PICK SIX

1. THE GAME: Idaho football opens Big Sky Conference play Saturday, at Northern Colorado. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. MT/noon PT from Nottingham Field and will be televised on Eleven Sports and streamed on Pluto TV. It is the first all-time meeting between the teams.

2. ABOUT IDAHO: The Vandals (2-2) knocked off No. 11 Eastern Washington 35-27 Saturday, in a nonconference game at the Kibbie Dome. Idaho raced out to a 28-0 lead at halftime and conquered its highest-ranked foe in 20 years. Wide receiver Jeff Cotton and linebacker Tre Walker lead the way on their respective sides of the ball. Cotton paces the Big Sky in receptions (9.5 per game) and yards (107.3 per game), while Walker's 11 tackles per game are tops in the league.

3. ABOUT NORTHERN COLORADO: The Bears (0-4) enter Big Sky play seeking their first win of the season after a narrow 14-6 defeat last week at the hands of South Dakota. Northern Colorado won back-to-back Division II national titles in 1996 and 1997, before transitioning to FCS in 2006. Idaho defensive coordinator Mike Breske was the Bears' defensive coordinator on both title teams.

4. AKANNO AWARDED: Redshirt junior linebacker Charles Akanno was named the FCS National Defensive Player of the Week by STATS LLC and College Sports Madness after helping the Vandals to a 35-27 victory over No. 11 Eastern Washington. Akanno was also selected as the ROOT SPORTS Big Sky Defensive Player of the Week. He recorded career highs with nine tackles and three pass breakups to go with a forced fumble and three quarterback hurries, while assisting on a tackle for loss.

5. PLAYING POSSESSED: Idaho has controlled the tempo of its last three games, dominating the time of possession. For the season, the Vandals are averaging 33:53 time of possession, the top mark in the Big Sky and No. 6 nationally. On a related note, Idaho also ranks No. 1 in the conference and sixth in the country in third-down conversion defense. The Vandals are allowing opponents to convert third downs at just a 23.4 percent clip.

6. RANKED WIN: Idaho's 35-27 win against Eastern Washington marked its first victory over a team ranked No. 11 or better in the national polls since 1999. The Vandals are now 30-35 all-time against nationally-ranked FCS/I-AA opponents, including a 27-29 mark when the Vandals are also playing at the FCS/I-AA ranks.

IT STARTS AT THE TOP

HEAD COACH PAUL PETRINO

Paul Petrino enters his seventh season as Idaho's head coach. Petrino got his first taste of Division I coaching as an assistant at Idaho from 1992-94, including three consecutive NCAA Playoff appearances.

Idaho's 2018 campaign, its first in its return to the Football Championship Subdivision and the Big Sky Conference, included the Vandals' first win over a nationally-ranked opponent in 11 years. North Dakota came to the Kibbie Dome as the No. 25 team in the country according to the coaches' poll. Idaho came away with a 31-27 victory thanks to Mason Petrino finding Jeff Cotton in the end zone with 27 seconds to play. It was Idaho's first win over a team

ranked in either national poll (media or coaches) in the FCS or FBS since 2007.

The 2017 team featured the first five-year class of Vandals under Petrino. Among that group was record-setting quarterback Matt Linehan, 1,000-yard rusher Aaron Duckworth and Academic All-America wide receiver Jacob Sannon.

A four-year starter under Petrino, Linehan surpassed some of the most sacred names in Vandal football history. He became the program's all-time leader in completions and when his senior season was cut three games short by injury, Linehan finished just shy of Doug Nussmeier's record for career passing yards.

Idaho played a school-record seven one-possession games in 2017, including its five conference losses coming by a combined 24 points, on the way to finishing 4-8. Still, the team featured 10 all-conference selections. For the first time since 2008 three Vandals picked up first-team accolades, including Duckworth who became the first Idaho running back to earn first-team all-league honors since 2000.

Petrino's head coaching career thus far is highlighted by Idaho's 2016 campaign. He guided the Vandals to bowl eligibility for the first time since 2009 - and won their bowl game in record-setting and entertaining fashion. For his efforts, Petrino was voted the 2016 Sun Belt Coach of the Year.

The Vandals' bowl eligibility was the result of their posting their best regular-season record since the 1998 team (Idaho's first bowl team) went 8-3. They wrapped up the year 9-4 after beating Colorado State 61-50 in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl - largely recognized as one of the most entertaining of the bowl season. It was the highest-scoring bowl game of 2016 and Linehan, who was named game MVP, had one of the top pass efficiency ratings of any quarterback involved in postseason play.

