

#### MORE MISSIVES

- In June of 2015, Athlon ranked Justin Fuente No. 1 of 20 coaches under 40 ahead of the release of its preseason publicaton.
- Fuente is one of just seven FBS head coaches who are under 40. Fuente, who turned 39 on July 30, ranks as the seventh-youngest coach in FBS. The only younger coaches are Western Michigan's P.J. Fleck (34), Troy's Neal Brown (35), Toledo's Matt Campbell (35), Texas Tech's Kliff Kingsbury (36), Boise State's Bryan Harsin (38) and USF's Willie Taggart (39).
- In August 2014, CBSSports.com ranked every FBS college football coach by playing career. Fuente, who was the OVC Player of the Year in 1999 as a senior at Murray State, ranked No. 18 on the list. Fuente was a starting quarterback at Oklahoma before transferring to Murray State for his final two collegiate seasons. He set 11 school records while playing for the Racers.

# MEMPHIS COACH JUSTIN FUENTE

With confetti swirling, the University of Memphis football program savored an American Athletic Conference championship to close out the 2014 regular season. Weeks later, the Tigers were back on a podium and celebrating another championship as Memphis defeated BYU 55-48 in double overtime to win the inaugural Miami Beach Bowl.

Memphis' first conference title in more than 40 years, along with the come-from-behind bowl victory, are certainly mile markers on the road the Tigers are traveling under Justin Fuente who is his fourth season as head coach in 2015.

Unquestionably, the Tigers have made momentous strides in Fuente's first three seasons. He inherited a program which had won just five combined games (2009-11) in the three years prior to his arrival.

When he was named the University's 23<sup>rd</sup> head football coach on Dec. 8, 2011, Fuente was not only charged with rebuilding Memphis' football program, but simultaneously having oversight in the program's step up in competition. In his second year, the Tigers began play in the American Athletic Conference.

The year following the transition to The American, Memphis celebrated a conference title inside Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. And the Tigers celebrated again in Miami as the team won for the 10<sup>th</sup> time during the season, equaling a school record for victories that was established in 1938.

Fuente's efforts in building the Memphis program did not go unnoticed. The Football Writers Association of America, in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, named him one of eight finalists for the 2014 Eddie Robinson Award. He was also named the American Athletic Conference's 2014 Coach of the Year, a unanimous choice by his peers. The Tennessee Sports Writers Association recognized Fuente as its

College Football Coach of the Year.

Fuente's team also received a number of honors from the conference as Tank Jakes shared the league's Co-Defensive Player of the Year and Jake Elliott was named the Special Teams Player of the Year. The Tigers had six players named to the league's first team – offensive lineman Al Bond, tight end Alan Cross, defensive lineman Martin Ifedi and cornerback Bobby McCain along with Elliott and Jakes. An additional four players received second team honors.

In two years as the Tigers' starting quarterback Paxton Lynch, a member of Fuente's original signing class, has become only the third Memphis player to pass for over 5,000 yards in a career. The 35 touchdowns he was responsible for in 2014 shattered the previous school season record of 26.

Offensively, Memphis scored 471 points in 2014, shattering the old school record of 430 points set in 2004. Defensively, Memphis allowed just 19.5 points per game, which ranked 11th in FBS Football.

With a seven-game winning streak to conclude the 2014 season, Memphis ended the year with the fourth-longest win streak in FBS Football. Only national champion Ohio State, as well as New Year's Six Bowl winners Boise State and TCU, ended the year with longer win streaks.

Memphis closed out the 2014 season ranked in the top-25 of both the AP and *USA Today*/Amway Coaches Polls, a first for the program.

The University of Memphis' seven-win gain from 2013 to 2014 was the third-best improvement for FBS Football programs in 2014. The improvement also represented the ninth-best improvement ever by an FBS team. Going from one league win to seven, the Tigers had a six-win improvement in league play alone.

Fuente's team continues to be built on four pillars – 1) Academic Integrity, 2) Social Responsibility, 3) Individual Accountability and 4) Competitive Excellence

Going into the 2014 season, Memphis Football had recorded the highest grade point average in program history. The Tigers' 2014 roster included four college graduates and that total jumped to 12 degree-holding players who played in the 2014 Miami Beach Bowl. Another eight student-athletes earned their diplomas from the University of Memphis following the 2014 fall semester.

Senior linebacker Charles Harris was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 3 NCAA Division I Football Team to highlight the program's academic accomplishments.

Much of the groundwork for the University of Memphis program's current success was attained during Fuente's first two seasons as the Tigers' head coach.

Fuente knew the challenges the program would face when the team began play in The American. In his second season as head coach, the Tigers finished in the bottom half of the league standings in the new conference. It was well apparent the program was headed in the right direction.

In 2013, Memphis faced the third-toughest schedule among American Athletic Conference programs while playing seven opponents who advanced to bowl games. Games lost to bowl-bound opponents were decided by just eight points per game.

Memphis Football continued to make major strides in Year Two under Fuente.

Defensively, the Tigers were ranked No. 39 in total defense (370.7 ypg allowed) and No. 12 against the run (116.3 ypg allowed). Offensively, Paxton Lynch passed for over 2,000 yards, becoming just the second rookie in program history to do so. It was just the 10th time overall a quarterback has passed for over 2,000 yards in a season.

Memphis' special teams featured Ray Guy Award winner Tom Hornsey, who won the award annually presented to collegiate football's top punter, and Elliott, who was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, which is presented to the nation's top place kicker.

Memphis had three players named to the All-American Athletic Conference Team – Elliott, Hornsey and Ifedi.

In Fuente's first season in 2012, the Tigers posted their best finish since 2008 and won more conference games than the previous three seasons combined. But Memphis' then new head coach began building the foundation months prior to his rookie season.

One of the first items Fuente put in place upon

being named the head football coach at the University of Memphis was "The Tiger Code." The code consists of three elements – 1) Fundamentally Sound, 2) Physically Fit and 3) Mentally Tough.

In addition to instilling the Tiger Code and installing a new off-season conditioning program, Fuente selected 10 student-athletes to form his first leadership council. The group best exemplified being student-athletes and living by the Tiger Code. During Fuente's first season, the group of leaders served as a conduit between the coaching staff and the team.

While breeding a new culture within the program, Fuente shared his vision for Memphis Football as a speaker for a variety of civic groups while also making the rounds on television morning shows and the area's talk radio circuit. He and his staff conducted the school's first Women's Clinic in an effort to educate female fans as well as building the program's fan hase

Fuente previously served five seasons on Gary Patterson's staff at TCU from 2007-11. Fuente joined the TCU football coaching staff in February of 2007 as running backs coach and was promoted to co-offensive coordinator in February of 2009. As part of his promotion, he moved to coaching the Horned Frogs quarterbacks.

A native of Tulsa, Okla., the dynamic play-caller helped guide TCU's program to consecutive BCS bowl game appearances with a 2011 Rose Bowl victory over No. 5-ranked Wisconsin that followed an appearance in the 2010 Fiesta Bowl. From 2008-10, TCU was the only program in the country that finished in the top-10 in both the Associated Press and USA Today polls all three campaigns.

In Fuente's three seasons as offensive coordinator, TCU set single-season school records for touchdowns, points scored and first downs, while also ranking among the nation's most productive offensive units. From 2009-11, the Horned Frogs won 36 of 39 contests, including a 24-game win streak in the Mountain West Conference (MWC).

Fuente made the move to TCU after spending six seasons as quarterbacks coach at Illinois State. His final three years saw him double as the Redbirds' offensive coordinator.

As a college quarterback, Fuente played two seasons (1996-97) at Oklahoma under then-Sooners offensive coordinator Dick Winder. Fuente set an Oklahoma freshman record with 11 touchdown passes. He transferred to Murray State for his final two years of eligibility and set 11 school records including passing yards and and total offense in a game and season.

Fuente and his wife, Jenny, have three daughters, Cecilia, Caroline and Charlotte.

#### OVER FIVE HUNDRED

- After beginning his career with a 4-8 season (2012) and a 3-9 mark (2013), Justin Fuente's career winning percentage climbed to .500 with the victory at Bowling Green.
- ▶ Fuente's career record is now 25-21 (.543), including 18-4 (.818) over the last two seasons.
- ▶ Following the win over Ole Miss, Fuente was named the *Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week*.
- ► Fuente has also been named to the 22-coach watch list for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award.

#### UNDER 40 IN YEAR FOUR

- In his fourth season as the head coach of the Tigers, Memphis' Justin Fuente remains ranked among the youngest coaches in NCAA FBS Football. Fuente ranks seventh on the list.
- Fuente turned 39 on July 30.
- Four coaches from the American Athletic Conference rank among the top-10 in terms of youngest in age.
- ▶ USF's Willie Taggart ranks just ahead of Fuente on the list at No. 6.
- American Athletic Conference coaches Matt Ruhle (Temple) and Tom Herman (Houston), rank No. 8 and No. 9.

### STAFF PROMOTIONS AND ADDITIONS

- ▶ Head coach Justin Fuente made several promotions and added two new coaching staff members during the off-season.
- ▶ Galen Scott, the Tigers' linebackers coach under Fuente, was named the Tigers' defensive coordinator ahead of the 2015 season. Scott previously served as co-defensive coordinator under former Memphis coach Larry Porter in 2011.
- Scott previously worked with Fuente at Illinois State (2002-06) and remained on at Memphis following Fuente's hire in December, 2011.
- Joining the Memphis coaching staff for 2015 were safeties coach Brent Guy and cornerbacks coach Troy Reffett.
- Darrell Dickey, who has been the Tigers' offensive coordinator the previous three years, was promoted to assistant head coach earlier this year.
- Dickey continues to serve as co-offensive coordinator along with quarterbacks coach Brad Cornelsen, who received additional responsibilities in being named co-offensive coordinator as well this past spring.

