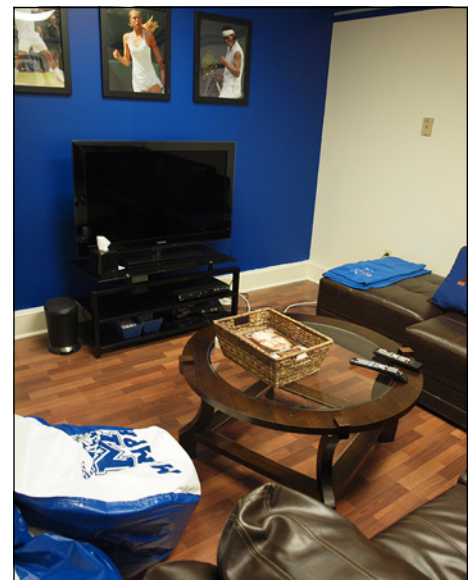

In October of 2009, The Racquet Club of Memphis, one of the premier facilities for tennis in the nation, officially became the home of the men's and women's tennis programs for the University of Memphis.

The Racquet Club has been the Mid-South's premier facility for tennis since opening its doors in 1974. Located on 12 acres of land in East Memphis, The Racquet Club has hosted an ATP tour stop since February of 1976. The U.S. National Indoor Championships is an ATP 250 level event that in 2013, awarded the Tigers' No. 1 doubles team of David O'Hare and Joe Salisbury a wild card in to the main doubles draw. That same event also saw seven of Memphis' eight singles players receive an entry to the qualifying draw of the ATP tournament.

The tournament stop brings some of the best players in the game to the Mid-South on a yearly basis. Former tournament champions include Jimmy Connors, Stefan Edberg, Andre Agassi, Jim Courier, Todd Martin, Mark Philippoussis, Andy Roddick, Tommy Haas, Sam Querrey, and current defending two-time champion Kei Nishikori. The doubles draw has the distinction of being the first professional doubles title for Bob and Mike Bryan, who faced the doubles team of O'Hare and Salisbury in the 2013 US National Indoor First Round.

Historically, the club also hosted a WTA event from 1986-2013. The women's professional event saw champions like Maria Sharapova, Lindsay Davenport, Venus Williams,

Lisa Raymond, Monica Seles and Zina Garrison walk the halls of the private club.

The home of the Tiger tennis team features 186,000 square feet of facilities, including six refurbished top-of-the-line post-tension system hard courts, as well as 11 indoor courts. Remodeled men's and women's locker rooms, specifically for use by the Tiger tennis teams, have also been added to the club's facilities.

With the move to The Racquet Club, Memphis student-athletes now have a brand new player lounge at their disposal for use during down time between practices and matches. The area, which used to be the facility's salon area, has been overhauled and includes four 48-inch big screen televisions and a player recreation area that includes one of the big screen TV's equipped with the most popular gaming systems. The player lounge also features a training room, study area, kitchen, racquet stringing room and offices for the coaching staff. A Hall of Fame area also exists in the player lounge, featuring photos of some of the most important players in the history of both the men's and women's tennis programs at the University of Memphis.

## INTERIM UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT - R. BRAD MARTIN

R. Brad Martin was named interim president of the University of Memphis effective July 1, 2013 by Tennessee Board of Regents Chancellor John Morgan.

Martin is a 1976 graduate of the University of Memphis where he served as Student Government President. While a student at the University, he was elected as a member of the Tennessee House of Representatives, and holds the distinction of being the youngest person ever elected to the Tennessee General Assembly, where he served five terms.

Martin has been involved with the U of M for over four decades. As a member of the House of Representatives, he created and sponsored the legislation which founded the Tennessee Earthquake Information Center at the University of Memphis. He has served as Chairman of the Board of Visitors of the University and Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the University of Memphis Foundation. He has been a guest lecturer and speaker at the University on multiple occasions and has taught in the Department of Political Science. He and his family have provided significant financial support for academic and athletic programs at the University of Memphis.

Martin has enjoyed a distinguished business career. He retired in 2007 from his role as Chairman and CEO of retailer, Saks Incorporated, having led that enterprise during an 18-year period of significant growth and value creation. He currently serves as Chairman of the private investment firm, RBM Venture Company, and is a member of the Board of Directors of FedEx Corporation, Chesapeake Energy Corporation, First Horizon National Corporation and Pilot/Flying J.

Martin is Chairman of the R. Brad Martin Family Foundation which provides philanthropic support to a number of important programs and institutions. Among the interests of the Foundation is the work of the Martin Institute for Teaching Excellence, housed at Presbyterian Day School in Memphis, which provides world-class professional development opportunities for K-12 public and private school teachers.

He is the co-author of *FIVE STONES: Conquering Your Giants* which was released by Abingdon Press in August 2013. He previously wrote the children's book, *MYLES' PESKY FRIENDS*.

Martin holds an MBA degree from the Owen Graduate School of Management at Vanderbilt University.

Martin's wife, Dina, also a U of M graduate, is active in a variety of University, community, and philanthropic programs. Martin is the father of five sons.

Tom Bowen took over as the University of Memphis Director of Athletics in June of 2012, and in only one year, he has the Tigers roaring into a new and exciting era.

Bowen began his tenure with an athletics program poised to make a league move from Conference USA to the Big East. Despite the conference realignment carousel continuing to rotate nearly halfway into his first year, Bowen's steady leadership helped Memphis become a charter member of The American Athletic Conference, which began its inaugural year July 1, 2013.

The Memphis athletics leader played an integral role in the formation of The American Athletic Conference and was instrumental in bringing the league's first men's basketball tournament to the Bluff City in March of 2014.

