Gonzaga Bulldogs (7-3 / 0-0 WCC)

★ Gonzaga dropped two-of-three on the road at New Mexico State over the weekend.

★ **Bobby Carlson** enjoyed an outstanding weekend, driving in eight of Gonzaga's 25 runs in the three-game series with the Aggies. Carlson batted .571 on the week and homered in all three games, including a grand slam in Saturday's 14-4 win.

★ Junior college transfer **Clayton Mortensen** has been solid on the mound for the Bulldogs, posting a 2-1 record through his first three starts. Mortensen struck out eight batters in six innings and won his second straight decision in Saturday's victory over the Aggies.

★ **Jackson Brennan** continued his hot start, going 7-for-14 on the weekend with four RBI.

★ GU travels to Washington for a three-game series this weekend.



LMU Lions (2-8 / 0-0 WCC)

★ The Lions fell to 2-8 on the season after being swept by Hawaii at Paige Stadium over the weekend.

★ **Brad Meyers** was the tough luck loser in Friday's 3-1 loss to the Rainbows, tossing a career-high 7.1 innings and striking out four Hawaii batters.

★ **Brian Wilson** has been effective on the mound and at the plate so far in his freshman season. Wilson went 3-for-4 at the plate in Sunday's 11-4 loss to Hawaii, and came on to toss 2.1 scoreless innings of relief with three strikeouts. On the season, Wilson is batting .400 (4-for-10) and leads the team with a 1.50 ERA in four appearances.

★ The Lions wrap up their seven-game homestand against UC Riverside (2/21) before traveling to San Jose State for a three-game set this weekend. LMU has the ninth toughest non-conference schedule in the nation according to BoydsWorld.com.



Pepperdine Waves (6-4 / 0-0 WCC)

★ Pepperdine enjoyed an outstanding week at Eddy D. Field Stadium, knocking off then-No. 15 ranked Long Beach State, 3-2, before taking two-of-three from then-No. 2 ranked Oregon State.

★ **Brett Hunter** has stepped into the closer role vacated by 2005 All-American Steve Kleen. The freshman earned saves against Long Beach State and Oregon State last week, and has not allowed a run in five relief appearances. He has 10 strikeouts in 8.2 innings pitched.

★ **David Uribes** has crossed the plate 10 times this season to move into second place on the Pepperdine career runs chart and 10th place on the WCC runs list with 189.

★ **Adrian Ortiz** did not play in the OSU series after sustaining a wrist injury against LBSU.

★ Pepperdine heads to UCLA (2/21) before traveling to No. 8 Tulane for a weekend series.



Portland Pilots (1-3 / 0-0 WCC)

★ Portland began the new campaign at Dallas Baptist, dropping three-of-four games to the host Patriots, including a 23-8 loss on February 14.

★ **Gustaf Little** clubbed a grand slam in the Pilots' loss to Dallas Baptist on February 14, marking his first home run of the season.

★ **Austin Dirx** picked up his first victory in a Pilot uniform on February 13, coming on in relief to strike out four batters in two scoreless innings of work.

★ The Pilots clubbed seven home runs in four games against Dallas Baptist. It took Portland 16 games to hit seven dingers in 2005.

★ UP heads to the River City Classic this weekend where they will meet Washington State (2/23), Sacramento State (2/24), and North Dakota State (2/25).

Saint Mary's Gaels (4-4 / 0-0 WCC)

★ After beginning the season with a 4-1 mark, the Gaels struggled against Sacramento State over the weekend, dropping three straight to the Hornets.

★ **Orben Frederick** enjoyed an outstanding weekend, batting .462 (6-for-13) in the series with Sacramento State. The senior went 3-for-5 with an RBI in the series opener, and went 2-for-6 at the plate with a run in Sunday's finale.

★ **Delaney Gallagher** collected three hits on the weekend and currently sits in eighth place on the Saint Mary's career hits chart with 188. He also ranks seventh on the SMC career list for total bases with 261.

★ The Gaels host San Jose State (2/21) before taking on North Dakota State (2/24), BYU (2/25), and No. 10 ranked Oregon State (2/26) at the River City Classic.



San Diego Toreros (7-2 / 0-0 WCC)

★ San Diego's bats provided the fireworks as the Toreros went 2-1 at the USC Public Storage Classic over the weekend, knocking off Vanderbilt and then-No. 30 Kansas before falling to then-No. 25 USC.

★ **Josh Butler** continued to baffle opposing hitters, tossing eight scoreless innings and striking out eight in USD's 10-0 win over Vanderbilt. Butler improved to 3-0 on the season and has not allowed a run in 20 innings pitched so far this season.

★ **Jordan Abruzzo** led the hit parade in Saturday's 17-6 win over Kansas, going 4-for-5 with five RBI, while slugging a pair of doubles and one home run. Abruzzo is batting .343 (12-for-35) on the season, and has driven in a team-high nine runs.

★ The Toreros host UC Irvine (2/21) at Cunningham Stadium before traveling to face Southeastern Conference foe Georgia for a three-game series.



