TIPOFF

THE GAMES: Grambling State will look for its first win of the season, while Iowa will be seeking its second consecutive victory over a Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) opponent after defeating Alabama State on Monday in the Cayman Islands Classic Preliminary Game. The Tigers won't have much time to rest as GSU visits Vermillion, South Dakota on Saturday to take on a South Dakota team coming off wins over Mayville State and Bowling Green.

RANKINGS: All teams come into the contest unranked.

SERIES HISTORY: Grambling State is 0-1 all-time against Iowa, with the loss 93-73 coming on Dec. 6, 1996. The Tigers and Coyotes are making their first meeting in the series.

GRAMBLING STATE: The Tigers will look to rebound after a 94-65 loss to begin the season at VCU.

Grambling State got 16 points off the bench from Dontae Jones, along with eight boards, in the loss to the Rams. Shirmane Thomas and Anthony Gaston added 14 and 11 points, respectively, as the Tigers shot nearly 38 percent (22-of-58) from the field and 19-of-30 (63.3 percent) from the foul line.

IOWA: The Hawkeyes have won its first two games by an average of 33.5 points over Chicago State and Alabama State. Luka Garza was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after averaging team bests in scoring (13.5), rebounding (9.0) and blocked shots (2.5).

Iowa is averaging 11.5 3-pointers through two games, making 12 against Chicago State and 11 against Alabama State.

SOUTH DAKOTA: The Coyotes are averaging 87.5 points a game and the defense is giving up just 69.0 a contest. Matt Mooney paces three South Dakota players in double figures, averaging 19.5 points and 4.5 rebounds. Tyler Hagedorn is averaging 13.0 points and 4.5 boards a game, while Carlton Hurst is averaging 11.5 points and 7.5 rebounds.

GRAMBLING STATE HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH DONTE' JACKSON



DONTE' JACKSON was named head men's basketball coach at Grambling State University in July 2017.

Prior to GSU, Jackson spent three seasons as the head men's basketball coach at Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

In his first season at Stillman, the Tigers finished 17-10 overall and 13-6 in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) en route to a first-place regular-season finish in the conference. The Tigers were especially tough at home, ending the year with an 11-1 mark.

Jackson's second year was Stillman's most decorated season in school history. The Tigers finished 27-6, won the 2016 SIAC Championship Tournament and earned a berth in the NCAA tournament, where they defeated West Georgia in their first-round game. Jackson was named SIAC Coach of the Year, as well as BOXTOROW National Coach of the Year. Additionally, his team produced the SIAC Player of the Year, as well as Newcomer of the Year.

In June 2016, he was named interim athletics director and spent the year leading both the athletics department and the men's basketball team. Despite the added duties, Jackson's team performed very well on the court. The Tigers surpassed 20 wins for the second consecutive season (22-5) and had a 10-2 record at home. Stillman led the nation in margin of victory, defeating opponents by an average of 28.6 points per contest. The Tiger offense, which averaged 86.7 points per game, finished second in the country in field goal percentage (52.6%).

GRAMBLING STATE HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH DONTE' JACKSON

Prior to Stillman, Jackson led the men's basketball program at Central State University (CSU) in Wilberforce, Ohio for four seasons. He took over the program in 2010 after serving as an assistant coach at CSU for seven seasons.

During his tenure as head coach at CSU, he went 68-42 and averaged 17 wins each season, including a 19-9 mark during the 2011-12 campaign. While serving as an assistant coach at CSU, he helped guide the Marauders to an NCAA tournament appearance and three Independent Conference Association regular-season titles. The team went 125-61 during those seven seasons.

Jackson graduated from CSU in 2003 with a bachelor's of science in education, and in 2008, he earned a master's of science in educational leadership. He was a three-year letterwinner on the Marauder basketball team and earned all-conference and all-region honors during the 2001-02 season. He led the Marauders to the NAIA Division I National Tournament and a Sweet Sixteen appearance with a 24-8 record during 1999-2000 season. Jackson capped his stellar career by being selected as the recipient of the John W. Garland President's Award, presented annually to a student-athlete who embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship through academic and athletic achievements.

Jackson is a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and attended Alexander Hamilton High School. He was an All-City Conference player and received all-state honors his senior year of high school. Prior to attending Central State University, Jackson played one season at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (NCAA Division I).

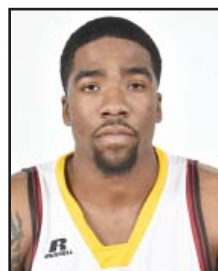

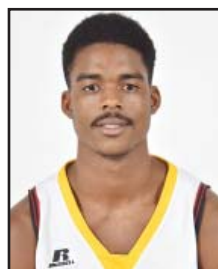

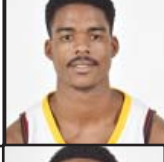

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, athletic officials from six Texas HBCUs — C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn College, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College — met in Houston, Texas, to discuss common interests. At this meeting, they agreed to form a new league, the SWAC.

