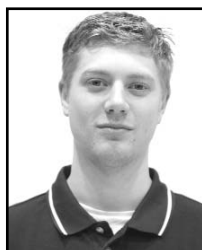

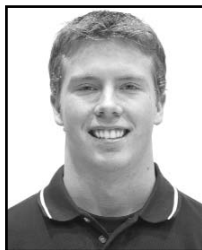

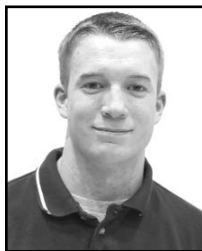

After leading the NCAA with 33 home runs in 2002, Gonzaga's Nate Gold became the first Bulldogs player to participate at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium as Gold was one of eight participants in the 3rd annual NCAA Home Run Challenge. Gold was joined by the seven of the nation's top home run hitters from Division's I, II and III. Included in the competition, shown live on ESPN2, were Brad Eldred from Florida International, Ryan Kenning from New Mexico State, Bubba Lavender from Morehead (Ky.) State, Heath Mason from Carson-Newman (Tenn.), Junior Medina from Stonehill (Mass.), Todd Meyer from Alvernia (Penn.) and Shaun Rice from Ohio Wesleyan. Gold finished second in the competition which was part of the Opening Ceremonies to help kick off the College World Series. Gold set a school and WCC record with his 33 home runs.