The bowl victory was the culmination of not just gritty, determined efforts week-in and week-out during 2016, but of the first four years of Petrino's reign. After back-to-back one-victory seasons, the Vandals were 4-8 in 2015. That marked the beginning of the on-field visibility of the process that started in December 2012 when Petrino was hired.

From the minute he arrived on the University of Idaho campus, Petrino infused the Vandals with an intensity that reverberated around the Kibbie Dome and throughout the Vandal Family. His practices mirror his personality - focused, intense and determined.

With his accountability-based approach in place, the Vandals' APR has improved every season and the team's spring 2017 grade-point average of 2.91 is the program's second-highest term GPA on record. He was using the same approach to elevating the classroom successes as he was on the field where effort and discipline were being preached day in and day out.

The result was the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl victory and one of the most incredible program turnarounds in history. The program had waded through three successive one-victory seasons (one under the previous staff) before four wins in 2015 and the 9-4 2016 team.

Bits and pieces of the progress made deep within the program were evident before the wins started to build on the field. Broc Westlake, a linebacker throughout Petrino's tenure, graduated in December 2015 with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average and was one of two Vandals to earn the department's prestigious Rich and Mary Fox Award, which is given annually to the graduating student-athlete(s) with the highest cumulative grade-point average. In graduating Summa Cum Laude, he also was recognized as a National Football Foundation's Hampshire Honor Society.

In 2015, the Vandals led the Sun Belt in seven statistical categories and were second in another five. Those conference rankings translated to their being in the top 25 percent nationally in 11 categories.

In his first season back at Idaho, he took the Vandals against a schedule that featured not only the eventual national champion, but a total of seven bowl teams, which included four teams that, at one time or another, were ranked among the nation's top 25. While the Vandals didn't finish with the win-loss mark he would have liked, his first class of recruits showed it can provide the base for a bright Vandal future.

In that season, Petrino had his first Vandal All-American in punter Austin Rehkow, whose record-setting season earned him a spot on the Walter Camp All-America team. A true freshman in 2013, Rehkow's average of 47.8 yards per kick is an NCAA record for a freshman as well as the overall record for a player who punted at least 75 times in one season. He went on to become the only four-time first-team all-conference selection in Vandal history.

HEAD COACH PAUL PETRINO



In year two of his tenure, Petrino took the Vandals back to the Sun Belt Conference after one season as an FBS independent. A passing game fueled by Linehan, a redshirt freshman at the time, and senior receiver Joshua McCain was one of the nation's best and Rehkow again repeated as the national punting average leader and was a finalist for the Ray Guy Award. The Vandals were significantly more competitive and off the field they made huge improvements in the classroom. The team posted one of its highest grade-point-averages in team history and improved its APR by leaps and bounds.

Coaching football is in Petrino's blood. Tagging along with his dad, Bob Petrino, Sr., as he coached the Carroll College (Montana) Saints into national prominence, Petrino knew from the time he was six years old he wanted to coach. He played for his dad at Carroll and was the Football Gazette NAIA Division II Player of the Year and a two-time Kodak All-American quarterback after setting 16 school records during a career that included four conference titles and a 36-6 record from 1985-88.

He already made his mark at Idaho when he coached two players who have been inducted into the Vandal Athletics Hall of Fame – running back Sherriden May and receiver Yo Murphy. They are just a small sampling of the successes of his players. In the 2012 NFL draft, five offensive players under his tutelage were drafted. The group, which included four receivers, represented the greatest number of players coached by one coach in that year's draft.

For Petrino, the return to Moscow was a return to his Northwest roots. A native of Butte, Mont., he was raised in Helena where his football legacy began. After serving as an assistant to his dad for two seasons (1990-91), he headed to Moscow for his first stop with the Vandals when he was hired as the receivers/running backs/special teams coach in 1992. His next stop was Utah State (receivers/special teams, 1995-97) then on to Louisville (receivers, 1998-99), Southern Miss (quarterbacks, 2000-03), Louisville (offensive coordinator/receivers, 2003-06), Atlanta Falcons (receivers, 2007), Arkansas (offensive coordinator/receivers, 2008-09), Illinois (offensive coordinator/receivers, 2010-11), and Arkansas (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks, 2012).



