MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials for Grambling State must be requested through GSU's official website. To begin the process, visit www.gsutigers.com/media. Only media covering the Tigers on a consistent basis and on assignment will be considered for season credentials. A lost season credential will result in credentials being issued on a game-by-game basis as available.

MONDAY MEDIA PRESS CONFERENCES

Each game week during the football season, Grambling State will hold a media press conference at 10 a.m. in the Stadium Support Facility in the media room, located on the second floor. Head coach Hue Jackson will speak at 2022 GRAMBLING STATE FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

10 a.m. and selected assistant coaches (one offense and one defense) will be available to the media immediately following Jackson's weekly press conference. In the event of special games (State Fair Classic and Bayou Classic), the press conference will move that week to Tuesday at 10 a.m. Players will only be available upon request at least 48 hours prior to the Monday press conference. Contact the Athletic Communications Office for more details. GSU will hold and conduct interviews during the open weeks of the season.

Jackson's portion of the news conference will be available each week on www.gsutigers.com on Monday afternoons.

MEDIA PRESS CONFERENCE PARKING & ENTRY

Parking for GSU's Monday media press conference is located at the Stadium Support Facility. Members of the media should enter through the front doors and take the elevator to the second floor.

PLAYER INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

All interviews with Grambling State student-athletes should be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office. During the season, GSU players are available after the weekly Monday Press Conference and after practice on Tuesdays. This also includes during the week of the State Fair Classic, Bayou Classic, SWAC Championship Game and Celebration Bowl, players will only be available on Monday and Tuesday only. Telephone interviews may be arranged by contacting Brian Howard in the Athletic Communications Office. ALL interview requests should be made at least 48 hours in advance. GSU's first-year players (true freshmen) are not available for interviews.

COACH INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

Interviews with head coach Hue Jackson should also be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office. Head Coach Hue Jackson is available at GSU's weekly media press conference on Mondays during the season. Telephone interviews with the head coach can be arranged by contacting the Athletic Communications Office. As with the student-athletes, interview requests should be made at least 48 hours in advance.

SWAC CONFERENCE CALL

Head coach Hue Jackson is available via teleconference on Mondays as part of the SWAC Conference call. Contact the SWAC Conference communications staff for more information.

PRACTICE AVAILABILITY

Grambling State's football practices are primarily

closed to the public and media with limited exceptions (media will be notified in advance of those dates). The first portion of the workouts (generally the first 15-20 minutes) is open to photographers. Again, media will be notified in advance of those opportunities.

Members of the media planning to shoot practice should contact the GSU Athletic Communications Office in advance to confirm arrangements and practice times.

PRACTICE LOCATION

The Tigers practice on the practice field next to the Football Stadium Support Facility or inside Eddie G. Robinson Memorial Stadium.

ACCESSING INFORMATION

In addition to the Grambling State Athletics website (www.gsutigers.com), the latest news, weekly releases, updated depth charts, rosters and season and single-game statistics can be sent on a daily or weekly basis via e-mail. Contact Brian Howard to request to be added to the football e-mail list.

When referring to Grambling State University, please only use the terms **GRAMBLING STATE** or **GSU**. Please refrain from acronyms of the name **GRAM**, **Grambling St.** or **GRAM State**, **GRAM St.** In addition, Grambling State plays in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).

SWAC WEEKLY HONORS

Each week during the regular season, the SWAC will name an offensive, defensive, newcomer and special teams player of the week.

SWAC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE/ZOOM

The SWAC football head coaches will be available on a weekly teleconference Mondays from September 5-November 21 from 10:00 am until noon central time. Each coach will be available for 8-10 minutes each week for questions and reviews.

Media representatives who wish to participate should consult the conference weekly release. A schedule of the times available for each coach are located on the SWAC page in the game notes. A replay of each teleconference will be available each Monday on the conference's website: www.swac.org.

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, athletic officials from six Texas HBCUs — C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn College, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College — met in Houston, Texas, to discuss common interests. At this meeting, they agreed to form a new league, the SWAC.

