# Pirates Close Out Season at URI

Hampton opened the 2025 campaign back on Aug. 31 when the Pirates played nationally-ranked Jackson State on even terms before falling 28-14 in the final quarter.

In the last five weeks of the season, Hampton will have faced the top four teams in the CAA: Villanova (8-2, 7-1), Monmouth (9-2, 6-1), William & Mary (7-4, 6-2) and finally Rhode Island (9-2, 7-0). The four opponents have a combined league record of 26-4 (.867) and overall mark of 33-10 (.767).



The young and inexperienced Pirates have struggled at times and will look to break a five-game losing streak against the Rams.

On Senior Day, Coach Trenton

Boykin celebrated the team's seven seniors in their final game at Armstrong Stadium.

The seven players bowing out include Jonathan Ward (LS), Harold O'Neal III (LB), Jordan Watkins (SS), Ta'Von Burrows (C), JuJu Ganthier (DB), Daniel Ufua (MLB) and Daniel Lane (CB).

### The Game

League-leading Rhode Island (9-2, 7-0) faces Hampton (2-9, 0-7) in the regular-season finale for both teams.

The only undefeated team in CAA play, the Rams have won their last five games in succession and are 4-0 at Meade Stadium this season. The Pirates have a five-game losing streak and are 0-5 on the road in 2025.

Seven Pirate football players will be playing their final game in a Hampton uniform. The group includes five players on defense and two offensive players: long snapper Jonathan Ward, linebacker Harold O'Neal III, strong safety Jordan Watkins, offensive lineman Ta'Von Burrows, defensive back JuJu Ganthier, middle linebacker Daniel Ufua and corner back Daniel Lane.

Hampton have been ranked one-two in rushing every year in the

CAA. The Pirates are currently third in the conference, averaging 165.1 yards on the ground.

Running back Ja'Quan Snipes, the centerpiece of the Pirate offense, has been out since September with a knee injury. Freshman Jah'Kei Chavis (351 yards), redshirt junior Donovan Shepard (325 yards) and freshman Gracen Goldsmith (283 yards) have carried the load.

Graduate linebacker Harold O'Neal III has 107 tackles in 2025, the most for a Pirates since linebacker Qwahsin Townsel had 107 in 2023.

The Pirates boasts the top pass defense in the conference. Hampton yields just 166.5 yards per game through the air.

Head coach Trenton Boykin has seen his players play through injuries, fall short in close games but look to go out a winner.



## History of Hampton Football

- Hampton fielded its first football team in 1902.
- A traditional powerhouse, Hampton is the HBCU's fourth all-time winningest football program.
- A charter member of the CIAA in 1912, Hampton's C.H. Williams was a CIAA Founding Father. Charter members included Hampton, Howard, Lincoln (Pa.), Shaw and Virginia Union.
- Hampton has won seven Black College National championships: 1922 (Coach Gideon Smith), 1985 (Coach Fred Freeman), 1994, 1997, 2004, 2005, and 2006 (Coach Joe Taylor).
- The Pirates have won 19 conference crowns including 14 in the CIAA (1913, 1914, 1915 1916, 1922, 1925, 1926, 1928, 1931, 1985, 1987, 1992, 1993, and 1994) and five as members of the MEAC (1997, 1998, 2004, 2005, and 2006).
- Hampton earned invitations to five IAA/FCS Championships (1997, 1998, 2004, 2005 and 2006). The Pirates played in the NCAA Division II Championships three times (1985, 1992 and 1993).
- Hampton has had 20 players chosen in the NFL Draft. The last was DT Kenrick Ellis was a third-round pick by the New York Jets in 2011.
- Coach Joe Taylor was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2019. He posted a 136-49-1 record in 16 years at the Pirate helm.

## This Date in Pirate History

Hampton has a 5-2 (.714) worksheet in Nov. 22 games. The first game on this date was in 1913 when the Pirates (then called Seaside) beat Howard 8-6. Hampton would go on to win its first CIAA championship. In 2008, Hampton beat Morgan State 17-13 on the road. In the last game on this date, Howard slipped past Hampton 30-29 in a game played in Washington, D.C.

## Boykin Adds Four Assistants

Head coach Trenton Boykin added four new coaches this year: defensive tackles coach Raekwon Bethea (formerly of SMU), co-offensive coordinator Ollie Taylor (Delaware State), tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator Delbert Tyler II (Robert Morris) and defensive ends coach Marc Yellock (Valdosta State).

## Veteran HU Coaching Staff

Hampton's coaching staff has 171 years experience. Head coach Trenton Boykin is in his 29th season and fourth as a head coach. Hampton's 10 assistants have 141 years of experience led by Howard Feggins's in 25th season and 16th stop.

