FALCONS WELCOME MEMPHIS TO THE DOYT FOR HOME OPENER

Following a 48-27 win at Maryland last week, the Bowling Green State University football team will finally get an opportunity to play in front of their home crowd when they welcome the Memphis Tigers to town for a showdown with the 2014 American Athletic Conference champions. Memphis is coming off a 55-23 win at Kansas last week, after defeating Missouri State 63-7 in week one.

A WIN AGAINST MEMPHIS WOULD...

- Mark the seventh straight season that the Falcons have won a home opener at Doyt L. Perry Stadium
- Make the Falcons 2-0 all-time against Memphis, as BGSU also defeated them in the 2004 GMAC Bowl
- Be the third straight season in which the Falcons have had a 2-1 record in the first three games

FALCON FACTS FROM THE WIN OVER MARYLAND

- The Falcons win at Maryland marks the second straight season that BGSU and the 10th straight season the MAC has defeated a Big Ten Conference program.
- The road win over a Power Five Conference opponent marks the first since a 2008 win at Pittsburgh for the Falcons.
- Bowling Green had 692 yards of total offense compared to Maryland's 341. The 692 total yards were the most in the Dino Babers' era and just 14 yards shy of the school record.
- •The Falcons ran 105 plays on Saturday against Maryland, the third time in the Babers era that the Falcons have run over 100 plays in a game.
- Matt Johnson's 491 passing yards were the second-most in school history. It was the first time in school history that a Falcon quarterback has thrown for more than 400 yards in back-to-back games and just the second time in school history (also 1983) that a QB has thrown for 400+ yards twice in a season.
- Johnson passed for six touchdowns on Saturday at Maryland, tying the school record for most in a game.
- Roger Lewis had 15 catches for 200 yards on Saturday, including two touchdowns. The 15 catches were one shy of his career high and were tied for sixth-most in school history for a single game. His 200 yards receiving were fifth-most in school history. The two touchdown grabs tied his career high.
- Robbie Rhodes caught two passes for 108 yards and a touchdown. The receptions, yards and TDs were all the first of his career.
- After falling behind 13-6 at halftime, Bowling Green outscored the Terrapins 42-14 the rest of the way.
- Fred Coppet went over 100 yards in the game, carrying it 15 times for 109 yards.
- Ronnie Moore (18), Ryan Burbrink (17) and Roger Lewis (16) all extended their streaks for consecutive games with a reception on Saturday.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for working press credentials should be made to the BGSU Athletic Communications Office, addressed to the attention of Scott Swegan. Requests should be made at least one week in advance. Late requests will be honored if space is available, but parking cannot be guaranteed for requests less than one week in advance. Scouts and non-working media will be seated if space is available.

WEEKLY INFORMATION

Media members can access BGSU information via the internet at <u>BGSUFalcons.com</u>. Weekly game notes and statistics will be updated regularly. A PDF version of releases and statistics can be e-mailed to those outlets which would prefer to receive this information on a regular basis. Please notify Scott Swegan if you would like to be put on our primary media e-mail list.

MAC TELECONFERENCE

Coach Babers will be available each Monday during the regular season on the weekly MAC Teleconference (10:50-11:00 a.m., Eastern). To join this MAC Teleconference please contact the MAC at 216-466-5622 and ask for Ken Mather.

WEEKLY PRESSER

Coach Babers will hold a weekly media press conference each week in the Wilcox Board Room on the third floor of the Sebo Athletic Center. All members of the media are welcome to attend. Out-of-town media should contact Scott Swegan to schedule a phone interview with Coach Babers or players at least one day in advance. All phone interviews need to be completed by *Wednesday evening*. Audio and video of each weekly press conference will be available at BGSUFalcons. com shortly after the completion of the press conference.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All interviews with members of the team should be coordinated through the BGSU Athletic Communications office. Players will be made available following practice on Tuesday and Wednesday. Please allow at least 24 hours to set up interviews with players. Arrangements will be made for telephone and in-person interviews at a time that is mutually agreeable to the reporter/broadcaster and the student-athlete.

