SERIES HISTORY

SERIES HISTORY: MEMPHIS LEADS 6-3

LAST MEETING: W, 21-6, NOV. 9, 2013

SETTING THE SCENE

- Memphis looks to bounce back at home against FCS opponent UT Martin after suffering its first loss of the year on the road against Boise State, where the Tigers were held scoreless in the second half.
- TE **Hunter Tipton** was named the John Mackey Award Tight End of the Week after going off with nine catches for 229 yards and an 87-yard touchdown reception, all new career highs for the redshirt senior.
- The 2026 Memphis Tigers roster features a grand total of 81 newcomers, split between 20 true freshmen and 61 transfers, with 27 returners from last season.
- Huff brings along 17 players from his 2025 Southern Miss squad, including All-Sun Belt performers: DE **J'Mond Tapp**, LB **Mike Montgomery** and SAF **Ian Foster**.
 - The list also includes 5 players who played for Huff at both Marshall and Southern Miss.
- QB **Marcus Stokes** had his highest passing output of his collegiate career, passing for 384 yards against the Broncos, including receptions of 41, 68 and 87 yards.
- Memphis returns just four players (CB **Chauncey Logan Jr.**, DL **Taylor Burton**, WR **Brady Kluse**, OL **Parker Mitchell**) that started at least one game for the Tigers in 2025.
- Dating back to a win over UAB in the 2023 season, Memphis has forced at least one turnover in 28 of its last 36 games. Over that stretch, the Tigers have created 61 takeaways (36 INT, 25 FR).
- The Tigers currently have an active streak of 32 games with two or fewer turnovers, which is the second-longest streak by an American Conference team and the longest active streak in the conference.
 - The streak is also the sixth-longest active streak by an FBS program.
- Memphis has scored at least 15 points in 86-consecutive home games. The streak is the second-longest active streak in the FBS and the fourth-longest streak overall since 1978.

INSIDE THE SERIES

- This week's matchup marks just the 10th time that Memphis and UT Martin, separated by just 135 miles, will face off on the field.
- The most recent three matchups, all being played at Memphis from 2009-13, had a pair of Tiger wins sandwiched around a 17-20 loss in 2012.
 - The 2013 game saw the Tigers score 21 unanswered to win 21-6 in a matchup during QB Paxton Lynch's first season of action as a Tiger.
- Prior to that, the only other meetings between the Tigers and Skyhawks were six games from 1924-1932.

SCOUTING THE SKYHAWKS

- UT Martin comes into the matchup after a 52-7 road loss at West Virginia where the Skyhawks' lone touchdown came on a 6-yard scoop-and-score by John Betts III.
- Under center, the Skyhawks have had a battle brewing between redshirt freshman Tate Surber and graduate student Julian Calvez.
 - So far this season, both have split time pretty evenly, with Surber passing for 359 yards with a 68.6 completion percentage compared to Calvez's 214 yards on 51.6 percent passing.
 - Through three games, UT Martin has yet to have a passing touchdown.
- The offensive strength for UT Martin so far has been the ground game, as Tommy Ansley is rushing at a clip of 5.90 yards per carry with five rushing touchdowns.
- Ansley's performance has been supplemented by Chris Franklin, who is also sitting above 5.0 yards per carry, with a

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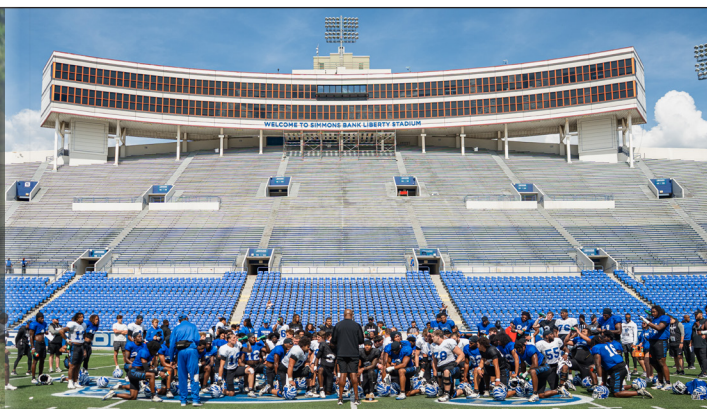

MEMPHIS HEAD COACH CHARLES HUFF



Charles Huff was named the 26th head coach in Memphis football history, Senior Vice President and Director of Athletics Dr. Ed Scott announced Monday, Dec. 8. Huff, a well-known figure in both collegiate and professional football, spent the 2019-20 season as College Football Hall of Fame coach Nick Saban's associate head coach and worked with future NFL superstars Najee Harris and Saquon Barkley.

