- ◀ The Tigers and Demons are both seeking their first win on the young season
- ◀ Grambling State is 15-3-1 all-time in the Shreveport Classic
- Northwestern State is 18-41-3 all-time when playing in the Shreveport Classic
- ◀ Northwestern State was predicted to finish fifth in the Southland Conference preseason poll
- Grambling State was chosen to finish fourth in the SWAC preseason West Division poll

# **ABOUT GRAMBLING STATE**

- The Tigers are seeking their first win in the Hue Jackson era after a 58-3 loss at Arkansas State last week
- GSU linebacker Lewis Matthews paced the defense with 14 total tackles, including 12 solo stops against the Red Wolves
- Lewis Matthews was named the SWAC Defensive Player of the Week on Monday
- GSU kicker Garrett Urban has scored at least one point (field goal or extra point) in the last nine games, dating back to the 2021 season
- ◀ The Tigers open the season with six straight road games, two of those contests are at neutral site venues, in which Grambling State is the designated home team

- ◀ The Demons are looking for their first win of the season after a 47-0 loss at No. 2 Montana last week

# **MEDIA CREDENTIALS**

Media credentials for Grambling State must be requested through GSU's official website. To begin the process, visit www.gsutigers.com/media. Only media covering the Tigers on a consistent basis and on assignment will be considered for season credentials. A lost season credential will result in credentials being issued on a game-by-game basis as available.

# **MONDAY MEDIA PRESS CONFERENCES**

Each game week during the football season, Grambling State will hold a media press conference at 10 a.m. in the Stadium Support Facility in the media room, located on the second floor. Head coach Hue Jackson will speak at 2022 GRAMBLING STATE FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

10 a.m. and selected assistant coaches (one offense and one defense) will be available to the media immediately following Jackson's weekly press conference. In the event of special games (State Fair Classic and Bayou Classic), the press conference will move that week to Tuesday at 10 a.m. Players will only be available upon request at least 48 hours prior to the Monday press conference. Contact the Athletic Communications Office for more details. GSU will hold and conduct interviews during the open weeks of the season.

Jackson's portion of the news conference will be available each week on www.gsutigers.com on Monday afternoons.

# MEDIA PRESS CONFERENCE PARKING & ENTRY

Parking for GSU's Monday media press conference is located at the Stadium Support Facility. Members of the media should enter through the front doors and take the elevator to the second floor.

# PLAYER INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

All interviews with Grambling State student-athletes should be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office. During the season, GSU players are available after the weekly Monday Press Conference and after practice on Tuesdays. This also includes during the week of the State Fair Classic, Bayou Classic, SWAC Championship Game and Celebration Bowl, players will only be available on Monday and Tuesday only. Telephone interviews may be arranged by contacting Brian Howard in the Athletic Communications Office. <u>ALL</u> interview requests should be made at least 48 hours in advance. GSU's first-year players (true freshmen) are not available for interviews.

### **COACH INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY**

Interviews with head coach Hue Jackson should also be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office. Head Coach Hue Jackson is available at GSU's weekly media press conference on Mondays during the season. Telephone interviews with the head coach can be arranged by contacting the Athletic Communications Office. As with the student-athletes, interview requests should be made at least 48 hours in advance.

# **SWAC CONFERENCE CALL**

Head coach Hue Jackson is available via teleconference on Mondays as part of the SWAC Conference call. Contact the SWAC Conference communications staff for more information.

# **PRACTICE AVAILABILITY**

Grambling State's football practices are primarily

closed to the public and media with limited exceptions (media will be notified in advance of those dates). The first portion of the workouts (generally the first 15-20 minutes) is open to photographers. Again, media will be notified in advance of those opportunities.

Members of the media planning to shoot practice should contact the GSU Athletic Communications Office in advance to confirm arrangements and practice times.

# **PRACTICE LOCATION**

The Tigers practice on the practice field next to the Football Stadium Support Facility or inside Eddie G. Robinson Memorial Stadium.

Each week during the regular season, the SWAC will name an offensive, defensive, newcomer and special teams player of the week.

# **SWAC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE/ZOOM**

The SWAC football head coaches will be available on a weekly teleconference Mondays from September 5-November 21 from 10:00 am until noon central time. Each coach will be available for 8-10 minutes each week for questions and reviews.

