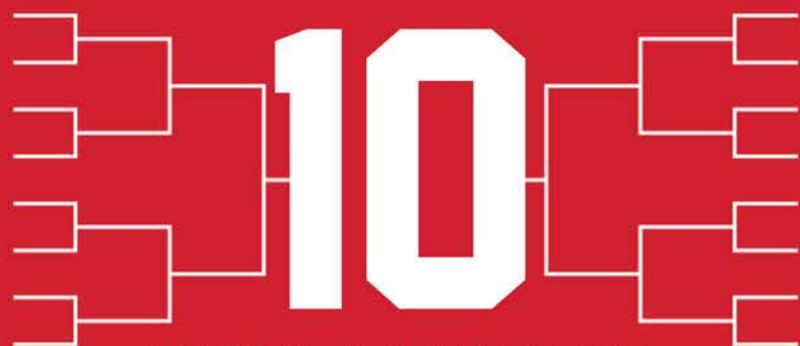

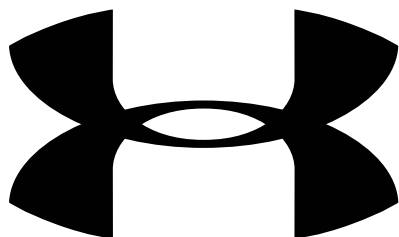

UNDER ARMOUR

Gardner-Webb head coach **Tim Craft** has quickly established himself as one of the Big South Conference's premier basketball minds in his six seasons at the helm, winning 111 games heading into the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

Craft, 42, became just the fourth head coach in Big South Conference history to win at least 15 games in each of his first four seasons, joining Ron Bradley (Radford), Gregg Marshall (Winthrop) and Nick McDevitt (UNC Asheville) in that exclusive club.

Gardner-Webb has continued its tradition of slaying college basketball giants under Craft's guidance. The Runnin' Bulldogs knocked off Clemson and Purdue during the 2014-2015 season and took down Nebraska on December 18, 2016. Purdue went on to finish third in the Big Ten in 2015 and Nebraska started out 3-0 in the Big Ten this past winter with several notable wins.

This season, he directed wins at Georgia Tech and Wake Forest in December, giving Craft more Power 5 wins than any Gardner-Webb coach before him.

Craft led the Runnin' Bulldogs to an overall record of 18-15 in his first season at the helm, guiding Gardner-Webb to a 10-6 mark in the Big South Conference, which placed the Runnin' Bulldogs two games out of a tie with regular season champion High Point. The Runnin' Bulldogs were involved in the longest NCAA Division I game of the season on February 5 that season, falling to VMI 108-104 in a four-overtime marathon in Paul Porter Arena. The Runnin' Bulldogs would close out the regular season in fine form, winning five of their last seven to earn the fifth seed in the Big South Tournament. For his efforts, Craft became the first coach in program history to be named one of the 10 finalists for the Joe B. Hall Award, given to the top first-year head coach in the nation. Sophomore Jerome Hill earned all-conference honors during the 2013-2014 season, as he was named to the Big South All-Conference Second Team. Rookie Tyrell Nelson was recognized on the Big South All-Freshman team and senior Mike Byron garnered the program's second-ever Scholar Athlete of the Year honors. Hill also earned a spot on the Big South All-Tournament team. Craft and the Runnin' Bulldogs continued their climb during the 2014-2015 campaign, posting the program's second 20-win season in the last three years while finishing with a 10-8 record in Big South play.

The Runnin' Bulldogs would advance to the semifinal round of the Big South Tournament as the seventh seed, upsetting second-seeded High Point, 72-71, in overtime in the quarterfinals before falling to eventual tournament champion Coastal Carolina. Gardner-Webb made its second appearance in a Division I postseason tournament several days later, accepting a bid to the Collegiate Basketball Invitational and taking on the University of Colorado in the first round.

Three Runnin' Bulldogs earned postseason honors in 2014-2015, as Hill earned a spot on the Big South All-Conference First Team and senior Tyler Strange was named to the Second Team. Nelson was selected to the Big South All-Academic Team, while both he and Hill were named to the North Carolina Collegiate Sports Information Association's University Division All-State Team.

The 2015-2016 season saw Gardner-Webb post its third-straight winning record under Craft's guidance – the fourth season in a row overall finishing above the .500 mark. GWU won 17 games and advanced to the Big South Conference semifinals once again.

Nelson was named second-team All-Big South Conference and followed that selection up with a spectacular showing in three league tournament games. He also earned a spot on the Big South's All-Academic Team for the second year in a row.

