## WEEKLY HONORS

### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Chris Swain • Sr. • FB • Navy • Macon, Ga.**

Swain rushed for 108 yards and three touchdowns on 18 carries to help Navy to a 45-20 win against then-No. 15/15 Memphis, snapping the Tigers' winning streak at 15 games and keeping the Midshipmen unbeaten in American Athletic Conference play. Swain's first touchdown of the game tied the score at 7-7 in the first quarter, while his 2-yard score in the second period gave the Midshipmen a 14-10 lead. Swain added a key insurance touchdown on a 40-yard run in the third quarter to put Navy ahead, 31-20.



### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Jamar Summers • So. • CB • UConn • Orange, N.J.**

Summers had five tackles, a pass breakup and a 67-yard interception return for a touchdown which stood up as the only TD of the game in UConn's 7-3 win at Tulane. Summers, who registered his American Athletic Conference-leading sixth interception of the season, keyed a UConn defense which limited the Green Wave to 140 yards of offense and nine first downs while keeping Tulane out of the end zone. Summers and the UConn defense allowed Tulane to cross midfield on only one of the Green Wave's 15 drives.



### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Alex Barta • Jr. • P • Navy • Clarkston, Mich.**

Barta helped Navy win the field position battle as the Midshipmen scored a 45-20 win at then-No. 15/15 Memphis, keeping Navy tied for first place in the American Athletic Conference West Division. Barta averaged 45.2 yards on four punts, including one kick that was downed at the Memphis 4-yard line and another downed inside the 1. Barta has averaged 42.0 yards per punt for the Midshipmen this season.

# AMERICAN NOTEBOOK

## Fantastic Four

The American Athletic Conference has a record four teams ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today polls. The American has as many ranked teams as both the SEC and Big 12.

## Schedule Strength

Of the remaining 18 games on the American Athletic Conference schedule, 10 will feature at least one ranked team. The American has three games remaining that will feature two ranked teams.

## Streaking

Houston extended its winning streak to 10 games with the Cougars' win against Cincinnati Saturday. The only teams with longer winning streaks this season are Ohio State (22 games), Clemson (12 games) and Oklahoma State (11 games). Memphis saw a 15-game winning streak end with its loss to Navy Saturday.

## Perfection

Houston is one of six remaining unbeaten teams in the nation. The others are Ohio State, Clemson, Oklahoma State, Baylor and Iowa.

## Conference Calls

The American is a combined 10-1 against opponents from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt conferences this season. The American is 8-11 against teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC.

## Look West

The top three teams in the American Athletic Conference's West Division — Houston, Memphis and Navy — are a combined 24-2 this season.

## Depth Perception

Eight of The American's 12 teams have at least a .500 winning percentage this season.

## That's Offensive

The American has four of the top 12 teams nationally in terms of total offense. Cincinnati is fifth nationally at 578.2 yards per game, followed by Memphis (seventh, 578.2 ypg), Houston (10th, 525.1 ypg) and Tulsa (12th, 520.1 ypg).

## Rank And File

Nine of the 12 teams in the American Athletic Conference were ranked in the top 25 of the Bowl Championship Series standings or the College Football Playoff committee rankings between 2008 and 2015.

## Eyeballs

Temple and Cincinnati have played in front of record home crowds. The Owls drew 69,176 at Lincoln Financial Field for their win against Penn State and broke that mark with 69,280 against Notre Dame. The Bearcats had an on-campus record 39,095 on hand at the newly renovated Nippert Stadium for their win against Alabama A&M before surpassing that number with 40,101 in attendance against Miami (Fla.). Memphis had 60,241 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium for the Tigers' game against Mississippi.

## Veteran Presence

Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo, who is in his eighth year as the Midshipmen's head coach, has more head coaching experience than the other five West Division coaches combined (six years).

## To The End Zone

Houston QB Greg Ward Jr. has 16 rushing touchdowns this season, trailing only Louisiana Tech RB Kenneth Dixon and Alabama RB Derrick Henry for the national lead.

## To Be The Best

American Athletic Conference teams have played five games against the top 10 teams in last week's Associated Press poll (No. 2 Baylor, No. 5 TCU, No. 8 Notre Dame and No. 9 Stanford). The American has played 10 games against teams currently ranked in the top 25.



The first American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 5, 2015, at noon ET and will be televised nationally on either ABC or ESPN.

The winner of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest-ranked team among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

## Divisional Champions

The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games — both divisional and non-divisional.

In the event of a two-team tie within a division, the head-to-head winner between the tied teams will be the championship game representative.

In the event of a multiple-team tie within a division, the following tiebreaker criteria will be used, in order:

- Head-to-head record against the tied teams
- Divisional winning percentage
- Record against each team in the divisional standings, in descending order
- Record against common non-divisional conference opponents
- Overall winning percentage
- Most recent College Football Playoff Selection Committee rankings (provided the highest-ranked team won its final game)
- Average of selected computer rankings

If, at any point during the tiebreaker process, the criteria eliminates all but two teams, the two remaining teams would revert to the two-team tiebreaking procedure to determine the representative.