#### Unprecedented Head Coaching & Coordinator Experience

- The Memphis staff includes four coaches with experience as head coaches at the NCAA FBS level.
- In addition to Justin Fuente, who enters his fourth season at Memphis, coaching staff member Darrell Dickey was the head coach at North Texas (1998-2006) while Brent Guy was the head coach at Utah State (2005-08).
- Last month, Fuente announced the addition of consultant Bill Blankenship, who was the head coach at Tulsa (2011-14).
- Defensively, Memphis has three coaches on staff with experience as NCAA FBS defensive coordinators.
- In addition to Galen Scott, who assumes the DC role for the Tigers in 2015, Guy served as defensive coordinator at Boise State (1998-2000), Arizona State (2001-04), Louisville (2009) and Tulsa (2011-14). Troy Reffett was the defensive coordinator at UTEP (2002-03), New Mexico (2008) and Louisiana-Monroe (2009-14).
- In addition to three defensive coaches with experience as coordinators, defensive line coach Ricky Hunley has served as an associate head coach at Missouri (1998-2000) and coached in the NFL.

#### EIGHT TO START

- Memphis' 8-0 start in 2015 was just the second time the Tigers opened the year with eight straight victories, joining the 1938 team which posted a 10-0 record.
- The 1961 Tigers won their first six games to mark the third-longest win streak to begin a season.
- ▶ In addition, the 1929 team went 8-0-2 with ties in Game 2 and 8, while the 1963 squad went 9-0-1 with a 0-0 tie against No. 3 Ole Miss the second week of the year.



### SIGNIFICANT STREAK TO BEGIN 2015

- ▶ Prior to a 45-20 loss to Navy, Memphis had won its previous 15 straight games, a school record.
- ► Heading into the week, only Ohio State (21 games) and TCU (16 games) had longer win streaks than Memphis. TCU's 16-win streak also came to an end last week with a 49-29 loss at Oklahoma State.
- Previously, over the 1960 and 1961 seasons the Tigers won 10 straight (Four wins to end 1960 and six victories to begin the 1961 season), tying the mark for the longest win streak in program history.
- During a four-year stretch (1960-63) under coach Billy Murphy, Memphis posted a combined 33-5-1 record (.868).
- ► The only other 10-game winning streak for Memphis came during the 1938 season when the Tigers posted the school's lone undefeated, untied season, going 10-0.
- ▶ The Navy loss ended Memphis' 10-game conference win streak.
- ▶ The loss also ended the Tigers' home win streak at seven games.
- Memphis plays a Houston team Saturday which has currently won its last 10 games dating back to a 35-34 win over Pittsburgh in last season's Armed Forces Bowl.

#### ROAD GLADIATORS

- ► The American Athletic Conference was the first league to have teams win multiple road games in 2015 (Memphis and Temple).
- ► The road wins have continued for the league as Memphis (4-0), Houston (4-0) and Temple (5-0) are three of 10 FBS teams to currently be undefeated in road games this season.
- ▶ Having won its last eight road games, Memphis has the second-longest road win streak in the nation.
- Ohio State has won 16 straight road games to lead the nation. Temple and Wisconsin have won six straight on the road.
- ▶ Including a 55-48, double-overtime win over BYU in the inaugural Miami Beach Bowl played at Marlins Park, the Tigers have won nine straight games played away from the Liberty Bowl.
- ► This year's 4-0 road record includes the first non-conference road wins since a 20-13 win at Ole Miss (Sept. 4, 2004) to start the 2004 season. Memphis had lost 15 straight non-conference games played on the road prior to this season.

#### NOTING WS

- ▶ With its next win, Memphis would notch consecutive, nine-win seasons for the first time in program history.
- ► The 2014 season marked just the sixth time a Memphis team won at least nine games 1938 (10-0), 1949 (9-1), 1950 (9-2), 1963 (9-0-1), 2003 (9-4) and 2014 (10-3).
- ▶ Prior to 2014, the last time Memphis won nine games came in 2003. The previous last time the Tigers won nine regular-season games was 1963.
- ▶ Memphis' seven conference wins in its second season as a member of the American Athletic Conference in 2014 set a program record. Over the past two seasons, Memphis is 11-2 in American play.

#### **NOVEMBER GAUNTLET**

- With only two losses between Navy, Houston and Temple, Memphis hit the most challenging segment of the schedule beginning with last week's game against the Midshipmen.
- ► Heading into last week, Memphis' future opposition schedule ranked tied for No. 12 nationally in terms of toughest at .714 (20-8).
- ▶ Memphis' current, cumulative opposition win-loss percentage of .552 (32-26) ranks 46<sup>th</sup> nationally.
- ► The Tigers' future opposition Houston, Temple and SMU have a combined 17-8 record against FBS competition (.680) which ranks 21st nationally.

#### **BOWL ELIGIBLE**

- During the third weekend of October, the Tigers became bowl eligible for a second straight year.
- ▶ This year is the earliest Memphis has become bowl eligible. It is also the quickest the Tigers have got to six wins. Both the 1938 and 1961 teams earned their sixth victory on Oct. 21 of the respective years.
- ► The American Athletic Conference has bowl tie-ins with seven bowl games this year AutoNation Cure Bowl (Dec. 19 vs Sun Belt), Miami Beach Bowl (Dec. 21 vs Conference USA), Marmot Boca Raton Bowl (Dec. 22 vs Mid-American Conference), Hawaii Bowl (Dec. 24 vs Mountain West Conference), St. Petersburg Bowl (Dec. 26 vs Conference USA), Military Bowl (Dec. 28 vs Atlantic Coast Conference) and the Birmingham Bowl (Dec. 30 vs Southeastern Conference).
- ► The American Athletic Conference champion will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest ranked team among the champions of five conferences.
- ► The two bowls not hosting a semifinal which could host champion of the non-contract conference champion this year is the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl in Atlanta (Dec. 31, 2015) and the Vizio Fiesta Bowl in Glendale, Ariz. (Jan. 1, 2016).

### Non-conference Games & the Power Five

- ▶ Memphis went 4-0 in non-conference play this season.
- ▶ It was the first time Memphis was undefeated in non-conference play since a 3-0 start to the 8-4, 2004 season.
- ▶ Previous to wins over Kansas and Ole Miss this season, Memphis last defeated multiple opponents from what is now considered Power Five conference in 1996 when the Tigers beat Missouri 19-16 on the road then upset No. 6 Tennessee 25-17 late in the 1996 season.
- ▶ Memphis went 3-0 against Southeastern Conference teams during the 1993 season, beating No. 23 Mississippi State (45-35), Arkansas (6-0) and Ole Miss (19-3).

TIGED TRENDS

#### SIGNIFICANCE OF KANSAS WIN

- With its win at Kansas, Memphis defeated a school from a Power 5 conference for the first time since a 20-13 win at Ole Miss to start the 2004 season.
- ▶ The victory snapped a 19-game losing streak to P5 schools including 10 straight on the road.
- ► The 55 points were the most in a win over a Power 5 conference team since 1998 when the Bowl Championship Series was formed.

#### NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- ▶ Memphis earned the AutoNation National Team of the Week award with the Tigers' 37-24 win over Ole Miss.
- ► The award is coordinated by the Football Writers Association of America.
- As part of AutoNation's history of charitable involvement, AutoNation will donate \$1,000 to the Breast Cancer Research Foundation (BCRF) in the University of Memphis' name.
- This charitable college football initiative culminates with the AutoNation Cure Bowl, a new post-season NCAA football game that kicks off bowl season at the Citrus Bowl Stadium in Orlando, Fla., and will be aired by CBS Sports Network.
- ► The aptly named AutoNation Cure Bowl also serves as a fund raiser for the BCRF, CharityWatch's only A+ rated breast cancer organization in the country.

#### RANKED TIGERS

- After being ranked No. 15 in last week's Associated Press Top 25 Poll as well as No. 16 in the Amway Coaches Poll, Memphis slipped to No. 25 in both polls this week.
- Last week, the College Football Playoff Selection Committee ranked Memphis No. 13 in its first weekly rankings. The committee will issue weekly rankings now through its final ranking announcement on Sunday, Dec. 6.
- Memphis has now been ranked four straight weeks in the AP Top 25 (Week 8 No. 18, Week 9 No. 16, Week 10 No. 15 & Week 11 No. 25). The Tigers have been ranked six straight weeks in the Amway Coaches Poll (Week 6 No. 25, Week 7 No. 22, Week 8 No. 17, Week 9 No. 16, Week 10 No. 16 & Week 11 No. 25).
- ► Following the 37-24 win over Ole Miss, Memphis debuted in the AP Top 25 poll at No. 18. It was the Tigers' first appearance in the AP Top 25 Poll since 2004.
- ▶ In the AP Top 25 poll released on Sept. 12, 2004, the Tigers debuted at No. 25 after beating Ole Miss (20-13) and Chattanooga (52-21) during consecutive weeks. The one-week appearance in 2004 was the only other time Memphis was ranked in the AP Top 25 in a weekly poll.
- ▶ Despite a 47-35 road win at Arkansas State the following week, Memphis fell out of the AP poll, and a week later lost at UAB 35-28. The 2004 team finished the season at 8-4 but never climbed back into the national rankings.
- ► The Tigers debuted in the Amway Coaches Poll at No. 25 following the USF game (Oct. 4) and were ranked No. 22 prior to playing Ole Miss. The Tigers made the biggest rise in the coaches poll following the Ole Miss win, moving up five spots to No. 17 after the victory.
- ▶ Prior to the Sunday after the Ole Miss win, Memphis had been ranked only once in the AP Top 25.
- ▶ Memphis closed out the 2014 season ranked No. 25 in both the final AP and Amway Coaches Polls.

