CAROLINE McCOMBS

HEAD COACH

Head coach Caroline McCombs enters her fourth season at the helm of GW women's basketball in 2024. During the 2023-24 season, McCombs helped guide GW to a 13-18 overall record, falling to Saint Louis in the second round of the Atlantic 10 Championship. McCombs' leadership also helped produce historic numbers for Mayowa Taiwo, who finished with 1,037 career rebounds, the third-most in program history for a single player. Taiwo was also named to the Atlantic 10's Preseason All-Conference All-Defensive Team, while sophomore guard Nya Robertson was named to the league's All-Conference Third Team.

McCombs' first two seasons with the Buff and Blue resulted in a run to the quarterfinals of the Atlantic 10 Championship. During her first year in Foggy Bottom, McCombs helped lead a team that ranked first in program history in points allowed in a season (55.2) and upset #5 La Salle to reach the Quarterfinals of the 2022 A-10 Women's Basketball Championship. 2022-23 then saw the Buff and Blue with McCombs at the helm earn the 7-seed in the tournament to notch a first-round bye, and then knock off the 10-seed before narrowly falling in the quarters to the second seed.

McCombs' first two seasons in Foggy Bottom portend a return to prominence in the A-10 and in the nation's rankings for the program with a rich history of winning Championships. Her team set an all-time school record for made three-pointers in a single-season in 2022-23, and saw three players decorated with All-Conference honors, including first-year Nya Robertson, a former top-50 recruit, who was named the league's Sixth Woman of the Year. The good times continued to roll in the offseason when a quartet of seniors agreed to return for a fifth season at GW, while McCombs also landed the commitment of a pair of highly-coveted graduate transfers.

A proven winner at every stop during her 22-year coaching career, McCombs arrived at GW after seven years as the head coach at Stony Brook where she led the Seawolves to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2021.

The 2020 America East Coach of the Year, McCombs won 130 games in seven years at Stony Brook. In 2021, she led the Seawolves to a 15-6 mark, winning the America East Tournament Championship and earning a No. 14 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

McCombs had the Seawolves on the precipice of an NCAA Tournament berth in 2020, winning the program's first-ever America East regular season championship and advancing to the America East Championship game with a 28-3 record before the remainder of the season was canceled due to COVID-19.

The Seawolves won 22 consecutive games in 2019-20, garnering votes in the national polls for the first time in program history. McCombs left Stony Brook as the program's winningest Division I coach and second-winningest overall, having coached 19 all-conference selections.

Prior to becoming a head coach, McCombs gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach for 15 years at the Division I level. She assisted four different programs and appeared in five NCAA tournaments, including two Sweet 16 appearances. She has also developed a pair of AP All-Americans and three WNBA players.

Before her time at Stony Brook, McCombs spent two years as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Auburn, assisting the Tigers to a pair of WNIT berths. She was influential in signing a recruiting class that ranked 16th nationally in 2012.

McCombs came to Auburn from Northwestern where she was an assistant under former GW head coach and Hall of Famer Joe McKeown from 2010-12. Under her tutelage, Amy Jaeschke was an AP All-American and made history as the program's first WNBA draft pick. McCombs helped lead the team to a WNIT berth in her first season and assisted in bringing in a top-25 recruiting class.

Prior to Northwestern, McCombs spent five seasons as an assistant at Pittsburgh from 2005-10, aiding the program to five straight postseason appearances that included three NCAA Tournaments and a pair of Sweet 16 berths. With the Panthers, she coached Shavonte Zellous, who earned All-America honors and was a 2009 WNBA Draft pick.

McCombs started her coaching career as an assistant coach at Valparaiso in 1999, holding the title for five years before being elevated to associate head coach in 2004-05. The Crusaders won two conference championships and advanced to consecutive NCAA Tournaments under her watch. She also coached Marlous Nieuwveen, who became the first player in school and conference history to reach the WNBA.

A native of Medina, Ohio, McCombs was an all-conference performer for Youngstown State, where she graduated in 1998 with a degree in dietetics. McCombs was a two-time Mid-Continent Conference Second Team selection in 1996-97 and 1997-98 and played in two NCAA tournaments, including with the 1998 team that pulled off a first-round upset as a #12 seed.