Paul Quinn became the first of the original members to withdraw from the league when it did so in 1929. When Langston University of Oklahoma was admitted into the conference two years later, it began the migration of state-supported institutions into the SWAC. Southern University entered the ranks in 1934, followed by Arkansas AM&N (now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff) in 1936 and Texas Southern University in 1954.

Rapid growth in enrollment of the state-supported schools made it difficult for the church-supported schools to finance their athletics programs and one by one they fell victim to the growing prowess of the state-supported colleges. Bishop withdrew from the conference in 1956, Langston in 1957 and Huston-Tillotson (formerly Samuel Huston) in 1959, one year after the admittance of two more state-supported schools: Grambling College and Jackson State College.

The enter-exit cycle continued in 1961 when Texas College withdrew, followed by the admittance of Alcorn A&M (now Alcorn State University) in 1962. Wiley left in 1968, the same year Mississippi Valley State College entered. Arkansas AM&N exited in 1970 and Alabama State University entered in 1982.

Arkansas-Pine Bluff (formerly Arkansas AM&N) rejoined the SWAC on July 1, 1997, regaining full-member status one year later. Alabama A&M University became the conference's tenth member when it became a full member in September, 1999 after a one year period as an affiliate SWAC member. Most of the former SWAC members that have left the conference are currently a part of the Red River Athletic Conference of the NAIA.

Current championship competition offered by the SWAC includes competition for men in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field and tennis. Women's competition is offered in the sports of basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

THE MISSION AND PURPOSE OF THE SWAC

The Southwestern Athletic Conference, Inc. (the "SWAC", the "Conference") is organized exclusively for the purpose of encouraging, promoting, advancing, and conducting intercollegiate sports activities and other recreational and not-for-profit activities among the members of the Conference. Its purposes are:

- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof;
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request;
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

University of the Pacific, 1986

1st Season as Grambling State Head Coach



Hue Jackson became the 14th head coach in the Grambling State University football program on December 10, 2021.

Jackson comes to Grambling State after spending the past year as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Tennessee State University.

Jackson, who has more than 30 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and professional levels, began his coaching career in 1987 at the University of the Pacific, his alma mater, and spent a majority of the next 13 years in the college ranks. He then moved to the professional ranks in 2001 and remained in the National Football League until 2019.

Jackson spent three years as a graduate assistant at Pacific from 1987-1989 before working two seasons as the running backs coach and special team's coordinator at Cal State Fullerton.

In the spring of 1991, Jackson experienced the professional level for the first time, coaching the running backs, wide receivers and special teams for the World League's London Monarchs.

Jackson returned to the collegiate level in 1992 where he spent four years (1992-1995) at Arizona State University. He coached the running backs for his first three seasons at ASU and worked with the quarterbacks in his fourth year.

Jackson was appointed offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at California in 1996, leading the Bears to

the Aloha Bowl. The following year, Jackson began a four-year stint as the offensive coordinator at the University of Southern California (USC).

While at USC, Jackson helped guide the Trojans in 2000 to the top of the Pac 10 in total offense. In addition, he was responsible for recruiting two Heisman Trophy-winning quarterbacks to USC — Carson Palmer (2002) and Matt Leinart (2004).

The first opportunity in the NFL for Jackson came with the Washington Redskins (now the Washington Commanders). He handled the running back corps for two seasons before being named offensive coordinator in 2003.

In 2004, Jackson began a three-year stretch coaching the wide receivers with the Cincinnati Bengals. Under Jackson's tutelage, Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh combined for 175 receptions for 2,388 yards in 2005, helping the Bengals secure the AFC North title and a play-off berth for the first time in 15 years. The following year, Johnson (1,369 yards) and Houshmandzadeh (1,081 yards) became the first pair of Bengals to eclipse the 1,000-yard receiving mark in a single season.

Jackson left Cincinnati to become the offensive coordinator with the Atlanta Falcons in 2007 before spending two seasons as the quarterback coach with the Baltimore Ravens.

