

Marshall Head Coach Doc Holliday

Opening statement:

I think I say every year, but how nice is it to be the head football coach of a game you know you can't lose with the way that game is. How special was that to watch Red Dawson leading that team out there. It was just an unbelievable moment. I think we can all cherish bringing those players back and taking the field the way we did today. It will be an experience I will never forget, just such a special time. I am proud of our football team. It was a very physical game in the first half and that is the way Charlotte always plays. I thought our guys came out in the second half and responded really well. Nobody has run the football against Charlotte like we did today. In the second half Knox had over 100 yards. We call that competitive excellence around here. When a play goes in and it is finally his turn and goes in well prepared to do that. He is a tremendous young back who will see a lot of carries for us. He had a lot of carries because of that. I thought Isaiah Green went in and did well. That being said, I thought our defense, after the first drive, did well. That team had less than 200 yards. Excited about our football team and the way they played. We have to come back and get ready to roll but it was a great evening for The Herd.

On facing adversity early:

Anthony hasn't done that all year. We did get the turnover in that half but I thought our kids responded really well. Even with the adversity we still took it down and scored, which is huge. Then we stuck it in the next drive there too with the field goal. It was just a great team win for us and the fact that it happens on the game to honor the 75 makes it even more special.

On offense picking up defense:

That and special teams had a blocked punt for a touchdown which I thought was huge. I thought our kicker went in and did well. He went three for three today in field goals and showed he can stick it through there. At the end of the day, we take care of the football and we haven't lost a game all year. We would still have the one, but we still end up winning the turnover margin. Just need to continue to take care of the football and continue doing all three phases. Take each game one at a time and see what happens.

On Knox:

He has great pad level. He is 225 pounds. I like what I saw out there tonight and you are going to see a lot more of that kid. He is just a Freshman but he is a good young back. Greg Adkins did a great job assigning some runs. I think Knox had well over 100 yards tonight, matter of fact he had 116. We ran the ball pretty well against that team and that is a tribute to Greg, Tim, and that offensive line.

On pass rush:

We had that one sack at the end of the half where Couch was offside and they ended up getting a field goal but other than that the defense did well. They got some pressure. They rotated a couple of quarterbacks in there. The one guy played against us a year ago and he was more of a running type guy, but they kept going back and forth with him and the Miami kid who transferred. However, again defense

played well. If you can play that kind of defense and do really well on special teams and continue taking care of that ball, you have a really good shot at winning the game. That is kind of what we did today.

On Hernandez:

He showed up a lot. He played really well. You know Malik Gant; I don't think there is a better safety around than he is. You guys have been around here a long time and if you know a better one, a more physical one I would like to see him because he is just a tremendous football player.
