The Buckeyes have played eight of the 12 American Athletic Conference members over the years. Ohio State has not met East Carolina, Southern Methodist, Temple and Tulane.

Havlicek Elected to Collegiate HOF

Ohio State great John Havlicek, who starred for the Buckeyes from 1960-62 and then went on to win eight NBA Championships with the Boston Celtics, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 20 in Kansas City. Clark Kellogg, another Ohio State basketball standout, will serve as the master of ceremonies. Clark Kellogg is the lead studio analyst for CBS Sports' coverage of college basketball, including the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship. Havlicek, a 1962 All-American under Coach Fred Taylor at Ohio State, helped the Buckeyes win the NCAA title in 1960. He went on to play his entire 16-year professional career with the Boston Celtics, winning eight NBA championships and earning 13 All-Star selections. Named one of the NBA's 50 greatest players, Havlicek was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1984.

Ohio State, Virginia Tip at 7:30 p.m. Dec. 1 in Big Ten/ACC Challenge

Thad Matta's Buckeyes are playing for the 12th time in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge this year. Matta teams are 6-5 in the event. The Buckeyes are 6-7 overall in the event. Virginia travels to Ohio State this year for a 7:30 p.m. game Dec. 1. ESPN will televise the game from Value City Arena in Columbus.

JaQuan Lyle: Logs 28 minutes a game, most among Ohio State rookies ... has started all four games this season ... leads Buckeyes with 23 assists, 20 over the last three games ... career-high eight helpers vs. UT Arlington Nov. 20 ... averages just under 10 points a game and a bit over four rebounds a contest ... owns three double-digit outings offensively with a career best 15 points vs. UTA. **Daniel Giddens:** Averages 6.3 points and 6.8 rebounds over first four games of Ohio State career ... 13 of 27 total rebounds are on the offensive end ... six of 13 blocks were against UT Arlington ... the six rejections are tied for No. 4 all-time in a single game among Ohio State freshman ... connects on 57 percent of his field goal attempts (12-21) ... averages 23 minutes a game off the bench. **Austin Grandstaff:** All seven of his made field goals and 14 attempts have come from 3-point range (7-14/.500) ... averages 10 minutes a game ... has yet to attempt a free throw. **A.J. Experience Tops Buckeyes Early

Despite the influx of seven freshmen and one transfer, Ohio State is led by three returning players from 2014-15. The Buckeyes' lone junior, Marc Loving, leads Ohio State in scoring with 16.5 points per game. Sophomores Keita Bates-Diop (13.0 ppg.) and Jae'Sean Tate (10.5 ppg.) also contribute double digits offensively to lead the team. Tate tops the squad with 8.0 rebounds a game with Bates-Diop adding 7.0 rpg. and Loving 6.0 boards a contest.

Ohio State plays the final of four games in the Basketball Hall of Fame Invitational Friday in Miami, Florida, vs. Memphis. Ohio State played Grambling (W, 82-55, last Tuesday), faced UT Arlington (L, 73-68 last Friday) and Louisiana Tech (L, 82-74) before the Thanksgiving trip to battle the Tigers Nov. 27 at American Airlines Arena. Tip time for Memphis game is 7:30 p.m. on ESPN.

Matta Earns Win No. 300 at Ohio State

When the Buckeyes defeated Minnesota in the 2015 Big Ten Tournament in Chicago, Thad Matta became the all-time wins leader in Ohio State history with victory No. 298 over his 12-year tenure with the Buckeyes. Matta passed Fred Taylor for the Ohio State wins record. Taylor amassed 297 triumphs from 1959-1976. Matta added another win a year ago in the second round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament, a 75-72 overtime affair over VCU in Portland, Oregon. The first victory of the 2015-16 season, a 76-54 win vs. Mount St. Mary's Nov. 15, was No. 300 for Matta at Ohio

