HOME SWEET HOME: The Dons got to open the season at home for the first time since 2013 and it treated them well. They opened 3-1 and improved their home record in the new Benedetti Diamond rose to 11-5. Last year, the Rainbow Warriors beat the Dons in two out of three games "at home" as USF hosted at Saint Mary's College in Moraga.

HOT START: The three wins to open the season was tied for the best start to a year under head coach Nino Giarratano (19th season). The last time the Dons won three games in a row to start a season was 2005.

WET AND WILD WEEKEND: It was a disjointed, rainy weekend that USF and Northern Colorado battled through. Friday's game was suspended due to rain and resumed Saturday with another game right after. Then they played a double-header on Sunday but could not finish the second game due to darkness. The two teams then went on to finish the series on Tuesday, where they played one inning to wrap-up game four of the series.

ROLLING FROM ONE YEAR TO ANOTHER: Ross Puskarich entered the season with a 17-game hit streak in tact from last season. He added at least one hit in each of the first four games extending his streak to 21 games. This season he is batting a co-team high .462 with a .533 on base percentage and a team-high 4 RBI.

PRESEASON ALL-WCC: Nico Giarratano and Ross Puskarich were voted to the Preseason All-WCC Team. Giarratano is the WCC's reigning defensive player of the year. Puskarich was a second team all-conference performer last year.

FAMILIAR FACES: When the Dons take the field Friday afternoon all nine starters are returners. Ross Puskarich, Nico Giarratano, Allen Smoot, Harrison Bruce, Matt Sinatro and Brady Bate all played last year. Catcher Dominic Miroglio returns after only playing eight games in 2016 due to a hand injury. Second baseman Michael Perri was on the roster but sat out all of last season after transferring from Pepperdine.

DOUBLING DONS: The Dons tallied 12 doubles in the opening series with Northern Colorado. Three of them came off the bat of Brady Bate. Dominic Miroglio, Allen Smoot and Nico Giarratano all added two of their own. Ross Puskarich, Matt Sinatro and Michael Perri all had one, too.

NEED FOR SPEED: The Dons stole nine bases in the opening series lead by Harrison Bruce and Tyler Villaroman's three each. Matt Sinatro stole two and Brady Bate had one.

PATIENCE AT THE PLATE: The Dons let Northern Colorado pitchers dig themselves into holes with patience at the plate. The Dons coaxed 25 walks over the course of the opening four games to the tune of a team OBP of .433.

**#3 RIKI URATA - INFIELD FR.
SAN MATEO, CALIF. • HILLSDALE HS**

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: He earned first-team Peninsula Athletic League honors as a junior and senior... hit .435 his senior year and was named team MVP.

#4 MATT SINATRO - OF SR. SAMMAMISH, WASH. • SKYLINE HS

2017 NOTES: Hit a walk-off single high off the right field wall to give the Dons the win in the season opener.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .305 with 26 steals (led the WCC). His .427 obp was 10th best in the WCC. He walked 34 times (fourth most in the WCC). Had a career-best 11-game hitting streak (Apr. 5 to Apr. 23)... became the first Don since Bradley Zimmer in 2014 to steal at least three bags in one game when he swiped a trio at Cal on March 29... matched his season high with three stolen bases against San Diego (Apr. 22)... scored a career-high four runs against UMass Lowell (Mar. 16)... all of his starts came in center field, but also made four appearances at second base.

**#5 ALLEN SMOOT - INFIELD R-SR.
MORAGA, CALIF. • DE LA SALLE HS • COLLEGE OF SAN MATEO**

2017 NOTES: Leads the team with 5 RBI.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .321 with 33 rbi and 14 doubles. His .434 OBP was sixth best in the WCC. He walked 31 times (ninth most in the WCC). Had a season-high three RBI at LMU (Apr. 8)... put together a season-best nine-game hitting streak (Mar. 19 - Apr. 2)

**#6 NICO GIARRATANO - SHORTSTOP SR.
SAN FRANCISCO, CALIF. • ST. IGNATIUS PREP**

2017 NOTES: Was voted a preseason All-WCC selection.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Was named WCC Defensive Player of the Year and hit .251 with 28 rbi. Had a team-best 18-game on-base streak (Mar. 29 - Apr. 30)... drove in a season-high three runs against Grand Canyon (Mar. 8)... hit home runs against Grand Canyon (Mar. 8) and at Cal (Mar. 29)... had a season-best three hits (3-for-6, 2 R, 2 RBI, 2B) against Hawai'i (Feb. 28)... had a season-best six-game hitting streak between Feb. 20 and Feb. 26.

