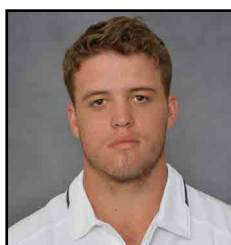

ABOUT CONFERENCE USA

Conference USA begins its 22nd year in 2016-17 as it continues to compete and promote the success of its student-athletes. The league has adapted to the ever-changing landscape of collegiate athletics over its first two-plus decades, but the commitment to excellence, integrity, leadership and its student athletes in competition, academics and community is unwavering.

Conference USA enjoys a far-reaching fan base with its 14 members: Charlotte, FIU, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana Tech, Marshall, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion, Rice, Southern Miss, UAB, UTEP, UTSA and WKU.

Debuting in 1995, Conference USA teams have combined for 93 bowl appearances in football, 104 NCAA Tournament appearances in basketball, including three Final Fours, 67 NCAA baseball appearances including six College World Series berths, 84 NCAA soccer tournament appearances including four trips to the College Cup, and 36 individual national champions in track and field and cross country.

Success is not limited to athletic achievement, however, as 207 Conference USA student-athletes have garnered Academic All-America honors, 722 have achieved academic all-district laurels and thousands of student-athletes have earned a college degree.

Conference USA sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball).

The league promotes the scholar-athlete ideal, honoring outstanding academic achievement with numerous conference-sponsored awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Commissioner's Academic Medal as well as sport-specific All-Academic teams.

C-USA annually awards postgraduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Awards, Scholar-Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award. Additionally, Conference USA presents a Spirit of Service Award three times each year, recognizing student-athletes who excel on the field, in the classroom and give back to the community through significant service efforts and participation.

SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

C-USA institutions are among the nation's best in academic performance of student-athletes, bolstered by the fact that student-athletes at league schools have a higher graduation rate than the general student population. Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In 21 years, more than 30,000 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom.

C-USA IN THE COMMUNITY

The conference's current footprint is concentrated with 14 members in 10 states and a combined area population of more than 30 million. With a commitment to community involvement, the conference developed several initiatives to maintain strong ties in C-USA cities, as well as with fans and alumni across the country. C-USA schools also place a priority on giving back to their communities through volunteer service with local and national organizations. Individually, student-athletes are recognized each season through the Spirit of Service award.

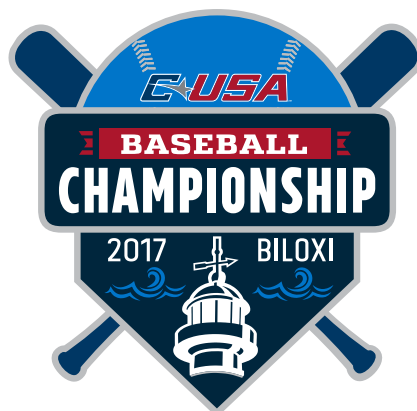

C-USA CHAMPIONSHIP

C-USA CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The 2017 Conference USA Championship will return to a neutral site for the first time since 2012 and just the sixth time in the league's history. Three-year old MGM Park, located on the waterfront in Biloxi, Mississippi, will be the host venue of the league's 22nd championship. The Championship will feature the top eight teams in regular-season league play and the format consists of two double-elimination brackets, with a single-elimination championship game that will be nationally-televised by CBS Sports Network.



MGM PARK

MGM Park is located right in the middle of Biloxi's entertainment, casino and lodging district, just two blocks from the Gulf of Mexico.

It is the home of the AA affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, the Biloxi Shuckers of the Southern League. The ballpark opened on June 6, 2015 as the Shuckers defeated the Mobile Bay Bears. The ballpark has 5,000 fixed seats with room for an additional 800-1,000 fans in berm seating. The stadium layout is organized around the concourse level that wraps around the field and includes concessions, a lounge and a team store. The majority of the seating is located below the concourse level with 12 suites situated above the concourse.



The league has hosted regular season college baseball games since its opening, including multiple games involving C-USA member Southern Miss.

2017 NCAA COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

The 70th Annual College World Series will take place June 17-27/28 at TD Ameritrade Stadium in Omaha, Neb. This is the 67th time that the CWS will be played in Omaha and the sixth year at the downtown stadium.

The field consists of 64 teams, with 29 conference champions being joined by 35 at-large selections. Sixteen double-elimination regionals consisting of four teams each will take place from Friday to Monday, June 2-June 5. The winners of those regionals advance to the Super Regionals, which will be a best of three format with two teams playing at eight different sites during June 9-12.