PARKING

A special media parking lot is located adjacent to Doyt Perry Stadium, near Cochrane Field. Access to the media lot is by Stadium Drive which is accessible off of Mercer Road. Admission to the media lot is restricted to people holding the correct credential acquired from the athletic communications office. All media members are asked to enter the stadium through the press gate (Gate 2) at the southwest corner of the stadium.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

At Home: Coach Babers and BGSU players will be available for post-game interviews in the Sentinel-Tribune Room located between the two locker rooms, following the normal cooling-off period. BGSU observes a closed locker room policy. The Sentinel-Tribune Room is on the east side of the stadium (opposite the press box), and can be entered through the tunnels at either the north or south end. On the road: Coach Babers and requested players will be made available in a designated media room or just outside the locker room following the normal cooling-off period.

PRESS GATE

The press gate (Gate 2) at Doyt L. Perry Stadium is at the southwest corner of the stadium, a short walk from the media parking lot. Late credential requests will be available for pickup at Gate 2 on game day.

MEDIA FIELD POLICY

A general media pass will allow you access to the field during pre-game warmups and during the final five minutes of the fourth quarter only. Field access at other times will be limited to working photographers and television reporters. **No interviews may be conducted on the field and any attempt to do so may lead to the loss of your media pass.**

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photo passes for newspaper photographers, television videographers and, under special circumstances, for free-lance photographers, are available from the athletic communications office. Photo passes entitle the photographer access to the sideline, the post-game press conference room and the press box.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Members of the media will be provided with game programs, flip cards, current statistics and last-minute pregame notes prior to the start of the game. Statistical summaries will include play-by-play, quarter stats, halftime stats, complete team and individual stats and tackles. The BGSU Press Box does have a wireless internet connection for all members of the media.

RADIO

Requests for permission to broadcast must be made in writing. Space will be made available for the official visiting radio station and student radio station on request. There is space in each booth for four persons. Phone lines can be ordered through Steve Messenger (smessen@bgsu.edu).

LIVE STREAMING

Live streaming of BGSU football practices or games is not permitted. The use of Periscope and Meerkat is prohibited while covering BGSU Football, unless prior permission is obtained from the BGSU Athletic Communications staff.

HEAD COACH DINO BABERS



Dino Babers will begin his second year as head football coach at Bowling Green State University in 2015. He was introduced as the 18th coach in school history on December 18, 2013, and has been a head coach for three seasons.

"Coach Babers and his staff have done a great job with our football program during his first year, and we expect that they will continue to take the program to new heights during year two," Director of Athletics D. Christopher Kingston said. "Winning eight games, the MAC East Division, a bowl game at BGSU for the first time since 2004, and defeating a Big Ten team for the first time since 2007 headline the most notable accomplishments during his first season. This is an exciting time to honor the past and create the future for BGSU and Falcon Football, and we can't wait for the 2015 season to get underway."

In his first season at Bowling Green, Babers and his Falcon football program achieved several notable milestones. Bowling Green finished the season 8-6 overall, winning the inaugural Raycom Media Camellia Bowl over South Alabama to cap off the season

For the second consecutive season, BGSU went undefeated against MAC East Division competition, on their way to their second straight divisional championship and back-to-back appearances in the MAC Championship Game. 2014 also marked the third season in a row that Bowling Green has played in a bowl game – the second-longest active streak in the Mid-American Conference.

Bowling Green had several notable wins during Babers' first season on the sideline, including a thrilling 45-42 victory over Indiana on Sept. 13, 2014 at Doyt L. Perry Stadium. The win marked BG-SU's first-ever at home against a Big Ten Conference opponent, and was the first over a Big Ten team since 2007. It also marked the first victory over a Power Five Conference opponent since 2008.

Under Babers, the Bowling Green offense flourished for much of the season. One such notable performance came from true freshman wide receiver Roger Lewis, who became the first freshman in school history to surpass 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Despite losing starting quarterback, and consensus preseason player of the year, Matt Johnson in week one, BGSU's offense featured three wide outs with more than 50 catches and six total receivers with 20-or-more receptions. They were one of three schools in the nation to achieve that feat.