Buckeyes Open 116th Season, 104th in B1G

This is the 104th season of Big Ten membership in men's basketball for the Buckeyes and the 116th overall for the sport at Ohio State. The Buckeyes are 91-22 in season openers and 96-17 in the first home game of the season. Ohio State is 54-57 in the first true road game of the season. In Big Ten Conference play, the Buckeyes are 55-44 in league openers, 67-32 in the first conference home game of the season and 36-63 in league road openers. Ohio State is 36-20 when the first conference game of the year is at home and 19-24 when opening conference play on the road. Thad Matta is 12-0 in season openers at Ohio State and is 8-3 in conference openers. In the last 12 years under Matta, the Buckeyes have opened league play at home six times (5-1) and have a 3-2 road opener mark.

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Non-Conference Schedule to Test Young Bucks

In addition to playing Virginia in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and Kentucky in the 2015 CBSSports Classic in Brooklyn, New York, Ohio State also will face Connecticut and Memphis in non-conference action. The Buckeyes travel to UConn to start a home-and-home series with the Huskies over the next two seasons. The game vs. the Tigers is part of the 2015 Basketball Hall of Fame Invitational. Ohio State and Memphis will travel to Miami, Florida, for a neutral-site game the Friday after Thanksgiving.

Buckeyes Face 3-of-4 2015 Final Four Teams

Ohio State will play a total of four games vs. three of the teams that qualified for the 2015 Final Four. The Buckeyes face Kentucky Dec. 19 in Brooklyn, New York, before a home-and-home series with Michigan State and a road game at Wisconsin during 2016 Big Ten regular-season play. The Buckeyes will face Illinois, Maryland, Michigan State, Northwestern and Rutgers twice this season. Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Penn State only travel to Columbus this year. Ohio State has lone road games in league play against Indiana, Nebraska, Purdue and Wisconsin.

Matta Continues to Build Impressive Ohio State Resume

Thad Matta has accomplished a remarkable list of accomplishments in 12 years as head coach of the Buckeyes. Matta's teams have never failed to win 20 games, a record streak (11 seasons) in Ohio State history. In fact, Matta has never failed to reach the 20-win plateau in 15 years as a head coach. The Buckeyes finished 24-11 in 2014-15, advancing to their seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament. Ohio State has reached 30 or more wins three times, all with Matta at the helm. Back-to-back seasons with 30 wins in 2010-11 (34) and 2011-12 (31) only trail the 35 wins recorded in 2006-07, the Ohio State record for single-season victories. In addition, Matta has five Big Ten regular-season titles, including three of the last six (2010-12), four Big Ten postseason tournament crowns in seven title game opportunities, nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including four-consecutive runs to the "Sweet 16," from 2010-13, a pair of Final Four trips (2007, 2012) and a title game appearance in 2007. Throw in a National Invitation Tournament title in 2009 and Matta has guided the Buckeyes to postseason play in 10-consecutive attempts and in every year in which Ohio State was eligible.

When the Buckeyes opened the season Nov. 15 vs. Mount St. Mary's in Columbus, the Ohio State roster featured eight newcomers to the program. six true freshmen, one redshirt freshman (David Bell) and one transfer (Trevor Thompson) will begin eligibility with the Buckeyes.

Four Buckeyes Look to Build on 2014-15 Experience

Ohio State's lone experienced upperclassman along with three sophomores who experienced college basketball for the first time as rookies return to form the nucleus of the 2015-16 Buckeyes. Junior Marc Loving has the most game experience on the roster with 71 appearances and 23 career starts. He is a proven long-range scorer and consistent free throw shooter. He made 47 of 102 3-pointers as a sophomore (.461) and is a career 76 percent shooter (127-167) from the foul line. Jae'Sean Tate broke into the starting lineup midway through his rookie season. He earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman team with an 8.8 points per game scoring average to go with 5.0 rebounds per game. Also back is redshirt sophomore Kam Williams, who demonstrated the ability to score from long range and the foul line (22-24/.917), and Keita Bates-Diop, another 3-point threat with the ability to block shots and rebound.