Gardner-Webb won 19 games in 2016-2017 and nearly clipped eventual champion and No. 1 seed Winthrop in the league semifinals – losing in overtime on the Eagles' home court.

Craft has been a part of major success in Boiling Springs before. His first season on the bench in Paul Porter Arena saw Gardner-Webb win its first Division I team title, bolting to the top of the Atlantic Sun Conference in 2004-2005 to win the league's regular season crown. The Runnin' Bulldogs advanced to the A-Sun title game in the postseason, and finished with an 18-12 record. Gardner-Webb followed that effort with 17 wins in 2005-2006.

Craft earned his Bachelor of Arts in history with a minor in secondary education from the University of Florida in 2000. Craft and his wife, Jessica, have four children – Lola, Macy, Bennett and Christian.



JEREMY LUTHER

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH | 6th SEASON

Jeremy Luther is in his sixth season as an assistant coach with the Gardner-Webb University men's basketball program, and brings a wealth of knowledge and outstanding credentials to the coaching staff.

Luther has been a part of 88 wins during his first five seasons on staff, which is the most successful stretch for the program since the late 1970s-early 1980s. His recruiting efforts have helped stock one of the best young teams in the Southeast.

The Tallahassee, Fla., native has 19 seasons of experience on the college sidelines, including six seasons as a head coach at a pair of NCAA Division II programs. He forged an 82-80 overall record in those two head coaching stops. Luther spent 2007-2009 rebuilding a Newberry program that had not won more than 12 games in a season since 2003-2004. In just his second season at the school, Luther led the Wolves to a record-setting campaign, posting a 21-8 overall record and a second-place finish in the South Atlantic Conference. The overall and league win total (10-6) both established new school records for Newberry.

Luther directed Armstrong Atlantic to a pair of winning campaigns during his time in Savannah, including a 15-12 mark in 2012-2013. Senior guard Aric Miller was named NABC Division II All-American and Daktronics/CoSIDA All-Southeast Region after leading the Peach Belt in scoring at 23.7 points per game.

The Pirates won 11 games in the ultra-competitive Peach Belt Conference. The 2012-2013 season also included a win over No. 20 St. Leo (Fla.) in November. Luther spent 2001-2007 as an assistant coach at Mercer, helping the Bears to an Atlantic Sun Conference regular season title in 2002-2003.

Mercer finished that season with a 23-6 record, the most wins in school history at that time and the first winning season at the school since 1996. The season also marked the Bears' first season with more than 15 wins since 1985-1986 and included an impressive 14-2 mark in the Atlantic Sun Conference.

During Luther's time in Macon, 10 Bears student-athletes went on to play professionally. Luther also spent time as head coach at Windsor Academy in Macon, Ga. (2000-2001) and as an assistant at North Greenville (1998-2000).

Luther started his playing career at Robert Morris (1992-93) before playing two seasons at Liberty and Covenant College. In his final two seasons at Covenant, Luther netted 1,300 points. He was named to the NAIA Division II All-America team following his senior season, when he pumped in 26.0 points per game.

Luther graduated from North Greenville in 1999 with a Bachelor of Arts in English. He and his wife, Ginny, have three children — Bryson, Kendall and August.





PAUL HEMRICK

ASSISTANT COACH | 8th SEASON

Paul Hemrick is his sixth season as an assistant coach with the Runnin' Bulldogs, after serving at a high level as Director of Basketball Operations the previous two years.

Since joining Tim Craft's bench in 2013-2014, Hemrick has been instrumental in Gardner-Webb's steady climb in the Big South standings. He has been a part of 109 wins over the past six seasons – with a string of five consecutive winning seasons the longest for the program since the 1977-1978 through 1982-1983 seasons.

Gardner-Webb advanced to the Big South Conference semifinals in four of the previous five seasons, including three in a row. GWU has also made two postseason appearances during Hemrick's tenure with the program, hosting a game in the CIT during his last season as Director of Operations (2013) and traveling to Colorado for a CBI appearance in 2015.

During his two seasons as Director of Basketball Operations, Hemrick had a hand in all aspects of the program, from administrative duties on a daily basis to overseeing the team's student managers and responsibilities for all video exchange and editing. His expertise with video was a very important aspect of Gardner-Webb's scouting success.

The John's Creek, Ga., native came to Boiling Springs after spending the past two seasons as head varsity men's basketball coach at Westminster Christian Academy in Watkinsville, Ga. He directed the squad to a 17-8 record in his first season, improving the previous season's win total by eight games. He directed the Lions to a pair of state tournament appearances and had five players named All-Region in two seasons.