In 1920, athletic officials from six Texas HBCUs — C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn College, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College — met in Houston, Texas, to discuss common interests. At this meeting, they agreed to form a new league, the SWAC.

Paul Quinn became the first of the original members to withdraw from the league when it did so in 1929. When Langston University of Oklahoma was admitted into the conference two years later, it began the migration of state-supported institutions into the SWAC. Southern University entered the ranks in 1934, followed by Arkansas AM&N (now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff) in 1936 and Texas Southern University in

Rapid growth in enrollment of the state-supported schools made it difficult for the church-supported schools to finance their athletics programs and one by one they fell victim to the growing prowess of the state-supported colleges. Bishop withdrew from the conference in 1956, Langston in 1957 and Huston-Tillotson (formerly Samuel Huston) in 1959, one year after the admittance of two more state-supported schools: Grambling College and Jackson State College.

The enter-exit cycle continued in 1961 when Texas College withdrew, followed by the admittance of Alcorn A&M (now Alcorn State University) in 1962. Wiley left in 1968, the same year Mississippi Valley State College entered. Arkansas AM&N exited in 1970 and Alabama State University entered in 1982.

Arkansas—Pine Bluff (formerly Arkansas AM&N) rejoined the SWAC on July 1, 1997, regaining full-member status one year later. Alabama A&M University became the conference's tenth member when it became a full member in September, 1999 after a one year period as an affiliate SWAC member. Most of the former SWAC members that have left the conference are currently a part of the Red River Athletic Conference of the NAIA.

Current championship competition offered by the SWAC includes competition for men in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field and tennis. Women's competition is offered in the sports of basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

# THE MISSION AND PURPOSE OF THE SWAC

The Southwestern Athletic Conference, Inc. (the "SWAC", the "Conference") is organized exclusively for the purpose of encouraging, promoting, advancing, and conducting intercollegiate sports activities and other recreational and not-for-profit activities among the members of the Conference. Its purposes are:

- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof:
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request:
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.



# **HUE JACKSON**

# **HEAD COACH**

University of the Pacific, 1986

1st Season as Grambling State Head Coach



Jackson comes to Grambling State after spending the past year as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Tennessee State University.

Jackson, who has more than 30 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and professional levels, began his coaching career in 1987 at the University of the Pacific, his alma mater, and spent a majority of the next 13 years in the college ranks. He then moved to the professional ranks in 2001 and remained in the National Football League until 2019.

Jackson spent three years as a graduate assistant at Pacific from 1987-1989 before working two seasons as the running backs coach and special team's coordinator at Cal State Fullerton.

In the spring of 1991, Jackson experienced the professional level for the first time, coaching the running backs, wide receivers and special teams for the World League's London Monarchs.

Jackson returned to the collegiate level in 1992 where he spent four years (1992—1995) at Arizona State University. He coached the running backs for his first three seasons at ASU and worked with the quarterbacks in his fourth year.

Jackson was appointed offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at California in 1996, leading the Bears to the Aloha Bowl. The following year, Jackson began a fouryear stint as the offensive coordinator at the University of Southern California (USC).

While at USC, Jackson helped guide the Trojans in 2000 to the top of the Pac 10 in total offense. In addition, he was responsible for recruiting two Heisman Trophy-winning quarterbacks to USC — Carson Palmer (2002) and Matt Leinart (2004).

The first opportunity in the NFL for Jackson came with the Washington Redskins (now the Washington Commanders). He handled the running back corps for two seasons before being named offensive coordinator in 2003.

In 2004, Jackson began a three-year stretch coaching the wide receivers with the Cincinnati Bengals. Under Jackson's tutelage, Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh combined for 175 receptions for 2,388 yards in 2005, helping the Bengals secure the AFC North title and a playoff berth for the first time in 15 years. The following year, Johnson (1,369 yards) and Houshmandzadeh (1,081 yards) became the first pair of Bengals to eclipse the 1,000-yard receiving mark in a single season.

Jackson left Cincinnati to become the offensive coordinator with the Atlanta Falcons in 2007 before spending two seasons as the quarterback coach with the Baltimore Rayens.

