THE RECORDS

Idaho is 3-3 overall and 1-1 in Sun Belt action after a thrilling victory at Louisiana-Monroe last Saturday. New Mexico State, which is coming off a bye week, is 2-3 overall and 0-2 in the Sun Belt. Both teams have league losses to Troy – Idaho 34-13 and NMSU 52-6.

THE COACHES

PAUL PETRINO is in his fourth season at Idaho. While it is his first head coaching job, it is not Petrino's first stint at Idaho. His coaching career began at Carroll College (his alma mater, 1989). From Carroll, he went to Idaho where he coached running back, receivers and special teams from 1992-94. From Idaho it was on to Utah State (1995-97), Louisville (1998-99), Southern Mississippi (2000-02), Louisville (2003-06), Atlanta Falcons (2007), Arkansas (2008-09), Illinois (2010-11) and Arkansas (2012).

DOUG MARTIN is in his fourth season at New Mexico State. A graduate of the University of Kentucky, he began his coaching career there as a graduate assistant before stops at East Texas State (1989-91) and East Carolina (1992-02) before accepting the head coaching job at Kent State. He was 29-53 at Kent State before spending 2011 as an assistant at New Mexico State and 2012 as an assistant at Boston College before returning to NMSU as the head coach.



THE SERIES

Idaho has a 15-7 lead in the series that first was played in 1971. The two teams, at times, have been members together of the Big West, Western Athletic and Sun Belt conferences. Of the 22 games in the series, 11 have been decided by a touchdown or less.

The game is on SWX and ESPN3 with Sam Adams calling the play-by-play and Bill Ames providing the analysis.

Captains will be announced weekly. DE Tueni Lupeamanu, QB Matt Linehan, OL Jordan Rose and P/K Austin Rehkov were captains against Louisiana-Monroe.

REMEMBERING 99

You'll see some Vandals wearing #99 stickers on their helmets. Those are the awards given each game to players who show the most grit and determination. They're wore in memory of Jace Malek. Jace was diagnosed with cancer the day

before National Letter of Intent signing day in 2015. The Vandals honored his offer and he was an inspiring and vital member of the Vandal Family throughout the season in his role as a student assistant coach. Jace passed away in February 2016 just days after his 19th birthday.

COACH TO CURE MD

During the game at UNLV, Idaho's coaches participated in the national Coach To Cure MD movement this weekend at UNLV. Coach To Cure MD provides awareness and fundraises in the hopes of finding a cure for Duchenne muscular dystrophy, a lethal genetic disorder of childhood. In its history, Coach To Cure MD has raised more than \$1 million.

A STAR

Idaho kicker/punter Austin Rehkow was honored after week six by the Lou Groza Award as a Star of the Week. Rehkow not only kicked the game-winning field goal at Louisiana-Monroe but had three other field goals and two successful PATs in the victory.

IN THE RANKINGS

Austin Rehkow still has a firm hold on the NCAA career punting lead with his average of 46.7 over the course of more than three seasons – he he does it while doubling as the Vandals' placekicker. His average is 0.7 yards longer than that of runner-up JK Scott of Alabama and 1.2 more than Florida's Johnny Townsend.

With a solid finish to the season, Rehkow likely will wrap up his Vandal career as the NCAA FBS career punting average record-holder. The records are

46.3 (150-199 punts) by Todd Sauerbrun of West Virginia (1991-94), 45.3 (200-249 punts) by Ryan Packemeier of Wake Forest (2002-05) and 45.2 (minimum of 250 punts) by Daniel Sepulveda of Baylor (2003-06). Rehkow has 192 career punts.

Rehkow's punting average – and hang time, have enabled the Vandals to rank second in the Sun Belt and ninth nationally in net punting (42.90). Their punt return defense (1.38) is second in the league and 11th nationally.

Idaho continues to show the discipline it has gained during the past couple of season and is second in the Sun Belt in fewest penalties per game (5.17) and is third in fewest total penalties with 31.

Rehkow is second in field goal percentage (.857), while Kaden Ellis is second in forced fumbles, and Aaron Duckworth is first in rushing touchdowns with four. Ellis and Jayshawn Jordan are in a group tied for second with total interceptions this season (they have three each). Rehkow is second in field goals per game.

SPEAKING OF ...

Speaking of current national career leaders, Idaho faces a host of players who are among the top five nationally.

New Mexico State's Larry Rose III is the current national career rushing average leader, Washington State's Luke Falk is the career passing yards per game leader, and Shalom Luani is the interceptions leader.