#### AMERICAN RANKINGS

- Four American Athletic Conference football teams Houston, Temple Navy and Memphis are ranked in the top 25 of the current Associated Press and Amway Coaches Polls.
- ► The American, which had three top-25 teams in each of the three previous polls, has one-third of its members ranked in this week's poll.
- ▶ The four American Athletic Conference teams in this week's rankings have a combined record of 32-3.
- ▶ The American joins the SEC and the Big 12 with four top-25 teams in this week's polls.

### SERIES BREAKDOWN

- Houston has a 14-9 edge in its series with Memphis. The Cougars have won the last five games played in the series. Memphis head coach
- ▶ Memphis will play in Houston's 40,000-seat TDECU Stadium for the first time on Saturday.
- ► Houston holds a 6-4 lead in games played in the series in the city of Houston. The Cougars posted a 25-15 win over the Tigers at BBVA Compass Stadium in downtown Houston during the 2013 season.
- Houston's current, five-game win streak in the series began with a 20-13 overtime victory against the Tigers in 2006. Prior to that game, Memphis had won the previous three including two at Robertson Stadium.
- Memphis head coach Justin Fuente is 0-2 as a head coach against Houston. During his first season on TCU's staff in 2007, Fuente was part of a 20-13 win over the Cougars at the 2007 Texas Bowl..

#### **TEXAS TIES**

- ▶ Memphis Football has 10 student-athletes from the state of Texas.
- Among the group is starting wide receiver Tevin Jones (League City) and starting right tackle Trevon Tate. Quarterback Clay Holgorsen (Katy) is also from the Houston area.
- Memphis assistant head coach Darrell Dickey and special teams coordinator James Shibest are both Houston natives.



#### **ABOUT THE DEFENSE**

- ▶ Memphis' defense has been challenged time and time again this season. Through the first nine games of the season, the Tigers have played four offenses which through last week's games are averaging 500+ yards and ranked among the top-15 in the nation.
- Already this season, Memphis has beat Bowling Green (595.7 ypg 3<sup>rd</sup>), Cincinnati (578.2 ypg 5<sup>th</sup>), Ole Miss (526.6 ypg 9<sup>th</sup>) and Tulsa (520.1 ypg 12<sup>th</sup>).
- ► Still ahead for the Tigers is a Houston team currently averaging 525.1 ypg (10<sup>th</sup>).
- ▶ In addition to four teams which featured high-power offense, the Tigers have now played one of the most proficient ground games. Navy's 326.5 rushing yards per game ranks third nationally.

#### **DEFENSIVE PERSONNEL**

- Sophomore LB Genard Avery leads the Tigers with 49 total tackles. Avery's 6.5 tackles for loss (28 yards) and quarterback sacks (20 yards) are both team highs.
- Senior LB Wynton McManis is coming off a career-high 10 tackle game against Navy. He is second on the squad with 46 total tackles.
- Senior SAF Reggis Ball has notched 40 tackles this season, third for total stops on the Memphis team. Ball is the team's co-leader with two interceptions and also has three pass breakups.
- ▶ Junior CB **Arthur Maulet** also has two interceptions on the year including a 59-yard scoring return against Cincinnati for the Tigers' first points in the victory over the Bearcats. Maulet leads the Tigers with five pass breakups.

#### MEMPHIS' SCORING NUMBERS

- Through nine games, Memphis has scored 403 total points. The Tigers' 44.8 scoring average ranks sixth nationally. This is the second straight year and third all-time Memphis has scored 400 points.
- ▶ The 2014 Tigers scored a school-record 471 points. The 2004 squad scored 430 points.
- ▶ Memphis had never scored 60+ points twice in the same season until 2015. The Tigers scored 63 points in the opener against Missouri State. The 66 points scored against Tulsa was the third-most points scored in a game and the most scored in a game since 1969.
- Just to put the scoring output through nine games in perspective, for the two seasons prior to Justin Fuente being named the Tigers' head coach, Memphis did not break the 200-point total for the season.
- ▶ The 2010 team scored 173 total points while the 2011 squad scored 195 points during the year.
- Memphis needs just 17 more points this season to score 400 points for the year. It would be only the third time in program history the Tigers have scored 400 points in a season but would be the second straight year.

#### More on Scoring

- ▶ Memphis has scored 30+ points seven times this season and 17 times in the last two years. The Tigers have scored 40+ points six times this season and 12 times over the last two seasons.
- Memphis began the 2014 season by scoring 30+ points in three straight games, and for the year, scored 30+ points 10 times.
- ▶ The only other time Memphis scored 30+ points nine or more times came in 2004.

### DOWN ... NEVER OUT

- Memphis came from behind in five straight wins this season, falling behind early against Kansas, Bowling Green, Cincinnati, USF and Ole Miss.
- ▶ Memphis charged back from a 13-0 deficit to score 41 unanswered points in the Tigers' 41-13 win over Tulane.
- ► Memphis' five comebacks from double-digit deficits this year equals UCLA's 2005 season which included a 50-38 win over Northwestern in the Sun Bowl after falling behind 22-0.
- North Carolina State came back from double-digit deficits in six games during the 2000 season which is a high-water mark since 1996 for FBS Football.
- ▶ The Wolfpack's six, double-digit comebacks included two overtime wins and a comeback from a 24-0, second-quarter deficit to beat Minnesota 38-30 in the MicronPC.com Bowl (Dec. 28, 2000). NC State finished the year at 8-4.
- ▶ In last month's 37-24 win over Ole Miss, the Rebels scored touchdowns on their first two series and led 14-0 with 9:44 to play in the first quarter before the Tigers rallied for 31 unanswered points.
- ▶ Memphis has outscored opponents just 93-75 this season in the first quarter.
- ▶ The Tigers have outscored opponents 310-183 over the second through fourth quarters this season.

### More on Tiger Deficits

- Early in the year, the Tigers trailed 10-0 to Kansas before scoring 17 unanswered and then stretched their lead to 31-13 early in the third quarter en route to a 55-23 victory.
- At Bowling Green, the Tigers trailed 27-17 at halftime and an early, fourth quarter touchdown put BGSU up 41-34. Memphis would score the game's final 10 points with Jake Elliott's 29-yard field goal with 7:35 to play give the Tigers the lead in a 44-41 victory.
- ▶ In a 53-46 win over Cincinnati, the Tigers trailed 7-0 early. The Bearcats had a 39-38 lead with 10 minutes to play in the game before the Tigers outscored UC 14-7 late.
- Memphis trailed 10-0 at USF early in the second quarter and 10-7 at halftime before scoring 17 unanswered, second-half points en route to a 24-17 victory.



### LYNCH IN 2015

- ▶ Through nine games, QB Paxton Lynch has completed 226-327 passes for 3,014 yards and 19 touchdowns.
- Lynch's 3,014 passing yards ranks eighth in NCAA FBS Football. His .691 completion percentage ranks 10th.
- ▶ In terms of passing yards per game, Lynch is averaging 334.9 ypg which ranks sixth in FBS Football.
- Lynch's 25.11 completions per game ranks ninth in FBS. His 164.5 pass efficiency rating ranks 11th.
- Lynch has posted 12 career, 300-yard passing games including the team's last eight games. He has thrown at least one touchdown pass in each of the last 14 games, dating back to the final five games of the 2014 season.

### LYNCH'S RECORD MARCH

- With 305 passing yards against Navy last week, Lynch hit the 3,000-yard passing plateau for a second straight year. He becomes the first Memphis quarterback to pass for 3,000 yards in multiple seasons.
- Lynch heads into this week's game with Houston needing just 207 passing yards to break the single-season passing yard record set by **Martin Hankins** in 2007 (3,220 yards).
- ► The only other 3,000-yard passers in Memphis history were Danny Wimprine (3,174 yards in 2003) and Lynch, who had 3,031 passing yards last year.
- ▶ By the way, congratulations to Hankins who was last week elected circuit clerk for Lamar County (Miss.).
- Lynch is moving up several other season charts. His 226 pass completions is currently tied for fifth with Hankins' 2006 total. The school record is 261. His 327 pass attempts ranks ninth all-time.
- Also, Lynch's 19 touchdown passes ranks as the sixth-best season total. Hankins set the school record with 25 in 2007. Danny Wimprine had 23 TD passes in 2002 while Lynch's 2014 tally of 22 TD passes is tied for the third-longest with Wimprine in both 2003 and 2004.

### CAREER NIGHT IN TULSA

- ► In the Tigers' 66-42 road win at Tulsa, Memphis quarterback **Paxton Lynch** completed 32-of-44 passes for 447 yards and four touchdowns
- The 447 passing yards established a new Memphis school record and ties for the 16th-best FBS passing performance this season.
- ▶ The previous school record of 416 passing yards was set by Hankins against East Carolina during the 2007 season.