ADAM CALL

ASSISTANT COACH

FOURTH SEASON // OKLAHOMA '07

Adam Call is in his fourth season at GW in 2024-25 after playing a major role in elevating George Washington women's basketball back up the ranks in the A-10 alongside Head Coach Caroline McCombs. During the 2023-24 season, Call helped guide GW to a 13-18 overall record, falling to Saint Louis in the second round of the Atlantic 10 Championship. His leadership also helped produce historic numbers for Mayowa Taiwo, who finished with 1,037 career rebounds, the third-most in program history for a single player. Taiwo was also named to the Atlantic 10's Preseason All-Conference All-Defensive Team, while sophomore guard Nya Robertson was named to the league's All-Conference Third Team.

His first two seasons resulted in a run to the quarterfinals of the Atlantic 10 Championship, with Year Two seeing an all-time school record for made three-pointers in a single-season in 2022-23, and three players decorated with All-Conference honors, including first-year Nya Robertson, a former top-50 recruit, who was named the league's Sixth Woman of the Year. With Call's guidance, Mayowa Taiwo also earned All-Defensive Team honors in the conference as she vaulted up the program's all-time

career rebounds leaderboard into the Top 10, while grad transfer from Penn, Mia Lakstigala, excelled in her final collegiate season and was rewarded with All Academic Team honors.

Call spent one prior season as a member of Coach McCombs' staff during her time at Stony Brook and the prior four seasons at Eastern Michigan, including two as the Associate Head Coach. At EMU, Call was responsible for the posts in 2019-20 and helped Eastern finish the season fourth in the MAC and rebounds per game, and post the 10th-most blocks in EMU history with 84.

Call was crucial in the development of EMU's guards in 2017-18. Most notably, he guided Danielle Minott and Courtne Lewis to All-MAC honors. Minott, after rewriting the single-game record book, landed on the All-MAC Third Team, while Lewis put together one of the greatest freshman campaigns in program history. Lewis scored the second-most points by a freshman Eagle en route to All-MAC Honorable Mention and MAC All-Freshmen honors, while also finishing top-10 nationally in scoring among freshmen.

The Norman, Okla., native arrived at Stony Brook after spending the 2013-14 campaign as the Director of Player Development at the University of Washington, where he helped guide the Huskies to a 20-win season and berth in the WNIT Quarterfinals.

Call was the Director of Basketball Operations at Northwestern from 2011-13, where he ran Joe McKeown Basketball Camps and supervised managerial staff, the video coordinator and interns.

Call previously spent three seasons as video coordinator at TCU, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2009 and 2010. TCU claimed the Mountain West Conference regular season title in 2009-10 and played in the WNIT in 2010-11. He began his career as a sophomore at the University of Oklahoma, where he served three seasons as the student manager from 2004-07. The Sooners claimed two Big XII Conference Tournament and regular season championships and went to the NCAA Tournament every year.

Call holds a bachelor's degree in international area studies from the University of Oklahoma and a master's degree in liberal arts from TCU.



JASMYN WALKER

ASSISTANT COACH

FIRST SEASON // WESTERN MICHIGAN '19

Jasmyn Walker is in her first season with GW in 2024-25. Walker arrives in Foggy Bottom after spending one season as an assistant with the Purdue Fort Wayne women's basketball program during the 2023-24 season. Walker helped contribute to a staff that led the Mastodons to a 23-13 overall record and a second-round berth in the Horizon League Championship. Following the conference tournament, Walker and Purdue Fort Wayne were selected to participate in the WNIT, winning a first-round matchup against Eastern Kentucky and a second-round meeting with Cincinnati, before falling to eventual WNIT Champions Saint Louis in the Super 16.

The 23 wins tied the program record for most victories in a single season, while Walker also helped lead the squad to records in single-season points, 3-pointers and rebounds. The 'Dons also tied the program record with 12 home wins and 11 victories on the road.

During her playing days, Walker was a standout student-athlete at Valparaiso and Western Michigan. She spent the first two seasons of her collegiate career at Valpo where she earned Horizon League All-Freshman Team accolades and set the program record for rebounds by a first-year student with 250. She started every game in her rookie season, averaging 10.1 points and 8.3 rebounds per contest. During her sophomore season, Walker showed continued growth, averaging 12.2 points and 8.0 rebounds a night.

