GAME STORYLINES

- ▶ Head coach Todd Graham will make his UH coaching debut. He is looking to become the first UH coach since Bob Wagner in 1987 to win in his Rainbow Warrior debut.
- ▶ In four previous head coaching jobs, Graham was 3-1 in his debut. His head coaching record in season openers is 9-3.
- ▶ With 95 career victories, Graham is third winningest active coach in the Mountain West behind Wyoming's Craig Bohl (140) and Air Force's Troy Calhoun (99) and tied for 29th in FRS
- ightharpoonup This season marks the fourth time in the last five years that Hawai'i will open the season away from home. UH won its last two 2018 at Colorado State and 2017 at IIMass
- ▶ UH has a 3-3 all-time record in season-openers versus conference opponents.
- ▶ Saturday's match-up is the 53rd meeting between the schools. Fresno State is UH's longest-standing rival. The teams have met every season since 1992 when both were members of the Western Athletic Conference.
- ▶ FS leads the all-time series 29-22-1. The Bulldogs lead the series 14-8-1 in Fresno and have taken three of the last four meetings at home.
- ▶ UH has five wins against the Bulldogs in Fresno, Calif., in nine meetings since 2002 including a 14-13 victory in 2016.
- ▶ After UH won 7-of-10 in the series from 2001-10, Fresno State has won eight of the last nine overall and 7-of-8 in Mountain West play. Hawai'i's only win during that span was a 14-13 victory in 2016 in Fresno, Calif., in a game in which the winning team of the series failed to reach 20 points for the first time since 1973.
- ▶ UH has won three straight MW games dating back to last season, tied for a school record. The Warriors have won four of their last five MW games.
- ▶ Hawai'i plays three of its first four games of the season on the road. UH is 10-22 all-time in Mountain West road games, however UH went 3-1 last year and are 6-2 on the road against MW competition the last two seasons.
- ▶ The UH offensive line features nine different players who have started at least one game. The 121 combined starts is the third most in the country entering the season.
- $\,\blacktriangleright\,$ Redshirt sophomore Chevan Cordeiro has a 4-0 record as a starter with wins over Wyoming in 2018 and San José State, UNLV, and Army in 2019.
- ightharpoonup UH is the defending West Division champions and played in its first-ever Mountain West Championship Game last season.

WE ARE THE "RAINBOW WARRIORS"

When referring to the UH football team, please use the nickname "Rainbow Warriors." In an effort to standardize its nicknames, on July 1, 2013, the University of Hawai'i officially changed its men's team nickname to "Rainbow Warriors." The school's women's teams are still referred to as "Rainbow Wahine." The word "Wahine" (pronounced wah-HEE-nay) means woman in the Hawaiian language. The rainbow has been part of UH's nickname since 1923.

WHAT'S AN 'OKINA?

What's that punctuation mark in the word Hawai'1? In the Hawaiian language, it's called an 'okina, which translated literally in English means separator. Phonetically it is referred to as a glottal stop, similar to the sound that would be made in the English oh-oh. The 'okina is actually a letter in the Hawaiian language and typed out looks like a backwards, inverted apostrophe. The practice of the UH Sports Media Relations office is to use the 'okina in all Hawaiian words in which they occur.

SEASON OPENERS

- ▶ UH is 62-36-5 (.626) all-time in season openers, including a 3-3 mark in season-openers versus conference opponents.
- ▶ Just as rare as season openers against a conference foe is opening against a conference opponent on the road. Its happened just four times in UH's 41 years in the WAC and MW. This will be however the second time in the last three years that UH has done so, after winning at Colorado State in 2018.

NO-SO-RARE ROAD OPENER

- ▶ This will be the fourth time in the last five years that the Warriors will open the season away from home.
- ▶ Road openers have been a rarity in the last quarter century. This will mark just the seventh time in the last 27 seasons that UH will open the season outside the state of Hawai'i.
- ▶ Prior to 2006, the last time UH opened on the road was 1992.