### Iron Man Jackson to Witness 523rd Game

Hampton Assistant Director of Athletics Buster Jackson will witness his 523rd consecutive Pirates football game when Hampton hosts William & Mary on Nov. 15. Starting as a student manager in 1978, he attended his 500th consecutive game when Hampton played at Elon in 2023. The streak began Sept. 9, 1978 at Winston-Salem State. In 46+ years, the Pirates has a 310-205-6 (.601) record.

### Pirate Wristbands

Hampton players are sporting special wristbands in a sign of unity this season. Inspired by Coach Trenton Boykin, they read "DHTT" --- meaning "Doing Hard Things Together."

### The Pirate Walk

Coach Trent Boykin unveiled a new tradition in 2024: the Pirate Walk. The team disembarks from the team buses at the Convocation Center bridge and make their way Holland Hall to the team locker room three hours before kickoff. Fans line the way and encourage and cheer on the team in the pre-game march to inspire and encourage the Pirates.

### Age before Beauty: CAA's Oldest Venues

Villanova Stadium was opened on Oct. 8, 1927 and is the CAA's oldest venue. Although the stadium is on the same site, the entire stadium has been replaced over the years.

Rhode Island's Meade Stadium opened two weeks before Armstrong Field on Sept. 22, 1928. In building the Ryan Center the last remnants of the original Meade Stadium were torn down.

Hampton's Armstrong Field (now Stadium) was constructed by Hampton Institute students and opened on Oct. 6, 1928 with a capacity of 1,500. The facility has added seating and other amenities over the years including endzone seating and boasts a seating capacity of 9,710. But the original 1,500 seats are still in use today, technically making Armstrong Stadium the oldest venues in the CAA.

### HU to Play FBS Teams in '26, '27, '28

Director of Athletics Anthony D. Henderson Sr. announced that Hampton will play at Maryland (Sept. 5, 2026) and at Georgia Tech (Oct. 9, 2027), marking Hampton's first-ever games against Power 4 competition. In addition, the Pirates will play FBS member Old Dominion (Sept. 16, 2028).





## The Pirates in Overtime

Hampton has played 14 overtime games since overtime was adopted by the NCAA in 1996. The Pirates are 6-8 (3-3 at home) in overtime.

■ The first OT game was a 6 OT affair in which Florida A&M outlasted the Pirates 59-58.

■ In 2006, Hampton scored a TD in OT and then blocked Grambling State's PAT attempt to post a 27-26 win over the Tigers.

■ In the last OT game, Hampton lost at North Carolina A&T 33-30 in two OTs in 2025.

### HU Rules CAA Commissioner's Honor Roll

Hampton has gained a well-earned reputation for academic excellence. Last semester, more than 76 percent of the Hampton football team was named to the CAA Commissioner's Honor Roll and the team posted a 3.05 GPA for the spring semester. A record 57 football student-athletes were recognized. Four players had a 4.0 GPA earning CAA High Honors with Distinction honors. Twenty-three players had a GPA of 3.7-plus earning High Honors and 30 with Honors and a 3.0-plus GPA.

After Hampton (2-9, 0-7) jumped to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, William & Mary (7-4, 6-2) stormed back scoring 55 unanswered points to post a 55-14 victory over the Pirates before 2,041 fans at Armstrong Stadium.

Hampton celebrated Senior Day with seven players playing in their last home game for the Pirates. The list included Jonathan Ward, Harold O'Neal, Jordan Watkins, Ta'Von Burrows, Juju Ganthier, Daniel Ufua and Daniel Lane.

The Pirates took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards in 14 plays culminating in Gracen Goldsmith's three-yard touchdown run. Brett Starling's extra point gave the Pirates a quick 7-0 advantage. The workmanlike drive ate up 6:45 of the clock 41 yards on the ground and 34 passing yards.

Cam Sturdifen's pass interception led to Hampton's second touchdown. The junior picked off a Tribe pass at the 41-yard line setting up an efficient seven-play, 59-yard drive. Goldsmith scored his second TD of the day on a one-yard run to boost the Pirates lead to 14-0.

But the lead didn't last long. The Tribe scored three touchdowns in the next 4:51 and led 38-14 at intermission. William & Mary added 17 more points in the second half while holding the Pirates scoreless to post a 55-14 win over the Pirates.

Braden Davis completed 11-of-18 passes for 117 yards for the Pirates while Gracen Goldsmith rushed for 86 yards with two touchdowns. Michael Matthews-Canty finished with eight tackles to lead the Pirate defense. For William & Mary, Hughes completed 17-of-20 passes for 207 yards and five scores. Rashad Raymond caught 13 passes for 114 yards and a touchdown. In all, William & Mary amassed 432 yards in total offense while the Pirates accounted for 253.