In addition to guiding Memphis through the conference move, Bowen placed his stamp on Tigers athletics. One of his first missions was to evaluate and restructure the athletics department.

Bowen also came in with a plan to increase the department's fundraising efforts to assist with facility upgrades. Under his direction, the Elma Roane Fieldhouse — home to Memphis women's basketball and volleyball — improvements were completed with a state-of-the-art weight room, a four-lane training track, an elevated cardio platform, a players lounge and an enlarged training room with Grimm Tubs-hydroponic pools for injury rehabilitation.

In November of 2012, Bowen received a gift of \$2.6 million on behalf of the department from the Helen and Jabie Hardin Charitable Trust to support women's athletics. The first phase in using the generous gift is underway with the redesign of the track and field complex on the University's Park Avenue campus. The second construction phase is set to begin in the near future and includes a clubhouse for the Tigers softball program at its stadium. The new softball clubhouse plans include coaches offices, meeting and recruiting rooms, indoor pitching and batting areas, athletic training room, equipment room and laundry room.

In the competition arena, Bowen's first year proved a rather successful one. After a tough start, the Tigers football squad rebounded to close the campaign with three-straight victories and finished the year with four league wins, the most since 2008. The men's basketball squad posted the sixth 30-win season in school history, swept the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament third round.

The men's tennis squad won the program's first Conference USA championship and received a second-consecutive NCAA Championships berth. The Tigers won their first NCAA Regional with an upset over Ole Miss and advanced to the program's first NCAA Championships Sweet Sixteen. The women's tennis team also made history with its first



NCAA Championships appearance as a team. The men's golf squad earned an NCAA Regional berth for a third-straight year. The track and field squads closed out the athletic year by sending a school-record nine student-athletes to the NCAA Outdoor Championships, with five earning All-America honors.

In the classroom, Memphis continued its strong performance in Bowen's first year. Memphis led the league with 228 student-athletes on the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll and was second in the number of C-USA Commissioner's Academic Medal recipients with 54.

Memphis athletics also had a Conference USA-best four student-athletes receive the league's Scholar-Athlete Award for their respective sports and had four of its programs earn C-USA Sport Academic Awards, the most of any in the league.

Furthermore, Memphis athletics had four programs receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards for their exceptional Academic Progress Rate (APR).

Prior to taking his current post, Bowen served as the athletics director at San Jose State University from 2004-12. While at San Jose State, the core of Bowen's mission was building a "Culture of Champions" academically, athletically and in the community. He led the Spartan Foundation, the department's fundraising component, through consistently challenging and uncertain economic conditions to unprecedented fiscal heights. The Spartans produced annual budget surpluses four-straight years and re-invested their gains back into their student-athletes and teams.

In 2008, San Jose State was named as one of 12 Division I universities cited for Overall Excellence in Diversity in the most recent national study by Texas A&M University on behalf of the NCAA.

Bowen's proven administrative and managerial record at San Jose State resulted in national appointments in college athletics. He

served as one of eight Football Bowl Subdivision directors of athletics on the 24-member NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee, an appointment that ended in 2011. In 2009, Bowen was one of 12 named to serve as a mentor to aspiring women and ethnic minority athletics administrators in the NCAA Fellows Leadership Program. He was the Tournament Director for the 2010 NCAA Men's Basketball Division I Championship first and second rounds games played in San Jose.

Bowen joined the staff at San Jose State after serving three years as the Director of Community Affairs and the executive director of the 49ers Foundation for the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League. His Division I experience at the collegiate level includes athletics administration positions at the University of California and Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif.

The 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame majored in theology/sociology and spent six years studying for the priesthood with the Holy Cross Fathers. Bowen went on to earn a master's degree in administration/education from the University of San Francisco in 1990.

Active throughout the entire Bay Area, he was named to the *San Jose Mercury News'* Top-25 Most Powerful Sports Figures in the Bay Area. Bowen served on the board of the San Jose Sports Authority, and he was an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco School of Sports Management and at San Jose State University's Department of Kinesiology, where he taught sports management classes.

He is a Level 2 certified member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA) and has memberships in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the Association of Fundraising Professionals.

He and his wife, Mia, are the parents of three children: sons, Andrew and Peter, and daughter, McKenna.

## UNIVERSITY OF MEMPHIS

As a doctoral-granting metropolitan research university, the U of M is committed to excellence in undergraduate, graduate and professional education; in the discovery and dissemination of knowledge; in engaged scholarship to the community, state and nation; and in the preparation of a diverse student population for successful careers and meaningful participation in a global society.

Ever forward looking, the University of Memphis is poised to enter one of its most historic and productive periods. Having just celebrated its centennial anniversary, its faculty, staff, alumni and benefactors have never been more willing, able and generous in their efforts to build an academic environment that makes a lifelong impact. This was evidenced by the more than \$256 million raised during the recent Empowering the Dream campaign.

The university’s strategic plan states its goals. Foremost among these is the ability to recruit outstanding faculty, enroll motivated students and provide distinctive learning experiences so its students are prepared for successful and meaningful participation in a diverse society.

Currently, the U of M offers 17 bachelor’s degrees in more than 50 areas of study, master’s degrees in 55 subjects and doctoral degrees in 23 disciplines. It also offers a specialist’s degree in education and a juris doctorate in law. Degree programs at the University of Memphis are divided into ten colleges and schools – College of Arts and Sciences, Fogelman College of Business and Economics, College of Communication and Fine



Arts, College of Education, Health and Human Sciences, Herff College of Engineering, the School of Public Health, University College, Cecil C. Humphreys School of Law, Loewenberg School of Nursing, and the School of Communication Sciences and Disorders.