In 2010, Jackson became the offensive coordinator for the Oakland Raiders. After leading the Raiders to a top five finish in scoring (25.6 points/game), Jackson was named

head coach for the 2011 season. Oakland finished the year at 8-8.

Jackson started his second tour with the Bengals in 2012 as a secondary assistant and special teams coach. In 2013, he moved back to the offensive side of the ball as the running backs coach. A year later, Jackson was promoted to offensive coordinator.

In 2016, Jackson was hired as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns, where he held the position into the 2018 season. After his time in Cleveland, Jackson returned to Cincinnati as a special assistant to head coach, Marvin Lewis.

Collegiately, Jackson played quarterback at Pacific after transferring from Glendale Community College. During his career at UOP, he amassed over 3,400 yards in total offense and 19 touchdowns in two seasons. Jackson also earned a letter in basketball as a senior.

Jackson earned a degree in Physical Education from the University of Pacific in 1986.



## TIGERS DROP SEASON OPENER AT ARKANSAS STATE

JONESBORO, Ark. | The Grambling State University football team fell behind early in the season opener and could not recover as Arkansas State ran away with a 58-3 victory at Centennial Bank Stadium.

Arkansas State (1-0) took the opening kickoff and marched 70 yards in nine plays. The Red Wolves began their drive with a 17-yard run by Brian Snead and picked up a fourth-and-short at the GSU 30. Just two plays after converting the fourth-down play, ASU quarterback James Blackmon completed a 29-yard pass to Champ Flemings for the opening scoring of the game and giving the Red Wolves a 7-0 lead.

Grambling State (0-1) slowly moved the ball on its first drive, but a holding penalty caused the drive to stall as the Tigers were forced to punt the football.

The Red Wolves took advantage of a short field as Blackmon hit Flemings for 16 yards on the first play. Five plays later, Arkansas State extended the lead to 14-0 with 6:19 remaining in the opening quarter as Blackmond tossed a 13-yard pass to Seydou Traore to complete a five-play, 50-yard drive.

After a Jimmy Hes punt after GSU's second possession, Arkansas State set up shop at its own 45. The Red Wolves continued to move the football, but was stopped at the Tigers 2 by Joshua Reed on fourth down, turning the ball over to Grambling State with 54 seconds left in the quarter.

Grambling State started its drive at its own 2, but Chance Aime was sacked in the endzone by John Mincey for a safety as the Red Wolves pushed the lead to 16-0 with 51 seconds remaining.

The Red Wolves extended the advantage to 23-0 after a five-play, 48-yard drive as Snead scored on a 5-yard touchdown run with 13:23 left in the first half

On the ensuing kickoff, Maurice Washington returned the kick 53 yards to give Grambling State its best field position of the night at the Arkansas State 45. However, GSU quarterback Quaterius Hawkins was sacked for a 15-yard loss as the Tigers were forced to punt the ball.

The Red Wolves drove 88 yards in nine plays, helped by a pair of targeting calls, as Blackmon scored on a 9-vard touchdown run as Arkansas State led 30-0 with 7:48 remaining in the second period.

Grambling State got some momentum going on its next drive as Hawkins connected with Chance Williams for a 34-yard gain and into Arkansas State territory at the 48. However, Hawkins was sacked on third down. On fourth down, Hawkins hit JR Waters for a 9-yard gain and a first down. Hawkins called his own number for a 18yard keeper, setting up first down at the ASU 21. Hawkins was sacked for a 22-yard loss and Julian Calvez was sacked for eight yards as the Tigers were forced to punt the football from their own 48.

Arkansas State put the game away as Blackmon scored on a 2-yard keeper to complete a nine-play, 64-yard drive as the Red Wolves extended the lead to 37-0 with 10:13 left in the third.

Grambling State took advantage of a pair of roughing the passer calls and a late hit on its next offensive possession as the Tigers capped a 63-yard, 13-play drive as Garrett Urban booted a 30-yard field goal, cutting the margin to 37-3, with 5:20 remaining in the third.

Arkansas State got 2-yard touchdown runs by Johnnie Lang and AJ Mayer to extend the Red Wolves advantage to 51-3 right before the end of the third quarter.

The Red Wolves continued to put points on the board, adding a touchdown by Mike Sharpe II with 11:43 remaining to push the lead to 58-3.