FAMILY FIRST

Petrino and his wife Maya - who he lovingly refers to as his all-time best recruit - have three children: Mason, Anne Mari and Ava.

Mason is a senior quarterback for the Vandals. The Petrinos are not the only father-son combination on Idaho's roster. Defensive line coach Luther Ellis is the father of linebacker Christian (junior) and defensive lineman Noah (sophomore).

Anne Mari is a sophomore outfielder for Montana's softball team. Paul's spring football schedule is structured around attending her games.

The Petrinos elected to live in Pullman when they arrived in 2013, allowing Mason to play football and soccer in high school as Washington high school boys' soccer is a spring sport.

VANDAL FOOTBALL NOTES - TEAM

LAST TIME OUT: Idaho came out swinging against Eastern Washington last week. The Vandals surrendered just 103 yards of offense in the first half and took a 28-0 lead into the locker room against the No. 11 Eagles. Mason Petrino accounted for three touchdowns in the game, including his pass to Jeff Cotton in the fourth quarter that sealed the 35-27 win.

BIG BACKS: Idaho's sizable backfield duo of Aundre Carter and Roshawn Johnson combined for 234 yards against Central Washington (Sept. 7). Carter rushed for 123 yards, while Johnson tallied 111 - both are career highs. It is the first time two Vandals rushed for at least 100 yards in the same game since 2004 (Jayson Bird and Rolly Lumbala).

GROUND GAME STRONG: Idaho has eclipsed 200 rushing yards in each of its wins this season. The Vandals ran for 280 yards on 54 carries against Central Washington, the most rushing yards Idaho has gained in a single game since 2014. The Vandals turned to the rushing attack again against Eastern Washington, going for 223 yards on 47 carries. Quarterback Mason Petrino contributed with a career-high 60 rushing yards against the Eagles.

RUNNING TO VICTORY: The Vandals have won 14 of the last 17 games in which they gained more rushing yards than their opponent.

30 THE MAGIC NUMBER: The Vandals have won each of the last 13 games in which they scored 30 points.

NO AIR: Idaho held Wyoming to just four passing completions and 50 yards through the air. It is the fewest passing yards allowed by the Vandals since 2004, holding Troy to 48 yards.

DOMESWEET DOME: Idaho has won six of its last seven home games. The Vandals closed their 2018 home slate with a 4-1 record. It matches the 2016 squad's 4-1 mark for the best home winning percentage since 1996 when Idaho went 5-0 in the Dome - its last year without a home loss. Idaho football has recorded six unbeaten home seasons since the Kibbie Dome opened in 1975 (1976, 1982, 1988, 1994, 1995 and 1996).

BIG CROWDS: Idaho's season opener at Penn State had an official attendance of 104,527, the largest crowd to watch a Vandal football game in program history. It was the eighth time Idaho has played in a game with an attendance of 80,000 or more, including three with 90,000+ fans.

HOMEGROWN: Idaho football's roster features 20 student-athletes from the state of Idaho. Of the 20 Idahoans, 11 are from North Idaho and another 15 Washington residents are from within 75 miles of the campus. Thirteen of the 35 local products are featured on this week's two-deep.

BLOCKED: Freshman Sean McCormick recorded a blocked punt in the season opener at Penn State. The Vandals have now blocked at least one punt in four straight seasons. Idaho led the Big Sky and ranked 14th in the FCS last season with two blocked punts.

KADEN ELLISS DRAFTED: Former Idaho linebacker Kaden Elliss capped his illustrious collegiate career as a seventh-round selection in the 2019 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints (No. 244 overall). Elliss was the only Big Sky student-athlete drafted this spring and became Idaho's first NFL Draft choice since 2012 (Korey Toomer). He is Idaho's 76th all-time professional football draft choice and the 36th Vandal taken in the modern era of the NFL Draft (since 1970). Elliss' father, Luther Elliss, was the 20th overall selection in the 1995 NFL Draft. Luther is currently Idaho's defensive line coach.

#PROVANDALS: Five Idaho football alums are on active NFL rosters:

FAMILY AFFAIR: Many football teams say they are like a family. In a number of cases, the Vandals actually are family. Head coach Paul Petrino's son Mason is an Idaho quarterback, while defensive line coach Luther Elliss is the father of defensive standouts Christian and Noah. The Ellisses are one of six sets of brothers on the roster. Second-year outside linebackers coach Adam Breske is the son of defensive coordinator Mike Breske.

