SETTING THE SCENE

- The University of Memphis football team will host Tulane on Friday, Oct. 13 at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium. The game will be broadcast nationally on ESPN starting at 6 p.m.
- On Saturday, Sept. 30, the Tigers rallied back from an early, 17-0 deficit to beat Boise State, 35-32.
- The Tigers (54) rank in a tie for fourth in the FBS in home wins since 2014, trailing only Clemson (62), Alabama (61) and Ohio State (58).
- Memphis has posted 82 victories since 2014, tying for 15th-most in the nation during that stretch.
- The 82 wins are the most among American Athletic Conference schools during that span.
- The Tigers have forced at least one turnover in 19 of their last 23 games, piling up 42 takeaways over that span.
- Memphis is one of nine teams in the FBS with nine or more consecutive bowl-game appearances along with Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Wisconsin and Mississippi State.

SCOUTING TULANE

- Tulane moved to 4-1 on the season and to 1-0 in conference play with a 35-23 home victory over UAB on Saturday, Sept. 30.
- The Green Wave have won three games in a row since starting the season 1-1. Tulane's lone loss on the year came at home to then-ranked No. 20 Ole Miss.
- In 2022, Tulane had a memorable season, winning the AAC Championship and finishing the season with a 12-2 mark after defeating No. 10/8/8 USC in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl, 46-45.
- Prior to this season, the Green Wave was picked to finish atop the AAC once again, earning 20 of the 34 first-place votes of the media.
- Tulane ranks ninth in the FBS in rushing defense (84.2), 12th in team sacks (3.4), 16th in turnovers gained (11) and 19th in passes intercepted (7).

INSIDE THE SERIES

- Friday's game between Memphis and Tulane will mark the 40th meeting between the two programs dating back to 1954.
- The Tigers lead the overall series, 24-14-1, including a mark of 15-2 in Memphis.
- The two teams have alternated wins over the last six meetings dating back to the 2017 season, with each squad winning at home.
- Last season, the Tigers fell behind the Green Wave, 35-0, at halftime, but battled back in the second half, out-scoring Tulane, 28-3. The Green Wave withstood the charge, winning 38-28.

Ryan Silverfield became the 25th head coach in Memphis football history in December 2019 and began his tenure by leading the Tigers into their first major bowl game appearance: the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Dallas.

In naming Silverfield, the Tigers hired from within. Silverfield served as deputy head coach and offensive line coach during the 2019 season as the Tigers won their first outright conference title in 50 years. Memphis won

the 2019 American Athletic Conference championship with a 29-24 win over Cincinnati at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium.

Silverfield also was part of Memphis staffs that led the program to three-straight American Athletic Conference West Division crowns from 2017-19 and four-straight bowl appearances from 2016-19. Behind Silverfield's contributions, Memphis won 38 games during those four seasons, including going 10-3 in 2017 and 12-1 in 2019. He is the only member of the staff to be part of both 10-plus win seasons.

Under Silverfield's leadership in 2022, Memphis defeated Utah State, 38-10, in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl, becoming the first head coach in program history to earn back-to-back bowl titles. Silverfield's 21 wins are tied for the second-most of any Memphis head coach through three seasons and rank him fifth among the 24 coaches hired in 2020 nationally. Only he and Sam Pittman of Arkansas have won two bowl titles from that group.

Individually, six Tigers earned All-AAC accolades in 2022, led by first-team honorees defensive back Quindell Johnson and kicker Chris Howard. Tight end Caden Prieskorn and linebacker Xavier "Zay" Cullens earned second-team All-AAC accolades, while defensive lineman Jaylon Allen and defensive back Davion Ross were named Honorable-Mention All-AAC.

In 2021, Silverfield led the Tigers to the program's eighth-straight bowl game, extending the longest bowl streak of any non-Power 5 team in the country. Memphis was named EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl Champions after Hawai'i was unable to participate.

Silverfield's 14 wins in his first two seasons at the helm of the Tigers are tied for the second-most in program history and also rank him tied for fifth for most victories among all FBS second-year head coaches.

