for SMU. In their season opener, the Mustangs were led in receiving by four freshmen - true freshmen **Xavier Jones**, **Braeden West**, and **Xavier Castille** and redshirt freshman **Courtland Sutton**. So far this season, the freshmen have accounted for 110 of the 198 receptions and 1,427 of the 2,556 receiving yards.

After a career-best three-rushing-TD performance against Tulane, Jones earned **AAC Honor Roll** honors as well as **Earl Campbell Award Honorable Mention** accolades. The Spring, Texas, native now holds the mark for **most rushing touchdowns by a Mustang freshman**, bettering SMU legends Eric Dickerson and Reggie Dupard among others.

3-TIME NATIONAL CHAMPS

SMU is one of just 20 schools that boasts both a **Heisman Trophy winner** and **multiple National Championships**.

Doak Walker won the Heisman following a dominant **1948** season in which he rushed for 542 yards and eight touchdowns, caught 15 passes for 278 yards and two scores, and threw for 304 yards and five TDs. He also returned 10 punts for 169 yards and a touchdown, totaled 161 yards on five kickoff returns, intercepted three passes for 75 yards, averaged 42.1 yards on 35 punts and kicked 22 PATs. He beat out Charlie Justice and Chuck Bednarik for the Heisman.

The NCAA recognizes three SMU teams as National Champions - **1935** (Dickinson & Houlgate), **1981** (National Championship Foundation) & **1982** (Helms Athletic Foundation).

ALL ABOARD THE PONY EXPRESS

SMU alum, 1982 All-American and NFL Hall of Famer **Eric Dickerson** is the recipient of the 2015 Walter Camp Alumni Award.

The Walter Camp Alumni of the Year award is bestowed on a worthy individual who has distinguished himself in the pursuit of excellence as an athlete, in his personal career and in doing good works for others.

Dickerson rushed for a Southwest Conference-record 4,450 yards and 48 TDs in three seasons for the Mustangs. In 1982, Dickerson totaled an impressive 1,617 yards and 17 TDs, averaging 7.0 yards a carry, on his way to Walter Camp All-America honors.

Dickerson was the first NFL player to gain more than 1,000 yards in seven consecutive seasons and became the fastest to total 10,000 yards (in just 91 games).

He was named to the NFL 1980s All-Decade Team. In 1999, Dickerson was enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

CALLS FROM THE HALLS

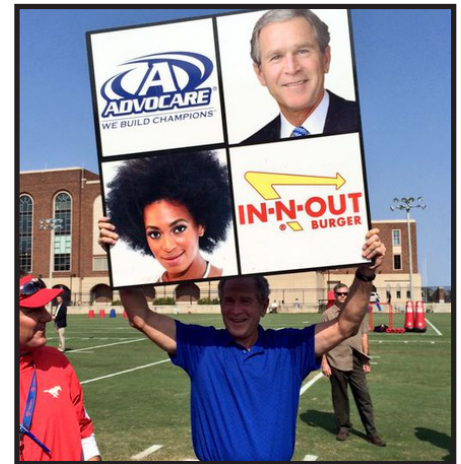
Courtland Sutton was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List on Sept. 29. The award is given annually to the nation's top receiver.

SMU HITS \$1B CAMPAIGN GOAL

SMU Unbridled: The Second Century Campaign has reached its \$1 billion goal ahead of schedule, raising unprecedented funding for scholarships, academic positions, programs, facilities and other enhancements to campus life. The campaign's official completion date is Dec. 31, 2015.

The Second Century Campaign was publicly launched in 2008 with a goal of \$750 million. Rapid progress toward that goal and opportunities for further advancements led SMU leaders in 2013 to increase the goal to \$1 billion and extend its timeline to 2015.

Ending in 2002, SMU's previous major gifts campaign, "A Time to Lead: The Campaign for SMU", raised \$542 million. Combining both campaigns, in the last two decades SMU has raised a total of \$1.5 billion for 753 new scholarships, 111 new academic positions, 146 academic programs and 32 capital projects.

SMU joins 35 private universities that have raised \$1 billion or more through major gifts campaigns. The institutions range from Columbia and Notre Dame to Emory and Vanderbilt.

PONY UP-GRADES!

