### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Greg Ward Jr. • Jr. • QB • Houston • Tyler, Texas**

Ward had 334 yards of total offense and three touchdown passes (29, 22, 15) to lead Houston to a 34-31 win at Louisville. All three of his touchdown passes gave Houston a lead, including a 15-yard strike with 3:09 left in the fourth quarter which put the Cougars ahead for good. Ward completed 23 of 33 passes for 236 yards and had 98 rushing yards on 21 carries.



### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Tyler Matakevich • Sr. • LB • Temple • Stratford, Conn.**

Matakevich led a defensive effort that forced five turnovers as Temple took a 34-26 win at Cincinnati — the preseason favorite in The American. Matakevich finished with a game-high 13 tackles and had two second-half interceptions, including a pick in the end zone with 13 seconds left which clinched the win.



### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**Brandon Wilson • Jr. • CB • Houston • Shreveport, La.**

Wilson had 148 yards on four kickoff returns, including a 100-yard return for a touchdown in Houston's 34-31 win at Louisville. Wilson tied the game at 17-17 in the third quarter with his 100-yard play, which answered a Louisville field goal. He added eight tackles and one pass breakup on defense.



**Jahad Thomas • Jr. • RB • Temple • Elizabeth, N.J.**

Thomas set an American Athletic Conference record with 342 all-purpose yards, including 132 yards on kickoff returns, in Temple's 34-26 win at Cincinnati. He opened the third quarter with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and added 193 rushing yards and 17 receiving yards.

# AMERICAN NOTEBOOK

## Streaking

Memphis extended its winning streak to nine games with its win against Kansas — the Tigers' longest winning streak since 1969. The only teams with longer active winning streaks are Ohio State (15 games) and TCU (10 games). Navy take a five-game winning streak into Week 3.

## That's Offensive

Seven of the 12 American Athletic Conference teams have averaged at least 400 yards of total offense through two weeks of the season. Tulsa has averaged 609 yards of offense, while three other teams (Cincinnati, Memphis and Houston) have averaged at least 500 yards of offense.

## Paper Or Plastic?

Temple smashed the American Athletic Conference single-game record with 10 sacks in the Owls' season-opening win against Penn State. The Owls had just one sack against Cincinnati this past Saturday, but forced five Bearcat turnovers.

## Grand Totals

Temple LB Tyler Matakevich registered 117 tackles in his junior season, marking the third straight season in which he had at least 100 tackles. He is only the third player in Temple history with three straight 100-tackle seasons, joining Joe Klecko (1974-96) and Steve Conjar (1979-81).

## A Man With A Purpose

Temple RB Jahad Thomas set an American Athletic Conference record with 342 all-purpose yards in the Owls' win against Cincinnati. Thomas rushed for 193 yards, had 17 receiving yards and had 132 yards on kickoff returns.

## Eyeballs

Temple and Cincinnati opened their 2015 seasons in front of record crowds. The Owls drew 69,176 at Lincoln Financial Field for their win against Penn State, while the Bearcats had an on-campus record 39,095 on hand at the newly renovated Nippert Stadium for their win against Alabama A&M. Memphis (41,730) and East Carolina (40,712) also had crowds of more than 40,000 for their respective season-openers.

## Pick Plays

Houston S Adrian McDonald and UConn S Andrew Adams have both registered interceptions in each of their first two games.

## Veteran Presence

Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo, who enters his eighth year as the Midshipmen's head coach, has more head coaching experience than the other five West Division coaches combined (six years).

## Introductions

The American Athletic Conference West Division features three first-year head coaches. SMU is led by Chad Morris, who was formerly the offensive coordinator at Clemson and a highly successful high school coach in Texas. Houston hired Tom Herman, the former Ohio State offensive coordinator and the 2014 winner of the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant. Tulsa is led by Philip Montgomery, who was the offensive coordinator for Baylor's back-to-back Big 12 championship teams.

## To Be The Best

American Athletic Conference teams will play 11 games against teams ranked in the preseason top 25 polls. The American's nonconference slate includes games against preseason No. 2 TCU, No. 4 Baylor, No. 10 Florida State, No. 11 Notre Dame, No. 16 Georgia Tech, No. 17 Mississippi, No. 19 Oklahoma, No. 21 Stanford and No. 24 Missouri.



The first American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 5, 2015, at noon ET and will be televised nationally on either ABC or ESPN.

The 2015 season will be The American's first in its new 12-team, two-division format, in which each team will play eight conference games. Each team will face the other five teams in its own division as well as three teams from the other division.

The American's East Division includes UCF, Cincinnati, UConn, East Carolina, USF and Temple. The West Division lineup is Houston, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Tulane and Tulsa. The two divisional champions will meet in The American Championship at the home site of one of the participants.