Babers has more than 30 years of coaching experience, including a 27-13 record as a head coach. In 2013, Babers led Eastern Illinois to a 12-2 record, a No. 2 national ranking, and a quarterfinal appearance in the FCS playoffs. The Panthers outscored their opponents 675-319. Upon his arrival at EIU, Babers took a Panthers team, which had finished in last place in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2011, and led them to a first-place finish in 2012 with a

6-1 league mark. It was just the fourth time in OVC history in which a team had gone from worst-to-first in a single season. For his efforts, he was named Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year in each of the past two years.

During his two seasons at EIU, Babers led the best offense in all of FCS. The Panthers led the nation in yards per game (589.5) and points per game (48.2) in 2013. In addition, EIU averaged 372.4 yards per game through the air and 217.1 yards per game on the ground.

Under the guidance of Babers, quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named the Walter Payton Award winner, the FCS equivalent of the Heisman Trophy — given to the nation's best player. Garoppolo threw for 5,050 yards and 53 touchdowns in 2013. During his two seasons under Babers' guidance, he threw for 8,873 yards and 84 scores.

Babers, best-known for his offensive firepower, has proven to be an effective defensive coach, as well. The Panthers were in the top 30 nationally in scoring defense, red zone defense, and passing defense efficiency. They are also one of the most prolific defenses in the all of FCS at forcing turnovers, as they are sixth in the nation with a plus-14 turnover margin. EIU forced 37 turnovers on the year and ranks first in the country with 23 fumbles recovered.

Both Garoppolo and wide receiver Erik Lora were named the best at their position by the FCS Athletic Directors Association. Lora followed up his record breaking 2012 season (in which he was named OVC Player of the Year) by catching 123 passes for 1,554 yards and 19 touchdowns in 14 games. The 123 catches were the second-most in FCS history, trailing only the record-setting 136 catches he had in 2012. The 1,544 yards were the second-most in OVC history (behind only his record of 1,664 set last year) and 15th in FCS history. His 19 receiving touchdowns were the most in OVC history as were his 35 career receiving touchdowns.

Under Babers, Eastern Illinois' offense used the talents of more than just one receiver as four wideouts had at least 700 yards and eight touchdowns this year. Adam Drake joined Lora with over 1,000 yards in 2013, as he caught 85 passes for 1,305 yards and 13 touchdowns. In addition to the aerial assault, EIU featured a dynamic rushing attack. As a team, the Panthers had 35 rushing touchdowns and featured two backs who had big years. Shepard Little rushed for 1,551 yards and 15 touchdowns on the season, while Taylor Duncan had 988 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Eastern Illinois, Babers spent four seasons at Baylor under Art Briles from 2008-11. During his time in Waco, he served as the special teams coordinator, recruiting coordinator, and outside receivers coach, coaching NFL stars such as Robert Griffin III, Kendall Wright, and Josh Gordon. Prior to that, he spent four seasons at UCLA as an assistant head coach, recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach. His other coaching stints have included stops at Pittsburgh, Texas A&M, Arizona, San Diego State, Purdue, Northern Arizona, Nevada, Eastern Illinois, Arizona State, and Hawaii.

More impressively, Babers has mentored 27 receivers who have played in the NFL, and several other top draft picks. Among the players who have been coached by Babers, six of them were drafted in the first two rounds. The Tennessee Titans drafted wide receiver Kendall Wright in the first round, while running back Trung Candidate was a first round pick by the St. Louis Rams in 2000. Four others—wide receivers Brian Alford, Will Blackwell, Dennis Northcutt and Josh Gordon—were taken in the second round.

Babers was a four-year starter at the University of Hawaii, Academic All-WAC, and captain his senior year. He is married to his wife Susan. They have four daughters—Breeahnah, Tasha, Jazzmin, and Paris.

HEAD COACH DINO BABERS

- Dino Babers is in his second season at the helm of the Orange and Brown, and his fourth season overall as a head coach. He has a career record of 28-14 and has won a championship in all three seasons thus far.
- Babers has impressed in his Bowling Green tenure thus far, winning eight games in his first season. In those eight wins were a victory over a Big Ten foe (Indiana), a MAC East Division championship, and Bowling Green's first bowl win since the 2004 season.
- The Falcons are off to a strong start in 2015, scoring 30 points against No. 25 Tennessee before racking up 692 yards and 48 points in a road victory over Maryland.

