2025 FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



GAME #1 - STANFORD

GAME STORYLINES

- ▶ UH will open the season against an Autonomous Four opponent for the fourth time in the last five seasons and fifth time since 2019.
- ▶ UH has a 4-4 all-time record in Week 0 including a 2-1 mark at home.
- ▶ UH will host a Week 0 game for the third time under head coach Timmy Chang (2022 vs. Vanderbilt, L, 10-63; 2024 vs. Delaware State, W, 35-14).
- ▶ Hawaii is 64-39-5 (.616) all-time in season openers, including a 31-30-1 mark against collegiate opponents and a 22-20-1 record at home.
- ▶ UH's last wins over a Power Conference team were against the then-Pac-12's Arizona and Oregon State in back-to-back weeks to open the 2019 season.
- ▶ UH and Stanford last met in Honolulu in Week 1 of the 2023 season (Sept. 1) with the Cardinal winning 37-24.
- ▶ Stanford leads the series, 4-0, with all four games played in Honolulu. The teams are scheduled to meet again in 2026 and 2030, both in Stanford, Calif.
- ▶ In the Division I era, the August 23 opening date marks the program's earliest start, topping the August 24 date in 2019 and 2024. UH's all-time record in the month of August is 8-11.
- ▶ The game marks UH's first-ever against an ACC opponent. Hawaii previously played five current ACC teams prior to their ACC membership with a 7-9 all-time record against those teams (0-1 vs. Boston College; 2-3 vs. California; 1-0 vs. Pittsburgh; 4-1 vs. SMU; 0-4 vs. Stanford).
- ▶ Head coach **Timmy Chang** begins his fourth season at his alma mater, where he has compiled an 13-25 career mark and 8-15 in Mountain West play.
- ▶ Chang has a 0-6 record against Autonomous Four conference teams.
- ▶ WR **Jackson Harris** played in nine games over two seasons at Stanford before transferring to UH. Harris redshirted in 2023 and played in six games last season. DL **Alden McComber**'s brother is Stanford freshman LB Landon McComber.
- ▶ This season marks the fifth that Hawaii will play its home games at the temporary, on-campus Clarence T.C. Ching Complex. UH has a 15-12 all-time record at Ching Complex. The future home of the Rainbow Warriors, the new Aloha Stadium, is projected to open in 2029.

TEMPORARY HOME STADIUM

UH began playing its home games on-campus at the retrofitted Clarence T.C. Ching Athletics Complex in 2021. The stadium increased its capacity to 15,194 in 2023 after holding 9,000 in 2021-22. Previously, Hawai'i played its home games at Aloha Stadium, which was shuttered at the conclusion of the 2020 season. UH had an all-time record of 211-145-4 in 46 seasons at Aloha Stadium.

INTERVIEW POLICY

The UH Sports Media Relations Office abides by federal law pertaining to the releasing of injury information. We will not disseminate any information about a student-athletes' injury without written consent. The only information given to the media will be if a student-athlete is "probable," "questionable," or "doubtful" to play. However, the student-athlete may release information about his/her injury.

WE ARE THE "RAINBOW WARRIORS"

Hawai'i's men's team nickname is the "Rainbow Warriors" while the women's teams are referred to as "Rainbow Wahine." The word "Wahine" (pronounced wah-HEE-nay) means woman in the Hawaiian language. The rainbow has been part of the nickname since 1923 and Warriors were first adopted in 1974.

WHAT'S AN 'OKINA?

What's that punctuation mark in the word Hawai'i? In the Hawaiian language, it's called an 'okina, which translated literally in English means separator. Phonetically it is referred to as a glottal stop, similar to the sound that would be made in the English oh-oh. The 'okina is actually a letter in the Hawaiian language and typed out looks like a backwards, inverted apostrophe. The practice of the UH Sports Media Relations office is to use the 'okina in all Hawaiian words in which they occur.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Head coach Timmy Chang and select players will be available in a post-game press conference following the 10-minute cooling-off period in the Lecture Hall.

