## PICK SIX

**1. THE GAME:** Idaho football begins Big Sky Conference play Saturday (Sept. 22), at No. 21/25 UC Davis. Kickoff is slated for 4 p.m. PT. The game will be televised by Eleven Sports and available on Pluto TV.

**2. ABOUT UC DAVIS:** The Aggies began the season with a win over FBS member San José State and are currently 2-1, ranked No. 21 in the STATS FCS Poll. Wide receiver Keelan Doss was a top-three finalist for the 2017 Walter Payton Award and an early-season favorite for the honor this year.

**3. BACK TO THE BIG SKY:** Saturday will mark Idaho's first Big Sky Conference game since Nov. 18, 1995. The Vandals won their last league game as a member of the Big Sky, defeating Boise State 33-13 in Moscow. Idaho would go on to finish tied for second in the conference that season and make its 11th NCAA Playoff appearance. The Vandals moved to the bowl subdivision the following year, playing in the Big West from 1996-2000, the Sun Belt from 2001-04, the WAC from 2005-12, as an independent in 2013 and most recently in the Sun Belt from 2014-17.

**4. VS RANKED FCS FOES:** During its 22 years as an FBS member, Idaho took on nine nationally-ranked FCS opponents. The Vandals went 3-6 in those games, including its most recent meeting with a ranked FCS team, a 20-3 loss against No. 12 Eastern Washington in 2012. That is also Idaho's last loss to an FCS opponent. The Vandals' last win against a ranked FCS foe came in 2007, a 20-13 win over No. 22 Cal Poly.

In 1995, Idaho's previously most recent season as an FCS member, the Vandals went 4-2 in six games against ranked FCS opponents. They won three consecutive games over ranked teams to end the regular season, defeating No. 13 Northern Arizona, No. 15 Northern Iowa and No. 16 Boise State in the first three weeks of November to earn a playoff berth. Idaho entered the playoffs ranked No. 17, but fell at No. 1 McNeese State in the first round.

**5. A MAN WHO CAN DO BOTH:** Idaho senior Kaden Elliss is expected to play a substantial role on both sides of the ball for the Vandals. Elliss, a preseason All-American at linebacker, will take a significant amount of snaps on offense as a tight end, wide receiver and full back. Last season Elliss was a second-team All-Sun Belt selection at linebacker with 80 tackles, including 16 for loss and six sacks. He also made seven receptions for 156 yards and two touchdowns in limited action at tight end.

**6. PRESEASON ACCOLADES:** Three Vandals landed on the Big Sky Preseason All-Conference Team, as voted on by select media members who cover the league. Cade Coffey (punter), Kaden Elliss (linebacker) and Noah Johnson (offensive guard) each earned spots on the 31-player all-league team. The same trio was named to Phil Steele's Preseason All-America Team, including Johnson getting a first-team nod. He and Elliss were also named preseason All-Americans by STATS.

IT STARTS AT THE TOP

HEAD COACH PAUL PETRINO

Paul Petrino enters his sixth season as Idaho's head coach, leading the Vandals in their return to the Big Sky Conference. The move also returns Petrino to his football roots. The Montana native got his first taste of Division I coaching as an assistant at Idaho from 1992-94, including the Vandals' last Big Sky title in 1992 and three consecutive NCAA Playoff appearances.

The 2017 team featured the first five-year class of Vandals under Petrino. Among that group was record-setting quarterback Matt Linehan, 1,000-yard rusher Aaron Duckworth and Academic All-America wide receiver Jacob Sannon.

A four-year starter under Petrino, Linehan surpassed some of the most sacred names in Vandal football history. He became the program's all-time leader in completions and when his senior season was cut three games short by injury, Linehan finished just shy of Doug Nussmeier's record for career passing yards.

Idaho played a school-record seven one-possession games in 2017, including its five conference losses coming by a combined 24 points, on the way to finishing 4-8. Still, the team featured 10 all-conference selections. For the first time since 2008 three Vandals picked up first-team accolades, including Duckworth who became the first Idaho running back to earn first-team all-league honors since 2000.

Petrino's head coaching career thus far is highlighted by Idaho's 2016 campaign. He guided the Vandals to bowl eligibility for the first time since 2009 - and won their bowl game in record-setting and entertaining fashion. For his efforts, Petrino was voted the 2016 Sun Belt Coach of the Year.

The Vandals' bowl eligibility was the result of their posting their best regular-season record since the 1998 team (Idaho's first bowl team) went 8-3. They wrapped up the year 9-4 after beating Colorado State 61-50 in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl - largely recognized as one of the most entertaining of the bowl season. It was the highest-scoring bowl game of 2016 and Linehan, who was named game MVP, had one of the top pass efficiency ratings of any quarterback involved in postseason play.