THE GRAHAM ERA BEGINS

- ▶ The Warriors are under the new leadership of Todd Graham, who has averaged nearly eight wins per season and led 10 of his 12 squads to bowl eligibility as a head coach at four previous stops.
- Graham is the first coach to be hired by UH with collegiate head coaching experience since Dave Holmes in 1968.
- ▶ With 95 career victories, he is third winningest active coach in the Mountain West behind Wyoming's Craig Bohl (140) and Air Force's Troy Calhoun (99) and tied for 29th in FBS.
- ▶ UH marks Graham's fifth head coaching stop. In his four previous jobs, he went a combined 31-21 in his inaugural season having no worse than a .500 record (6-6 at Pitt).

UH HEAD COACHING DEBUTS

▶ Todd Graham looks to be the first UH coach since Bob Wagner in 1987 to win in his Rainbow Warrior debut. Six out of eight first-year coaches in the Division I era have dropped their opener, including each of the last five.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

- ▶ UH returns nine offensive linemen who have made a combined 121 starts, which ranks third nationally entering the 2020 campaign behind Minnesota (126) and Marshall (123).
- ▶ UH's offensive line allowed only 27 sacks in 657 pass attempts (1 sack/24.3 att.) last season and did not allow a sack in four games.
- ▶ UH ranked No. 51 in fewest sacks allowed (1.80). In addition, Hawai'i was No. 5 nationally in fewest tackles-for-loss allowed (3.87/game).
- ▶ Two linemen started every game tackle IIm Manning and center Taaga Tuulima. In fact, Manning has started all 29 games of his career and was UH's lone representative on the preseason all-Mountain West team.
- ▶ Both Tuulima and Manning are named to preseason watch lists - Tuulima to the Rimington Trophy (nation's top center) and Manning to the Outland Trophy (nation's best interior lineman).
- ▶ UH started four different players at right guard last season Solo Vaipulu (9), Kohl Levao (3), Bubba Wa'a (2), and Alesana Sunia (1).
- ▶ The versatile Levao has played all three spots on the line – tackle, center, and guard. In 2018, he started all 14 games, however he missed the majority of last season due to injury and redshirted.

TEAM CAPTAINS

▶ UH elected four captains this season — junior DB **Khoury Bethley** (Chino, Calif.), sophomore QB **Chevan Cordeiro** (Honolulu, Oʻahu), senior DB **Eugene Ford** (Venice, Calif.), and junior RB **Miles Reed** (Corona, Calif.).

NOT A FRESHMAN ANYMORE

- ▶ Quarterback Chevan Cordeiro spent the past two seasons — 2018 as a redshirt and 2019 as a redshirt freshman — as a back-up to starter Cole McDonald, who was picked in the seventh round of the NFL Draft in April.
- ▶ In those two seasons, Cordeiro was instrumental in seven UH victories. He made four career starts (1 in 2018 and 3 in 2019), all leading to UH victories. He also came off the bench to rally the Warriors to wins over UNLV in 2018 and Arizona and San Diego State in 2019.
- ▶ Made his first start in his first collegiate appearance against Wyoming (Oct. 6, 2018), leading UH to a 17-13 comeback win capped by a 38-yard pass to JoJo Ward with 1:26 left. He finished 19-of-29 for 148 yards and two TDs and became UH's first true freshman starter since Timmy Chang in 2000.
- ▶ Also became the first UH true freshman quarterback to win a game in his first career start since Blaine Gaison in 1976 (vs UTEP).
- ▶ Perhaps Cordeiro's most heroic effort came against UNLV in 2018 in which he directed three touchdown drives after UH trailed 28-13 He capped the comeback with a 68-yard dart to John Ursua with 1:25 left to finish 4-of-5 for 153 yards and 3 TDs.
- ▶ Last season, he made three starts and threw from 907 yards on 57.5 percent passing and eight touchdowns. He threw for a career-high 309 yards on 23-of-31 passing and rushed for a career-high 55 yards in a win over San José State to earn MW Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- ▶ Led a 96-yard TD drive that proved to be the game-winner in UH's 14-11 win over San Diego State that clinched the MW West Division title.
- ▶ In UH's opener vs. Arizona, he entered the game with the score tied at 35 and directed two scoring drives for a 45-38 victory and almost led the Warriors to another comeback with two fourth quarter touchdown drives in a loss to Fresno State.