Huff brings over 20 years of coaching experience with stops at Marshall (2021-24), Alabama (2019-20), Mississippi State (2018), Penn State (2014-17), Western Michigan (2013), the Buffalo Bills (2012), Vanderbilt (2011), Hampton (2010), Maryland (2009) and Tennessee State (2006-08).

"We are extremely excited to welcome Charles Huff as the next head football coach at the University of Memphis," Scott said. "Early in our search process, Coach Huff quickly rose to the top of our list as a dynamic leader with a proven track record of building strong, competitive programs. He brings a championship mindset, tremendous drive, and more than 20 years of experience working alongside some of the top coaches in college football. We are eager to get him to Memphis and begin this next chapter for our football program."

"We look forward to welcoming his wife, Jessica, and their three sons, B.J., Beau and Blaze to Memphis."

Huff comes to Memphis after serving as the head coach at Southern Mississippi where he turned the Golden Eagles from a 1-11 team in 2024 to a bowl eligible 7-5 team in just one season. It was the program's best regular-season record since 2019 and his six-win turnaround with the Golden Eagles was one of the biggest improvements in the FBS this season. Following his impressive turnaround during the 2025 season, Huff's career record sits at 39-25.

"I am excited to welcome Charles Huff to the University of Memphis as our next head football coach," Dr. Bill Hardgrave, University of Memphis President said. "As a proven winner who knows how to build a championship team, Charles brings a strong blend of on-field success, recruiting excellence and player development."

Changing the narrative of Southern Miss football, Huff guided the Golden Eagles to a complete revamp; after the team ranked near the bottom in nearly every statistical category in 2024, Huff's team flipped the script and became one of the most dangerous teams to play in FBS.

The team's 21 interceptions ranked first in the country while the 26 total turnovers created put Southern Miss top four in all of Division I. Boasting a 1.00 turnover margin, the

Golden Eagles held opponents to under 28 points per game, a more than 10-point difference from the year prior.

"Coach Huff brings energy, discipline and a vision that aligns perfectly with who we are and where we want to go as a University," Cato Johnson, Board of Trustees Chairman said. "He is a tremendous competitor who knows what it takes to win at the highest levels of college football. We look forward to supporting him as the next leader of Tiger Football."

Offensively, the Golden Eagles were firing on all cylinders, boosting their completion rate to 65.3% - an 88-spot jump from 2024 - and leading the Sun Belt with nearly 267 passing yards per game.

Nine Golden Eagles earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors with J'Mond Tapp (defensive lineman), Chris Jones (linebacker) and Josh Moten (defensive back) all earning First Team nods.

Tapp led the Southern Miss defensive line with 67 tackles (18 solo) with team bests of 11.5 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks. His sack total ranked second in the Sun Belt and No. 28 nationally, while his tackles per game total ranked No.1 among defensive linemen in the league.

The Sun Belt's leading tackler, Jones ranked seventh nationally in total tackles, averaging 10.7 per contest (128 total). Jones was the first Golden Eagle to record 100-plus tackles in a season since D'Nerius Antoine in 2015 and produced the most since Gerald McRath registered 137 in 2008.

Moten proved to be one of the most dangerous cornerbacks in the league, ranking fourth nationally with five interceptions while sitting in the top eight in the country in passes defenses.

Huff made his way to Southern Miss after serving as head coach at Marshall University from 2021-24, posting a 32-20 record that culminated with a 31-3 victory over Louisiana in the 2024 Sun Belt Conference championship game.

Huff holds the distinction of being the only Marshall coach in the FBS era to lead the Herd to a bowl game in each of their first four seasons at the helm. During his tenure, Huff led Marshall to victories over No. 8 Notre Dame (2022) and Virginia Tech (2023). The 26-21 win over Notre Dame was part of a 9-4 season and was the Herd's first win over a Top 10 team since 2003.