## The Series with Rhode Island

**Record:** William & Mary leads the series that began in 1997 by a 10-0 margin.



**Last 10 Meetings:** The Tribe has won all 10 of the two teams.

**Boykin vs. the Tribe:** 0-1 (.000).

**Record at Hampton:** William & Mary is 4-0 in games played at Armstrong Stadium. The last match-up in Hampton was in 2023 with the Tribe winning 31-10. Tied 10-10 midway through the fourth quarter, the Tribe turned three Hampton turnovers into touchdowns.

**Record at William & Mary:** William & Mary leads 6-0 (1.000).

**First Meeting:** The two teams first met on August 30, 1997 with homestanding William & Mary winning a 31-16 decision over the Pirates. Hampton would go on to win 11 consecutive games before losing in the Division I-AA Playoffs under Coach Joe Taylor.

**Last Meeting:** Sept. 28, 2024. The Pirates scored first but the Tribe scored the game's next 49 points in a 49-7 win over Hampton.

In a game that matched the Coastal Athletic Association's top two running attacks, William & Mary (4-1) prevailed over Hampton (3-2) 49-7 before a crowd of 11,317 at Zable Stadium. The loss snapped Hampton's three-game winning streak. The Tribe finished the game with 632 yards offense while Hampton had 214 yards offense.

It was a back-and-forth first quarter. In the early-going, William & Mary turned the ball over on a fumble at the Tribe 38-yard line. But Hampton was unable to capitalize as the Pirates threw an interception on the first play from scrimmage.

After the Hampton defense held, Pirate quarterback Chris Zellous engineered an efficient drive to put the Pirates on the board first. Hampton moved the ball 70 yards in 11 plays capped by a five-yard touchdown run by Elijah Burris with 4:48 to go in the first quarter to put the Pirates ahead 7-0.

But from there it was all William & Mary as the Tribe put up 49 consecutive points.

The Tribe continued its winning streak against the Pirates, prevailing in all 10 meetings between the two teams.

Trenton Boykin, a veteran of 29 years collegiate coaching experience including 10 years on the FBS-level at Akron, Boston College, and Ball State, was promoted to permanent head coach on Oct. 16, 2024 after less than six months as interim head coach of the Pirates.

Boykin joined the Pirate staff in 2020 after serving as running game coordinator at Akron from 2012-18.

Under his guidance as offensive coordinator, Hampton's running game developed into the top unit in the CAA. In 2023, the Pirate ground game averaged a league-best 216.4 yards per contest. Elijah Burris rushed for 803 yards (114.7 yards per game) with eight TDs in seven games. Darran Butts rambled for 670 yards (74.4 ypg) with four scores giving Hampton the CAA's top one-two punch.

Prior to his time at Akron, Boykin spent a season as

running backs coach at Wayne State (Mich.). He helped lead the Warriors to a 12-win season and an appearance in the Division II national championship game. In 2011, Wayne State boasted two 1,000-yard rushers for the first time in school history.

Boykin served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Lambuth (Tenn.) in 2010 after two seasons (2008-09) as the head coach at Lane (Tenn.). From 2005-07, he worked as the assistant head coach at Kentucky State.

Boykin began his coaching career at Akron in 1996 as an offensive graduate assistant. He spent two years on the staff moving to Boston College in 1998 as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching receivers at Tiffin in 1999.

For three years, he worked at his alma mater, Youngstown State, as wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator.

From 2003-04, he coached special teams and running backs at Ball State.

Boykin graduated from Youngstown State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in organizational communication.

He played for legendary coach Jim Tressel at Youngstown State and helped lead the Penguins to I-AA national titles in 1991, 1993, and 1994.

A standout receiver, Boykin's 150 career receptions rank him second on Youngstown's all-time list and his 1,950 career receiving yards are seventh. In 1994, he was named the team's most outstanding offensive player.

In 2006, he was inducted onto the Kent Roosevelt High Hall of Fame.

He is the father of two daughters: Elivia and Brittney, and a son, Jaz. He also has three grandchildren.

## Renovations and Improvements

The stadium has seen many renovations over the years. In 1978, a new press box was completed on the west side. New bleachers were installed on the west side in 1985 and on the east side in 1986.

In 1988, lights were added making night games possible and a new track was installed. A new press box was built in 1991 on the east side along with camera towers for televised games.

In 1998, the press box was renovated, the stadium was bricked, the playing field resurfaced and a new scoreboard with a Pro Video Screen was added.

In 1999, seating was added in the north end zone along with construction of a new entrance to the facility. The additions included coach's offices, team rooms, conference rooms, multipurpose audio/visual rooms, reception area, and a player lounge.

Later construction included the addition of bleachers in the south endzone.