THE SMART CHOICE

- ▶ In his first season with UH in 2019, Jared Smart finished second on the team in receptions (87) and receiving yards (1,129) and was one of just four players on the team to start every game.
- ▶ Smart enters this season on the preseason watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, as the nation's top receiver.
- ▶ Smart led the team with five 100-yard receiving games including a career-high 142 yards on seven catches and two touchdowns in win over BYU in the SoFi Hawai'i Bowl.
- ▶ He is one of 16 players in program history to record 1,000 receiving yards in a season.
- ▶ Ranked fifth in the Mountain West in both receptions per game (5.8) and receiving yards per game (75.3) and averaged 13.0 yards per catch.

BAM BAM BOOM

- ▶ Running back Miles "Bam Bam" Reed enjoyed a breakout season in 2019 and this season is on the watch list for the Doak Walker Award as the nation's best running back.
- ▶ The powerful and shifty Reed ranked No. 6 in the conference with 908 yards on 174 carries,

- averaging 5.2 per attempt and 60.5 yards per game. He also led the team with eight rushing touchdowns.
- ► Racked up a career-high 124 rushing yards and one touchdown on 17 carries against San losé State

HE'S BACK

- ▶ Linebacker Penei Pavihi, who had a breakout sophomore season in 2018, missed all of last year due to a season-ending injury. The redshirt junior is fully healthy for the 2020 season.
- ▶ The Pago Pago, American Samoa native made 13 starts in 2018 and tied for second on the team with 87 total tackles, including 6.5 tackles-forloss. He also accounted for two pass breakups, 1.5 sacks, two fumble recoveries, and one forced fumble
- ▶ Career-high 13 tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss and a sack against UNLV and had 10 tackles against Wyoming.

DARIUS THE DESTROYER

- ▶ As a true freshman last year, linebacker Darius Muasau was thrust into an expanded role mainly due to injuries in the linebacker unit.
- ▶ The Mililani native more than delivered. He was a breakout star on both defense and special teams by finishing with 61 tackles, good for third on the team.
- ► Muasau played in all 15 games with four starts at linebacker and was named the team's Dick Tomey Special Teams MVP.
- ▶ Tallied a season-high 11 tackles in a win over Army and had nine tackles and two fumble recoveries against Fresno State.

NO FLY ZONE

- ▶ Senior Cortez Davis returns this season after an impactful 2019 season, his first wearing the green and white. The junior college transfer slid into the starting cornerback role and racked up a team-best 13 break-ups and earned all-Mountain West honorable mention honors.
- ▶ The Decatur, Ga., native returned his lone interception for a touchdown to help seal a pivotal win at UNLV.
- ▶ Accounted for 53 tackles, including 44 solo and 3.5 tackles-for-loss. Posted season-highs of seven wrap-ups and five pass breakups versus San José State.

PREMIERE PLAYMAKERS

- ▶ UH's secondary returns three safeties who have made a combined 42 career starts.
- ▶ With his ability to roam the entire field, junior safety Khoury Bethley is one of UH's top defensive players. He led the team with 83 tackles in 2019 and had two interceptions in UH's season-ending Hawaii Bowl win over BYU.
- ▶ Safety Eugene Ford has started 25 games since his freshman campaign and he's now entering his senior season as one of the unquestioned leaders of the squad.
- ▶ Kai Kaneshiro snagged a team-high three interceptions playing both nickelback and safety last season and returned one for a touchdown against Central Arkansas.

