SETTING THE SCENE

- The Memphis Tigers are in their 104th season of basketball and their 12th as an AAC member.
- Memphis is coming off a 2023-24 season that saw the Tigers climb as high as No. 10 in the AP Poll in January, before ultimately finishing 22-10 overall and turning down an invite to the NIT.
- The Tigers were picked second in the AAC Pre-season Coaches poll with 136 total points and four first-place votes.
- UAB was tabbed the preseason AAC favorite with 141 points and nine first-place votes.
- Memphis is starting at home for the fifth time in seven seasons under Penny Hardaway. The Tigers are 4-0 in those games and 6-0 all-time in season openers under the Tiger legend.
- Memphis is 73-30 all-time in regular season openers.
- Memphis has secured at least 20 wins in all six seasons under head coach Penny Hardaway.
- The Tigers are in search getting back to the NCAA Tournament after missing the Big Dance last season.
- Hardaway has led Memphis to an NIT title in 2021, an AAC title in 2023 and two NCAA Tournaments in 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- Last season, the Tigers captured four victories over AP Top 25 opponents, including in three-straight games for the first time.
- The Tigers knocked off No. 20 Arkansas (84-79) in the Bahamas, then took down No. 21 Texas A&M (81-75) on the road.

- They followed that stretch up with back-to-back victories over No. 13 Clemson (79-77) and No. 22 Virginia (77-54) at home.

OPENING NIGHT HISTORY

- The Tigers are set to open the 2024-25 campaign at FedExForum on Monday, Nov. 4, marking the earliest Memphis men's basketball has ever opened a season in program history.

HOME-OPENING SUCCESS

- In 103 seasons of Memphis basketball, the Tigers own a record of 73-30 (.708) in season openers.
- They have won six-straight lid lifters with the last loss coming Nov.10, 2017 against No. 25 Alabama.
- Memphis has won 21-straight home openers, dating back to 2003.
- The Tigers last loss in a home opener was Nov. 22, 2002 when Austin Peay snuck out of town with an 81-80 overtime victory.

AAC PRESEASON AWARDS

- Memphis had four players honored on the AAC Preseason Awards list.
- **PJ Haggerty** and **Tyrese Hunter** were each selected to the first team, while **Colby Rogers** landed second team recognition.
- **Jared Harris** was also named the AAC Pre-season Freshman of the Year.
- Memphis was tabbed to finish 2nd in the coaches poll behind only 2024 AAC tournament champion UAB.

ELITE SCORERS

- Memphis has produced two of its top seven single-season scorers in program history the last two seasons.
- **Kendric Davis** transferred in from SMU for the 2022-23 season and passed Penny Hardaway for the 2nd-most points ever in a season (744).
- Davis ranked 8th in the country in scoring (21.9)
- Last year, **David Jones** came to town from Rutgers and produced 698 total points for 7th on the school chart.
- Jones ranked 6th nationally in scoring (21.8).

SERIES HISTORY VS. MIZZOU

- Memphis and Missouri have met 13 times before, with the Bluff City Tigers leading 8-5.
- Last season, the teams met for the first time in 15 years with Memphis overcoming an early 14-point deficit to earn a 70-55 victory in Columbia.
- Prior to last season's meeting, the teams last faced off in the 2009 NCAA Sweet 16 with Mis-

souri posting a 102-91 victory.

- Memphis owns a 5-1 home record versus Missouri, last facing off in 2003.
- Missouri's only win in Memphis came on Dec. 27, 1989. It was a 71-65 victory.
- The first-ever meeting came Dec. 21, 1965 with the Memphis Tigers winning 85-72 at home.

EXHIBITION ROUNDUP

- Memphis played arguably the two toughest exhibitions of anyone in college basketball.
- The Tigers played No. 9 North Carolina at FedExForum on Oct. 15 for the Hoops for St. Jude Tip Off Classic where Memphis led by as many as 10 before ultimately falling 84-76.
- Then on Oct. 28, Memphis made the trip to Huntsville to play No. 2 Alabama in the Rocket City Classic. The Crimson Tide dominated early, but the Tigers got going and outscored them 59-47 in the second half en route to a 96-88 loss.
- **PJ Haggerty** led the team over the two games, averaging 28.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game.
- **Tyrese Hunter** had a team-best 5.0 assists.

