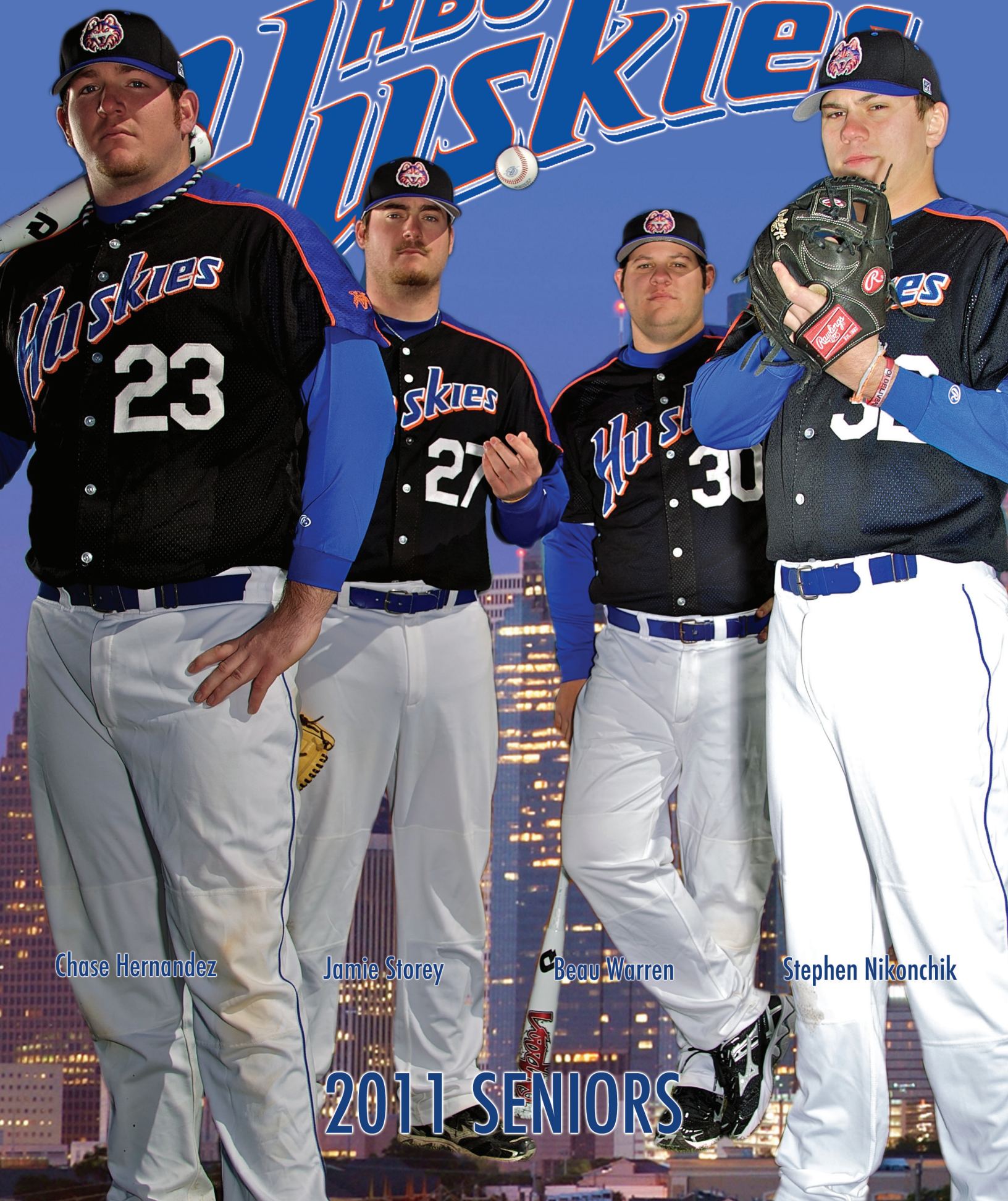

Cousins retired in 2006 after 23 years at Rice University. He joined the Rice staff in 1983 as assistant to long-time SID Bill Whitmore, becoming his successor in 1984. He assumed the title of assistant athletic director in 1987.

A Hobbs, N.M., native, Cousins is a journalism/mass communications graduate of New Mexico State University. After one season in professional baseball, he then joined the sports staff of the El Paso Times, before becoming SID at West Texas State University. He then moved to KFDA-TV in Amarillo as a news reporter/anchor and later sports director.

Cousins came to Houston in 1980, first as editor of Inside Houston Sports magazine and then as editor of Oiler Report, the official newspaper of the Houston Oilers. He added the title of publisher of the paper in 1981.

He and wife Sandra have two children, Craig and Kelli, and three grandchildren, Emily, Charlotte and Sam.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Working Credentials: Requests for press credentials should be directed to the Houston Baptist University Media Relations office. Upon acceptance of application, the appropriate passes will be held for pickup at the Husky Field ticket booth. All working press members will be seated in the press box as space allows.

Radio Broadcasts: Application for broadcasting permission must be made in writing to the HBU Media Relations office at least one week prior to the game. Seating will be provided for no more than three persons. Any station other than the designated official station of each visiting school will be charged a \$100 rights fee.

Player Interviews: All requests for player interviews, either in person or by phone, must be arranged no less than 24 hours in advance through the HBU Media Relations office. No player interviews will be granted on game day prior to the game. HBU players will be available after games following a brief cooling-off period.

Coaches Interviews: Coach Moon will meet with the media after each game following a short post-game meeting with the team.

Jared Moon is in his sixth season at the helm of the HBU baseball program, leading the Huskies to a record of 146-131-1. In the Huskies' first three seasons at the NCAA Division I level, HBU has gone 61-95 against such competition as Baylor, Nebraska, New Mexico State and Oklahoma.