MATTY J LEADING THE NCAA

- Matt Johnson, a redshirt-senior from Harrisburg, Pa., leads the Football Bowl Subdivision in passing through two weeks of the 2015 college football season.
- Johnson has passed for 915 yards and eight touchdowns against Power Five opponents Tennessee and Maryland during the first two games, both on the road.
- After missing the last 13 games of the 2014 season, Johnson has returned to his 2013 form which saw him pass for 3,400 yards and earn Mid-American Conference Championship Game MVP honors when he threw for 393 yards and five TDs in a win over No. 12 Northern Illinois.

SUPER "11" - 11 JOHNSON-RELATED NOTES

- Matt Johnson currently leads the NCAA with 915 passing yards in two games. The next closest passer is 129 yards behind Johnson after two weeks.
- Johnson has eight passing touchdowns in two weeks, second-most in the country. He trails Baylor's Seth Russell by just one TD pass.
- Johnson became the first player in school history to pass for more than 400 yards in back-to-back games.
- In week one, Johnson passed for 424 yards, which was a career-high at the time.
- Johnson followed that performance up with 491 passing yards and six touchdowns last Saturday at Maryland.
- His 491 passing yards in week two were second-most in school-history, behind just Tyler Sheehan's 505 in 2009.
- Johnson's six TDs through the air tied a school-record, previously done just once in BGSU's 96-year football history.
- His consecutive 400-yard passing performances mark just the second time in school history that a quarterback has had multiple 400-yard passing games in a single season (1983).
- Just two weeks into his senior season, Johnson has passed for 4,814 career yards. He is looking to become just the eighth player in school history to reach the 6,000-yard mark for a career.
- With his eight TD passes already this season, the Bishop McDevitt graduate is just four TD tosses shy of moving into a tie for seventh in school history for career touchdowns through the air. Just six players have ever thrown 40 touchdown passes in their career. Johnson currently has 35 in his career.
- Prior to the 2015 season, Johnson's career-high for completions in a game was 25. In the first two weeks of the 2015 season, Johnson has completed 27 and 36 passes, respectively, against Tennessee and Maryland.

• True sophomore Roger Lewis (Pickerington, Ohio) had a monster day Saturday at Maryland. Take a look at Lewis' day by the numbers.

FALCON OFFENSE FINDING ANOTHER GEAR

- The Falcons' offense has been good in each of the past two seasons, but it is primed for greatness in 2015. The Falcons return every offensive starter from last season's team.
- In the first game of the season against No. 25 Tennessee, the Falcons racked up 557 yards of total offense.
- BGSU followed up that week one performance with 692 yards in week two on the

road at Maryland, just 14 yards shy of the school record. The Falcons scored 48 points in the win, tied for the most points in a game under Babers. It was the eighth time that Bowling Green has surpassed the 500-yard mark under Babers in just 16 games.

- During a six season stretch (2007-12), Bowling Green's offense had just 19 100-yard rushing performances. But, the Falcons have had nine such performances in each of the past two seasons (2013-14).
- 11 times last season a BGSU receiver had more than 100 yards receiving in a game, which tied a school record. During the 2012 & 2013 seasons, Bowling Green had just nine such performances.

- Bowling Green features one of the most experienced offensive line units in the entire country, and it showed on Saturday at Maryland. The OL unit has held their own against two Power Five defenses, helping the BGSU offense rack up 624.5 yards per game during the first two games.
- The Falcons' have 135 offensive line career starts on the roster, second-most in FBS football. Alex Huettel (43), Logan Dietz (30), Jacob Bennett (30), Tim McAuliffe (16), Ben Steward (14) and Ryan Hunter (2) make up the 135.
- Bowling Green was one of just nine schools in the entire country to start the same five players on the offensive line every game last season. The Falcons were joined by Fresno State, UL-Lafayette, Northern Illinois, Ohio State, Rutgers, Tulane, Wisconsin and Rice. BGSU is the only one of those nine that returns all five starters in 2015.