In Huff's inaugural season in Huntington, Marshall finished 7-6 appearing in its 17th bowl game since moving to FBS in 1997. Huff also navigated the Herd to a five-game winning streak at the end of 2022, which was one of the nation's longest heading into the 2023 season. The 2022 campaign culminated with a 28-14 win over UConn in the Myrtle Beach Bowl.

The Herd finished 6-6 during the regular season in 2023 before dropping a 35-17 decision to UTSA in the Frisco Bowl. In 2024, Marshall registered its first league championship since capturing the 2014 Conference USA crown, while also recording the school's first 10-win season since 2015.

Described as an elite recruiter and developer of talent, Huff's proven history bolstered head coach Nick Saban's staff for the 2019 and 2020 seasons. In his inaugural season in



Tuscaloosa, Huff helped Najee Harris rush for a career-best 1,224 yards on 209 carries with 13 rushing touchdowns while catching 27 passes for 304 yards and seven more scores. In 2020, Harris was a consensus All-American who led the nation in total touchdowns (30), rushing touchdowns (26) and points (180). He also ranked third nationally in rushing yards (1,466) and holds the school record for total touchdowns (57), rushing touchdowns (46) and rushing yards (3,843). In his final season at Alabama, Huff helped lead the Crimson Tide to the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship over Ohio State University.

Huff arrived in Tuscaloosa after one season (2018) as the assistant head coach, run-game coordinator and running backs coach at Mississippi State. His one season in Starkville produced an effective rushing attack that averaged 223.6 yards per game to rank second in the SEC and 20th nationally.

Huff spent four seasons (2014-17) as Penn State's running backs coach and special teams coordinator. He recruited and developed one of the game's most electrifying players in Barkley, who was drafted by the New York Giants as the No. 2 overall pick in the 2018 draft. Numerous records fell at the running back position and on special teams under Huff's tutelage at Penn State.

In 2017, Barkley was a consensus All-American, becoming the first Big Ten running back in history to win Offensive Player of the Year honors twice. A Walter Camp National Player of the Year finalist, Barkley ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards in 2017 (2,329). He broke four school career records, including rushing touchdowns (43), total touchdowns (53), all-purpose yards (5,538) and consecutive games with a touchdown (15) in just three seasons.

Huff spent the 2013 season at Western Michigan as the running backs coach and helped the unit nearly double its rushing yards from 2012. The Broncos ran for 1,394 yards in 2013 after running for just 735 yards the year before.

During the 2012 season, Huff worked in the NFL as the assistant running backs coach for the Buffalo Bills. He helped guide C.J. Spiller to his first career 1,000-yard rushing campaign and a Pro Bowl invitation.

In 2011, Huff was on James Franklin's 2011 staff at Vanderbilt as the offensive quality control coach. Huff and Franklin also worked together at Maryland in 2009, when Huff was the assistant offensive line coach. Huff also mentored NFL first-round pick Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie as the tight ends and special teams coach at Tennessee State from 2007-08.

Huff graduated in 2005 from Hampton University where he served as a team captain, starting 12 games at center as a senior in 2005. He also played guard, fullback and tight end in his career.

"My family and I are so fired up about this opportunity," Huff said. "The city of Memphis, the leadership at the University and the level of consistency the football program has had over the recent years is incredible. I would like to thank University President Dr. Bill Hardgrave, Athletics Director Dr. Ed Scott, and

their entire team who has instilled their faith in me to lead this outstanding program. To the city of Memphis and Tiger Nation, it's time to STAND UP! To the players and administration, it's go time!"

A native of Denton, Maryland, Huff and his wife, Jessica, have three boys: B.J., Beau and Blaze.

pair of touchdowns and 193 yards rushing on the year.

- On defense, UT Martin has been able to bring ballcarriers down in the backfield with 14 tackles for loss on the year, but they have only been able to muster a pair of sacks.
- Sophomore safety Trey Cotton has been a bright spot. The 2026 Phil Steele Preseason All-OVC Third Team selection has caused the only player thus far this season with an interception or a forced fumble, recording one of each.
- Cotton, a native of Louisville, Kentucky, also leads the team in tackles with 24.
- Defensive end Chris Wilson is also a player to note as he sits second on the team in tackles with 17, while also having additional effects on the game with a pair of pass breakups and blocked kicks, with both blocks coming in UT Martin's season-opener against Central Arkansas.