### **CONSECUTIVE CAREER GAMES**

- ► Earlier in the year, **Paxton Lynch** passed for career yardage over a stretch three straight games, culminating with his first career 400-yard passing game against Cincinnati.
- Against Cincinnati, Lynch also led Memphis with 52 rushing yards on 11 carries. He was successful on a two-point conversion with 7:07 to play to give the Tigers a 46-39 lead.
- ▶ On Memphis' game-winning drive, he completed consecutive passes of 13, 29 and 18 yards to move the ball into the red zone and set up the game-winning touchdown run by Craft with 53 seconds to play.

### CAREER GAMES ... AT THE TIME

- At Kansas, Paxton Lynch passed for 354 yards, completing 22-of-25 passes (.880) to establish what was then a career high. He had touchdown passes of six and three yards to cap drives of 80 and 75 yards.
- At Bowling Green, Lynch completed 29-of-40 passes for 386 yards and three touchdowns in the Tigers' 44-41 come-from-behind victory.
- Lynch's 386 passing yards at Bowling Green now ranks sixth all-time at Memphis.
- Lynch and the Memphis offense answered BGSU's 62-yard touchdown pass which gave the Falcons a 41-34 lead with 14:13 to play with a 48-yard touchdown strike to WR **Tevin Jones**. The score came on a double reverse flea-flicker as WR **Roderick Proctor** took a pitch from RB **Sam Craft**. Proctor then flipped the ball back to Lynch who found a wide-open Jones sprinting toward the end zone.





- ► In the third quarter, Lynch and the Tigers answered a 94-yard touchdown pass by BGSU with a 60-yard screen pass to Craft for a touchdown.
- ▶ Earlier in the third quarter, Lynch threw a 32-yard pass to Jones on fourth-and-one from the BGSU 41 to sustain a touchdown drive which tied the game at 27.

#### ADDING UP

- QB Paxton Lynch has now started 34 straight games for the Tigers, completing 688-1089 passes (63.2 completion percentage) for 8,101 yards. He has thrown 50 touchdown passes and scored 67 total TDs (17 rushing).
- ▶ Lynch ranks second in all-time passing yards at Memphis as well as career completions and attempts.
- ▶ Lynch's 8,101 career passing yards and 8,741 total offense yards both rank eighth among active FBS players.
- ▶ The junior signal caller's completion percentage of .632 ranks ninth among active FBS quarterbacks.

#### Mackey Award & Burlsworth Trophy Nominee

- ▶ Memphis senior TE **Alan Cross** was nominated for the for the Burslworth Trophy.
- ▶ In the award's sixth year, the Trophy honors Brandon Burlsworth, former University of Arkansas walk-on and All-American offensive lineman. The award will be given to the collegiate player who began their career as a walk-on and has shown outstanding performance on the field. Nominees must have begun their first season of participation with a D1 football program without financial aid of any kind from their athletic department.
- Cross, formerly a walk-on long snapper and linebacker at Memphis, is the program's all-time leader in touchdown receptions by a tight end with 13.
- With three catches for 46 yards against Tulane, Cross became the third Memphis receiver to pass the 1,000-yard receiving mark this season. He has now caught 86 career passes for 1007 yards.
- ▶ In the Tigers' win over Ole Miss, Cross had a career-high six receptions for 41 yards and a touchdown in which he got his toe down in the end zone before falling out of bounds.
- Cross was named the Mackey Award Tight End of the Week following the performance against the Rebels.
- Following wins at home, Memphis players celebrate the victory by heading to the student section and the Mighty Sound of the South marching band to join in the singing of the school's fight song.
- ▶ Cross has climbed the director's ladder and led the band in home victories this season.

#### WALK-ON RECEIVERS

- ▶ Five of Memphis' top-six receivers in terms of receptions and yardage began their careers at the UofM as walk-ons.
- Among the group are two wide receivers who have surpassed the career 1,000-yard mark Mose Frazier who has caught 117 passes for 1,428 yards and seven touchdowns along with Tevin Jones who has caught 85 passes for 1,184 yards and nine touchdowns.
- Frazier sat out Justin Fuente's first season as the Tigers' head coach after transferring back home from Arkansas-Pine Bluff. Frazier has caught 52 passes (Tied for eighth-best in a season) for 626 yards and three touchdowns.
- For his career, Frazier has caught 117 receptions for 1,428 yards. He has broke into the Memphis statistical top-20 for both catches (seventh) and yards (12th)
- Frazier's 22 straight games with a reception through the Navy game moves him into a share of sixth all-time with Bunkie Perkins, Isaac Bruce and Ryan Roskelly.
- Anthony Miller, who has 607 receiving yards on 38 catches, is coming off his first multi-touchdown game against Navy. Miller had an 11-yard touchdown reception and scored on a one-yard run in the third quarter.
- ▶ Phil Mayhue has caught 36 passes for 507 yards in 205. Mayhue transferred to Memphis from the Atlanta Sports Academy as a walk-on ahead of the 2014 season.
- ▶ Tevin Jones has caught 17 passes for 285 yards, including four touchdown receptions. Jones had a four-catch, 77-yard game against Tulsa which included touchdown receptions of 58 and five yards. Miller is the co-leader in touchdown receptions with four.

### KOR TD: It's BEEN AWHILE

- Memphis has currently gone 225 straight games without returning a kickoff for a touchdown. The streak is the longest in FBS football.
- The Tigers' last return of a kickoff for a score came on Nov. 9, 1996, against Tennessee when Kevin Cobb returned a kickoff 95 yards to tie the game at 14-14. The play earned Cobb an ESPN ESPY.
- ▶ **Joe Craig** appeared to break that drought in 2013 when he took a kick from the three, headed to the near sideline and up the field to the end zone in the final minutes of the UCF game. A holding call nullified the return.
- ▶ In 2012, **Bobby McCain** almost broke the streak at Duke. McCain had a 95-yard return to the Duke five in the second quarter of the game.
- ▶ McCain set a school single-game record with the highest kickoff return average (43.7 yards per return) against Duke.

#### PUNT RETURNS FOR SCORES

- ▶ Roderick Proctor became the first return man to take a punt back for a touchdown since Oct. 16, 2004 when Darron White returned a punt 60 yards early in the first quarter of the Tulane game. Proctor's 63-yard return to cap a 28-point first-quarter for the Tigers ended a stretch of 129 games without a return man taking a punt back for a touchdown.
- ▶ In addition to three punt returns for 84 yards, Proctor caught three passes for 51 yards in the Missouri State win.
- ▶ For his efforts, Proctor was named the American Athletic Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Officially however, the Tigers had gone 34 games without a punt returned for a score before Proctor's burst to the end zone in the opener.
- ► Tevin Jones was credited with a punt return touchdown in the second game of the 2012 season when he pounced on the ball in the end zone after a blocked punt at Arkansas State.
- ▶ Proctor heads into the week having returned 16 punts for 144 yards (9.0 yards per return).

#### ALL-CONFERENCE KICKER X TWO

- ▶ PK Jake Elliott was named the American Athletic Conference's Special Teams Player of the Year as well as selected to the league's all-conference first-team for a second straight year at the conclusion of the 2014 season.
- ▶ For 2014, Elliott converted on 21-32 field goals during the year. Of his 11 missed field goals, eight were from 45+ yards.
- ► Elliott also made all 57 of his PATs, a school record, breaking the previous mark of 48 PATs set by **Stephen Gostkowski** in 2004
- ▶ Elliott scored 120 points in 2014. It was just the seventh time a Memphis player has scored 100+ points in a season.


#### GAME WINNER

- Junior Jake Elliott booted what proved to be the game-winning field goal with 7:35 to play, drilling a 29-yard kick, to give the Tigers a 44-41 lead at Bowling Green.
- Elliott converted on all three field goal attempts including a 52-yarder that got the game back to a one-possession contest early in the third quarter.
- Last year, Elliott kicked a 31-yard field goal as time expire to lift the Tigers to a 16-13 win over Temple. With the victory, Memphis became bowl eligible for the first time since 2008.
- ► Currently, Elliott made 7-of-11 career field goals of 50+ yards.

#### KICKING NOTES ON ELLIOTT

- Along with making all 49 PATs in 2015, **Jake Elliott** has made 16-of-18 field goals. His .889 success percentage ranks 11th in FBS Football while his 1.78 field goals per game is tied for seventh nationally.
- With two field goals against Navy last week, Elliott moved into sole possession of second in all-time field goals at Memphis with 53. He moved passed Joe Allison, the inaugural Lou Groza Award winner, who kicked 51 during his career.
- ▶ Thanks in part to Elliott's booking kickoffs, Memphis ranks second nationally in kickoff return defense (14.31 ypr).





- In handling kickoffs, Elliott has placed 56 of 74 kicks into the end zone for touchbacks (.756).
- ▶ For his career, Elliott has booted 128 of 211 total kickoffs for touchbacks (.606).