Individually, true freshman quarterback Seth Henigan had a record-breaking season, earning FWAA Freshman All-America honors. The Denton, Texas native completed 235-of-393 passes for 3,322 yards, 25 touchdowns and eight interceptions. His 3,322 passing yards shattered the school's freshman record previously held by Paxton Lynch in 2013 (2056) and rank sixth

overall on the program's single-season list. His 25 touchdowns are tied for the seventh-most in school history.

Wide receiver Calvin Austin III was unanimously chosen by the AAC coaches to the first team, one of just three players to be unanimously selected. Joining Austin III on the All-AAC First Team are tight end Sean Dykes, offensive lineman Dylan Parham and linebacker JJ Russell. The four first-team honorees are the most for Memphis since the program had six in 2017. Earning second-team all-conference accolades for the Tigers are defensive lineman John Tate IV and defensive back Quindell Johnson.

In his first full season at the helm of the program in 2020, Silverfield led the Tigers to the team's first bowl victory since 2014, a 25-10 win over Florida Atlantic in the Montgomery Bowl, becoming the first head coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first year.

Silverfield guided Memphis to an 8-3 record on the season, setting the program record for winning percentage (.727) by a first-year head coach, while also matching the school mark for most wins in a debut year (Mike Norvell, 2016). For his efforts, he was named the 2020 Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA) Coach of the Year.

On the field, Memphis ranked 22nd in the nation in total offense (453.1) and finished 17th in the country in both passing offense (307.9) and first down offense (260). Defensively, the Tigers were 13th in turnovers gained (20), 17th in passes intercepted (12) and 19th in red zone defense (.744).

Quarterback Brady White capped his incredible career at Memphis by winning the 31st William V. Campbell Trophy, which is presented to the college football player with the best combination of academics, community service and on-field performance. White was also a First-Team Senior CLASS Award All-American, one of nine semifinalists for the Wuerffel Trophy and a top-15 candidate for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.

Five players earned honors from the American Athletic Conference following the season, with wide receiver Calvin Austin III and defensive lineman O'Bryan Goodson being named to the first team. Defensive back Quindell Johnson was named to the second team, while both tight end Sean Dykes and defensive lineman Morris Joseph earned All-AAC Honorable-Mention accolades.

During the 2019 season, Silverfield developed a young offensive line that returned only two starters from 2018. One of starters -- Dustin Woodard -- moved to center as a regular for the first time in his collegiate career. Silverfield molded a line that blocked for the fourth-best offense in program history (6,249 yards) and the program's third-best scoring offense (527 points).

Two of Silverfield's linemen received all-conference accolades in 2019. Woodard was named to the All-American Athletic Conference second team and Dylan Parham earned all-league honorable mention recognition. Silverfield's line blocked for Kenneth Gainwell, The American's Rookie of the Year and the program's fifth 1,000-yard rusher all-time (1,425 yards), and for all-league second team performers in quarterback Brady White, wide receivers Damonte Coxie and

Antonio Gibson, and tight end Joey Magnifico. White had more than 3,000 yards passing and Coxie posted more than 1,000 yards receiving, both for a second-straight campaign. After the season, Woodard was a seventh round draft selection in the 2020 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots.

Silverfield served as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2018, overseeing the team's most consistent unit with all five starters playing every game. One year after blocking for an offense that featured consensus All-American wide receiver Anthony Miller and set a school record for passing touchdowns, the offensive line spent the 2018 season in the trenches blocking for the program's first unanimous All-American in running back Darrell Henderson. During the 2018 season, Memphis set school records for total yards, points scored and rushing touchdowns. In 2017, they set the standard for passing touchdowns.

Collectively, Silverfield's 2018 unit was one of 10 semifinalists for the Joe Moore Award, given to the best offensive line in college football. For his role leading the offensive line, Silverfield was named one of six finalists for the offensive line coach of the year award sponsored by FootballScoop. Silverfield also was recognized as one of the top recruiters in his time at Memphis. In 2017, he was ranked the fourth-best recruiter in *The American* by 247sports.com.