The bowl victory was the culmination of not just gritty, determined efforts week-in and week-out during 2016, but of the first four years of Petrino's reign. After back-to-back one-victory seasons, the Vandals were 4-8 in 2015. That marked the beginning of the on-field visibility of the process that started in December 2012 when Petrino was hired.

From the minute he arrived on the University of Idaho campus, Petrino infused the Vandals with an intensity that reverberated around the Kibbie Dome and throughout the Vandal Family. His practices mirror his personality - focused, intense and determined.

With his accountability-based approach in place, the Vandals' APR has improved every season and the team's spring 2017 grade-point average of 2.91 is the program's second-highest term GPA on record. He was using the same approach to elevating the classroom successes as he was on the field where effort and discipline were being preached day in and day out.

The result was the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl victory and one of the most incredible program turnarounds in history. The program had waded through three successive one-victory seasons (one under the previous staff) before four wins in 2015 and the 9-4 2016 team.

Bits and pieces of the progress made deep within the program were evident before the wins started to build on the field. Broc Westlake, a linebacker throughout Petrino's tenure, graduated in December 2015 with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average and was one of two Vandals to earn the department's prestigious Rich and Mary Fox Award, which is given annually to the graduating student-athlete(s) with the highest cumulative grade-point average. In graduating Summa Cum Laude, he also was recognized as a National Football Foundation's Hampshire Honor Society.

In 2015, the Vandals led the Sun Belt in seven statistical categories and were second in another five. Those conference rankings translated to their being in the top 25 percent nationally in 11 categories.

In his first season back at Idaho, he took the Vandals against a schedule that featured not only the eventual national champion, but a total of seven bowl teams, which included four teams that, at one time or another, were ranked among the nation's top 25. While the Vandals didn't finish with the win-loss mark he would have liked, his first class of recruits showed it can provide the base for a bright Vandal future.

In that season, Petrino had his first Vandal All-American in punter Austin Rehkow, whose record-setting season earned him a spot on the Walter Camp All-America team. A true freshman in 2013, Rehkow's average of 47.8 yards per kick is an NCAA record for a freshman as well as the overall record for a player who punted at least 75 times in one season. He went on to become the only four-time first-team all-conference selection in Vandal history.

In year two of his tenure, Petrino took the Vandals back to the Sun Belt Conference after one season as an FBS independent. A passing game fueled by Linehan, a redshirt freshman at the time, and senior receiver Joshua McCain was one of the nation's best and Rehkow again repeated as the national punting average leader and was a finalist for the Ray Guy Award. The Vandals were significantly more competitive and off the field they made huge improvements in the classroom. The team posted one of its highest grade-point-averages in team history and improved its APR by leaps and bounds.

## HEAD COACH PAUL PETRINO



Coaching football is in Petrino's blood. Tagging along with his dad, Bob Petrino, Sr., as he coached the Carroll College (Montana) Saints into national prominence, Petrino knew from the time he was six years old he wanted to coach. He played for his dad at Carroll and was the Football Gazette NAIA Division II Player of the Year and a two-time Kodak All-American quarterback after setting 16 school records during a career that included four conference titles and a 36-6 record from 1985-88.

He's paid his dues – and along the way has put together a résumé of success.

During his 23 years as an assistant, he coached in 12 bowl games and five I-AA playoff games. He spent one season (2007) with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons. As a Division I coach, he was on staffs who combined for a 152-93 record – a .650 winning percentage.

He already made his mark at Idaho when he coached two players who have been inducted into the Vandal Athletics Hall of Fame – running back Sherriden May and receiver Yo Murphy. They are just a small sampling of the successes of his players. In the 2012 NFL draft, five offensive players under his tutelage were drafted. The group, which included four receivers, represented the greatest number of players coached by one coach in that year's draft.

For Petrino, the return to Moscow was a return to his Northwest roots. A native of Butte, Mont., he was raised in Helena where his football legacy began. After serving as an assistant to his dad for two seasons (1990-91), he headed to Moscow for his first stop with the Vandals when he was hired as the receivers/running backs/special teams coach in 1992. His next stop was Utah State (receivers/special teams, 1995-97) then on to Louisville (receivers, 1998-99), Southern Miss (quarterbacks, 2000-03), Louisville (offensive coordinator/receivers, 2003-06), Atlanta Falcons (receivers, 2007), Arkansas (offensive coordinator/receivers, 2008-09), Illinois (offensive coordinator/receivers, 2010-11), and Arkansas (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks, 2012).



### FAMILY FIRST

Petrino and his wife Maya - who he lovingly refers to as his all-time best recruit - have three children: Mason, Anne Mari and Ava.

