NEED TO KNOW

- Gonzaga and Michigan square off in the finals of the 2025 Players Era Championship Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. in the MGM Grand Garden Arena. The Wolverines won the only other previous meeting between the programs, beating the Zags in the 2019 Battle 4 Atlantis Championships in The Bahamas.

- The Bulldogs cruised to a 100-61 win over Maryland in the second game of the tournament. Eleven Zags scored led by Braden Huff's 20 points on 9-of-10 shooting. Mario Saint-Supéry had nine of GU's 30 assists on 37 made shots from the field. Emmanuel Innocenti made five of his seven three-point attempts, while Steele Venters made 4-of-7 from deep. Gonzaga finished 14-for-33 from behind-the-arc.

- Following the win, GU jumped to No. 1 in KenPom's rankings, with its offense and defense both being fourth in the country. One of two programs with both being in the Top 10, Duke is third (off.) and seventh (def.).

- The Zags currently lead the West Coast Conference in scoring margin (32.9, 2nd in NCAA), field goal percentage (53.0, 9th in NCAA), scoring offense (95.0, 9th in NCAA), three-point field goal percentage defense (24.9, 15th in NCAA), rebounds (45.57, 13th in NCAA), defensive rebounds per game (31.1, 14th in NCAA), turnover margin (5.9, 18th in NCAA), steals (9.4), and turnovers forced per game (16.29).

- Graham Ike eclipsed the 2,000-point mark in his career in the win over Creighton. He needed nine points to reach the mark and finished with 20. He sits at 2,078. Ike ranks second among active scorers in NCAA Div. 1, Indiana's Tucker DeVries is first at 2,082. Ike's 958 rebounds also ranks second among active players. He is the only active player with 1,500 points and 900 rebounds in a career. Ike was named preseason All-American by CBS Sports and ESPN, and to the NABC, Wooden, and Naismith Player of the Year watch lists.

- GU opens the season 7-0 for the first time since 2021-22, when the team entered the national championship game at 31-0. The Zags have now opened 7-0 eight times under Few (2008-09, 2012-13, 2014-15, 2016-17, 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21). With the exception of 2008-09, all those previous teams moved to 8-0.

- While the Bulldogs only return 36 percent of their scoring from last season, along with 34 percent of their rebounding, the current roster features four 1,000-point career scorers and two more at 864 and 825. Seven Zags have played at least 70 games in their careers, with six averaging at least 20 minutes per game. GU's 2025-26 roster features the 2022-23 Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year, the 2022-23 Big Sky Player of the Year, the 2023-24 WAC Player of the Year, and the 2023-24 Patriot League Player of the Year. KenPom metrics ranks the Bulldogs' roster second in the nation in experience.

- The Zags were ranked No. 21 in the preseason Associated Press poll. It marks the 25th straight season GU has been ranked in the AP poll, and 16th in the preseason poll.

For over 25 years, Mark Few has built one of the greatest dynasties in college basketball. Since taking over at Gonzaga University in 1999, Few has turned a small private school in Spokane, Washington, into a national powerhouse defined by consistency, innovation, and excellence. Entering the 2024–25 season, Few owns the highest active winning percentage in NCAA Division I men’s basketball (.830) with a career record of 741–152. Under his leadership, Gonzaga has: Reached 26 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, Captured 22 WCC regular-season titles and 20 conference tournament crowns, Advanced to two national championship games, five Elite Eights, and thirteen Sweet Sixteens. Few’s program is synonymous with player development, offensive efficiency, and selfless teamwork, underpinned by a culture of humility, discipline, and relentless competitiveness.

Born in 1962, in Creswell, Ore., Few grew up in a small-town environment that shaped his values and drive. A standout multi-sport athlete at Creswell High, he graduated from the University of Oregon (B.S., Physical Education, 1987) and later earned an M.A. in Athletic Administration from Gonzaga (1993). Though he never played college basketball, Few’s sharp basketball mind led him quickly into coaching. After stints at the high school level, he joined Gonzaga as a graduate assistant in 1989 under head coach Dan Fitzgerald. At that time, Gonzaga had never appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Few’s energy and recruiting acumen soon earned him a full-time assistant role, and he helped build the foundation for Gonzaga’s rise. The 1999 Elite Eight run under Dan Monson put the program on the map — and that summer, Gonzaga promoted Few to head coach.