TEAM NOTES

SEASON OPENERS

- ▶ UH is 64-39-5 (.616) all-time in season openers, including a 31-30-1 mark against collegiate opponents and a 22-20-1 record at home.
- ▶ UH snapped a three-game season-opener losing streak after a 35-14 win over Delaware State last season in Honolulu.
- ▶ In the Division I era, the August 23 opening date marks the program's earliest start, topping the August 24 date in 2019 and 2024.
- ▶ This season marks the ninth time UH will play in Week 0 and fourth time hosting.
- ▶ UH has a 4-4 mark in Week 0 including a 2-1 mark at home.

HAWAII vs. THE ACC

- ▶ This week's match-up marks the first-ever against an ACC opponent however Hawai'i has played five teams prior to their membership.
- ▶ Hawai'i holds a 7-9 (.438) all-time record against those teams (0-1 vs. Boston College; 2-3 vs. California; 1-0 vs. Pittsburgh; 4-1 vs. SMU; 0-4 vs. Stanford).
- ▶ UH's last win over a current ACC team was against SMU in 2002, while both were members of the Western Athletic Conference.

HAWAII vs. POWER CONFERENCES

- ▶ Hawai'i will play a Power Conference team for the sixth consecutive year (not counting the shortened 2020 COVID-19 season).
- ▶ UH's last wins over a Power Conference team was against the then-Pac-12's Arizona and Oregon State in back-to-back weeks in 2019.
- ▶ Since that win over Oregon State, UH has dropped its last nine games against Power Conference teams. (UH defeated BYU in 2019 and Houston in 2020 when both were non-Power Conference teams)
- ▶ Since 2003, UH has 12 wins over Power Conference teams, 11 of which occurred at home.

NATIONAL TELEVISION

- ▶ UH will make five appearances on national television this season, including its 10th all-time appearance on a network station for the Aug. 23 season-opener against Stanford on CBS. It marks the program's second appearance in the last two seasons on network television and fourth in the last two decades.
- ▶ UH will also make its first-ever appearance on TNT with a road game at Arizona, Aug. 30. UH was featured on sister station WTBS back in 1982 (at New Mexico).
- ▶ Hawai'i will also appear on the FOX Networks twice — Sept. 27 at Air Force and Nov. 21 at UNLV and on CBS Sports Network for the Nov. 1 game at San José State.
- ▶ UH and UNLV meet on national television for the second straight year. Of the four such meetings, this will be the third held in Las Vegas.
- ▶ UH and San José State will square off for just the second time on national TV as Mountain West opponents.
- ▶ Hawai'i has dropped its last 15 games on national television dating back to 2021.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- ▶ UH will play a 12-game schedule for the second consecutive year and third time since 2017 (not counting 2020 COVID season). Five opponents played in bowl games last season.
- ▶ Hawai'i will play half of its schedule (6 games) by the end of September then will have three bye weeks in the second half of its schedule (Weeks 6, 9, 12).
- ▶ UH will play an FCS opponent for the 17th time in the last 19 years when it hosts Portland State, Sept. 13. The Warriors have won their last 22 games against FCS opponents. Ironically, Hawai'i's last loss to an FCS team was against Portland State in 2000.
- ▶ Longtime rivals UH and Fresno State will play Sept. 20 in Honolulu, the earliest meeting since 1966 (Sept. 17, 1966). Fresno State is UH's longest standing rival with 56 all-time meetings.
- ▶ Along with Fresno State, UH will play Colorado State, San Diego State, and Utah State for the final time as Mountain West members as the teams will move to the Pac-12 following this season.
- ▶ UH will look to snap losing streaks to Utah State (8 games), San Diego State (5 games), San José State (4 games).

TROPHY GAMES

- ▶ UH will play all four of its rivalry trophy games in 2025 for the second time in the last three seasons — Kuter Trophy (at Air Force), Dick Tomey Legacy Trophy (at San José State), Island Showdown Trophy (at UNLV), and Paniolo Trophy (vs. Wyoming).
- ▶ UH also played all four of its rivalry trophy games in 2023, marking the first time in program history the team played all four in the same season.
- ▶ UH currently has possession of one rivalry trophy, the **Kuter Trophy** by virtue of a 27-13 win over Air Force in 2023 in Honolulu.

PRESEASON PICKS

- ▶ WR **Pofele Ashlock** and **Nick Cenacle** were both named to the preseason all-Mountain West team as selected by the league's media, marking the first time UH had multiple selections since 2021.
- ▶ UH was picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Preseason Poll behind preseason favorite Boise State, UNLV, San José State, Colorado State, Fresno State, and Air Force.
- ▶ At least two national publications released its preseason all-MW teams that included several Rainbow Warriors.