ABOUT THE ROSTER

- This season's Tiger squad features two re-turners from last year's team along with 12 newcomers.
- The newcomers are made up of eight Division I transfers, a Division II transfer, two junior college transfer and one freshmen.
- Memphis had to replace 14 players who played in a game last season, which is the most of any team in college basketball.
- The lone returning scholarship player is **Nicholas Jourdain**, who averaged 6.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game last season with 25 starts in 32 games.
- Walk-on **Noah Stansbury** is also back for his second season with the Tigers.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

- The Tigers are opening a season on the road for the first time in 21 years (at Oakland; 2003-04) when they come to the Bluff City on Monday.
- Head coach Dennis Gates enters his third season at the helm after finishing 8-24 last season.
- Gates signed the nation's No. 5 freshman class and added the nation's No. 13 transfer class in the spring.
- Highlighting their new additions are Mark Mitchell (Duke), Tony Perkins (Iowa) and Marques Warrick (Northern Kentucky), who all ranked in the top-30 by respective publications.
- Missouri also brought in two-time Arkansas Player of the Year Annor Boateng, who was a top-40 recruit nationally out of high school.
- Missouri defeated Lincoln, 90-45, in their only exhibition last Saturday. The 45-point victory is the team's largest exhibition victory since 2011.

IT JUST MEANS MORE

- Memphis has not been afraid to play the best teams in the country under Penny Hardaway, and that is especially true against Southeastern Conference opponents.

- In six seasons under Hardaway, the Tigers have played 20 contests against SEC foes and are 12-8 in those games.
- The Tigers are 8-2, however, in such games over the last two seasons. The only losses were a pair of three-point defeats at Ole Miss (80-77) last season and at No. 4 Alabama (91-88) in 2022-23.

HAGGERTY AS A FRESHMAN

- Perhaps the most coveted transfer for Hardaway in the offseason was **PJ Haggerty** from Tulsa.
- He was the second-leading scorer in the AAC last season (21.2) and only trailed Memphis' **David Jones**. He ranked 13th in the nation in scoring.
- Haggerty became only one of two players in the last five seasons of Division I hoops to average at least 21.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game last season: Drake's **Tucker DeVries** was the other.
- In fact, they are the only two players to do so in the last five seasons since Ja Morant in 2018-19.
- Haggerty was named the Kyle Macy National Freshman of the Year and the AAC's Freshman of the Year after setting the league's record with 14 freshman of the week honors.

WELCOME HOME

- Former Tiger big man **Moussa Cisse** will close his collegiate career right where it began.
- Cisse signed with the Tigers in 2020-21 and helped guide Memphis to a 20-8 record and a NIT title while earning AAC Freshman of the Year honors.
- He then transferred to Oklahoma State for the next two seasons (2021-23) before playing for Ole Miss in 2023-24.
- He averaged 4.5 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.4 blocks with 17 starts in 26 games for a Rebel squad that went 20-12.
- He has appeared in 115 games at the Division I level and has proven to be one of the elite rim protectors in the country.
- He was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year for Oklahoma State in 2021-22 and has blocked 198 shots in his career for an average of 1.7 per game.
- Over four collegiate seasons, Cisse has averaged 6.3 points (56.3% shooting) and 6.4 rebounds

MR. ROGERS

- **Colby Rogers** is at his fourth stop on the Division I level, playing in his final season.
- Rogers is one of only three players in the country that have averaged at least 10.0 points per game at three different DI schools.
- He averaged 12.2 ppg at Cal-Poly (2020-21), 14.1 ppg at Siena (2021-22) and 16.4 at Wichita State (2023-24).
- He has proven to be one of the most lethal three-point shooters in college basketball.
- Last season with the Shockers, he broke the program's record with 99 made triples in a season.
- He shot 40.9 percent from deep, tops in the

DAINJA ZONE

- Transfer big man **Dain Dainja** comes to the 901 after spending the last two seasons at Illinois where he helped lead the program to 49 wins.
- Prior to that, Dainja spent his first two collegiate seasons at Baylor (2020-22), winning a NCAA National Championship with the Bears in 2021.
- Dainja started all 38 games for the Illini last season, averaging 6.1 points and 3.6 rebounds while shooting a team-high 66.9 percent from the field (101-of-151) in just 10.6 minutes per game.
- He set the Illinois program record for consecutive field goals made at 20, a streak that spanned six postseason games.