Few’s debut season set the standard: 26–9, both WCC titles, and a Sweet Sixteen appearance. From 2000 to 2004, Gonzaga captured five straight regular-season championships and became a fixture in the national rankings. Under Few’s direction, players such as Dan Dickau, Blake Stepp, and Ronny Turiaf developed into All-Americans and future NBA players. Gonzaga’s hallmark — skill-based, unselfish basketball — stood out in an era dominated by athleticism and isolation play. By the mid-2000s, the Bulldogs were no longer Cinderella. The 2006 team, led by national Player of the Year Adam Morrison, made another Sweet Sixteen, proving Gonzaga belonged among the nation’s elite. Few continued to challenge his teams with ambitious schedules, seeking matchups with programs like Duke, North Carolina, and Arizona. In 2013, Gonzaga achieved its first-ever No. 1 AP ranking and top NCAA Tournament seed. The 2014–15 team finished 35–3 and reached the Elite Eight, cementing Few’s status as one of the sport’s premier coaches.

Gonzaga’s transformation into a national powerhouse peaked in this era. The 2016–17 team (37–2) reached the national championship game for the first time, falling narrowly to North Carolina. Two years later, the 2018–19 squad featuring Rui Hachimura, Brandon Clarke, and Killian Tillie reached another Elite Eight after multiple top-10 wins. The 2020–21 Bulldogs produced one of the most dominant seasons in NCAA history: Opened 31–0, led the nation in offense, Featured stars Jalen Suggs, Corey Kispert, and Drew Timme, Reached the national championship game after Suggs’ iconic half-court buzzer-beater in the Final Four. Though they fell to Baylor, Gonzaga’s undefeated run into the final cemented their place in basketball lore.

Few’s adaptability has kept Gonzaga among the elite. 2021–22: Future NBA lottery pick Chet Holmgren led another Sweet Sixteen run. 2022–23: Gonzaga reached the Elite Eight, highlighted by a dramatic comeback win over UCLA. 2023–24: The Bulldogs extended their NCAA streak to 25 straight appearances, captured another WCC title, and remained nationally ranked. Few continues to innovate, blending transfers, international recruits, and freshmen into balanced, championship-caliber teams.

Few has coached 22 All-Americans and produced a steady pipeline of NBA players, including: Domantas Sabonis, Rui Hachimura, Jalen Suggs, Chet Holmgren, Corey Kispert, Kelly Olynyk, Zach Collins, and Andrew Nembhard. Gonzaga players are recognized for their basketball IQ, skill, and team-first mentality, reflecting Few’s developmental philosophy.

Few’s leadership extends to the international stage: Assistant Coach, Team USA (Gold – 2024 Paris Olympics), Head Coach, 2015 Pan American Games (Bronze), Assistant, 2012 FIBA Americas U18 (Gold), Contributor, 2019 FIBA World Cup staff.

Off the court, Mark and Marcy Few are deeply engaged in philanthropy. Through Coaches vs. Cancer and the Community Cancer Fund, they’ve raised over \$25 million for research, treatment access, and family support across the Inland Northwest.

The Fews live in Spokane, Washington, and have four children — A.J., Joseph, Julia, and Colt. Away from basketball, Mark Few is an avid fly fisherman and outdoorsman, often found exploring the rivers and lakes of the Pacific Northwest — a pursuit that mirrors the balance and perspective he brings to his life and career.

SCOUTING THE WOLVERINES

- Michigan rolled to a pair of victories in its two games at the Players Era Championship, 94-54 over San Diego State, and 102-72 over No. 21 Auburn.
- In Tuesday's victory over Auburn, six Wolverines finished in double-digit scoring led by Yaxel Lendeborg and Roddy Gayle Jr., who both finished with 17 points. Aday Mara grabbed eight rebounds. Michigan made 51.5 percent from the field, including 14-of-35 from behind-the-arc. Auburn was held to 35.5 percent shooting from the field. The Wolverines outrebounded the Tigers, 51-35.
- Four Wolverines average double-digit scoring, with three more at 8.5 points or more.
- Lendeborg is scoring a team-high 15.3 points per game at 60.4 percent shooting. Morez Johnson Jr. adds 13.5 points per outing. Mara pulls down 9.5 rebounds a game, while shooting 63.4 percent from the field.
- Lendeborg was named Preseason All-Big Ten. The Wolverines were picked second in the conference's preseason poll by the media.

SERIES INFO

- Gonzaga and Michigan meet for only the second time.
- The Wolverines won the first meeting in the 2019 Battle 4 Atlantis Championship Game, 82-64. Isaiah Livers scored 21 points to lead Michigan, while Jon Teske added 19 points and 15 rebounds. Killian Tillie scored 20 points for the No. 8 Bulldogs, and Filip Petrusev chipped in nine points and nine rebounds.