"THREE THINGS IN LIFE THAT'S CERTAIN: DEATH, TAXES AND THAT THE TIGERS GONE' HUNT" - W, 27-21 at UNLV

- The Tigers opened the **Charles Huff** era with a statement win over RV/RV UNLV, a program who entered the season with higher odds than Memphis of becoming the Non-P4 representative in the College Football Playoff.
- Memphis entered the half trailing 14-7 after allowing a pair of explosive UNLV plays, only countered by the first of many connections from QB **Marcus Stokes** to TE **Hunter Tipton** on a 16-yard passing touchdown.
- In the second half, Stokes knotted the game up at 14 apiece on a 48-yard pass to WR **Stonka Burnside**, with RB **Jaylin Carter** later scoring on a 36-yard run to make it 21-21.
- The Tiger defense stood tall in the second half, limiting UNLV to just seven points in the final 30 minutes, forcing a pair of turnovers-on-downs and sacking Jackson Arnold six times, highlighted by 2.5 from DL **Elijah Kinsler**.
- Stokes finished his Memphis debut 15-for-26 for 223 yards and a pair of touchdown passes, also netting 45 yards on the ground.
- In a display of pure dominance at the point of attack, the Tigers recorded six sacks, with DL **Elijah Kinsler** (2.5), DL **J'Mond Tapp** (1.0), DL **Taylor Burton** (1.0), DL **Joseph Head Jr.** (1.0) and DL **Jaden McKinney** (0.5) all wreaking havoc in the backfield.

CHRISTENING THE STADIUM WITH A RIVALRY WIN - W, 42-24 vs. ARKANSAS STATE

- In front of a sold-out crowd of 45,632 in the newly renovated Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium, the Tigers put on a dominant display with a 42-24 win over Arkansas State in the Paint Bucket Bowl.
- RB **Jaylin Carter** shined for a second week in a row, this time going off for 183 rushing yards and four touchdowns, matching Mario Anderson Jr.'s TD total against North Texas in 2024 and the most rushing yards since Greg Desrosiers Jr.'s 204 last season at Florida Atlantic.
 - Carter was named the American Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his performance.
- Carter wasn't the only Memphis running back to show out as **Manny Covey** had 15 carries for 103 yards, giving him his first career 100-yard rushing game as well.
- QB **Marcus Stokes** became the first Memphis Tiger with 2 or more passing TDs in his first two starts since Riley Ferguson in 2016, finding **Jermame Hayes** and **Aidan O'Callaghan** in the end zone for each's first collegiate touchdown.
- After Memphis' defensive line starred against UNLV, the Tiger secondary stole the show against the Red Wolves as SAF **Dylan Smith**, SAF **Ahmere Foster** and LB **Zach Ruffin** each picked off Arkansas State QB Trey Owens a total of four times.
 - Smith picked off Owens twice, the first time a Tiger had multiple INTs in a game since Sylvonta Oliver in the 2022 SERVPRO First Responder Bowl against Utah State.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES - L, 20-38 at BOISE STATE

- The Tigers suffered their first loss of the season in a battle of two of the frontrunners for the top Group of Six program in a matchup that saw a contrast in play style and two completely different halves of competition.
- Memphis, a program formerly known for dominating time of possession, led 20-17 at the half with two of its scores just taking 33 seconds off the clock on an 87-yard reception by TE **Hunter Tipton** and an 80-yard run by RB **Jaylin Carter**.
 - Memphis' four scoring drives, all coming in the first half, took a total of 4:33 off the clock.
 - Comparatively, Boise State's scoring drives took a combined 21:14 of game time.
- After carrying a 20-17 lead into the half, Boise State took a commanding lead after a pair of defensive stops and scores, including the first punt-return touchdown allowed by Memphis since 2021.
- Memphis was shutout completely in the second half, with Boise State scoring the final 21 points of the game.
- QB **Marcus Stokes** had a career night in the loss, passing for 384 yards and connecting on three passes of 40-plus yards.
- TE **Hunter Tipton** had one of the best single-game performances by a Memphis tight end in program history, finishing the game with nine catches for 229 yards and a touchdown, en route to being named the John Mackey Award Tight End of the Week.
 - It was the most receiving yards by a Tiger since Calvin Austin III's 200 against Tulsa in 2021.
- SAF **Dylan Smith** led Memphis with 12 tackles in the loss, a new career high for the Southern Miss transfer.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Memphis was well represented on preseason national award watchlists by numerous student-athletes, as well as Preseason American Conference Teams put out by various publications.
- TE **Hunter Tipton**, DL **J'Mond Tapp**, LB **Mike Montgomery** and SAF **Ian Foster** were all named to the Shriners Children's East-West Bowl 1000 Watchlist.
- LB **Donovan Mathena** was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Nominee Class for the second season in a row, highlighting his continued commitment to on-the-field performance and community service efforts off the field.
 - Mathena also was named to the 2026 Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List for the second-straight season.
- RB **Manny Covey** picked up a nod on the 2026 Doak Walker Award Watch List, annually awarded to the best running back in the nation.
 - Memphis has had 10 players be named to the watch list in nine separate seasons since 2004, including players in the past three seasons.
- SAF **Ian Foster** was named to the Chuck Bednarik Award Preseason Watch List, an award given to the best defensive player in all of college football.