#### SCORING

- Elliott is just one field goal away from scoring 100 points for the second consecutive year and would join Stephen Gost-kowski and DeAngelo Williams as the only players to score 100 points in multiple seasons during a career at Memphis.
- ▶ Elliott leads Memphis with 97 points this season. Elliott's 10.8 points per game ranks seventh nationaly.
- ▶ In Memphis' 41-13 win over Tulane, Elliott made 3-of-4 field goal attempts (24, 40 & 34) and scored 13 points. The game marked the third time this season and the 13<sup>th</sup> of his career that Elliott has scored in double-digits in a game.
- ▶ Elliott was named the American's Special Teams Player of the Week for a second time this season and the seventh time of his career.
- Elliott scored a career-high 15 points at Houston his freshman year. He scored a season-high 14 points at Bowling Green.
- Elliott's 10.8 points per game ranks seventh nationaly.

#### **DUAL PUNTERS**

- Memphis utilized two punters throughout the 2014 season then, red-shirt freshman Spencer Smith and true freshman Nick Jacobs.
- Smith handled punts in all 13 games last year, averaging 40.3 yards on 58 punts. He placed 18 inside opponents' 20-yard line.
- ▶ During the first half of the 2015 season, the tandem combined to earn American Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honors in back-to-back weeks.

#### SMITH'S SOPHOMORE START

- Spencer Smith is averaging 46.8 yards, which if he met the minimum of 3.6 punts per game, would rank fourth nationally.
- ▶ Through nine games, Smith is six punts shy of being ranked by NCAA Statistics.
- Smith, a nominee for the Ray Guy Award, has booted 11 punts of 50+ yards and has had nine punts downed inside opponents' 20-yard line.
- Against Cincinnati, Smith averaged a career-high 52.7 yards on six punts in the Tigers' 53-46 come-from behind win over the Bearcats. He flipped field position with every punt including three after the Tigers were pinned inside their own 20.
- Against Cincinnati, Smith had four punts of 50 yards or more including a career-long, 72-yarder which was his only touchback. That punt was the eighth-longest punt of the year in NCAA FBS Football. Even without it, Smith's average for the Cincinnati game would have been 48.8 yards per punt.
- ► For his efforts against Cincinnati, Smith was named the American Athletic Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week.

#### DESIGNATED SHORT-FIELD PUNTER

- Nick Jacobs had just a 33.2 punting average in 2014, but all 16 of his punts were downed inside opponents' 20-yard line.
- ► For 2015, Jacobs has averaged 36.8 yards on 13 punts, with 10 downed inside the 20.
- Against USF, Jacobs pinned the Bulls inside their own 20-yard line with all six of his punts. Jacobs averaged 36 yards on his career-high six punts. Three were downed on fair catches inside the 10.
- ▶ Jacobs' performance was recognized as the American Athletic Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week.
- The Bulls did not have an opportunity return a punt during the game. Their average starting field position after Jacobs' punts was the USF 9-yard line.
- Jacobs' performance was recognized as the American Athletic Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week.
- ► In what is certainly a rarity, Memphis had different punters receive league player of the week recognition on back-tohack weeks
- ▶ Earlier in the season on a fake punt at Bowling Green, Jacobs' ran for 11 yards for a first down to sustain a scoring drive.

#### More Receiving Notes

- The last time Memphis had three or more receivers with 1,000 receiving yards was 2008 when the Tigers finished the year with four players closing out the year with 1,000 yards Duke Calhoun (2058), Carlos Singleton (1858), Maurice Jones (1356) and Earnest Williams (1061).
- Both Calhoun and Singleton added to their numbers the following year and rank No. 1 and No. 2 on Memphis' career pass receiving chart.
- ▶ Memphis also had three, 1,000 yard receivers following the 1998 season.
- Memphis has five players with 20+ receptions this season Mose Frazier (52), Anthony Miller (38), Phil Mayhue (36), Roderick Proctor 24) and Alan Cross (21).

#### DOUBLING UP

- Memphis had four, 100-yard games against Tulsa. Both Doroland Dorceus (32-138-2) and Jamarius Henderson (14-112-2) had 100-yard rushing games. Mose Frazier (110-128-0) and Anthony Miller (5-106-1) had 100-yard receiving games.
- Dorceus and Henderson's 100-yard rushing games marked the first time since 2013 (vs. Arkansas State) that the Tigers had two or more players with 100 rushing yards in a game.
- Frazier and Miller's 100-yard receiving games is the first time since 2012 that Memphis had two or more players with 100 receiving yards in a game.
- ► The last time Memphis had a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in the same game came against UTEP in 2009. Against the Miners that year Curtis Steele rushed for 240 yards while Carlos Singleton had 105 receiving yards).
- For the year, Dorceus leads the Tigers with 449 yards and seven touchdowns on 103 carries. Jarvis Cooper, who did not play at Tulsa, has 77 carries for 349 yards and five touchdowns.

#### **O-LINE VERSATILITY**

- Against Ole Miss, Memphis utilized the same five linemen for all 94 offensive snaps LT Taylor Fallin, LG Christopher Roberson, C Drew Kyser, RG Gabe Kuhn and RT Trevon Tate. The five-player group also played every snap against Navy last week.
- ▶ Memphis utilized a different group of offensive linemen in the first four offensive series against Tulsa.
- ► On the left side of the line, both Fallin and Roberson played all 190 offensive snaps over the two-week span. Last week against Tulane, the same group of linemen played every snap through the next-to-last series.
- ▶ Since missing the Bowling Green game and prior to getting a break for the final series of the Tulane game, Fallin played 414 consecutive offensive snaps. For the year, Fallin has competed 614 of 651 offensive plays of the games in which he played, including a career-high 96 snaps against Tulsa.
- ► The Navy game marked Fallin's 32<sup>nd</sup> career start. The Bowie, Md., native has started all 21 games he has played in over the past two season. He has played in 41 career games.

#### RED ZONE SUCCESS

- After converting on 4-of-4 treks into the Red Zone against Navy, Memphis has converted 48-of-50 times inside opponents' 20-yard line.
- ▶ The Tigers .960 Red Zone Offense percentage ranks fourth in the country.
- ▶ Memphis' 48 Red Zone Offense scores is the most by any team in FBS Football.
- Memphis has converted for 26 red zone rushing touchdowns, 11 red zone passing touchdowns and 11 red zone field goals.
- ▶ A total of eight 15 teams have journeyed in the red zone 45+ times but not team has been as successful as the Tigers.

### CONVERTING ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN

- Memphis has been efficient at moving the chains on third and fourth down.
- ▶ Memphis has converted on 50 percent or better on third down in four games this season. The Tigers were 6-of-13 on third down in the Tulane game (.462) and 7-of-13 on third downs against Navy (.467)
- The Tigers were 12-for-20 on third down plays against Ole Miss (.600). At Tulsa, Memphis converted on 9-of-18 third-down plays.
- ► Heading into the week, Memphis ranks eighth nationally in third-down conversions having converted 49.3 percent of the time. The Tigers are 68-of-138 on third down this season.
- Memphis is 8-of11 on fourth down conversion attempts this season (.727). The Tigers rank 12<sup>th</sup> nationally in the category.
- Against Bowling Green, Memphis was 3-for-3 on fourth down plays. Taking into account the third-down plays in the game, Memphis moved the chains 12-of-20 times (.600) in four-down, 10-yard segments during the game.

#### PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL CRITICAL AT HOUSTON

- ▶ Houston leads the nation in both turnovers gained (25) and turnover margin (1.78).
- Memphis is coming off just its second, muti-turnover the game this season matching a season high with three turnovers (two fumbles and one interception). Navy scored 10 points off the miscues.12
  Prior to the Navy loss Memphis had just six turnovers five fumbles lost and one interception through the first eight

- ▶ In four games this season, Memphis has played turnover-free football, including last week's game against Tulane.
- Memphis' lone turnover against Ole Miss was a pass that popped off receiver Jae'Lon Oglesby and into the air. The ball was intercepted by the Rebels. It was the first of just two interceptions thrown by QB Paxton Lynch.
- ▶ The Tigers have had only one other multi-turnover game this season (3 fumbles in win at Kansas).

#### TIGERS IN OVERTIME GAMES

- ▶ Memphis has been involved in seven overtime games (2-5).
- ► The Tigers ended the 2014 season with the first overtime game in five seasons, defeating BYU 55-48 in double overtime at the Miami Beach Bowl.
- ► The previous overtime game came in the 2009 season finale at Tulsa. The Golden Hurricane defeated the Tigers 33-30 on Nov. 27, 2009.
- Prior to the Tulsa game, Memphis' previous overtime game was against SMU and was decided in three overtime periods, 55-52.
- Memphis has played a total of three, multi-overtime affairs. The Tigers played a three-overtime game against Houston on Oct. 31, 2000. The Cougars won that game 33-30.

#### **CRUNCHING THE ATTENDANCE NUMBERS**

- Attendance for the Navy game was announced at 55,212. It is the most-ever for a conference game played by Memphis in the stadium and the second-largest crowd when discounting games played against Southeastern Conference opponents. The largest non-SEC crowd was 57,500 against Arkansas State in 1989.
- Memphis 232,736 attendance is the highest accumulative attendance by an American Athletic Conference program and the Tigers' 46,547 per game average ranks only second to Temple (51,252).
- ► The 60,241 attendance announced for the Ole Miss game marked the seventh-largest crowd to witness a Tigers' game in Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.
- The Ole Miss attendance figure was the highest for Memphis football since the stadium underwent renovations for ADA improvements following the 2012 season which lowered the capacity of the stadium to 59,308.
- ▶ The Ole Miss game was the most-attended Memphis game since the Tigers played host to Tennessee in 2006 (61,783).
- Memphis drew 45,172 for the Cincinnati game. The attendance followed up a crowd of 41,730 for the season opener against Missouri State.
- ▶ Prior to the Tulane game which drew 30,381 to a rain-soaked Liberty Bowl, the 40,000+ for three consecutive home games to begin the year was a first for Memphis Football.
- ► The highest per game average for Memphis Football played in the Liberty Bowl is 41,175 in 2004. The UofM is currently averaging 46,547 per game.