A 2018 Frank Broyles Award candidate, Silverfield first came to Memphis in 2016 with more than 18 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and NFL levels. He remains the only coach to have worked with an NCAA single-season rushing leader and an NFL single-season rushing leader. At UCF, Silverfield helped tutor Kevin Smith when the junior back led college football with 2,567 yards in 2007. Five seasons later in 2012, Silverfield was at Minnesota, where the Vikings' offensive line paved the way for Adrian Peterson's 2,097-yard season.

Just prior to coming to Memphis, Silverfield spent the last half of the 2015 football campaign with the NFL's Detroit Lions. In a mid-season staff shake-up, the Lions brought in Silverfield as an assistant offensive line coach, and the hire paid immediate dividends. His tenure with the Lions was Silverfield's second stint in the NFL.

Before Silverfield's arrival, the Lions had a 2-7 record in the three games before he came on board, Detroit's offensive line allowed 15 sacks for 105 yards. In the season's final stretch, Silverfield helped mold an offensive line that propelled the Lions to a 5-2 record. The Lions' offensive line allowed just more than three sacks per game in the last seven contests, and quarterback Matthew Stafford thrived behind Silverfield's new-look offensive line. In the seven games with Silverfield on staff, Stafford threw 17 touchdowns and only one interception. Before that, Stafford had 15 touchdowns and 12 interceptions.

Preceding his 2015 mid-season jump to the NFL, Silverfield was a senior offensive analyst on head coach Todd Graham's Arizona State staff. In his short time in Tempe, Ariz., the Sun Devils posted a 5-5 record on their way to a final 6-6 regular-season mark and a Motel 6 Cactus Bowl berth.

Silverfield served as an offensive consultant at Toledo in 2014 and helped the Rockets to a 9-4 overall record and a

7-1 Mid-American Conference (MAC) mark. Toledo tied for the MAC West crown and earned a GoDaddy.com Bowl berth. The Rockets' nine wins were the most since 2001, and Toledo's 63-44 bowl victory over Arkansas State was its first postseason win since 2011.

The Rockets' offensive line helped put one of the most prolific offensive seasons in Toledo football record book. The 2014 offense set school records for total offense, total rushing yardage and first downs per game and also ranked among the program's top-five in points per game (2nd), touchdowns scored (3rd) and rushing touchdowns (3rd).

Leading the charge on Silverfield's offensive line was Greg Mancz, the 2014 Vern Smith Award/MAC Player of the Year award recipient. Mancz, also an All-America second team selection, became the first offensive lineman in MAC history to be honored as the league's Player of the Year. Fellow linemen Josh Hendershot and Jeff Myers joined Mancz in earning All-MAC recognition.

Toledo's offensive line proved fruitful for the 2014 Rockets' attack. Toledo led the MAC in scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense and first downs. Rockets running back Kareem Hunt led the MAC in rushing (1,631 yards) and was tops in the nation in yards per carry (8.0). Hunt was an All-MAC first team pick and also earned GoDaddy.com Bowl MVP honors (271 yards/5 touchdowns).

Before jumping back to the collegiate ranks, Silverfield spent six seasons on the Minnesota Vikings staff. In his time in Minnesota, Silverfield helped the Vikings to two NFC North Division crowns and three NFL playoffs appearances, including a trip to the 2009 NFC championship game. Silverfield began his Vikings' stint as an offensive quality control staffer, before moving to a defensive line staff assistant in 2009 and 2010. He moved to the offensive side from 2011-13, assisting Jeff Davidson with the offensive line.

It was in the midst of his three years working with the Minnesota offensive line that Peterson had one of the most-prolific, single-season rushing performances in NFL history. In 2012, Peterson ran for a league-best 2,097 yards, falling just eight yards shy of Eric Dickerson's NFL record of 2,105. Peterson was named the 2012 NFL MVP.

Prior to his time in the NFL, Silverfield spent the 2006 and 2007 seasons at UCF. In his two campaigns in Orlando, Fla., he served as an offensive graduate assistant his first season and

moved to a defensive graduate assistant spot in 2007. Silverfield was a member of the 2007 Knights staff that led the squad to a 10-4 record, a 7-1 Conference USA mark and the C-USA East Division crown. UCF defeated Tulsa in the C-USA championship game and earned the league's AutoZone Liberty Bowl berth.