IRON MAN

- **Tyrese Hunter** has been Mr. Dependable over his first three years in college.
- He has not only played in all 106 career games, but he has started every single one of those and averaged more than 31 minutes each time out.
- He has amassed 1,143 points (13.8 ppg), 403 assists (4.8 apg), 332 rebounds (4.0 rpg) and 146 steals (1.8 spg) and has reached double figures in scoring 58 times.
- Hunter has an abundance of experience in the NCAA Tournament, posting a 6-3 mark in nine career March Madness games.
- He led the Iowa State Cyclones to the Sweet 16 (2021-22) and Texas to the Elite Eight (2022-23) and Round of 32 (2023-24).

GETTING TO THE LINE

- **PJ Haggerty** ranked second in the nation last season in getting to the free throw line with 309 attempts at the charity stripe. He trailed only the unanimous National Player of the Year – Zach Edey.
- Haggerty converted on 237 of those attempts, which ranked third in the country, and were the most by any freshman in the nation since at least 1947.
- Oklahoma's Trae Young held the previous mark at 236.
- points on 44.2% shooting and 36.1% from deep.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- The Tigers have won 32 of their last 36 games at FedExForum and are 81-12 at home under head coach **Penny Hardaway**.
- Dating back to the start of the 2021 calendar year, Memphis is 45-6 with the losses coming by a combined 17 points.
- The last four losses at home have been by a combined 7 points - Tulane (1), #1 Houston (2), USF (1), Rice (3)
- Seven of the 12 defeats in Hardaway's tenure have finished as one-possession games.

ALL WE DO IS WIN

- Memphis is one of only three programs in the nation to have won at least 18 games in each of the last 22 seasons starting in 2000-01 (Gonzaga, Kansas, Memphis).

TIGER DEFENSE

- Defense has been a staple under Penny Hardaway, with his teams always ranking near the top of the nation in defensive categories.
- In his six seasons when Memphis has held an opponent to 60 points or less, the Tigers are 44-3.
- They have won 24-straight after holding ECU to 58

- Memphis reached the 10-win mark in AAC play for the sixth-straight year last season.
- The Tigers have earned 10 AAC wins in all six seasons under head coach **Penny Hardaway**.

On Oct. 28, 2021, the University of Memphis dedicated **Larry Finch Plaza** outside the Laurie-Walton Family Basketball Center.

Finch coached **Penny Hardaway** while the latter was a standout on the court in the early 1990s, which followed Finch's own acclaimed playing career in the early 1970s.

Called "one of the 10 most influential Memphians of all time" by Mayor Jim Strickland, Finch was credited with helping to reunite the City when he played for then-Memphis State after graduating from Melrose High School in Orange Mound following the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

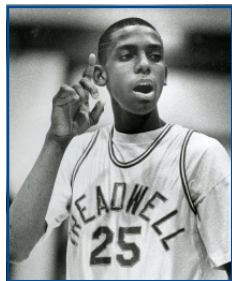

HARDAWAY: THE TIMELINE

A former prep standout at Treadwell High, he averaged 36.6 points and 10.1 rebounds as a senior in 1990 and



was named *Parade Magazine* National High School Player of the Year.

A two-time All-American and two-time Great Midwest Conference Player of the Year, Hardaway averaged 22.8 points, 8.5 rebounds, 6.4 assists and 2.4 steals in 1992-93.

Hardaway remains the only Memphis player

to have two career triple-doubles and his 1,319 points (in only two seasons) rank 17th on the school's career scoring list. The 729 points he scored during the 1992-93 season are the most by a junior in Tigers history.

In his two seasons, Hardaway led the team to a 43-23 record – including eight wins over nationally ranked schools -- and directed the Tigers to two NCAA Tournament appearances, including an Elite Eight trip in 1992.