The Huskies went 15-13 and finished third in their first season of Great West Conference play in 2010 and had an overall mark of 28-31. HBU landed five players on the all-conference teams, including Robbie Buller and Chase Hernandez as first-team selections.

In 2007, Moon helped guide the Huskies to arguably the greatest season in school history. HBU finished 44-20 overall, winning the Region VI title for the first time, and advancing to the Mid-South Super-Regional and the NAIA World Series.

After losing the first game of the national tournament in Lew-



iston, the Huskies ran off four straight victories to reach the final four. HBU fell to the eventual national champion Lewis-Clark State College and finished in third place at the season-culminating event in its first and only appearance. It was the deepest post-season run ever for HBU.

He was named the Red River and Region VI Coach of the Year in 2006 after leading the Huskies to a 40-16-1 mark and a seventh Red River Athletic Conference title in his rookie year as skipper of his alma mater.

After a successful playing career in a Husky baseball uniform, Moon spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach during which



time HBU won six conference championships and competed in the NAIA Regional Tournament six times. He also served as recruiting coordinator and recruited 20 players who went on to sign professional contracts and helped coach 25 All-America players and assisted the Huskies in becoming a perennial NAIA national power.

In 12 years, the Huskies won eight conference championships, competed in nine region tournaments and posted a record of 480-252-1. The Huskies were ranked five times in the nation's Top 15 in NAIA batting average and six times in the nation's Top 20 in team ERA during his coaching tenure.

Moon attended Aldine High School where he received All-District and Most Valuable Player honors. He was a three-year letterman for HBU, batting .356 as a junior and setting the HBU single game record for most hits with five.

Moon led the 1994 Huskies to HBU baseball's first-ever national ranking and a runner-up finish in the District playoffs, batting .579 for the tournament.

Moon earned his degrees in history and human kinetics, as well as his master's degree in education at HBU and was inducted into the HBU Sports Hall of Honor in 2008. He enjoys fishing, golf, softball and playing with his two dogs Elvis and Duke. He is married to the former Tonja Vick, and the couple has a daughter, Camryn, who will turn six during the 2011 season.

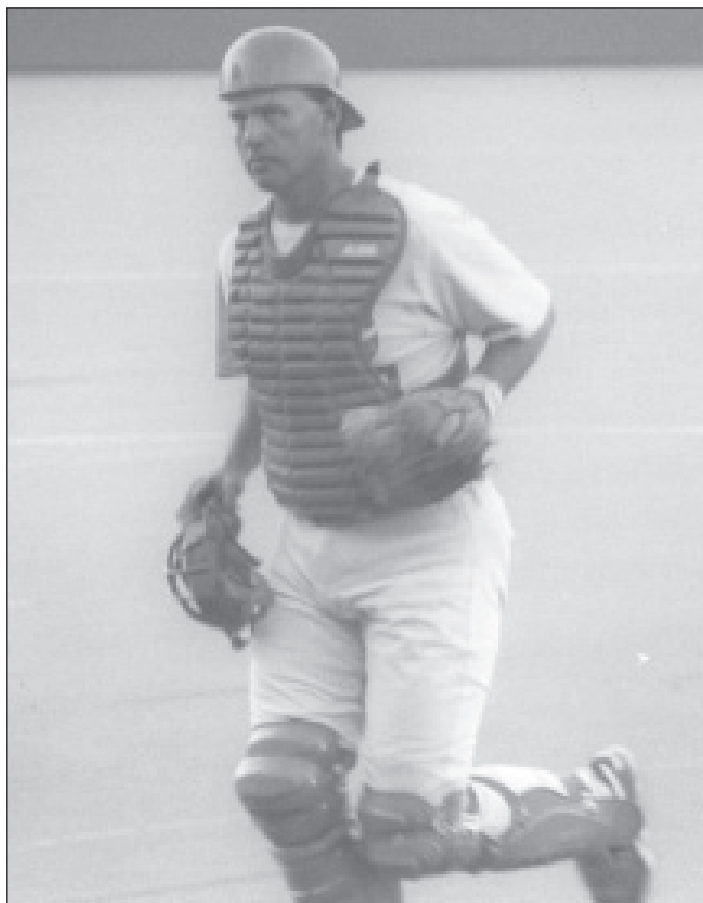

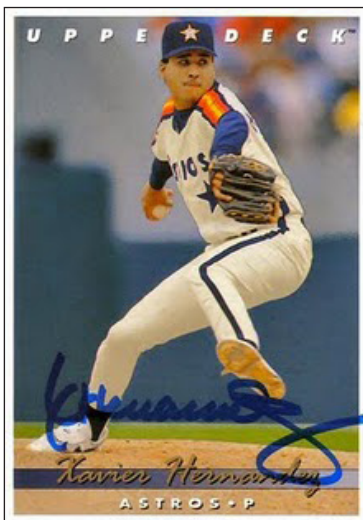
Former HBU assistant and Tampa Bay Rays minor league pitching coach Xavier Hernandez, who spent 10 years in the major leagues as a relief pitcher, returns as assistant baseball coach at Houston Baptist University.

Hernandez was an assistant coach with the Huskies from 1999-2001 before joining the Tampa Bay staff. He earned bachelor's degrees in psychology and sociology from HBU. With the Rays, he was responsible for implementing the organizational pitching program and overseeing development. Hernandez also identified and evaluated potential major league pitching prospects, and in 2008 he won the Player Development Man of the Year award.

Prior to moving to the Durham staff, Hernandez had stints at AA Montgomery and class-A Charleston and Bakersfield. His pitchers have consistently ranked among the best in the league, including 19 shutouts in 2006 at Montgomery.