Bell, Thompson Start Ohio State Careers After Year on Sidelines

Thompson is a 6-11 center from Indianapolis, Indiana. He played his freshman season of collegiate basketball at Virginia Tech. He sat out the 2014-15 season to satisfy NCAA transfer rules and will have three years of eligibility with the Buckeyes. As a freshman, Thompson competed in 30 games with 11 starts for the Hokies. He made 50

of 122 shots from the field (.410) and 49 of 75 from the foul line (.653). He averaged 5.0 points and 4.7 rebounds with a pair of double-doubles as a rookie. In 486 total minutes (16.2 mpg.), he was credited with 28 blocks and eight steals. Bell began his Ohio State academic career last year, working out with the team while gaining strength and sitting out games. The 6-10 center from Garfield Heights, Ohio, will have four years of eligibility starting this season. Thompson started the 2015-16 season opener vs. Mount St. Mary's while Bell came off the bench.

Ohio State Opponents Highly Ranked Early

Thad Matta's Buckeyes, who have faced the third-most ranked opponents nationally (111) since he became head coach at Ohio State in 2005, will again battle the nation's best teams in 2015-16. The Buckeyes are scheduled to go against No. 1 Kentucky, No. 2 Maryland, No. 3 Michigan State, No. 12 Virginia, No. 13 Indiana, No. 16 Purdue, and No. 18 Connecticut for a total of nine games vs. ranked foes this season.

CBS Sports Classic-Year 2

CBS Sports is bringing together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams: Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC. CBS Sports will broadcast a doubleheader in 2015 and 2016 following the first year of the event a year ago in Chicago. These four schools have combined to win 25 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBS SPORTS CLASSIC moves to Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015 and then travels to Las Vegas in December 2016.

104 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State will celebrate 104 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2016. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over the 103 previous seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 27 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 51 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

Dials Elected to Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Terence Dials became the 37th men's basketball player in Ohio State history to be elected to the Athletics Hall of Fame. Dials lettered in 2002, was sidelined with a back injury in 2003 and then returned to action to complete his eligibility from 2004-06. The 2006 Big Ten Player of the Year, Dials rates among the Top 10 all-time at Ohio State in career field goal percentage (No. 4/.604), free throws attempted (No. 3/552) and career rebounds (No. 5/876). The two-time captain was a first team All-Big Ten selection in 2006 and was named the Chicago Tribune Big Ten Most Valuable Player that same year.

Matta Reaches Career, Ohio State History

Thad Matta has made a habit of achieving records and milestones over his coaching career, which spans 16 years. After a season at Butler, three at Xavier and the last 12 in Columbus, Matta coached his 500th career game as a head coach Dec. 13 vs. Morehead State. As an Ohio State head coach, the 13th in the history of the program, Matta set the all-time wins record, surpassing Fred Taylor's 297 career victories over 18 seasons from 1959-1976, with a 79-73 win vs. Minnesota March 12, 2015 in Chicago. The Minnesota victory also gave him his 400th career win (403-127). Matta teams have never failed to win at least 20 games. His Ohio State teams have averaged 27.2 victories over his 11 full years in Columbus.

Funderburk played at St. Edward High School before transferring to Hargrave Military Academy (Chatham, Virginia) for his senior season. Potter is playing his senior year at Montverde (Florida) Academy after playing for three years at Mentor High School. "These two signees bring versatility, size and rebounding to our program," Matta said. "With Micah we get a big who can play with his back to the basket as well as stretch the defense and face-up. With Derek we are getting an athletic, high energy guy who can impact both ends of the floor. I'm excited to have two high quality kids who have a deep appreciation for The Ohio State University."

Matta's Big Ten Tenure

Thad Matta took over the head coaching duties at Ohio State in July of 2004. His 12 years in Columbus have been a successful stint, both nationally and in the Big Ten Conference.