OH, BROTHER: Idaho football's 2019 roster features six sets of brothers. Christian and Noah Elliss; Hayden and Hogan Hatten; Noah and Coleman Johnson; D.J. and Bryson Lee; Wryor and Michael Noil; and Kayode and Mujeeb Rufai.

Paul Petrino: "It tells you how good of people we have around here when the younger brother wants to come here... Usually when we get a brother here, we have a good chance of getting the younger brother because of the great people who are around this campus."

AT ALTITUDE: Idaho plays road games this season at Wyoming and Northern Arizona - the two highest Division I football stadiums in the country, by elevation. The Vandals will become the seventh team in NCAA history to visit both stadiums in the same season, and the first since Northern Colorado in 2013. The daunting double was also previously endured by Cal Poly (2012), Montana (1997), Weber State (1990), Cal State Fullerton (1985) and BYU (1939).

FLIPPING THE FIELD: Idaho finished the 2018 season ranked second in the FCS in net punting. The Vandals averaged 40.05 net yards per punt, surrendering just 5.67 yards per return. All-America punter Cade Coffey averaging 44.1 yards per punt last year, the sixth-best average in the FCS.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Idaho scored four special teams touchdowns last season and blocked four kicks. The Vandal specialists came through in their 56-10 win against Western New Mexico (Sept. 8). Idaho scored on a blocked field goal return for the first time since 2005 and on a punt return for the first time since 2011. The big plays both came in the fourth quarter, at the end of consecutive Mustang drives. Christian Elliss blocked a 38-yard field goal attempt and Dorian Clark eventually scooped up the loose ball, returning it 47 yards for a touchdown. The ensuing WNMU series ended in a punt, which David Ungerer took back 65 yards for another score. Jalen Hoover has blocked two punts this year, both returned for touchdowns. Lloyd Hightower scored against Portland State (Sept. 29) and Connor Whitney scored against North Dakota (Nov. 3).

TAKING NOTICE: Cade Coffey entered the Big Sky and FCS ranks as a known commodity. In 2017, Idaho's final season in the Sun Belt and FBS, Coffey was named to the USA Today Freshman All-America Team as the lone punter. He immediately followed that season with a sophomore campaign that landed him three more All-America honors. Headed into his junior season, Coffey is Athlon Sports' preseason selection for first-team All-America.

STRONG COFFEY: In 2018, Cade Coffey booted 64 punts in 11 games. 19 of Coffey's kicks traveled at least 50 yards, including a career long of 80 yards. Coffey's average of 44.1 yards ranked sixth nationally in the FCS.

80 BURGER: Cade Coffey unloaded a career-long 80-yard punt against Southern Utah (Oct. 20), tied for the second-longest punt in the FCS last season. It is the second-longest punt in program history and the longest since Flip Kleffner's 82-yard boot in 1953.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Cade Coffey earned Big Sky Special Teams Player of the Week, following his performance against Southern Utah (Oct. 20). Coffey converted all five of his scoring attempts (one field goal and four extra points), while averaging 51.8 yards per punt on eight punts. His career-best 80-yard punt was the longest in the Big Sky last year. Coffey booted three punts more than 50 yards and downed three inside the 20.

ALL-AMERICA TRADITION: Cade Coffey is the fourth consecutive Idaho punter to be named to an All-America team during their careers. Austin Rehkow (2013-16), Bobby Cowan (2009-12) and T.J. Conley (2006-08) were each honored as All-Americans at least once. Coffey is the fifth Vandal punter to earn an All-America nod, also joining Tom Sugg (1991).

LEGACY POSITION: Before Cade Coffey took over in 2017, the previous eight seasons saw Idaho start just two punters and two place kickers. All-American Austin Rehkow was a four-year starter at both positions for the seasons preceeding Coffey (2013-16), and from 2009-12 Trey Farquhar was a four-year kicker alongside four-year punter Bobby Cowan. Coffey is just the eighth different starting punter for the Vandals in the past 25 seasons. With two seasons of eligibility remaining, he plans to continue the legacy.

BORN TO DO THIS: Idaho kicker/punter Cade Coffey is the son of Sue and Travis Coffey. Travis played linebacker and safety for the Vandals from 1992-95. Travis and Sue were married prior to Travis' senior season, and the following year Cade was born at Gritman Medical Center in Downtown Moscow. The family lived in England for six years, before returning to Northern Idaho (Rathdrum) when Cade was 10.