As a pitcher from 1986-99, Hernandez saw action in 463 major league games with the Houston Astros, Texas Rangers, Cincinnati Reds, New York Yankees and Toronto Blue Jays. He had a career record of 40-35 with 35 saves and a 3.90 ERA, and had 562 strikeouts. Hernandez also played professional winter league baseball in Mexico and Venezuela.

Hernandez and his wife, Deborah, reside in Sugar Land and have four children.





RUSSELL STOCKTON

Assistant Coach

Russell Stockton enters his first season as assistant coach at Houston Baptist University.

Prior to HBU, Stockton spent two seasons in his second stint at the University of Houston, one as assistant coach and as associate head coach in 2010. He played a large role in the success of pitchers Donnie Joseph, the 88th overall draft pick in 2009, and Jared Ray, a 38th-round selection in 2010.

Stockton was the head coach at Texas A&M-Kingsville for 10 seasons, and became the program's all-time winningest coach with a 275-273 record. His final victory came as the Javelinas defeated top-seeded and nationally-ranked Abilene Christian to win the 2008 Lone Star Conference Tournament and advance to the NCAA Division II Tournament. The Javelinas recorded at least 30 wins in four of his last six years and also posted four consecutive 30-plus win campaigns from 2003-06. He was also head coach at Cedar Valley College in Lancaster, Texas, where he earned several coach of the year honors.

Stockton was a four-year letterwinner on the Cougar baseball team under his father, Bragg, who coached the Cougars from 1986-94. He was an infielder for three years as well as a relief pitcher and was a member of two NCAA Regional-qualifying teams. After his playing career, he had his first stint as an assistant at Houston on his father's staff from 1991-94.

Stockton holds a bachelor's and master's degree in kinesiology from Houston. He and his wife, Linda, have five children: Zachary, Lauren, Jacob, Amanda and Peter.





TREVOR RAINEY

Graduate Assistant Coach

Trevor Rainey is in his first year as a graduate assistant coach for the Huskies after playing two seasons at HBU.

Rainey appeared in 48 games, including 27 starts, in his two seasons. He was second on the team with four outfield assists in 2010.

The Woodville, Texas, native transferred to HBU after two seasons at Texarkana College. He was a two-time all-state selection at Woodville High School and was the two-time district MVP in baseball and MVP in football as a senior as well.

2010: Appeared in 57 games and started 56 in right field as a sophomore...Hit .305 with a home run and 35 RBIs...tied for third on the team with 13 doubles and made three outfield assists...had 20 multiple-hit games, including eight with three hits or more...went 3-for-4 with two doubles, an RBI and a run against Concordia (3/16)...went 3-for-5 with a double and two runs scored against New Mexico State (4/1)...was 2-for-5 and belted his first career home run and had a career-high three RBIs against NJIT (4/10)...went 3-for-5 with a double, a triple and tied his career-high with three RBIs against Chicago State (5/1)...had a career-high four hits against Utah Valley (5/21)...was 3-for-5 with two runs and an RBI in the Huskies' victory over Chicago State at the Great West Tournament (5/27).

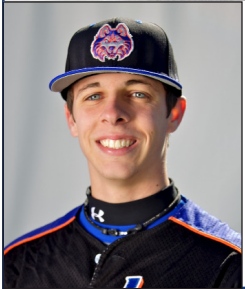

Compliance

The goal of the Athletics Compliance Office is to educate, monitor, and verify NCAA rules compliance with regard to each sport and component within the Athletics Department. The compliance office strives to be proactive with education along with having monitoring systems in place that are effective and user friendly. HBU compliance embraces open communication with faculty, staff, student-athletes and the community at large. It is compliance office's position that all questions and requests for rules interpretations shall be answered in a friendly and timely manner. In addition, it should be known that no rules violation is too minor to be reported. In responding to rule violations, the compliance office will determine whether the violation was incidental or intentional and to what effect the violation will have on the involved coach, student-athlete or administrator.

The compliance office maintains an open-door policy and is designed to be student-athlete friendly. The compliance office functions as an office within the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at Houston Baptist University. It is the mission of the compliance office to provide a service to HBU which is in alignment with the overall mission of the University.

Mission Statement

The HBU Athletics Compliance Office is committed to creating and fostering an atmosphere of compliance throughout the HBU community. Operating with integrity and accountability, the Athletics Compliance Office will educate, monitor and promote all aspects of rules compliance in accordance with NCAA, Great West Conference, and HBU rules and regulations.

Rules & Regulations

Effective institutional management and integrity in intercollegiate athletics through compliance with, and enforcement of, the rules and regulations of Houston Baptist University the NCAA, the Great West Conference, and the standards of fair play and appropriate conduct for student-athletes and institutional representatives.

Amateur Sportsmanship

The call to honesty, integrity, commitment, hard work and social responsibility resounds from the Department's administrators, coaches and student-athletes. Through participation in athletics, student-athletes are provided opportunities to develop essential life skills in leadership, teamwork, discipline, goal setting, respect for self and respect for others, as demonstrated both on and off the field of play.

HBU's Commitment to Rules Compliance

Houston Baptist University has made the commitment to operate and support a Division I athletics program. Along with this commitment is the pledge that the program is administered and operated with the highest level of integrity, respect and regard for all rules and regulations that govern its operation. It is every coach and staff member's responsibility to operate his/her program in full compliance with all NCAA, Great West Conference and Institutional rules and regulations. Ignorance of these regulations cannot be used as an excuse for failure to comply.