2017 NOTES: Leads the team with three doubles... doubled twice in the season opener.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .230 with a team-high six home runs. All of his starts but two (DH) have been in right field... hit his first-career home run vs. Utah Valley (Feb. 24)... also homered at Pacific (Mar. 25), vs. Gonzaga (Apr. 17) and vs. San Diego (Apr. 22)... drove in a season-best four runs against San Diego (Apr. 22)... stole a season-best two bases against San Jose State (Apr. 19).

**#9 MICHAEL PERRI - INFIELD R-JR.
ALAMEDA, CALIF. • BISHOP O'DOWD • PEPPERDINE**

2017 NOTES: Projected to play second base.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Sat out last year after transferring from Pepperdine. While at Pepperdine he was a short stop as a freshman and a pitcher as a sophomore.

2017 Notes: Tied for the team lead with three steals entering the series.

**#11 MATT CAMPOS - INFIELD FR.

Coach Giarratano: "Matt is the top middle infielder in the state of Hawaii," added Giarratano. "He will contribute with his glove, bat and work ethic as a young player. Look for Matt to be a middle of the order hitter in time."

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .257 with three home runs. Had a season-high three hits at San Jose State (Mar. 15)... hit his first home run of the year at No. 12 Cal (Feb. 23).

**#14 ROSS PUSKARICH - INFIELD JR.
BAKERSFIELD, CALIF. • LIBERTY HS**

2017 NOTES: Was voted a preseason All-WCC selection. Currently in the midst of a 21-game hit streak that is carrying over from last season... batting .462 after four games.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .331 (team-high, 9th in the WCC) with 5 home runs and 29 rbi. Had a career-high three hits on two occasions; 3 for 4, HR, 2 RBI at Pacific (Mar. 26) and 3 for 3, vs. New Mexico (Apr. 13)... hit home runs against Utah Valley (Feb. 24), at San Jose State (Mar. 15) and at Pacific (Mar. 26).

**#20 HARRISON BRUCE - OUTFIELD R-SR.
PORTLAND, ORE. • JESUIT HS**

2017 NOTES: Tied for the team lead with three steals... batting .375 after four games.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .260 with 14 rbi and 12 steals (7th most in WCC). Started in all three outfield positions last season, with the majority in left field... had season-best three RBI at UC Santa Barbara (Feb. 20)... tallied a season-high three hits on two occasions: at Cal (Feb. 23) and at Cal Poly (Mar. 4).

#23 DAN JAMES - INFIELD SR. PORTOLA HILLS, CALIF. • EL TORO HS • SADDLEBACK CC

2017 NOTES: Projected as a utility infielder and top contender for DH.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Hit .257 with three home runs and 23 rbi... The majority of his starts came at third base, but he also started two games at first base... went a season-best 4-for-5 with a double and two RBI at Sacramento State (Mar. 22)... also drove in a season-best two runs on six occasions, most recently at Stanford (May 3)... hit his first-career home run at UC Santa Barbara (Feb. 20).

**#25 RILEY HELLAND - INFIELD/RHP SO.
CAMARILLO, CALIF. • OAKS CHRISTIAN HS**

2017 NOTES: Started game four at catcher.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Had a season-high three hits (3-for-3, RBI, R) at Cal Poly (Mar. 4)... came up with a pinch-hit single in the ninth inning vs. Hawai'i (Feb. 27) that helped spur a three-run comeback... went 2-for-4 with two runs scored against UC Santa Barbara ace Shane Bieber in his collegiate debut (Feb. 19)... started games at second base, third base and catcher.

2017 NOTES: Tied for team high batting average of .462.

PRIOR YEARS' NOTES: Injured his hand in a collision sliding into second base vs. Hawai'i (Feb. 27) and missed the rest of the season... was in the midst of a four-game hitting streak where he was hitting .429 (6-for-14) before his injury. Was drafted in the 16th round by the Tampa Bay Rays.

Over his 18 years on the Hilltop, Nino Giarratano has guided the Dons' baseball program to unprecedented success since taking over prior to the 1999 season.