UP NEXT

- Gonzaga travels to Nashville, Tenn., for a matchup with Kentucky in Bridgestone Arena on Dec. 5.
- It will be the fifth all-time meeting between GU and Kentucky. The series is split at 2-2 all-time.
- Last season in Seattle, the No. 4 Wildcats rallied from an 18-point deficit early in the second half to pickup a 90-89 win in overtime. The No. 7 Zags' Graham Ike led all scorers with 28 points and 11 rebounds.
- In 2023, the Zags won at No. 17 Kentucky, 89-85. Graham Ike scored a team-high 23 points, while Braden Huff added 12. Ryan Nemphard dished out nine assists.
- In 2022, No. 2 Gonzaga beat No. 4 Kentucky in Spokane, 88-72. Rasir Bolton scored 24 points, Drew Timme added 22, and Julian Strawther had 20 points and 14 rebounds. Anton Watson had 10 points and 10 rebounds and spent the evening guarding reigning player of the year Oscar Tshiebwe.
- In the first matchup, the Wildcats beat Gonzaga 80-72 in the 2002 Maui Invitational. Kentucky was ranked 15th and the Zags were No. 20. Blake Stepp scored a game-high 24 points with five three-pointers to lead GU.

ABOUT PLAYERS ERA CHAMPIONSHIP

- The 2025 Players Era Championship in Las Vegas is the second edition of the event.
- GU is one of 18 teams in the elite field this year, with the tournament hoping to expand to 32 in 2026.
- Nine games on Monday and Tuesday will be played between MGM Grand Garden and Michelob Ultra Arena.
- The 18-team Players Era Championship features 13 programs ranked or receiving votes in the preseason AP Poll: No. 2 Houston, No. 5 St. John's, No. 7 Michigan, No. 15 Alabama, No. 16 Iowa State, No. 18 Tennessee, No. 19 Kansas, No. 20 Auburn, No. 21 Gonzaga, No. 23 Creighton, Oregon (98 votes), San Diego State (74

votes), and Baylor (one vote).

GIVING THANKS FOR THESE EVENTS

- Gonzaga is 50-14 under Mark Few in events during the week of Thanksgiving, and 39-8 in the last 10 Thanksgiving week events.
- Under Mark Few, GU has won seven tournaments during the week of Thanksgiving, and played in 12 of the 19 tournament championship games.
- Last season at the Battle 4 Atlantis in The Bahamas, the Zags were upset in overtime by West Virginia, before easing to wins over Indiana and Davidson.

VIVA LAS ZAGAS

- Prior to this year, the Bulldogs played eight regular season games in Las Vegas, falling to UNLV in 1965 and 1977, a loss to Seattle in 1977, and beating No. 3 Georgia Tech, 85-73, in 2004.
- In 2021, top-ranked Gonzaga beat Central Michigan (107-54) and No. 2 UCLA (83-63) in the Empire Classic at T-Mobile Arena, before falling to No. 5 Duke, 84-81.
- On Dec. 2, 2023, No. 11 Gonzaga beat USC, 89-76, the Legends of Basketball Las Vegas Invitational in the MGM Grand Garden Arena.
- Gonzaga is 35-4 in the WCC Tournament since 2009, when the event moved to Las Vegas. The four losses in the tournament in Las Vegas have all been to Saint Mary's, the 2010, 2012, 2019, and 2024 finals.
- The Bulldogs were 33-13 in the conference tournament prior to it coming to Vegas.
- The Zags have never lost an opening game of the tournament in Las Vegas, winning all 17.
- Gonzaga has won in the WCC tournament semifinals in each of the past 28 years. The Zags last loss in the WCC semifinals was 1994, 83-75, to San Diego in Santa Clara.
- The Bulldogs are 31-2 in semifinal games at the tournament, winning all 17 in Las Vegas.
- GU is 13-4 in the WCC Tournament finals played in Las Vegas. The Bulldogs are 22-9 in championship games at the WCC tournament all-time.

EXPERIENCE IS KEY

- While the Bulldogs only return 36 percent of their scoring from last season, along with 34 percent of their rebounding, the current roster features four 1,000-point career scorers and two more at 864 and 825.
- Eight Zags have played at least 70 games in their careers, with seven averaging at least 20 minutes.
- KenPom metrics ranks the Bulldogs' lineup second in the nation in experience. KenPom's "experience" statistic measures average number of full DI seasons played, weighted by minutes played. GU is at 2.88, while Indiana leads at 3.03.
- The average age of Gonzaga's roster, featuring 12 scholarship players and four walk-ons, is 21.2 years old. The Brooklyn Nets, by comparison, are the NBA's youngest team at 23.3 years old.
- GU's roster features the 2022-23 Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year, the 2022-23 Big Sky Conference Player of the Year, the 2023-24 WAC Player of the Year, and the 2023-24 Patriot League Player of the Year.