As an offensive graduate assistant, Silverfield worked with Smith in 2006. That season – Smith's sophomore campaign – he rushed for 934 yards in only nine games, setting up his explosive junior season. As a junior, Smith was the NCAA rushing champion.

In Silverfield's season working with the Knights defense, UCF ranked among the top four in C-USA in scoring defense, rushing defense, passing defense and turnovers forced. The Knights held half of their opponents to 20 or fewer points in the 2007 campaign.

In 2005, Silverfield served as the quarterbacks coach at Jacksonville University. In 2004, at the age of 23, Silverfield served as head coach at Memorial Day High School in Savannah, Ga.

A 2003 Hampden-Sydney College (Va.) graduate, Silverfield coached four seasons at his alma mater, starting as an offensive assistant in 2000. Then, at age 20, he was tapped as the Tigers defensive line coach and spent two seasons at that post (2001-02). In 2003, Silverfield moved back to offense and coached the tight ends and H-backs. That season, the Tigers went 9-1 and had the nation's No. 1 scoring offense in the country (47.0 ppg). Hampden-Sydney scored 45 or more points in seven of its 10 games in 2003.

Silverfield started coaching in 1999 at his alma mater, The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla. He played for the Bulldogs and was a member of two Florida state championship teams (1995 and 1998). During his playing career, Silverfield helped Bolles to a No. 1 ranking in the USA Today Super 25 national high school football poll. Immediately after his playing career, Silverfield jumped to the coaching ranks as a Bolles School assistant.

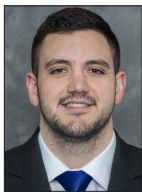

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- The Tigers (54) rank in a tie for fourth in the FBS in home wins since 2014, trailing only Clemson (62), Alabama (61) and Ohio State (58).
- Memphis has had a great home field advantage at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium, posting a record of 44-7 (.863) since head coach Ryan Silverfield joined the staff in 2016.
- As head coach, Silverfield is 19-4 (.826) at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium.

ONE OF THE ELITE PROGRAMS IN THE NATION

- Memphis has posted 82 victories since 2014, tying for 15th-most in the nation during that stretch.
- The 82 wins are the most among American Athletic Conference schools during that span.
- The Tigers are also tied for 17th in the country in winning percentage dating back to 2014 with their 82-39 (.678) mark.
- Memphis' streak of nine-straight seasons with a record of .500 or better is tied for the fourth-longest streak among Group of 5 and independent schools and is the longest such streak in the AAC.

TIGERS RALLY FROM 17-0 DEFICIT TO UPEND BOISE STATE

- On Saturday, Sept. 30, Memphis rallied from an early, 17-0 deficit to defeat Boise State, 35-32, at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium.
- Running back Blake Watson led the way for the Tigers, rushing the ball 19 times for 113 yards and two scores, while wide receiver Roc Taylor posted his second-straight 100-yard receiving game, reeling in five receptions for 102 yards and a touchdown.
- In one of the biggest plays of the game, linebacker Geoffrey Cantin-Arku broke through the middle of the line, blocking a 24-yard field goal attempt.
- He then scooped up the loose ball and darted down the field for an 80-yard score to give the Tigers a lead they wouldn't surrender against the Broncos.

DO-IT-ALL WATSON

- Running back Blake Watson has done it all for Memphis this season, ranking 13th in the nation and leading the AAC in all-purpose yards at 138.6 per game.
- The Old Dominion transfer ranks 24th in the NCAA in rushing touchdowns (6), 27th in rushing yards per game (91.0) and 49th in receptions per game (5.2).
- Watson ranks second on the team in receptions (26) and third on the squad in receiving yards (233).

FORCING TURNOVERS

- Dating back to the 2021 season, Memphis has forced at least one turnover in 19 of the last 23 games.
- Over that stretch, the Tigers have totaled 26 interceptions and 16 fumbles.
- Memphis has forced multiple turnovers in 13 of those 23 contests.