Matta vs. the Big Ten: Matta's Buckeyes have played in the second most games (397) with more victories (301) than any other Big Ten program in the last 12 years. Wisconsin is next in victories (290) and Michigan State leads in total games (400).

Matta in the B1G Regular Season: The Buckeyes have won 132 Big Ten regular-season games, with 10-consecutive years winning at least 10 conference games. The Buckeyes have won 81 percent of league games decided by 10 or more points (78-18) in the Matta era. In games decided by less than 10 points, Ohio State is 54-42 (.584).

B1G Titles in the Matta Era: Ohio State has more overall conference titles (9) than any other league school over the last 12 years. Five of those are regular-season titles while four are conference tournament crowns. Michigan State is the next closest with five titles, three in the regular season and two conference tournament titles.

Defending the 3 in Matta Era

Over the 12 years with Thad Matta as the head coach in Columbus, Ohio State is 92-21 (.814) when holding opponents to less than five made 3s. When foes make between 5-9 from distance, Ohio State is 165-59 (.737) and when opponents make 10 or more, the Buckeyes are 44-16 (.733). Ohio State is 238-64 (.788) when making at least five 3-pointers, 63-11 when making 10 or more (.851) and 63-32 (.663) when connecting on four or fewer.

Richard Pitino of Minnesota and Chris Collins at Northwestern were the two newest coaches in the Big Ten in 2013-14. Ohio State defeated the Wildcats and Golden Gophers in back-to-back games Feb. 19 and 22 of 2014. The Buckeyes downed Maryland 80-56 Jan. 26 in Columbus and won 79-60 at Rutgers Feb. 8.

The Ohio State men's basketball team topped Walsh, 92-82, in an exhibition game Nov. 8 in Columbus. Keita Bates-Diop paced the Buckeyes offensively with 26 points to go along with eight rebounds and four blocks while Marc Loving tallied a double-double with 24 points and 10 boards. Freshman JaQuan Lyle added 19 points, nine rebounds and a team-best seven assists while Trevor Thompson scored six points to go along

with 10 rebounds. Ohio State held a 43-40 lead at half as Walsh connected on eight 3-pointers and 10 of 14 free throws over the first 20 minutes. Bates-Diop paced the Buckeyes with 15 points on 6-of-7 shooting while Loving added nine points and six boards in the first half. Five 3-pointers in the first 10 minutes of the second half kept the Cavaliers in it but Kam Williams and Lyle scored the final 11 Buckeye points to ice the game.

Matta Has Faced, Defeated Top Active Coaches

Ohio State's Thad Matta has faced 21 of the Top 25 active coaches by wins entering the 2015-16 season and has wins against all 19. Of the Top 10 coaches, Matta has faced and defeated eight. Matta entered the season No. 5 among active coaches in win percentage at .762 (401-125). In addition to owning wins vs. the top active coaches, Matta has a victory vs Coach Bob Knight, the No. 3 all-time winningest coach in NCAA history. Ohio State defeated Texas Tech, where Knight finished his coaching career, 77-71 Dec. 16, 2004 in Dallas. That game was Matta's ninth as Ohio State's head coach.

This is Matta's 16th year as a head coach and the 12th at Ohio State. He spent three seasons at Xavier (2002-2004) and one season at Butler (2001).

In the 19 most recent wins vs. the Top 24 active coaches by wins, Matta teams have been ranked among the Top 10 in 10 of the wins, were unranked in seven, faced Top 25 teams eight times and matched up against unranked opponents on 11 occasions. Opponents were ranked among the Top 10 four times.