A B1G WIN FOR BGSU

- Saturday's win over Maryland marked the first time in school history that Bowling Green has defeated a Big Ten Conference opponent in back-to-back seasons.
- Last season, the Falcons beat Indiana 45-42 at Doyt L. Perry Stadium on Sept. 13. Nearly a year later, the Orange and Brown defeated Maryland on the road, 48-27.
- The Falcons will look to claim two wins over a Big Ten foe in a season for the first time since 2003, when they defeated both Purdue and Northwestern in the same campaign.

GIVING NEW MEANING TO #FALCONFAST

- Through the first two weeks of the season, the Bowling Green offense has run an astonishing 190 offensive plays an average of 95.0 plays per game.
- The 95.0 plays per game is most in the country through the first two weeks of the season. Duke is second in the country in plays per game at 89.0.
- Bowling Green has run 100 more plays this season than Texas, despite both having played two games. Texas has only run 90 offensive plays this season, while the Falcons are *averaging* 95.0.

FALCON CAPTAINS AGAINST MARYLAND

As is tradition under head coach Dino Babers, Bowling Green will have game captains for the 2015 season.

- Travis Greene (offense), Zach Colvin (defense) and Tyler Tate (special teams) represented the Falcons at midfield for the coin toss Saturday at Maryland.
- For the season-opener against Tennessee, Babers named Ryan Burbrink (offense), Darrell Hunter (defense) and Ronnie Moore (special teams) captains.

UNCHARTERED TERRITORY

- Bowling Green enters the week in unchartered territory by NCAA football standards. The Falcons currently have four receivers and two running backs who have over 1,000 career yards.
- Travis Greene is one of the select running backs in the nation with more than 2,500 rushing yards in his career. Greene enters the Memphis game with 2,652 career rushing yards, fourth-most in BGSU school history.
- Fred Coppet joins Greene with more than 1,000 career rushing yards, totaling 1,150 to date.
- Four receivers Ryan Burbrink, Ronnie Moore, Roger Lewis, and Chris Gallon have more than 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Burbrink leads the group with 1,695 career yards receiving. Moore has 1,411 and Lewis has 1,342 to follow up Burbrink.
- Gallon, after missing 18 games due to injury between 2013 and 2014, has returned this season. His eight yard reception on Saturday at Maryland put him over 1,000 career receiving yards. He currently sits at 1,005 yards.

WATCH LIST FALCONS

- Eight members of the 2015 Bowling Green football team were named to preseason watch lists, announced by the national College Football Awards Association over the summer.
- Ronnie Moore (Sanford, Fla.) was named to the Paul Hornung Watch List as one of the nation's most versatile players
- Tim McAuliffe (Lemont, Ill.) was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List as one of the country's best centers
- Tyler Tate (Carroll, Ohio) is on the Lou Groza Award Watch List as one of the best placekickers in the country
- Alex Huettel (Pickerington, Ohio) was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List as one of the best interior linemen in the nation
- Both Ryan Burbrink (Shady Side, Md.) and Roger Lewis (Pickerington, Ohio) were named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List as some of the country's best wide receivers
- Christian Piazza (Ann Arbor, Mich.) was named to the Wuerffel Trophy Preseason Watch List
- Travis Greene (Carol City, Fla.), one of the best running backs in school history, was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List

GREENE SET TO WRAP UP HISTORIC CAREER IN 2015

Redshirt senior Travis Greene is in his third season at running back for the Falcons in 2015, after coming to BGSU and playing wide receiver his first two years on campus. Greene has set the school record for most rushing yards in a season and nearly broke 1,000 yards a season ago despite missing two games because of injury. What will his third year bring? He is chasing several milestones in the Orange and Brown in 2015, including:

- Currently sits 4th all-time with 2,652 rushing yards...just 771 yards shy of the all-time career record currently held by Dave Preston (1973-76)
- Could become just the second Falcon player ever, behind Paul Miles, to lead Bowling Green in rushing in three consecutive seasons
- Comes into 2015 with 14 career 100-yard rushing games...the school record is 20 held by Dave Preston.

