## CONFERENCE HONORS

### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

**Keenan Reynolds • Sr. • QB • Navy • Antioch, Tenn.**

Reynolds was chosen as the American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year after he rushed for 1,229 yards and a league-leading 21 touchdowns in the regular season. Reynolds also threw seven touchdown passes with one interception in 98 attempts. He enters the Military Bowl as the NCAA career leader in rushing touchdowns (85) and is the active career leader among FBS players with 4,415 rushing yards. Reynolds is second among all American Athletic Conference players in rushing this season (102.4 yards per game) and is ranked sixth among NCAA FBS players in scoring (10.5 ppg).



### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

**Tyler Matakevich • Sr. • LB • Temple • Stratford, Conn.**

Matakevich was named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year after he registered his fourth consecutive season with at least 100 tackles – a feat accomplished by only six other players in NCAA FBS history. Matakevich enters the postseason with 126 tackles in 2015 to go with 4.5 sacks, 15.0 tackles for loss, five interceptions and 10 passes defended. He is the only player in FBS football who has led his team in tackles in every game this season, and he was the winner of the Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player.



### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE YEAR

**Jake Elliott • Jr. • K • Memphis • Western Spring, Ill.**

Elliott becomes the first player in American Athletic Conference history to repeat as a major individual award winner as he was named Special Teams Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. Elliott is The American's leading scorer in 2015, with 128 points on a league-high 22 field goals and 62 PATs. A finalist for the Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker, Elliott has made 9 of 10 field goal attempts from 40 yards or longer.



### ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

**Tre'Quan Smith • Fr. • WR • UCF • Delray Beach, Fla.**

Smith was a bright spot for UCF on his way to Rookie of the Year honors in The American as he finished with 52 receptions for 724 yards and four touchdowns – all team highs. Smith had more than twice as many receptions and receiving yards as any other UCF player, while he finished among the league's top 10 in both categories.



### COACHES OF THE YEAR

**Tom Herman • Houston**

**Ken Niumatalolo • Navy**

Herman earned American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors after he led Houston to an 11-1 regular season, a share of the West Division title and a spot in the American Athletic Conference Football Championship.



Niumatalolo was also named American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after he led Navy to a 10-2 regular-season and a 7-1 mark in the Midshipmen's first year as a conference member. Navy has been ranked in the top 25 in each of the last five weeks – a feat last accomplished in Annapolis in 1978.

## What A Rush

Navy QB Keenan Reynolds has set the NCAA's career rushing touchdowns record after he ran for four TDs in the Midshipmen's win against SMU. Reynolds has 85 career rushing touchdowns.

Reynolds needs two touchdowns in the Military Bowl to tie Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon for the overall NCAA touchdowns record (87). Reynolds held the record until Dec. 20, when Dixon scored four TDs in the New Orleans Bowl.

## Eyeballs

Temple and Cincinnati have played in front of record home crowds. The Owls drew 69,176 at Lincoln Financial Field for their win against Penn State and broke that mark with 69,280 against Notre Dame. The Bearcats had an on-campus with 40,101 in attendance against Miami (Fla.). Memphis had 60,241 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium for the Tigers' game against Mississippi, while Houston had a TDECU Stadium-record 42,159 on hand for the Cougars' game against Memphis.

## Rare Company

Temple LB Tyler Matakevich became the seventh FBS player to register 100 tackles in four seasons. He joins Rick Razzano, Virginia Tech (1974-77); Carl McGee, Duke (1975-78); Dan Bass, Michigan State (1976-79); Stephen Boyd, Boston College (1991-94); Dana Howard, Illinois (1991-94); and Marcus McGraw, Houston (2008-11).



## Houston Holds Off Temple For American Title

HOUSTON (AP) — Tom Herman came to Houston after helping Ohio State to a national championship last season with designs on returning the Cougars to national prominence.

Less than a year later the coach has done exactly that, leading Houston to a high-profile bowl for the first time in more than 20 years with a 24-13 win over Temple in the inaugural American Athletic Conference Football Championship.

Championship Most Outstanding Player Greg Ward Jr. ran for 148 yards and two touchdowns to secure Houston's spot in the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl.

"Just an overwhelming sense of pride in our guys and our team," said Herman, who came to Houston after working as the offensive coordinator for the Buckeyes. "None of this would be possible without the leaders in that locker room buying in from day one and dragging the rest of the team with them."

Ward raved about Herman and his staff.

"This program has gone through a lot before coach Herman came in," he said. "When coach Herman first came in we knew he had a plan ... we are just very happy and fortunate that we have those guys with us."

Houston jumped to a 17-0 lead with the help of two turnovers by Temple, one capped by a 47-yard touchdown run by Ward.

Temple had a chance to get within a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, but Jeremy Winchester knocked down a pass in the end zone and the Owls settled for a field goal that made it 24-13.

They had two more chances to cut the deficit after that, but were stopped on fourth down both times.

P.J. Walker threw for 287 yards with a touchdown and interception and Robby Anderson had a season-high 150 yards receiving for the Owls, who are heading to a bowl for the first time since 2011.