SMU has made almost **\$10 million in Ford Stadium improvements** since 2011, including upgrades to the locker room and team meeting rooms, a new playing surface, lighting system, suites and club seating.

Renovations included a new team meeting room with stadium-style seating and renovated positional meeting rooms. Changes to the locker room included the creation of a new team lounge, as well as new lockers, updated graphics and audio/visual equipment. SMU also installed a state-of-the-art Mondoturf 3NX artificial turf system. Musco Sports Lighting's new system has reduced energy consumption 50% and has saved more than 293 metric tons of CO2 from entering the environment.

In 2013, SMU added a new 233-seat Hall of Champions Club and seven new suites to the northwest corner of the stadium.

In 2014, SMU made significant upgrades to the Stadium Club. The improvements to the nearly 900-seat area included new stadium seats and bar stools. The enhancements also include new carpet and granite countertops.

In 2015, SMU updated its football offices and team areas, installing new graphics and displays.

DID YOU KNOW?

- SMU offers nationally-rated academic programs, championship-caliber facilities, a top-five media market, fertile recruiting grounds and is a top destination for travel. Dallas features two major airports with direct flights nationwide and is the company headquarters for many of the biggest sponsors in collegiate sports, including 20 Fortune 500 companies.
- SMU has one of the best athletic programs in the country. Teams are competing at the highest level in a plethora of sports. Last year, 12 of SMU's 17 sports finished in the top-3 in the AAC; and eight sports were represented in post-season competition.
- SMU has the third-largest athletic budget of any non-P5 school, trailing only UConn and BYU. Significant investments have been made in the student-athlete experience, including attracting and retaining quality coaches.
 - SMU's infrastructure represents tangible evidence of the commitment to athletics on the Hilltop. A new \$20 million tennis complex and a \$57 million renovation to Moody Coliseum - now one of the most intimidating places to play in college basketball - are the newest additions. Other recent improvements include new throwing field for track, enhancements to the football offices and meeting rooms and golf hitting bays at the Dallas Athletic Club. A \$20 million aquatics center will break ground this winter, and design for golf facilities at Trinity Forest are underway. A facility master plan is in development to address future needs, including an indoor performance center.
- SMU is among an elite group private universities nationwide that have raised \$1 billion or more through major gifts campaigns.
- Since June 2011, SMU has invested almost \$400M in approximately 350 new construction and renovation projects. That work has elevated the campus to No. 2 on Princeton Review's "Most Beautiful Campus" list and No. 8 on the "Best Athletic Facilities" list.
- Baylor and TCU are local examples of what can happen with access to resources. Due to location, academic quality and other factors unique to SMU, the potential exists to develop a program on par with these schools as well as Miami, Vanderbilt, Northwestern and USC.
 - Dallas is a top-five college football market.
- Dallas is home to some of college football's biggest advertisers and sponsors: AT&T, Southwest Airlines, American Airlines, Dr. Pepper, Frito-Lay, Toyota, Exxon Mobil, JC Penney, Gamestop and others.
- Dallas is Texas' No. 1 tourist destination and ranked as the No. 1 sports city in America.
- Texas high school football produces the most Division I football prospects in the country.

DALLAS (AP) - Seth Russell threw for 376 yards with three of his five touchdowns to Jay Lee, and also ran for a score as fourth-ranked Baylor scored a 56-21 victory at SMU.

Played its first game for new coach Chad Morris, the Mustangs, who scored only 12 total points their first four games last season including a 45-0 loss at Baylor, had 21 points in the first 11-2 quarters. They were still in the game until two impressive TD catches by Lee in the third quarter.

Russell hit Corey Coleman for a 42-yard gain on the game's first play and Baylor got in the end zone on all four of its possessions in the first quarter.

But with SMU at the 3 and within 28-21, Davis was sacked on the final play of the first half. The Mustangs were out of timeouts and couldn't get lined back up for another play.

Baylor went ahead to stay when Russell hit Lee for a 7-yard TD to make it 21-14 with just under four minutes left in the first quarter.

DALLAS (AP) - P.J. Walker threw four touchdowns passes and ran for another score, freshman Jager Gardner had a 94-yard scoring run on Temple's second play and the 23rd-ranked Owls beat SMU, 60-40.