Since taking over the Ohio State program for the start of the 2004-05 season, Thad Matta has the Big Ten's best overall record with a winning percentage of 76 percent. He also has directed the Buckeyes to the second-most regular-season Big Ten Conference wins with 132 and most overall wins with 301. Buckeyes Own Four 1-Loss/Perfect Home Seasons Under Matta

Thad Matta has won at least 15 home games in each of his 11 seasons in Columbus. The 2006-07 squad finished with a perfect 18-0 record while the 2005-06 (16-1) and 2009-10 teams (18-1) squads each finished with a single loss at home. Matta is 190-21 overall in Columbus, the most home wins among Big Ten schools, during his tenure after finishing the 2013-14 season 17-3 at home and finishing 2014-15 at 18-2. Ohio State was 16-2 in 2012-13. Ohio State is 110-5 at home vs. non-conference opponents and 80-16 vs. Big Ten competition. Over the last seven seasons Ohio State is 108-12 in Columbus.

Matta Owns Top Win Percentage Among Ohio State Coaches

Thad Matta, now in his 12th season as head coach of the Buckeyes, has an overall win percentage of 75.8 (301-96) at Ohio State. That winning mean is the highest among the 11 head coaches in the history of the Ohio State men's basketball program with three or more seasons on the sidelines. Matta's 132-60 (192 games) record in Big Ten regular-season play (.688) also has produced the highest winning percentage in conference play among any previous Ohio State coach. Fred Taylor (1959-76) is second in both overall win percentage (.653/297-158) and Big Ten win percentage (.608/158-102) in 18 seasons.

The Buckeyes vs. Unranked (AP) Opponents - Matta Era

- Thad Matta is 167-6 in Columbus vs. unranked opponents. The Buckeyes have lost just three times to an unranked non-conference opponent during his 12 years at Ohio State. The losses were at the hands of West Virginia Dec. 27, 2008, UT Arlington Nov. 21, 2015 and Louisiana Tech Nov. 24, 2015.
- The Buckeyes are 107-3 vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home under Matta.
- Ohio State is 61-3 in Columbus with Matta at the helm vs. unranked Big Ten opponents.
- Ohio State had won 62-consecutive games vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the loss to UT Arlington Nov. 20.
- Matta began his career with a 45-game win streak vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the lone loss to West Virginia in 2008.

MATTA WORKING ON 400 GAMES COACHED AT OHIO STATE

When Ohio State played at Illinois Jan. 5, 2013, Thad Matta, who was then 14 games into his ninth season with the Buckeyes, coached in game No. 300 at Ohio State. Only two previous coaches, Harold G. Olsen (1923-46) and Fred Taylor (1959-76), reached 300 or more games at Ohio State. Olsen coached 456 (259-197) and Taylor 455 (297-158). Matta has 397 games to his credit as a Buckeye. His winning percentage after 100 games was second only to Taylor. At 200 games, Matta tied Taylor for best winning percentage to that point in OSU history. Matta's winning mean of .773 at 300 games topped Taylor and Olsen at the 300-game plateau. Matta will reach 400 games coached at Ohio State early in the 2015-16 season, his 12th in Columbus.

Game 1 Ohio State 76, Mount St. Mary's 54 Nov. 15, 2015, Columbus

Columbus -- Sophomore Jae'Sean Tate scored a game-high 21 points to go with nine rebounds to lead Ohio State (1-0) to a 76-54 win over Mount St. Mary's (0-2) in the season opener for the Buckeyes. The win was No. 300 for Ohio State under the direction of Thad Matta, now in his 12th season in Columbus. A pair of Buckeyes posted their first career double doubles with junior Marc Loving scoring 15 points to go with 11 rebounds. Sophomore Keita Bates-Diop tallied 10 points and 10 rebounds. In all, Ohio State players reached double figures offensively and the team recorded 50 rebounds. Freshmen JaQuan Lyle, Daniel Giddens and Austin Grandstaff all scored on their first shots as Buckeyes. Four true freshmen saw action and combined to make 10 of 18 shots from the field. Ohio State scored on 50 percent of its shots (28-56) and 82 percent from the free throw line (14-17). The Buckeye defense held the Mountaineers to 33 percent shooting (21-63) and 28 percent from the 3-point line (7-25). Mount St. Mary's was outrebounded 50-22. Matta teams are 12-0 in season openers at Ohio State. He is 16-0 all-time in the first game of the season as a head coach, which includes three seasons at Xavier and one at Butler.