The three-time West Coast Conference Coach of the Year has led USF to two WCC championships (2006, 2011), three postseason appearances (2006, 2011, 2013) and has compiled the most wins in program history. Giarratano has had 44 players named to the All-WCC first team, including two WCC Player of the Year awards (Taggart Bozied, 1999; Scott Cousins, 2006), three WCC Defensive Players of the Year (Joey Railey, 2008; Stephen Yarrow, 2011; Nico Giarratano, 2016) and one WCC Pitcher of the Year selection (Patrick McGuigan, 2006).

Giarratano's player development success is highlighted by the 45 Dons that have been drafted by Major League Baseball teams during his tenure; most recently, Dominic Miroglio (16th round; Rays) and Ryan Matranga (36th; Giants) in the 2016 draft. Following the 2012 season, right-handed pitcher Kyle Zimmer was selected fifth overall by the Kansas City Royals, making Zimmer the highest draft pick in USF baseball history. In 2014, Kyle's brother, Bradley, became the fourth first-round pick under Giarratano when he was selected 21st overall by the Cleveland Indians. The other two first-rounders under Giarratano's watch were Evan Frederickson (2008, White Sox) and Aaron Poreda (2007, White Sox).

Giarratano became the winningest coach in USF baseball history when he surpassed Hilltop legend Dante Benedetti with his 374th victory in 2009. On May 12, 2016, Giarratano earned his 500th career win as the Dons defeated BYU 6-5 in walk-off fashion at home. With that victory, Giarratano became just the third coach in WCC history (along with Rich Hill and John Cunningham) to amass at least 500 career wins at the Division I level.

Following the 2016 season, Giarratano sits at third on the WCC's all-time list for wins (502) and is the second winningest active WCC coach behind San Diego's Rich Hill.

In 2006, Giarratano led the Dons to a milestone by winning a program-record 39 games and claiming the team's first WCC championship. USF duplicated their championship form in 2011 when they finished in first place again.

In 2013, the Dons were on the doorstep of another championship when they participated in the inaugural WCC Championship series at Banner Island Ballpark in Stockton, Calif. only to fall to San Diego in three games.

In addition to his program's success on the field, Giarratano's teams have also boasted superior academic performance. The 2004, 2006, 2007 and 2009 squads set a then-school record by having four players selected to the All-WCC Academic Team. In 2014, the team set a new record by having six student-athletes named to the WCC All-Academic Team. The team had 14 student-athletes earn WCC Commissioner's Honor Roll selections in 2003 and 2007, also a school record.

Giarratano has led the Dons to the NCAA Regional three times and this ability to lead has been recognized on the national level. During the summer of 2008, he helped guide the U.S. Collegiate National Team to a 24-0 record and a gold medal in the FISU World Championships in the Czech Republic. Two years later, he served as an assistant to the team again and helped them to a 16-3 record and a silver medal finish.

Before coming to USF, Giarratano spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Arizona State, serving as the hitting instructor, offensive coordinator and third base coach. In his final season with the Sun Devils, ASU reached the 1998



College World Series Championship game behind a staggering offense. The team hit .318 with 557 runs off 723 base hits, including 57 home runs in addition to 120 stolen bases.

Giarratano's ability to recruit also shined in Arizona. While serving as Arizona State's recruiting coordinator, he helped to piece together a class ranked as the third best in 1996 and did it again in 1997 when the incoming class was ranked as No.2 in the nation.

Much of Giarratano's experience was gained while coaching at the junior college level, where he quickly found success. He was named Collegiate Baseball's National Junior College Coach of the Year three times while at Trinidad State Junior College (Trinidad, Colo.) from 1989 to 1994. He led the program to five NJCAA World Series appearances, while the team posted a 233-86 (.730) mark over his six seasons at the helm.

Between Trinidad State JC and Arizona State, Giarratano made a stop at Yavapai Community College (Prescott, Ariz.), leading the team to a 77-36 record in two seasons, while sending 25 players to the professional ranks. Altogether, Giarratano compiled an overall junior college record of 310-122 (.718).

Giarratano is a 1985 graduate of William Jewell College with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He later earned his master's degree in secondary administration from Adams State. He lives in The City with his wife Brenda. His daughter Bianca is a graduate of the University of San Francisco and his son, Nico, is currently a senior shortstop for the Dons.