HAWAII' I IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- ▶ Hawai'i enters its 14th season in the Mountain West in 2025.
- ▶ UH is 34-69 (.330) all-time in the MW — 20-33 (.377) at home and 14-36 (.280) on the road.
- ▶ Hawai'i has appeared in one Mountain West Championship game during the 2019 season.
- ▶ UH tied for fifth in the Mountain West standings last season at 3-4 after being picked to finish No. 9 in the preseason rankings.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME

- ▶ The 2025 season marks UH's fifth home season at the Clarence T.C. Ching Complex, which has a seating capacity of 15,194.
- ▶ UH is scheduled to move into the new Aloha Stadium in 2028. The old Aloha Stadium served as Hawai'i's home stadium from 1975-2020.
- ▶ UH has a 15-12 (.556) all-time record in Ching Complex. Hawai'i went 4-2 in its inaugural season of 2021; finished 3-4 in 2022; and were 4-3 each of the past two seasons.
- ▶ Under head coach Timmy Chang, UH is 11-10 at home, including 6-6 in conference games.

GAME 1 - STANFORD

ROAD WARRIORS

- ▶ For the second straight season, UH will play five road games.
- ▶ UH will total nearly 29,600 air miles in 2025 with its longest trip to Denver, Colo. (6,720) for a pair of games at Air Force and Colorado State.
- ▶ The most miles UH travelled in a season was 46,568 in 2016, that included trips to Sydney, Australia (vs. California) and Ann Arbor, Mich., in back-to-back weeks.

OFFENSE NOTES

FRESHMAN SENSATION

- ▶ In his lone start last season in the regular season finale against New Mexico, QB **Micah Alejado** set new UH freshman records for passing yards (469) and passing touchdowns (5).
- ▶ Alejado was the first Hawai'i player ever to throw for 450+ yards and rush for 50+ yards in a game. He was the only FBS player to reach those marks in a game last season. In addition, his 523 yards of total offense were the second most nationally last season.
- ▶ Alejado's 469 yards passing were the most by a UH quarterback since Cole McDonald's 493 yards in the 2019 Hawai'i Bowl and his five passing TDs were the most since McDonald threw five versus Duquesne in 2018.
- ▶ Alejado has not thrown an interception in a regulation game since his junior year at Bishop Gorman High School.

DEFENSE NOTES

EXPERIENCED SECONDARY

- ▶ Despite losing all-Mountain West first team cornerback Cam Stone, many key players from UH's secondary returns in 2025.
- ▶ Cornerback **Virdel Edwards II**, nickelback **Elijah Palmer**, and safeties **Peter Manuma**, **Justin Sinclair**, and **Kilinahe Mendiola-Jensen** return and are among a secondary that has a combined 99 career starts.
- ▶ Manuma has been a staple since his true freshman season of 2022 and last year ranked fourth on the team with 43 tackles (31 solo) with three pass break-ups and one forced fumble.
- ▶ The secondary had six of the team's seven interceptions last season and combined for 35 pass breakups.

AUSSIE, AUSSIE, AUSSIE

- ▶ P **Billy Gowers** follows a long line of punters from Australia for the Rainbow Warriors.
- ▶ Other Australian punters in recent UH history include Mat McBriar (2000-02), Alex Dunnachie (2009-12), Scott Harding (2011-14), Stan Gaudion (2017-20), and Lucas Borrow (2024).
- ▶ McBriar enjoyed an 11-year NFL career, most notably with the Dallas Cowboys.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

VETERAN LINE-UP

- ▶ UH is tied for third nationally with two seventh-year players — CB **Virdel Edwards II** and DL **De'Jon Benton**.
- ▶ Edwards, who is in his fourth season in Manoa, redshirted in 2024 and appeared in 24 games over the 2022-23 seasons, including 22 starts at cornerback. He previously spent three seasons at Iowa State.
- ▶ Benton is in his first season at UH after transferring from New Mexico, where he spent one season. Previously, he appeared in 35 games in five seasons at USC.
- ▶ UH is tied with Mississippi State with five players, who've played 6+ seasons which is tied for 11th nationally.