Walker's final touchdown pass was a 75-yarder to Ventell Bryant the first play after Matt Davis pulled the Mustangs to 38-31 on a 30-yard scoring toss to Jeremiah Gaines early in the fourth quarter.

Temple went ahead for good at 21-17 when Walker found Romond Deloatch for a 16-yard touchdown strike with 24 seconds left in the first half.

SMU was competitive for third time in three games against ranked teams under first-year coach Chad Morris, and made things really interesting with nine quick points to get within 45-40 midway through the fourth quarter.

After Temple's Nick Sharga was called for holding in the end zone on a punt to give the Mustangs a safety, Braeden West returned the subsequent free kick 80 yards for a touchdown, weaving between tacklers before breaking free near midfield.

The Mustangs had one chance for a go-ahead score, but linebacker Tyler Matakovich knocked down Davis' fourth-down pass in SMU territory with 2:41 remaining.

Walker followed with a clinching 36-yard touchdown run, and Sean Chandler finished the scoring with a 41-yard interception return in the final minute.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (AP) -- Keenan Reynolds broke the NCAA record for career rushing touchdowns, upping his total to 81 with four scores as No. 22/23 Navy beat SMU, 55-14, to remain undefeated in the American Athletic Conference.

Reynolds shattered the mark held by Montee Ball, who ran for 77 TDs with Wisconsin from 2009-12. Ball holds the record for total touchdowns with 83.

Reynolds scored on runs of 4, 43 and 8 yards on Navy's first three series and added a 32-yard touchdown with 14:19 left to make it 41-14.

In a sentimental move, SMU coach Chad Morris started third-string quarterback Garrett Krstich, whose late father was co-captain of the 1969 Navy team. After Krstich completed a pass for no gain on the game's first play from scrimmage, Morris called a timeout to allow the senior to savor the moment.

SMU quarterback Matt Davis ran for a touchdown and threw for a score, but the junior never had a chance of keeping pace with Navy's prolific triple-option attack.

After failing to get into the end zone last week against Memphis, Reynolds got the record-breaker on Navy's opening drive with a run up the middle. Before being embraced by his teammates, Reynolds bent down to one knee, lowered his head and pointed skyward.

Reynolds ran for two more scores to make it 21-0, and then lofted a pass to a wide-open Jamir Tillman that gave Navy four touchdowns in four possessions.

Davis scored on a 1-yard run late in the half, but Navy went up 34-7 when Demond Brown scored on 32-yard run to close out a 78-yard drive.

Chad Morris was named the Head Football Coach at SMU on Dec. 1, 2014. Morris arrived on the Hilltop after five seasons as an offensive coordinator on the collegiate level and 16 seasons as a Texas high school coach.

For the previous four seasons, Morris has served as Offensive Coordinator at Clemson, helping the Tigers to a 41-11 record, the 2011 ACC Championship and four bowl berths, including two BCS Orange Bowl appearances. Clemson also posted three final top-25 rankings, including a top-10 finish in the final USA Today polls in 2012 and 2013. At the time of his departure, the Tigers were ranked 19th in the 2014 AP and USA Today polls. Clemson established 127 offensive records during his four years (89 individual/38 team) and posted the top three scoring seasons in school history, as well as four of the top five passing seasons in Clemson history. For his work, Morris was named AFCA National Assistant Coach of the Year and one of five finalists for National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by 247Sports.com in 2013, and the National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by Rivals.com in 2011.

Among the players Morris tutored at Clemson were 2012 first-team All-American quarterback and ACC Player of the Year Tajh Boyd, 2012 first-team All-American center Dalton Freeman, 2012 third-team All-American wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins and 2013 first-team All-American wide receiver and Biletnikoff Award finalist Sammy Watkins as well as NFLers Dwayne Allen of the Indianapolis Colts, Jaron Brown and Andre Ellington of the Arizona Cardinals, Martavis Bryant of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Tyler Shatley of the Jacksonville Jaguars and Brandon Thomas of the San Francisco 49ers.