Coaches and staff members have an affirmative duty to the following: Knowledge of all NCAA and Great West Conference regulations and policies including but not limited to, recruiting, eligibility, amateur status and sporting behavior, as well as all rules interpretations, observance of all NCAA and Conference regulations and HBU policies. Self-reporting of all known or potential violations to the Assistant Athletic Director Compliance or the Athletic Director. Full cooperation with NCAA, Conference and HBU in all investigations and provision of any of these entities with truthful and complete information

concerning involvement in or knowledge of any violation of NCAA, Conference and regulations.

As a member of the NCAA, Houston Baptist University is accountable for the actions of its boosters and fans. Even the best-intentioned action on a fan's part may be a violation of NCAA rules. Please contact the HBU Athletics Compliance Office if you have any questions concerning what is permissible.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

Who is a prospective student-athlete?

A "prospective student-athlete," better know as a "recruit" or "prospect", is a student who has started classes for the ninth grade, with the exception of men's basketball which is a student who has started classes for the seventh grade. In addition, any younger student-athlete who receives any benefits from the institution would be considered a recruit.

Recruiting

Only coaches and athletic department staff may be involved in the recruiting process. Athletics representatives are prohibited from contacting a prospective student-athlete or members of his/her family by telephone, letter, e-mail, or in person for the purpose of encouraging participation in athletics at Houston Baptist University. This prohibition remains in effect even after the prospect signs a National Letter of Intent (scholarship offer).

NCAA Recruiting Definitions

NCAA Recruiting Calendars

Visiting HBU

An "official visit" is a visit paid in whole or in part by the university and cannot exceed 48 hours in length. A prospect can make a total of five official visits, with a limit of only one per university.

Official Visit Checklist (link to .pdf file)

An "unofficial visit" is a visit made at the prospect's own expense. The university may provide (a) three complimentary tickets to an on-campus athletics event in which the university's team is competing and (b) transportation to view off-campus practice and competition sites within a 30-mile radius. Prospects can make as many unofficial visits as they want.

National Letter of Intent

The National Letter of Intent (NLI) is a binding agreement between a prospective student-athlete and an institution in which the institution agrees to provide a prospective student-athlete who is admitted to the institution and is eligible for financial aid under NCAA rules athletics aid for one academic year in exchange for the prospect's agreement to attend the institution for one academic year. All colleges and universities that participate in the NLI program agree to not recruit a prospective student-athlete once he/she signs an NLI with another college or university. Therefore, a prospective student-athlete who signs an NLI should no longer receive recruiting contacts and calls and is ensured an athletics scholarship for one academic year. The NLI must be accompanied by an institutional financial aid agreement. If the student-athlete does not enroll at that institution for a full academic year, he/she may be subject to specific penalties, including loss of a season of eligibility and a mandatory residence requirement.

Who is a "Representative of Athletic Interests?"

A "representative of the institution's athletics interests" or Booster can be an individual, independent agency, corporate entity or other organization

BOOSTERS

- ◆ Have ever made financial contributions to the athletic department, or a specific team.
- Have contacted, in any manner, students in grades 9-12 regarding Husky athletic programs.
- ◆ Be assisting or to have assisted in providing benefits to enrolled student-athletes or their families.
- ◆ Have provided or arranged summer employment for student-athletes.
- ◆ Have provided benefits to a student-athlete and or their parents
- ◆ Are or ever have been a Husky season ticket holder (NCAA bylaw 13.02.13)
- ◆ According to NCAA rules, once an individual has been identified as an institutional "representative of athletic interests" the individual IS A BOOSTER FOR LIFE!
- ◆ Houston Baptist University is ultimately responsible for the acts of all "representatives of athletic interests" in relation to NCAA rules and regulations.

Important Reminders

- ◆ Boosters cannot be involved in the recruiting process.
- ◆ Only HBU staff members may be involved in the recruiting process. Boosters who are not employed by HBU may not contact a prospect in any way.
- ◆ Boosters may not have any involvement with a prospect during an official or unofficial visit to the HBU campus.
- ◆ Boosters may continue to maintain pre-existing relationships with neighbors and friends who have prospect age children as long as you do not encourage participation in HBU athletics.
- ◆ You may not contact an enrolled student-athlete at another institution for the purpose of encouraging transfer to HBU and participation in our athletic program.
- ◆ Boosters may not provide benefits of any kind to prospects or their families.

Boosters CANNOT:

- ◆ Provide cash or loans in any amount.
- ◆ Sign off or co-sign a note with an outside agency to arrange a loan.
- ◆ Employ relatives or friends of a prospect as an inducement for the enrollment of the prospect at HBU.
- ◆ Provide gifts of any kind (e.g. birthday) or free services (airline tickets, laundry, meals in restaurants).
- ◆ Provide discounts for goods or services.
- ◆ Provide use of an automobile.
- ◆ Provide hospitality or lodging in your home.
- ◆ Provide them transportation within or outside of the campus area. (e.g. from campus to your home, from the airport to campus, to summer job, etc.)
- ◆ Entertain or contact a prospect or prospect's parents on or off campus.

Boosters CAN:

- ◆ Attend high school and junior college athletic events assuming no attempt is made to contact the prospect or his/her coaches.
- ◆ You May attend a public event (high school awards banquet) at which prospects are in attendance. No attempt should be made to recruit the prospect.
- ◆ You May discuss summer employment arrangements with a prospect AFTER he/she has signed a National Letter of Intent.
- ◆ You are permitted to play "pick up" basketball or softball games, continue neighborhood picnics or backyard barbecues and engage in your normal activities with the prospect and their family and friends. Again, you simply are not permitted to discuss the athletic program.
- ◆ Reminders regarding relationships with currently enrolled HBU student-athletes:

DO NOT employ or arrange employment for a prospective or enrolled student-athlete without checking first with the HBU Athletic Department. The department is permitted to make arrangements for summer employment for prospects prior to enrollment as freshmen and to enrolled student-athletes during the summer and semester breaks. Stringent rules apply in these instances and written records must be kept regarding employment.

