Mark Carr is in his 22nd season as the head coach of the Hartwick football program. Prior to his appointment, he spent nine years (1993-2001) as the offensive coordinator and four years (1998-2001) as the assistant head coach at Hartwick under Steve Stetson before taking over the controls of the program.

In 2016, Carr's Hawks ranked in the top 10 in NCAA Division III in passing offense. The team led the Empire 8 Conference in total offense and passing yards as well. A big part of that offense was quarterback, Billy Pine who finished the season as the nation's leader in total offense. Wide Receiver Koree Reed, who garnered All-America honors from both the Associated Press and AFCA, was also instrumental in the offense going on to lead the nation in Receiving Yards per game. In 2015, Carr became the all-time winningest coach in Hartwick football history with the 'Wick passing offense finishing the season ranked fifth in Division III with an average of 359.1 yards per outing.

Under Carr's leadership in 2008, quarterback Jason Boltus and wide receiver Jack Phelan piled up awards and honors. Boltus was the Empire 8 and d3football.com East Region Offensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season and a Gagliardi Trophy Regional Finalist for the second straight time. He was also selected as an Associated Press Little All-American and was tabbed the ECAC Division III Player of the Year and the Northwest Player of the Year. He set an NCAA career record for yardage in Division III accumulating 14,231 yards in four seasons with the Hawks. He was the first Hartwick player to be invited to the NFL Player Combine in Indianapolis and has played the last four seasons with the Canadian Football League's Hamilton Tiger-Cats. Phelan was named an American Football Coaches' Association (AFCA) All-American, an Associated Press Little All-American, and a d3football.com First Team All-American. His 26 touchdown catches equaled a 10-year old NCAA Division III record and he led the nation in both receiving yards and receiving yards per game for the second straight year.

Carr's offenses have not only been ranked high in the Empire 8, but also nationally as well. Five seasons ago, the Hawks ranked 1st in passing offense (397.3 ypg) and second in total offense (544.2 ypg) in Division III football. Six years ago, the program ranked in the top 10 in both categories logging 364.4 yards per game in passing (3rd nationally) and 494.3 in total offense (7th). In the 2006 season, the Hawks were ranked 26th nationally in passing offense (248.0 ypg), 28th in total offense (388.6 ypg), and tied for 62nd in scoring (25.7 ppg).

In 2005, Hartwick was ninth in passing offense (318.1 ypg), 10th in total offense (489.3 ypg) and tied for 20th in scoring offense (37.5 ppg). In his first season at the helm, Carr led the Hawks to an 8-2 record (3-1 Empire 8 Conference) en route to the school's first postseason victory in history by defeating Curry College (Mass.) 69-14 in the 2002 ECAC North Atlantic Championship Game.



During Carr's tenure at Hartwick, he has developed 16 All-Americans, two ECAC Northwest Players of the Year as well as the 2002 and 2007 Melberger Award Winners, Dan Pincelli ('02) and Jason Boltus ('07). The Melberger Award is given to the Most Outstanding Player in NCAA Division III football.

Carr, a native of Vestal, New York was a 1990 graduate of the University of New Hampshire. After his senior season, Carr was invited to attend the National Football League Combine in Indianapolis, Indiana. He returned to the University of New Hampshire and helped the team win the 1991 Yankee Conference Championship as the quarterbacks coach. Carr and his wife Tiffany reside in Oneonta along with their two children, Brady and Kylie.

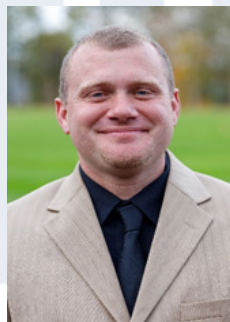

MELBERGER AWARD

The Melberger Award is handed out annually to the most outstanding player in all of NCAA Division III Football. During the years that the Melberger Award has been handed out, the trophy has resided at Hartwick College twice. Following the 2007 campaign, quarterback Jason Boltus was honored as the recipient, while former standout, quarterback Dan Pincelli was the 2002 award winner.

The award was handed out for the first time in 1993. In 2002, the Wilkes-Barre Touchdown Club, which handed out the award since the inaugural season, ceased to exist and Diversified Information Technologies took over controls of the award.

FACILITIES



WRIGHT STADIUM

Hartwick football plays its home games and conducts most of its practices at Wright Stadium, which is located on campus. On October 7, 2006, the stadium was formally dedicated as Wright Stadium, in honor of Trustee Brian Wright '02 and the Wright family's commitment to the College.

The surface is FieldTurf, a grass-like synthetic turf that offers the beneficial biomechanical properties of natural grass, combined with all-weather playability, low maintenance, and unlimited playing time. FieldTurf is the first choice for elite athletic venues worldwide, and 24 NFL installations, including the New York Jets, New York Giants, and the New England Patriots, and more than 40 NCAA installations. The College funded installation of the new surface through the generosity of the Fred L. Emerson Foundation and alumni, parents, and friends of the College.

At the south end zone of Wright Stadium stands a multi-purpose facility completed during summer 2006. "The Hawks Nest" has a ticket office, concession stand, restrooms, and a second floor VIP room that overlooks the south end zone through an impressive wall of glass.

Over the summer of 2023, the south side of the stadium added another upgrade with the installation of a new scoreboard gifted to the department from Trustee Larry Miller ('73) and his late wife, Dr. Judith Day.

The seating area and press box are known as the Coughlin Pavilion, named in honor of P.J. and Carol Ann (Hamilton '86) Coughlin.

The Hawks also have the option to practice on Strawberry Field, a natural grass practice facility located above the Binder Gymnasium tennis courts. Strawberry Field is a regulation sized field complete with goal posts, and provides an impressive view of Oneonta and the Susquehanna Valley from its hilltop location.

BINDER GYMNASIUM

The athletic complex at Hartwick revolves around Binder Gymnasium. Located in Binder is Lambros Arena, which is home to the women's volleyball program and the men's and women's basketball program.

Also located in Binder is the Sally Griffiths Herbert '88 Aquatic Center. Dedicated in 2014, the center is home to the men's and women's swimming and diving teams.