SPANNING THE GLOBE

- ▶ UH's roster features players from five different countries — United States (99), Australia (1), Canada (1), Japan (1), and Samoa (1) — and one U.S. territory — American Samoa (5).
- ▶ Besides Hawai'i with 47 players, the rest of the 99 players from the U.S. come from 12 other states — California (21), Nevada (7), Texas (5), Arizona (4), Ohio (3), Washington (3), Florida (2), Georgia (2), Utah (2), Louisiana (1), North Carolina (1), and Tennessee (1).

HAWAII'S TEAM

- ▶ As the only Division I university in the state of Hawai'i, UH's teams prides itself as representing the entire state which is evident in the football team's use of the island chain on the left side of its helmet.
- ▶ UH began using the island chain decal on its helmet during the 2018 season. Days before its season-opener at Colorado State, a tropical storm headed toward the Hawaiian Islands. The team donned the decal for the game and has worn it since.
- ▶ The island chain look actually dates back to former record-setting quarterback Colt Brennan in 2007 when, for his love of the 50th state, he dyed the Hawaiian Islands in his hair.

HOMEGROWN

- ▶ UH's roster includes 47 homegrown players from the state of Hawai'i.
- ▶ Among players from Hawai'i high schools, 10 are from powerhouse Saint Louis School followed by Punahou School (6) and Campbell (6).

- ▶ UH leads the nation with the most players from one high school (10, Saint Louis), four of which were from the same graduating class.

NINTH ISLAND PIPELINE

- ▶ UH has started a pipeline with Las Vegas power Bishop Gorman High School with six players on the roster — QB **Micah Alejado**, RB **Cam Barfield**, LB **Giovanni Iovino**, DL **Aiden McComber**, LB **Jamih Otis**, and DB **Elijah Palmer**.
- ▶ Associate head coach and LB coach **Chris Brown** was Bishop Gorman's assistant head coach and defensive coordinator from 2015-21 while QB coach **Chad Kapanui** coached the quarterbacks at Bishop Gorman from 2022-24.
- ▶ UH's roster includes seven players from Las Vegas which includes RB **Christian Vaughn**, who prepped at Desert Oasis High School.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

- ▶ The 2025 squad features seven second-generation Warriors — **Ha'aheo Dela Cruz** (Reggie), **Wynden Ho'ohuli** (Watson, 2000-05), **Tryton Keli'iki** (West, 2003-04), **Zaden Mariteragi** (Rocky Savaigaea, 2006-09), **Landon Sims** (Travis, 1989-92), **Ethan Spencer** (Sean), and **Matagi Thompson** (Afatia, 1998-2000).
- ▶ DB **Makana Meyer**'s great-grandfather Francis played for UH in the 1930s while WR **Josiah Fetui**'s father Caleb played volleyball for UH.
- ▶ Two sets of brothers are on this year's team — **Pofele Ashlock & Jarvis "Dino" Heimuli** and **Jalen & Julian "JuJu" Smith**.
- ▶ Three others have older brothers who once suited up for UH — **Alika Cavaco-Amoy** (Ho'oikaika, 2009-13), **James Milovale** (Mike, 2012-13), **Josh Sagapolutele** (Anthony, 2022-24).

'BOWS IN THE PROS

- ▶ A total of six former Rainbow Warriors are currently in NFL camps, highlighted by ninth-year veteran P **Rigoberto Sanchez** of the Indianapolis Colts.
- ▶ LB **Jahlani Tavai** (New England Patriots) is in his seventh NFL season while OL **Kohl Levao** (New York Jets) and rookie OL **Luke Felix-Fualalo** (Seattle Seahawks) are looking to make their first NFL roster.
- ▶ Two others began their career at UH before transferring — second-year NY Giants LB **Darius Muasau** (UCLA) and second-year Las Vegas Raiders DT **Jonah Lau** (Oklahoma).
- ▶ Several others are currently in the Canadian Football League — OL **Iim Manning** (British Columbia), OL **Dejon Allen** (British Columbia), CB **Cam Stone** (British Columbia), OL **Asotui Eii** (Winnipeg), OL **Micah Vanterpool** (Winnipeg), and DL **Blessman Ta'ala** (Ottawa).