DO NOT provide transportation for prospects or student-athletes in your employ unless transportation is provided for all employees.

DO NOT provide employment for student-athletes during the academic year without contacting the HBU Athletic Department first. The NCAA has strict rules about the amount and source of outside funds during the academic year.

DO NOT provide a student-athlete or friend discounted clothing, reduced rent, or any other benefits. The NCAA considers these extra benefits and they are specifically prohibited.

DO NOT provide room and/or board or any type of transportation during the summers for a student-athlete with eligibility remaining.

DO NOT provide any payment, expense or loan of an automobile for student-athlete to return home or to any location for ANY reason.

DO NOT provide lodging or transportation costs incurred by friends or family of an enrolled student-athlete to visit campus or attend an away athletic contest.

DO NOT use the name or picture of an enrolled student-athlete to directly advertise, recommend or promote sales or use of a commercial product or service of any kind. Even the sale of a picture of an enrolled student-athlete would jeopardize his/her eligibility.

DO NOT provide awards or gifts to a student-athlete for his or her athletic performance. All awards must conform to NCAA regulations and must be approved by HBU.

DO NOT allow a student-athlete, his/her friends or relatives to use your telephone to make long distance calls even if it is a free call. THIS INCLUDES CELL PHONES!

DO feel free to invite an HBU team for dinner or to meet with a group of alumni in a city where they are competing. The NCAA permits student-athletes, AS A TEAM, to receive special benefits not permitted as individuals. Arrangements for such events can be made in advance with the head coach or Athletic Department.

DR. ROBERT B. SLOAN, JR.

University President

Dr. Robert B. Sloan Jr. is in his fourth year as President of Houston Baptist University, becoming the third president in the school's history. He came to HBU from Baylor University, where he served as both Chancellor and President.

HBU has seen tremendous growth in Sloan's first three years as President. Enrollment has increased, building is happening all over campus and the Huskies have moved back to NCAA Division I. This is all part of Sloan's vision to make HBU one of the premier Christian institutions in the country.

Born in Coleman, Sloan grew up in Abilene before attending Baylor and earning a bachelor of arts degree cum laude, graduating "With Distinction." In his freshman year, Sloan was a member of Baylor's baseball team. He then earned a master of divinity degree magna cum laude from Princeton Theological Seminary before conducting postbaccalaureate research in church history at the University of Bristol, England, and earned the Doktor der Theologie degree insigni cum laude from the University of Basel, Switzerland.

Before returning to Baylor to join the faculty of the Department of Religion, he taught at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and adjunctively at Hardin-Simmons University. He was the first to hold the position of chair of the George W. Truett School of Evangelism at Baylor and became founding Dean of Truett Seminary in 1993. Two years later, Sloan was named President of Baylor University. Ten years later, in 2005, Sloan was named Chancellor.

While holding a full-time academic position, Sloan served as interim pastor of more than 20 churches throughout Texas and Oklahoma. He has also authored two books, edited several and published more than 50 articles during his career.

Sloan has held memberships in many professional societies and learned organizations. He has held numerous civic positions in the Waco area and has served on the board of Independent Colleges and Universities of Texas, the American Association of Presidents of Independent Colleges and Universities, the Big 12 Athletic Conference Board of Directors, and the Group of 6 (six major athletic conferences). He was inducted into the Little League Hall of Excellence in 1996.

Married to the former Sue Collier, the Sloans have seven children, a daughter-in-law and three sons-in-law: Charissa, Bryan and Amy, Eraina and Bryan, Michael, Alatheia and Justin, Sophia and Mac, and Paul.

They are also the proud grandparents of Robert Bryan Sloan IV and Lucy Larson.

STEVE MONIACI

Director of Athletics

Steve Moniaci became the director of athletics at HBU on Feb. 1, 2010 after serving as interim director since the end of May 2009. In his new role, he will oversee the day-to-day operations of the athletic department while continuing to lead the department in its transition to NCAA Division I. He came to HBU in January of 2007 as the associate director of athletics, after 26 years across town at Rice University.

In nearly two and a half years as the associate director of athletics, Moniaci has been with the Huskies from the beginning of the transition process. He has also assisted in overseeing the operations in the department.

He began his tenure at Rice as the executive director for the Owl Club and director of athletic promotions. He was elevated to assistant athletic director in charge of operations in 1985, associate athletic director in 1997 and rose to the position of senior associate athletic director in 2001, a position he held until 2006.

Moniaci was the administrator at Rice directly responsible for volleyball, baseball, tennis, golf and women's soccer. During his tenure with the Owls, he played an integral role in the success of the baseball team's 11 conference championships and five College World Series appearances, including the 2003 NCAA National Championship.

He was also the administrator responsible for academic advising, sports information, marketing and athletic fund-raising, concessions and facilities maintenance. Moniaci has extensive experience in overseeing facilities renovations and construction. He oversaw renovations to historic Rice Stadium and to Rice Track to accommodate the addition of women's soccer. He also played an important role in the expansion of Rice's Reckling Park.

Moniaci graduated summa cum laude with a bachelor's degree in physical education and a minor in mathematics from Ball State University. He went on to attain his master's degree in education with an emphasis in athletic administration from Ohio University.

Moniaci and his wife, Cathy had two daughters, Alyssa [21] and Andrea [17].



RON COTTRELL

Associate Director of Athletics/ Head Basketball Coach

Ron Cottrell is in his second year as associate director of athletics after serving 16 years as director of athletics for the Huskies. Cottrell worked very closely with HBU President Robert Sloan in leading HBU's transition back to NCAA Division I.