'BOW BITES

- ▶ Sophomore QB Chevan Cordeiro, who backed-up former Alabama and current Miami Dolphins quarterback Tua Tagovailoa at Honolulu's Saint Louis School, continues the school's tradition of FBS QBs which also includes Marcus Mariota (Oregon), Jeremiah Masoli (Oregon/Ole Miss), Timmy Chang (UH), Jason Gesser (Washington State), and Darnell Arceneaux (Utah). Washington State QB Jayden DeLaura is also a Saint Louis alum.
- ▶ Senior WR Jared Smart's father Keith is famously known for hitting the game-winning shot in the 1987 NCAA Championship game.
- ▶ Junior RB **Hekili Keliiliki**, who is of Hawaiian descent, went to high school in Arkansas and is fluent in Mandarin after serving a two-year mission in Brisbane, Australia. He is UH's nominee for the Wuerffel Trophy, which is known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service." Keliiliki is a double major in biology and Chinese; is an Eagle Scout; and serves on the school's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.
- ▶ Senior OL Taaga Tuulima joined the program as a preferred walk-on in 2016 and is now in his third year as the starting center. He is a mechanical engineer major who is on track to graduate in December. He enjoys playing the saxophone (tenor) and singing.
- ▶ North Texas transfer WR Rico Bussey played three seasons for the Mean Green and was a two-time Biletnikoff Award Watch List member. As a junior in 2018, he ranked eighth nationally in touchdown catches and 32nd in receiving yards and earned first-team all-Conference USA honors.
- ▶ Backup QB Kamali'i Akina's older brother Kainoa played quarterback for UH (2003-05) and father Duane is a 40-year veteran coach who served as an assistant at UH (1983-85) and currently coaches at Stanford. "Kama" played for Todd Graham at Arizona State, where he redshirted in 2016.
- Junior WR Dior Scott was prominently featured in Netflix's "Last Chance U." series this summer. Scott won viewers over with his grit and resolve as he battled homelessness, bouts of anxiety, and a fractured relationship with his father, all the while starring on the field for Laney College as a receiver and emergency quarterback during the 2019 season.
- ▶ Senior WR **Melquise StovalI**'s younger brother Melguan is a sophomore receiver for Mountain West rival Nevada. Melquise did not play in UH's win over the Wolf Pack last season while Melquan had one catch for five yards in that game.
- ▶ Junior DB **Noa Kamana** comes from a football-playing family as his father Carter (Michigan State), brother Tim (Wyoming), grandfather John (USC), and uncle John Jr. (USC) all played collegiate football.
- Navy transfer DL Alema Kapoi's cousin is UFC champion Max Holloway. In addition, his brother Micah played football at Wisconsin and mother Patti (Sua) played softball at UH and was the 1991 Jack Bonham Award recipient.

AUSSIE BOOMER

- ▶ Senior Stan Gaudion returns for his final season at UH. The Melbourne, Australia native currently ranks No. 7 all-time in UH history with a 41.08 career yards per punt average. In 129 career punts, he has only two touchbacks.
- ▶ Gaudion continues a long line of Australian punters that includes Scott Harding (2011-14), Alex Dunnachie (2009-12) and Mat McBriar (2000-02), who went on to a 11-year NFL career, most notably with the Dallas Cowboys.

BOUNCEBACK KIDS

- ▶ A total of eight players began their careers at FBS programs before making their way to UH -Kamali'i Akina (Arizona State), Rico Bussey (North Texas), Aaron Cephus (Rice), Michael Eletise (Arizona), Alema Kapoi (Navy), Adam Stack (Oregon), Melquise Stovall (California), and Isaiah Tufaga (Oregon State).
- ▶ Three others played at FCS programs prior to UH — Cortez Davis (Chattanooga), Eliki Tanuvasa (Eastern Illinois), and Calvin Turner (Jacksonville).

ALL IN THE FAMILY

- ▶ The 2020 squad features four second-generation Warriors - Jaden Allen (father Gary, 1978-81); Kalani and Kila Kamakawiwo'ole (Kila, 2002-05); and Elias Wong (Hauoli, 1995).
- ▶ UH is one of only eight teams in the nation to have at least three sets of brothers on its roster. The brothers are: Kalani and Kila Kamakawiwo'ole; Darius and Sergio Muasau; and Blessman and Maurice Ta'ala.
- ▶ Four others have older brothers who once suited up for UH: Kamali'i Akina (Kainoa), Andrew Choi (Zeno), Kamuela Borden (brothers Kawika & Noah), and Justus Tavai (Jahlani). Borden's sister Anika also competed for UH's track and field team.