The eight winners will play in the 2017 College World Series, which will employ its familiar pair of four-team double-elimination brackets leading to a best-of-three championship series between the winners of the two brackets. The CWS will run from Saturday, June 17 – Tuesday, June 27 or Wednesday, June 28.

2016 KEITH LeCLAIR C-USA COACH OF THE YEAR

11TH SEASON

CLEVELAND STATE

In 10 seasons, 33 Marshall players/signees have been given a chance to play at the professional level under Head Coach Waggoner, including major leaguers Dan Straily (2009, 24th round – Oakland A's) and Aaron Blair (2013, first supplemental round – 36th overall – Arizona Diamondbacks). Waggoner has won 231 games in his coaching career.

2016 was a record season for Marshall under the instruction of Coach Waggoner. The Herd won a program record 34 wins, including a win over 17th-ranked Florida Atlantic. Marshall also set a program record 21 wins in Conference USA play. Marshall boasted its highest RPI of 60. Coach Waggoner received the Keith LeClair Coach of the Year award from C-USA. The Thundering Herd lineup featured three C-USA All-Conference first team players (Chase Boster, DJ Gee, Tommy Lane), one C-USA All-Conference second team player (Corey Bird) and a member to the All-Freshman team (Joshua Shapiro). Lane was selected as the Newcomer of the Year for Marshall. The Herd also found success in the classroom with a 3.01 GPA during the fall semester.

The 2016 MLB amateur draft featured four players from the Herd, second most in a single draft. Corey Bird was drafted by the Miami Marlins in the seventh round with the 203rd overall pick. Burris Warner was the second player drafted in the 22nd round to the Detroit Tigers. JD Hammer followed in the 24th round to the Colorado Rockies. Parker Danciu rounded out the group in the 39th round to the Atlanta Braves.

Waggoner's 2014 and 2015 seasons produced All-Conference performers, with Boster earning All-Conference USA second team honors in 2015. Bird was chosen to the All-Freshman team in 2014.

After the 2013 season, Waggoner saw two Thundering Herd players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. A total of 12 players were selected over the last three seasons, while 26 of his student-athletes have received an opportunity to play professional baseball under his tutelage. Aaron Blair (first supplemental round - 36th overall - to the Arizona Diamondbacks) and Isaac Ballou (15th round to the Washington Nationals), the 2013 draftees, became the 14th and 15th members of the Herd to be selected after serving on one of Waggoner's teams.

One year prior, pitchers Joe Church (17th round to the San Diego Padres) and Mike Mason (24th round to the Colorado Rockies) were selected.

Waggoner's last three teams have produced All-Conference performers, with Blair and Ballou garnering All-Conference USA first team honors in 2013 after Blair and Sergio Leon were named All-Freshmen in 2011 and 2012, respectively.

The 2011 season featured eight players who would go on to be drafted by MLB teams and two players who were signed as free agents. Greg Williams (Texas Rangers), Mike Mason (Texas Rangers), Joe Church (Los Angeles Angels), Isaac Ballou (Pittsburgh Pirates), Kenny Socorro (Chicago Cubs), Arik Sikula (Toronto Blue Jays), Shane Farell (Toronto Blue Jays), Rhett Stafford (Oakland Athletics) were each drafted in the 2011 MLB, marking the most drafted players in a season in Marshall baseball history. Victor Gomez (Atlanta Braves) and Ian Kadish (Toronto Blue Jays) were also picked up by big league teams as free agents.

Along with the most drafted players in a season, Waggoner's club had four players earn Conference USA honors. Kenny Socorro was selected to the All-Conference USA team as an infielder and freshman, Aaron Blair, was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team. Kyle Blank and Arik Sikula both earned academic recognition through the conference, after being picked to the Conference USA All-Academic team.

In the 2010 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft, Kevin Shackelford, Ryan Kiel and Aaron Blair were selected. Other notable players drafted include Steven Blevins, Tommy Johnson and Nate Lape in 2008, while Eddie Rush and Dan Straily were picked in 2009.

In 2008, during his second season at Marshall, Waggoner led the Herd to 30 wins, the second most in program history. The Herd notched a 30-30-1 overall record and finished sixth in C-USA, with a berth in the 2008 Entergy C-USA Baseball Championship tournament hosted by Tulane.

Prior to the 2010 campaign, the Herd placed three players (Blevins, Lape and Gomez) on All-C-USA teams, while two (Lape and Gomez) were named to all All-Mideast Region squads. Adam Yeager, Gomez and Lape all played summer ball in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League.

Newman enters his fourth season as the Marshall baseball pitching coach and first year as head recruiting coordinator. Newman mentored Chase Boster, the all-time winningest pitcher in Marshall History. In 2016, three pitchers from his staff were drafted in the 2016 MLB Draft.