Under Cottrell's leadership, HBU athletics became one of the premier NAIA programs in the country, winning 42 conference championships and competing in national tournaments 32 times.

Cottrell then led the Huskies back into NCAA Division I as a member of the Great West Conference, building on the successes of the past.

In addition to the Huskies' team success under Cottrell, HBU has produced 96 All-America and 62 Academic All-America honorees while

maintaining a graduation rate above 90 percent. Cottrell was honored by his peers as the 2001 NAIA Region Athletics Director of the Year.

Cottrell also has served Houston Baptist University as head men's basketball coach for 18 years and led his last 10 NAIA teams to national championship appearances. He recorded his 300th career victory in 2004-05 and has been named Conference Coach of the Year five times. In 2002-03, Cottrell was chosen Basketball Times National Coach of the Year after leading the Huskies to a 31-3 record and the nation's top ranking. He also was chosen as a coach for USA Basketball in 2006, helping select the U18 team that won the gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship.

A native of Arkansas, Cottrell attended Houston's Westbury High School. After graduating from Westbury, Cottrell attended the University of Arkansas, where he served as a volunteer coach for Nolan Richardson, his mentor, while earning his degree in industrial engineering. He also served as sports director for Fayetteville, Ark., ABC affiliate KTVP-TV. Cottrell then spent a year as an assistant coach at North Dakota State College of Science before returning to Arkansas and joining Richardson's staff as an assistant coach. During Cottrell's years as an assistant at Arkansas, the Razorbacks won two Southwest Conference championships and went to the NCAA tournament three times, culminating with the Hogs' appearance at the 1990 NCAA Final Four.

Cottrell is married to the former Jacque George, director of media relations for the Great West Conference, and they have two daughters: Scottlyn Rose [15] and Sydney-Anne [13]. He also serves as a deacon at Sugar Land Baptist Church.



DR. JOHN YARRINGTON

Faculty Athletics Representative

Dr. John Yarrington, director of the school of music, is in his eighth year as faculty athletics representative for the Huskies and serves as HBU's representative to the NCAA.

Yarrington, who also serves HBU as director of choral studies and a professor of music, received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Oklahoma. He completed the master of sacred music degree at the Union Theological Seminary in New York City and continued his graduate studies back at the University of Oklahoma, completing a doctor of musical arts degree.

**Assistant Director of Athletics/
Compliance & Academics**

David Moss is in his third year as the assistant director of athletics for compliance and academics. He came to HBU after serving the past eight years as co-owner of the Texas Baseball Academy. Moss will handle the day-to-day operation of the compliance department, as well as oversee the advising of HBU's student-athletes.

Before beginning his ownership of the baseball academy, Moss spent 11 years across town at Rice University in several capacities — the final three as the compliance coordinator.

While at Rice, he also served as an assistant baseball coach and assistant academic coordinator followed by a stint as administrative assistant for football operations before becoming compliance coordinator. He also was coordinator of the Rice Baseball Camp.

Head Softball Coach**

Mary-ellen Hall is in her second year as Senior Woman Administrator at HBU. Her duties as SWA are to coordinate and provide support for all woman's sports teams, attend home and away games and conference championships as appropriate to represent the department and participate in the hiring and evaluation of coaches. Hall also disseminates pertinent information to coaches, provides insight and information regarding women's issues and programming at all levels and represents HBU at Great West Conference and NCAA meetings and conventions.

Hall, a 1988 HBU graduate, is also the head softball coach at HBU and the 2011 season will be her 20th at the helm of the program. During her time with the Huskies, she has led HBU to nine NAIA national championship tournament appearances and was the Red River Athletic Conference Coach of the Year every year HBU was a member. In 2005, the Huskies posted the record for number of wins in a season (51) and concluded the season ranked the highest in program history (2nd). She and assistant coach Roger Willhite have been honored as NAIA Southwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year in 1999 and 2005. She has coached 31 All-Americans and 44 Academic All-Americans and has a career record of 639-297.



RUSS RENEAU

**Director of Athletic
Media Relations**

Russ Reneau is in his first year as director of athletic media relations at Houston Baptist University, after spending the one year as assistant director. He oversees the media relations efforts for the department's 15 NCAA Division I sports and is the primary contact for the men's basketball, volleyball, baseball and men's and women's golf programs.

Reneau was the assistant director of athletic media relations and internet coordinator at Baylor from 2003-2006. He served as the contact for volleyball, track & field/cross country, men's and women's golf and worked extensively with the men's and women's basketball programs as the secondary contact. 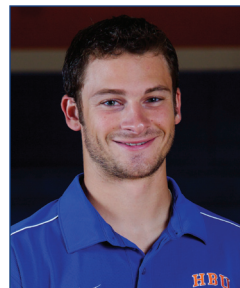


MATT VASQUEZ

Great West Conference

Houston Baptist University is now a member of the Great West Conference. The Great West Conference, which had been a football-only league since its inception in 2004, expanded into an all-sports conference and HBU is one of its seven full-time members.

The Huskies, who compete in 15 NCAA Division I sports, began Great West Conference competition in 2008-09 in men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf and men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field. HBU won the inaugural Great West Conference men's golf championship and hosted the outdoor track and field championships. Baseball, men's and women's basketball, women's soccer, softball and volleyball will commence conference play this season. HBU men's soccer will compete in the Atlantic Soccer Conference until a time when the sport may be added to the Great West lineup.

HBU has captured Great West Conference team titles in women's soccer (2010) and women's golf (2010).

