2004-05 (SOPHOMORE)

Made perhaps the biggest improvement on the team from last season, finishing as the team leader in rebounds (7.9/game, 4th in MAC) and free throw attempts (4.1/game)...second on team in points (9.8/game, 28th in MAC), field goal percentage (55.1), free throws made (2.6/game)...contributed 1.0 assist and 1.0 steal per game...3.3 offensive rebounds per conference game led MAC...named an All-MAC Honorable Mention selection...started in 26-of-29 games...collected a team-high seven double-doubles...posted career-highs in steals (4) and minutes (34) in MAC quarterfinal win over Toledo...named MAC East Division Player of the Week twice...averaged 13.0 points (81.0 percent shooting) and 9.0 rebounds, including her first career double-double, in season-opening Fifth Third MU Classic en route to being named tournament MVP and MAC East POW...earned second POW nod on Jan. 24 after averaging 13.0 points, 10.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists in wins over Ohio and Buffalo...led or tied for team lead in rebounds in 11-of-29 games...reached double-digits in rebounds in five straight games at beginning of 12-game win streak...pulled down team season- and career-high 18 rebounds at Kent State on Jan. 8, tied for the best single-game total in the MAC and the sixth-best rebound game in Marshall history...against No. 17 Maryland on Dec. 30, set career-highs in points (20), field goals (8) and field goal attempts (11)...was named to the Terrapin Classic All-Tournament Team by scoring 14.5 points and grabbing 8.5 rebounds in two games in College Park, Md.

2003-04 (FRESHMAN)

Appeared in 23 games, one start, averaged 8.4 minutes per game...her one start came against West Virginia, where she played a season-high 24 minutes with five rebounds, three points and a season-high two assists...tallied season-highs in points (9), field goals/attempts (4/9), 3-point field goal attempts (4) and rebounds (6) vs. Western Michigan on Jan. 14...ignited a 13-0 MU run over Buffalo in the MAC Tournament's first round with a 3-pointer, seconds after entering the contest from the Herd bench...finished with eight points, two rebounds and an assist in 12 minutes vs. UB...posted five points in eight minutes with a steal


and an assist in quarterfinal win over Kent State...scored six points in collegiate debut, Nov. 21 vs. Morgan State.



2004-05 (SOPHOMORE)

Improved steadily from solid freshman season on both ends of the floor to start 23-of-29 games...upped '03-'04 scoring average by 3.1 points (7.4/game) and rebound average by 3.3 boards (6.6/game)...played perhaps best game of her young career with a 13-point, 13-rebound (both career-highs) effort in MAC quarterfinal win over Toledo...in 2005 MAC Tournament, averaged 10.5 points, 9.5 rebounds (4th in league) and shot team-leading 50.0 percent from the floor (10-of-20)...non-starter for six games, but registered five points, six rebounds, two assists and a block in first start back on Jan. 11 versus West Virginia, catapulting MU to its longest win streak in 33 years (12 games)...remained a starter for the rest of the season...second on team and 12th in MAC in blocked shots with 0.8/game (23 total)...blocked four shots in one game on two occasions, including the Feb. 13 regionally-televised game versus Ball State in which Curry also added 12 points and 12 rebounds...third on team and 13th in MAC in rebounds (6.6/game)...five double-doubles were second most on team and ninth in MAC...posted back-to-back double-doubles twice, versus Robert Morris and Morehead State, then later versus Akron and Toledo...committed team-high 96 fouls with five foulouts.

2003-04 (FRESHMAN)

Placed in starting lineup in 14-of-28 games played, including first 10 games of career...averaged 4.3 points, 3.3 rebounds and 16.8 minutes per game...provided solid, athletic play as a starter and reserve...third on team with 12 blocks (0.4/game)...only player on team to register multiple blocks in at least three consecutive games, posting two blocks versus Ohio, Akron and Buffalo to end MU's home schedule...scored a season-high 11 points in first road game of season at Texas-Pan American on Dec. 19...recorded best performance of season at Central Michigan on Jan. 24, going 5-for-5 (team-best FG percentage with at least 5 FGM) and a season-high eight rebounds and one assist in 73-56 win over the Chips, which snapped a three-game losing skid...on her way to a monumental postseason effort vs. Eastern Michigan before a knee injury forced her from the game...Curry was 3-for-3 (seven points) from the floor, including her first career 3PT FG, with a rebound

and steal in nine minutes in MAC semifinal game prior to injury...went 5-for-8 (10 points) with three boards in Fifth Third MU Classic championship win over High Point, followed up by a 10-point output in the next contest versus Radford on Nov. 25.