MEMPHIS IN THE NCAA RANKINGS

- Entering Friday's game, the Tigers rank in the top-25 nationally in 15 statistical categories.
- As a team, the Tigers are ranked ninth in fewest penalties (21), 13th in fewest penalties per game (4.2), 16th in fewest penalty yards (200) and 22nd in fewest penalty yards per game (40.0) and 24th in blocked kicks (1).
- Defensively, Memphis is ranked fourth in the country in third down conversion percentage defense (.238), sixth in fourth down conversion percentage defense (.250), eighth in fumbles recovered (6), 17th in first downs defense (87) and 25th in defensive touchdowns (1).
- Offensively, the team is ranked eighth in fourth down conversion percentage (.816), 18th in scoring offense (36.6) and 23rd in completion percentage (.684).
- Memphis is tied for the NCAA lead in both blocked kicks allowed (0) and blocked punts allowed (0).

HENIGAN AT IT AGAIN

- For the third-consecutive season, quarterback Seth Henigan ranks nationally amongst the best QBs in the country.
- Henigan is ranked 15th in the NCAA in completions per game (24.0), 23rd in passing yards per game (275.2), 23rd in completion percentage (.686) and 34th in passing yards (1,376).
- Entering Friday's game, Henigan ranks fourth in program history in career completions (614), fourth in attempts (977), fifth in passing yards (7,862) and fifth in passing touchdowns (55).
- His 12 300-yard passing games are tied for second in program history, behind only Riley Ferguson (13).
- The junior is the youngest third year starting quarterback (20 years old) in the FBS this season.

NCAA STATISTICS STANDOUTS

- Defensive back DeAgo Brumfield ranks ninth in the NCAA in passes defended at 1.4 per game.
- Linebacker Geoffrey Cantin-Arku ranks 10th in the FBS in forced fumbles at 0.40 per game.
- Wide receiver Koby Drake ranks 16th in the country in punt returns at 11.8.

GAME NOTES

MARTIN MAKING AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- Linebacker Chandler Martin has made an immediate impact for the Tigers after transferring from East Tennessee State.
- Martin leads Memphis with 35 tackles and five tackles for loss on the season and ranks second on the team with one sack and one forced fumble.

BOWL STREAK

- Memphis is one of nine teams in the FBS with nine or more consecutive bowl-game appearances along with Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Wisconsin and Mississippi State.
- In 2022, the Tigers defeated Utah State, 38-10, in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl, improving the program's record to 7-8 in bowl games.
- The 2021 EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl was canceled due to COVID issues in the Hawai'i program last year and Memphis was named champions.
- Ryan Silverfield has led the program to bowl games in all three seasons as head coach and has been on staff for the past seven years, with Memphis earning bowl berths each season.

NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS IN MEMPHIS

- Memphis is 26-1 in the team's last 27 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Among the games during that stretch for the Tigers include victories over Mississippi State (2021), Ole Miss (2019, 2015), UCLA (2017) and Kansas (2016).
- The lone loss during that stretch came against UTSA, 31-28, on Sept. 25, 2021.

GILLIS STEPS UP AGAINST MISSOURI

- With both scholarship kickers injured against Missouri on Sept. 23, Tanner Gillis stepped up in a big way for Memphis.
- The backup punter kicked field goals from 22 and 43 yards and all three of his PATs.
- For his effort, Gillis was named to the AAC's Weekly Honor Roll.

WATSON LEADS TIGERS TO FIFTH-STRAIGHT WIN OVER NAVY

- Running back Blake Watson stole the show for Memphis, rushing 10 times for 169 yards and a score, while also reeling in six catches for 68 yards in the team's 28-24 win over Navy on Sept. 14.
- The Old Dominion transfer came alive in the second half against the Midshipmen, piling up 146 rushing yards, including a pair of 69-yard rushes.
- For his effort against the Midshipmen, Watson was named to the AAC Weekly Honor Roll.

TIGERS TAKE DOWN ARKANSAS STATE, 37-3

- Memphis defeated Arkansas State in Jonesboro on Sept. 9, 37-3, thanks to a stellar defensive effort.
- The Tigers forced four takeaways in the win, limiting ASU to its fewest points in the series since 1993.
- The win was the fifth-straight for Memphis against the Red Wolves.