#### **NETWORK COVERAGE**

- ▶ Memphis' broadcast television coverage has been unprecedented in 2015.
- ▶ Through the Houston game, Memphis will have appeared on ESPN twice (Cincinnati and Tulsa), ESPN2 three times (USF, Navy and Houston), a split broadcast where a majority of the nation saw the Ole Miss game on ABC and last week's game against Tulane on CBS Sports Network.
- ▶ With the ABC broadcast of the Ole Miss game, Memphis played on an over-the-air network for the first time since a 21-17 win over then, No. 6 Tennessee on Nov. 9, 1996.
- Memphis's American Athletic Conference opener against Cincinnation Sept. 24 was broadcast as a Thursday night game, the only FBS game played that night.

### ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

- Junior TE Daniel Montiel was voted to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team and will now appear on the CoSIDA Academic All-America ballot. Montiel, a two-year letter winner at Memphis, has played in all nine games this season, starting the last two in a two, tight-end set.
- On the season, Montiel, a native of Arlington, Texas, has seven catches for 116 yards and two touchdowns and has played in 29 career games.
- An accounting major with a 3.72 GPA, Montiel has twice been a member of the American Athletic Conference All-Academic team and has been a member of the Tiger 3.0 club in every semester at Memphis. A multiple-semester honoree on the Dean's List, Montiel was also an honoree of the Tiger Academic 30 award in multiple semesters.
- ► This is the second straight season Memphis football has had a CoSIDA first team Academic All-District III honoree. Former Tiger Charles Harris was also a first team honoree last season.

#### ON THE RADIO DIAL

- With Memphis' football game set for 6 p.m. Saturday and Tigers Basketball opening its season with a 7 p.m. game against Southern Miss, the broadcast of football will slide over to the FM band and Rock 103 FM.
- ▶ The pregame show with Forrest Goodman along with Dave Woloshin and Jarvis Greer in Houston will begin at 4 p.m.
- ▶ Memphis Basketball will air on WREC AM 600 with pregame set for 5 p.m.

### LIBERTY BOWL MEMORIAL STADIUM

The University of Memphis football program is fortunate to have one of the finest facilities in the nation in which to play its home games. Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium, "built by the citizens of Memphis," is a memorial to the veterans of World War I, World War II and the Korean War. The renovated 59,308-seat facility, built in 1965 at a cost of \$3.7 million by the city of Memphis, is operated by the Memphis Park Services Department.

The Tigers inaugurated the stadium in the fall of 1965 and in 50-plus years, have compiled a 157-142-7 record in the Liberty Bowl. The stadium features an AstroTurf® playing surface, spacious locker rooms and a four-level press box which features a VIP stadium club. The playing surface, which had been natural grass through the 2004 season, was replaced with a FieldTurf surface prior to the 2005 campaign. For the 2012 season, the surface changed to AstroTurf®, a surface used in several FBS collegiate and NFL stadiums. The field surface upgrade was part of major renovations to the stadium for 2012.

The centerpiece of the 2012 renovations at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium was a \$2.5 million video score-board and sound system. A generous donation provided by Fed Ex to the U of M paved the way for the video board/sound system upgrades.

The south end zone features a 98x48-foot, state-of-the-art video board with a sound system located on the sides of the structure. The speakers and cap/or crown of the scoreboard makes the structure's actual size grow to 106 feet by 58 feet. According to available statistics, the board is one of the top-10 largest video boards in the nation.

In 2012, the north end zone was updated with an LED board that is 38x10 feet in size.

In addition to the \$850,000 FieldTurf playing surface for the 2005 season, the Liberty Bowl underwent several aesthetic changes the last six years (2005-11) that made the stadium look more like the "Home of the Tigers."

Prior to the start of the 2006 season, Jim McDonald of McDonald Outdoor provided several large photo wraps on the walls of the stadium's entrances to welcome Tigers fans. Graphics wraps were unveiled around the stadium's interior in 2008, and a face-lift project for the stadium's restrooms on the lower concourse was completed prior to the start of the season.

A major renovation project took place at the Liberty Bowl prior to the start of the 2009 season when the Tigers and visitors' locker rooms both

underwent makeovers. The most notable change was the separation of the two locker rooms in the north tunnel. The Tigers' locker room remained in the north tunnel, while the visitors' locker room moved to the stadium's south tunnel.

Renovations in both 2009 and 2013 have brought the stadium into compliance with ADA specifications. The two separate renovations lowered the stadium's capacity from 62,380 to 59,308.

In the spring of 2010, the Memphis City Council approved a \$15.7 million capital improvements budget to upgrade the grounds surrounding the Liberty Bowl. Included in the renovations was the construction of a grand entrance off East Parkway which City Council approved naming "Tiger Lane" in honor of the facility's longest tenant — the University of Memphis. "Tiger Lane" officially opened Sept. 18, 2010, when Memphis hosted Middle Tennessee.

Prior to the recent upgrades in the 2000s, the previous major renovation came in 1987 to a tune of \$19.5 million. Included in the 1987 facelift were the addition of the sky-suites located on the east side of the stadium, approximately 12,000 seats in the stands and a stadium club to accommodate donors. Other areas of the stadium also were vastly improved, including the lighting system, playing surface, handicap seating area, concession stands and restroom facilities.

In December of 1983, city of Memphis officials named the playing surface Rex Dockery Field in honor of the late Tigers coach who was killed in a plane crash.

The stadium also hosts the annual AutoZone Liberty Bowl Game, as well as the Southern Heritage Classic. In spring of 2011, the world-renowned 'Memphis In May' BBQ Contest was moved to "Tiger Lane" from Tom Lee Park on the Mississippi River as a result of flooding in that area.

Throughout the 50-year history, several professional teams have called the Liberty Bowl home. In 1974, the Grizzlies of the World Football League played their only season in Memphis. From 1978-80, the stadium hosted the Memphis Rogues of the North American Soccer League, and later in 1984-85, the Showboats of the U.S. Football League (USFL). Three other professional football organizations spent one season in the Liberty Bowl, including the XFL'S Memphis Maniax (2001), the NFL'S Tennessee Oilers (1997) and the CFL'S Memphis Mad Dogs (1995).

# **2015 MEMPHIS GAME RECAPS**

GAME 1 ► ESPN3

## MEMPHIS 63, MISSOURI STATE 7

SEPTEMBER 5 > LIBERTY BOWL > MEMPHIS, TENN.

Eight starters lost from last season's Tigers defense. Well, no problem early on in 2015.

The University of Memphis used a suffocating defensive performance to hold Missouri State to 125 yards of total offense in an impressive 63-7 victory in the 2015 season opener for both programs. Before a crowd of 41,730 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium, the Tigers defense also held the visiting Bears to 18 yards rushing on 30 carries and only 10 first downs.

In the 2014 season opener, the Memphis defense held Austin Peay to 146 yards of total offense and 10 first downs, the last time the Tigers held an opponent to both fewer than 150 yards of total offense and 10 or fewer first downs. The last time Memphis held an opponent to under 50 yards rushing was at Houston in 2013. The Cougars managed only 38 yards on the ground in that contest.

The defense also helped in two first-quarter scoring drives for Memphis, recovering two fumbles deep in Bears territory.

The first short-field drive was set up when Jackson Dillon recovered a Breck Ruddick fumble at the Missouri State 25 yard line. Five plays later, Paxton Lynch hooked up with Mose Frazier for a five-yard scoring strike to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead. Then, on Missouri State's third possession, Ryan Heaston fumbled, and Wynton McManis scooped up the loose ball at the Bears 36 yard line, setting up another short field for the Memphis offense. Five plays later, Doroland Dorceus went over from two yards out for a 21-0 Tigers first-quarter lead.

Taking a cue from the defense, the special teams got into the scoring act late in the first quarter when Roderick Proctor returned a punt 63 yards for a score. It was the Tigers' first punt return for a touchdown by a returner in 129 games. The last time a Memphis return man scored was against Tulane in the 2004 campaign.

Frazier and Dorceus each scored another first-half touchdown, and Jarvis Cooper added a four-yard touchdown run to give Memphis a 42-0 halftime lead.

Cooper scored on another four-yard scamper just after halftime before Missouri State got on the board. The Bears' lone touchdown came with five minutes left in the third quarter when Ruddick hit Malik Earl from two yards out.

The Tigers added two more late touchdowns for the 63-7 final.

Cooper led the Tigers rushing attack with a career-high 102 yards on 18 carries and two scores.

Lynch, who only played in the first half, was 8-of-12 passing for 78 yards and one touchdown. Clay Holgorsen, who came on in relief of Lynch, went 7-of-8 passing for 80 yards and his first collegiate touchdown toss. Frazier led the Tigers receiving corps with six receptions for 89 yards and two scores.

## Memphis 55, Kansas 23

SEPTEMBER 12 MEMORIAL STADIUM LAWRENCE, KAN.

Paxton Lynch threw for a career-high 354 yards and wide receiver Mose Frazier had a career-high 141 all-purpose yards to lift Memphis to an impressive 55-23 road victory at Big 12 member Kansas.