Mason is a junior quarterback for the Vandals. The Petrinos are not the only father-son combination on Idaho's roster. Defensive line coach Luther Ellis is the father of linebackers Kaden (senior) and Christian (sophomore).

Anne Mari is a sophomore outfielder for Montana's softball team. Paul's spring football schedule is structured around attending her games.

The Petrinos elected to live in Pullman when they arrived in 2013, allowing Mason to play football and soccer in high school as Washington high school boys' soccer is a spring sport.

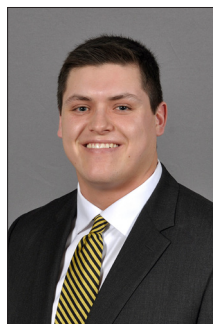

**VANDAL FOOTBALL NOTES - TEAM**

**VANDALS VS UC DAVIS:** Idaho's only previous meeting with UC Davis came Oct. 11, 1997, a 44-14 Vandal victory in Moscow. The Aggies competed at the Division II level at the time, before becoming a Division I FCS member in 2007. Idaho freshman Dennis Gibbs returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown in the game. Gibbs would go on to score on a 99-yard fumble return later in the year and added a 99-yard interception return the following season.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Idaho cruised to a 56-10 victory against Western New Mexico in the Vandals' home opener, Sept. 8, before taking their bye week. Idaho scored twice on special teams in the fourth quarter to blow the game open and romp to its largest margin of victory since 2000.

**THE RETURN:** This season, Idaho football returns to the Big Sky Conference and the Football Championship Subdivision. The Vandals previously won eight conference titles as a charter member of the Big Sky from 1963-95. Idaho qualified for the national playoffs 11 times in their final 14 years at the then-Division I-AA level. A 22-year run in the Football Bowl Subdivision netted a 3-0 record in bowl games, including a win in the 2016 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. Five current Vandals started in the latest bowl victory.

Sixth-year head coach Paul Petrino was an assistant coach on Idaho's last Big Sky championship team in 1992. Petrino coached running backs and wide receivers during his three-year stint as an assistant in Moscow from 1992-94, his first Division I coaching job. Among his wide receivers on the 1992 championship team was Walt Saunders, father of Vandal senior running back Isaiah Saunders.

**CLOSE ONLY COUNTS IN...:** The Vandals played a school-record seven games decided by one possession last season. All seven came in Sun Belt play. Idaho went 2-5 in those games, suffering its five conference losses by a combined 24 points.

**LIVING IN THE BACKFIELD:** The Vandal defense ranked third in the Sun Belt and 14th nationally last year with 7.6 tackles for loss per game. Idaho finished fifth in the league and 49th in the country with 2.25 sacks per game. The Vandals recorded seven sacks against Louisiana (Oct. 7), their most in a single game since 1999, when they tallied eight against Nevada.

**WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE:** Under Paul Petrino, Idaho has seen its success in the win column tied almost directly to winning the turnover battle. In 2013, Petrino's first season, the Vandals committed more turnovers than their opponent nine times. In the following years that number decreased to seven, five and eventually just four times in 2016 and again in 2017.

**RUNNING TO VICTORY:** The Vandals have won 12 of the last 14 games they outgained their opponent on the ground. The Sept. 16 loss at Western Michigan marked Idaho's first loss when outrushing its opponent since 2014.

**FAMILY AFFAIR:** Many football teams say they are like a family. In a number of cases, the Vandals actually are family. Head coach Paul Petrino's son Mason is an Idaho quarterback, while defensive line coach Luther Elliss is the father of Vandal linebackers Kaden and Christian. Another pair of brothers are on the roster in Wryor and Michael Noil. First-year outside linebackers coach Adam Breske is the son of defensive coordinator Mike Breske.

**FLIPPING THE FIELD:** Idaho enters the week as the national leader in net punting. The Vandals are averaging 49.29 net yards per punt, including surrendering -1.0 yards per return, the third-best mark in the country. Redshirt sophomore punter Cade Coffey is averaging 48.9 yards per punt, which would lead the FCS, but his 3.5 punts per game are just shy of the NCAA minimum 3.6 per game to qualify for the national rankings.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Idaho special teams came through in the Vandals' 56-10 win against Western New Mexico (Sept. 8). Idaho scored on a blocked field goal return for the first time since 2005 and on a punt return for the first time since 2011. The big plays both came in the fourth quarter, at the end of consecutive Mustang drives. Christian Elliss blocked a 38-yard field goal attempt and Dorian Clark eventually scooped up the loose ball, returning it 47 yards for a touchdown. The ensuing WNMU series ended in a punt, which David Ungerer took back 65 yards for another score.