For academically ambitious and talented students, the Helen Hardin Honors Program at the University of Memphis combines the best of a small liberal arts school with the wide-ranging opportunities of a large, nationally-recognized research university. With 1,848 students participating in fall 2012, the honors program, now entering its 40th year, is the largest honors program in the state of Tennessee.

In addition to the main campus in the heart of East Memphis, the University of Memphis opened a campus in Jackson, Tenn., in fall 2011 at what was formerly Lambuth University. It also has off-site campuses in Bartlett, Collierville, Cordova, Covington, Dyersburg, Jackson, Millington and Whitehaven.

One of the university’s strongest contributions to the community is its alumni. Many have become nationally and internationally renowned in their fields as corporate executives, elected officials, award-winning actors and best-selling authors. More than 65,000 U of M alumni live within a 40-mile radius of Memphis.

As the university enters its second century, it will continue to build strong partnerships with alumni, friends and community leaders to empower the next generation of Dreamers. Thinkers. Doers.

## CITY OF MEMPHIS

Considered the “Home of the Blues” and the “Birthplace of Rock ‘n Roll,” the city of Memphis’ musical roots run deep. However, music is just a chapter in the history as well as the future of the city located in the heart of Mid-America.

Memphis, named after the capital of ancient Egypt, has big city amenities with a small-town feel. Whether you are a hardcore sports enthusiast, a history buff, a music aficionado, or you just like to relax and watch as boats travel the Mississippi River, Memphis has something for everyone.

Downtown Memphis has continued to grow and thrive, and two of the most visible projects have been the construction of AutoZone Park and FedExForum.

AutoZone Park is the home of the Memphis Redbirds, the St. Louis Cardinals’ Triple-A club. The 14,320-seat stadium includes 1,500 club seats, 48 luxury suites and is located at the corner of Third Street and Union Avenue across from the world-famous Peabody Hotel. The Memphis Tigers baseball team also plays some of its more high-profile opponents in the top-notch facility.

The city’s newest downtown project is FedExForum, an entertainment arena that houses both the Memphis Grizzlies of the National Basketball Association and the University of Memphis men’s basketball team. The \$250 million state-of-the-art arena features a 35,000-square-foot outdoor plaza where fans of all ages can gather before an event. The arena has over 100 points of sale for concession stands and four full-service restaurants. FedExForum is located one block south of Beale Street.

Memphis’ musical roots can be traced to band leader W.C. Handy, who wrote the first blues song here in 1909, a campaign theme for Memphis mayor “Boss” Crump called “Boss Crump Blues” and later published as the “The Memphis Blues.” The sound soon caught on and blues bands filled the clubs along Beale. Young musicians who have performed along Beale include Muddy Waters, Furry Lewis, Albert King, Bobby “Blue” Bland and B.B. King.

Beale Street has rapidly become the entertainment center of Memphis, and visitors and locals alike enjoy the food and music offered in the various nightclubs.

Where Beale Street meets the Mississippi River is Tom Lee Park, site of the annual Beale Street Music Festival. The weekend-long event is just a part of the month-long Memphis in May International Festival, which also includes the World Championship Barbecue Cooking Contest and the Sunset Symphony.

Located within a block of Beale is Gibson Guitar Memphis, which includes factory tours and cultural exhibits. Across the street is the Smithsonian’s Rock ‘n’ Soul Museum located at the FedExForum, which includes artifacts documenting music’s past.

Memphis’ musical roots also include Stax and Hi-Records as well as Sun Records recording studio. Stax became known for “sweet soul music” through such artists as the MarKeys, Booker T.



and the MGs, Otis Redding, Wilson Pickett, Sam and Dave and Isaac Hayes. The Stax Museum reopened on its original location at McLemore and Crump in the summer of 2003 and offers visitors a complete history of “Soulsville USA.”

One of Hi-Records’ premier artists was Al Green. Sun Records’ most famous recording artist was Elvis Presley and also boasted Jerry Lee Lewis, Carl Perkins and Johnny Cash among its recording artists.

Elvis Presley’s Graceland is one of the five most-visited home tours in America and is the most famous home in the United States after the White House. In 1991, Graceland was placed on the National Register of Historical Places. Over 600,000 visitors tour Graceland each year. Also located downtown is the beautiful Orpheum Theater, which serves as a venue for performances by Ballet Memphis, the Memphis Symphony Orchestra and traveling Broadway shows, as well as the Orpheum Classic Movies series and other concerts.

The city’s location makes Memphis a major distribution hub with two interstate highways intersecting the city. Memphis is also home of FedEx, the nation’s largest package carrier which makes Memphis International Airport the world’s busiest cargo airport. Over 500 commercial passenger flights originate from Memphis International each day.

Ranked by *The Sporting News* as one of the “Top 50 Sports Cities In the Country,” the city of Memphis is a large metropolitan city with a hometown feel. From its big-city industry such as FedEx and the Memphis International Airport to its family recreation areas such as Shelby Farms and the Memphis Zoo, the city boasts all the amenities one would expect in a city with over 1 million residents, while retaining the charm and down-to-earth feel of a small town.

## TIGERS TRADITIONS

When the University of Memphis first fielded a football team in the fall of 1912, no one had selected a nickname for the squad.

Early references to the football team tabbed them only as the Blue and Gray Warriors of West Tennessee Normal School.

After the final game of the 1914 season, there was a student parade. During this event, several Normal students shouted, "We fight like Tigers." The nickname was born.

More and more the nickname "Tigers" was used, particularly in campus publications. But, it did not catch on with the newspapers downtown. They continued to use "Normals" or the "Blue and Gray" when referring to the University.