Second among career leaders are Appalachian State's Marcus Cox in rushing and all-purpose yards and Falk in total offense.

NEWS AND NOTES

Others in the top five are Rose (third all-purpose yards per game), Falk (second total offense per game), Appalachian State's Marcus Cox (third, all-purpose yards), UL-Lafayette's Elijah McGuire (fourth all-purpose yards), Washington State's Gabe Marks (third receptions; fourth receptions per game) and New Mexico State's Rodney Butler (fourth assisted tackles).

AT LOUISIANA-MONROE

Austin Rehkow was the man of the hour for the Vandals at ULM when he kicked the game-winning field goal as time expired at Warhawk Stadium. He was a significant contributor all night with the Vandals' first three scores all by field goal. He added two extra points and used his punting to keep ULM at bay.

Help can in other areas in the form of four turnovers – interceptions by Kaden Elliss, Jayshawn Jordan and Russell Siavii to go with a fumble recovery by Jordan.

Need more? Qendarrion Barnett blocked a punt and Kendrick Trotter scooped up the ball and returned it 19 yards to score.

From the offensive side, Jordan Frysinger had four receptions for 100 yards, which includes a 71-yard score, and Aaron Duckworth covered 121 yards on the ground on 16 carries.

VS. TROY

Troy spoiled the Vandals' Homecoming with its 34-13 victory in a game during which the Vandals' offense struggled to gain traction and the defense was susceptible to the big play.

Idaho was held to field goals on its first two possessions, which were sandwiched around a fumble recovery by Kaden Elliss. The Trojans went on to score 34 successive points to seal the victory.

The Vandals did come up with three turnovers – Elliss' fumble recovery and interceptions by Jayshawn Jordan and Jordan Grabski.

AT UNLV

Heroes abounded in the Vandals' overtime victory at UNLV. There was Callen Hightower, who score the winning touchdown on a pass from Matt Linehan, who two plays earlier had converted a key third down, and earlier still had scored a rushing touchdown.

There was Kaden Elliss, who returned on of his two pass interceptions for a 31-yard touchdown. He added a break up to his disruption to the UNLV

passing game.

Austin Rehkow, the ever dependable kicker/punter, for the Vandals had a stellar evening with all five of his punts being downed inside the 20 (four inside the 10) to go with two successive field goals. His hang time was such on his punts that UNLV only attempted one return – and had zero yards for the effort.

There was Aaron Duckworth, who carried the ball 20 times for 90 yards.

Not to mention, Ed Hall, who had 11 solo tackles and four assists in a career-best 15-tackle game.

AT WASHINGTON STATE

Tony Lashley and Tueni Lupeamanu both had career bests with Lashley's 10 solo tackles and 11 overall his career highs. Lupemanu had two tackles for loss (-13 yards) in his best game in that category.

Deon Watson and Callen Hightower each had five receptions – season highs for a Vandal receiver, against the Cougars.

AT WASHINGTON

After a commendable first quarter, the Vandals found the going tough against eighth-ranked Washington at Husky Stadium. Idaho trailed just 7-0 at the end of the first quarter but was down 35-0 at the half.

Trent 'Buck' Cowan provided the Vandals with their first TD of the game when he pulled in a 20-yard pass from Matt Linehan with 4:44 to go in the third.

Two freshmen quarterbacks – red-shirt Gunnar Amos and true Mason Petrino, saw their first collegiate action at Husky Stadium. Amos scored for the first time in his college career on a six-yard run in the fourth quarter and Petrino wound up as Idaho's leading rusher with 48 yards on nine carries.

With two from D.J. Olmstead, the Vandals totaled four tackles for loss on the day. Kaden Elliss and Aikeem Coleman each had one.

VS. MONTANA STATE

The Vandals used a hearty defensive and determined running game to win their season opener against Montana State on Sept. 1 – their third Thursday night season-opener in a row.

Junior Aaron Duckworth (Orange Park, Fla.), who in 2015 was the understudy to current Arizona Cardinal Elijah Penny, carried the ball 14 times for 108 yards and two scores. He didn't have a single carry that resulted in lost yardage.

On the defensive side of the ball, line-

LB Kaden Elliss – Sophomore

Elliss was recognized by the league for his two-interception performance in Idaho's 33-30 overtime victory at UNLV. He returned the first one 31 yards to score the first touchdown of the game. He is from Salt Lake City's Judge Memorial Catholic High School and is majoring in Human Resources Management.