MEMPHIS OPENS SEASON WITH CONVINCING WIN OVER BETHUNE-COOKMAN

- The Tigers opened the 2023 season with a convincing, 56-14, win over Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 2 at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium.
- Memphis' 42-point win was the largest margin of victory in a season-opening game since 2018 when the Tigers defeated Mercer, 66-14.
- Memphis' defense limited B-CU to just 91 total yards on the night – the first time the team allowed less than a 100 yards since SMU in 2015.
- With the victory over Bethune-Cookman, the Tigers are 1-0 all-time against the Wildcats. B-CU was only the second current SWAC team Memphis has played.

DOMINANT DEFENSIVE EFFORT

- The Tigers' defense was dominant in the team's season-opening, 56-14, victory over Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 2.
- The defense didn't allow any points, as the Wildcats tallied two defensive scores.
- Memphis' defense limited B-CU to just 91 total yards on the night – the first time the team allowed less than a 100 yards since SMU in 2015.
- The Tigers limited the Wildcats to just four first downs, 39 passing yards and 52 rushing yards on the night.

MORGAN EARNS AAC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Kicker Seth Morgan was named the AAC Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 4 following his great game against Bethune-Cookman.
- In his first game as a Tiger, the Sam Houston transfer was perfect in the team's 56-14, season-opening victory.
- The redshirt junior connected on both of his field goal attempts, 26 and 45 yards, as well as all six of his extra point attempts.

- In the team's season-opening win over Bethune-Cookman, the Memphis rushing attack was on display.
- Sophomore Sutton Smith ran for a game-high 115 yards and two touchdowns on 18 carries, while fifth-year Blake Watson had 10 rushes for 75 yards and three scores, all coming in the first half.
- Watson was the first Tiger RB to rush for three touchdowns in a half since Darrell Henderson in 2018 against UCF.
- On the game, Memphis rushed for 208 yards on 43 carries and five scores.

BEST AGAINST THE BEST

- Since 2015, Memphis has posted a record of 8-11 (.421) against top-25 ranked opponents.
- The eight victories are the most over that stretch for any non-Power 5 team in the country.
- Memphis' eight ranked wins since 2015 have come over No. 13/12 Ole Miss (2015), No. 18/21/20 Houston (2016), No. 25/RV UCLA (2017), No. 25/24 Navy (2017), No. 15/14 SMU (2019), No. 18/17/19 Cincinnati (2019), No. 21/21/20 Cincinnati (2019) and No. 23/24 SMU (2021).

HOME SEASON OPENER

- The Tigers opened the season at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium for the 12th time in the last 13 years against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 2.
- 2022's season-opening game on the road at Mississippi State snapped an 11-season streak of opening the season in Memphis.
- The Tigers are 44-61-3 all-time in season-opening contests.
- Memphis has won 10-straight home openers and have posted a record of 54-49-5 all-time in home opening games.

SILVERFIELD STATS

- Head coach Ryan Silverfield totaled 21 wins through his first three seasons as head coach, tying him for second-most in program history.
- Silverfield is the only head coach in Memphis history with three bowl titles.
- Among head coaches hired in 2020, Silverfield is the only one with three bowl championships and his 21 wins through three seasons ranked fifth in that group.

TRANSFORMATIVE RENOVATIONS ANNOUNCED FOR SIMMONS BANK LIBERTY STADIUM

- The University of Memphis and the City of Memphis have announced plans to pursue a \$150-200 million renovation to Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium to revitalize and modernize the home of Memphis Tiger Football.
- Priority elements of the wide-ranging project include a transformation of the stadium's west side, providing several innovative premium seating options, creating a hospitality experience within the halo space surrounding the stadium, other new seating options, such as family boxes on the north end and party deck patios for students on the south end and a potential repurpose and retrofit of the east side suite tower.
- The goal for completion of the project is prior to the 2025 football season.

TIGERS PICKED FOURTH IN PRESEASON AAC POLL

- Prior to the season, Memphis was picked to finish fourth in the American Athletic Conference (AAC) preseason media poll.
- The Tigers (362 points, 1 first-place vote) were picked behind Tulane (457, 20), UTSA (440, 9) and SMU (397, 3)
- Memphis won the AAC Championship in 2019, 29-24, over No. 24-ranked Cincinnati.