- Gonzaga's 122-50 win over Southern Utah was a program record margin of victory over a Div. 1 opponent.

- Creighton went just 7-of-25 from the field in the second half, including 2-for-12.

SHOWCASING THE DEPTH

- In the Zags' 83-68 victory over Oklahoma, GU's bench outscored its counterparts, 38-8.
- Tyon Grant-Foster and Jalen Warley came off the bench to combine for 27 points and 15 rebounds.
- Three Bulldogs came off the bench and played over 20 minutes, with Steele Venters adding 12 minutes.

A DEFENSIVE DELIGHT

- The Bulldogs defense held Texas Southern to just 25 percent shooting from the field in the season-opening win, including 3-of-21 (14 percent) from behind-the-arc.
- Gonzaga forced 17 TSU turnovers behind nine steals.
- The Zags outscored the Tigers 52-16 in the second half, while limiting Texas Southern to 5-of-30 shooting from the field, including 0-of-11 from three.
- Jalen Warley had four steals in his Gonzaga debut.

ZAGS INK TOP 15 RECRUITING CLASS

- Gonzaga signed Luca Foster, Sam Funches, and Jack Kayil for the 2026-27 season.
- The Zags have the No. 15 signing class on ESPN.com.
- Foster ranks 37th on ESPN's SCNext Top 100. He is the top-ranked recruit in Pennsylvania and will now play for Link Academy in Missouri. He's also 36th on 247Sports Composite rankings. The 6-5, 185-pound recruit is listed as the 16th-best small forward in the country. With Team Final on the Nike EYBL Circuit over the summer, he averaged 15.4 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. He made 37 percent from three-point range on nearly five attempts per game during the circuit.
- Funches is a four-star recruit according to ESPN and 247Sports. He ranks as the 42nd top recruit in his class on Rivals. The top-ranked ranked player in Mississippi is a consensus top-10 center in the class of 2026 and ranked as high as No. 8 by On3.com. The 7-0, 205-pound recruit helped

Germantown to its first state championship last year in the MHSAA Class 7A playoffs after beating Madison Central 69-52. He averaged 14.7 points, 8.8 rebounds, 4.7 blocks and 1.7 assists during the 2024-25 season. On the Puma PRO16 Circuit this past summer, he averaged 11.0 points, 5.7 rebounds, 1.7 blocks, and 1.1 assists with Team Sipp United.

- Kayil is a four-star recruit according to ESPN and 247Sports. He averaged 11.1 points and 6.6 assists per game for Germany at the FIBA U-19 World Cup, helping lead the team to a silver medal. In the gold-medal game, he recorded 13 points and five assists against Team USA. His assist average ranked second in the tournament, and he posted an impressive 2.88 assist-to-turnover ratio. This season, the guard will play for Alba Berlin of Germany's Bundesliga.

IKE NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Graham Ike was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches and Naismith Trophy preseason watch lists for the Division I Player of the Year.
- Ike is 28 points from 2,000 in his career. He has started in 109 of his 116 career appearances. Last season led the WCC in field goal percentage (59.8), was third in scoring (17.3), and fifth in rebounding (7.3). He is coming off back-to-back First Team All-Conference selections. The Colorado native was named Preseason All-American by multiple outlets after earning the WCC Tournament Most Outstanding Player honor last year.
- The 2026 NABC Division I Player of the Year - selected by a nationwide vote of Division I head coaches - will be announced the week of the 2026 Men's Final Four.

IKE NAMED TO MALONE AWARD WATCH LIST

- Graham Ike was named to the Karl Malone Award Watch List. The Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced the 20 watch-list candidates.
- Named after Class of 2010 Hall of Famer and two-time NBA Most Valuable Player Karl Malone, the annual honor in its 11th year recognizes the top power forwards in Division I men's college basketball. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates in November, which has now been narrowed to 10.
- In late January, the watch list of 20 players for the 2026 Karl Malone Award will be narrowed to 10, and then in late February, to just five. In March, the five finalists will be presented to Malone and the Hall of Fame's selection committee, where winners will be selected. The Selection Committee for the Karl Malone Award is composed of top men's college basketball personnel, including media members, head coaches, and sports information directors.
- The winner of the 2026 Karl Malone Award will be presented on a to be determined date, along with the other four members of the Men's Starting Five. Additional awards being presented include the Bob Cousy Award (Point Guard), Jerry West Award (Shooting Guard), Julius Erving (Small Forward), and the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award (Center).