WEEK #6 ~ SPECIAL TEAMS

K/P Austin Rehkow – Senior

Rehkow was recognized after kicking four field goals, including the game winner, in Idaho's victory at ULM. His 27-yard game-winning kick came as time expired. He also was good on two PATs and averaged 40.7 yards per punt with three being down at or inside the 10. He is a graduate of Spokane Valley's Central Valley High School and is majoring in Exercise Science and Health.

backer Tony Lashley (Kansas City, Mo.) was a menace to the Bobcats with three tackles for loss – one a sack, included in his nine total tackles. Those numbers are career highs for Lashley, who missed most of 2015 with injury.

Defensive lineman Tueni Lupeamanu (Herriman, Utah) had a dominating evening with eight total tackles, while fellow senior Russell Siavii (Wahaiwa, Hawai'i) opened the season with an interception – the same way he ended 2015. He now has five picks for his career.

Senior safety Jayshawn Jordan (Seattle, Wash.) also had a strong return after missing 2015 with injury with six tackles – the same number redshirt freshman Mike Linehan (Highland Park, Texas) totaled in his collegiate debut.

Senior punter/kicker Austin Rehkow (Spokane Valley, Wash.) added to his already impressive career numbers. He now has 46 field goals (out of 65 attempts) and remains Idaho's – and the NCAA's, all-time career punting average leader at 47.1 yards per kick.

NEWS AND NOTES

WATCH LISTS

Four Vandals are on national award preseason watch lists with one, senior kicker/punter Austin Rehkow on two.

Rehkow (Spokane Valley, Wash.) is one of just two players in the nation to be on the watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which recognizes college football's best punter, and the Lou Groza Award, which is given annually to the player voted to be the best kicker.

Buck Cowan (Camas, Wash.) finished fourth among the nation's top tight ends in 2015 and is being recognized early this year as a member of the watch list for the John Mackey Award, awarded to the top tight end in the country.

Tueni Lupeamanu (Herriman, Utah) is on the watch list for the Polynesian College Football Player of the year. Former Vandal Mike Iupati, now with the NFL's Arizona Cardinals, is in the Polynesian Football Hall of Fame.

Center Steve Matlock (Boise, Idaho) is on the Rimington Award Watch List after taking over as the Vandals' starting center in 2015.

GOOD REASON TO WATCH

There are plenty of good reasons to watch Austin Rehkow as his career as a punter and kicker continue to grow. He enters his senior season as the NCAA career punting leader with an average of 47.22 yards per kick. He's joined on the second team by fellow Group of Five players Rashaad Penny (a kicker returner from San Diego State) and Corey Davis (a receiver from Western Michigan). Penny, ironically, is the younger brother of former Vandal Elijah Penny – now with the Arizona Cardinals.

CBS PRESEASON

Rehkow is one of just three non-Power 5 players on the CBS Sports Preseason All-American team. Rehkow is the second team punter and is on the list