The Great West Conference includes Chicago State University, NJIT, University of North Dakota, University of South Dakota, University of Texas-Pan American and Utah Valley University. 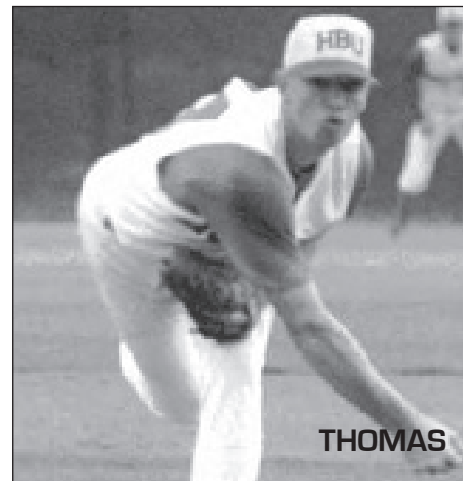

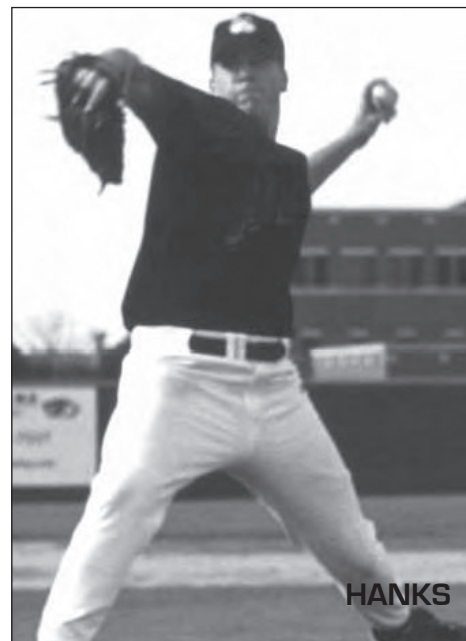
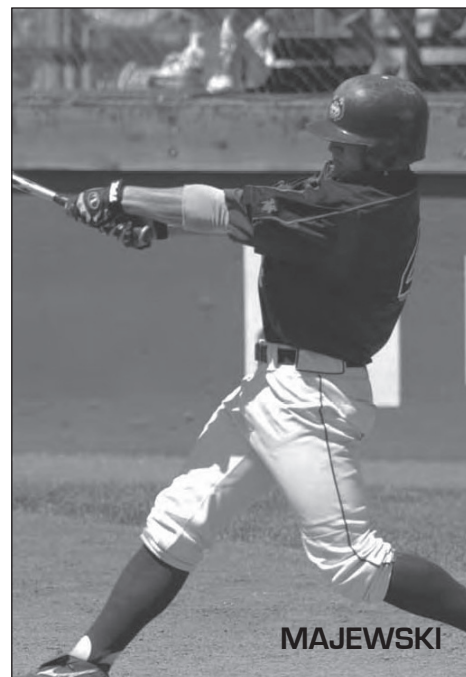

Husky Field

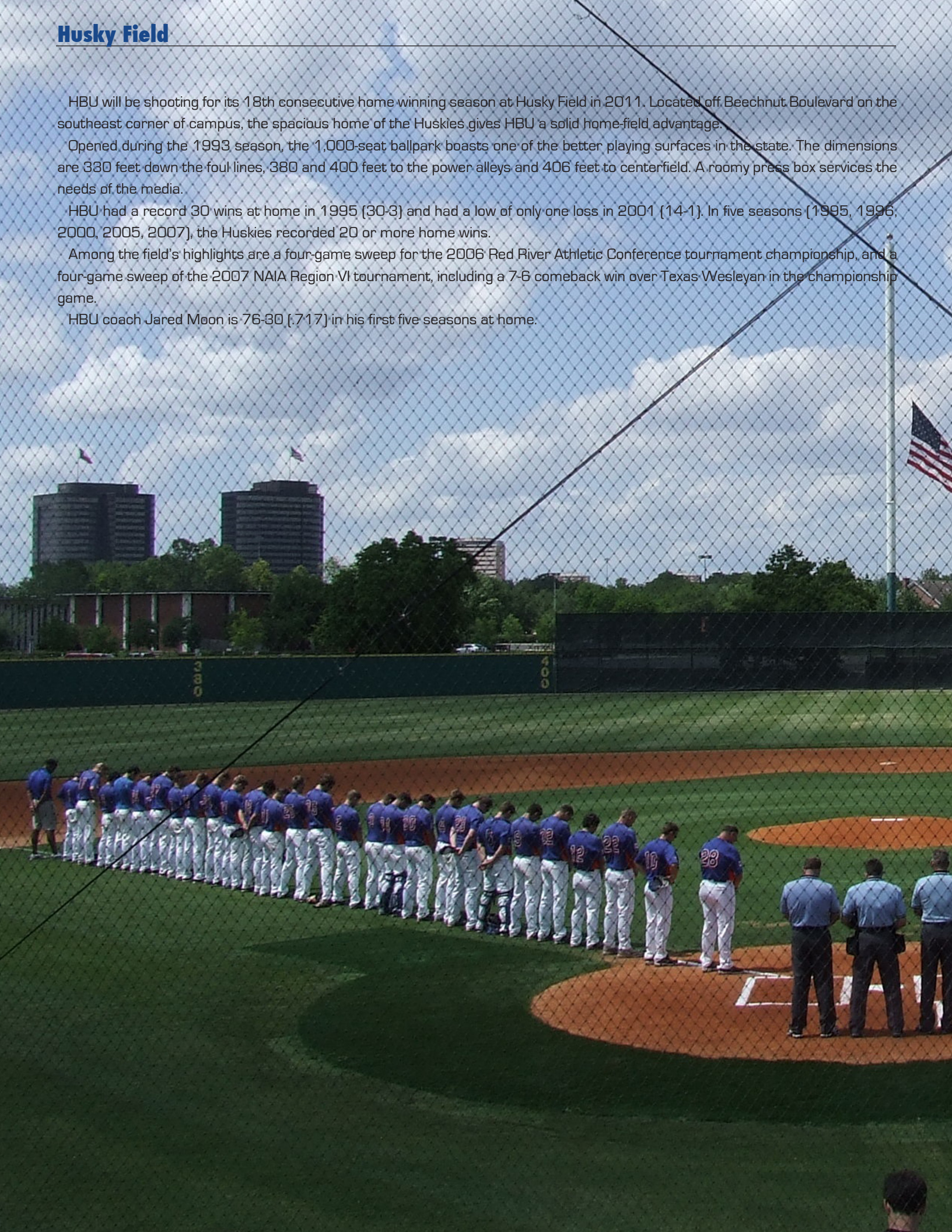
HBU will be shooting for its 18th consecutive home winning season at Husky Field in 2011. Located off Beechnut Boulevard on the southeast corner of campus, the spacious home of the Huskies gives HBU a solid home-field advantage.