## Championship Site

The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion (as determined above) with the best record in conference games.

If the two divisional champions have the same conference record, then the regular-season head-to-head winner between the divisional champions would host the championship.

If the divisional champions have the same conference record and did not play in the regular season, then the team with the better overall regular-season winning percentage would host the championship.

If that does not produce an advantage, then the team that was ranked higher in the most recent College Football Playoff Selection Committee rankings would be the host, provided that team won its final regular-season game. The next tiebreaker would be an average of selected computer rankings.

Tulane has a defense that is stronger than its record suggests ... The Green Wave has forced 16 turnovers and is ranked 15th nationally in tackles for loss ... LB Nico Marley, the grandson of music legend Bob Marley, has 61 tackles and 10.0 tackles for loss with one interception ... The Green Wave had registered one quarterback sack in its first three games, but has 19 sacks in its last six ... DE Royce LaFrance has a team-high 5.0 sacks with 11.0 tackles for loss ... Army enters its first home game in more than a month with a 2-7 record following a 20-3 loss at Air Force as part of the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy series ... The Black Knights have lost their last two games ... Army's wins have come against Eastern Michigan (58-36) and Bucknell (21-14) ... Five of the seven losses have come by a touchdown or less ... The game against Tulane is the second of three games for the Black Knights against American Athletic Conference opponents ... Army fell at UConn, 22-17, Sept. 12, while the Black Knights face Navy in Philadelphia Dec. 12 ... Army will be the third team that Tulane has faced this season that runs an option-based offense (Georgia Tech, Navy) ... FB Aaron Kempner leads the team in rushing with 431 yards on 70 carries with two touchdowns ... QB Ahmad Bradshaw has rushed for 396 yards and four touchdowns, while QB A.J. # COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

## Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

## Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, comparative outcomes of common opponents and other factors.

## Two Days

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day belong to college football, with two semifinal games and four other top bowl games continuing a wonderful tradition. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

## Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

## Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

## Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Jeff Long (chair), Barry Alvarez, Mike Gould, Kirby Hocutt, Tom Jernstedt, Bobby Johnson, Tom Osborne, Dan Radakovich, Condoleezza Rice, Mike Tranchese, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

## Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

## Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings..

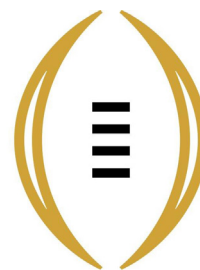

# BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The Miami Beach Bowl was played for the first time in 2014 at state-of-the-art Marlins Park in Miami, which sits on the site of the historic Orange Bowl stadium. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year, beginning with last year's matchup against Brigham Young. Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference and the Sun Belt Conference are scheduled for future years, though institutions from other conferences also will have the opportunity to participate.

The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The Birmingham Bowl takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The St. Petersburg Bowl is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The Hawaii Bowl is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West Conference.

The Marmot Boca Raton Bowl is a new game that will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2015.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl will debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The Popeye's Bahamas Bowl is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference in 2016 and Conference USA in 2018.

The R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tennessee, the Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, and the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.

# THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The 2015 football season will be the second under the American Athletic Conference's comprehensive television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports.

The new arrangements began with the 2013-14 basketball season and will be in place through the 2019-20 academic year. The contracts provide for unprecedented exposure on two of the industry leaders in sports television.

In football, the contract calls for all conference-controlled games — which encompasses all conference games and home nonconference games — to be televised. Nearly 90 percent of those games will be carried on either national broadcast or national cable platforms.

In addition to contracted games on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3, American Athletic Conference teams will regularly appear on CBS Sports Network through a sublicensing agreement with ESPN.

Additional nonconference games will be available on ESPN3 — ESPN's live multi-screen sports network, giving fans an online destination that delivers thousands of global sports events annually. It is accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 and Xbox One. The network is currently available to more than 99 million homes at no additional cost to fans who receive their high-speed Internet connection or video subscription from an affiliated service provider. The network is also available at no cost to approximately 21 million U.S. college students and U.S.-based military personnel via computers, smartphones and tablets connected to on-campus educational and on-base military broadband and Wi-Fi networks.

ESPN, Inc., is the world's leading multinational, multimedia sports entertainment company featuring a portfolio of more than 50 multimedia sports assets. The company is comprised of eight U.S. 24-hour television networks and five HD simulcast services. Based in Bristol, Connecticut, ESPN is 80-percent owned by ABC, Inc., which is an indirect subsidiary of The Walt Disney Company. The Hearst Corporation holds a 20 percent interest in ESPN.

CBS Sports Network is available to 100 million homes and may be seen on a digital basic cable package in all American Athletic Conference markets. Talent for The American's weekly game on CBS Sports Network includes Dave Ryan on play-by-play, Corey Chavous as the analyst and Lauren Gardner as the reporter.