Notes:

- Matta, the winningest coach in Ohio State history, earned his 300th win as head coach of the Buckeyes and has posted a 300-94 career record in Columbus.
- Ohio State has won both series meetings with the Mountaineers.
- The Buckeyes are 4-0 all-time against members of the Northeast Conference.
- Ohio State is 96-17 all-time in home openers. When the Buckeyes open the season at home, OSU is 91-22.
- Thad Matta teams are 16-0 in season openers, which includes an 11-0 record at Ohio State.
- Ohio State has won 60 consecutive games vs. unranked non-conference opponents. The last loss was Dec. 27, 2008 vs. West Virginia.
- Ohio State is 107-10 at home since the 2009-10 season, the most home wins in the country.
- JaQuan Lyle, Trevor Thompson and Keita Bates-Diop made their first starts as Buckeyes.
- Ohio State outrebounded the Mountaineers, 50-22 (+28). The last time Ohio State outrebounded an opponent by 25 or more was against High Point (+27 40-20, Dec. 10, 2014)
- The last time Ohio State recorded 50 or more rebounds was against Maryland (51), Jan. 29, 1915.
- Five Buckeyes reached double figures offensively (Tate-21, Loving-15, Lyle-12, Giddens-11, Bates-Diop-10), the last time OSU had five in double digits was against Miami, Ohio, Dec. 22, 1914 (Williams-18, Loving-16, Russell-15, Bates-Diop-12, Tate-10).
- Freshmen JaQuan Lyle, Daniel Giddens and Austin Grandstaff all made their first shots from the field as Buckeyes. Lyle and Grandstaff both knocked down 3s while Giddens scored in the paint. Jae'Sean Tate, D'Angelo Russell and Keita Bates-Diop all made their first shots as Buckeyes, all 2 pointers, a season ago vs. UMass-Lowell. Amedeo Della Valle was the last rookie to connect on a 3-pointer as his first attempt as a Buckeye (Kansas City, Nov. 23, 2012).

Game 2 Ohio State 82, Grambling State 55 Nov. 17, 2015, Columbus

Columbus -- The Buckeyes showed Tuesday they are not opposed to spreading the wealth. In its 82-55 win against the Grambling State Tigers, Ohio State saw three players score in double figures: Keita Bates-Diop, Marc Loving and Kam Williams. Williams led the way with 22 points off the bench on 9-of-12 shooting and career-highs five rebounds and four steals. Bates-Diop and Loving each had 14 points. The 14 points tied a career high for Bates-Diop. The Buckeyes scored 40 of their 82 points off the bench. The Buckeyes outshot the Tigers 59 percent to 37 percent, shooting 65 percent in the second half. Freshman guard JaQuan Lyle tallied a career-high seven assists. Grambling had four players in double digits offensively, led by Nigel Ribiero and Remond Brown with 12 each.

Notes:

- The matchup marked the first meeting for Ohio State and Grambling State all time. The Buckeyes now lead the series 1-0
- Ohio State is now 5-0 all-time vs. Southwestern Athletic Conference opponents. The last matchup was an 85-41 win over Jackson State on Nov. 18, 2011
- This game marks the second time since a matchup vs. Houston Baptist Jan. 9, 2009 that Ohio State has been unranked when facing an unranked non-conference opponent in Columbus.
- Ohio State has won 61 consecutive games vs. unranked non-conference opponents. The last loss was Dec. 27, 2008 vs. West Virginia
- Ohio State is 108-10 at home since the 2009-10 season, the most home wins in the country
- Ohio State never trailed in the game
- Ohio State outrebounded the Tigers 35-29
- Ohio State's largest lead was 37 at 9:22 in the second half
- Ten of 11 Buckeyes who saw the floor scored and nine recorded at least one rebound.
- Ohio State scored 28 points off 21 Grambling turnovers
- The Buckeyes shot 58.8 percent in the second half and 65.2 percent for the game.
- Grambling made 34.7 percent of its shots (17-49), Matta's Buckeyes are 69-2 when holding foes under 35 percent shooting.
- Grambling managed 18 defensive rebounds, Matta teams are 114-8 when holding teams under 20 defensive boards and 115-11 when opponents have fewer than 30 total rebounds (Grambling-29).
- The Tigers were credited with seven assists, Matta teams are 129-17 when holding opponents to fewer than 10 helpers.
- Grambling also failed to block a shot. Ohio State is 48-8 under Matta when foes record zero rejections.
- Matta teams have 146 wins vs. non-conference opponents over his 12 years in Columbus.
- Kam Williams set a career high in rebounds (5), field-goals attempted (12), field-goals made (9) and steals (4). He finished with a game high 22 points.