Lynch was 22-of-25 passing and tossed two touchdowns. The 354-yard performance bettered his previous career high of 311 yards in last season's 41-14 win at Cincinnati. It also was his fifth career 300-yard passing game.

Frazier had three rushes for 64 yards and a score and added four receptions for 77 yards to account for his 141 yards. He scored one touchdown on a career-long 60-yard scamper.

Memphis piled up 651 yards of total offense, the second-most for a single game in school history. The school record is 659 yards set in a 69-19 rout of rival Louisville in 1969.

The Tigers carried momentum and a 24-13 lead into the second half and pulled away from the Jayhawks. Frazier's 60-yard touchdown run put Memphis up 31-13.

After a Kansas touchdown, Memphis scored the game's next 24 points to grabbed an insurmountable 55-20 advantage. Lynch hit Daniel Monteil for a three-yard scoring strike, and Jarvis Cooper and Jamarius Henderson each hit pay dirt from a yard out for the Tigers' three touchdowns in the 24-0 spurt. Jake Elliott added a 32-yard field goal in the run.

The game, though, got off to a shaky start for the Tigers, as on their opening possession, they fumbled on their first play from scrimmage. The fumble set up the KU offense at the Memphis 10 yard line, but after netting a minus-two yards on three plays, the Jayhawks settled for a Nick Bartolotta 30-yard field goal to take an early 3-0 advantage.

The shaky start continued for Memphis on its second drive. The Tigers went backwards for seven yards on three plays and had to punt. The Jayhawks took over on their own 27 and marched 73 yards on five plays to take a 10-0 lead. Ke'aun Kinner scored on a five-yard scamper around the right end.

That's when the Tigers offense woke up.

Memphis scored on its next three possessions (two touchdowns, one field goal) to take a 17-10 advantage. The Tigers combined to rack up 183 of its 267 first-half yardage on the three drives. The touchdown drives ended in scoring runs from Sam Craft and Doroland Dorceus, and Elliott connected on a 27-yard field goal.

### Memphis 44, Bowling Green 41

SEPTEMBER 19 > DOYT PERRY STADIUM > BOWLING GREEN, OHIO

In a battle of two high-powered offenses, Memphis edged Bowling Green for a 44-41 win at Doyt Perry Stadium Saturday. In the end, it was the Tigers defense and special teams that separated the two foes.

Junior place-kicker Jake Elliott scored the winning points on a 29-yard field goal with 7:35 left in the game. Elliott also had field goals of 52 yards and 38 yards in the contest. Bowling Green's kicker Tyler Tate missed his only field goal attempt and was unable to convert one of the team's extra-point attempts.

After the teams went back and forth and scored at will for much of the game, the Memphis defense made stops on the Falcons' final four drives of the game.

Memphis quarterback Paxton Lynch had another banner game, completing 29-of-40 passes for a career-high 386 yards and three touchdowns. On the receiving end of his touchdown passes were wide receiver Tevin Jones, running back Sam Craft and tight end Daniel Montiel. Lynch's career-high 386 yards passing bested his previous high of 354 yards which he threw for in last Saturday's 55-23 win at Kansas.

Bowling Green exploited the Memphis defense through the air for a majority of the game. Falcons quarterback Matt Johnson was 28-of-44 for 443 yards and four touchdowns. Three of his touchdown passes were long-range strikes to Roger Lewis, who finished with seven catches for 261 yards.

Doroland Dorceus led the Tigers rushing attack with 75 yards on 16 carries. He and Craft, who finished with 11 carries for 50 yards. scored rushing touchdowns.

Elliott kicked his 52-yard field goal to start the second half, cutting into the Bowling Green lead. That Tigers' drive was extended on a Nick Jacobs' 11-yard run off a fake punt. For his career, Elliott moved to 8-of-14 on kicks of longer than 50 yards.

Memphis linebacker Genard Avery came up with a huge sack on third down of Bowling Green's first second-half possession. The sack forced the Falcons to attempt a 48-yard field goal, which was missed.

The game see-sawed back and forth as Memphis had an answer for 94 and 62 yard touchdown passes from Johnson to Roger Lewis.

Prior to Elliott's field goal which proved to be the game winner, Memphis tied the game at 41-41 with a 48-yard touchdown pass on a double reverse pass. Lynch handed the ball to Craft who pitched it to Roderick Procter who tossed it back to Lynch. The Tigers quarterback launched it to a wide-open Jones.

### Memphis 53, Cincinnati 46

SEPTEMBER 24 > LIBERTY BOWL > MEMPHIS, TENN.

Memphis opened American Athletic Conference play with a heart-palpitating 53-46 victory over longtime rival Cincinnati. The Tigers posted the win before a crowd of 45,172 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium and an ESPN national audience.

The victory, however, wasn't easy to come by for the Tigers. In a game in which the two teams combined for 99 points and over 1,300 yards of total offense, it was a defensive play that sealed the win for Memphis.

After taking a 53-46 lead on a Sam Craft 3-yard score with 53 seconds left, Memphis saw Cincinnati march down inside the Tigers 20 yard line. On a 1st-and-10 for the Bearcats, back-up quarterback Hayden Moore was pressured into throwing an errant pass that Tigers middle linebacker Leonard Pegues picked off at the 21 yard line with only :10 on the clock. The interception was Pegues' first of his career.

Memphis snapped the ball once on the ensuing possession, and the celebration in the Bluff City began.

Prior to the game-saving Pegues interception, it was all offense for both teams. Memphis racked up 570 yards of total offense, which was the 10th-most for a single game in school history. Cincinnati, though, outgained the Tigers with 752 yards of total offense, including 620 yards through the air. Both the total offense and passing yards were single-game records for a Memphis opponent. The previous total offense (689) and passing (578) single-game marks were by Houston in the 2009 season.

The two teams also combined for 99 points, the fourth-most in a game in Tigers history. For Memphis, its 53 points tonight versus Cincinnati gave them 215 points in the first four games of 2015. The 215 points are the most by a Tigers squad in the first four games in the program's history.

For the third-straight week, Memphis quarterback Paxton Lynch set a career-high passing mark with 412 yards. He was 24-of-36 passing and tossed two touchdowns.

The 412 yards were just four yards shy of tying Martin Hankins' school record of 416 yards versus East Carolina in the 2007 campaign.

### MEMPHIS 24, USF 17

OCTOBER 2 - RAYMOND JAMES STADIUM - TAMPA, FLA.

It wasn't the offensive fireworks Tiger Nation had enjoyed the first four weeks of the 2015 season, but the University of Memphis used timely offense and a stingy, second-half defense to post a 24-17 American Athletic Conference victory over USF.

Paxton Lynch led the Tigers with 305 yards on 20-of-33 passing and two scores. He also ran for another touchdown.

The Memphis defense stepped it up in the second half. After giving up 204 yards in the first half, the Tigers tightened up a little as USF gained 173 second-half yardage. However, 88 of those 173 yards came on the Bulls' next-to-last possession. Moreover, 183 of USF's 377 total yards came on its two touchdown drives (95 and 88 yards).

As the storyline for much of the season, Memphis fell behind early. After stopping Memphis on its opening possession, USF started its first drive of the contest from its own 5 yard line. The Bulls, though, put together an impressive 12-play, 95-yard drive that culminated in a Darius Tice one-yard TD run for a 7-0 lead.

The Tigers' next possession ended with a Jake Elliott missed field goal attempt, and the Bulls took over on their own 20 yard line. Eleven plays later, an Emili Nadelman field goal extended the USF lead to 10-0 just four seconds into the second quarter.

From that point, the Tigers offense picked up the pace and the Memphis defense stiffened. Memphis answered the USF field goal quickly, moving the ball 50 yards in under two minutes to cut the Bulls lead to 10-7. Memphis got on the board when Lynch found Sam Craft in the end zone from 20 yards out.

While that touchdown was the lone first-half score for Memphis, the Tigers defense began to take control. The USF offense had the ball four times in the second quarter, but managed only 42 total yards and one first down.

After half, Memphis scored the next 17 points to take a 24-10 advantage. An Elliott field goal five minutes into the third period tied the contest at 10-all. The Tigers then drove the ball 92 yards on 13 plays to take their first lead of the contest at 17-10 with 2:11 in the third quarter. Lynch capped the drive with a three-vard touchdown run.

The Tigers defense also played anmajor role in the squad's comeback. Memphis held USF to 64 yards on the Bulls' three third-quarter possessions and forced three punts.

Memphis then put the game out of reach early in the fourth quarter when Lynch hit Doroland Dorceus for a 55-yard scoring strike to extend the lead to 24-10 with 10:39 left on the clock.

USF managed a final 88-yard drive that resulted in a late touchdown to cut the Memphis advantage to 24-17 with just over a minute to play. The Bulls got the ball back with under a minute to go, but for a second-straight week, the Memphis defense sealed the win with an interception, this time by Reggis Ball.

Wynton McManis posted a career-high nine tackles (all solo stops).

### Memphis 37, Ole Miss 24

OCTOBER 17 > LIBERTY BOWL > MEMPHIS, TENN.

Believe. Memphis. Believe.

Behind a masterful performance from quarterback Paxton Lynch, the No. 22 nationally-ranked Tigers came back from an early 14-point deficit to post a 37-24 non-conference victory over No. 12 Ole Miss, before a crowd of 60,241 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium and an ABC network audience.