ALL-AMERICA: Noah Johnson earned the first All-America accolade of his career last season. Johnson was named to the HERO Sports All-America Third Team following his junior year, which also included first-team All-Big Sky honors. He became the first Vandal offensive lineman to garner All-America recognition since Mike Iupati in 2009. Entering his senior campaign, Johnson has landed on two preseason All-America teams. He picked up first-team nods from Athlon Sports and HERO Sports headed into the 2019 season.

GUARD U: Noah Johnson is on his way to earning a spot among the all-time great offensive linemen to come through the University of Idaho, including recent Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Jerry Kramer. Johnson was able to spend time with Kramer last August at a celebration for the longtime Green Bay Packer. Other NFL linemen to come through Idaho include: Mark Schlereth, Mike Iupati, Jake Scott, Jesse Davis, and John Yarno.

EARLY START PAYS QUICK DIVIDENDS: Idaho offensive lineman Noah Johnson enters his senior year with 33 starts already under his belt. Johnson got a head start on his college career after graduating high school early and joining the Vandals for spring ball prior to the 2016 season. The extra time with the program helped Johnson earn a starting spot on the offensive line for his collegiate debut. Johnson went on to be named to the Sun Belt All-Newcomer Team as a freshman in 2016, after staking his claim among a veteran offensive line that helped lead the Vandals to a win in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

VANDAL ANCHOR: Noah Johnson anchored the Idaho offensive line each of the last two seasons. In 2018 Johnson was the highest-graded Vandal lineman opening lanes for All-Big Sky running back Isaiah Saunders. In 2017, he helped pave the way for Aaron Duckworth's 1,000-yard rushing season. Duckworth was a first-team All-Sun Belt selection, the first Vandal running back to earn first-team all-league honors since 2000. Johnson picked up second-team All-Sun Belt recognition.



THE FABRIC OF OUR TEAM

SWEET SIXTEEN: Redshirt senior wide receiver Jeff Cotton hauled in 16 receptions against Central Washington (Sept. 7), the second most in a game in Idaho history and one shy of the record set by Jerry Hendren in 1969. Cotton's 16 catches are the most in the NCAA so far this season at any level. He tallied two touchdowns and 145 yards, the most receiving yards by a Vandal in a single game since 2015.

NO-SHRINK COTTON: Jeff Cotton has made a habit of stepping up when the lights shine brightest. In four career games against FBS opponents, Cotton has tallied 19 catches for 308 yards and two touchdowns. He grabbed six balls for 83 yards at Penn State (Aug. 31, 2019). In three games against ranked FCS opponents, Cotton has 357 yards and three touchdowns, eclipsing 100 yards and scoring in each game.

SOFT HANDS: Jeff Cotton broke out in 2018 with 49 catches for 656 yards and seven touchdowns in his debut campaign for the Vandals after transferring from Pima Community College and redshirting in 2017. He was an honorable mention Junior College All-American as a sophomore.

HOT START: Cotton hauled in a touchdown reception in each of Idaho's first four games of 2018, becoming the first Vandal to do so since Josh McCain in 2014.

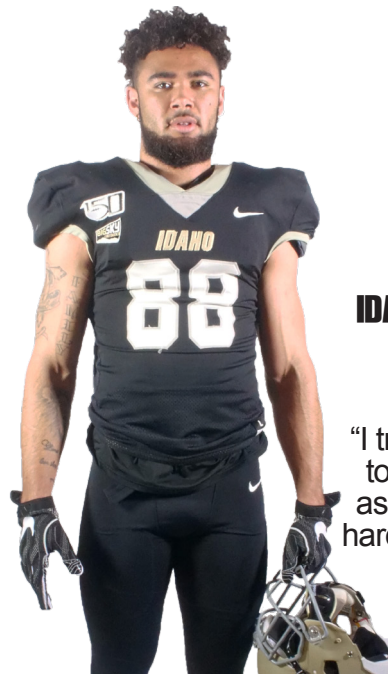

EPPINGER TAKES ADVANTAGE:

Freshman cornerback David Eppinger was not listed on the season-opening depth chart, but he made an impact on special teams at Penn State. Eppinger recovered a muffed punt to set up Idaho's scoring drive and forced a fumble on another punt return. He also took reps at cornerback and claimed a spot on the two-deep entering the home opener.

