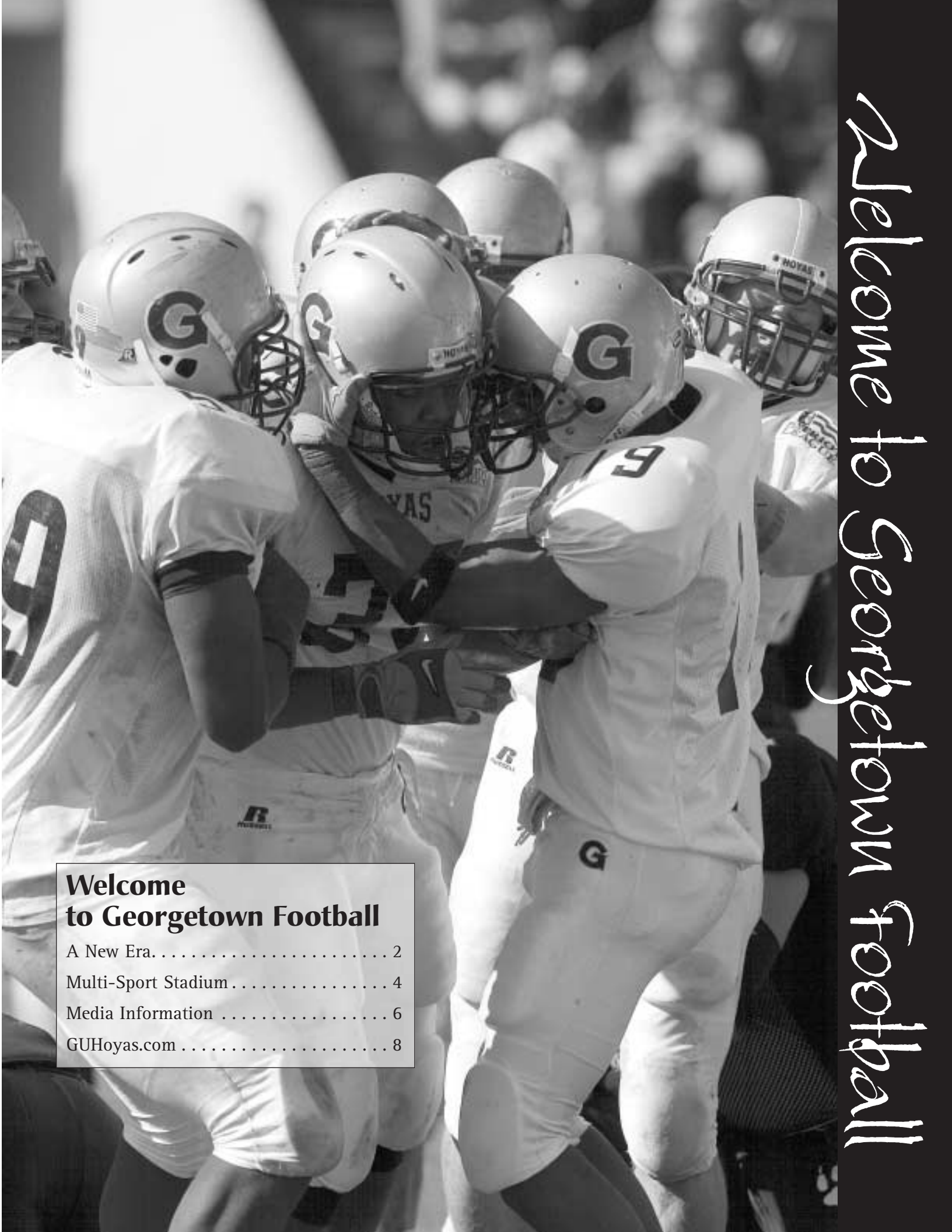

A New Era

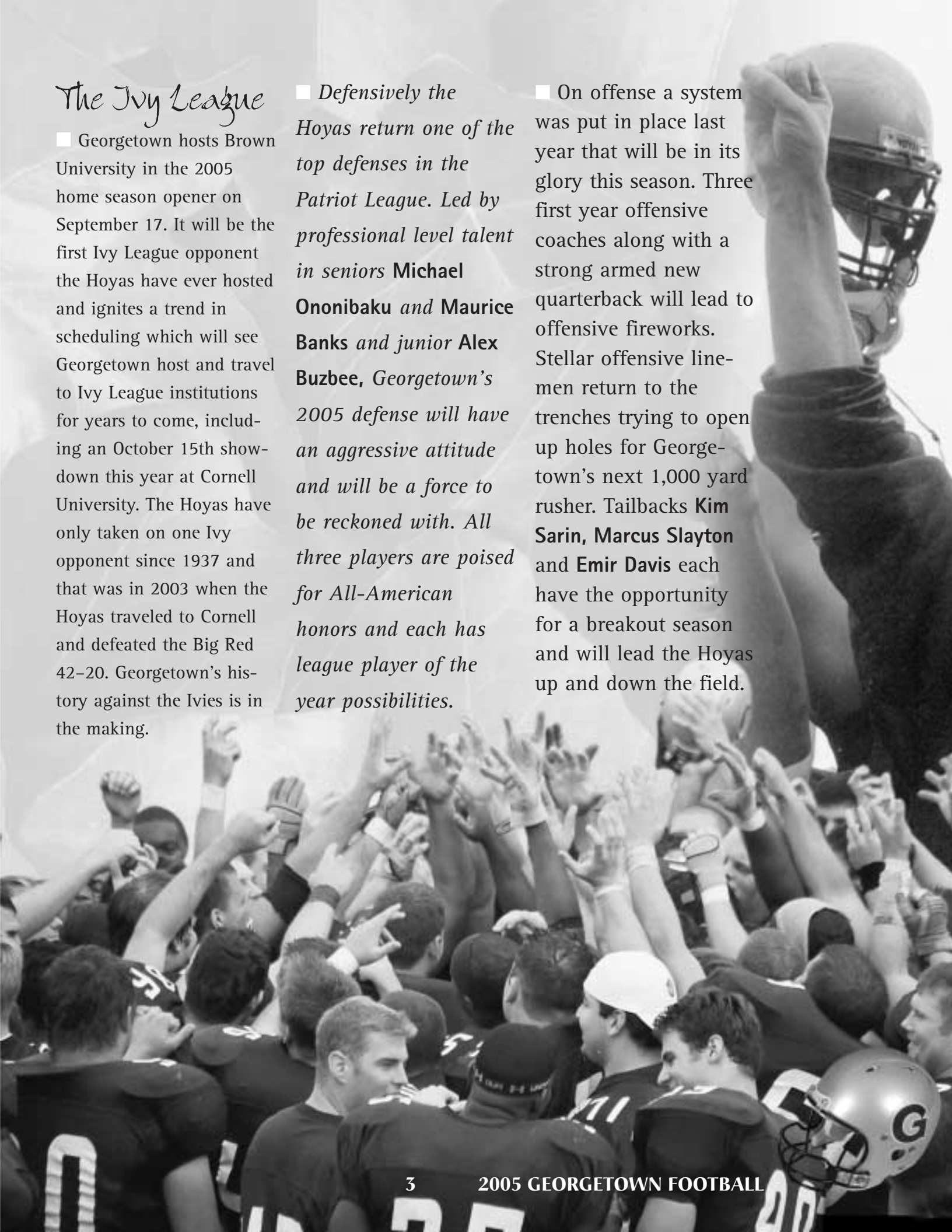
- This year will be the inaugural season of the Hoyas new home: the Multi-Sport Field. Georgetown will be playing in the middle of Georgetown's picturesque campus and on a new surface as the field will employ NextTurf, the same turf used at 21 NFL Facilities. It's a new home, a new field and a new beginning of Hoya Football.
- *Entertaining contests and lively pre- and post-game events will be attracting new and old fans alike to home football games this year. A festival atmosphere will be built around every home game and Hoya football fans will be a blend of current students, alumni and local families. Everyone will take Hoya Pride in 2005 Georgetown football.*

The Ivy League

■ Georgetown hosts Brown University in the 2005 home season opener on September 17. It will be the first Ivy League opponent the Hoyas have ever hosted and ignites a trend in scheduling which will see Georgetown host and travel to Ivy League institutions for years to come, including an October 15th showdown this year at Cornell University. The Hoyas have only taken on one Ivy opponent since 1937 and that was in 2003 when the Hoyas traveled to Cornell and defeated the Big Red 42-20. Georgetown's history against the Ivies is in the making.