NINE TIGERS EARN PRESEASON ALL-AAC HONORS FROM PHIL STEELE

- Prior to the 2023 season, nine Tigers were named Preseason All-AAC by Phil Steele.
- Defensive lineman Jaylon Allen and defensive back Simeon Blair were tabbed first team, while linebacker Geoffrey Cantin-Arku and offensive lineman Jacob Likes were named to the second team.
- Earning places on the third team were long snapper Colby Cox and running back Blake Watson, while offensive lineman Davion Carter, defensive lineman Josh Ellison and quarterback Seth Henigan were on the fourth team.

HENIGAN EARNS NUMEROUS PRESEASON HONORS

- Junior quarterback Seth Henigan earned numerous preseason honors this summer.
- Henigan was named to the Maxwell Award Watch List, the Davey O'Brien Award Preseason Watch List, the Manning Award Preseason Watch List and the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watchlist.
- In 2022, Henigan completed 286-of-446 passes for 22 touchdowns, while also rushing for 289 yards and four scores.
- The junior will be the youngest third year starting quarterback (20 years old) in the FBS this coming season.

GAME NOTES**LIKES NAMED TO PAIR OF PRESEASON WATCHLISTS**

- Offensive lineman Jacob Likes earned a pair of honors prior to the 2023 campaign.
- Likes was named to the Rimington Trophy Watchlist, as well as a nominee for Allstate's AFCA Good Works Team.
- Likes has appeared in 33 games in his Tiger career entering 2023, earning Second-Team Preseason All-AAC honors from Phil Steele prior to this coming season. Likes is a three-time Academic All-AAC honoree and earned a place in the NFF Hampshire Honor Society in 2023.

BAUER NAMED TO RAY GUY AWARD PRESEASON WATCHLIST

- Punter Reid Bauer was named to the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watchlist in August.
- The Ray Guy Award honors the nation's top collegiate punter in the FBS.
- Bauer came to Memphis prior to the 2023 season from Arkansas, where he played in 48 games from 2018-22.
- During that time, he averaged 42.0 yards on 179 punts. In 2021, Bauer won the Peter Mortel Holder of the Year award.
- In 2013, Memphis' Tom Hornsey was named the winner of the Ray Guy Award.

ALLEN EARNS SPOT ON LOMBARDI AWARD WATCHLIST

- Defensive lineman Jaylon Allen was named to the Lombardi Award Watchlist this summer.
- The Lombardi Award goes annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman who exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi in addition to outstanding performance and ability.
- For his career, Allen has played in 47 games with 110 tackles, 18.5 tackles for loss, 11 sacks, one interception, three passes defended, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

STANDOUT FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN FOR HENIGAN

- Quarterback Seth Henigan posted one of the best seasons in program history in 2021 and he did it as a true freshman.
- In 2021, Henigan earned FWAA Freshman All-America honors after starting all 11 games in which he played for the Tigers.
- The Denton, Texas native completed 235-of-393 passes for 3,322 yards, 25 touchdowns and eight interceptions.
- His 3,322 passing yards shattered the school's freshman record previously held by Paxton Lynch in 2013 (2056) and rank sixth overall on the program's single-season list. His 25 touchdowns are tied for the seventh-most in school history.
- Henigan also became the first true freshman quarterback to start a season opener in school history.

SILVERFIELD SECURES ANOTHER TOP-5 RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- For the third-straight year, head coach Ryan Silverfield has recruited one of the top-5 classes in program history.
- The 2023 class, which includes 22 student-athletes, is ranked No. 61 by Rivals, making it the fifth-best class in program history. It ranks as the second-best class among Group of Five programs.
- The 2022 class was the best class in program history (No. 47), while the 2021 class is the second-best in school history (No. 49).
- Both classes were ranked No. 2 in the AAC those seasons behind only Cincinnati.
- Prior to Silverfield, Memphis has never had a top-50 recruiting class in Rivals rankings.