San Francisco Dons (4-7 / 0-0 WCC)

★ San Francisco claimed the opener of its series at Southern Utah, 9-2, but dropped the final two games of the series to fall to 4-7 on the season.

★ **Pat McGuigan** collected his second victory and first complete game of the season in Friday's win, throwing seven innings and holding Southern Utah to three hits.

★ **Joey Railey** pounded out six hits on the week, including a 3-for-4 performance with three RBI in last Tuesday's loss to San Jose State. Railey currently paces the team with a .444 (16-for-36) batting average, and ranks third on the squad with nine RBI.

★ **Tavo Hall** went 4-for-5 with three runs scored in Friday's win over Southern Utah.

★ USF travels to UC Davis (2/21) before meeting Washington State (2/26) and Sacramento State (2/26) at the River City Classic.



Santa Clara Broncos (4-5 / 0-0 WCC)

★ Santa Clara's series with UC Riverside was cut short, but the Broncos rebounded from a 1-0 loss on Saturday to top the Highlanders in 13 innings on Sunday, 3-2.

★ **Dustin Realini** and **Ryan Conan** provided the heroics in Sunday's win. Realini tied the game at 2-2 with a dramatic two out home run in the 13th inning, while Conan drove in the winning run with a base hit following a pair of SCU singles.

★ **Mark Willinsky** notched his first collegiate victory on Sunday, coming on in relief of starter **Justin Kuehn** and striking out four batters in 4.2 innings pitched.

★ **Sean O'Neill** threw 7.1 innings of scoreless ball in Saturday's 1-0 loss to the Highlanders.

WCC Player of the Week

Shane Buschini, San Diego

Shane Buschini led San Diego to a 2-1 mark at the USC Public Storage Classic in Los Angeles over the weekend. The junior batted .500 (6-for-12) through three games, slugging a home run, a pair of doubles, and driving in five runs as the Toreros knocked off Vanderbilt, then-No. 30 ranked Kansas, and fell to host USC. The Danville, CA native played a huge role in the win over the Jayhawks, going 4-for-5 with a double and a home run.



WCC Pitcher of the Week

Barry Enright, Pepperdine

Barry Enright posted a 2-0 record during the week as he registered victories over No. 15 Long Beach State and No. 2 Oregon State. In two outings, Enright worked 15.0 innings, allowed 10 hits, three runs, and struck out 10, while limiting opposition to a .200 average. The sophomore earned his first win of the season against LBSU after logging seven innings, surrendering just two runs and striking out four. Against OSU, He pitched eight innings, and struck out a career-high six batters.

Two WCC Teams Ranked In The Top-10 For First Time

San Diego and Pepperdine were ranked in the top-10 in the nation according to the most recent *Collegiate Baseball* poll, marking the first time that two WCC squads have been listed among the top-10 teams in the nation. San Diego achieved a program-best ranking at No. 8 after going 2-1 at the USC Public Storage Classic, while Pepperdine moved up to No. 9 after taking two-of-three from then-No. 2 ranked Oregon State last weekend. Both squads were ranked in the *Collegiate Baseball* preseason poll, and the Waves were ranked as high as No. 11 in the preseason listings.

Pepperdine Named National Team Of The Week

The Pepperdine Waves became the second straight WCC team to be named as the National Team of the Week by online news magazine *College Baseball Insider* on February 21 following an outstanding week at Eddy D. Field Stadium. The Waves knocked off then-No. 15 ranked Long Beach State on Tuesday, 3-2, before taking two of three from then-No. 2 ranked Oregon State over the weekend. Pepperdine improved to 6-4 on the season and are ranked as high as No. 9 in the national polls.

San Diego's Butler and Pepperdine's Enright Named To National Honor Roll

San Diego's Josh Butler and Pepperdine's Barry Enright were named to the Collegiate Baseball Foundation National Honor Roll following their respective performances on the mound over the weekend. Butler out-dueled the much-heralded David Price to defeat Vanderbilt, 10-0, in the USC Public Storage Classic. Butler (3-0) had not been scored on in 12 innings coming into the game versus the Team USA star, and extended that number to 20 with eight innings of shutout baseball. The junior struck out eight, including six in a row, while allowing four hits in the game for the Toreros. Enright, the WCC Pitcher of the Week, posted a 2-0 record during the week as he registered victories over No. 15 Long Beach State and No. 2 Oregon State.

Gonzaga Named National Team Of The Week

The Gonzaga Bulldogs were named as the National Team of the Week by online news magazine *College Baseball Insider* on February 14 following their performance at the Coca-Cola Spring Training Classic in Surprise, Arizona. The Zags came out of the tournament unscathed, knocking off three quality opponents including a pair of squads that were ranked in the top-10 nationally. Gonzaga began the tournament with a convincing 9-1 win over then-No. 10 ranked Arizona State behind Patrick Donovan's six-inning, three strikeout effort. It marked the second straight time that Donovan has defeated the Sun Devils, after earning the win at the same event a year ago. After Gonzaga's bats exploded for 15 hits in an 11-5 win over Nevada, the Bulldogs closed out the tournament with a 6-5 victory over then-No. 2 ranked Oregon State to capture their second tournament title in as many weeks. The Zags improved to 6-1 on the season with the three wins and jumped into the national rankings for the first time since 1981, garnering a No. 29 ranking in the *Collegiate Baseball* poll.