TURNER TURNING THE CORNER

• Senior safety Dernard Turner (Miami, Fla.) had one of the best games in his career at Maryland, turning in four tackles, one tackle for loss, and two interceptions. They were the first two interceptions of his career.

• Turner now has eight tackles this season, two tackles for loss, those two interceptions and a pass breakup.

MEAN TRENT GREENE

- Until the middle of August, Trent Greene was a walk-on player for the Falcons. Following one of BGSU's fall practice sessions, head coach Dino Babers announced that he was being placed on scholarship.
- Greene has shined from his outside linebacker position during the first two weeks, totaling 20 tackles to lead the Falcons.
- He has 2.5 tackles for loss through two games, second-most on the team.
- Against Tennessee, Greene had a career-high 12 tackles while following it up with eight on the road against Maryland.

FALCONS PUT #MACTION ON THE MAP

- On Saturday, the MAC got wins against the Big Ten (Bowling Green over Maryland), the SEC (Toledo over Arkansas), and last season's Conference USA champion (Ohio over Marshall).
- The MAC has now won a regular-season game against the Big Ten for 10 straight seasons the longest streak in MAC history and has 18 wins over 10 different Big Ten teams in that period. The MAC defeated an SEC opponent for the first time since 2004, when Ohio beat Kentucky.

FORMER FALCONS IN THE NFL

- Eight former Falcons were on preseason NFL rosters this season, including four who have played a significant role with NFL teams over the past several years.
- Chris Jones, a defensive lineman for the New England Patriots, played a huge part in the Super Bowl a season ago. The 2012 MAC Defensive Player of the Year, Jones has 79 tackles and 9.0 sacks in the last two years. He was placed on the PUP list to begin the 2015 season.
- Kory Lichtensteiger is the starting center for the Washington Redskins, having started 67 games for them since the 2010 season.
- Shaun Suisham is the placekicker for the Pittsburgh Steelers. Signed through the 2018 season and a captain, Suisham will miss the 2015 season with a torn ACL suffered in the preseason.
- Alex Bayer, after playing last season with the St. Louis Rams, was picked up by the San Diego Chargers and will begin the season on the practice squad.
 Jude Adjei-Barimah (Tampa Bay Bucs) and Gabe Martin (Arizona Cardinals) are signed to their respective practice squads, while Kendall Montgomery (Miami) and D.J. Lynch (New England) were in preseason camps.

KNOWLEDGE IS POWER

• Bowling Green and Memphis have met just one time prior to Saturday's matchup, with the Falcons taking home a 52-35 victory in the GMAC Bowl in Ladd-Peebles Stadium in Mobile, Ala.

FALCONS ON NATIONAL TV THIS SEASON

- The Orange and Brown are currently scheduled to appear on National TV seven times this season, with every game expected to be broadcast to a national audience.
- With the announcement of the Mid-American Conference's deal with ESPN last season, every MAC game and home Falcon game will be, at a minimum, carried on ESPN3.com.
- The season opener at Tennessee was carried on the SEC Network, while last week's matchup at Maryland was aired on the Big Ten Network.
- After an American Sports Network/ESPN3 broadcast against Memphis in the home opener this week, the Falcons will travel to Purdue in a game that will be carried on the Big Ten Network.
- All MAC games will be shown on ESPN3, while the Ohio (ESPN2), Western Michigan (ESPN2 or ESPNU), Toledo (ESPN2 or ESPNU) and Ball State (ESPNU or ESPN3) games are expected to be available on National TV.

TRIO OF FALCON RECEIVERS ARE STREAKING

- Three Bowling Green receivers have all caught passes in at least 16 consecutive games dating back, in two cases, to the 2013 season.
- Ronnie Moore leads the trio with a reception in 18 straight games. He had eight receptions for 79 yards in Saturday's win over Maryland.
- Sure-handed Ryan Burbrink has caught a pass in 17 consecutive games dating back to the MAC Championship in 2013. Burbrink had four receptions for 39 yards and touchdown in his homecoming last weekend.
- Roger Lewis also has an impressive streak going, having caught a pass in all 15 6career games he has played in. He caught 15 passes for a career-high 200 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday's win.