In the late 1920s, student publications and downtown newspapers began referring to the football team as the "Teachers" or "Tutors." The Tigers nickname would return, but not until 1939 was it finally adopted as the official nickname for the University of Memphis.

For over 40 years, the sideline mascot for the University of Memphis has been a Bengal Tiger named TOM. TOM attends all Tigers football home games, and he can also be found at many other University events throughout the year.

TOM travels in style in a custom-designed, climate-controlled trailer and always with a sheriff patrol escort.

As one of only two universities in America with a live tiger mascot, The University of Memphis is unique in its tiger tradition. As a project of the Highland Hundred, no public or University funds are used to provide for TOM's needs, and no University resources are required in his care.

TOM is a powerful and majestic symbol of the University of Memphis, and his presence presents constant opportunities to educate Tigers fans young and old through the preservation of one of the world's most recognizable endangered species.

The first Tiger, TOM, was procured by the Highland Hundred football boosters in 1972 and served the U of M faithfully for nearly 20 years until passing away in February of 1992. The Highland Hundred officially presented TOM



to the University in a ceremony at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium on Nov. 11, 1972, during a football game against the University of Cincinnati.

TOM had initially been named 'Shane' at the suggestion of the breeder's daughter. Once in Memphis, though, a contest was held to name the mascot. More than 2,500 entries were submitted. The list was ultimately reduced to two choices, Shane and TOM, which stands for Tigers Of Memphis. TOM won.

In the fall of 1991, the Highland Hundred Tiger Guard received TOM II as a gift from Tom and Carolyn Atchison of Florence, Ala. TOM II served his university with pride for 17 years through 2008, passing away on Oct. 15 of that year.

Shortly after TOM II's death, the Tiger Guard began the search for a new tiger to serve as TOM III, and a stroke of good luck was realized in a discussion with the Wisconsin Big Cat Rescue & Educational Center in Rock Springs, Wis. Faced with three new cubs born Aug. 31, 2008, after an unexpected pregnancy at their facility, founders Jeff Kozlowski and Jenny Meyer offered to donate one of their young tigers to serve as TOM III.

TOM III was introduced at a press conference on Nov. 17, 2008, and the Tiger Guard officially presented him to the University on Nov. 22 during a football game against the UCF.

The original logo was an MSU with a leaping Tiger coming out from behind the letter. The new logo is an "M" with a leaping Tiger coming up over the center of the "M."

### SCHOOL COLORS

The University of Memphis' official school colors of Blue and Gray were selected in the early 1900s.

The colors were chosen in an effort to show unity in a nation that was still recovering from the effects of the Civil War. The student body thought that by picking the colors of the North and the South, the school would show a togetherness among all students.

Not entirely unlike the nation that provides its namesake, the American Athletic Conference was born from an ideal in which members with ambitious goals are provided with the means to succeed in their quests for excellence.

With roots that extend to three conferences, the American Athletic Conference membership in 2013 — its debut season — consists of 10 institutions: the University of Central Florida, the University of Cincinnati, the University of Connecticut, the University of Houston, the University of Louisville, the University of Memphis, Rutgers University, Southern Methodist University, the University of South Florida and Temple University.

In 2014-15, East Carolina University, Tulane University and the University of Tulsa come aboard. The 2015-16 season sees the U.S. Naval Academy join the ranks in football only.

The American, which operated as the Big East Conference from 1979 to 2013, will immediately take a place at the forefront of Division I athletics, with schools that have played in a combined five Bowl Championship Series games, won four NCAA men's basketball titles since 1999, and won eight NCAA women's basketball championships since 1995.

Among the league's 2013 members, seven of The American's 10 football teams have been ranked in the top 13 in the BCS since 2006. Eight of the 10 teams have been in the BCS top 25 in that span. The 2013-14 membership will also include the most recent NCAA men's basketball (Louisville) and women's basketball (UConn) champions.



The 2013 season will mark the final year of a six-year arrangement with ESPN that gives The American national exposure on ABC television and the ESPN family of networks. ESPN, ESPN2 or ABC will carry a minimum of 19 American home football games each season. Championship Week in December includes three American games on either ABC, ESPN or ESPN2. At least four American games are featured on ESPN's Thursday-night package.

In addition, ESPN Regional Television will continue to produce and distribute its Game of the Week package to a nationally syndicated audience, reaching more than 30 million homes. Most of these games also will be available as part of the ESPN GamePlan subscription service. Finally, a minimum of five home games will be carried on ESPNU.

Following the 2013 football season, the American Athletic Conference enters new television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports which will give the conference unprecedented national exposure. The football portion of the contract, which begins in the 2014 season, calls for nearly 90 percent of conference-controlled games on national broadcast or national cable platforms. The first American Athletic Conference Football Championship, which will be played in 2015, will be carried either on ABC or ESPN on Championship Saturday.

In men's basketball, the new television deal calls for all conference-controlled games to be televised, with more than 63 percent slotted for national broadcast or national cable - a minimum of 107 games. The entire postseason tournament will be

televised, including the championship game, which will be either on ABC or ESPN. Sixty percent of the American's women's basketball games will be carried on either national cable, regional sports networks or ESPN3.

American Athletic Conference teams will have access to the pinnacle of college football's postseason structure, both in the coming season and beyond. In 2013-14, the league champion will receive an automatic bid for the final edition of the Bowl Championship Series, including a spot in the VIZIO National Championship Game if it is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS standings. Moving forward, The American champion would be chosen for the College Football Playoff semifinals if it is among the top four teams following the regular season. Otherwise, the league would place its champion in either the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl or Peach Bowl if it is ranked higher than the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

The American Athletic Conference administers to its membership from a state-of-the-art office located in Providence, R.I. The location of the conference headquarters — just steps from the city's Amtrak station and 10 minutes from T.F. Green International Airport — gives the conference easy access to its member schools.