VANDAL FAMILY

Idaho has eight sons who are following in their fathers' footsteps as Vandals. 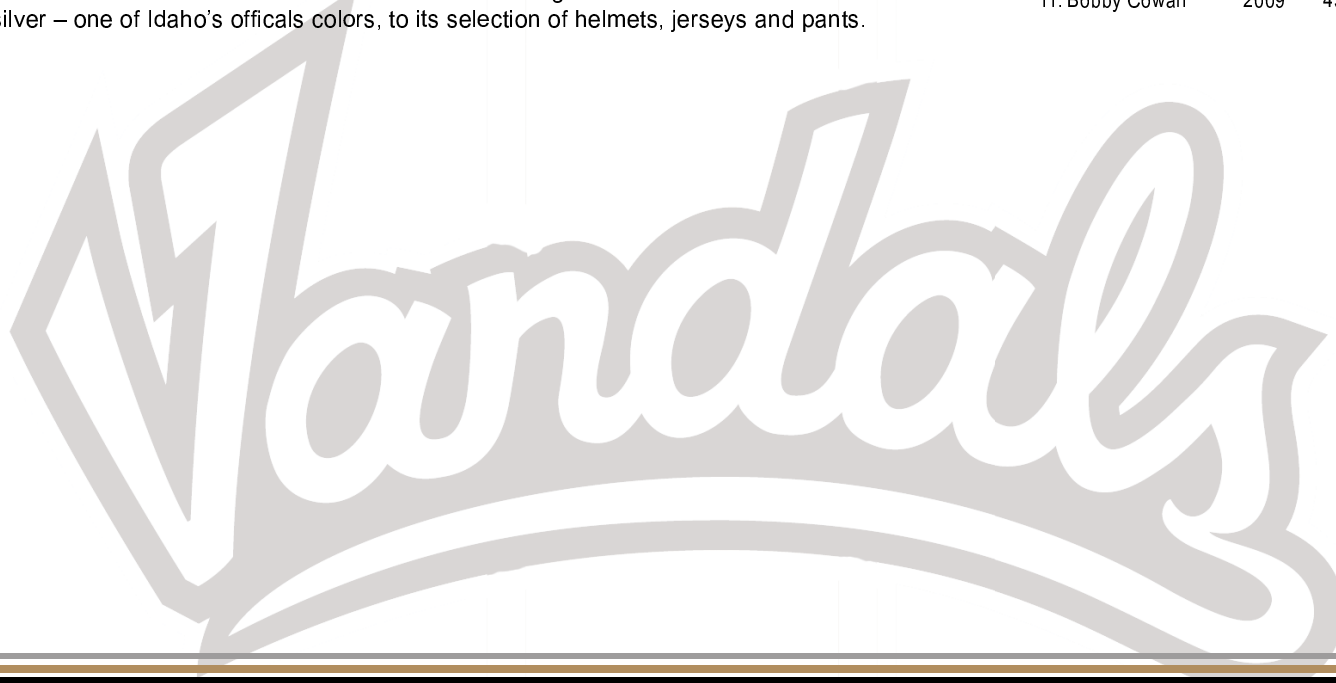

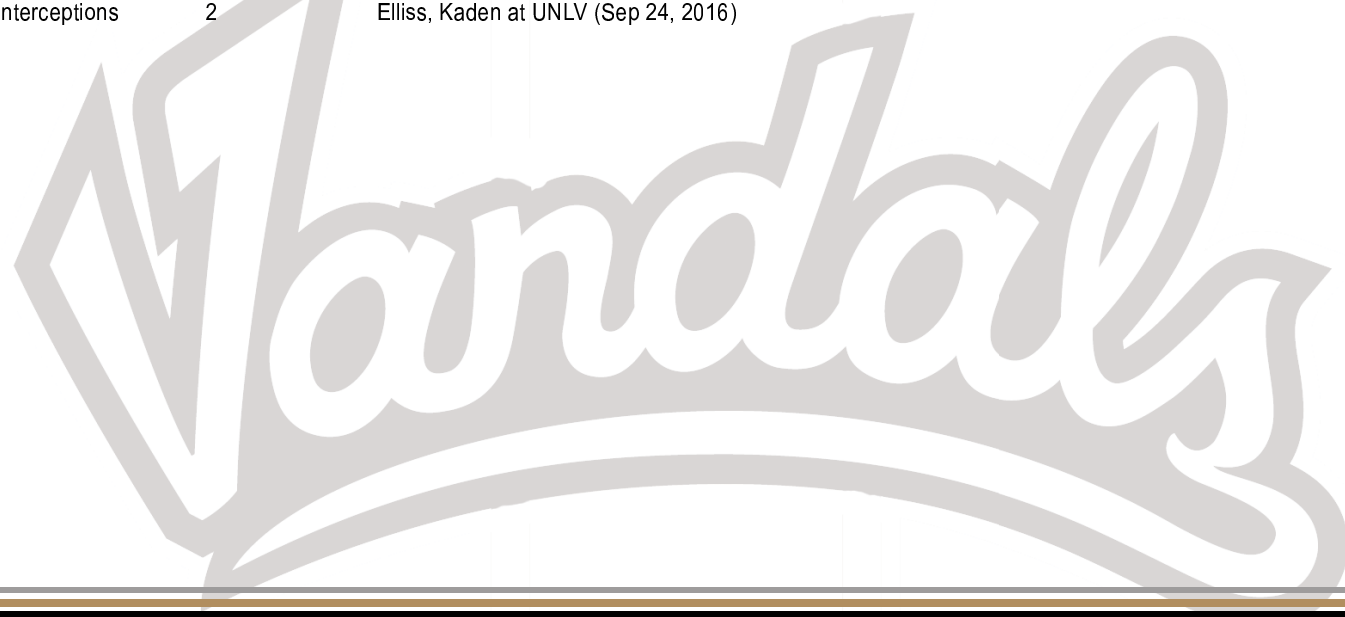