**FIRST TIMERS:** Seven Vandals made their first career start at the NCAA level in the season opener at Fresno State (Sept. 1): Christian Elliss, Matt Faupusa, Logan Floyd, Cutrell Haywood, Brandon Luckett, Ben Taliulu and Cameron Townsend. Another 10 Vandals made their Idaho debut in the game.

**IN MEMORY OF BOB PETRINO SR.:** Idaho head coach Paul Petrino lost his father, Bob Sr., July 26, at the age of 81. The elder Petrino was the head football coach at Carrol College for 28 years, winning 17 conference championships. Paul was a four-year starter at quarterback for his father and later joined his coaching staff. Vandal assistant coaches Kris Cinkovich and Troy Purcell also played under Bob Petrino at Carrol College and Cinkovich later served as his offensive coordinator during Paul's playing career.

**PROJECTIONS:** Idaho football was projected to finish fourth in the Big Sky Preseason Coaches' Poll and fifth in a vote of the conference's media members.

**30 THE MAGIC NUMBER:** The Vandals have won each of the last 10 games in which they scored 30 points.

**HOMEGROWN:** Idaho football's roster features 20 student-athletes from the state of Idaho. Of the 20 Idahoans, 10 are from Northern Idaho and another 14 Washington residents are from within 75 miles of the campus. Thirteen of the 34 local products are featured on this week's two-deep.

**DEGREE IN HAND:** Four Vandal football student-athletes have already earned their bachelor's degree. Seniors Alex Boatman, Dorian Clark, Jordan Grabski and Isaiah Saunders completed their first degree with eligibility remaining and are working toward additional degrees.

## BIG PLAYS

Idaho's coaching staff defines big plays as rushes of 15+ yards and passes of 30+ yards. A game with at least four big plays is considered a good performance.

### IDAHO

**CLIMBING THE LIST:** Kaden Elliss has recorded 238 career tackles. Elliss is on pace to become the 12th Vandal in program history to eclipse 300 career stops. If he surpasses his current career high of 83 tackles this season, Elliss would move into the school's top 10.

**LIVING BEHIND THE LINE:** Kaden Elliss was named second-team All-Sun Belt at linebacker as a junior after recording 80 tackles, including 16 for loss and six sacks. Elliss' 16 tackles for loss ranked 24th in the country at the FBS level. Elliss has 32.5 career tackles for loss, 9.5 shy of sixth place on Idaho's all-time list. No Vandal has cracked the top six since 2000.

**HERE, THERE, EVERYWHERE:** While listed as Idaho's starting Buck linebacker, Kaden Elliss will rotate all over the field. Elliss will line up at strong-side linebacker, defensive end and a stand-up edge rusher. He will also play multiple positions on offense and could see snaps on special teams as a kick blocking weapon.

**TURNING IT ON:** In the last six games of 2017 Kaden Elliss recorded 48 tackles, 12 tackles for loss, four sacks, five quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery on defense while making six catches for 134 yards and two touchdowns on offense.

**ALL-EVERYTHING:** Kaden Elliss' versatility was epitomized on one specific series last season against ULM (Oct. 28). In leading the Vandals to a much-needed win Elliss made major contributions on both sides of the ball. In the second quarter he hauled in a 45-yard touchdown reception, the second-longest touchdown reception by a Vandal last year, and on the next play from scrimmage sacked ULM quarterback Caleb Evans. He finished with a team-leading 10 tackles, including three for loss and the sack.

**PAUL HORNUNG AWARD WATCH LIST:** Kaden Elliss was named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch List this summer. The Paul Hornung Award presented by Texas Roadhouse is given annually to college football's most versatile player.

**ONE OF A KIND:** Linebacker Kaden Elliss established himself as one of the best two-way players in the country last season and is expected to expand his roles in 2018. Elliss, primarily a linebacker, also lined up at full back and tight end on a handful of snaps in each of the last nine games of 2017. Against Missouri (Oct. 21), Elliss became the first FBS player to record a sack and a touchdown reception in the same game since 2013. He repeated the feat against ULM (Oct. 28). Elliss also played on special teams and blocked an extra point against Appalachian State (Oct. 14).

**PURE FOOTBALL PLAYER:** Often referred to as the best football player on Idaho's roster, Kaden Elliss can do it all. As a freshman Elliss ranked second on the team with 83 tackles. In 2016 he honed his pass coverage skills and snagged five interceptions - the most by a linebacker in the country at the FBS level. His junior season saw Elliss play closer to the line of scrimmage on defense and make appearances on offense, including seven receptions for 156 yards and two touchdowns. In high school, Elliss led Judge Memorial Catholic High School to the Utah 3A state title as quarterback and defensive end.