PERRY PILES ON: Redshirt sophomore linebacker Kyle Perry has stepped up the last two weeks, adding to an embarrassment of riches the Vandals enjoy at the position. Perry has seven tackles over the last two games, including two for loss and one sack. He entered the game at Wyoming with three career tackles.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Jalen Hoover was named the Big Sky Special Teams Player of the Week following his game-changing blocked punt in Idaho's 31-27, comeback win over North Dakota (Nov. 3). Hoover blocked two punts in 2018, both of which were returned for touchdowns.

HAVE A DAY HAYWOOD: Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Cutrell Haywood enjoyed a breakout debut season in 2018. No game was bigger for Haywood than against Southern Utah (Oct. 20), when he hauled in three touchdown receptions. Haywood became the first Vandal to catch three touchdowns in a game since 2010, and the 11th in program history. He finished the season with six receiving scores.

RELOADING: Idaho has had to replace a number of highly-productive linebackers the last three seasons. Each year a true freshman has been waiting in the wings to take on the challenge and this year is no different. Sully Shannon impressed the coaching staff enough to make the two-deep in advance of his collegiate debut at Penn state, where he made six tackles. Shannon looks to join the list of recent true freshmen Kaden Elliss (2015), Ty Graham (2016), Christian Elliss (2017) and Tre Walker (2018) who contributed to the Vandal defense right away.

KRAMER ENSHRINED IN CANTON:

"You can. If you will."

University of Idaho and Green Bay Packers legend Jerry Kramer was officially enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame Aug. 4, 2018, captivating thousands in attendance and millions watching at home with a passionate, humorous and inspiring speech.

Kramer was a standout for the Vandals at guard and kicker and Idaho's first All-American in 1956, adding first-team All-America accolades in 1957. He later played 11 seasons for the Green Bay Packers from 1958-68, was a five-time All-Pro and helped pave the way to five NFL Championships and wins in Super Bowls I and II. Kramer was named to the NFL's 50th Anniversary Team and the All-Decade Team of the 1960s. He was a charter member of the Vandal Athletics Hall of Fame.

Idaho football head coach Paul Petrino spoke about Kramer's legacy ahead of the enshrinement ceremony. "I think it's unbelievable. It's well deserved. A little late, but well deserved. It gives us all great pride that we're Vandals and a Vandal is in the Hall of Fame."

Long considered the best player not in the Hall of Fame, Kramer's induction came on his 11th appearance on the ballot. He was advanced to the final ballot as a Senior Committee Finalist and gained election by earning a vote from at least 80 percent of the 48-member Hall of Fame Selection Committee.

Kramer, originally from Sandpoint, Idaho, is the second Idaho native to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, joining Larry Wilson of Rigby. Wilson, a safety for the St. Louis Cardinals, was enshrined in 1978. Kramer is the first Vandal to earn the highest individual honor in football. He joins Dave Wilcox as the only members of the Hall of Fame to attend an Idaho college. Wilcox attended Boise Junior College before finishing his collegiate career at Oregon.

IN MEMORY OF BOB PETRINO SR.: Idaho head coach Paul Petrino lost his father, Bob Sr., July 26, 2018, at the age of 81. The elder Petrino was the head football coach at Carrol College for 28 years, winning 17 conference championships. Paul was a four-year starter at quarterback for his father and later joined his coaching staff. Vandal assistant head coach Kris Cinkovich also played under Bob Petrino at Carrol College and Cinkovich later served as his offensive coordinator during Paul's playing career.

"I used to listen to (Vandal Athletics Hall of Famer) Bob Curtis do Vandal football games when I was growing up in American Falls," Patchin said. "I always wanted to do games in Moscow because he made it sound like it was a great place to do a game, and he seemed to be having so much fun."

Patchin said the same level of fun exists with Phillips, a defensive end for the Vandals during some of their most successful years.

"I covered Ryan as a player and I remember him not only as one of the best defensive players to ever play at Idaho, but as a young man who was thoughtful and very well spoken," Patchin said. "He is be a great asset to our broadcast."

Phillips has impressed in his first shot at broadcasting.

"I was a little hesitant," said Phillips, a charter member of the Vandal Athletics Hall of Fame. "Then I thought, what a great way to get back in touch with the Vandal Family. I'm excited."

Patchin replaced Tom Morris, who called football and basketball for the Vandals for nearly 30 years. Morris stepped away from the microphone to concentrate on his role as general manager for Idaho Vandals Sports Properties.