GAME NOTES

- o Memphis has had a player on the watch list now in each of the past three seasons.
- Seven Tigers garnered recognition on the 2026 *Phil Steele* Preseason American Conference Teams, with four first-teamers (DE **J'Mond Tapp**, LB **Mike Montgomery**, SAF **Ian Foster**, DL **Jaden McKinney**) on the defensive side and a trio of offensive linemen (**Phillip Gray**, **Riley McGehee**, **Maarten Woudsma**) being named to teams, with Gray as a third-team center and McGehee and Woudsma as fourth-team tackles and guards, respectively.
 - 11 Tigers claimed 12 spots on the 2026 *Athlon Sports* Preseason American Conference Team, with DL **J'Mond Tapp**, LB **Mike Montgomery** and SAF **Ian Foster** on the First Team, TE **Hunter Tipton** and SAF **Ahmere Foster** on the Second Team, WR **Tychaun Chapman**, OL **Maarten Woudsma**, **Ian Foster** (KR), DL **Jaden McKinney** and CB **Chauncey Logan Jr.** on the Third Team, and WR **Terrell Timmons Jr.** and SAF **Dylan Smith** on the Fourth Team.
 - DL **J'Mond Tapp** and SAF **Ian Foster** were both also named to the *Sports Info Solutions* Preseason American Conference Team, with Tapp listed as a DE and Foster as a defensive flex honoree. SIS's formula for selecting the team is based solely on data scouting and statistical analysis.
 - Memphis had six honorees on the *Pro Football Network* Preseason American Conference Team, including DL **J'Mond Tapp**, SAF **Ian Foster** and RB **Manny Covey** (PR) as first-team selections. OL **Riley McGehee** picked up his second preseason honor on the second team, along with CB **Anthony Richard Jr.** ;SAF **Ahmere Foster** also picks up his second honor, this time on the preseason all-conference third team.
 - Five Tigers were named to *HERO Sports'* Preseason Group of Six All-America Teams, with SAF **Ian Foster** and DL **J'Mond Tapp** on the first team, along with TE **Hunter Tipton**, LB **Mike Montgomery** and SAF **Ahmere Foster** all being named to the third team.
 - DL **J'Mond Tapp** was also recognized in *ESPN's* Adam Rittenberg's Top 15 Non-QB Playmakers as the only member from a non-Power 4 School, along with being named to *The Athletic's* Freaks List.
 - DL **J'Mond Tapp** also was named to the 2027 Panini Senior Bowl Top 300 List.
 - TE **Hunter Tipton** also picked up a nod on the 2026 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watchlist, awarded to the most outstanding offensive player with ties to the state of Texas through high school and/or college.
 - After recording six pressures, five tackles and a sack in Memphis' week zero win over UNLV, DL **J'Mond Tapp** was named the 2027 Shrine Bowl Defensive Player of the Week.
 - Opening his Memphis tenure with a debut win on the road, head coach **Charles Huff** was named the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Week.

OUR FOOTBALL FUTURE NOW: THE NEW-LOOK SIMMONS BANK LIBERTY STADIUM

- Memphis Athletics, alongside the University's Auxiliary Services Foundation, has completed a \$226.5 million renovation of Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium to redefine the college football gameday experience.
- The brand-new, four-level West Tower features 26 luxury suites, 36 loge boxes, 370 club seats and a full-service kitchen.
- With the renovations is the new Landers Plaza, providing fans an elevated experience on the west side.
- The stadium also now features 360 degree sound, fireworks around the bowl of the stadium and one of the largest ribbon boards in all of college football.
- The new stadium capacity sits at 45,632 after renovations, creating a more intimate atmosphere for all fans and adding to the *stadium pulse*.