JaQuan Lyle scored 15 points to go along eight assists and six boards while Keita Bates-Diop totaled 16 points and five rebounds for the Buckeyes. Kevin Hervey paced the Mavericks with 18 points and seven rebounds while Neal scored 17.

Game 4 Louisiana Tech 82, Ohio State 74

Nov. 24, 2015, Columbus

Columbus -- Ohio State dropped an 82-74 decision to Louisiana Tech in the third game of the Basketball Hall of Fame Invitational at Value City Arena. The Bulldogs held a 42-32 lead at the half before the Buckeyes (2-2) knotted the score at 55-all at the 11:26 mark of the second half. Louisiana Tech then went on a 10-2 run to take a 65-57 lead with 8:54 left and Ohio State couldn't get closer than four the remainder of the way as the Bulldogs stayed perfect on the year. Alex Hamilton paced Louisiana Tech with 24 points while Erik McCree added 17 points and 10 boards. Marc Loving posted a career-high 25 points while Jae'Sean Tate earned his first-career double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds for the Buckeyes.

Notes:

- This matchup marks the third meeting all-time between Ohio State and Louisiana Tech. Ohio State is now 1-2 in the series.
- Both previous meetings were in postseason play as the Buckeyes fell 79-67 in the first round of the 1985 NCAA Tournament and defeated the Bulldogs 79-66 in the semifinals of the 1986 National Invitation Tournament
- The Buckeyes are 7-4 all-time against current members of Conference USA
- Ohio State is 109-12 (.901) at home since the 2009-10 season, the most home wins in the country.
- This is the first time Jaquan Lyle, Keita Bates-Diop, Marc Loving, Jae'Sean Tate and Daniel Giddens have combined to form the starting lineup
- The Buckeyes have lost just three times to an unranked non-conference opponent during Matta's 12 years at Ohio State. The two other losses were at the hands of West Virginia Dec. 27 2008 and UT Arlington Nov. 21, 2015
- Marc Loving reached 500 career points with his fourth of the game. Loving finished with a career high 25 points and now has 521 total.
- Loving recorded a career-high 25 points. Loving had reached his previous high of 19 twice, with the last time coming vs. Maryland Jan. 29, 2015
- Loving recorded six rebounds and reached 200 for his career with his fifth of the game
- Jae'Sean Tate posted 10 points and 12 rebounds to record his first-career double-double
- Tate tallied his 16th career game with double-digit points after posting 14 as a freshman a season ago
- Tate recorded a career-high 12 rebounds with the fifth being number 200 for his career. Tate's previous high was nine rebounds vs. Mount St. Mary's Nov. 15, 2015
- Daniel Giddens tallied four blocks and now has recorded 13 blocks through four games.
- Giddens notched his first career start recording four points, eight rebounds and a career-high three steals
- Austin Grandstaff went 3-5 from beyond the arc and has now recorded a 3-pointer in every game this season
- Grandstaff recorded a career-high 9 points on three 3-pointers
- Grandstaff has attempted 13 shots this season with each of them being a 3-point attempt.