Hemrick spent four seasons as a student manager at the University of Georgia from 2005-2009, coordinating film exchange in addition to responsibilities for equipment and filming. Hemrick graduated from Georgia in May 2009 with a Bachelor of Arts in business administration-management and a Bachelor of Science in education-sports management. He recently completed his Masters of Business Administration at Gardner-Webb in May 2013.

He and his wife, Melissa, are the proud parents of Eloise Grace.





RONRICO WHITE

ASSISTANT COACH | 1st SEASON

Ronrico White is in his first season as an assistant coach at Gardner-Webb, joining the Runnin' Bulldogs in July, 2018.

White came to Boiling Springs following one season as an assistant coach at Division III Emory & Henry, where he helped the Wasps to a 22-7 overall record in 2017-2018. The Knoxville, Tenn., native played four seasons at Chattanooga in the Southern Conference, finishing his career as the 14th-leading scorer in program history – netting more than 1,000 points.

White finished ranked among the top-10 in program history in career three-pointers made, free throws made (3) and assists (8). White is part of a very talented basketball family, as his father Tony was an All-America guard at the University of Tennessee and brother, Tony, Jr., was an All-SoCon guard at College of Charleston.

White graduated from Chattanooga in 2014 with a degree in business and communications. He was a member of the Dean's List multiple times.





SAGAR KAPOOR

DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS | 2nd SEASON

Sagar Kapoor is in his second season as Director of Operations with Gardner-Webb men's basketball.

Kapoor previously served as a graduate assistant with the Runnin' Bulldogs, earning his master's degree in sports pedagogy in 2018. Kapoor joined the Runnin' Bulldogs program after serving the East Carolina University program and Head Coach Jeff Lebo as their Men's Basketball Manager from 2013 through 2016.

At ECU, Kapoor completed his first season as a volunteer manager before being hired as a student manager. While with the program, he assisted the team and coaching staff with a variety of duties.

Prior to arriving at GWU, Kapoor also served at ScoutsFocus and was Camp Director of their All-American camp. In that role, Kapoor recruited players throughout the nation to attend camp and communicated with a wide range of coaches from the Division I, II, and III levels as well as NAIA and Junior Colleges regarding players.

In his first year as a Graduate Assistant Coach with Gardner-Webb University, the Runnin' Bulldogs went 19-14 making their way to the Big South Conference tournament semifinals. In his current role, Kapoor assists Gardner-Webb with a variety of duties, including travel, meal planning and as a liaison for a number of areas across campus and in the community. Kapoor assists with recruiting by helping during on-campus visits and organization of summer recruiting schedules for the coaching staff.

With academics at the forefront of the Runnin' Bulldogs priorities, Kapoor has assisted in the overseeing of student-athlete academic success by coordinating study hall and class checks for the players.

Kapoor has also worked a variety of collegiate basketball camps including: Duke University, Michigan State University, Appalachian State University, and Jay Bilas camp. He has also spent time in professional development by attending the Rising Coaches Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana. Kapoor notes John Wooden as one of his primary influences as a coach for his unique philosophies. Additionally, he claims Coach Mike Hollis, President of NetWorks Basketball as one of the individuals who has had the greatest impact on him as a coach, claiming "He has played a significant impact in molding me into the coach that I am. He challenges me, encourages me, and believes in me to be the best coach that I can be."

As a graduate of ECU, he earned his B.S. in Health and Physical Education while maintaining a 3.74 GPA as a member of the Dean's List each semester at the University in 2016. The Holly Springs, N.C. native graduated from Holly Springs High School. He is the son of Rakesh, and Renu Kapoor. He also has a brother, Sunny Kapoor.

2018-2019 at Gardner-Webb: Named second-team All-Big South Conference for the second season in a row ... An All-Tournament choice after averaging 15.3 ppg ... Enters tournament as the league's No. 5 scorer with a career-high 18.4 points per game ... Also averaging 3.7 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game, also career-high averages ... Logging 33.5 minutes per game ... Has started all 31 games this season to date ... Shooting 49.0 percent from the floor, which ranks second in the league and tops among guards ... Scored 20 or more points in 12 games ... Notched double figures scoring in all 31 regular-season games ... Career-high 33 points on 11-of-18 shooting vs. Charleston Southern (2/13) ... Scored 26 points in three different games ... Knocked down 63-of-152 shots from long range (41.4 percent) ... Made career-high 145-of-196 free throws (74.0 percent) ...