- ▶ The Warriors own one the most diverse squads in the country. UH has players from 15 different states, encompassing five time zones (Hawaiian, Pacific, Mountain, Central and Eastern time).
- More than half of the 115-man roster hails from Hawai'i (45) and California (32). UH also features players from American Samoa (8), Australia (1), and Canada (1).

JUST LIKE OLD TIMES

- ▶ Three former Warriors are on the coaching staff — defensive coordinator Victor Santa Cruz, cornerbacks coach Abe Elimimian and defensive quality control coach Kim McCloud.
- ▶ Santa Cruz, in his first season as a UH coach, played linebacker for the 1992 squad that captured a WAC title and defeated Illinois in the Holiday Bowl.
- ▶ Elimimian enters his sixth season on the staff after a playing career that saw him earn first-team all-conference honors at cornerback and play in three bowl games.
- ▶ McCloud makes his way back to Honolulu after serving under former Rainbow Warrrior turned head coach Dino Babers at Syracuse. McCloud four-year career (1987-90) as a Warrior defensive back included a trip to the 1989 Aloha Bowl.

UH ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

- ▶ UH has made 110 all-time appearances on national TV and owns a 27-81-2 (.255) record.
- ▶ The Warriors have won 7 of their last 15 on national TV dating back to last season including a 4-4 mark in 2019. Prior to last season, Hawai'i was 2-36 in their last 38 games.

TROPHY GAMES

- ▶ UH will play three of its four rivalry trophy games this season having control of all three trophies.
- ▶ UH will bring the Paniolo Trophy to Laramie for a match-up against Wyoming, Oct. 30. Hawai'i reclaimed the trophy in 2018 after a 17-13 victory in Honolulu.
- ▶ UH holds possession of the Dick Tomey Legacy Trophy after a 42-40 win over San José State last season. The teams are scheduled to meet Dec. 5 in San José.
- ▶ UH will look to retain the Island Showdown Trophy with a match-up against UNLV, Dec. 12 in Honolulu. The Warriors have won the last two meetings in the series.

ON THE CONTINENT

- ▶ Since 2016, UH is 10-15 (.400) in road/neutral site games and 9-7 (.562) in MW road games.
- ▶ Comparatively in the eight seasons prior, UH went 11-37 (.229) in road/neutral site games and 9-23 (.281) in league contests.

HAWAI'I IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- ▶ Hawai'i enters its ninth season in the Mountain West in 2020.
- ▶ UH owns a 19-45 (.297) all-time MW mark 9-23 (.281) in home games and 10-22 (.313) in road games.
- ▶ Since the conference moved to two divisions in 2013, UH is 13-22 against the West and 5-16 versus the Mountain.

'BOWS IN THE PROS

- ▶ A total of seven former Rainbow Warriors are currently on NFL rosters — S Trayvon Henderson (Cincinnati), WR Marcus Kemp (Kansas City), C Leo Koloamatangi (New York Jets), P Rigo Sanchez (Indianapolis), LB Jahlani Tavai (Detroit), WR John Ursua (Seattle), and WR JoJo Ward (Arizona). Only Sanchez and Tavai are on active rosters.
- WR Keith Kirkwood (Carolina) began his career at UH before transferring to Temple.

OTHER NOTABLES

- ▶ UH has the second longest streak in the country at 145 games without allowing a punt block behind Auburn (147). UH last had a punt blocked against Notre Dame in 2008.
- ▶ UH led the nation with six different 100-yard receivers last season.
- ▶ UH is coming off its first back-to-back winning seasons in more than a decade.
- ▶ UH seeks its third straight winning season. which was last accomplished when UH had four straight such seasons from 2001-04.
- ▶ UH enters its ninth season in the Mountain West and will look to defend its 2019 West Division title. UH finished second or better in the West Division in three of the last four years.