HIGH SCHOOL

A two-time all-star at Huntington HS...earned honorable mention All-American honors from Street & Smith's in 2001...a McDonald's All-American nominee her senior season...tabbed a top-30 prospect by the All-Star Girls Report...an AAA All-State First Team member...named an all-conference selection three times...logged over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds over the course of her career...member of the Huntington HS state championship team...averaged 18 points and 13 rebounds as a senior...participated in the Nike All-American camp in the summer of 2002...played in the North/South All-Star Game her senior year...MVP of the AAA vs. AA+A All-Star Game...selected to the all-tournament team her junior year...played for the AAU West Virginia Tornadoes...coached by Lonnie Lucas.



Appeared in 24 games off the bench, serving as the Herd's backup center...shot 31.4 percent from the floor on 11-of-35 attempts...at 6-foot-5, Hagan proved to be one of MU's better free throw shooters at 70.0 percent (14-of-20)...third on team with five blocked shots...scored season-high six points with an assist on Dec. 1 versus Morehead State...pulled down season-high seven rebounds in 11 minutes against Ball State on Feb. 13...tallied two points, two rebounds, a block and a steal in win versus Elon on Dec. 29...snagged two steals with two points in only four minutes at Ohio on Feb. 9...with the Herd up by only one point at Western Michigan on Feb. 16, Hagan registered a critical block along with two points and a rebound in only five minutes against the Broncos.



2004-05 (SOPHOMORE)

Improved from her stellar freshman campaign in virtually every category, most notably by committing 20 less turnovers than in 2003-04 and raising her assist to turnover ratio to 1.52 (3rd in MAC)...team leader in assists (3.9/game, 4th in MAC) and steals (2.1/game, 7th in MAC)...sixth on team with 7.9 ppg, upped to 11.5 ppg in MAC Tournament...tied a pair of career-highs in the league tournament with seven field goals and one 3-pointer in the quarterfinal win versus Toledo on March 9...named Toyota Capital Classic MVP for her efforts in defeating West Virginia on Jan. 11 by posting five assists and a steal, tying her career-high in points (20) and setting new career marks in free throws/attempts (10/16) and rebounds (7)...her 16 free throw attempts are the third highest single-game total in school history...the win over WVU, Marshall's first in three years, sparked the Herd to its longest win streak (12 games) in 33 years...named MAC East Division Player of the Week on Jan. 17 after averaging 14.0 points (66.7 percent shooting), 6.0 assists, 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals in wins over WVU and NIU...scored all 16 of her points in the second half of the Herd's come-from-behind victory over Ohio, 88-87, on Jan. 18, including the game-winning field goal with 10 seconds remaining...dished out a career-high 10 assists in Dec. 1 game vs. Morehead State...posted career-high seven steals in regular-season finale vs. Akron on March 1...averaged 13.3 points and 5.0 assists in three-game stretch against teams (Toledo, Kent State and Miami) that historically dominated the Herd, leading MU to a 3-0 record and a +12.0 scoring margin in that span...logged only eight starts, but each reserve appearance yielded an average of 25.6 minutes/game...started final three games of season.

2003-04 (FRESHMAN)

free throws/attempts (6/8) and rebounds (5, tied 5 times, incl. twice in MAC Tournament) to lead Herd to 15-point win at Tex.-Pan American...led team with seven five-plus assist games...went 4-for-4 with three assists and two steals in road win at Central Michigan on Jan. 24...after being delegated to coming off the bench for four straight games, Hodge responded in her first start back with an eight-point, five-steal, five-rebound, four-assist effort in a season-high 39 minutes in a win over Ohio on Feb. 28...averaged 5.25 assists per game in the last four games of the season, including a seven-assist, zero-turnover performance in 30 minutes of play in the first round win over Buffalo...helped snap a four-game losing streak to Ohio by posting 10 points and five assists in an 86-63 win over the Bobcats on Jan. 10.