Paul Quinn became the first of the original members to withdraw from the league when it did so in 1929. When Langston University of Oklahoma was admitted into the conference two years later, it began the migration of state-supported institutions into the SWAC. Southern University entered the ranks in 1934, followed by Arkansas AM&N (now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff) in 1936 and Texas Southern University in 1954. Rapid growth in enrollment of the state-supported schools made it difficult for the church-supported schools to finance their athletics programs and one by one they fell victim to the growing prowess of the state-supported colleges. Bishop withdrew from the conference in 1956, Langston in 1957 and Huston-Tillotson (formerly Samuel Huston) in 1959, one year after the admittance of two more state-supported schools: Grambling College and Jackson State College.

The enter-exit cycle continued in 1961 when Texas College withdrew, followed by the admittance of Alcorn A&M (now Alcorn State University) in 1962. Wiley left in 1968, the same year Mississippi Valley State College entered. Arkansas AM&N exited in 1970 and Alabama State University entered in 1982.

Arkansas—Pine Bluff (formerly Arkansas AM&N) rejoined the SWAC on July 1, 1997, regaining full-member status one year later. Alabama A&M University became the conference's tenth member when it became a full member in September, 1999 after a one year period as an affiliate SWAC member. Most of the former SWAC members that have left the conference are currently a part of the Red River Athletic Conference of the NAIA.

Current championship competition offered by the SWAC includes competition for men in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field and tennis. Women's competition is offered in the sports of basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

THE MISSION AND PURPOSE OF THE SOUTHWESTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Southwestern Athletic Conference, Inc. (the "SWAC", the "Conference") is organized exclusively for the purpose of encouraging, promoting, advancing, and conducting intercollegiate sports activities and other recreational and not-for-profit activities among the members of the Conference. Its purposes are:

- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof;
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request;
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

2017-18 GRAMBLING STATE MEN'S BASKETBALL GAME-BY-GAME

GAME 1

VCU 94, GRAMBLING STATE 65

The Donte' Jackson era has begun at Grambling State University as the Tiger men's basketball program opened the season with a 94-65 loss to VCU at E.J. Wade Arena at the Stuart C. Siegel Center.

Grambling State (0-1) shot nearly 38 percent (22-of-58) from the floor and was 2-of-13 from behind the arc against VCU. The Rams shot 45.3 percent (34-of-75) and benefited from 15 3-pointers to grab the victory.

Diontae Jones came off the bench to spark the Tigers with a career-high 16 points, on 6-of-10 shooting, and pulled down a career-high eight boards in 21 minutes of action. Shirmane Thomas registered 14 points, on 7-of-12 shooting, and seven rebounds, while Anthony Gaston tallied a career-high 11 points, including going 9-of-10 from the free-throw line.

De'Riante Jenkins, Justin Tillman and Jonathan Williams each finished with 14 points to pace the Rams offense. Khris Lane chipped in with 11, while Malik Crowfield added 10. Tillman led the way defensively with a game-high 10 boards, while Williams dished out a game-high five assists.

Turning Point

Grambling State fell behind early and couldn't recover in the road loss.

The Tigers led 4-3 after a bucket by Axel Mpoyo with 18:05 remaining in the first half, but the Rams answered and used a 21-4 run over the next eight minutes to grab a 24-8 advantage after De'Riante Jenkins layup with 9:43 left in the first.

Grambling State cut the margin to 30-20 after a pair of free throws by Bobby Jackson with 5:24 left, but that was as close as the Tigers would get as VCU (1-0) closed out the half on a 20-10 run to take a 50-30 advantage into the half.

Inside The Numbers

* Ivy Smith, Jr. led Grambling State with a game-high six assists and added eight points, with four of those points coming at the foul line.

* Grambling State shot 22-of-58 (37.9 percent) from the field and 19-of-30 (63.3 percent) from the free-throw line.

* VCU was 34-of-75 shooting for 45.3 percent, 15-of-34 (44.1 percent) from behind the 3-point line and 11-of-15 (73.3 percent) from the charity stripe.

* The Tigers were out-rebounded, 49-35, and finished with 12 turnovers.

* Grambling State tallied 25 bench points, 12 points off turnovers and nine second-chance points.

* The Rams finished with 31 bench points, 15 points off turnovers and 13 second-chance points.

* There were three lead changes and one tie.

News & Notes

* Dionte Jones' previous career high for points came Jan. 16, 2017 when he poured in 13 points against Prairie View A&M, and his previous career high for rebounds was six against Selma College (Dec. 9, 2016).

* This was the first meeting between the two schools as VCU came into the contest with a 4-0 record against schools from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC)