Butler struck out five Aggie batters in seven innings of work and did not surrender a run in posting his second straight shutout. Butler tossed 12 innings and struck out 10 hitters in his first two outings, limiting opponents to a .128 batting average.

WCC Non-Conference Schedules Among the Nation's Toughest

WCC teams have some of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation according to the strength of schedule ratings published by BoydsWorld.com. All eight conference teams have non-conference "SOS's" that rank in the top-77 in the nation. LMU's non-conference slate ranks as the ninth toughest, while San Diego's checks in at No. 10. Pepperdine has a No. 21 strength of schedule, while Portland is listed with the No. 26 toughest slate.

WCC Baseball Returns To One Division Format For 2006

Beginning this season, the West Coast Conference will change its alignment and schedule for the baseball conference slate. A one-division format will once again be implemented, and the eight institutions will compete in a 21-game conference season. Over the past seven seasons, WCC schools competed in a two-division format, West and Coast, with a 30-game conference schedule. Under the one-division, 21-game format, each school will play the other seven opponents one time over the course of an eight-week season. Each school will play seven three-game series, with one week serving as a bye week. The WCC Championship Series will continue despite the change in format, as the top two teams with the best conference records will compete for the league title in a "best of three" series, with the regular season winner earning home field advantage.

Three WCC Teams Ranked In Preseason Polls

Three WCC teams were ranked in the 2006 college baseball preseason polls. Pepperdine, which finished last year ranked as high as No. 23, is the top ranked conference squad checking in at No. 13 in the *Collegiate Baseball* top-40 preseason poll and garnering a No. 11 ranking in the *Baseball America* preseason listing. The Waves also garnered a No. 12 ranking in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and a No. 14 ranking in the USA Today coaches poll. San Francisco, coming off of one of the top seasons in program history, checked in at No. 35 in the *Collegiate Baseball* poll and San Diego was right on the Dons' heels at No. 36. The Toreros are welcoming in a nationally-rated recruiting class to go along with a strong returning cast.

Pepperdine Tabbed As Favorite In 2006 WCC Preseason Poll

Pepperdine, the two-time defending conference champion, was selected as the favorite to win the WCC baseball championship in the 2006 WCC preseason poll, as selected by the conference coaches. The Waves, who earned a No. 11 preseason rank from *Baseball America*, received six first place votes for a total of 48 points to edge San Diego for first place in this season's poll. Coach Steve Rodriguez hopes to lead an experienced squad to its third straight conference title after posting a 41-23 overall mark and coming within one win of advancing to a Super Regional in 2005. USD received the remaining two first place votes, and garnered a total of 42 points. San Francisco, coming off of the best season in program history, was tabbed for a third place finish with 34 points, just ahead of LMU at the No. 4 spot with 32 points. Gonzaga claimed the fifth spot with a total of 26 points, followed by Santa Clara at No. 6 with 18 points. Saint Mary's and Portland were picked to finish seventh and eighth with 16 and eight points, respectively.

WEST COAST CONFERENCE BASEBALL HISTORY



Baseball was originally established as a conference sport in 1968. The early period of WCC play was dominated by Santa Clara, as the Broncos claimed the first five conference championships. Loyola Marymount captured its first conference title in 1973, before Pepperdine won three straight conference crowns from 1974-76.

From 1977-84, WCC teams competed with teams from the current Big West and Western Athletic conferences in the Northern California Baseball Association and the Southern California Baseball Association. Pepperdine made the only College World Series appearance among WCC squads during this period, finishing third at the 1979 event.

Conference play resumed in 1985 and the WCC would enjoy some of its greatest baseball success in the late 80's and early 90's.

LMU began the period with an appearance at the College World Series in 1986. Led by future Major Leaguers Billy Bean and Tim Layan, the Lions achieved a No. 1 national ranking in the ESPN/Collegiate Baseball poll on April 22 of that year. Pepperdine capped off the era with the conference's first-ever national championship in baseball, claiming the College World Series title in 1992. The Waves reeled off four straight victories in Omaha, including a 3-2 triumph over Cal State Fullerton in the championship game. The WCC sent multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament three times between 1986-89, with a conference record three teams (Loyola Marymount, Pepperdine, and Santa Clara) earning regional bids following the 1988 season.

Long time conference members Gonzaga and Portland joined the league for baseball in 1996, moving from the Pacific-10 North Division and giving the conference its current membership. The WCC went to a two-division alignment in 1999, matching the two division winners in a three-game Championship Series to determine the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. San Diego claimed its first-ever WCC title in 2002, and repeated as champions in 2003.

Pepperdine reclaimed the conference crown under current head coach Steve Rodriguez in 2004, and repeated as champions in 2005 to advance to the program's third straight postseason. With the conference returning to a single-division format for the 2006 season, the WCC Championship Series will feature the league's top two squads at the conclusion of the regular season.