"This isn't deflating," Temple coach Matt Rhule said. "This is one of the most positive days in Temple football history. I wish we would have won, but we got down, and our kids fought back. Disappointed, yes, but we are going to play in a bowl game."

Fans rushed the field after the game, making a sea of red surrounding the stage they brought out onto the field to present the championship trophy.

Herman helped the Cougars to their second 12-win season and first since they went 13-1 in 2011 under former coach Kevin Sumlin and quarterback Case Keenum. Houston cornerback William Jackson set a school-record by breaking up seven passes.

Navy quarterback Keenan Reynolds was chosen as the American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year after he rushed for 1,093 yards and a league-leading 19 touchdowns in the regular season. Reynolds also threw six touchdown passes with one interception in 84 attempts. He enters the annual Army-Navy game as the NCAA career leader in touchdowns scored (83), rushing touchdowns (83) and points scored (500) and is second among all active FBS players with 4,195 career rushing yards.

Temple linebacker Tyler Matakevich was named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year after he registered his fourth consecutive season with at least 100 tackles – a feat accomplished by only six other players in NCAA FBS history. Matakevich entered the American Athletic Conference Football Championship with 118 tackles in 2015 to go with 4.5 sacks, 14.5 tackles for loss, five interceptions and 10 passes defended. He is one of three finalists nationally for the Bednarik Award.

Memphis kicker Jake Elliott becomes the first player in American Athletic Conference history to repeat as a major individual award winner as he was named Special Teams Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. His selection marks the third straight season in which a Memphis player won the award (Tom Hornsey, 2013). Elliott is The American's leading scorer in 2015, with 128 points on a league-high 22 field goals and 62 PATs. A finalist for the Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker, Elliott has made 9 of 10 field goal attempts from 40 yards or longer.

UCF wide receiver Tre'Quan Smith was a bright spot for UCF on his way to Rookie of the Year honors in The American as he finished with 52 receptions for 724 yards and four touchdowns – all team highs.

Houston coach Tom Herman earned American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors from his counterparts in his first year as a collegiate head coach after he led Houston to an 11-1 regular season, a share of the West Division title and a spot in the American Athletic Conference Football Championship.

Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo was also named American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after he led the Midshipmen to a 9-2 regular-season and a 7-1 mark in their first year as a conference member. Navy has been ranked in the top 25 in each of the last four weeks.

The College Football Playoff is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

## Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

## Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, comparative outcomes of common opponents and other factors.

## Two Days

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day belong to college football, with two semifinal games and four other top bowl games continuing a wonderful tradition. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

## Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

## Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

## Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Jeff Long (chair), Barry Alvarez, Mike Gould, Kirby Hocutt, Tom Jernstedt, Bobby Johnson, Tom Osborne, Dan Radakovich, Condoleezza Rice, Mike Tranchese, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

## Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

## Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings..

# BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The Miami Beach Bowl was played for the first time in 2014 at state-of-the-art Marlins Park in Miami, which sits on the site of the historic Orange Bowl stadium. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year, beginning with last year's matchup against Brigham Young. Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference and the Sun Belt Conference are scheduled for future years, though institutions from other conferences also will have the opportunity to participate.

The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The Birmingham Bowl takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The St. Petersburg Bowl is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The Hawaii Bowl is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West Conference.

The Marmot Boca Raton Bowl is a new game that will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2015.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl will debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The Popeye's Bahamas Bowl is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference in 2016 and Conference USA in 2018.

The R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tennessee, the Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, and the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.

# THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The 2015 football season will be the second under the American Athletic Conference's comprehensive television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports.

The new arrangements began with the 2013-14 basketball season and will be in place through the 2019-20 academic year. The contracts provide for unprecedented exposure on two of the industry leaders in sports television.

In football, the contract calls for all conference-controlled games — which encompasses all conference games and home nonconference games — to be televised. Nearly 90 percent of those games will be carried on either national broadcast or national cable platforms.

In addition to contracted games on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3, American Athletic Conference teams will regularly appear on CBS Sports Network through a sublicensing agreement with ESPN.

Additional nonconference games will be available on ESPN3 — ESPN's live multi-screen sports network, giving fans an online destination that delivers thousands of global sports events annually. It is accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 and Xbox One. The network is currently available to more than 99 million homes at no additional cost to fans who receive their high-speed Internet connection or video subscription from an affiliated service provider. The network is also available at no cost to approximately 21 million U.S. college students and U.S.-based military personnel via computers, smartphones and tablets connected to on-campus educational and on-base military broadband and Wi-Fi networks.

ESPN, Inc., is the world's leading multinational, multimedia sports entertainment company featuring a portfolio of more than 50 multimedia sports assets. The company is comprised of eight U.S. 24-hour television networks and five HD simulcast services. Based in Bristol, Connecticut, ESPN is 80-percent owned by ABC, Inc., which is an indirect subsidiary of The Walt Disney Company. The Hearst Corporation holds a 20 percent interest in ESPN.

CBS Sports Network is available to 100 million homes and may be seen on a digital basic cable package in all American Athletic Conference markets. Talent for The American's weekly game on CBS Sports Network includes Dave Ryan on play-by-play, Corey Chavous as the analyst and Lauren Gardner as the reporter.