COACHING STAFF



TODD GRAHAM

Head Coach; 1st Season at Hawai'i Overall Record: 95-61 (12 seasons)

- ▶ Formally introduced as UH's 24th head coach on January 22, 2020.
- ▶ 12 years of head coaching experience at the FBS level, most recently with Arizona State.
- ▶ Led the Sun Devils to five bowl appearances in six years.
- ▶ Complied 46 wins, the most in a six-year span in ASU history and was third all-time in wins.
- ▶ Only head coach to lead ASU to bowl eligibility in each of his first four seasons and his five bowl appearances is second most in school history.
- ▶ Twelve of Graham's former assistant coaches went on to head coaching positions. Eight are current head coaches including Gus Malzahn (Auburn), Mike Norvell (Florida State), Jay Norvell (Nevada), Billy Napier (Louisiana), Chris Ball (Northern Arizona), Chip Lindsey (Troy), Jake Spavital (Texas State), and Ryan Silverfield (Memphis).
- ▶ Was also head coach at Pittsburgh, Tulsa, and Rice
- Nine all-time bowl appearances and has led 10 of 12 teams to bowl eligibility.
- ▶ Won 10 or more games in five of his 12 seasons.
- Finished nationally ranked three times, including a No. 12 ranking in 2014.
- ▶ Won four conference divisional titles.
- Named conference Coach of the Year twice.
- ▶ Led Rice to its first bowl game in 45 years in first season as head coach.
- ▶ His Tulsa teams led the nation in total offense in consecutive years in 2007 (543.9 ypg) and 2008 (569.9) and ranked in the top six in scoring three times, averaging better than 40 points per game.
- ▶ His teams have averaged 36.5 points per game over 12 years, while his ASU squads scored 50 or more points 16 times.
- ▶ Coached the only team in NCAA history to boast a 5,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher, and three 1,000-yard receivers in a single season (Tulsa, 2007).
- ▶ During his tenure at ASU, was second in the nation in sacks per game (3.10) and tackles-for-loss (7.7) per game, trailing just Clemson.
- ▶ The Sun Devils scored 20 defensive touchdowns during his tenure (16 interception returns; four fumble returns) and forced 143 turnovers, including 91 interceptions which ranked 10th in the nation.
- ▶ While at ASU, his student-athletes garnered 51 Pac-12 all-conference honors while 30 were either selected in the NFL Draft or signed free agent contracts.

- ▶ Three former Rainbow Warriors are on the coaching staff defensive coordinator **Victor Santa Cruz**, cornerbacks coach **Abe Elimimian** and defensive quality control coach **Kim McCloud**.
- **Santa Cruz**, in his first season as a UH coach, played linebacker for the 1992 squad that captured a WAC title and defeated Illinois in the Holiday Bowl. He is Division II Azusa Pacific's all-time winningest coach with an overall record of 84-69 in 14 seasons.
- ▶ **Elimimian** enters his sixth season on the staff after a playing career that saw him earn first-team all-conference honors at cornerback and play in three bowl games. His younger brother Solomon (2005-08) is UH's all-time tackles leader and a veteran CFL linebacker, who was the league's Most Outstanding Player in 2014.
- ▶ Quarterbacks coach **G.J. Kinne** was a three-year starter for Tulsa and threw for 9,472 yards and 81 touchdowns and was named 2010 Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year. He led the Golden Hurricane to a 2010 Hawai'i Bowl victory over the Rainbow Warriors.
- ▶ Co-Defensive Coordinator and linebackers coach **Jacob Yoro**, who joined the program in 2017, is the lone Hawai'i native. Yoro prepped at nearby powerhouse Saint Louis School under legendary high school coach and former UH assistant Cal Lee.
- ▶ Wide Receivers coach **Brennan Marion** remains the NCAA record holder in yards per catch (31.9), which he set in 2007.
- ▶ Running backs coach **Bo Graham** is head coach Todd Graham's eldest son. The younger Graham has coached with his father at Rice, Tulsa, Pittsburgh, and Arizona State.
- ▶ Prior to going into coaching, inside receivers coach **Tony Hull** spent two years working as an engineer with NASA.
- **Sam Bennett**, the team's offensive line coach, is the son of long-time collegiate coach Phil Bennett, who was once SMU's head coach.
- **Kim McCloud** makes his way back to Honolulu after serving under former Rainbow Warrrior turned head coach Dino Babers at Syracuse. McCloud four-year career (1987-90) as a Warrior defensive back included a trip to the 1989 Aloha Bowl.