Lynch was 39-of-53 passing for 386 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Tigers to a 6-0 start for the first time since 1961. Memphis also extended its win streak to 13, which is currently tied for the second-longest in the nation.

Anthony Miller and Mose Frazier were Lynch's two favorite targets versus the Rebels. Miller had a career-high 10 receptions for 132 yards and a score, and Frazier added eight catches for 83 yards and a touchdown. But, more than their numbers, the tandem came up with key receptions to keep drives alive for Memphis, which was 12-of-20 on third-down conversions in the contest.

The game did not start as well as it ended for the Tigers. Ole Miss scored touchdowns on its first two possessions of the game, with both coming through the air.

The Rebels wasted little time on their first drive, going 75 yards on two plays that took 20 seconds off the clock. On the scoring play, Ole Miss quarterback Chad Kelly lateraled the ball to Laquon Treadwell, who then tossed a 68-yard scoring strike to Quincy Adeboyejo.

After forcing another Tigers punt, the visitors from Oxford took over on their own 10. Again, the Rebels did not take long to score, putting together a 90-yard, eight-play drive that took only 2:33. The drive was capped off when Kelly hit Damore'ea Stringfellow for a 23-yard score to give Ole Miss a 14-0 lead.

However, that is when the Tigers awoke. And Tiger Nation began to believe.

Memphis scored the next 31 points and held the Rebels scoreless the next 32:45 of the game. Ole Miss did not score again until the 6:59 mark of the third period.

The Tigers got their first score late in the first quarter when Lynch hit Alan Cross from a yard out to cut the Rebels' lead to 14-7. The touchdown drive was 10 plays and 70 yards and gave Memphis momentum heading into the second quarter.

After an exchange of possessions early in the second quarter, the Memphis offense revved up and the Tigers defense clamped down, setting up three short-field scoring drives. In that second quarter, the Memphis defense held Ole Miss to only 63 yards of total offense, while the Tigers offense put up 146 yards in the period.

# Memphis 66, Tulsa 42

OCTOBER 23 > H.A. CHAPMAN STADIUM > TULSA, OKLA.

On the strength of quarterback Paxton Lynch's record-setting night, Memphis posted a 66-42 American Athletic Conference victory over Tulsa, before a crowd of 20,216 at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

The win gave the Memphis program its best start to a season since 1938. This year's squad entered Friday's game tied with the 1961 team for the second-best start in school history at 6-0. The 1938 Memphis team posted a perfect 10-0 record.

On their way to the win, the Tigers piled up a school record 704 yards of total offense. Memphis had a balanced attack with 257 yards rushing and 447 yards through the air. The Tulsa offense also racked up 534 yards of total offense.

After flirting with the school's single-game passing record earlier this season, Lynch put his name at the top of that list with his career-best 447 passing yards against the Golden Hurricane (3-4, 0-3 The American). The junior was 32-of-44 passing and tossed four touchdowns. Lynch also ran for another score. Martin Hankins held the previous school single-game passing yardage record with 416 yards versus East Carolina.

For the second-straight week, Lynch continued to look for his favorite receiving tandem in Mose Frazier (10 receptions-128 yards) and Anthony Miller (5 receptions-106 yards). The duo combined for 15 catches and 234 yards. It was the first time that Memphis had two receivers with 100 yards in the same game since the 2012 Middle Tennessee contest.

Not to be overshadowed by the passing game, the Tigers rushing attack proved to be just as valuable in the win. Doroland Dorceus (32 carries-138 yards) and Jamarius Henderson (14 carries-112 yards) each rushed for over 100 yards and scored two touchdowns. It was the first time the Tigers had two running backs with 100 yards in the same game since the 2013 Arkansas State contest.

While it was a special homecoming win for Tulsa native Justin Fuente, Memphis was unable to secure the victory until late in the third quarter.

The Tigers held what seemed a solid lead at 35-14 just before the halftime break. But, a Golden Hurricane "Hail Mary" play at the first half horn was answered when Keyarris Garrett hauled in Dane Evans' 46-yard pass to cut the Memphis lead to 35-21.

### MEMPHIS 41, TULANE 13

OCTOBER 31 > LIBERTY BOWL > MEMPHIS, TENN.

It's not the way Tiger Nation likes its team to start games. But, University of Memphis football fans have to love how strong their team finishes.

For the sixth time this season, the No. 16 nationally-ranked Tigers fell behind early. And, for the sixth time this season, Memphis came back and answered the call with a victory.

Before a crowd of 30,381 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium, Memphis spotted the visiting Tulane Green Wave a 13-0 first-quarter lead and responded with 41-straight points for the 41-13 American Athletic Conference win.

While quarterback Paxton Lynch passed for over 300 yards for the seventh-straight game, it was the Tigers' ground attack the provided the offense a solid 1-2 punch to secure the victory. Memphis rushed for over 200 yards for the third time this season and the second game in a row.

The Tigers rushing game saw 10 players run the ball, gaining 223 yards and scoring three touch-downs. Doroland Dorceus led all Memphis backs with 10 carries for 45 yards, and Lynch was the team's second-leading rusher with seven carries for 43 yards. Sam Craft (31 yards) and Anthony Miller (28) also had over 25 yards on the ground. Dorceus, Miller and Jarvis Cooper each hit pay dirt via the run.

Lynch recorded his 11<sup>th</sup> career, 300-yard passing game with 343 yards on 26-of-42 passing. He tossed one touchdown, and for the seventh game this season, had no interceptions. Lynch's favorite target was Phil Mavhue. Who had a career-best 107 receiving yards.

The visitors from New Orleans jumped out to an early – but not quick – 13-0 lead. The Green Wave scored their first touchdown on a methodical and time-consuming 17-play, 75-yard drive that took 11:13 off of the first-quarter clock. Tulane missed the PAT for a 6-0 lead.

After Memphis' first drive ended with missed field goal, Tulane drove 80 yards in three plays to increase its advantage to 13-0 just 45 seconds into the second quarter. Both Green Wave scores were Dontrell Hilliard touchdown runs of three and 43 yards.

From that point on, the game was all Memphis.

The Tigers responded on their next two possessions with a Dorceus two-yard touchdown run and a Jake Elliott 24-yard field goal to slice the Tulane lead to 13-10 midway through the second period. Memphis earned the first of its two safeties in the contest in the second quarter when the Green Wave special teams snapped the ball over the punter's head, and he fell on it in the end zone.

On the ensuing possession, Memphis drove 22 yards, and an Elliott 40-yard field goal gave the Tigers a 15-13 lead at halftime. It also was a lead that Memphis did not lose the remainder of the contest.

### NAVY 45, MEMPHIS 20

NOVEMBER 7 > LIBERTY BOWL > MEMPHIS, TENN.

Sometimes it's just not your day, and that was the case for Memphis against one-loss Navy.

The Tigers were unable to find a rhythm on either side of the ball and dropped a 45-20 American Athletic Conference decision to the Midshipmen, before a crowd of 55,212 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. The 55,212 crowd was the largest for a conference home contest in the program's history.

Tigers quarterback Paxton Lynch notched his eighth 300-yard passing game of the season (12<sup>th in</sup> career) with 305 yards through the air, but wasn't able to put together the Lynch-like drives that Tiger Nation had become accustomed to during the season. He went 26-of-42 passing with one touchdown. He threw his second interception of the season in the contest.

The Memphis rushing attack managed 133 yards but fumbled the ball four times, two of which were recovered by the Midshipmen. Navy turned two of the three Tigers turnovers (two fumbles, one interception) into 10 points. Navy played error-free football with no miscues.

Memphis struck on its first possession of the game. The Tigers took only 1:21 to score and hit pay dirt when Lynch found Anthony Miller from 11 yards out for a 7-0 lead.

Navy answered the Memphis score on the ensuing possession. The Midshipmen, however, took their time scoring. Navy put together a methodical 16-play, 75-yard drive that took 9:02 off of the clock and tied the contest at 7-all with a Chris Swain three-yard touchdown run.

The Tigers reclaimed the lead on their next drive, capped by a Jake Elliott 40-yard field goal. Elliott's field goal ended the first-quarter scoring.

Navy took its first lead of the contest late in the second quarter. Starting on their own 29 yard line, the Midshipmen ran seven plays and 3:36 to cover the 71 yards, and Swain rushed for the final two yards to give Navy a 14-10 advantage.

The Midshipmen added to their lead just before halftime. Daniel Gonzalez intercepted a Lynch pass at the Tigers 37 yard line and returned it 10 yards to the 27 with under 30 seconds on the clock. Three plays later, Austin Grebe kicked a 44-yard field goal to give Navy a 17-10 advantage at the break.

After halftime, a role reversal was seen on each team's first score of the third period. The Tigers tied the contest at 17-all on a Miller one-yard touchdown sweep. In Navy-like fashion, Memphis methodically drove 84 yards on 15 plays and took 5:48 off of the clock.

Following the Tigers' score, Navy started its drive on its own 25, but regained the lead in a quickstrike, Memphis-like way. On the Midshipmen's first play from scrimmage, quarterback Keenan Reynolds connected with DeBrandon Sanders for a 75-yard touchdown. The drive was one play and took only 10 seconds, giving Navy a lead it did not lose.

An Elliott second field goal cut the Navy lead to 24-20 with just over five minutes left in the third quarter. But, from that point forward, it was all Midshipmen.