**ALL IN THE FAMILY:** Kaden Elliss is joined in the Vandal football program by his father Luther (defensive line coach) and younger brother Christian (sophomore linebacker). Kaden is the oldest of 12 children - seven of whom are adopted. Luther is in his second season on the Idaho coaching staff after spending the previous two years as the Denver Broncos team chaplain. Luther spent 10 seasons playing in the NFL, including Pro Bowl selections in 1999 and 2000. He was the 20th overall pick in the 1995 NFL Draft after an All-American career at Utah.

**ADDING ANOTHER ROLE:** This summer, Kaden Elliss added another title to his resume. Elliss was married July 27 to Brooke Reilly, a former Vandal women's basketball student-athlete.

“He’s such a good player, and so smart, he usually only needs one rep to understand something and get it down. You’d like to be able to steal him and play him all the time on offense, but he’s so valuable on defense. You’ve got to be able to pick your times.”

**STRONG COFFEY:** Through two games, Cade Coffey has been called upon to punt seven times. Four of Coffey's boots have traveled at least 50 yards, including a season long of 60 yards. Coffey has punted 3.5 times per game, the NCAA requires 3.6 punts per game to qualify for the national rankings. His 48.9 yards per punt would put Coffey as the FCS national leader if he met the minimum requirement. It would rank third in all of Division I.

**COFFEY COMING THROUGH:** Idaho punter and kicker Cade Coffey was selected as the punter on USA TODAY's 2017 Freshman All-America Team. Coffey averaged 44.6 yards per punt, ranking 10th nationally and first among freshmen. A second-team All-Sun Belt selection, Coffey handled punting and kicking duties for the Vandals. More than 30 percent of his punts went for at least 50 yards, including a long of 68. Coffey also connected on 12-of-17 field goals with a long of 46.

**ALL-AMERICA TRADITION:** Cade Coffey became the fourth consecutive Idaho punter to be named to an All-America team during their careers. Austin Rehkow (2013-16), Bobby Cowan (2009-12) and T.J. Conley (2006-08) were each honored as All-Americans at least once. Coffey is the fifth Vandal punter to earn an All-America nod, joining Tom Sugg (1991).

**LEGACY POSITION:** Before Cade Coffey took over in 2017, the previous eight seasons saw Idaho start just two punters and two place kickers. All-American Austin Rehkow was a four-year starter at both positions for the seasons preceeding Coffey (2013-16) and from 2009-12 Trey Farquhar was a four-year kicker alongside four-year punter Bobby Cowan. Last season, Coffey became just the eighth different starting punter for the Vandals in the past 23 seasons. With three seasons of eligibility remaining, he plans to continue the legacy.

**BORN TO DO THIS:** Idaho kicker/punter Cade Coffey is the son of Sue and Travis Coffey. Travis played linebacker and safety for the Vandals from 1992-95. Travis and Sue were married prior to Travis' senior season, and the following year Cade was born at Gritman Medical Center in Downtown Moscow. The family lived in England for six years, before returning to Northern Idaho (Rathdrum) when Cade was 10.

**PRESEASON HONORS:** Noah Johnson has yet to play a game in the Big Sky, but he has already earned the respect of pundits around the league and the FCS. Johnson was selected to two prominent preseason All-America teams, in addition to the All-Big Sky Preseason Team. He earned a spot on Phil Steele's Preseason All-America First Team, as well as the STATS Preseason All-America Second Team.

**EARLY START PAYS QUICK DIVIDENDS:** Idaho offensive lineman Noah Johnson enters his junior year with 22 starts already under his belt. Johnson got a head start on his college career after graduating high school early and joining the Vandals for spring ball prior to the 2016 season. The extra time with the program helped Johnson earn a starting spot on the offensive line for his collegiate debut. Johnson went on to be named to the Sun Belt All-Newcomer Team as a freshman in 2016.

**VANDAL ANCHOR:** Noah Johnson anchored the Idaho offensive line last season and helped pave the way for Aaron Duckworth's 1,000-yard rushing season. Duckworth was a first-team All-Sun Belt selection, the first Vandal running back to earn first-team all-league honors since 2000. Johnson picked up second-team All-Sun Belt recognition himself.

**GUARD U:** Noah Johnson is on his way to earning a spot among the all-time great offensive linemen to come through the University of Idaho, including recent Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Jerry Kramer. Johnson was able to spend time with Kramer in August at a celebration for the longtime Green Bay Packer. Other NFL linemen to come through Idaho include: Mark Schlereth, Mike Lupati, Jake Scott, Jesse Davis, and John Yarno.

**SHAKING THE RUST OFF:** Noah Johnson missed Idaho's spring ball while recovering from offseason shoulder surgery. Johnson was given a clean bill of health headed into the summer and is expected to be full go in the Vandals' season opener. He slowly worked up to full contact drills during fall camp.