Prior to the Herd, Newman was a volunteer assistant at Ohio State, Newman spent three seasons on the Buckeye coaching staff after being hired in 2010.

The Ohio State pitching staff, under the guidance of Newman and pitching coach Mike Stafford, improved dramatically over the last three seasons. After the staff posted a 4.94 ERA in 2011, the Buckeyes improved to a 3.24 ERA in the 2013 campaign. In 2013, Ohio State ranked in the Top 40 nationally in every pitching category including walks per nine innings (8th, 2.45), strikeout-to-walk ratio (15th, 2.75), WHIP (17th, 1.19), hits per nine innings (33rd, 8.29) and ERA (38th, 3.24).

Ohio State had three pitchers earn All-Big Ten honors in 2013. Newman has also helped Buckeyes into the next level as right-hander John Kuchno was a 2012 18th-round selection by the Pittsburgh Pirates before Brad Goldberg was taken by the Chicago White Sox in the 10th round this season and Brett McKinney's 19th round selection by the Pirates.

A native of Wheelersburg, Ohio and a 2004 Ohio State graduate, Newman ranks third all-time at Ohio State in career wins (32), innings pitched (369.0) and strikeouts (291). He was a freshman All-American in 2001 and a three-time All-Big Ten honoree, including a first-team selection in 2004.

In his career, Newman helped the Buckeyes to a 161-84-1 record, a Big Ten regular season championship (2001) and two Big Ten Tournament championships (2002 and 2003). Ohio State went to three NCAA Regional tournaments and hosted an NCAA Super Regional (2003) in his four years in Columbus.

Newman was drafted in the 19th round of the 2004 MLB Draft and signed a professional contract with the Colorado Rockies. He had previously been drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in 2003 but he elected to stay at Ohio State for his senior season.

The Wheelersburg High School graduate spent three seasons in the minors before making his Major League debut against Philadelphia on Sept. 12, 2007, and making the Colorado Rockies World Series roster that season. He jumped between Triple-A Colorado Springs and the Rockies in 2008 before being claimed off waivers by the Kansas City Royals in July. Newman pitched in 14 games over his two seasons between Colorado and Kansas City, making his last appearance in September 2008.

He and his wife Sarah currently reside in Wheelersburg, Ohio with their two children - Ayda and Kash.

Marshall baseball's all-time home run leader, Victor Gomez, has returned to accept an assistant coaching position for the Thundering Herd, head coach Jeff Waggoner announced in August of 2016.

"Marshall baseball is very excited to have one of its greatest players of all time return to Huntington," Herd coach Jeff Waggoner said. "I was very lucky to coach Victor. We had over 200 applicants apply for this job, but I chose Victor because I was very excited to work alongside of him as a coach. He has a coach's mind and he was always an extension of the coaching staff here as a player. Victor is a perfect fit for the program and we are very excited and lucky to have him."

The Miami native rejoins the Herd after an impressive career from 2008-11. Gomez leads Marshall all-time in eight offensive categories, including games played (217), at bats (849), hits (294), doubles (48), home runs (52), RBIs (211), total bases (510) and sacrifice files (20). In his first season with the Herd, Gomez was named to the All-Conference USA Freshman Team and All-C-USA Second Team. He also was named to the Louisville Slugger's Freshmen All-American team and ABCA All-Mideast Region Team. As a sophomore and junior, he was named to the All-C-USA First Team.

Gomez signed a minor league contract with the Atlanta Braves in 2011. In Aug. 2012, Gomez signed with the Florence Freedom of the Frontier League.

"I'm very excited and grateful for this opportunity to be back with the Marshall baseball program," Gomez said. "I'm thrilled to work with the hitters alongside Coach Waggoner who has overseen the hitters the last 10 seasons. Marshall and Huntington have always held a special place in my heart. I'm excited to come in and work hard so we can build off the success of last season."

Gomez graduated from Marshall University in 2013 with a regents Bachelor of Arts degree. He remained in Huntington from April-Aug. 2013 as he served as an assistant coach for Huntington High School and the 16U Huntington Hounds travel summer baseball team.

Gomez returned to Miami in Aug. 2013 to become an assistant coach with LaSalle High School. He helped train student-athletes, provide staff support and coached fall teams. In January of 2014, Gomez accepted a job with Miami Dade College as an assistant baseball coach and recruitment coordinator.

This past summer Gomez was the head baseball coach with the Front Royal Cardinals of the Summer Collegiate Valley Baseball League. He was responsible for recruitment of players, camp management, running practices and instructing players on baseball techniques.
