//VIKINGS PRIMED FOR THIRD NAIA FCS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Grand View is making their third NAIA FCS Championship Appearance, they won the National Championship back in 2013 vs. The University of the Cumberlands 35-23, fell to Morningside in 2021 38-28, and now face Keiser.
- A win would give Grand View their 19th postseason victory, moving the overall record to 18-11.
- HOA-N DIVISION CHAMPS! The 31-13 win over Graceland to end the regular season clinched the programs 6th straight HOA title, 9th overall.
- HOA MAJOR AWARDS: The Vikings saw **Jackson Waring** (Player of the Year), **John Argo** (Defensive Player of the Year), E.J. Peterson (Assistant Coach of the Year), and HC **Joe Woodley** (Coach of the Year) earn Heart major awards.

// KEY STORYLINES

- The historic season for GVU continues with the FCS National Championship title game on the line.
- Keiser is the first Sun Conference opponent for the Vikings this season.
- The Vikings' defense sits first in the nation in multiple categories, including scoring defense and holding opponents to just 8.5 points per game, total yards per game at 205.5 (122 fewer yards than Keiser), and rushing yards per game at 68.6.
- QB **Jackson Waring** is in his best playoff performance of his career for the Vikings, through the FCS he has 643 passing yards (43-69... 62% CMP), 3 passing TDs, 153 rushing yards, and four rushing TDs.
- The Vikings rushing attack sits fourth in the NAIA in rushing touchdowns, with 41 this season.
- HOA-N Defensive Player of the Year, John Argo is at 83 tackles this season with 34 in the NAIA FCS.
- AFCA NAIA All-American Jackson Filer, sits 4th in the Nation in sacks with 11, and 2nd in the country in sack yards with 107.
- Grand View has possessed the ball for 7:18:54 this season (33:46) per game, the longest remaining TOP in the FCS.

VIKING NOTES

// VIKINGS PLAYOFF TIDBITS

- The Vikings are 18-11 in the NAIA FCS.
- HC Joe Woodley picked up his 70th career victory against No. 11 Northwestern.
- Grand View is back into the title game for the 2nd time in four seasons.
- A win would give Grand View their 19th postseason victory, moving the overall record to 18-11.
- **DEFENDING DES MOINES:** Grand View is 7-0 in Des Moines this season; five of these wins were played at the Duke.
- The most points GVU has scored in a National Championship game was 32, which dates back to 2013 where they won its first title.

// DVP CLEARED FOR TAKE-OFF!

- Junior Dalten Van Pelt has sparked the Vikings offense through the playoffs, the Van-Meter native posted several season highs in their semifinal game against Morningside.
- Van Pelt recorded 3 rushing TDs against the Mustangs, accumulating 53 net yards on just nine carries.
- DVP now sits at 709 rushing yards on the season, 423 more yards than his Sophomore season - including 10 more TDs at 12 this season.
- He averages 59.1 yards per game.

// BROWN THE BULLDOZER

- Sr. lineman Aaron Brown continues to lead in big moments for the Vikings.
- The senior, although may not light up the stat sheet, continues to lead the Nations top defense.
- The Quarterfinals saw Aaron Brown be awarded Defensive Player of the Game after he recorded one his best games of the season, including 2.5 TFLs of yards, as well as a forced fumble that set up a scoring opportunity for Waring and Co.
- Brown is one of the Vikings leading tacklers, but shines the most with pressure on the QB, AB stifled the Mustangs first chance of a score that led to only them trailing 21-7 at the half.
- Aaron Brown, who is one of the veterans on this Viking squad who also played several snaps as a true freshman at the National Championship back in 2021.

// ARGO A FINALIST FOR CLIFF HARRIS

- Viking LB John Argo was named one of the 36 finalists for the Cliff Harris Award, announced on Dec. 17.
- The Cliff Harris is awarded to small colleges' best defensive player annually.
- In 2023, Tristin Waugh, Viking standout earned the award.
- John Argo has shined in his first full season with the Vikings, being awarded the Heart of Americas' Defensive Player of the Year, and 1st team All-HOA.
- Argo has recorded 34 tackles through the FCS series, with two double-digit performances.
- The Davenport native leads the Vikings with 83 tackles through his Junior campaign.

// WARING THE DOUBLE THREAT

- QB-1 Jackson Waring is the Vikings second leading rusher with 541 net yards and 13 TDs, for an average of 41.62 per game.
- Waring is 171-of-283 for 2382 passing yards and 21 TDs and just 3 INTs.
- The Vikings offensive scheme has leaned heavily on Waring's ground game, especially in the post season as he's accumulated 153 yards on 41 carries - scoring a rushing TD in each.
- Along with his strongest rushing performances in the playoffs, Waring has also displayed some of his best numbers through the air of the post-season run including 643 passing yards and 3 TDs.