The conference headquarters is equipped with a complete video production studio and small- and large-scale meeting rooms to accommodate the many coaches' and administrators' meetings held on-site each year.

## PAUL GOEBEL

MIDDLE TENNESSEE, 1995  
TENTH SEASON

Heading in to his 10th season as the head coach of the University of Memphis men's tennis program, Paul Goebel has elevated the Tigers' program to unprecedented heights.

Already this season, the Tigers have established a number of program benchmarks. The doubles team of David O'Hare and Joe Salisbury started the spring dual season ranked No. 3 in the country, the highest-ever national ranking for a Tigers' doubles tandem. The duo became just the third Memphis doubles entry to qualify for the main draw of the ITA All-American, where they strung together a run to the quarterfinals, the deepest a Memphis entry has ever gone in the draw. Less than two weeks later, the duo became the first Tigers in program history to defeat the No. 1 ranked doubles team in the country when they upset the team of Mikelis Libietis and Hunter Reese of Tennessee, 8-4, in the semifinals of the ITA Ohio Valley Regionals in Knoxville. They went on to win the ITA Regional doubles crown, another program first, qualifying for the ITA Intercollegiate Indoor Championships, where they advanced to the Round of 16.

Memphis enters the 2014 spring dual season with some major team momentum as well. After making its first-ever NCAA tournament appearance in 2012, the Tigers won two matches in the 2013 NCAA tournament, making the program's first-ever appearance in the Round of 16 and finishing the season ranked No. 20 in the country, the program's highest-ever team ranking.

Individually, the Tigers captured a program-best 10 conference post season honors, including sophomore Connor Glennon earning the Conference USA Player of the Year award and Goebel earning his second conference coach of the year honor. Juniors David O'Hare and Joe Salisbury were named first team, all-conference in doubles, while Glennon and junior Cedric De Zutter earned second team all-conference doubles honors. In singles play, Glennon was named first team, while Salisbury and junior Johnny Grimal were named second team in singles play. Salisbury also grabbed an academic honor, being voted to the conference's all-academic team.

Since taking over as the program's head coach after spending the previous five seasons as the assistant coach, Goebel has guided Tigers to 18 all-conference honors, including Glennon's Player of the Year honor in 2013 and freshman of the year honor in 2012 and Amrit Narasimhan's Newcomer of the Year honor in 2007.

A program that ranked No. 73 in the country at the end of Goebel's first season at the helm, the Tigers spent the entire 2013 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) national rankings, capturing their first-ever C-USA tournament crown. After starting the 2011-12 season not among the national rankings, Memphis broke into the national rankings the second week of the season and has remained there since, a streak of 32 straight polls heading in to the 2013-14 season.

# WE ARE MEMPHIS TENNIS

Of the six Tigers in program history to earn first-team, all-conference honors, Goebel has been the head coach of the program for five of them. He coached Jorge Vazquez to a 2009 first-team honor. Johnny Grimal and David O'Leary were named first team singles honorees in 2012, and were joined by Connor Glennon. Glennon then became the first Tiger in school history to earn repeat first-team all-conference honors with his award in 2013. The one other Tiger that earned first-team, all-conference honors that preceded Goebel's taking over the team is former Tiger, and current Lady Tigers head coach, Lee Taylor Walker. Goebel was an assistant for the Tigers while Walker was earning his first team honor and eventually earning a spot on the C-USA All-Decade Team in 2005.

Goebel has also raised the level of expectations off the court. Two of his men's tennis teams have earned C-USA Sport Academic Awards (honoring the highest team GPA among each conference sport), in 2010-11 and 2005-06. Of the 30 C-USA commissioner's academic medalists, 18 of them have come since Goebel took over the program.

The Tigers have earned ITA All-Academic Team honors in six of the last seven seasons. Juniors Cedric De Zutter and Joe Salisbury were named ITA Scholar Athletes in 2013. It was the second ITA academic honor for Salisbury and the third for De Zutter. Current Tiger David O'Hare is also a two-time ITA Scholar Athlete. In school history, Tigers have received 31 ITA Scholar-Athlete awards, 24 of them coached by Goebel.

A native of Hendersonville, N.C., Goebel came to Memphis after a stellar career at Middle Tennessee, where he was part of the school's first All-America doubles team, which earned him a place in the MTSU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Goebel became the second men's tennis player to be inducted into the

Middle Tennessee Hall of Fame. A member of the MTSU team from 1990-1994, Goebel served as the team's captain from 1992-1994 and was a four-time, all-conference player. He was also named the student-athlete of the year in 1994.

Following his collegiate playing career, Goebel served as a student assistant coach in 1995 at Middle Tennessee, while also playing professionally. He graduated from MTSU in 1995.

Goebel moved to Memphis and became a tennis professional at The Racquet Club of Memphis beginning in 1996. At The Racquet Club, Goebel taught top national and southern-ranked juniors and has coached in a variety of area training centers, zonals and national team events. In 1999, Goebel was ranked No. 1 in the nation in the "Men's 25 and Over" age group.

He sits on various NCAA tennis committees and has won two conference coach of the year awards (2012, 2013).

He and his wife, Shelly, have four children.

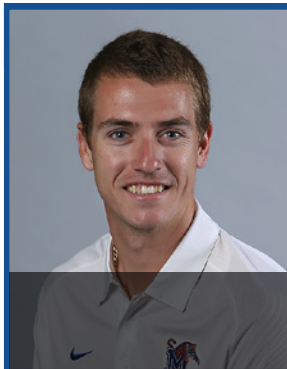

Chris Doerr joined the University of Memphis men's tennis staff as a volunteer assistant coach in August of 2012 and was promoted to the program's assistant coach in June of 2013.