"There's no question Dennis is an excellent choice to call Vandals football, particularly with 1080 AM already embedded in the program as our North Idaho flagship," Morris said. "I had an outstanding run calling games and enjoyed it thoroughly, however I am passing the torch to a seasoned veteran who will do a terrific job."

Patchin, a renowned sports personality in the Pacific Northwest, has been with the KXLY Broadcast Group since 1984 and spent 31 years an Emmy award-winning television sports anchor with KXLY-TV. He is currently program director of 700 ESPN in Spokane and 1080 ESPN in Coeur d'Alene.

Phillips, a three-time first-team all-conference defensive end and 1995 Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year as well as a two-time All-American, was the Vandals' MVP and Defensive MVP in 1995 and 1996. Phillips played five years in the NFL for the New York Giants and Indianapolis Colts.

THE KIBBIE DOME



The Kibbie-ASUI Activity Center, also called the "Kibbie Dome," is one of the most unique facilities in all of the NCAA.

The Kibbie Dome has been the home of Vandal athletics since 1975, when the barrel-arch roof was completed. In 1976, the building earned the award for America's Outstanding Structural Engineering Achievement.

It took nearly seven years to complete the 14-story-tall structure, which is tall enough that Idaho's Theophilus Tower dormitory would fit inside. Construction began in 1969 on the site of the former Neale Stadium, which had been partially destroyed by fire. The field and stands were completed in 1971, but it took four more years to finish the unique roof. The east end addition, which includes the athletic department offices, locker rooms, training rooms and a weight room, was completed in 1982.

In 2004, the facility began its next phase of improvement, as enhanced academic and athletic support facilities were added for student-athletes. The Norm and Becky Iverson Speed and Strength Center was added to more than double the size of the previous weight room to 7,000 square feet. Locker rooms were also expanded to more than 14,000 square feet.

Team meeting rooms, two student-athlete computer labs and study rooms and expanded academic support areas have also been added. In 2010, the athletic training and equipment rooms were expanded and upgraded to nearly double their respective work areas.

In 2010 and 2011, the old plywood end walls were replaced with state-of-the-art KalWall translucent panels as part of a major renovation to bring the building up to code. In conjunction with the end-wall replacement and fire-safety measures, the Litehouse Center, Bud and June Ford Club and expanded premium seating, suites and loge boxes were added and the Bob Curtis Press Box was completely rebuilt on the North side of the facility. Those improvements were privately funded.

The Kibbie Dome serves as both a training and competition facility for many of Idaho's 16 varsity athletic teams, including football, basketball, track & field, tennis and starting in 2017 soccer. The facility has a capacity of more than 16,000. When the fans get excited, the Kibbie Dome crowd noise can be deafening and intimidating to opposing teams.

Beneath the football field, which is rolled up and stored at season's end, is a premier indoor track & field facility, as well as a full indoor tennis facility. The Cowan Spectrum, where Idaho men's and women's basketball play their home games, is also a part of the Kibbie Dome floor. With 93,000 square feet of floor, there is plenty of room for each team to practice at the same time.

Vandal track & field athletes can practice year-round in the facility. The track is a 290-meter flat circular with eight lanes in the straightaway. It also has two long jump pits, two pole vault pits and two throwing circles. The spacious floor area also gives the Kibbie Dome enough space to host indoor discus and javelin competitions, a boast few other indoor facilities in the nation can make.

The Idaho men's and women's tennis programs use the facility to train and compete during the winter and in times of inclement weather conditions. The floor can be cleared for action on up to nine courts at once.

The Kibbie Dome is for more than just Vandal Athletics, too. The facility has been used to host a multitude of different events, including Idaho high school football playoffs, concerts, student activities, intramural sports, community events and graduations. The facility is also used by students and staff as a workout venue.

The internationally-renowned Lionel Hampton International Jazz Festival also calls the Kibbie Dome its home. One of the banner accomplishments of the University of Idaho, the festival was recently awarded the National Medal of Arts, the nation's most prestigious arts honor. The festival dates back to 1967 and during its history, it has featured some of the best jazz musicians to ever play, including Ella Fitzgerald, Gerry Mulligan, Dizzy Gillespie, Dianne Reeves, Stan Getz, Carmen McRae, Diana Krall, Wynton Marsalis and Sarah Vaughan and of course, Lionel Hampton and his New York Big Band.

Every year, thousands of high-school, middle-school and elementary-school students from hundreds of schools all around the United States and Canada make the pilgrimage to Moscow to take part in adjudicated performances, workshops and concerts.