Clemson's 2012 team set school records for total offense per game (512.7) and points per game (41.0), ranking sixth in the nation in scoring and ninth in the nation in total offense, and the 2013 offense averaged 507.7 yards and 40.2 points per game. Clemson and Baylor were the only FBS schools with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver every year from 2011-13.

Morris went to Clemson after one season as Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach at Tulsa. After his arrival, Tulsa improved from 5-7 in 2009 to 10-3 in 2010, averaging 41.4 points per game, eighth-most in the nation, and scoring at least 28 points in 12 of its 13 games. Tulsa was fifth nationally in first downs (25.6) and tied for fifth in touchdowns scored from the red zone (46). His offense scored 64 touchdowns on scrimmage plays (32 rushing, 32 passing) and totaled 1,006 plays (537 rush-es, 469 passes).

Prior to his stint at TU, Morris served as a head coach on the Texas prep level for 16 years, coaching at Eustace Independent School District (1994-97), Elysian Field ISD (1998-99), Bay City ISD (2000-02), Stephenville ISD (2004-07) and Lake Travis ISD (2008-09). Morris is a legend in the state after posting a 169-38 record overall and winning back-to-back undefeated state championships in his final two seasons as a prep coach. In all, Morris took six of his teams to Texas State Championship Games, with three of those teams capturing state titles, and earned Coach of the Year honors 11 times.

In his last two years in the prep ranks, Morris led Lake Travis High School to back-to-back undefeated 16-0 seasons as well as two Class 4A State Championships. Lake Travis was the state of Texas' top-ranked offense in both 2008 and 2009. The 2008 team was ranked second nationally by USA Today and eighth by Rivals.com, while the 2009 team ranked No. 2 nationally by Rivals.com and ninth by USA Today.

Morris' offenses enjoyed tremendous success in his two seasons at Lake Travis. In 2008, the Cavaliers averaged 49.0 points per game and had a 41-point margin of victory, while scoring 784 points, the fourth-most in Texas football history, and throwing for 305 yards per game. In that same 2008 campaign, Morris coached former Mustang great Garrett Gilbert, who was named the Gatorade and Parade Magazine National Player of the Year, while setting the state of Texas' single-season passing yardage mark with 4,884 yards and 55 touchdowns. Gilbert also rushed for 790 yards and 28 TDs that season.

In 2009, Lake Travis totaled 7,600 offensive yards for a 475-yard average. LTHS threw for 287.5 yards and scored 44.0 points per game, while defeating opponents by an average of 34 points a game. The Cavaliers put up 4,600 passing yards and 46 TDs, with just seven interceptions.

Before compiling a 32-0 record in his two seasons at Lake Travis, Morris posted a five-year mark of 49-10 at Stephenville High School, where he implemented a hurry-up, no-huddle offense in 2004. At Stephenville, Morris tutored former Ole Miss quarterback Jevan Snead. Snead started the 2004 and 2005 seasons under Morris' tutelage and rushed for 1,053 yards in his senior season. After Snead, Morris coached quarterback Kody Spano, who later played collegiately at Nebraska. Spano threw for over 2,900 yards and rushed for more than 1,000 yards as a senior in 2007.

Before moving to Stephenville, Morris' teams registered a three-year record of 34-8 at Bay City High School, while playing for the state championship twice (2000 & 2001) and winning the crown in 2000 with a 14-1 record. At Bay City, Morris coached quarterbacks Andrew Smith (2000) and Scott Elliott (2001-02). Smith went on to play at North Texas where he led the Mean Green to a Bowl Game in his freshman season, while Elliott played collegiately at Tulane.

Morris' Elysian High School teams advanced to the state championship game in each of his two seasons as the head coach, while posting a 26-6 two-year record. His first team in 1998 compiled a 12-4 record, while the 1999 team compiled a 14-2 mark.

Morris received his first coaching position at Eustace High School as the quarterbacks coach in 1992-93, before taking over as head coach in 1994, leading the school to an 11-1 record in his final season of four years as the head coach. At Eustace, Morris also served as the head boys' basketball coach for four seasons (1993-97) and posted a record of 128-32.

Morris earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics with a minor in statistics from Texas A&M University in 1992.

Born Dec. 4, 1968, the Dallas, Texas native and his wife, Paula, have two children, daughter Mackenzie and son Chandler.