**CARRYING ON TRADITION:** Isaiah Saunders has amassed 1,413 career rushing yards. Saunders will look to become the 13th Vandal to reach the 2,000-yard milestone, joining former backfield mate Aaron Duckworth (2014-17). Saunders is 40 yards shy of cracking Idaho's all-time top-20 list.

**THE POTATO ON TOP:** A massive performance in the 2016 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl capped off Isaiah Saunders' sophomore campaign. Saunders set career highs of 33 carries and 147 rushing yards in the game. His three touchdowns matched his career high, set just two games prior. Saunders' career night guided the Vandals to a 61-50 victory over Colorado State.

**VANDAL PEDIGREE:** Isaiah Saunders followed in his father's footsteps coming to Idaho. Walt Saunders was a wide receiver for the Vandals from 1991-93, including Idaho's last Big Sky championship in 1992. Paul Petrino was an assistant coach at Idaho, during Walt's playing career.

**ALMOST A MASTER:** Isaiah Saunders completed his bachelor's degree in December 2017. Saunders majored in sociology with an emphasis on criminology. He is now nearing completion of a master's degree in public administration. Saunders plans to pursue a career in social work.

**PLAYING FOR MORE THAN HIMSELF:** Isaiah Saunders and his fiancé welcomed a baby boy, Ezekiel, into the world in June. Saunders said his mindset changed instantly, including in areas he did not expect.

"My son has changed everything. Everything I do now has an impact on him. I even take that into my training. I feel like I need to go hard in everything I do just to set an example for him."

**HALL DOES IT ALL:** Head coach Paul Petrino calls junior linebacker Ed Hall “the ultimate student-athlete.” Petrino also says of Hall, “he’s the guy every parent wants their son to be and their daughter to marry.” Hall, a former walk-on from Chugiak, Alaska, is set to become a three-year starter at outside linebacker for the Vandals. He led Idaho with three interceptions last season and ranked third with 78 tackles, yet he makes his biggest impact off the field. A mechanical engineering major, Hall is working with fellow engineers and finance students, including teammate Alex Boatman, to develop a shower targeted to recreational vehicles that uses filtered, recycled water. The Forever Shower has won entrepreneurial and innovation awards across the region.

**HALL EARNS ACADEMIC AWARD:** Ed Hall was named to the 2017 CoSIDA Academic All-District 7 First Team. Hall, along with former teammate Jacob Sannon who also earned the award, became the first Vandal football student-athlete to take home the honor since 2009. Hall and Sannon were the first pair of Idaho football teammates to be named Academic All-District in the same season since 2007.

**CAREER DAY:** David Ungerer led Idaho’s offense to a 56-point outing against Western New Mexico (Sept. 8) with career highs of nine receptions and 118 receiving yards. Ungerer caught one touchdown pass and returned a punt for another score. The 56 points marked Idaho’s second-highest scoring output since 2003, surpassed only by the 61 points scored in the 2016 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl victory over Colorado State.

**DO-IT-ALL DAVE:** David Ungerer racked up a career-high 235 all-purpose yards in Idaho’s 56-10 win against Western New Mexico, the 13th-most in a single game in Idaho history. Ungerer tallied single-game career highs of 118 receiving yards, 70 punt return yards and 47 kick return yards.

**TO THE HOUSE:** David Ungerer returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown against Western New Mexico (Sept. 8), the first punt return touchdown by a Vandal since 2011. The 65-yard return was also the longest by a Vandal since 2011, and is the eighth-longest in program history.

**UPPING HIS GAME:** David Ungerer became a critical part of Idaho’s offense the last six games of the 2017 season. In that stretch Ungerer tallied 31 receptions for 312 yards and five touchdowns. The six-game span came on the heels of Ungerer not registering a catch against Appalachian State (Oct. 14). Through the first six games, he had a total of eight receptions for 87 yards and one touchdown.

**PULLMAN CONNECTION:** Senior wide receiver David Ungerer attended Pullman High School while his father, Dave, was on the football coaching staff at Washington State. Ungerer was high school teammates with two of his current Vandal teammates, Mason Petrino and Cameron Lang. Ungerer and Petrino rekindled their high school chemistry late last season. The first two touchdown passes of Petrino’s career went to Ungerer, including the first one coming at Missouri - where Dave Ungerer Sr. is on staff.