HOME OPENERS

- Memphis' 2026 home opener kicked off a new era in Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium with a 42-24 win over Arkansas State in the Paint Bucket Bowl.
- The 2025 season got off to a bang with a 45-10 win over the Mocs.
- The Tigers opened the 2024 season against North Alabama and rolled to a dominant 40-0 shutout win.
- 2022's season-opening game on the road at Mississippi State snapped an 11-season streak of opening the season in Memphis.
- The Tigers are 49-61-3 all-time in season-opening contests.
- Memphis has won 12-straight home openers and have posted a record of 55-49-5 all-time in home-opening games.

NONCONFERENCE OPPONENTS IN MEMPHIS

- Memphis is 33-1 in the team's last 34 home games against nonconference opponents.
- Among the games during that stretch for the Tigers include victories over Arkansas (2025), Mississippi State (2021), Ole Miss (2019, 2015), UCLA (2017) and Kansas (2016).
- The lone loss during that stretch came against UTSA (now a member of The American), 31-28, on Sept. 25, 2021.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

- Head Coach Charles Huff built up a new coaching staff across the board, also bringing his assistant head coach, Telly Lockette, from Southern Miss and Marshall prior to the duo's time with the Golden Eagles.
- Offensively, Kevin Decker and David Weeks both come in from Old Dominion to serve as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator/tight ends coach, respectively. Rounding out the offensive staff are Andy Kwon coaching the offensive line and Aaron Dobson coaching the wide receiving corps.
- Lance Gidry joins as the program's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach after spending time as a defensive analyst at LSU in 2025 and time as Miami's defensive coordinator after being Marshall's defensive coordinator under Coach Huff from 2021-2022. The defensive position groups are coached by Eric Mathies (defensive line), Dominique Bowman (safeties), Tim Duffie (cornerbacks) and Mac Goode (linebackers asst.).

WE'RE STOKED

- **Marcus Stokes** became the first Memphis QB since Riley Ferguson in 2016 to throw for 2-plus TDs in his first two starts with a pair against both UNLV and Arkansas State.
o Stokes also set a career high with 384 passing yards at Boise State.
- Stokes, a West Florida transfer who was once committed to Florida in high school, dominated at the Division II level in 2025, winning Gulf South Conference Offensive Player of the Year, D2CCA Super Region 2 Offensive Player of the Year and being a finalist for the Harlon Hill Award, given to the most valuable player at the NCAA Division II level.

- After mentoring multiple first-round running backs in Saquon Barkley at Penn State and Najee Harris at Alabama,

Head Coach Charles Huff has built a balanced group of tailbacks who could all go off on a given day, guided by assistant head coach and running backs coach, Telly Lockette.

- **Dallan Hayden** comes in as the most experienced of the group after stints at Ohio State and Colorado. The Memphis native returned home for his final season, looking to build off of a current mark of 1,185 career rushing yards and eight rushing touchdowns.
- **Manny Covey** is set for his first season in the blue and gray after playing a versatile role at Cincinnati over the past two seasons. He recorded his first 100-yard rushing game against Arkansas State, while also having a 100-yard receiving performance under his belt and 156 career punt return yards from Cincinnati.
- **Jaylin Carter** followed Coach Huff from Southern Miss after rushing for 166 yards and a pair of touchdowns and logging 137 receiving yards as a true freshman in 2025.
 - o He's already surpassed his total from last season, even in one game as he rushed for 183 yards and four scores against Arkansas State after scoring once and having 97 rushing yards at UNLV.