The former Mississippi State netter was a four-year letterwinner for the Bulldogs and was named the SEC Player of the Week one time in his junior season. He also served as a volunteer assistant coach at Mississippi State for the 2010-11 season.

Hailing from Bromley, England, Doerr has ranked as high as number 11 in the English National Rankings and as high as #480 in the ITF Rankings. Back in England, he was a member of the State Championship Team for four years and was a state champion in singles and doubles and won a divisional title as the captain for the state team.

In his first season as the program's assistant coach, Doerr was an integral part of landing a signing

class that was ranked by TennisRecruiting.net as the #28 incoming class of 2014-15 freshmen in the country. That ranking does not include the Tigers' one junior college transfer that will join Memphis in the fall, ASA College's Tim Srkala, who capped his JC career the No. 5 ranked singles player in the country and part of the No. 3 ranked doubles team.

Doerr graduated from Mississippi State in 2010 with a degree in communications.

He and his wife, Rachel McLemore Doerr, married in August of 2012, and reside in Memphis with their dog Lily.

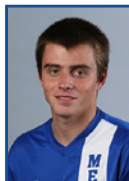

## 2014: SEASON IN REVIEW

### THIRD STRAIGHT NCAA APPEARANCE

It took 62 years for a Memphis men's tennis team to make the NCAA tournament field, but the Tigers have since made three straight with an at-large in to the NCAA tournament field in 2014.

Memphis advanced to the NCAA Second Round for a second consecutive season, downing Drake, 4-3, in the first round of the 2014 tournament before falling to host and No. 12 ranked Illinois.

### ITA HONORS FOR GOEBEL & SALISBURY

The Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA)'s Ohio Valley Region honored a pair of Tigers at the end of the 2014-15 season. Head coach Paul Goebel earned his first-ever career Coach of the Year honor from the region and senior Joe Salisbury added his first-ever on-court honor from the ITA, earning the Ohio Valley Most Improved Senior Award. Both are firsts for a Memphis tennis representative.

### PERSONAL INVITE TO NCAA DRAW

Seniors David O'Hare and Joe Salisbury became the first duo since the 1970s to punch a ticket to the NCAA Doubles draw.

The tandem was upended by the No. 26 ranked team of Russell Bader and Leonard Stakhovsky of Penn State in the first round to put an end to two stellar Tiger careers. The pair leaves Memphis ranked No. 1 (Salisbury, 97 wins) and No. 2 (O'Hare with 91 wins) in career doubles victories and became the first doubles players at Memphis to be named all-conference doubles for three seasons.

Junior Connor Glennon was also on the list for the NCAA Singles Championship. He was listed as the sixth alternate for the singles draw after spending all season in the national singles rankings.

### FOUR ALL-CONFERENCE AWARDS

Four American Athletic Conference post season honors had the words University of Memphis on them. Senior Joe Salisbury earned two honors, being named to the All-Conference singles and doubles teams. David O'Hare also was named to the all-conference doubles team and junior Connor Glennon was named all-conference in singles. Glennon becomes the first player in school history to earn two first-team, all-conference honors, while O'Hare and Salisbury become the first players in school history to be named to three different all-conference teams.

### PRESENCE IN THE POLLS

The Tigers spent the entire season among the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) team rankings, with a season-best ranking of No. 18 (Jan. 29, Feb. 8).

Memphis ended the year in the top 25 for a second straight season, ranking No. 21 in the country in the final poll of the 2013-14 season.

Memphis has had five different entries earn national rankings during the year.

Junior Connor Glennon has been ranked all year in singles play, and is currently ranked No. 64 in the country heading in to the NCAA tournament.

Joe Salisbury was ranked in singles for six weeks, with a season-best ranking of No. 56 (Jan. 2). Fellow senior Johnny Grimal was also ranked in that Jan. 2 poll at No. 87.

In doubles, Memphis has had two ranked entries. The No. 1 doubles team has been ranked all season, peaking at No. 3 in the Jan. 2nd ranking.

In the pre-season rankings, the tandem of Grimal and David O'Leary was also ranked No. 54, but with the arrival of Ian Chadwell to the roster, Grimal was paired with Chadwell instead during the spring season.

### THIRD STRAIGHT CONFERENCE FINAL

Memphis made its third straight appearance in a conference final in 2014, advancing to the championship game, where they fell 4-3 to USF.

Memphis won the Conference USA Championship final in 2013 and finished as the runner up in 2012.

### RANKED FOES

Memphis has faced 15 ranked opponents in the spring dual season of 2014, sporting a 9-6 record.

The Tigers have faced seven top 25 ranked teams, picking up a road win at No. 25 Harvard and upending No. 25 USF, 4-3, in the regular season finale. The win over USF gave Memphis the top seed in the American Athletic Conference tournament and a first round bye in the tournament.

Included in that run of ranked opponents was a meeting with then-No. 43 ranked Drake at the San Diego Classic. Drake won that meeting 4-3 over the then-#34 ranked Tigers, but Memphis avenged the loss with a 4-3 win over No. 43 Drake in the NCAA First Round, Memphis' first win over Drake in five tries.

### FACING THE BRYAN BROTHERS

The Tigers' home facility, The Racquet Club of Memphis, hosts an ATP tour event each spring. The 2014 tournament was extra special for the Tigers, as seven of the eight members of the team received entries in to the qualifying draw of the National Indoor Championships.