After his junior year, Hardaway declared for the NBA Draft and began a 14-year pro career with the Orlando Magic (1993-99), the Phoenix Suns (1999-2004), the New York Knicks (2004-06) and the Miami Heat (2007).

The No. 3 pick in the 1993 NBA Draft, Hardaway quickly rose to stardom with the Magic. He averaged 16.6 points, 6.6 assists and 5.4 rebounds in his first season and was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team.



During the 1994-95 season, he averaged 20.9 points and 7.2 assists, started the NBA All-Star Game and was named to the All-NBA First Team, while leading Orlando to the NBA Finals against the Houston Rockets. Hardaway averaged 25.5 points and eight assists in the series.



After the 1995-96 season, he played on the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won a gold medal in Atlanta, Ga.

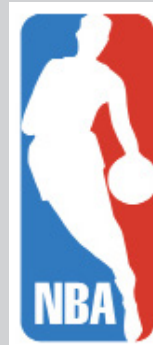
Hardaway had a successful run at East High School, which won state titles in 2016, 2017 and 2018. With Hardaway as head coach, the Mustangs defeated Whitehaven High for the 2018 Class AAA championship.



Hardaway returned to his alma mater and becomes the school's 19th head coach and the third former Tiger player to hold the position.

Hardaway was inked to a six-year, \$16.5 million extension on Oct. 12, 2022, which takes him through April 15, 2028.

MEMPHIS & THE ASSOCIATION



The Memphis Tigers have had significant success in the Draft in recent seasons. After **James Wiseman (PK2)** and **Precious Achiuwa (PK15)** were selected in the first round in the 2020 NBA Draft, **Jalen Duren (PK13)** followed suit in the 2022 Draft.

- Duren was the 16th Tiger selected in the first round and the 53rd Tiger selected overall, while Josh Minott was taken No. 45 in the second round.
- Besides 2020, the last and only other time Memphis had two NBA first rounders was in 2006 (Rodney Carney, No. 16 to Chicago; Shawne Williams, No. 17 to Indiana).
- Memphis, Kentucky, and North Carolina are the only schools to have players selected each of Nos. 1-7 in NBA Draft history.
- After coaching Wiseman, Tigers head coach **Penny Hardaway** is the only NCAA head coach to have been picked in the top three of the NBA Draft and have been the college head coach of a player taken in the top three.

FEDEXFORUM THE HOME OF THE TIGERS

The 2024-25 season marks the 21st for the Tigers in their home arena, FedExForum, which officially opened in September 2004. Located just a few feet off Beale Street on historic Highway 61, FedExForum rises to extend the heart of the Memphis entertainment district.

Memphis plays its home contests in the 18,400-seat arena, which served as host for 2019 American Athletic Conference Championship. It also will be the site for the 2024 NCAA Tournament First and Second Rounds. Since it opened in 2004, FedExForum has hosted six Conference USA Tournaments, three NCAA Men's South Regionals (2009, 2014, 2017), two American Athletic Conference Tournaments (2014, 2019) and one NCAA Women's South Regional (2010).

At 135 feet high, FedExForum provides a backdrop for historic Beale Street. The 805,850 square-foot arena, covering 13.8 acres, features five levels as well as state-of-the-art locker rooms and facilities for sports teams, as well as an exceptional dining and entertainment experiences for its patrons.

Memphis men's basketball moved into its new practice facility, the Laurie-Walton Family Basketball Center, Nov. 17, 2017. It is a comprehensive, 62,000-square-foot training facility on the University's Park Avenue Campus.

This stand-alone facility encompasses offices, locker rooms, 3,250-square-foot weight room, training facilities, two NCAA regulation courts, as well as spaces for student-athletes to study, train, eat and develop.



In addition, the history of Memphis basketball is showcased via a large atrium in the grand lobby known as Traditions Hall, a 7,300-square-foot area that will double as a museum designed to be an interactive celebration of Tigers basketball for the general public.

The new practice facilities, part of the University's "Time to Shine" capital campaign, represent a major commitment from the University and Memphis community to compete at the highest level.