HEAD COACHES ON THE RISE

- During the month of June, Athlon Sports named several head coaches who were rising stars in the profession. In just his fourth season as a head coach, Dino Babers made the list.
- Babers is 27-13 in his three year career as a head coach, including an 8-6 record during his first season on the sideline at Bowling Green.
- Despite losing his starting quarterback in the season opener last year, the Falcons still managed to claim the MAC East Division and win the inaugural Camellia Bowl over South Alabama.

FLORIDA FALCONS FLOCKING NORTH

- Bowling Green has made a habit of recruiting the talent-rich state of Florida in recent years. The 2015 roster is expected to feature 18 players from the Sunshine State.
- The Falcons have especially had luck recruiting Dwyer High School in the Palm Beach, Fla. area. Four players Darrell Hunter, Mike Minns, Malik Brown, and Clint Stephens on the 2015 roster are graduates of Dwyer.
- The four players from one high school are tied with Washington (South Bend, Ind.) and Pickerington Central for most on the team.

SIX FALCONS MAKE FIRST CAREER STARTS AGAINST TENNESSEE

- Six members of the BGSU football team made their first career start in the Orange and Brown on Saturday against nationally-ranked Tennessee.
- On the offensive side of the ball, Ryan Hunter (LG) and Derek Lee (TE) got the start.
- On the defensive side, Mike Minns (NT), Terrance Bush (DE), Trenton Greene (OLB) and Eilar Hardy (S) started their first career games for the Falcons.

#PROTECTTHEDOYT

- After two difficult road games to open the 2015 season, the Falcon football team finally gets a chance to play in front of their home crowd Saturday when they host Memphis.
- Bowling Green is 35-12-2 all-time in home openers at Doyt L. Perry Stadium and has won six consecutive home openers dating back to the 2009 season.
- 2010 was the last time the home opener came as late as week three of the season.

MAC/NCAA LEADERS

- The 2015 Falcons have several MAC and NCAA leaders on the roster, and are also leading in several team categories.
 - Matt Johnson is first in passing yards (915) and second in both passing TDs (8) and completions per game (31.5).
 - Dernard Turner is seventh in the nation and first in the MAC with two interceptions.
 - Roger Lewis is eighth in the country with 249 receiving yards.
 - As a team, the Falcons are third in scoring offense (39.0), first in total offense (624.5), first in passing defense (462.0), first in first downs offense (29.5), third in time of possession (32:03), and second in turnover margin (+2).

SEEING DOUBLE AT BGSU

- The 2015 roster features two sets of brothers on the team in Travis/Trenton Greene and Gehrig/Nolan Dieter.
- Many fans know Travis Greene, who sits fourth all-time in career rushing yards at BGSU. His brother, Trenton, was recently awarded a scholarship and made his first career start on Saturday against Tennessee, racking up a career-best 12 tackles.
- For the Dieters, both transferred to BGSU after starting their careers somewhere else. Gehrig began his career at SMU, but transferred and has been at Bowling Green for three seasons. On Saturday against No. 25 Tennessee, Dieter caught seven passes for a career-high 133 yards. Nolan, a redshirt-senior, is a quarterback on the Falcons roster.

RHODES FINDS PAYDIRT

- Robbie Rhodes (Fort Worth, Texas) was one of the most-coveted wide receiver prospects out of Southwest High School when he enrolled at Baylor in 2013.
- Rhodes has now found a home in Bowling Green after transferring from Baylor, and recorded his first career catches in Saturday's win at Maryland.
- Both of Rhodes' two catches went for big plays, as he totaled 108 receiving yards and a touchdown in the win.

TRENDING TOWARDS 100

- In the first season of Dino Babers' #FalconFast offense at Bowling Green, the Falcons had 11 receiving and nine rushing performances of 100-or-more yards. The 11 receiving games tied a school record for most in a season, while the nine rushing efforts was just two shy of the school record.
- After just two weeks, the Falcons are trending towards breaking both of those marks. The BGSU offense has three 100-yard receiving performances and a 100-yard rushing performance already this season.
- The four total 100-yard performances have come from four different players so far during the first two weeks of the 2015 season.