FAMILIAR FACES ON DEFENSE

- Coach Huff brings over multiple members of his 2025 Southern Miss defense that finished 1st in the nation in interceptions (23) and fifth in turnover margin (1.08).
 - o Current Memphis Tigers **Ian Foster**, **Ahmere Foster**, **Mike Montgomery** and **Anthony Richard Jr.** account for 10 of those 23 interceptions.
- Counting all Southern Miss to Memphis transfers, the 2026 Tigers team has the following production from Southern Miss' 2025 season -
 - o Tackles - 411 of 1,095 (37.5%)
 - o Tackles for Loss - 26.5 of 78.0 (34.0%)
 - o Interceptions - 10 of 23 (43.5%)
 - o Sacks - 12.5 of 30.0 (41.7%)
- DL **J'Mond Tapp** follows Huff to Memphis for his final season after finishing in the top 40 in the FBS in sacks (7.5) and being named to the All-Sun Belt First Team in 2025.
- LB **Mike Montgomery** also follows to lead Huff's defense yet again after finishing in the top 30 in the nation in tackles per game (8.8) and picking off a pair of passes for the Golden Eagles last season, earning a Third Team All-Sun Belt nod.
- The third piece of a key trio of Southern Miss transfers from Huff's 2025 campaign is SAF **Ian Foster**, who picked off three passes, returning two for touchdowns while adding 72 tackles, being named to the All-Sun Belt Third Team.
- Of the numerous pieces that Huff brings from Southern Miss are **Ahmere Foster**, **Anthony Richard Jr.** and **Dylan King** in the defensive backfield, who all contributed to last year's dominance in Hattiesburg.
 - o The three combined for 5 interceptions and 105 tackles.
- The Memphis defensive line is anchored by multiple Southern Miss transfers in addition to Tapp in **Jaden McKinney** and **Jabari Ishmael**, who combined for 48 tackles in the interior tackle spots.
 - o DE **Elijah Kinsler** also comes in from the Golden Eagles after a limited role during his freshman season in 2025.

BUILDING THE BOOTS

- Memphis brought in a pair of veteran kickers with a lower amount of in-game experience.
- **Philippe Laforge** doubled his field goal total in the Tigers' season opener, converting on attempts of 32 and 36 yards on what eventually became the game-winning scores.
 - o Laforge was also a perfect 6-for-6 on PATs in Memphis' home opener against Arkansas State, sitting at 9-for-9 on the season.
 - o Laforge, a Coastal Carolina transfer, had attempted just four field goals and one extra point in his time as a Chanticleer, converting on attempts of 47 and 51 yards.
- Michigan State transfer **Tarik Ahmetbasic** enters his fourth collegiate season with just one point-after conversion in his career and no field goal attempts.

BEST AGAINST THE BEST

- Since 2015, Memphis has posted a record of 10-11 (.476) against top-25 ranked opponents.
- The 10 victories are the most over that stretch for any non-Power 4 team in the country.
- Memphis' 10 ranked wins since 2015 have come over No. 13/12 Ole Miss (2015), No. 18/21/20 Houston (2016), No. 25/RV UCLA (2017), No. 25/24 Navy (2017), No. 15/14 SMU (2019), No. 18/17/19 Cincinnati (2019), No. 21/21/20 Cincinnati (2019), No. 23/24 SMU (2021), No. 17/18/18 Tulane (2024) and No. 18/20 South Florida (2025).

AMONG THE ELITE

- Memphis has posted 109 victories since 2014, the 10th-most in the nation during that stretch.
 - o The 109 wins are the most among American Conference schools during that span.
- The Tigers also rank 11th in the country in winning percentage dating back to 2014 with their 108-46 (.699) mark.
- Memphis (68) is tied for the fifth-most home wins in the country since 2014, trailing only Alabama (79), Ohio State (77), Clemson (77) and Georgia (69). Memphis is tied with Oregon and Michigan with 68 home wins since 2014. The Tigers' .838 winning percentage is No. 10 in the country over that stretch.
- Memphis' streak of 12-straight seasons with a record of .500 or better is the third-longest streak among Group of 6 and independent schools and is the longest such streak in the American.

BOWL STREAK

- After a 6-0 start capped off by a 45-7 win at home against Tulsa, Memphis was bowl eligible for the 12th-consecutive season, the longest stretch of any non-Power 4 team in the country.
- The six-game stretch became the fastest mark to reach bowl eligibility by the Tigers in the last decade, narrowly surpassing the seven games needed in 2024, 2019 and 2017.
- Memphis is one of seven teams in FBS with 12 or more consecutive bowl-game appearances along with Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Iowa.
- The Tigers sit at 9-9 in bowl games after a 31-7 loss to NC State in last season's Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl, a game that snapped a streak of four consecutive bowl wins.