Following her sophomore season, Walker transferred to Western Michigan where she sat out of the 2016-17 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Once returning to the court, she made an instant impact with the Broncos, averaging 8.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per game. During her senior season, Walker tallied 10.0 points and 6.9 rebounds per game to complete her collegiate career. In total, she tallied 1,147 points in 111 career games.

Prior to working with the Mastodons in 2023, Walker served as the Coordinator of Recruiting and Creative Content at Butler. She also worked as an assistant coach at Ferris State and Davenport University.



DOUG NOVAK

ASSISTANT COACH

FIRST SEASON // TENNESSEE '90

Doug Novak enters his first season with the GW Women's Basketball coaching staff in 2024-25.

Novak, a 1990 graduate of Tennessee, arrives in Foggy Bottom after spending the 2023-24 season as an assistant with the Northern Kentucky women's basketball program. Prior to his time with the Norse, Novak was the Associate Head Coach for Army's men's basketball program during the 2022-23 campaign. Under Novak's guidance, the Black Knights collected 17 wins, the second-most since the 1978-79 season, while registering the third-most conference wins (10) since joining the Patriot League in 1990.

Before his time in West Point, Novak guided the Mississippi State women's basketball program as the Interim Head Coach for the 2021-22 season. Novak's squad was named the NCAA Team of the Week twice during the regular season and he left with the most wins by a first-year head coach in program history.

The bulk of Novak's head coaching experience came during his eight-year stint with Bethel's men's basketball program. Novak accumulated a record of 131-68 over that span, finishing with the highest winning percentage (.658) of any coach in the program's history. Novak also led the Royals to a record 11 consecutive victories during the 2019-20 season, while also leading the team to its second-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2017. During that same 2016-17 season, the program also captured a share of its first regular season conference championship and the second conference tournament crown. Over the course of his tenure with Bethel, Novak developed 15 MIAC All-Conference selections.

Prior to coaching, Novak was part of Tennessee's men's tennis program from 1987-90. Amy Pryor is in her first season with GW in 2024-25. Pryor joins the GW family after two seasons with the Eastern Michigan women's basketball program. During her first year in 2022-23, Pryor served as the Director of Basketball Operations before transitioning to an assistant coach role for the 2023-24 season. Albert "Al" Lipscomb III enters his second season with GW in 2024-25. During his first season in 2023-24, Lipscomb helped guide GW to a 13-18 overall record, falling to Saint Louis in the second round of the Atlantic 10 Championship. His leadership also helped produce historic numbers for Mayowa Taiwo, who finished with 1,037 career rebounds, the third-most in program history for a single player. Taiwo was also named to the Atlantic 10's Preseason All-Conference All-Defensive Team, while sophomore guard Nya Robertson was named to the league's All-Conference Third Team.

Lipscomb came to George Washington from Georgetown, where he has served in multiple roles from 2017-23 with the Hoyas' women's basketball program. Evelyn Adebayo enters her second season with GW in 2024-25. Adebayo landed at GW after a three-year professional career in Spain and Poland. A native of London, England, Adebayo spent the last two seasons with Energa Torun in the Basket Liga Kobiet. While with Torun, Adebayo averaged 8.4 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.5 assists per contest.

Adebayo began her collegiate career with Gardner-Webb in 2015. She spent two seasons with the Bulldogs, playing in 56 total games. While with Gardner-Webb, Adebayo averaged 13.3 points and 3.6 rebounds. Following her sophomore season, Adebayo transferred to Murray State where she spent two seasons. Under Geno Auriemma's guidance, Adebayo appeared in 22 games, averaging 1.0 points and 2.1 rebounds off the bench. The Huskies were primed to make a run in the NCAA Tournament, but it was ultimately cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Adebayo graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance from Murray State in 2019 and a Master of Science degree in Sports Management from UConn in 2020. Prior to her collegiate career, Adebayo also represented her country as part of the Great Britain U16, U18, U20 and senior national team in the European Championships.