■ *Defensively the Hoyas return one of the top defenses in the Patriot League. Led by professional level talent in seniors **Michael Ononibaku and Maurice Banks and junior Alex Buzbee**, Georgetown's 2005 defense will have an aggressive attitude and will be a force to be reckoned with. All three players are poised for All-American honors and each has league player of the year possibilities.*

■ On offense a system was put in place last year that will be in its glory this season. Three first year offensive coaches along with a strong armed new quarterback will lead to offensive fireworks. Stellar offensive linemen return to the trenches trying to open up holes for Georgetown's next 1,000 yard rusher. Tailbacks **Kim Sarin, Marcus Slayton and Emir Davis** each have the opportunity for a breakout season and will lead the Hoyas up and down the field.



MULTI-SPORT STADIUM



THE MULTI-SPORT FACILITY will provide a new and adequately sized gathering place for the Georgetown community, including hundreds of athletic, academic, educational, and recreational opportunities throughout the years to engage students, faculty, staff, alumni, parents, neighbors

and friends. Situated at the heart of campus adjacent to the Southwest Quad, Village C and Harbin Dorms, the Multi-Sport Facility will serve as a natural hub for walkway “spokes,” enabling all the amenities and spaces of the campus to be interconnected for use and enjoyment on a 24/7 basis. The central location guarantees audiences for future events on the Hill-top, while providing a pastoral focal point for all that look down from the dorms.

Home for our Football, Men’s and Women’s Lacrosse Teams the Multi-Sport Facility will include:

- * Four permanent Locker Rooms
- * Weight and Conditioning Center
- * Training Room
- * Visiting Team Locker Rooms

- * Press box with VIP suites

The Multi-Sport Facility is the most significant undertaking in the history of Georgetown Athletics. As past and present Georgetown alumni, parents and fans, we control the destiny of the Athletics program and the completion of the remaining aspects of this facility. With Phase I completed, additional funding is needed to finish this project. HOYAS ON THE AIR

All of Georgetown's football games can be heard live on the Internet by visiting www.guhoyas.com or www.wgtb923.com.

Georgetown's official website will be carrying all of the Hoyas home games while WGTB is Georgetown's student run radio station and has been carrying Hoya athletic events for the past five seasons including covering all of GU's football contests in 2002, 2003 and 2004.

LIVE WEBCASTS

Georgetown University's athletic department has partnered with College Sports to webcast the majority of Georgetown's home athletic events, including all of the Hoyas home football games, live over the Internet via streaming video during the upcoming 2005-06 season. To view the games on your computer visit: www.guhoyas.com and select College Sports Pass. There is a game by game or yearly fee to view the games.

CREDENTIALS

Credential requests for Georgetown home games are issued to working members of the media only and should be requested as early as possible. Requests are to be faxed on company letterhead to Georgetown's Sports Information Office at 202-687-2491.

Georgetown University follows the guidelines set forth by the NCAA and the Patriot League office in honoring credential requests. Season credentials will be issued to daily newspapers and television/radio stations that cover Hoya football on a regular basis.

All other organizations and requests will be granted on a single game basis.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking is free for all attendees of Georgetown football games, including fans and media. There is no designated parking area for members of the media.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Press passes will be available prior to kickoff and can be picked up at the main ticket booth located behind the press box.

TELEPHONES

A limited number of telephones are available for all members of the media. There is a \$75.00 fee for a private line to be used by a newspaper or radio station. Official radio stations of Patriot League opponent school do not have to pay the \$75.00 fee.

POSTGAME MEDIA & INTERVIEWS

All postgame media inquiries and interviews will take place inside McDonough Gym in one of the Team Rooms located on the second floor next to the Sports Information Office. Following the game there will be a 10-minute cooling off period. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, select players and the head coach of each team will report to the interview room.