MEMPHIS IN OVERTIME GAMES

GAME NOTES

- Memphis has been involved in 11 overtime games (3-8). The Tigers have played a total of five multi-overtime affairs and have a 2-3 record in those games.
- The most recent overtime game for the Tigers was in 2024 at Charlotte when Memphis won 44-38.
- The Tigers came up just short in the 2017 American Conference Championship game in double-OT at UCF, 62-55. The Tigers and Knights combined to score 117 points, the highest total in a conference title game in FBS history.
- Memphis ended the 2014 season with the first overtime game in five seasons, defeating BYU 55-48 in double-OT at the Miami Beach Bowl.

MADE IN MEMPHIS

- Since 2015, 15 Memphis players have been drafted by the National Football League.
- Travis Burke was the most recent Memphis draftee, being selected in the 4th round (117th overall) by the Los Angeles Chargers in the 2026 NFL Draft.
- Defensive back Kobee Minor was selected as “Mr. Irrelevant” in the 2025 NFL Draft, going in the seventh round as the last 257th pick to the New England Patriots.
- OL Dylan Parham was selected in the third round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Las Vegas Raiders, while WR Calvin Austin III was taken by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the fourth round.
- With the selections, Memphis has had at least one player selected in nine of the last 12 NFL Drafts, with 16 players being taken over that span.
- Currently, seven Tigers are on NFL active rosters entering the regular season – WR Calvin Austin III (New York Giants), OT Travis Burke (Los Angeles Chargers), K Jake Elliott (Philadelphia Eagles), RB Kenneth Gainwell (Tampa Bay Buccaneers), OG Dylan Parham (New York Jets), K Riley Patterson (Miami Dolphins) and RB Tony Pollard (Tennessee Titans).

TIGER GREATS WHO PLAYED IN THE LEAGUE

- **Charlie Babb**, DB, member of the Miami Dolphins’ undefeated, Super Bowl VIII championship team (1972-79).
- **Marcus Bell**, DT, played for the Arizona Cardinals, Detroit Lions and New York Giants (2001-07).
- **John Bramlett**, LB, Pro Bowl player for both the Denver Broncos and Miami Dolphins before concluding his playing career with the New England Patriots and Atlanta Falcons (1965-71).
- **Isaac Bruce**, WR, four-time Pro Bowl selection whose 15,208 receiving yards ranks fourth all-time in the league. Played for the St. Louis Rams and San Francisco 49ers (1994-2008).
- **Ken Irwin**, DB, played for the Buffalo Bills, New Orleans Saints and Minnesota Vikings (1995-2005). Inducted into the University of Memphis Athletic Hall of Fame in 2018.
- **Harry Schuh**, OT, a member of the Oakland Raiders’ All-Time Team who played in the second AFL-NFL World Championship Game. Was an All-Pro player for the Raiders before concluding his playing career with the Los Angeles Rams and Green Bay Packers (1965-74).
- **DeAngelo Williams**, RB, was a first-round draft pick by the Carolina Panthers in 2006 and rushed for over 8,000 yards in his 11-year NFL career. In 2008 and 2015, Williams was the NFL’s rushing touchdowns leader. Williams is one of six Tigers to have their jerseys retired and he was inducted into the M Club Hall of Fame in 2014.
- **Stephen Gostkowski**, K, was a three-time All-Pro and two-time Super Bowl Champion (2015, 2017) with the New England Patriots. Gostkowski finished his NFL career as the Patriots’ all-time leading scorer (1,457 points). He was a 2016 M Club Hall of Fame Inductee after being the only student-athlete in CUSA history to be an All-Freshman selection in both baseball and football.
- **Clinton McDonald**, DT, Super-Bowl winner with the Seattle Seahawks in 2014. Also played for the Cincinnati Bengals, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Oakland Raiders and Arizona Cardinals.
- **Dontari Poe**, DT, a two-time Pro-Bowler and 2013 Second Team All-Pro selection with the Kansas City Chiefs. Also spent time with the Atlanta Falcons, Carolina Panthers and Dallas Cowboys. Poe was also a Second-Team All-CUSA selection in 2011 with the Tigers in 2011; a season where he was named an All-American Honorable Mention.
- **Darrell Henderson Jr.**, RB, was a third-round selection after back-to-back all-conference seasons, closing out his Memphis career as a consensus First-Team All-American and a Jim Brown Award winner. Henderson went on to carve out a career with the Los Angeles Rams and Jacksonville Jaguars, winning a Super Bowl in 2022 with the Rams.