MEMPHIS IN OVERTIME GAMES

- Memphis has been involved in nine overtime games (2-8). The Tigers have played a total of five multi-overtime affairs and have a 2-3 record in those games.
- The Tigers came up just short in the 2017 American Athletic Conference Championship game in double-OT at UCF, 62-55. The Tigers and Knights combined to score 117 points, the highest total in a conference title game in FBS history.
- Memphis ended the 2014 season with the first overtime game in five seasons, defeating BYU 55-48 in double-OT at the Miami Beach Bowl.

MADE IN MEMPHIS

- Since 2015, 13 Memphis players have been drafted by the National Football League.
- OL Dylan Parham was selected in the third round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Las Vegas Raiders, while WR Calvin Austin III was taken by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the fourth round.
- With the selections, Memphis has had at least one player selected in nine of the last 10 NFL Drafts, with 15 players being taken over that span.
- On current NFL rosters, four former Tigers are listed at running back (Antonio Gibson, Tony Pollard, Kenneth Gainwell and Patrick Taylor Jr.).
- Currently, 18 Tigers are on NFL rosters – WR Calvin Austin III (Pittsburgh), DL Genard Avery (Indianapolis), CB Chris Claybrooks (Jacksonville), K Jake Elliott (Philadelphia), CB Jacobi Francis (Houston), RB Kenneth Gainwell (Philadelphia), RB Antonio Gibson (Washington), DL Bryce Huff (New York Jets), S Quindell Johnson (Chicago Bears), CB Arthur Maulet (Baltimore), S Bobby McCain (New York Giants), OL Dylan Parham (Las Vegas), K Riley Patterson (Detroit), RB Tony Pollard (Dallas), LB JJ Russell (Tampa Bay) and RB Patrick Taylor (Green Bay).

STERLING START

- Head coach Ryan Silverfield had a tremendous first season at the helm of the Tiger Football program in 2020, leading the team to an 8-3 record and a win in the Montgomery Bowl, the first for the Tigers since 2014.
- With that victory over Florida Atlantic in the Montgomery Bowl, Silverfield became the first head coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first year.
- Silverfield set the program record for winning percentage (.727) by a first-year head coach, while also matching the school mark for most wins in a debut year (Mike Norvell, 2016).
- For his efforts, he was named the 2020 Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA) Coach of the Year.
- Prior to being named head coach in 2019 before the team's appearance in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Dallas, Silverfield served as deputy head coach and offensive line coach during the 2019 season as the Tigers won their first outright conference title in 50 years.
- Silverfield also was part of Memphis staffs that led the program to three-straight American Athletic Conference West Division crowns from 2017-19 and four-straight bowl appearances from 2016-19.
- Behind Silverfield's contributions, Memphis won 38 games during those four seasons, including going 10-3 in 2017 and 12-1 in 2019. He is the only member of the staff to be part of both 10-plus win seasons.

THANK YOU, TOM III

- TOM III, the beloved Bengal Tiger mascot for the University of Memphis who was a part of one of the most glorious periods in University and athletics history, passed away on Sept. 18, 2020, less than three weeks after his 12th birthday.
- TOM III was remembered with a moving ceremony as his ashes made a final lap around Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium in his custom-designed, climate-controlled trailer prior to the 50-49 win over UCF on Oct. 18, as the Tigers' 21-point come-from-behind victory was the largest in school history.
- TOM III's last game attended came as the No. 16 Memphis Tigers defeated No. 21 Cincinnati in a come-from-behind, 29-24 victory in the 2019 American Athletic Conference Championship at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium on Dec. 7.
- TOM III attended his first game at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium as a cub in 2008.
- He was born Aug. 31, 2008 and arrived in Memphis a few short months later on Oct. 23. His first game at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium was on Nov. 22 against UCF. In 73 games attended, TOM III produced a 44-29 home record. Since he arrived in Memphis, the Tigers went 73-73 (.500) overall and 45-29 at home.

- **DeAngelo Williams**, RB, was a first-round draft pick by the Carolina Panthers in 2006 and rushed for over 8,000 yards in his 11-year NFL career. In 2008 and 2015, Williams was the NFL's rushing touchdowns leader. Williams is one of six Tigers to have their jerseys retired and he was inducted into the M Club Hall of Fame in 2014.