Connor Glennon, Joe Salisbury and Johnny Grimal all won their first round qualifying matches before falling in the second round.

In doubles, the duo of Salisbury and David O'Hare received an at-large bid in to the main draw doubles and drew the former world No. 1 ranked Bryan Brothers. In front of a big crowd on the showcase court, the Tigers stood in with the Bryans, falling 6-4, 6-3.

### SENSATIONAL SENIORS

The senior class of 2014 has built quite a foundation for the Tigers' tennis program. Prior to their arrival in 2010, Memphis had not appeared in the national team rankings since 2006.

That changed when the team earned a national ranking of #58 on Jan. 4, 2011. The team spent six weeks in the national rankings with the freshman core in place. In their sophomore year, the Tigers broke in to the national rankings in their second week of the spring and have been ranked ever since, a stint of 47 straight periods of polls dating back to that 2011-12 season by the end of the 2013-14 season.

They helped Memphis to its highest-ever team ranking of #18 earlier this season (Jan. 29, Feb. 4).

### DAVIS CUP CALL

Senior men's tennis player David O'Hare answered the Davis Cup call for his native Ireland in January, becoming the first-ever Tiger to represent his home country in Davis Cup play.

O'Hare stayed with the Tigers for the ITA Kickoff Classic opening weekend, then winged his way to Minsk, Belarus, where he caught up with his Team Ireland teammates.

Playing in the doubles match on the second day of the weekend, O'Hare was teamed with James Cluskey and the duo played an epic four plus hour doubles match, coming up just short 6-7 (3), 7-6 (6), 5-7, 7-6 (8), 6-2.

### SHARING THE WEALTH

For the season, five different Tigers were recognized by the American Athletic Conference with their weekly/monthly awards.

Joe Salisbury was named Player of the Week two times by the American office (4/8/14, 2/5/14) also earning a player of the month award in the fall.

Salisbury shared that Player of the Month honor with David O'Hare after the duo won the ITA Ohio Valley Regional Doubles title.

David O'Leary became the first Tiger to win a Player of the week award in the spring (Jan. 28).

Connor Glennon became the third Tiger of the spring to earn the award (3/25/14), and Johnny Grimal rounded out the four different weekly winners in the final week of the regular season (4/15/14).

### TAKING IT ON THE ROAD

Paul Goebel has been aggressive with the schedule he puts together for the Tigers each year. With no mandatory league play in the American Athletic Conference, that leaves Goebel with more dates to fill and he has done so by taking his Tigers around the country to face top-ranked opponents wherever he can.

In 2013-14, that has included stops in New York, California, Texas, Georgia and Florida.

Goebel also continues to include a fall Futures stop on the schedule in order for the Tigers to get experience on the professional tennis circuits' minor league for their post-collegiate aspirations.

### NEW FAN GRANDSTAND

The off-campus home of both the men's and women's tennis programs is continually being updated. That trend included some fan seating additions near the Tigers' six outdoor courts as a covered fan grandstand was added in between the three banks of hard courts.

### RANKED RECRUITING CLASS

With at least five seniors graduating following the completion of the May semester, the Tiger coaching staff had to hit the road recruiting. They signed a class that TennisRecruiting.net ranked as the No. 28 incoming freshman class for the 2014-15 season.

Memphis signed three players in the early signing period, signing Andrew Watson (Reigate, Great Britain), Kai Lemke (Trebur, Germany) and Shakeel Manji (Burton-Latimer, Great Britain).

The three early signees were joined in the late signing period by two other players. Ryan Peniston (Great Waking, Great Britain) will become the fourth freshman on the Tiger roster next fall and junior college transfer Tim Srkala (Brno, Czech Republic/ASA Junior College) comes to Memphis in the fall after spending two seasons in junior college tennis, where finished as the No. 5 ranked JC singles player and part of the No. 3 ranked doubles team in the year-end rankings. Srkala's addition was not figured in to the TennisRecruiting.net ranking.

### ITA CROWN

Seniors David O'Hare and Joe Salisbury became the first doubles team in school history to win an ITA Ohio Valley Conference doubles championship in October.

The win qualified the duo for the ITA National Indoor Championships, where the duo advanced to the Round of 16.

### UPENDING ITA #1 DOUBLES DUO

On their run to the ITA Ohio Valley Doubles title, O'Hare and Salisbury became the first players in school history to defeat the No. 1 ranked doubles team in the country, upsetting the Tennessee tandem of Mikelis Libietis and Hunter Reese, 8-4, to advance to the ITA Regional finals on the Tennessee's team's home court in Knoxville. Libietis and Reese would finish the 2013-14 season as the NCAA Doubles Champs.

### DEEP ITA ALL-AMERICAN RUN

The Tigers' duo of O'Hare and Salisbury became just the third duo in school history to appear in the ITA All-American main draw in doubles, but put together the deepest run in Memphis history, advancing to the quarterfinals before falling to the UCLA team of Marcos Giron and Mackenzie McDonald. In that run, the Tigers upset the No. 6 ranked Mississippi State team of Jordan Angus and Malte Stropp.

### NEW LEAGUE, NEW FOES

July 1, 2014 will mark a membership change. Louisville will be replaced by three teams, all of whom finished the 2013-14 season in the national team rankings -- No.