// HEAD COACH JOE WOODLEY

- HC Joe Woodley was named the 2024 Heart of America Athletic Conference (HOA) Coach of the Year.
- He's won five HOA Coach of the Year honors at GVU (2019, 2020, 2022, 2023, & 2024) out of six seasons as HC.
- Woodley leads the Conference of Heart of America Coach of the Year Awards.
- Woodley was named one of ESPNs 100 coaches to Define the Next Decade of College Football - the only NAIA coach to be featured.
- This season, Woodley picked up his 51st straight career win at Grand View with the 52-28 win at (9-seeded in the FCS) Benedictine on September 14th.
- **He has coached in 75 career games at Grand View.**
- Mike Woodley, the founding coach of Grand View's football program, led the Vikings with remarkable success over 11 seasons, compiling an impressive 93-34 record.
- Joe Woodley, son of Mike, who took the helm in 2019, has continued the legacy of excellence. With a stellar 70-5 career record as head coach, Joe snagged career win 70 with the Quarterfinal victory against the Red Raiders.

// STOUT DEFENSE

- The Vikings posted their fourth shutout of the season after the Quarterfinal match-up.
- Grand View's defense is on pace to be one of the best defenses in NAIA history, only allowing 13 TDs this season.
- GVU has stifled opponents in 3rd down conversion with an aching 22% conversion rate.
- The defense ranks at the top in the nation in many categories: total yards (205.0), passing yards per game (136.9), points per game (8.5), and rushing yards per game (68.6).
- The Vikings have twelve interceptions as a team, with seven different Vikings having one (Daviere Jones owns four of the 12).
- Prince Brown leads the Vikings with eight PBUs.
- Grand View's defense is so balanced that there are 3 members with 65+ tackles.
- Jackson Filer leads the Vikings in TFL-YDS with 23 for 155 yards, and second in tackles with 65.
- Cade Sheedy matches Filer's 65 tackle effort with 65 of his own tackles this season to round out the defense.



HEAD COACH JOE WOODLEY

Joe Woodley was introduced as the 2nd head coach in the history of Grand View University football in 2019. He enters his 17th year with the Vikings and begins his sixth year as head coach. Prior to being head coach, he was the offensive and defensive coordinator. Woodley has been instrumental in the Vikings' success since the program's inception in 2008. In 2013, Grand View finished 6-0 in the MSFA Midwest, 14-0 overall and won the NAIA National Football Championship. During his first three years as head coach, Woodley led the team to an NAIA FCS semi-final finish in 2019, a quarterfinal finish in 2020, and a National Championship game finish in 2021. As a head coach, Woodley has amassed a 58-5 overall record while winning the Heart of America North Division Conference Championships all six years. Woodley has also yet to lose a regular season Heart of America game. In the 2022 season, the Vikings garnered 21 all-conference accolades while earning multiple major postseason awards including Offensive Player of the Year, Player of the Year, and Head & Assistant Coach of the Year accolades. Coach Woodley was named North Division Conference Head Coach of the Year in 2019, 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024. Woodley was mentioned in the ESPN's "Coached Who Will Define the Next Decade" of College Football, as the only NAIA level coach to receive the recognition in 2024.

As offensive coordinator, Woodley had a successful 2018 season: the Vikings were top 25 in the nation in points per game (34.8/24th), rushing yards per game (221.6/15th), and yards per game (424/18th). Woodley was defensive coordinator from 2008 to 2017. During the program's last nine seasons, the Viking defense has been among the top defenses in the country in points allowed: 2019 – 11.1 (1st), 2017 – 20.8 (12th), 2016 – 19.1 (9th), 2015 – 13.9 (1st), 2014 – 17.6 (6th), 2013 – 15.4 (2nd), 2012 – 16.1 (7th), 2011-16.2 (11th), 2010-14.7 (4th). The 2013 Football Scoop Coordinator of the Year and 2009 MSFA Midwest Assistant Coach of the Year has coached seven AFCA All-Americans six conference Players of the Year and more than 60 All-Conference selections. Woodley has done instructional and schematic videos for Championship Productions and has been published in AFCA Monthly. Prior to GV, Woodley spent the 2006 and 2007 seasons as the defensive line and linebacker coach for Johnston High School under his brother, Brian, who is the head coach.

The Dragons were 7-2 in 2007 – the best record in program history. Before Johnston, Woodley spent two seasons at St. Ambrose University where he coached the defensive backs and linebackers. During his two years at St. Ambrose, the Bees were 15-5, in the top ten in the nation defensively, and made a playoff appearance. Clive, Iowa, native, Woodley was both a First Team Elite All-State Linebacker and Central Iowa Metro League (CIML) Player of the Year for the Valley High School Tigers in 1998. He played college football for Iowa State University from 1999-2003. He was a team captain and played in three bowl games: the Insight Bowl, the Independence Bowl, and the Humanitarian Bowl. Woodley's recruiting areas include Central Iowa and Houston. He resides in Urbandale with his wife, Jen, and daughters, Anna, Elly, and Emma.