**TIMMY CHANG***Head Coach; 4th Season**Overall Record: 13-25**MW Record: 8-15*

Former record setting quarterback Timmy Chang is the sixth former Rainbow Warrior to head the program, joining Tom Kaulukukui (1946-50), Jim Asato (1962-64), Larry Price (1974-76), June Jones (1999-2007), and Nick Rolovich (2016-19).

Chang was hired as UH's 25th head coach in program history on Jan. 22, 2022. He completed his first season with a 3-10 record which included career win No. 1 against Duquesne.

Chang spent the previous five seasons as the wide receivers and tight ends coach at Nevada, under coach Jay Norvell. He helped direct one of the most potent offensive attacks on the West Coast while the Wolf Pack earned a bowl bid in each of the last four seasons.

Prior to his time at Nevada, Chang had two stints as an offensive coordinator. In 2016, he served as the offensive coordinator at Emory & Henry College in Virginia and also spent two seasons at Jackson State in Mississippi from 2014-15.

Chang first got his coaching start as an offensive assistant at SMU under his collegiate head coach, June Jones, for two seasons assisting with the quarterbacks.

A four-year starter for Hawai'i from 2000-04, Chang set the NCAA's all-time passing (17,072) and total offense (16,910) records. The Honolulu native finished his career with 117 total touchdowns, which ranked third at the time. A two-time Hawai'i Bowl Most Outstanding Player, Chang led UH to three bowl appearances and a program-record 29 wins at quarterback. In his final season as a Warrior, he was a finalist for the Johnny Unitas Award, given to the nation's top senior quarterback.

Following his collegiate career, Chang played professionally in the NFL, CFL, and NFL Europe for four seasons. He retired from pro football in 2009 and returned to Hawai'i to complete his bachelor's degree.

COACHES NOTES

- ▶ **Timmy Chang** is one of three Polynesian head coaches in FBS (Kalani Sitake-BYU and Ken Niumatalolo-San José State). Chang is tied with Colorado State's Jay Norvell as the second-longest tenured coach in the Mountain West behind Air Force's Troy Calhoun.
- ▶ The full-time staff includes five former Warriors, **Chang** (2000-04), LB coach **Chris Brown** (1998-2002), OL coach **Derek Faavi** (2001-05), QB coach **Chad Kapanui** (2000-04) and DT coach **Jordan Pu'u-Robinson** (2012-14). Brown, Faavi, and Kapanui were former teammates of Chang.
- ▶ Kapanui, who joined the staff in January, came from national powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in Las Vegas where he was offensive coordinator and QB coach.
- ▶ Among the extended staff, Chang has previous coaching ties with ST/TE coach **Thomas Sheffield** and General Manager **Matt Chon**, who were both on the same staff at Nevada.
- ▶ RB coach **Anthony Arceneaux** will assume the offensive coordinator duties this season. He joined the coaching staff in 2024.
- ▶ WR coach **Jared Ursua** is the older brother of former UH receiver John Ursua.
- ▶ LB coach **Chris Brown** still owns two UH weightlifting records—bench press (500lbs) and squat (605lbs).
- ▶ DL coach **Jordan Pu'u-Robinson**, a Maui native, spent the 2021 and '22 seasons as a UH graduate assistant and quality control coach, respectively, before briefly taking a full-time job at The Citadel in the spring of 2023. He returned to Hawai'i in summer 2023.
- ▶ DT coach **Jeff Reinebold**, who is in his third stop at Hawai'i after previous stints in 2005-07 and '22, is the veteran on staff with 42 years of coaching experience.
- ▶ DC **Dennis Thurman**, who was part of Deion Sanders' Colorado staff in 2023 prior to joining the staff last season, has 35 years of experience. Previously, he was defensive coordinator at Jackson State from 2020-22, where he guided a Top 10 defense in FCS. The former Dallas Cowboy spent more than half of his coaching career in the NFL where he was a part of four organizations - including two as defensive coordinator (NY Jets and Buffalo Bills). An All-American safety at USC, he was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in January 2025.
- ▶ OL coach **Derek Faavi**, a former UH lineman, has 16 years of coaching experience, including two seasons as an analyst at USC prior to joining Chang's staff in 2024.
- ▶ Asst. OL coach **Winterhawk Leighton**, SAF coach **Nick Locher**, and CB coach **P.J. Minaya** all spent time as graduate assistants for the Rainbow Warriors — Leighton from 2022-23, Locher in 2023, and Minaya from 2020-22.