The winner of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest-ranked team among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

## Divisional Champions

The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games — both divisional and non-divisional.

In the event of a two-team tie within a division, the head-to-head result between the tied teams will determine the divisional champion.

## Championship Site

The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion with the best record in conference games.

If the two divisional champions have the same conference record, then the regular-season head-to-head winner between the divisional champions would host the championship. If the divisional champions have the same conference record and did not play in the regular season, then the team with the better overall regular-season record would host the championship.

- QB Justin Holman was injured in the first quarter against Stanford and did not return. QB Bo Schneider and QB Tyler Harris both saw action of the bench.
- Holman saw a streak of 14 straight games with a touchdown pass come to an end.
- UCF used 53 players in the game against Stanford. Twenty-nine of those players were either freshmen (15), sophomores (10) or first-year transfers (four).

## NOTES

UConn is off to its first 2-0 start since the 2008 season, when the Huskies won their first five games of the year and finished 8-5 ... UConn was a 20-15 winner against Villanova, which is ranked No. 3 in this week's FCS poll, and took a 22-17 decision against Army last Saturday ... The game at Missouri is the Huskies' first road date of the season ... Through two games, UConn ranks third in The American in both scoring defense (16.0 ppg) and total defense (284.0 ypg) ... The top defensive player has been S Andrew Adams, who is second on the team with 11 tackles and has registered an interception in each of the first two games ... Adams has an interception in four of UConn's last five games, dating to last season ... DE Folorunso Fatukisai has a team-high two sacks, while DE Junior Joseph leads the team with 14 tackles ... # COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

## Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

## Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, comparative outcomes of common opponents and other factors.

## Two Days

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day belong to college football, with two semifinal games and four other top bowl games continuing a wonderful tradition. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

## Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

## Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

## Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Jeff Long (chair), Barry Alvarez, Mike Gould, Pat Haden, Kirby Hocutt, Tom Jernstedt, Bobby Johnson, Tom Osborne, Dan Radakovich, Condoleezza Rice, Mike Tranchese, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

## Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

## Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings..

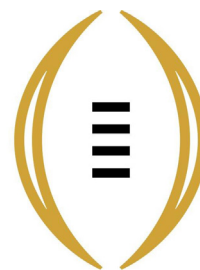

# BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The Miami Beach Bowl was played for the first time in 2014 at state-of-the-art Marlins Park in Miami, which sits on the site of the historic Orange Bowl stadium. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year, beginning with last year's matchup against Brigham Young. Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference and the Sun Belt Conference are scheduled for future years, though institutions from other conferences also will have the opportunity to participate.

The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The Birmingham Bowl takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The St. Petersburg Bowl is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The Hawaii Bowl is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West Conference.

The Boca Raton Bowl is a new game that will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2015.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl will debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The Popeye's Bahamas Bowl is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference in 2016 and Conference USA in 2018.

The R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tennessee, the Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, and the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.

# THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The 2015 football season will be the second under the American Athletic Conference's comprehensive television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports.

The new arrangements began with the 2013-14 basketball season and will be in place through the 2019-20 academic year. The contracts provide for unprecedented exposure on two of the industry leaders in sports television.

In football, the contract calls for all conference-controlled games — which encompasses all conference games and home nonconference games — to be televised. Nearly 90 percent of those games will be carried on either national broadcast or national cable platforms.

In addition to contracted games on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPNNews, American Athletic Conference teams will regularly appear on CBS Sports Network through a sublicensing agreement with ESPN.

Additional nonconference games will be available on ESPN3 — ESPN's live multi-screen sports network, giving fans an online destination that delivers thousands of global sports events annually. It is accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 and Xbox One. The network is currently available to more than 99 million homes at no additional cost to fans who receive their high-speed Internet connection or video subscription from an affiliated service provider. The network is also available at no cost to approximately 21 million U.S. college students and U.S.-based military personnel via computers, smartphones and tablets connected to on-campus educational and on-base military broadband and Wi-Fi networks.

ESPN, Inc., is the world's leading multinational, multimedia sports entertainment company featuring a portfolio of more than 50 multimedia sports assets. The company is comprised of eight U.S. 24-hour television networks and five HD simulcast services. Based in Bristol, Connecticut, ESPN is 80-percent owned by ABC, Inc., which is an indirect subsidiary of The Walt Disney Company. The Hearst Corporation holds a 20 percent interest in ESPN.

CBS Sports Network is available to 100 million homes and may be seen on a digital basic cable package in all American Athletic Conference markets. Talent for The American's weekly game on CBS Sports Network includes Dave Ryan on play-by-play, Corey Chavous as the analyst and Lauren Gardner as the reporter.