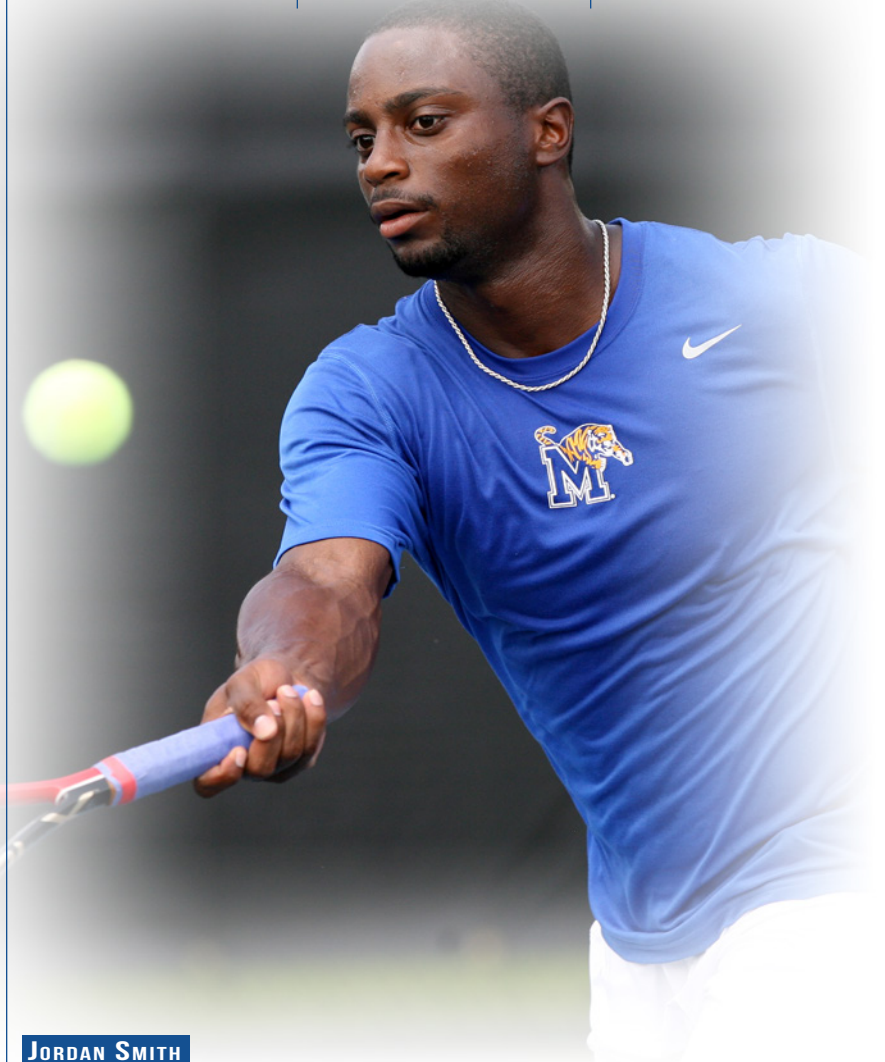

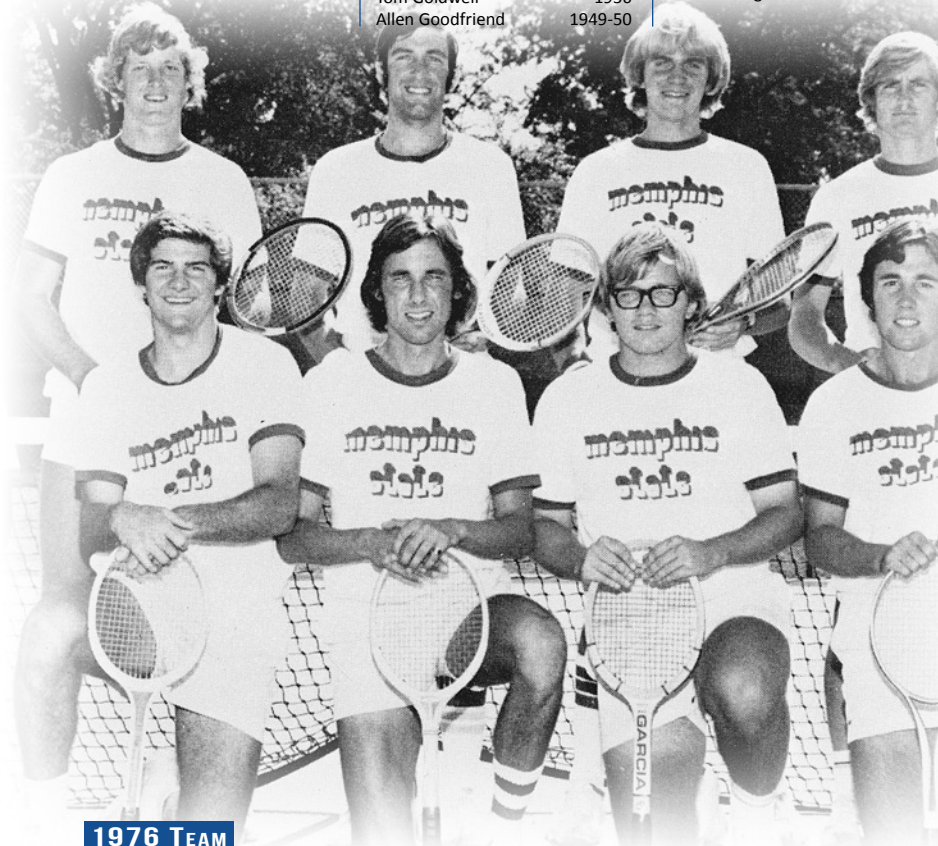

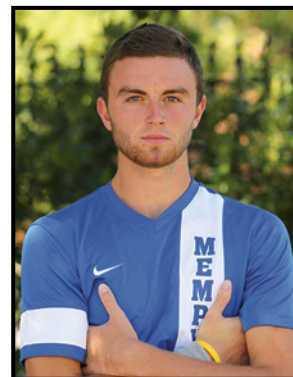