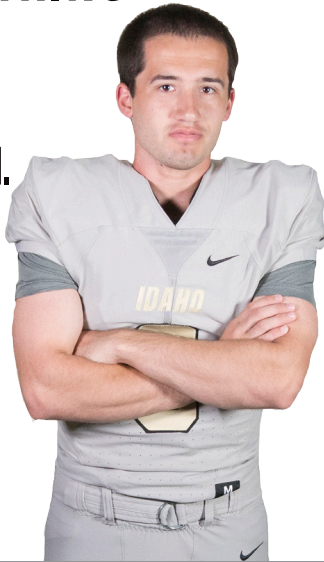

## VANDAL FOOTBALL NOTES - INDIVIDUALS

### MAKING A NAME FOR HIMSELF:

Sophomore linebacker Christian Elliss made an impact last season as a true freshman, just as his brother Kaden did in 2015. Christian Elliss recorded 30 tackles and an interception in 11 games as a backup linebacker. He is now Idaho's starting middle linebacker as a sophomore, after Tony Lashley transferred following spring practices. Elliss blocked a field goal in the Vandals' win over Western New Mexico (Sept. 8).

**HOOVER STAKES HIS CLAIM:** Sophomore safety Jalen Hoover stepped up as a true freshman in 2017, after Denzal Brantley was injured in the second game of the season. Hoover started the final 10 games. His 48 tackles led Idaho's secondary and he pulled in two interceptions. Hoover recorded two takeaways in Idaho's season finale win at Georgia State.

**SOFT HANDS:** Redshirt junior wide receiver Jeff Cotton made his Idaho debut at Fresno State (Sept. 1) and led the Vandals with 96 receiving yards. Cotton scored the team's first touchdown of the year on a 73-yard reception from Colton Richardson. Cotton snagged a 25-yard score from Richardson against Western New Mexico and his two receiving touchdowns this season rank fourth in the Big Sky.

**WHICH WIDE OUT?** Three Idaho wide receivers who redshirted last season are expected to make significant contributions in 2018.

- Redshirt junior Jeff Cotton sat out 2017 after two years at Pima Community College. Cotton was a 2016 NJCAA Honorable Mention All-American.

- Redshirt freshman D.J. Lee recorded four touchdown catches in a scrimmage during spring ball.

- Redshirt freshman Cutrell Haywood became a trusted target on crossing and fade patterns for both Idaho quarterbacks throughout fall camp. Haywood hauled in nine touchdowns on 10 receptions in Idaho's two fall scrimmages.

**ELLINGSON UP NEXT?:** Redshirt junior wide receiver Josh Ellingson worked his way onto the Idaho two-deep with an impressive fall camp. Ellingson is a two-time Offensive Scout Team Player of the Year for the Vandals.

### KRAMER ENSHRINED IN CANTON:

"You can. If you will."

University of Idaho and Green Bay Packers legend Jerry Kramer was officially enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame Aug. 4, captivating thousands in attendance and millions watching at home with a passionate, humorous and inspiring speech.

Kramer was a standout for the Vandals at guard and kicker and Idaho's first All-American in 1956, adding first-team All-America accolades in 1957. He later played 11 seasons for the Green Bay Packers from 1958-68, was a five-time All-Pro and helped pave the way to five NFL Championships and wins in Super Bowls I and II. Kramer was named to the NFL's 50th Anniversary Team and the All-Decade Team of the 1960s. He was a charter member of the Vandal Athletics Hall of Fame.

Idaho football head coach Paul Petrino spoke about Kramer's legacy ahead of the enshrinement ceremony. "I think it's unbelievable. It's well deserved. A little late, but well deserved. It gives us all great pride that we're Vandals and a Vandal is in the Hall of Fame."

Long considered the best player not in the Hall of Fame, Kramer's induction came on his 11th appearance on the ballot. He was advanced to the final ballot as a Senior Committee Finalist and gained election by earning a vote from at least 80 percent of the 48-member Hall of Fame Selection Committee.

Kramer, originally from Sandpoint, Idaho, is the second Idaho native to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, joining Larry Wilson of Rigby. Wilson, a safety for the St. Louis Cardinals, was enshrined in 1978. Kramer is the first Vandal to earn the highest individual honor in football. He joins Dave Wilcox as the only members of the Hall of Fame to attend an Idaho college. Wilcox attended Boise Junior College before finishing his collegiate career at Oregon.

"I used to listen to (Vandal Athletics Hall of Famer) Bob Curtis do Vandal football games when I was growing up in American Falls," Patchin said. "I always wanted to do games in Moscow because he made it sound like it was a great place to do a game, and he seemed to be having so much fun."

Patchin said the same level of fun exists with Phillips, a defensive end for the Vandals during some of their most successful years.

"I covered Ryan as a player and I remember him not only as one of the best defensive players to ever play at Idaho, but as a young man who was thoughtful and very well spoken," Patchin said. "He is be a great asset to our broadcast."

Phillips has impressed in his first shot at broadcasting.

"I was a little hesitant," said Phillips, a charter member of the Vandal Athletics Hall of Fame. "Then I thought, what a great way to get back in touch with the Vandal Family. I'm excited."