In 2010, Jackson became the offensive coordinator for the Oakland Raiders. After leading the Raiders to a top five finish in scoring (25.6 points/game), Jackson was named

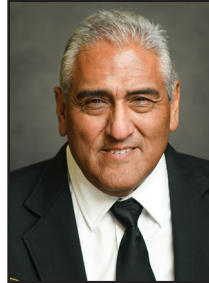

- Grambling State and Northwestern State met for the first time in Shreveport since 1974
- The Tigers and Demons met for the sixth time Grambling State now leads the all-time series, 4-2
- The 26-point victory was the largest in the series for GSU
- The Tigers improved to 16-3-1 all-time in the Shreveport Classic
- The Demons fell to 18-42-3 in the Shreveport Classic
- The GSU win gave Tiger head coach Hue Jackson his first collegiate victory Grambling State trailed, 7-0 in the first quarter and scored 41 unanswered points, including a 27-point outburst in the second quarter
- Garrett Urban has now registered at least one point in the last 10 games, dating back to the 2021 season
- The Tigers played three quarterbacks as Quaterius Hawkins started, while Julian Calvez and Chance Aime saw action the fourth quarter
- Northwestern State blocked three extra points, the first time GSU had one blocked since the Arkansas-Pine Bluff game in the fall of 2021

HAWKINS AND WASHINGTON KEY BIG GSU VICTORY

SHREVEPORT, La. | Quaterius Hawkins threw for 292 yards and three touchdowns in the first half and Maurice Washington provided the spark in the ground game as the Grambling State University football team gave head coach Hue Jackson his first collegiate coaching victory with a 47-21 win in the Shreveport Classic over Northwestern State on Saturday night at Independence Bowl Stadium.

Hawkins put on a showcase in the second quarter with touchdown passes of 83 yards, 20 yards and 71 yards. Washington did most of the damage in the first quarter by rushing 95 yards on five carries and touchdown runs of 61 and 25 yards

Grambling State's opening drive stalled and was forced to punt the football.

Northwestern State (0-2) began its drive at its own 14 and marched 86 yards in 11 plays as Miles Fallin connected with Zach Patterson for a 13-yard touchdown strike as the Demons took an early 7-0 lead with 9:40 remaining in the opening quarter.

After another Tigers punt, NSU started its drive on the Demons 45. Fallin connected with Jaheim Walters for 30 yards and rushed 17 yards to the GSU 25. After a Grambling State penalty, Fallin was picked off in the end zone by Donald Lee, giving the Tigers new life.

The turnover paid dividends for Grambling State as Maurice Washington hurdled one NSU tackler and went 61 yards to the house as the Tigers cut the margin to 7-6 as Garrett Urban's PAT was blocked with 5:33 remaining in the first quarter.

After the first three-and-out for Northwestern State, Grambling State started its drive on its own 45. The Tigers went 55 yards in 10 plays as Washington bolted for his second score of the day, a 25-yard touchdown. Quaterius Hawkins connected with Lyndon Rash on the two-point conversion as GSU grabbed a 14-7 advantage with 28 seconds left in the quarter.

On the very next NSU drive, Kevin Thomas picked off Fallin at the Demon 19-yard line and went 17 yards before being tackled out of bounds at the NSU 2. GSU cashed in the turnover on a Chance Williams 1-yard touchdown with 12:13 remaining in the second.

Grambling State (1-1) went back to work after another NSU punt at its 16. The Tigers made quick work as Rash caught an 83-yard touchdown pass from Hawkins as Grambling State extended the lead to 28-7 with 9:50 left.

The Tigers put the game away with 3:35 remaining in the first half as Hawkins tossed his second TD pass, a 20-yard strike to Claude Coleman as GSU pushed the lead to 34-7 as the PAT was blocked.

Grambling State forced Northwestern State to punt the football and the Tigers immediately took advantage as Hawkins found a streaking JR Waters down the left sideline for a 71-yard touchdown as GSU extended the lead to 41-7 with 1:37 left in the half.

Northwestern State capped a 10-play, 72-yard drive as Fallin connected with Scooter Adams for a touchdown to trim the GSU lead to 41-14 with 10:42 left in the third.

Grambling State answered as Fallin was stripped sacked by Bryan Powell and the ball was picked up by Joshua Reed, who took it to the house for the 63-yard score as the extra point was blocked, with the Tigers firmly ahead, 47-14, with 6:51 remaining.

The Demons added a 1-yard touchdown by Kolbe Burrell with 12:13 left in the final quarter to close the gap to 47-21.