ZAGS PICKED WCC PRESEASON FAVORITE

- For the 23rd time in the last 25 seasons, the Gonzaga men's basketball team was selected as favorites in the West Coast Conference preseason coaches' poll.
- With the exception of the 2023-24 and 2017-18 seasons, the Zags have been first place in every WCC preseason poll since 2001.
- GU received nine of the league's 12 first place votes in this year's poll. Coaches are not allowed to vote for their own program.
- Saint Mary's and San Francisco collected the other three

first place votes in this year's poll. Santa Clara and Oregon State rounded out the top-half of the league.

- The Bulldogs have won 24 of the last 28 WCC regular season championships, 20 of which have been won outright. GU has 26 WCC regular season titles overall, including 22 of the last 25.

- Gonzaga has appeared in 28 straight WCC Tournament Championship games, which is the longest streak of its kind in the nation. The Zags have won the conference tournament title 11 times in the last 14 years.

HUFF AND IKE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-WCC

- Braden Huff and Graham Ike were both named to the conference's preseason team.

- Ike earned the recognition for the third straight season, while Huff makes his first appearance.

GONZAGA RANKED 20TH IN COACHES POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 20 in the preseason USA TODAY Sports/Coaches poll.

- GU opens in the top-20 of the poll for the 13th straight year. GU appears in the coaches' preseason poll for the 16th straight season.

- Purdue was No. 1 in the preseason poll for the first time in program history, collecting 18 of the 31 first-place votes. Houston received 12 first-place votes and was No. 2. Defending national champion Florida also received a first-place vote and was No. 3. UConn and Duke round out the Top 5.

ZAGS OPEN SEASON RANKED NO. 21 IN AP POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 21 in the preseason Associated Press poll. The Bulldogs received 387 points in the preseason rankings.

- This marks the 25th straight season GU has been ranked in the AP Poll and the 16th consecutive year the Zags have appeared in the preseason poll.

- Gonzaga joins Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, and North Carolina as the only programs to appear in each of the last 16 preseason AP Polls.

STEADY IN THE POLLS

- The Bulldogs have appeared in 163 of the last 177 AP Polls (92 percent) since the start of the 2016 season, ranking only behind Kansas's 171 appearances.

- Gonzaga has averaged a No. 7.1 ranking in the AP Polls since 2017, second only to Kansas (6.3).

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

- The Zags have now won 22 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in New York City.

- GU has won 36 consecutive regular season home-openers since a 73-65 loss to Boise State on Dec. 7, 1988.

- Gonzaga has won all 21 regular season home-openers in the McCarthy Athletic Center and all 27 regular season home-openers under Mark Few.

THE SLATE

- No. 5 St. John's and No. 3 Houston are potential opponents for Gonzaga on the final day of the Players Era Championship. The Bulldogs open the event against No. 15 Alabama on Nov. 24.

- The Zags host No. 23 Creighton on Nov. 11. No. 9 Kentucky and GU meet in Nashville, Tenn., on Dec. 5, before Gonzaga faces No. 12 UCLA in the Seattle Hoops Showdown on Dec. 13.

ZAGS

- The Bulldogs close their nonconference schedule in the Northwest Elite Showdown versus Oregon in Portland on Dec. 21. The Ducks are two spots outside the Top 25, receiving 98 votes.

- Gonzaga welcomes Oklahoma to Spokane on Nov. 8; the Sooners received one vote in the poll.

- West Coast Conference foe Saint Mary's (Jan. 31 and Feb. 28) received two votes in the preseason rankings.

- During their non-conference slate, the Zags could face up to eight teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season.

- Seven non-conference opponents won 20 or more games in 2024-25 and finished inside the Top 75 in last year's NET rankings.

- Gonzaga plays teams from eight different conferences, including the Big Ten, Big East, Big 12, and SEC.

- The Bulldogs are a participant in this year's Players Era Festival and three more neutral site games.

ANOTHER HIGH KENPOM RANKING

- Gonzaga came in at No. 8 overall and No. 9 in the metrics' offensive efficiency scale in KenPom's preseason metric rankings.

- Houston sits atop the ratings, with Florida, Purdue, Kentucky, and UConn in the Top 5. Illinois, Duke, Tennessee, and UCLA round out the Top 10.

- On top of having the No. 2 offense, the Zags are No. 20 in adjusted defensive efficiency. GU's defense ranked 45th in last year's preseason rankings.

- Referred to as KenPom, the advanced analytics website ranks all 365 Division-I men's college basketball teams based on numerous factors. It considers aspects such as a team's offensive and defensive efficiencies, tempo, luck and strength of schedule.