Patchin replaced Tom Morris, who called football and basketball for the Vandals for nearly 30 years. Morris stepped away from the microphone to concentrate on his role as general manager for Idaho Vandals Sports Properties.

"There's no question Dennis is an excellent choice to call Vandals football, particularly with 1080 AM already embedded in the program as our North Idaho flagship," Morris said. "I had an outstanding run calling games and enjoyed it thoroughly, however I am passing the torch to a seasoned veteran who will do a terrific job."

Patchin, a renowned sports personality in the Pacific Northwest, has been with the KXLY Broadcast Group since 1984 and spent 31 years an Emmy award-winning television sports anchor with KXLY-TV. He is currently program director of 700 ESPN in Spokane and 1080 ESPN in Coeur d'Alene.

Phillips, a three-time first-team all-conference defensive end and 1995 Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year as well as a two-time All-American, was the Vandals' MVP and Defensive MVP in 1995 and 1996. Phillips played five years in the NFL for the New York Giants and Indianapolis Colts.

# THE KIBBIE DOME



The Kibbie-ASUI Activity Center, also called the "Kibbie Dome," is one of the most unique facilities in all of the NCAA.

The Kibbie Dome has been the home of Vandal athletics since 1975, when the barrel-arch roof was completed. In 1976, the building earned the award for America's Outstanding Structural Engineering Achievement.

It took nearly seven years to complete the 14-story-tall structure, which is tall enough that Idaho's Theophilus Tower dormitory would fit inside. Construction began in 1969 on the site of the former Neale Stadium, which had been partially destroyed by fire. The field and stands were completed in 1971, but it took four more years to finish the unique roof. The east end addition, which includes the athletic department offices, locker rooms, training rooms and a weight room, was completed in 1982.

In 2004, the facility began its next phase of improvement, as enhanced academic and athletic support facilities were added for student-athletes. The Norm and Becky Iverson Speed and Strength Center was added to more than double the size of the previous weight room to 7,000 square feet. Locker rooms were also expanded to more than 14,000 square feet.

Team meeting rooms, two student-athlete computer labs and study rooms and expanded academic support areas have also been added. In 2010, the athletic training and equipment rooms were expanded and upgraded to nearly double their respective work areas.

In 2010 and 2011, the old plywood end walls were replaced with state-of-the-art KalWall translucent panels as part of a major renovation to bring the building up to code. In conjunction with the end-wall replacement and fire-safety measures, the Litehouse Center, Bud and June Ford Club and expanded premium seating, suites and loge boxes were added and the Bob Curtis Press Box was completely rebuilt on the North side of the facility. Those improvements were privately funded.

The Kibbie Dome serves as both a training and competition facility for many of Idaho's 16 varsity athletic teams, including football, basketball, track & field, tennis and starting in 2017 soccer. The facility has a capacity of more than 16,000. When the fans get excited, the Kibbie Dome crowd noise can be deafening and intimidating to opposing teams.

Beneath the football field, which is rolled up and stored at season's end, is a premier indoor track & field facility, as well as a full indoor tennis facility. The Cowan Spectrum, where Idaho men's and women's basketball play their home games, is also a part of the Kibbie Dome floor. With 93,000 square feet of floor, there is plenty of room for each team to practice at the same time.

Vandal track & field athletes can practice year-round in the facility. The track is a 290-meter flat circular with eight lanes in the straightaway. It also has two long jump pits, two pole vault pits and two throwing circles. The spacious floor area also gives the Kibbie Dome enough space to host indoor discus and javelin competitions, a boast few other indoor facilities in the nation can make.

The Idaho men's and women's tennis programs use the facility to train and compete during the winter and in times of inclement weather conditions. The floor can be cleared for action on up to nine courts at once.

The Kibbie Dome is for more than just Vandal Athletics, too. The facility has been used to host a multitude of different events, including Idaho high school football playoffs, concerts, student activities, intramural sports, community events and graduations. The facility is also used by students and staff as a workout venue.

The internationally-renowned Lionel Hampton International Jazz Festival also calls the Kibbie Dome its home. One of the banner accomplishments of the University of Idaho, the festival was recently awarded the National Medal of Arts, the nation's most prestigious arts honor. The festival dates back to 1967 and during its history, it has featured some of the best jazz musicians to ever play, including Ella Fitzgerald, Gerry Mulligan, Dizzy Gillespie, Dianne Reeves, Stan Getz, Carmen McRae, Diana Krall, Wynton Marsalis and Sarah Vaughan and of course, Lionel Hampton and his New York Big Band.

Every year, thousands of high-school, middle-school and elementary-school students from hundreds of schools all around the United States and Canada make the pilgrimage to Moscow to take part in adjudicated performances, workshops and concerts.