Opened during the 1993 season, the 1,000-seat ballpark boasts one of the better playing surfaces in the state. The dimensions are 330 feet down the foul lines, 380 and 400 feet to the power alleys and 406 feet to centerfield. A roomy press box services the needs of the media.

HBU had a record 30 wins at home in 1995 (30-3) and had a low of only one loss in 2001 (14-1). In five seasons (1995, 1996, 2000, 2005, 2007), the Huskies recorded 20 or more home wins.

Among the field's highlights are a four-game sweep for the 2006 Red River Athletic Conference tournament championship, and a four-game sweep of the 2007 NAIA Region VI tournament, including a 7-6 comeback win over Texas Wesleyan in the championship game.

HBU coach Jared Moon is 76-80 (.717) in his first five seasons at home.

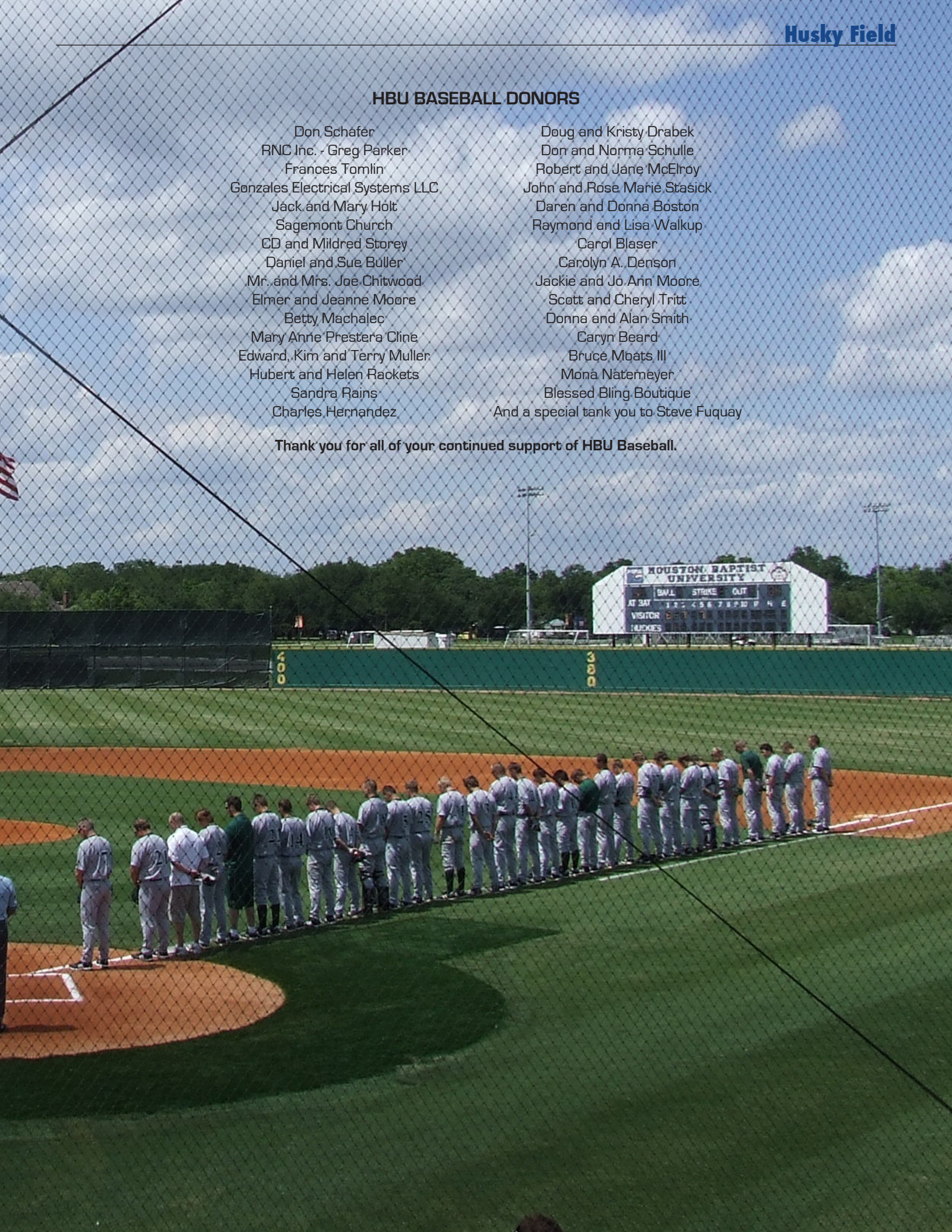