'BOW BITES

► QB **Micah Alejado** was born and raised in Hawai'i and attended Saint Louis School before moving to Las Vegas at age 14 with his mother to attend Bishop Gorman HS. Also competed in bowling and as a junior, was one of the top in Class 4A. Has two lifetime perfect games, including during the undefeated Southern Regional championship season of 2023. Recently picked up golf and shoots in the 80s.

► At age 29, P **Billy Gowers** is the third oldest player in FBS behind Southern Miss' Jack Murley (30) and Arkansas' Monte Harrison (30). Gowers is a former professional Australian Rules Football player who was recruited by UH out of Prokick Australia. A professional hair stylist who co-founded a barbershop (Zeppelin) in Australia.

► WR **Karsyn Pupunu** of Lahaina, Maui lost four members of his family (uncle, aunt, two cousins) in the devastating Maui wildfires of 2023 that destroyed his hometown. Pupunu's brother Kameryn of the Maui Police Department helped save 15 lives from the fires and the Pupunu family housed more than 30 displaced individuals. A walk-on, Karsyn was awarded a scholarship in December.

► S **Peter Manuma**, who was born in American Samoa and moved to Hawai'i at age 4, lost his mother during the 2022 season from breast cancer. He did not miss a practice or game, and honored her memory by wearing pink gloves and socks. Peter married his high school sweetheart (Relina) in December and the pair welcomed their first child in July.

► RB **Landon Sims** dons the same jersey number (#30) as his famous UH football father, Travis, who was a member of the 1992 Holiday Bowl championship squad. Before the 2023 opener, Landon was awarded a scholarship in a surprise reveal by Travis at a team meeting.

► DB Eli **Matagi Thompson** was named after his uncle Eli Thompson who was committed to UH but passed away his senior year of HS. Fire knife dances for his father's luau company "Tihati Productions."

► PK **Kansei Matsuzawa**, a native of Japan, learned how to kick by watching YouTube videos and learned to speak English by listening to his junior college teammates.

► DE **Jackie Johnson III** and DE **Ka'eo Akana** were teammates at Honolulu's Roosevelt HS. Prior to that, they were teammates at Saint Francis School before the school shut down. After the pandemic wiped out the 2020 high school football season, they both joined the Trench Dawgz, a local full-padded club team.

► TE **Frank Abreu** comes from a family of Frank Abreus. Frank's father and three brothers are all named Frank. His two brothers are also named Frank and he has several cousins named Frank, bringing the total number of Frank Abreus to 10.

► DL **Jamar Sekona**'s uncle is former NFL defensive tackle Haloti Ngata, who most notably won a Super Bowl with the Baltimore Ravens.

► WR **Josiah Fetui** is of royal bloodline. His fifth great grandma was a princess in American Samoa.

► OL **Ezekiel Salanoa**'s grandmother is UH Circle of Honor inductee and former UH volleyball player and administrator Marilyn Moniz.

► TE **Oakie Salave'a**'s father Okland played at Colorado and was a starting defensive tackle on the 1989 Big Eight champion team that finished the regular season undefeated. Oakie's uncle is Joe Salave'a, who played at Arizona and in the NFL for three teams.

► WR **Koa Eldredge** comes from the famous Eldredge 'ohana. His father David "Boy" played baseball at BYU and is the head softball coach at Punahou School. His uncle Pal is the longtime UH baseball TV analyst. His cousin Jordyn is a member of the UH soccer team and brother Kana'i plays football at Utah Tech.

THE RUN-AND-SHOOT

► The most productive offensive scheme in program history is the **Run-and-Shoot**, which Hawai'i used for 16 seasons since 1999.

► UH ran the offense for 13 consecutive seasons under coaches June Jones (1999-2007) and Greg McMackin (2008-11) until Nick Rolovich brought it back for the 2018 & '19 seasons.

► UH finished in the Top 10 nationally in passing in 13 of 16 seasons and led the country in 2002, '06 & '10. UH also led the nation in scoring in 2006 and '07.

► UH is the only school to feature three 1,000-yard receivers in the same season twice – 2018 (JoJo Ward, Jared Smart, Cedric Byrd II) and 2007 (Ryan Grice-Mullen, Davone Bess, Jason Rivers).
